





Press and hold the **Power** U button 4~5 seconds until the RCA logo appears.

#### **Power the Tablet Off**

Press and hold the **Power**  button until the **Power off** message displays, then tap it and the tablet will be powered off.

#### Sleep Mode

Briefly press the **Powe**r button to put the tablet in sleep mode. If you don't operate for some time, the tablet will enter sleep mode automatically.

#### To Reset the Unit

Press and HOLD the **Power** U button about 15 seconds until the screen turns OFF and turns ON again.

Tip: You can go to Settings -> Device -> Display -> Sleep to set the screen timeout.

#### Wake the Tablet from Sleep Mode

Press the Power button to wake the tablet from sleep mode.

#### **Volume +/- button**


Press the **Volume +/-** button to increase or decrease the volume.

# **Navigating the Home Screen**



### **Notification & Status Bar**

Some indicators that inform you about the status of your tablet are shown at the top of the screen.

#### **Notification Shade**

Notifications may come from the system, a game, an application such as E-mail, or the music player.

When Notifications are available, related icons will appear in the top left corner of the screen. To open the Notification Shade, touch the Notification icon and swipe your finger down. Some notifications allow you to take specific actions by tapping icons within the notification.

After you are finished with a notification, just slide it away to the left or right. If you want to dismiss all notifications, tap the Dismiss icon \_\_ at the top of the notification.

### Status Bar & Quick Settings

The Status Bar in the top right corner shows various indicators, including Wi-Fi connection and battery status. To access "Quick Settings", touch the status bar and swipe down. You can then adjust various settings on the tablet by touching the corresponding square.

### **Notification & Status Icons**


### **Home Screen Icons**

## All Apps ፡:

Tap the All Apps icon (ii) to enter the All Apps screen.

In All Apps screen, you can:

- Move between screens: Slide up or down.
- Open an App: Tap its icon.
- Copy an App icon to the Home screen: Press and hold the icon or widget icon slowly to drag it to the Home screen.
- Get more apps: Tap the Google Play Store icon



**Tip:** Most apps include a Menu icon a near the top or bottom of the screen that lets you control the app's settings.

### Back <

Tap Back icon  $\triangleleft$  to return to the previous screen.

- The Back icon remains on the bottom of the screen at all times, allowing you to navigate back to the previous screen.
- Once you go back to the Home screen, you can't go back any further in your history.

Tap Home icon O from anywhere on your tablet to return to the Home screen.
Recent Apps
Tap Recent Apps icon to view recently used apps. Tap an app to use it again. You can slide down to see more apps. You can also slide it away to the left or right.



## **Battery Management and Charging**

The tablet has a built-in rechargeable battery.


### **Battery Icon**

The battery icon in the upper-right corner shows the battery level or charging status.



### **Charging the Battery**

Use the AC Adapter or the Micro-USB port to charge the battery.



Charging time will vary depending on remaining battery life. Charging from 0%, should take approximately 4-5 hours. You may not be able to turn on your tablet for at least 20 minutes if the battery was fully drained.

**Note:** In order to keep the battery working in best condition, please pay attention to the following:

- The included AC adapter is for use with this unit only. Do not use it with other equipment.
- Please do not charge the battery in high temperatures.
- Do not wait for the battery to be fully depleted before charging again. Keep the battery charged as needed.
- If tablet has not been used for a long period of time, the battery might be in over discharge protection mode and may take longer to charge.

#### **Prolong the Battery Life**

Here are some tips for how to prolong the life of the battery:

- If you aren't using Wi-Fi, go to Settings -> Wireless & networks -> Wi-Fi, turn it off.
- Don't leave the Maps or Navigation apps open on the screen when you're not using them.
- Turn down screen brightness and set a shorter screen timeout: Settings -> Device -> Display.
- If you don't need it, turn off automatic syncing for all apps: Settings -> Personal -> Accounts -> [Google account- name]. This means you need to sync manually to collect messages, email, and other recent information, and won't receive notifications when updates occur.


### **USB**

The tablet can be connected to a USB storage device to transfer music, pictures and other files in both directions.


