



1	USB port 1	Supports connection of compatible removable storage devices, portable media players, digital cameras with USB connectors, and USB wireless adapters.
2	Reset button (bottom of device)	Press for one second to reset to factory defaults (see "Device Reset" on page 183). Press and hold 10 seconds to toggle between NTSC and PAL. Use a fine-tipped stylus or the unfolded end of a paperclip to press the reset switch.

Steady flashing— A USB device has been discovered and the unit is being mounted in the system. If the Media Library is set to On in the Setup options (see "Media Library Compilation" on page 52), the LED flashes at the same steady constant rate. Installation Requirements

- Standard or HD TV with a composite (standard A/V), component (YPbPr), or HDMI input
- An available network connection for online content and services

Optional: TV, stereo, or AV receiver with an optical digital (S/PDIF) or stereo audio input jack (audio playback only)

Important: For highest performance and reliability, it is recommended that you install the latest updates and service pack (SP). For Windows, go to the **Start** menu and select **Windows Update**. For Mac, go to the **Apple** menu and select **Software Update**.

Installation Procedure

The media player installation procedure is outlined below:

- 1. Transfer content from your computer to the USB storage media. See "Step 1 Loading Content onto your USB Drive" on page 12.
- 2. Connect the power cable. See "Step 2 Connecting the Power Cable" on page 13.
- 3. Connect the media player to your TV or entertainment unit. See "Step 3 Connecting the Media Player" on page 14. You can use HDMI (page 15), component (page 16), or composite (page 17) connections.
- 4. Insert the batteries into the remote control.
- 5. Connect the USB device containing your media content ("Step 4 Connecting a USB Device (Optional)" on page 19) and/or establish a wired or wireless network connection ("Step 5 Connecting to Your Network" on page 21).

Step 1 - Loading Content onto your USB Drive

Transfer your favorite content from your computer to your external USB drive, such as My Passport® or My Book® (external USB drives and stand not included).




Step 2 - Connecting the Power Cable

1. If applicable, connect the power clip to the power cable plug.

The AC power adapter will vary, depending on your location. Some locations do not require a power plug clip. Units sold in those locations will have a fixed power plug. Refer to the illustration below.





2. Connect the power cable to the media player's DC connector, and then plug the opposite end into an AC power outlet. The media player powers up automatically.




Wait a few seconds for your TV to detect the media player. If it is not detected, you may need to change the input source on your TV to HDMI or composite, depending on your connection. Check the user documentation of your TV for more information.

Once the media player is detected, the splash screen displays to indicate system bootup, then the home screen of the user interface opens.

Step 3 - Connecting the Media Player

The following figures illustrate the cable connections supported by the media player. The standard connection uses the included composite-to-mini AV cables.





Important: Configure the media player's Audio/Video settings depending on the type of connection you choose. See "Audio/Video Output" on page 166 for more information on these settings.

Choosing the Best Connection

The quality of the picture produced by your TV depends on the quality of your TV and its connection to the media player.

HDMI (High Definition)



Composite (Standard Definition)



HDMI Video and Audio (High Definition)

HDMI combines high-definition video, multi-channel audio, and inter-component control in a single digital cable. This interface provides video quality resolution of up to 1080p.

To connect your media player using an HDMI cable:

- 1. Plug an HDMI cable into the HDMI connector on the media player.
- 2. Plug the opposite end into the HDMI port on your TV or audio/video system (if available).



Wait a few seconds for your TV to detect the media player. If it is not detected, you may need to change the input source on your TV to HDMI. Check the user documentation of your TV for more information.

Once the media player is detected, the splash screen displays to indicate system bootup, then the home screen of the user interface opens.



Note: HDMI cables are sold separately.

Composite AV Connection (Standard Definition)

To use a composite connection:

- 1. Plug the mini-connector into the composite port on the media player.
- 2. Plug the opposite ends into the composite input ports on your TV, yellow to yellow, red to red, and white to white.
- 3. Select the appropriate TV input source.



Wait a few seconds for your TV to detect the media player. If the media player is not detected, you may need to change the input source on your TV to component or composite, depending on your connection. Check the user documentation of your TV for more information.

Once the media player is detected, the splash screen displays to indicate system bootup, then the home screen of the user interface opens.

Home Theater (High Definition)

To connect a home theater system:

- 1. Plug an HDMI cable into the HDMI connector on the media player.
- 2. Plug the opposite end into the HDMI In port on your AV receiver.
- 3. Plug an HDMI cable into the HDMI Out port on your AV receiver.
- 4. Plug the opposite end into the HDMI port on your TV (if available).
- 5. Select the appropriate TV input source.



To connect a home theater system using S/PDIF:

- 1. Plug a S/PDIF cable into the S/PDIF connector on the media player.
- 2. Plug the opposite end into the S/PDIF In port on your A/V receiver.
- 3. Plug HDMI or composite connectors to the appropriate Out ports on the media player.
- 4. Plug the opposite end(s) into the appropriate port(s) on your TV.
- 5. Select the appropriate TV input source.
- 6. Set the appropriate audio output option on the media player. See "Audio/Video Output" on page 166.





HDMI and S/PDIF cables sold separately.

Step 4 - Connecting a USB Device (Optional)

The media player has two USB ports that support playback from WD USB external drives.*

* For a list of supported WD external drives, see article #5688 in or knowledge base at http://support.wdc.com.

To connect the USB device:

1. Connect the USB device to either of the media player's USB ports.



2. Wait for a few moments while the media player scans the USB device for media files. (Scanning is enabled by default. If you want to turn off automatic scanning, go to "Media Library Compilation" on page 52.)

To unlock a locked WD USB device:

A USB device must be unlocked for the media player to access its contents.

- 1. Navigate to the Home screen, and select the menu for the media content you wish to access. It can be Music, Videos, or Photo.
- 2. In the Unlock your WD Drive screen, press ◀/▶ to select **OK**, then press **OK**.
- 3. Use the navigation buttons ▲▼◀▶ to type in the USB drive access password in the on-screen keyboard. Select **Submit**, then press **OK**.
 - If a wrong password is entered, press **I**/**I** to select **OK**, press **OK**, then type in the correct password. If you enter the wrong password five consecutive times, the USB drive is placed in a hold state. Press **OK** to close the error message. Disconnect the USB drive. Power cycle and reconnect the USB drive and type in the correct access password.
- 4. Once the USB drive has been unlocked, the menu bar for the selected media type will appear. Press ▲/▼ to choose a filter option for displaying supported media contents, then press OK.
 - Supported content for the selected media type will be displayed.
- 5. Use the navigation buttons **AV** to select the content you wish to access, then press **OK** to start media playback.

