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
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1 Key Features

- Digital Audio Player Supports MP3 and WMA. Supports WAV format (ADPCM Encoding)
- USB interface for upload and download files (USB 1.1)
- Firmware Upgradeable Provides the latest updated features via free downloads from our website and upgradeable to other digital music format if available.
- Full Graphic LCD for displaying information with backlight.
- FM Tuner function with memory function (Preset channel).
- 6 Equalizing Patterns
- FM Tuner recording function.
- Built-in microphone for Voice Recording Function (High Quality, Normal Quality and Long Play selectable).
- Programmable Music Playlist.
- Low battery level indicator.
- The Digital Audio Player will power off automatically if the player is idle for about 3 minutes.
- Support for Windows ME, Windows 2000 and Windows XP.



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2 Basic Operation

Installing Driver (for Windows 98 and Windows 98SE only)

 The USB mass storage function will not be activated without driver installation. To activate the USB mass storage function, please use the installation CD-Rom to install the driver.

Remark:

No Driver is required for Windows ME, Windows 2000 and Windows XP. Windows will automatically detect the Audio Player after connection with the USB port is established.

Upgradeable Firmware Procedure

For Windows ME, Windows 2000 or Windows XP only

- Install the "Digital DFP Solid State Audio Player" program in computer
 - 1.1 Insert the Installation CD
 - 1.2 An Install Shield Wizard will pop up automatically
 - 1.3 Click on Next to proceed the installation
 - 1.4 Once the installation is done. Click on Finish

2. Firmware Download

- 2.1 Download the latest firmware from website www.soulplayer.com. Unzip the firmware file into the directory C:\Program\Digital\DFP\
- 2.2 Click on Start and select Program. From program, select the DFP Solid State Audio Player, then click on Update.
- 2.3 An Update dialogue box will pop up. Click on Start and the application program will begin to download the firmware.

Remarks:

Some memory space in Flash Memory is reserved for Firmware Upgrade Features. Therefore, usable memory space will be less than 128MB / 256MB, where applicable.

Format the Player

- Click on Start and select Program. From program, please select the DFP Solid State Audio Player, then click on Format.
- A Format dialogue box will pop up, click on Start and the application program will format the Player.

Operating with different modes

- The Digital Audio Player can operate with different modes (Music Mode, FM Tuner Mode, Voice Recording Mode and Navigation Mode). Press MODE button once for Mode Selection Menu.
- Press K(or W) buttons to switch to different mode.
- Press NAVI to confirm the selection or press MODE button to quit without any change.




Operating with Music Mode

- Insert the earphone plug into earphone jack of the Digital Audio Player.
- Turn on the unit by pressing is button.
- Press IIIN button to pause during playing music.
- Press
 button to stop playing music.
- Press + button to increase the volume.
- Press button to decrease the volume.
- Press # button to select previous track.
 Press # button to select next track.



- Press and hold I button for rewind.
- ♦ Press and hold button for fast forward.
- Slide HOLD switch to lock all buttons. All buttons will not function. (If the unit stops during Music Mode or Voice Recording Mode, unit will automatically shut off after about 3 minutes.)
- For fast selection on the music stored in the Player, press the NAVI button to see a list of files.





Operating the FM Tuner Mode

While playing in *Music Mode*, press **MODE** button to select *FM Tuner Mode* before proceed to the next step.



- Auto Scanning the whole FM band
- If the PRESET icon is on, then press button to remove
 Then press and hold button III to start auto scanning the whole FM band.
- Each FM station detected will be stored in the 10 preset memory (previous preset channel will overwrite by new FM station detected) Only the last 10 FM stations will remain in the memory.
- Manual Preset FM Band
- If the PRESET icon is on, then press I button to remove
- Press W to increase FM frequency. The unit will start Auto Scan function if the W button is pressed and held for a longer time. The unit will stop when next FM station is detected.



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- Press # to decrease FM frequency. The unit will start Auto Scan function if the # button is pressed and held for a longer time. The unit will stop when next FM station is detected.
- Press IIN button once, then STORE and Channel number icons will be shown on LCD.
- Press H to increase Channel Number.
- Press II> button again to store this FM frequency in selected channel number. (The STORE icon will be turned off)
- If the PRESET icon is off, then press button to turn on the PRESET icon.
- Press W to increase the preset channel by 1.
- Press # to decrease the preset channel by 1.
- To delete the preset channel, then press and hold IIP button.

Safe Removal Procedure


- Before disconnect the Digital Audio Player from USB cable, please make sure the following procedure is followed. Otherwise, it may damage the Player.
- Double click the "safe removal" icon on the task bar; the "Unplug or Eject Hardware" window will be pop up. You can select the device you want to remove. Then, click the "Stop" button. After that you can unplug the device from the USB port of your computer.