Note: To enter the USB storage device, please go to **Settings -> Device -> Storage & USB**, and tap \_\_\_.

### **Headphones**

Headphones can be connected to the tablet's Headphone jack.



### **MicroSD**



Insert the microSD card into the tablet's microSD slot until it clicks.

To check the storage of the microSD card, go to **Settings -> Device -> Storage&USB**.


Remove the microSD card by pushing in on the card's edge. The card will pop out and can be removed.

#### **Notes:**

- You can use microSD<sup>™</sup>card and microSDHC<sup>™</sup>card (up to 64GB, SD card not included).
- Never remove or insert microSD card in On mode.

### **HDMI**


You can connect the unit to a TV or other display device using an HDMI cable through the HDMI port.



- Go to Settings -> Device -> Display -> HDMI settings, to turn on the HDMI.
- The system interface on the unit is automatically synchronized with your TV screen.

#### Wi-Fi

#### Connect to a Wi-Fi Network



- Go to Settings -> Wireless & networks, tap Wi-Fi to open the Wi-Fi screen and slide Wi-Fi to the ON position.
- The device will scan Wi-Fi networks automatically and display the available names.
- If the device finds a network that you connected to previously, it will connect to it automatically.
- 3. Tap a network name to connect to it, and enter a password if necessary.
- 4. Alternatively, if your Wi-Fi router supports Wi-Fi Protected Setup, you can go to the Advanced Wi-Fi screen (tap Menu icon at the upper right corner and select Advanced) and select WPS Push Button, then press the WPS button on your router.

5. If your network does not broadcast its SSID, tap

Menu icon at the upper right corner and select Add

network, and enter the Network SSID (name) of the
network. If necessary, enter security or other network

configuration details.

**Note:** you can tap **Menu icon** at the upper-right corner in the **Settings** screen for advanced settings.


### **VPN (Virtual Private Network)**

You can create a virtual private network (VPN) and connect to your private network securely through a public network such as the internet. You must set a lock screen PIN or password before you can use credential storage.

Add VPN network and follow the instructions on the screen.

### **Bluetooth**

You can use Bluetooth to communicate between the unit and other Bluetooth devices, such as a smartphone.



- Go to Settings -> Wireless & networks, tap Bluetooth to open the Bluetooth screen and slide Bluetooth to the ON position.
- 2. It will scan automatically and display the available bluetooth devices.
- 3. Tap an available bluetooth device name to pair with it and follow the instructions to complete the pairing.

**Note:** You can tap **Menu icon** at the upper right corner and select **Refresh** for scanning again.

#### **Receive Files**

When the Bluetooth share icon \$\$1 is shown in the Notification bar, touch and drag it to open the Notification Shade. Tap the notification and follow the instructions to complete the receiving.

#### **Send Files**

- 1. Go to All Apps :: -> File Manager.
- 2. Select a file you want to send, touch & hold it until the Notification bar appears. Touch icon 

  description and select Bluetooth, then follow the instructions to complete the sending.

# **Basic Operation**

### **First Time Operation**

### **Turning Your Tablet On for the First Time**

When using the tablet for the first time, you will be required to setup the following:

- 1. Select the language, then tap →.
- 2. Set the Wi-Fi.
- 3. If you have a Google Account, select "Yes". Then tap a network name to see more details or connect to it, and enter a password if necessary.
  - When prompted, sign in using the email address and password for your Google Account. If you don't have one yet, go ahead and create one.
- 4. Follow the onscreen instructions to setup the tablet.

## **Basic Operation**


### **Using the Touchscreen**

Here are some basic procedures for interacting with the touchscreen.




### Tap

To select an item on the touchscreen, lightly tap it.



### **Press & Hold**

In some instances, touching the item and holding your finger on it will present other options or menus.



### **Drag or Swipe**

While holding an item such as an icon, it can sometimes be moved by dragging it to another area or screen. You may also be able to swipe your finger across a screen or item to navigate or move it.



#### Zoom

By placing two fingers on the screen, you can slide them apart to "Zoom In", or pinch them together to "Zoom Out".

