

Getting Started

INTRODUCTION

Digital Audio Player (DAP) - MX 72FZ

Your Digital Audio Player is a device that stores and plays multi-format digital audio files including MP3, WMA and WAV files. Downloading hours of music from your PC, transfer them into your DAP or use it for voice recording. Please read this manual carefully before using this product for the first time.





Key Functions



mode Press to access into the Main Menu.

Press and hold to access into the Settings Monu.

hold Slide to the right to lock all keys functions.
Slide to the left to unlock all keys functions.

●/EQ/与 Record / Equalizer / Repeat button.

Press to access into the Repeat mode.

Press and hold to access into the Equalizer mode.

Press to recording in Voice mode.

Press to select song into playlist in Navigation mode.

Press and hold to turn the player OFF.

Press to turn the player ON.



There is a joystick key in the center that can be used to control several key functions. Press the button top, down, left, right or pressing it down will achieve the following actions:

In Navigation Mode:

NAVI / • Push the button down to access the Navigation mode of the folders.

Push to the right to select the next file.

Push and hold to the right to fast-forward within the files.

Push to the left to select the previous file.

Push and hold on to the left to fast-rewind within the files.

Push downward to decrease the volume.

Push and hold downward to decrease the volume rapidly.


Push upward to increase the volume.

Push and hold upward to increase the volume rapidly.

Battery Installation (not included)

When the bars in the battery indicator (in the display) become low (figure 1), replace the battery as follows.

- 1. Click the button and opens the battery compartment door.
- Insert the battery with the correct polarity as show.
- 3. Close the battery compartment door.



BATTERY PRECAUTIONS

- To avoid battery leakage or corrosion, remove the battery from the player if the player is not to be used for a long time.
- Remove dead battery from the player immediately to avoid damaging the player.
- When corrosion occurs, wipe the battery compartment immediately with a dry cloth and insert a new battery.

Downloading and Transferring Files

USB DRIVER INSTALLATION

For Windows ME, 2000 or XP:

These versions of Windows will automatically detect your DAP after connecting with the USB cable and the computer. (Please make sure the DAP is turned ON.)


For Windows 98SE:

Windows 98SE will not recognize the player until you have installed the driver using the included installation CD-ROM. Follow the detailed instructions in this section to activate the USB mass storage function, so you will be able to transfer files from your computer to your player.

Installation Procedures for the Player Software (For Windows 98SE only)


When connecting the player to the computer for the first time, please follow these instructions:

1. Insert the CD-ROM into the CD Drive. The auto-run program will display as shown. Click "Next" to install the driver.




Remarks: If the setup does not start automatically, please run the install.exe in your CD-ROM drive directory. Double click "install.exe" in the installation CD.

2. Follow the on screen instruction to install the software. Please install the software under the directory as prompted.




Warning: DO NOT change the installation path. Otherwise, the Player driver may not run properly.

3. After successfully installing the driver software click "Close to Exit".




TRANSFERRING FILES

Connect the DAP by using the supplied USB cable to the computer. Press the button to turn the player ON. The following will be displayed on the LCD screen of your DAP:



A "Removable Disk" will be added in My Computer. Open the "Removable Disk" folder:




Locate the files you wish to copy from your computer to your player. Drag and drop MP3, WMA or WAV files on your computer into the "Removable Disk" folder. These files will now be copied into your DAP.


Note: When you are finished transferring files, use the Safely Remove Hardware procedure before disconnecting your player. (Please see the next section for detailed instructions.)

SAFELY REMOVE HARDWARE PROCEDURE


1. Double click the "Safely Remove Hardware" icon on the task bar:



2. From the "Safely Remove Hardware" window, select "USB Mass Storage Device" and click the "Stop" button. The "Stop a Hardware Device" window will pop up as shown:



Click "OK". A "Safe to Remove Hardware" window will pop up. Now, it is safe to remove the USB Cable and the DAP from the computer.



Remarks: If the "Safely Remove Hardware" icon is not displayed on the task bar, please double click on My Computer. Right click on "Removable Disk", left click on "eject". Then it is safe to remove the DAP from the computer.

Operation

LISTENING TO MUSIC

After you have transferred MP3, WMA or WAV files from the computer to the DAP player, you can start listening to music while you learn how to use the rest of the features.

Insert the earphones into the earphone jack of the player; press the player on. The first song will immediately begin to play. Use the navigation keys to forward, reverse, adjust the volume and access to Navigation mode.

USING THE MAIN MENU

Press the mode button to access the MAIN MENU. The following menu will be displayed on the LCD screen:



Push | or | until your desired selection is highlighted and press the | NAVI / • button to confirm the selection.



MUSIC PLAYER

To listen to any files or songs stored in your DAP or run the Program List, you can select the MUSIC PLAYER mode.

Using Special Functions Equalizer Mode (EQ)

The current equalizer mode is displayed in the lower right hand corner of the LCD screen in a rectangular block with a black background.

Changing the EQ mode

- Press and hold the ●/EQ/与 button until the current mode is displayed with a clear block background. Keep pressing the ●/EQ/与 button repeatedly to select one of the six equalizer modes:

NORM POP JAZZ ROCK FLASS UBASS

- Stop pressing the ●/EQ/→ button when your desired selection is displayed with a clear background. The background will turn back to the black after a few seconds.

Repeat Button

Press the P/EQ/D button repeatedly to select different repeat mode options. As each mode is selected, the following icons will displayed on the right upper part of the LCD screen on your player:

Play all the files in the player once.