FM Recording

- Press the EQ button to start recording.
- Press the STOP button again to stop recording.
- The recorded file is saved as F001.WAV in the FM folder.
- To play a recorded file, press MODE to switch back to Music Mode and select a Tuner file in the TUNER folder, press II> button.

Note: Volume is not controlled during recording

Operating with Voice Recording Mode



- Press the MODE button.
- ◆ Press ₩ or ₩ to select the Voice Recording Mode.
- Press the EQ button to start recording.
- Press the STOP button again to stop recording.
- The recorded file is saved as V001.WAV in the VOICE folder.
- To play a recorded file, press II button Note: Volume is not controlled during recording

Operating Navigation Mode



- While playing in other modes, press MODE button to select the Navigation Mode before proceed to the next step. Or press NAVI button as a short cut key.
- In Navigation mode, the LCD displays the music files in folders and files.
- Press + to move up in the list.
- Press to move down in the list.
- Press # to move up to the previous folder.
- Press H to move down to the next folder.
- After selected the music file,
 - Press II or NAVI button to play.
 - Press
 button to delete the file, a dialogue box will show on the LCD. (Remarks: You can not delete the file while music is playing.)
 - Press H or H to toggle the confirmation on the dialogue box. Then press NAVI to confirm.
 - The file in the folder is protected, so you can not delete the file inside folder. Delete these files in Mass Storage Mode when the unit is connected to PC.

3 Useful Features

EQ Mode

Press and hold EQ/REPEAT button while playing music to display the current EQ. Then press EQ/REPEAT button again to scroll the six EQ modes (Normal, Rock, Classic, Pop, Jazz and Ultra Bass). The program will quit the EQ Mode if no consecutive key pressed.



Repeat Mode

Pressing the **EQ/REPEAT** button will toggle different *Repeat Mode* function.

- Play a single file repeatedly. "
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 ^{*}
- Play all files in the player repeatedly. " entry "
- Randomly play all files in the player repeatedly and stop. " "."
- Play program List file and stop. " In " (only be activated upon Playlist is created)
- Play program List file repeatedly. "

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Program - Playlist



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In Navigation Mode

- Press + or to select the music file. Then press EQ/REPEAT button, a number will be displayed adjacent to the song name.
 Press EQ/REPEAT button again to confirm, then the number will clear and the song is stored in the playlist.
- If more than one song is stored in the playlist, before pressing the EQ/REPEAT button to confirm, you can use ke or be to change the playlist order number.
- Then press III> to start playing the music according to the programmed playlist.
- ◆ To delete the music file in the playlist, press button to delete the program number, a dialogue box will show on the LCD. Then press + to confirm or to quit without deleting the program number. (Note: You cannot program the same music file on more than one Playlist)

Clear Playlist

- To clear the playlist, go to Setting Mode and select PLAYLIST (Use the same procedure in Navigation Mode)
- To delete whole Playlist, press STOP button once, a dialogue box will display, then select CLEAR LIST. Then press NAVI again, a confirmation box is displayed and select YES to delete the whole Playlist.
- To delete one of the songs from the playlist, then press STOP once and select CLEAR ITEM. Press NAVI again and a confirmation box is displayed. Select YES to delete the music file.

Setting Mode

- Press and hold the MODE button, the Setting Mode Menu will be shown on LCD.
- Press the IN or IN button to scroll different setting options (PLAY LIST, BACKLIGHT, CONSTRAST, EQUALIZER and PLAY TIMER).
- After pointed to the requested option, then press the NAVI button to confirm this selection. Then press the K or M button to change the setting. Pressing - again to return to Setting Mode Menu.
- Press MODE again to quit the Setting Mode Menu i.e. return to normal operation.



4 Additional Information

Installing Battery



- 1. Slide and open the battery compartment door.
- 2. Insert the battery with correct polarity.
- 3. Close the battery compartment door.



Charging battery:

 Connect the USB power converter (mini-jack) to the player and the other end to AC adapter. Plug in AC adapter to the power.

AC adapter

Remark:

- To avoid battery leakage or corrosion, remove the battery from the player if the player is not to be used for a long time.
- Remove dead battery from the player immediately to avoid damaging the player.
- When corrosion occurs, wipe the battery compartment immediately with a dry cloth and insert a new battery.

Installing RealOne Player

- 1. Insert the Installation CD.
- Click on Start and select Program. From program, click on Windows Explorer.

 Select the directory of CD-Rom from Windows Explorer, click on the folder of RealOne Player. Different versions of RealOne are displayed.



- Double click the version that you want to install and the installation will be started automatically.
- Follow the RealOne Install Wizard step by step to finish the installation.

Safe Removal Procedure

Before disconnecting the Digital Audio Player from the USB cable, please make sure the following procedure is followed. Otherwise, it may damage the Player.

 Double click the "safe removal" icon in the task bar; the "Unplug or Eject Hardware" window will be pop up. You can select the device you want to remove. Then, click the "Stop" button. You can then unplug the device from the USB port

Safety