Removing a USB Device

To prevent data loss, it is highly recommended that you first press the **EJECT** button on the remote control before removing a USB device.

To remove a USB device:

- 1. Press the **HOME** button .
- 2. Press the **EJECT** button
- 3. Press ▲/▼ to select the USB device.
- 4. Press **OK**. With the **v** selected, press **OK** again.



5. Disconnect the USB device from the media player.

Step 5 - Connecting to Your Network

The media player can be connected to your home network to access the Internet and network storage using a wired or wireless network connection. A network connection provides access to locally stored and online media content.

Wired Network Connection

To connect to a home network using an Ethernet cable:

- 1. Plug an Ethernet cable (sold separately) into the Ethernet connector on the media player.
- 2. Plug the opposite end of the Ethernet cable directly into a LAN port on a router or network switch.

Note: Streaming over wi-fi may be unstable due to various reasons such as a weak network connection, signal strength, variable speeds, or other environmental factors. Network Setup

The media player can be connected to the local area network using a wired or wireless network connection for access to streaming video and online and offline media content.

Ethernet Network (Wired) Setup

- 1. Plug an Ethernet cable into the Ethernet connector on the media player.
- 2. Plug the opposite end of the Ethernet cable directly into a LAN port on a router or network switch.
- 3. Navigate to the Home | Setup menu bar.
- 4. Press ▲/▼ to select **Network Settings**, then press **OK**.




5. Press ▲/▼ to select **Network Setup**, then press **OK**.



Select a setup configuration option, then press **OK**.
 Select **Automatic** to have the device attempt to detect your network connection automatically, then go to step 11.

Select **Manual** to manually set your network connection, then proceed to step 7.



7. Once the network is detected, the following screen appears. Press ▲/▼ to select IP address, then press **OK**.




8. Press **▼** to key in your IP address using the on-screen keyboard. Select **Submit**, then press **OK**.



- 9. Repeat the step above to key in values for the subnet mask, gateway, and DNS settings.






Note: The recommended setting on Wireless N routers is 802.11n-only with a channel width of 20/40 MHz. If you are using a wireless-N access point (AP) and it has been set to operate in 802.11n mode with a security setting of anything other than WPA2-PSK+AES or None, the media player operates at 802.11g rates. Disabling wireless security is not recommended.







Checking the Network Connection

If you experience network problems, check the network connection to determine the cause of the problem.

To check the network connection:

- 1. Press **Setup** or navigate to the Home | Setup menu bar.
- 2. Press ▲/▼ to select **Network Settings**, then press **OK**.
- 3. Press ▲/▼ to select **Check Connection**, then press **OK**.

The unit will automatically check the network connection. Once the check is completed, the results display. A green check mark on these items indicate that there is no problem with your network settings. If a problem is indicated, check your router settings and manual for a solution.



A red cross mark indicates a problem with the network settings. It can either be the IP address or the DNS server address. If the problem persists, check with your Internet service provider.



Network Services

Share a Folder on Your Computer

Make sure the media player and your computer are both attached to the network, then follow the instructions below for your operating system (Windows 7/Vista/XP or Mac).



Important: Be sure to update your operating system to the latest update or service pack. Depending on your network's configuration you may need to disable or adjust your Firewall settings to view your shared folder on your network. Contact your Firewall manufacturer for assistance.


To access media content from a network share, media server, or online account:

- 1. Navigate to the Home screen, and select the menu for media content you wish to access. It can be Music, Videos, or Photos. Press **OK**.
- 2. Press **OK** to select a new content source or press **B** or **△**/ **▶** to select Select Content Source **D**, then press **OK**.
- 3. Press ▲/▼ to select the network resource where the media content you want to access is located, then press **OK**.



Logging in to a Network Resource or Online Account

When accessing a network resource, you need to enter in the user name and password for the device or account using the on-screen keyboard. In some cases, a default anonymous login displays if no password is set for the device. When this happens, accept the default login, select , then press **OK**.



Select **Remember Me** and press **OK** to have the media player remember the user name and password for the resource.

Local Storage

Select Local Storage to access media content on a USB storage device connected to the media player. If the media player and your computer are attached to the network, you can transfer files back and forth between your computer and the USB storage device. See "Transferring Files" on page 38.

Network Share


This menu displays shared computers and network attached storage devices (such as WD's My Book® Live™ personal cloud storage NAS drive) connected to your network via the Samba protocol.

To access a shared folder under Network Share:



Media Server

This menu displays network attached media servers (such as the WD TV[®] Live Hub[™] media center) connected to your network via the DLNA protocol. Follow the steps above under "Accessing a Shared Folder," selecting the name of your media server and referencing your media server documentation for password setup and administration if necessary.

Online Service

This menu allows you to connect to media content stored in your Facebook and Picasa online accounts. Select **Facebook** or **Picasa** and enter your user name and password to access your media content.



Network Share (NFS)

This menu displays shared computers and network attached storage devices connected to your network via the NFS protocol.

Follow the steps above under "Accessing a Shared Folder," selecting the name of your NAS device or computer and referencing your NAS device or operating system documentation for password setup and administration if nessecary.

Transferring Files

If the media player has an active network connection, any USB drive connected to it can serve as a network drive. This allows you to transfer files between your media player and your computer. This feature is applicable to a PC running the Windows® XP, Windows Vista®, or Windows 7 operating systems, as well to a Macintosh® computer running Mac® OS X® Leopard® or Snow Leopard®.

Enabling File Sharing on the Network Share (Samba Server)

- 1. Navigate to the Home | Setup menu bar.
- 2. Press ▲/▼ to select Network Settings, then press **OK**.

3. Press ▲/▼ to select **Network Share Server** and make sure the option is set to **On**.



4. Note the name indicated in the **Device name** field. This will help you identify your media player on the network.

Moving Files Between the Media Player and a Windows Computer

Using the Web UI

The media player provides a Web-based user interface (UI) that can be used to control certain functions. You must use a network-connected computer or smart phone to use the Web UI.



Important: Your media player must be set up on the network (see "Network Setup" on page 22 for further information) to use the Web UI.