### **Customizing the Home Screen**

- From All Apps screen to Home screen: Tap All Apps icon
   to open All Apps screen, press & hold an icon slowly to drag it to the location of your choice. This makes it much easier to change your Home screen layout.
- View widgets: Press & hold the screen on your Home screen, the widgets icon will display, and then tap it.
   Widgets are app information displays that can be placed on your Home screen.
- Move apps or widgets: Press & hold an icon or widget, slowly to drag it to the screen edge, the screen will switch.

- Delete apps or widgets: Press & hold an icon or widget, when the "X" icon appears at the top of the screen, drag the icon or widget into it.
- Press & hold the screen on your Home screen, and the wallpaper icon will display, tap it and choose a wallpager.

### **Google Now**

To create a truly personalized experience, using your location and personal Google account information, use Google Now. Touch and Hold the Home icon, and slide up to the Google Now icon. Follow the instructions to setup your Google Now experience.

### **Voice Search & Voice Actions**

#### Turn Voice Search or Voice Action On

You can initiate a Voice Search or Voice Action by tapping the Microphone icon on top of the Home screen.

When you're viewing the Google Now screen, you don't have to touch anything. Just say "Google."

**Note:** To detect when you say "Google" to launch Voice Search or Voice Actions, your tablet analyzes sound picked up by your tablet's microphone in intervals of a few seconds or less.

### **Using Voice Search**

After tapping the microphone icon, just say whatever it is you want Google to search for.

### **Using Voice Actions**

There are many actions that the tablet can perform using "Voice Actions". For example, you can send emails, set alarms, play a song, or navigate to a website. Just tap the Microphone icon, and say what you want the tablet to do. As you speak, Voice Search analyzes your speech and initiates the action.

If Voice Search doesn't understand you, it lists a set of possible meanings. Just tap the one you want.

## **Google Play**

In addition to the apps that come preinstalled on your tablet, you can download Android apps and games, music, movies, TV shows and magazines using the Google Play Store app.

- 1. On the App menu, touch the Google Play Store icon.
- 2. To search for an item from the Google Play Store app, touch the search icon in the upper right corner, and then type a keyword to search.
- 3. Touch an available item to go to its details page. From there you can install or download the item.

# **Settings**

Settings lets you configure the tablet, set app options, add accounts, and change other preferences.

### Wireless & networks

**Wi-Fi** — Enable or disable **Wi-Fi**, and connect to a wireless network so that you can check email, search the Web, or access social media websites.

**Bluetooth** — Enable or disable **Bluetooth**.

More... — Enable or disable Airplane mode or VPN.

### **Device**

Display — Set HDMI settings, ScreenshotSetting, Brightness level, Wallpaper, Sleep, Daydream, Font size, when device is rotated and Cast.

**Sound & notifications** — Set **Sound general settings**, **Notification & Others**.

Storage & USB — View available space in Internal Storage, USB Storage and SD Card /set the related items.

**Battery** — View battery status.

**Apps** — View all apps and set preferences for **Configure app**. To view information or uninstall an app, tap the relevant app.

### **Personal**

Location — Set Mode (Battery saving), Recent location requests and Location services.

• Battery saving: use Wi-Fi, Bluetooth to determine location.

Security — Set preferences for Screen security, Passwords, Device administration, Credential storage and Advanced.

Language & input — Set preferences for Language, Keyboard & input methods, Speech and Mouse/trackpad.

**Accounts** — You can add an email account or another type of account.

**Google** — Set preferences for **Google**.

Backup & reset — Set preferences for Backup my data, Network settings reset and Factory data reset.

### **SYSTEM**

**Date & time** — Enable or disable **Automatic date & time**, and select preferences for date, time, time zone, time format, and date format.

Accessibility — Select preferences for Services and System.

Printing — Enable or disable PRINT SERVICES.

#### **About tablet**

Check System updates, Status, Legal information, etc.

### Google

A Google Account lets you organize and access your personal information from any computer or mobile device.

#### Add an Account

You can use multiple Google Accounts and Microsoft Exchange ActiveSync accounts on your tablet.