Randomly play all the files in the player once.

Randomly play all the files in the player continuously.

Plays a single file repeatedly.

Play all the files repeatedly in the consecutive order.

Edits and plays one section repeatedly. Press NAVI / • button once to start with point A A • and press NAVI / • button again to end with point B A • B.

Plays the play list once. (The play list must be created before using this function.)

Plays the play list repeatedly. (The play list must be created before using this function)

NAVIGATION

You may search for, listen to, and program the play list in the Navigation mode. Press the mode button and use the mode or the mode button to highlight the Navigation NAVI / ● icon as shown.



Press the NAVI / • button to confirm and access in the Navigation menu.

All the files are displayed on the LCD in the Root/ folder. Voice recorded files are stored in the Voice/ folder.

Creating a play list

- Enter into the Navigation menu.
- Push + or button to highlight a desired song or file.
- Press the PEQ/D button; a number icon (01, 02 ctc.) will be displayed next to that song or file.
- Press the PEQ/D button to confirm the song or file selection; the number icon will disappear and the file or the song will be added to the play list.
- Follow these steps with each file you would like to add to your play list.
- Press the button or idle a few second to exit from the Navigation menu.

Note: You can only program the same file into the play list once.

VOICE RECORDER

Use your DAP to record quick reminder memos or even lengthy business meetings or lectures.

Press the mode button and use the mode button to highlight the Voice Recorder icon as shown.



Press NAVI / • to confirm and enter the Voice Recorder mode.

Recording a Voice Message

- Press the ●/EQ/ button to start recording.
- Press the button to stop recording.
- The recorded file is saved as a WAV format.

Listening to the Recorded File

- Press the button to listen the recorded file.
- Press the button to stop listening.
- Press the [kt] button to select the previous recorded file.
- Press the bill button to select the next recorded file.

Notes: The volume is not controlled during recording.

You may select three different quality levels for recording.


Customizing the Player

USING THE SETTING MENU

The Setting Menu provides the options to change the player settings, displays, and resolution. Press and hold the mode button to display the SETTING MENU on the LCD screen.



Press the M or the M button to select one of the following setting options: Play List, Recording Resolution, Contrast, Equalizer, Play Timer or Light Timer. Once your selection is highlighted then press NAVI / • to confirm.




To exit the SETTING Menu, press the mode button.

Setting Features



Push [+] or [-] button to select the desired file.

Press the Press the button; a [CLEAR ITEM / CLEAR LIST] box will be displayed on the LCD screen.



Push + or - to select clear item or clear list and press NAVI / ● button to confirm.

Push | or | button to select [Yes / No] to clear the selection.

Press button to confirm the selection.

Note: If you have deleted or not programmed a play list, "PLAYLIST EMPTY" will display on the LCD screen.

Recording Resolution Setting
▶1 RECRESOLUTION
Push + or - to select one of the three voice recording resolution: Low, Normal, or High Press NAVI / ● to confirm the resolution selection.
Contrast Setting
EPP MB
FI GUNINADE
Press the M or the M button to adjust the LCD contrast level. Press NAVI / • to confirm the contrast level.
Equalizer Setting
▶1 <u>EQUEUZER</u>
Push [+] or [-] button to select one of the six music equalizer effects: Normal, Rock, Ultra Bass, Jazz, Pop, or Classical. Press NAVI / ● to confirm the equalizer mode.
Play Timer Setting
▶1 PLAYTIMER
Push or to select between ELAPSED and REMAIN time. Press NAVI / to confirm the play timer selection.
Light Timer Setting
AZ GHTIMER:
Push [+] or [-] to select duration of the backlight timer: 5 sec, 10 sec, 15 sec or Off
Press NAVI / • to confirm the timer selection.

	Check whether the battery is exhausted.	Replace the battery.
	Check whether the earphones jack is contaminated or oxidized.	Clean the earphones jack.
	Corrupted MP3 or WMA file.	Download the files again.
Invalid Character on LCD	The Language is not supported	Visit our web site to check whether a new version of firmware is release.
Failed to Download or Upload of MP3/ WMA/WAV files	Check whether the battery is exhausted.	Recharge/Replace the batter
	Check the connection of USB cable.	Re-plug the cable at both ends.
	Damaged USB cable.	Replace a new USB cable.
	Memory is full.	Release some memory space by deleting some files.
Cannot record Voice	Memory is full.	Release some memory space by deleting some files.


EXTERNAL MEMORY CARD

- 1) Open the battery compartment door by click the button.
- 2) Insert a SD/MMC memory card (not included) up to 512MB, facing up as shown.
- 3) Connect the USB cable as described previously.
- 4) Drag MP3 and WMA files into the new folder. The memory card indicator will appear at the bottom left corner on the display.
- 5) To remove the SD/MMC memory card, push the edge of the card, then the card will spring out. Carefully remove the card.


Remarks: Please turn off the unit and remove the battery before install the memory card.

FORMATTING THE MEMORY PROCEDURE

- 1. Ensure the Digital Audio Player is ON.
- 2. Use the supplied USB cable to connect between Digital Audio Player and the Computer.
- 3. Double click the "My Computer" icon, "Removable Disk" appears in the My computer folder. (Picture of My computer)



4. Right click the "Removable Disk" then select Format. (Picture of Format)




5. The following dialogue box will appear. Select the FAT file system only, then click START to proceed for formatting the drive.


Important: Do not select other file systems, it will cause malfunction of the unit. (picture of FAT file)