Launching the Web UI

1. Open a Web brower and type in your media's center's IP address in the address field. Press **ENTER** on your computer keyboard.



Note: To find your media player's IP address, press **Setup** on the remote controller and navigate to **Network Settings**. Select **Network Setup** to see the media player's IP address.

- 2. The Web UI launch page displays. Enter the default password ("admin") in the **Password** field.
- 3. Select your preferred language from the **Language** list.

4. Click I accept END USER LICENSE AGREEMENT, then click Login. You can also click Keep me signed in.



5. The Web UI menu options display.



System

Click **System** in the Web UI home page to manage the system status of your media player and view general network information and important messages. You can change the password, set system preferences, and choose date and time settings using these options.



Remote

Click **Remote** in the Web UI home page to control the media player using your computer. Click the buttons on the virtual remote controller to control your media player (see "Using the Remote Control" on page 46 for further information).




Click the **Open in separate window** link to open the virtual remote controller in a new browser screen. You can copy the URL from this browser screen and enter it in a browser on your smartphone. Then, you can use your smartphone as a virtual remote controller by touching the buttons on the screen.

Enter on-screen keyboard commands in the **Submit** field using your computer or smartphone keyboard, then click or press **Submit** when finished.




RSS

Click **RSS** to view your RSS subscriptions and category folders. Here, you can add a new subscription or a new folder to categorize your subscriptions.

Using the Remote Control

The media player's ergonomic remote control lets you navigate the Home screen, browse for media files, enable playback options, and customize the system settings. The infrared sensor detects signals from the remote.



Important: Make sure there are no obstructions between the remote control and the infrared sensor on the media player.



The Music, Videos, and Photos options represent folders for the different media types. Media contents display either as file/file folders in the media player, network attached storage, or a USB drive directory or as a media library compilation list based on metadata information. For example, music files can be categorized based on their genre or the artist's name.

Setup lets you customize the way you use the media player and set preferences for media playback. For more information, see "Setup and Advanced Features" on page 165.

Media Player Dashboard

Press ▼ at the home screen or navigate to then press **OK** in the in the Videos, Music, or Photos menus to launch the dashboard. Press ▼ or **Back** to exit the dashboard. Your Favorites are shown by default.



Navigate to to filter the media files and internet service links shown on the main dashboard page by category and media type. For example, to find photos you have added in the last 30 days, select Last 30 days and press **OK**, Photo and press **OK**, then press **OK** again.



Navigate to and press **OK** to toggle between list and thumbnail views.

Press \triangle , Use the $\blacktriangleleft/\triangleright$ navigation buttons, then press **OK** in the dashboard to display your media files by the following categories:

- **Favorites** (see "Favorite" on page 62)
- Last 30 Days (displays media files you have added in the last 30 days)
- Queue (Use the ◀/▶ navigation buttons then select the Videos, Music, or Photos icon, then press **OK** see "Add to Queue" on page 62)
- Recently Viewed (displays media files you have viewed in the last xx days)

After selecting a category, filter the results by media type (Videos, Audio, or Photo). Then, use the navigation buttons to select a file then press **OK** to begin playback.



- **Favorite** (when a file in Queue, Last 30 Days, or Recently Viewed is selected see "Favorite" on page 62).
- Copy (see "Move & Copy" on page 63).
- Remove from Favorite/Remove from Queue removes the selected file from the Favorites or Queue categories.
- Delete (see "Delete" on page 63).
- **Edit Multiple** (see "Select Multiple" on page 64).

Media Library Compilation

Media Library Compilation refers to the process of scanning and consolidating the media contents of the media player, network attached storage, or an attached USB device into one comprehensive database so that you can easily browse and locate media files based on certain metadata information (e.g., video files are categorized based on title or release date).

Media Library Compilation Exemptions

The following conditions will prevent the media library compilation process.

- The USB device has read-only protection.
- There is not enough storage space on the media player, network attached storage, or USB device.
- A drive is locked.

To turn off Media Library Compilation (default is On):

- 1. Navigate to Home | Setup | System.
- 2. Select Media Library, and then press OK.



3. Select **OFF**, then press **OK**.



Note: Clear Media Library clears then rebuilds the media library.

Supported Categories for Media Library Compilation

Once the media library compilation process is completed, all available media files are organized under their respective media type directory. By default, media contents are displayed as thumbnails (music album/movie poster art, image thumbnail). The content categories are listed in the following table.

Media Type	Category	Description
Music	All Tracks	Displays a list of all audio files arranged in alphabetical order.
	Artist	Content is categorized based on the artist name.
	Genre	Content is categorized based on genre.
	Album	Content is categorized based on album names.

Locating Your Contents on the Drive

There are two ways of locating a particular media file depending on whether or not the media library compilation function is enabled.

Manual Search

You can manually search for a media file by navigating to the specific media section and browsing through the available file folders. This method is recommended if there are only a limited number of files to search through. Otherwise, it is better to enable the media library compilation and use the built-in Search function.

Button	Function
▲▼ Up/Down arrows	Select a media type (photos, video, or music) or settings Select one of the option icons in an Internet service's submenu bar
Left/Right arrows	Move within a category

Use the navigation buttons to move around a particular folder; press **Back** to move between folders.

Thumbnail Support for Media Files

Your media player supports thumbnails in two ways - embedded or external (some file formats do not support embedded thumbnails).

Embedded thumbnails are images that are part of the media file itself. File formats that support embedded thumbnails:

Music - MP3 and WMA

Photo - JPEG

Video - MP4

To add an external thumbnail:

With an individual file or music album selected, press **Options**, then select **Get Content Info** (see "Get Content Info" on page 61). As an alternative, or if the database did not find any info:

- 1. Select a JPEG, GIF, or PNG image file that you want to display as a thumbnail of the music or video file.
- 2. Save the file in the same location as the file it will represent, according to the following guidelines:

Folder Thumbnail Guidelines

Music:

- Display folder.jpg (the image file must be named "folder.jpg" or thumbnail will not function)
- If no folder.jpg file is found, display the first embedded album art image found in the folder
- If no album art is available, display the first .JPG in the folder

Photo:

Display thumbnail

Video:

- Display embedded cover art
- If no embedded cover art is available, display image file associated with the video file to be played (for example video.mkv will be associated with video.JPG)

File Thumbnail View Functions (Defaults)

Music:

- Display album art (.MP3 file with embedded .JPG)
- If no album art is available, display the image file with the same name as the audio file to be played. (for example, song.wav will be associated with song.jpg)

Photo:

Display thumbnail

Video:

- Display .MP4 with embedded .JPG
- Display image file associated with the video file to be played (for example video.mkv will be associated with video.JPG)





Video Playback

To play back video:

1. Navigate to the Home | Videos menu, then press **OK**.



2. The screen displays available video files and video folders in the media player's local drive by default. The display will either be in preview view (default), grid view, list view, or gallery view, depending on your Browser Display setting (see "Video Settings" on page 171 for more information on Browser Display settings).