You may also be able to add other kinds of accounts, depending on your apps. To add some accounts, you may need to obtain details from your system administrator about the service to which the account connects. For example, you may need to know the account's domain or server address.

- 1. Go to Settings -> Personal -> Accounts -> Add account.
- 2. Tap the kind of account to add. And then follow the onscreen instructions.

#### Remove an Account

To remove a Google account, go to **Settings -> Personal -> Accounts -> Google -> [account-name] Menu icon : -> Remove account.**

### Playing a Disc (Basic Playback)

### **Playing a Disc**

- 1. At Home screen,tap DVD Player icon. To open the DVD door, hold the display panel while pressing the OPEN button.
- 2. Hold the disc by its sides and carefully place it onto the spindle with the label side facing up, pushing gently until you hear a "click".
- 3. Close the disc door. It takes a short while for your unit to load the disc. After loading, the unit will automatically bring you to the main menu of the DVD or start playing the DVD.
- 4. If the unit does not automatically start playing the DVD, tap the ►IIPLAY/PAUSE icon on the panel.

### Pausing Playback (Still Mode)

Tap the ►IIPLAY/PAUSE icon. To resume normal playback, tap the ►IIPLAY/PAUSE icon on the panel.

### **Stopping Playback**

Tap the ■STOP icon at the location where you want to interrupt playback. To resume playback at the position where the disc was stopped, tap the ►IIPLAY/PAUSE icon. If you tap the ■STOP twice, the unit's memory will be cleared and tapping the ►IIPLAY/PAUSE icon will reset the DVD to the beginning.

### Skip (Forward / Reverse)

- Tap the ►►I NEXT icon to advance titles, chapters/tracks.
- Tap the I◄◄PREV icon to go back to current or previous titles, chapters/tracks.

#### **Audio Selection**

On some DVDs, the sound is recorded in two or more formats. Follow the directions below to select the preferred language and sound system.

1. While a disc is playing, tap AUDIO icon to show the current audio format number.

# Audio 1/3:Dolby D 2ch English

2. Tap the AUDIO icon repeatedly to select the desired audio format.

#### **Notes:**

- If only one audio format is recorded on the DVD, the number does not change.
- You can select different audio channels (Stereo, Mono Left, Mono Right or Mix-Mono) on an Audio CD by tapping the AUDIO icon repeatedly.

#### **Subtitle Selection**

1. While a DVD is playing, tap the SUBTITLE icon to display the current language setting, as shown in the example.

### Subtitle 02/03:Spanish


2. Tap the SUBTITLE icon repeatedly to select the desired subtitle language. You can turn subtitles off by tapping the SUBTITLE icon repeatedly until the "Subtitle Off" is displayed.

#### **Notes:**

- Some DVDs are set to display subtitles automatically, and you cannot turn them off even if you set the subtitle function to off.
- During some scenes, the subtitles may not appear immediately after you select your desired scene.
- The number of subtitle languages recorded differs depending on the disc. If only one language is recorded, the language does not change.
- This function can only be used for discs on which subtitles have been recorded in multiple languages.
- Some DVDs allow you to change subtitles using the disc menu only. If this is the case, tap the MENU icon and choose the appropriate subtitle on the disc menu.

### **Display Function**

While the disc is playing, tap the DISPLAY icon repeatedly to display information on operation status.



### Repeat Playback

You can play a specific DVD title or chapter repeatedly (title repeat, chapter repeat, A-B repeat).

### Repeating a Chapter

1. While the DVD is playing, tap the REPEAT icon until the "Chapter" indicator displays on the screen. The current chapter is played repeatedly.

### Repeating a Title

2. While the DVD is playing, tap the REPEAT icon until the "Title" indicator displays on the screen. The current title is played repeatedly.

### **To Resume Normal Playback**

3. While the DVD is playing, tap the REPEAT icon until the "
Repeat Off "indicator displays on the screen.

You can play a single CD track or the whole disc repeatedly.

### Repeating a Single Track

While the CD is playing, tap the REPEAT icon until the "
 Track " indicator displays on the screen. The current track is played repeatedly.