Preview mode displays file size, and file type and genre (if available) for the selected video.



If Media Library is enabled, you can choose to navigate using a filter option (All Videos, By Date, By Folders, By Year, Personal rating, or Playlists) by selecting the Video icon and then using the left and right arrow buttons on the remote control to scroll through the options listed. See "Supported Categories for Media Library Compilation" on page 53 for details.

- 3. Locate the video file you want to play.
 - To begin playback of a single video file, highlight the file, and then press **OK**.
 - To begin playback of a video playlist, highlight the playlist name, then press **PAUSE/PLAY**.
 - To begin playback of all video files in a folder, highlight a video in that folder, then press **PAUSE/PLAY**.
 - To find a video on a network share or media player, follow the instructions in "Accessing Media Content" on page 36.

If you try to open a video file that has been partially played before, you are prompted to choose whether to play the file from the beginning or resume playback from the last playback position. Select **Resume** to resume playback or **Restart** to start playback from the beginning.







View Info

Press ▲/▼ and select **View Info** from the list of options after you have associated content info with a file. A synopsis/description of the title info displays.

Add to Queue

Adding videos to the queue provides quick access to these files via the dashboard (see "Media Player Dashboard" on page 50).

Rate

Rate your videos and other media files so you can sort and filter them by ratings and access them guickly in the dashboard.

- 1. Press ▲/ ▼ and select **Rate Video** from the list of options.
- 2. Press ◀/▶ to highlight the number of stars corresponding to your preferred rating. Five is the highest rating, and one is the lowest.
- 3. Press **OK** to confirm your rating.

Favorite

Favorite your videos other media files so you can sort and filter them by favorite and access them quickly in the dashboard.



Playing Music From Your iPod®

Apple[®] uses a proprietary naming scheme and because of this the media player is unable to display the original names for the folders and files as they are in your iPod. The media player instead reassigns new names for the folders and files, but only while in use with the media player. The original file information is preserved in your iPod. You can view the original file information when you play a file where the screen will display the metadata.



Note: The media player does not support playback of protected premium content such as movies or music from the iTunes® Store, Cinema Now, Movielink®, Amazon Unbox™, and Vongo®.

To use your iPod with the media player, simply plug your iPod in to the USB port and navigate through the interface menu.



Note: The media player only supports USB mass storage mode. iPod Touch is not a USB mass storage device and is therefore not supported.



- 1. Press $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ to select a game from the list in the main screen, then press **OK**.
- 2. Select a video feed (HOME or AWAY broadcast), then press OK.

3. Select a playback option (Watch From Beginning, Resume Watching, Watch Live), then press OK.



Game Playback





- At present, Pandora is only available for users located in the United States. You
 must have a US-based network connection.


To set the system language to English:

Once you have successfully signed in to Pandora, the Stations screen appears.



From this screen you can create new stations, start listening to previously created stations and Quickmix playlist, and define profile preferences for your account.

Pandora Stations

A Pandora station is a personalized stream of music, based on one or more artist names or song titles of your choice. Once you've signed in to Pandora from your media player, you can easily access your stations from the Music menu bar.

Pandora stations reminders

- You can have up to 100 stations at any one time, plus one QuickMix. Once you reach this maximum number of stations you have to delete a station before you can add another one.
- Pandora does not allow immediate or "on demand" playback of a specific song.
- A Pandora station cannot play more than four songs by an artist in a three-hour period.
- After eight hours of play, Pandora prompts you to see if you're still listening.
 Streaming stops until you respond.
- The music selection streamed into your Pandora station contains a mix of songs or artists that were compiled based on:
 - the initial station "seed' used in creating that station. Go to the next section for instructions on how to create a new Pandora station.
 - the track feedback (thumbs up / thumbs down) you provide. Go to page 138 for more information.
 - the number of skips assigned to a track. Go to page 138 for more information.
- You cannot reverse or immediately replay the songs played on your Pandora station.

To create a Pandora station:

- Navigate to Create Station or press Options to select Create station. Press OK.
- 2. Use the navigation buttons **AV** to type the name of an artist or song title using the on-screen keyboard. Select **Submit**, then press **OK**.
- Press ▲/▼ to select a listing from the search results, then press OK.
 The listing you selected will serve as the station 'seed' for Pandora to compile and stream music similar to your station.

To listen to a Pandora station:


- 1. On the **Stations** screen, use the navigation buttons to select the name of the station you want to listen to.
- 2. Press **II** ▶ or **OK** to start listening to the selected Pandora station. Press **NEXT ▶** to go to the next song.

To tune in to another station:

- 1. While listening to a station, press **STOP** ■. You are returned to the Stations screen.
- 2. Use the navigation buttons to select the name of the station you want to switch to
- 3. Press **II** ▶ or **OK** to start listening to the selected station.

To rename a Pandora station:

- 1. Tune in to the station you want to rename.
- 2. Navigate to Rename Station or press Options then ▲/▼ to select Rename this station. Press OK.



3. Use the navigation buttons ▲▼◀▶ to key in a new station name using the onscreen keyboard. Select **Submit**, then press **OK**.

To delete a Pandora station:

- 1. Tune in to the station you want to delete.
- 2. Navigate to **Delete Station** or press **Options** then ▲/▼ to select **Remove this** station. Press **OK**.
- 3. Press **◄/▶** to select **OK** on the confirmation prompt, then press **OK**.

QuickMix

QuickMix is a feature that allows you to listen to more than one of your stations at once. QuickMix will play only one song based on particular musical characteristics at a time (unlike regular Pandora stations, which play four related songs in a row), so the mood changes more often.

Providing Song Feedback

You can influence the music selection that is streamed into your Pandora station by providing track feedback for the song currently playing. You can give a song a "thumbs up" or a "thumbs down" vote.

Thumbs up

If you like the currently playing song, give it a thumbs up vote. This positive feedback means:

- The very next set of songs for this station will be generated using the song you've given a "thumbs up" vote to as a musical starting point.
- Future sets of songs are likely to have similar musical traits. Multiple "thumbs up" votes on this station for other similar songs will have a cumulative effect.
- This song will play somewhat more often than other songs on this station's potential playlist, and will play about as often as other songs that have received a "thumbs up" on this station.

Thumbs down

If you don't want to hear a song on a particular station, give it a thumbs down vote. This negative feedback means:

- The song will stop playing, if there are any of the remaining "six skips per hour" available on that particular station (this limit is per station, on a rolling per-hour basis).
- The song will be permanently removed from that particular station's playlist.
- A new set of songs with a different musical emphasis will begin to play.
- If you've given at least two "thumbs down" vote to a specific artist on that particular station, songs from that artist will no longer be included in that station's playlist.

To provide song feedback:

While a song is playing, press
 ✓ to select ★ or ▼, then press OK.
 A prompt to confirm your vote appears.

Putting a Song to Sleep

When you want to stop listening to song, but not permanently remove it from a station's playlist, you put it to "sleep." This prevents the song from playing on any of your stations for 30 days.

To put a song to sleep:

While a song is playing, press
✓/ to select
✓, then press
OK.
A prompt to confirm the "sleep" action appears.

Bookmarking a Song or Artist

You have the option to bookmark a song or an artist for later reference. You can later refer to this bookmark if you want buy the track when you've sign in to Pandora from your computer or mobile computing device, or if you want to share your musical preferences with other Pandora users.

To bookmark a song or artist:

- 1. While a song is playing, press **√**/ **▶** to select **√**, then press **○K**.
- 2. Press ▲/▼ to select whether to bookmark the song title or the song artist, then press **OK**.

The new bookmark is added to your listener profile page. Sign in to Pandora from your computer or mobile computing device to view this profile page.

Why a Song is in my Station's Playlist

You can see why Pandora included a particular song in your station's playlist. While a song is playing, select **Why this song?**, then press **OK**. The song analysis displays.

Deleting a Pandora Account

- 1. Select Pandora from the Services menu then press **OK**.
- 2. Press ▲/▼ to select the Pandora account you want to delete, then press ► to select the and press **OK**.

 On the Spotify main screen, press ◀/► to select What's New, Toplists, or Radios, then press OK.

- 2. Press ▲/▼ to select a new or most listened to artist album, or artist radio station.
- 3. Press ▮ ▶ or **OK** to start listening to the selected album or radio station. In the Radios screen, you can select **Create New Station** to add an artist radio station using the on-screen keyboard.

Delete Spotify Account

To delete a Spotify account:

- 1. On the Spotify main screen, press **◄/▶** to select **Account**, and press **OK**.
- 2. Select the Spotify account you wish to delete, then press **>** to select the **x** and press **OK**.

The world's largest Internet radio guide with access to over 30,000 free radio stations searchable by location, genre, or format.

To access TuneIn:

- 1. Navigate to the Home | Services menu and press **OK**.
- 2. The list of Internet services display in alphabetical order. Press ◀/▶ to select TuneIn tune , then press **OK**.





To sign in to TuneIn:

1. Press **◄**/▶ to select **Sign in**, then press **OK**.



2. Select **Activate Device**, then press **OK**.




- Write down the activation code and follow the onscreen instructions (go to http://radiotime.com/mydevice to associate the media player with your account). When finished, choose Continue, then press OK.
- 4. Select Enter RadioTime.com account, then press OK.
- 5. Use the navigation buttons **ATIP** to type in your TuneIn user name using the on-screen keyboard, then press **OK**.
- 6. Use the navigation buttons **AV** to type in your Tuneln account password using the on-screen keyboard, then press **OK**.
- 7. Press **OK** to complete the sign-in process.

Listening to a TuneIn Station, Program, or Podcast

- New Tuneln users can browse for a radio station, program, or podcast.

- 2. Press ▲/▼ to select the station, program, or podcast you want to listen to.
- 3. Press **Options**, then press ▲/▼ to select **Add to Preset** if you want to add the station to Presets (TuneIn account required). Press **OK**.
- 4. Press **II** ▶ or **OK** to start listening to the selected radio station.

Searching for a TuneIn Station

To search for a TuneIn station, program, or podcast:

1. On the Tuneln main screen, press **◄**/▶ to select **Search**, then press **OK**.

Getting Station Information

You can view information about the currently playing station and song.

- While the station is playing or selected, press Options, then ▲/▼ to select View info. Press OK.
- 2. The information screen appears, displaying info such as genre, language, currently playing song, next song, and time. Press **OK** to return to the previous screen.

Reporting Problems

You can report a problem with the currently playing station or audio or contact the station/show using the reporting problems option.

- While the station is playing or selected, press Options, then ▲ / ▼ to select Report problem. Press OK.
- 2. The reporting problems screen appears, displaying options for reporting problems such as audio, wrong information, errors, etc. After making your selection press **OK** to return to the previous screen.



Exit

To simply exit out of TuneIn and stay signed in, press **1**/**b** to select **Exit** in the TuneIn main screen, then press **OK**.

Yota Music

Yota Music provides access to more than 800,000 licensed music tracks in its online catalog. With Yota Music, you can listen to and customize personalized channels, save tracks to Favorites, and listen to theme-based collections put together by Yota Music editors. The charts show 100 songs most popular with the Yota Music audience.



Note: The Yota Music service user interface is primarily in the Russian language.

To access Yota Music:

- 1. Navigate to the Home | Services menu bar and and press **OK**.
- 2. The list of Internet services display in alphabetical order. Press ◀/► to select Yota Music ②, then press **OK** to display the Yota Music home screen.
- 3. Use the navigation buttons **AV** to browse, select, and search for songs and the playback buttons to stop and start songs.

YouTube

YouTube is a video hosting website where you can upload and share videos.

To access YouTube:

- 1. Navigate to the Home | Services menu bar and and press **OK**.
- 2. The list of Internet services display in alphabetical order. Press / to select YouTube / then press OK to display the YouTube home screen.
- 3. A default video plays. Use the navigation buttons to search (using an on-screen keyboard) or browse for videos. Use the **PAUSE/PLAY**, **REW**, **FF**, **NEXT**, and **PREV** buttons for video playback.

Games

You can access game services and use the remote control to play them using the Games menu.