### Repeating the Whole Disc

2. While the CD is playing, tap the REPEAT icon until the " All " indicator displays on the screen. The whole disc is played repeatedly.

### **To Resume Normal Playback**

3. While the CD is playing, tap the  $\nearrow$  REPEAT icon until the "Repeat Off" indicator displays on the screen.

### Repeating a Specific Section

- 1. While the disc is playing, Tap the AB REPEAT AB icon at the beginning of the section (" A" is displayed) you want to play repeatedly.
- 2. Tap the AB REPEAT A-B icon again at the end of the section (" AB" is displayed). The unit will immediately begin replaying your selection.
- 3. While the disc is playing, tap the TAB REPEAT A-B icon until the "TAB OFF" indicator displays on the screen to resume normal playback.

#### **Notes:**


- Some discs may not permit A-B repeat operation.
- you cannot set the A-B repeat function for a s e g m e n t t h a t includes multiple camera angles.
- You can specify a segment only within the current title or track.
- There may be a slight difference between point A and the location where playback actually resumes depending on the disc.

### **Viewing JPEG Files**

This unit can play JPEG files recorded on a CD-R or CD-ROM disc (CD-RW is not recommended).

### **Viewing JPEG Files**

- Press the OPEN button to open the disc door.
- 2. Hold a JPEG file disc by its edges and gently push it onto the spindle with the label side facing up until you hear a "click".



- 3. Close the disc door.
  The JPEG files on the disc will be displayed one by one automatically. If the disc does not play automatically, Tap the ►IIPLAY/PAUSE icon.
- 4. Tap the ■STOP button to display a folder list. Tap the ▲ / ▼ button to highlight a JPEG file to play. Tap the ►IIPLAY/ PAUSE icon to start playback.

#### **Notes:**

- You can tap the I PLAY/PAUSE icon to freeze the picture.
   Tap the I PLAY/PAUSE icon to resume picture slide show.
- You can tap the 

  STOP icon to quit playback.
- You can tap the I◄◄PREV icon or ►►I NEXT icon to change the picture.
- Some discs may not permit this operation.

### **Trouble Shooting**

### Tablet displays network or service error message

 When you are located in places with poor signal, your tablet may lose its Wi-Fi connection. Try moving closer to the Wi-Fi router.

### Touch screen response is slow or incorrect

If the tablet's touch screen response is incorrect, please try the following:

- Remove any protective film on the touch screen. The protective film may prevent the device recognition input.
- Make sure that your fingers are dry and clean before you tap the touch screen.
- Restart the tablet to clear any temporary software bugs.

### Tablet is frozen or a serious error appears

- If the tablet is frozen or suspended, you may need to close the app program or reset the tablet.
- If the tablet is frozen or slow to respond, press and hold the power button for 15 seconds to reset the tablet.
- If that doesn't work, insert a paper clip into the RESET hole on the back of the tablet, then press and hold the **Power**  $\circlearrowleft$  button for 4~5 seconds to turn on the unit.

#### **Tablet gets warm**

 When using for a long time, the tablet may be warm. This is normal and will not affect the life or performance of the unit.

# Tablet can not show video of opposite side during skype call

- The Wi-Fi signal is poor. Please move closer to your wireless router, or disconnect other devices from your wireless router, or increase bandwidth of internet connection.
- Please check the Wi-Fi setting. It's recommended to use an IEEE 802.11 b/g/n. certified Wi-Fi network.

### Insufficient storage

 We recommend to reserve at least 700MB of free space in internal storage for APP download.

### The disc does not play

- There is no disc inside ("No Disc" appears on the screen).
- Insert the disc correctly with the playback side facing down.
- Clean the disc.
- A non-NTSC disc has been inserted. The unit and disc region number are incompatible.
- Condensation may have formed inside the unit due to a sudden change in temperature. Wait about an hour for it to clear and try again.

#### No picture

• The region number of the disc doesn't match the region number of this unit.

### The picture is not clear

- Clean the disc.
- The disc is scratched.