Games Display

1. Navigate to the Home | Games menu, then press **OK**.



- 2. The screen displays all available game services. The display is in grid view. Use the navigation buttons to select a game service, then press **OK**.
- 3. Use the navigation buttons to select a game, then press **OK**. Select **Rules**, **Info** or **Help**, then press **OK** for further information, or select **New Game** or **Start** to begin.
- 4. Use the navigation buttons on the remote the play the game. Select **Exit** when finished.



RSS


RSS (Really Simple Syndication) provides you with a list of current news items in a brief format so you can scan headlines and choose the items that interest you most without visiting websites.

Reading RSS Feeds

1. Navigate to the Home | RSS menu, then press OK.



2. The screen displays all available RSS feeds. The display is in grid view. Use the navigation buttons to select a headline of a RSS feed that you want to read, then press **OK**.





Note: You can display your RSS feeds in a streaming ticker display on the home page. See "RSS Ticker" on page 170.

Adding RSS Feeds

To add an RSS feed to the media player:

- 1. In the RSS main screen, navigate to the button then press OK.
- 2. Enter the URL of the RSS feed using the on-screen keyboard (see the website of the RSS feed provider for details), select Submit, then press **OK**.
- 3. Press **OK** again to add the RSS feed.

Setup and Advanced Features

The Setup menu lets you customize the way you use the media player and set preferences for media playback.

To select a Setup category:

1. Press **Setup**, or navigate to the Home | Setup menu and press **OK**.



2. Use the **T** Up/Down arrows to select a Setup category, then press **OK**.



Use these buttons on the remote control to navigate within and between the Settings screens.

Audio/Video Output

Use the menus in this category to configure playback for audio and video files.



Video Output

Use this menu to select a video signal. After you finish making your selections, select \mathbf{OK} at the "Are you sure you want to change the video resolution?" prompt, then press \mathbf{OK} .

Composite

When using the standard RCA A/V cable (yellow, red, and white connectors) to connect the media player, select **Composite** in the Video output screen.

You will be prompted to select the TV standard applicable to your device. This setting depends on your regional location.

Options include:

- NTSC United States, Canada, Japan, Mexico, the Philippines, South Korea, and Taiwan.
- PAL Europe, Greenland, parts of Africa and South America, the Mideast, China, India, Australia, and Indonesia

Select a regional TV standard then press **OK**.

HDMI

When using an HDMI cable (if your TV supports HDMI resolution), select **HDMI** in the Video output screen.

You will be prompted to select the applicable HDMI video resolution (set to Auto, or from 480p to 1080p). Select display resolution then press **OK**.



Note: The further down the list the setting, the higher the resolution and clearer the picture.

After setting resolution, you are prompted to select color space (set to Auto, or RGB High, RGB Low, or YCbCr). Select color space then press **OK**.

Aspect Ratio


Use this menu to select the way videos are displayed. Options include:

- **Normal** (4:3)
- Widescreen (16:9)

The media player's default setting is **Widescreen**. Make sure your TV can support widescreen resolution, or this default setting can result in a distorted video display.

Audio Output

Use this menu to select the audio output mode.



Options include:

- **Stereo** (Analog, S/PDIF, HDMI) This is the default setting that decodes all audio streams into 2-channel output via analog (RCA connectors), S/PDIF (optical connector), or HDMI. Recommended if you are using a 2- or 4-speaker entertainment unit.
- Digital Pass Through via Optical Only (S/PDIF) Select this option if you are using HDMI for video and a S/PDIF (optical) connection to output multichannel surround sound to a receiver and do not want audio output from HDMI. After selecting Digital Pass Through via Optical Only, select one or more of the following options that describe your receiver. Select Finish when complete.
 - AAC capable receiver
 - Dolby Digital capable receiver
 - DTS capable receiver
 - WMA Pro capable receiver
- Digital Pass Through via HDMI Only (HDMI) Select this option if you are only using an HDMI connection to output multichannel surround sound to a receiver. After selecting Digital Pass Through via HDMI Only, select Auto to have the media player detect receiver settings automatically. Or, select Manual (Except DVD), then select one or more of the following options that describe your receiver. Select Finish when complete.
 - AAC capable receiver
 - Dolby Digital capable receiver
 - Dolby Digital Plus capable receiver
 - DTS capable receiver
 - Dolby TrueHD capable receiver
 - WMA Pro capable receiver

HDMI CEC

The CEC function allows HDMI devices to control each other when necessary, allowing the user to operate multiple devices with a single remote control for one of the devices. Not all operations of each HDMI device can be controlled with a single remote control. Use this menu to set HDMI CEC to **ON** (**OFF** is set by default).

Appearance

Use the menus in the Appearance screen to set user interface display options for the media player.



Language

Press ▲/▼ to select the display language, then press **OK**.

Video Calibration

Use this menu to correct any issues with overscan (the display is cropped in the TV screen). To correct any overscan problems, calibrate the display by reducing the display size by up to 30%. The calibration settings are in 5% increments.

User Interface Themes

The media player supports interchangeable user interfaces called themes. Themes alter the player's visual appearance, but not its functionality. There are several themes available in the User Interface Themes page and available for download at http://www.wdtvlive.com/theme.

User Interface Backgrounds

You can use this menu to set a different photo as the system background to replace the default grass field and sunny sky photo. You can choose from the **WD Creative Masters** backgrounds or **Your Backgrounds**.

WD Creative Masters

WD Creative Masters includes themed albums of photos from leading photographers that you can use for your media player user interface background.

Select a WD Creative Masters album, then navigate to a photo and press **OK**. Press **OK** again to preview the background. You can choose to **Set as Background** or **View Bio** of the photographer, then press **OK**.



Your Backgounds

Your Backgrounds shows the default background as well as other photos you have set as the background (see "Set as Background" on page 84). Navigate to a background photo and press **OK**, then press **OK** again to **Set as Background**.



RSS Ticker

Set RSS Ticker to **Show** to stream your RSS feeds on the home page. Default setting is **Hide**.




Screensaver Delay

Use this menu to set the time of system inactivity before the screensaver display is enabled. The default setting is **5 minutes**.

Show New Items

Use this menu to select a date range for the media files added to your content source(s) to be marked as "new." The number of new items displays when you select **Video**, **Music**, **Photo**, or **Files** on the home screen, or **New Items** in the dashboard.



Screensaver Style

Use this menu to choose your screensaver display style. The **WD Logo** screensaver is the default style, but you can also choose a **Random Photo Slideshow** of photos stored in the media player's internal drive or a **Folder Photo Slideshow** of photos from a single folder as your screensaver.

Video Settings

Use the menus in the Video Settings screen to configure the display and sequence option for video files.



Video Playback Sequence

Use this menu to select the video playback mode. The default setting is **Normal**. Go to "Play Mode" on page 68 for a description of these video playback modes.

DVD Menu

Use this menu to disable the DVD menu display (set to **Off**) if your video file supports it. Default setting is **On**.

Subtitle Font Size

Use this menu to set the default font size (24 to 68 points, 40 points is default) for displaying video subtitles. Use the **T** buttons to select a font size. "Subtitle font size" at the bottom of the screen reflects the font size option currently selected. Press **OK** to select a subtitle font size.

Subtitle Border

Use this menu to set the default appearance of the subtitle frame (**Thin** or **Thick**).

Subtitle Default

Use this menu to set the default appearance of the subtitles (On or Off).

Browser Display


Use this menu to select the default display mode for the video browser screen. The default setting is **Preview View**. Examples of grid, list, and preview views are shown below.



Use this menu to select which file information to display in the audio browser screen. The default setting is **File name**.

Background Music Info Panel

When turned **On**, a music info menu bar appears at the top of the screen when music is playing in the background.





Resume Music Longer Than 15 Min

When turned **On**, will prompt you to resume or restart a music file that is 15 minutes or longer.

Browser Display

Use this menu to select the default display mode for the audio browser screen. The default setting is **Grid View**. Examples of both grid and list views are shown below.





Grid View List View

Photo Settings

Use the menus on this category to configure the display size and slideshow settings when viewing your image files.



Slideshow Sequence

Use this menu to set the slideshow sequence mode. The default setting is **Normal**.

- **Normal** The slideshow is played once. When the last image is displayed, the previous browser screen is displayed.
- **Shuffle** The slideshow is played in random order until you press **Stop**.
- Repeat All The slideshow is played repeatedly until you press **Stop** or **Back**.
- Repeat All and Shuffle The slideshow is played continuously in random order.

Slideshow Transition

Use this menu to select the method used to display the next slide in a slideshow. The default setting is **Normal**.

Slideshow Interval Time

Use this menu to set the time interval between pictures in the slideshow. You can select from 3 seconds (default) to 5 minutes.


Photo Scaling

Use this menu to define how pictures are scaled when you view them. This also applies when pictures are viewed in a slideshow. Options include:

- **Keep as original** Maintains the original resolution of the image (default).
- Fit to screen Fills as much of the display area as possible while maintaining correct image proportions.
- Display in full screen
 – Fills the display area with the image (this can lead to image distortion).

Browser Display

Use this menu to select how media files are displayed in their respective folders. The default setting is **Small Grid View**. Examples of both grid and list views are shown below.



Network

Use the menus in this category to configure and view the media player's network settings. Press $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ to make a selection from the list of options, then press **OK**.



Network Setup

See "Network Services" on page 28 for information and instructions.

Wireless Favorites

This menu displays a record of your wireless network settings. After performing a wireless network setup, the media player keeps a record of the LAN access point. Use this menu to reconnect to the local network without having to rekey the password.

Check Connection

See "Checking the Network Connection" on page 27 for information and instructions.

Device Name

The name shown in the device name field helps you identify the media player on the network. Use this menu option to change the device name using the onscreen keyboard.

Network Share Server

Must be set to **On** to use network services. See "Network Services" on page 28 for information and instructions.

Workgroup

Allows you to join a specific workgroup on your network. Windows-based computers and devices in the same workgroup may allow each other access to their files, printers, or Internet connection. Members of different workgroups on the same local area network and TCP/IP network can only access resources in workgroups to which they are joined.

To create a new workgroup, select the existing Workgroup Name then press **OK**. Enter a new workgroup name.

Proxy

Proxy is used by corporations to view and filter online transactions. All requests in the corporate environment go through a proxy server to perform such actions as recording the IP address of a web site, checking the IP address that is being opened to make sure it's not on a blocked list, and checking outgoing attachments for spam or viruses


If you plan to use the media server in a corporate environment, select **On**, then enter the Proxy address and port using the on-screen keyboard to access online services.

Clear Login Info for Network Share

Use this menu to clear login information (preset password) for the network share.

Operation

Use the menus in the Operation screen to set preferences for the media player.



Remote Settings

Select a function for the **A**, **B**, **C**, and **D** function buttons on the remote controller. The remote settings menu displays the functions currently assigned to each button.



To change functions, press ▲/▼ to select a function button, then press **OK**. Press ▲/▼ to select functions such as display mode, filter menu, Music, Video, Services, Setup, etc., then press **OK**.



To reset the function buttons to default settings, select **Reset**, then press **OK**.

Delete Music Preset (Buttons 0-9)

To clear a music file or playlist preset from one of the 0-9 buttons, press \triangle/∇ to select a numbered button. Press \triangleright to select the \square , then press \bigcirc K.



Auto Play


Select the type of media (music or video) that plays automatically when a USB device is connected to USB port 1 on the front of the media player. The media files must be located in the USB device's root directory for Auto Play to function.



Note: The auto play function will only work if the USB device is plugged into USB port 1 on the front of the media player.

System

Use the menus in this category to configure the media player's general functions. Press $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ to make a selection from the list of options, then press **OK**.



Set Time Zone for Clock

Use this menu to select your local time zone and turn Daylight Savings Time **Off** or **On** so that the media player displays the current time.

Media Library


Use this menu to enable or disable Media Library (turn **Off**, **On**, or **Clear Media Library**), which refers to the process of consolidating the media contents of an internal hard drive, USB drive, or network drives into one database so you can locate media files based on metadata information. See "Media Library" on page 186 for more information.

Get Content Info

Use this menu to set options for how you want to attach metadata (such as artwork and additional information) to your music and video files. **Manual Only** is the default setting, and you can also set this menu to **Auto**.

Meta-Source Manager


Use this menu to select a meta-source that provides metadata information and artwork for your media files. Select **Movie**, **Music**, or **TV Show** to display and select available meta-sources for the media type.



Select **Add New Meta-Source** and select the meta-source XML file from the network or attached USB storage. You can also create your own meta-source. Go to www.wdtvlive.com to download a sample meta-source, and for more information about meta-sources.

Device Security

Use this menu to set a security password to access and control folder locking and parental control features. Select **Device Security** and use the navigation buttons **AV** to type in your password (you will need to enter it twice before initial use) to enable the features. The following screen displays:



From here, enter the **Folder Lock** or **Parental Control** menus or **Set New Password**.

Folder Lock

Select **Set Default Lock Folder** to select a folder containing files you want to prevent access to. Once selected, the folder displays on the screen. Select **Lock** to prevent access to the folder, **Unlock** to provide access to the folder, or **Disable** to disable the feature.



Parental Control

Parental control allows you to password protect an Internet service so the user can access it only if the correct password is entered. There are two options:

- 1. **Show** default option. The service is not password protected.
- 2. **Ask** the password must be entered to access the service.



Additional Encoding Support

Press $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ to select an encoding support for a secondary language, then press **OK**. This prevents garbled characters in file names and subtitles defined in the selected language.

Device Registration

To register your WD product using the Setup menu:

Make sure your media player has an active network connection.
 See "Network Services" on page 28 for instructions on how to set up a network connection.

- 2. Press **Setup** or navigate to the Home | Setup menu, then press **OK**.
- 3. Press $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ to select **System**, then press **OK**.
- 4. Press ▲/▼ to select **Device Registration**, then press **OK**.




- 5. On the Register Product screen, press ▲/▼ to select **First Name**, then press **OK**.
- 6. Use the navigation buttons ▲▼◀► to type in your first name using the on-screen keyboard. Select **Submit**, then press **OK**.

- 10. Use the navigation buttons ▲▼◀▶ to type in your email address using the onscreen keyboard. Select **Submit**, then press **OK**.
- 11. On the Register Product screen, press **▼** ▶ to select **OK**, and then press **OK**.

WD LED Light Control

Use this menu to turn off the WD LED light (**Always Off**). If turned off, the WD LED will only appear during start up then disappear after the device has booted up. The default setting is **Normal**.

Device Reset

Use this menu to perform device reset options:



Reset All Settings Back to Factory Default – restores all media player system preferences and playback settings to their default factory values. This may correct problems caused by a failed firmware upgrade or faulty configuration settings.

Reset All Settings Except Online Service Accounts – restores all media player system preferences and playback settings to their default factory values with the exception of your internet Services personal account information.

Reset All Online Service Accounts – clears all account information and logins you have entered for Services, with the exception of BLOCKBUSTER On Demand (you must contact Blockbuster to have the media player removed from your account).

Reset Web Interface Login – clears the user-created Web UI password and resets it to the default password. See "Using the Web UI" on page 42 for details.



Important: If you specified a static IP address (or any other non-standard configuration), the media player will no longer appear on the network after the reset. Also, be sure to reset the media player to factory defaults and reset all online service accounts before returning or otherwise transferring the device to purge your internet services personal account information, network shares passwords, and wireless network passwords.

To perform a device reset:

- 1. Press ▲/▼ to select **Device Reset**, then press **OK**.
- 2. Press \blacktriangle/V to select a device reset option, then press **OK**.
- 3. Select **OK** in the confirmation screen, then press **OK**.

Device Restart

Press **OK** to restart the media player.

Check Latest Firmware

This menu displays the current firmware version. Press **OK** to check for new firmware.

Auto Detect New Firmware

Use this menu to turn the automatic detection of new firmware **On** or **Off**. See "System Firmware Upgrade" on page 188 for further details.

About

Select this option to display the network info, firmware version currently installed, part number, and serial number of the device as well as online service info.



- Select Network Info then press OK to view info such as the device's MAC and IP addresses, mobile access type, etc.
- Select **Device Info** then press **OK** to view the firmware version currently installed, part number, and serial number of the device.
- Select Online Service Info to view online service account info such as your Netflix ESN.

Media Library

Media Library scans and consolidates the media contents of the internal hard drive, USB drive, and network drives into a database through which you can easily locate media files. This feature is set to on by default.

The following conditions will prevent the Media Library from processing your media.

- The USB device has read-only protection.
- There is not enough hard drive space on the USB device. Your media player needs some space to cache information, so that searches and scans are faster.

A note about metadata

Metadata is information about the data in a file that describes how, when, and by whom a particular set of data (video, music, photographic, or any other type of data) was collected, and how the data is formatted.

Not all files have metadata loaded. To add and edit metadata so that Media Library can aggregate the files properly, you can use one of several tools including:

- Adobe® Bridge (part of the Adobe Creative Suite)
- abcAVI Tag Editor (freeware)

- Name
- Artist
- Year released
- Album name
- Composer
- Track number
- Genre
- 3. When you are done, click **OK**. To edit the next song listed in your iTunes library, click **Next**.

Editing metadata with Windows media player:

- 1. Open Windows media player.
- 2. Click the **Library** tab.
- 3. Right-click the title or other item to edit.
- 4. When the menu opens, click Edit.

Converting The Content Into A Usable Format

There are several fast, easy-to-use applications available online that can convert photos, videos, and music files into formats optimized for use on your media player. The software also allows simultaneous conversion of multiple files in batches regardless of their original formats.

Examining Your Files

Medialnfo (free software) can provide technical and tag information about your video or audio files.

Medialnfo provides the following kinds of information:

- General—title, author, director, album, track number, date, and duration
- Video—codec, aspect, fps, and bitrate
- Audio—codec, sample rate, channels, language, and bitrate
- Text—language of the subtitles
- Chapters—number and a list of chapters

Medialnfo supports the following formats:

- Video MKV, OGM, AVI, DivX, WMV, QuickTime, Real, MPEG-1, MPEG-2, MPEG-4, DVD (VOB) (Codecs: DivX, XviD, MSMPEG4, ASP, H.264, AVC)
- Audio-OGG, MP3, WAV, RA, Dolby Digital Plus, AAC, M4A, AU, AIFF
- Subtitles—SRT, SSA, ASS, and SAMI

With MediaInfo, you can:

- Read many video and audio file formats
- Use several methods of viewing information, such as text, sheet, tree, and HTML
- Customise views
- Export information as text, such as CSV and HTML

To examine your files:

- 1. Use your browser and go to http://mediainfo.sourceforge.net/en.
- 2. Download the software and install it on your computer.
- 3. Follow the instructions as prompted.

System Maintenance

The system software of your media player can be upgraded to the latest release, which can improve support for media file playback and includes bug fixes and product enhancements. To ensure that you receive the latest update, we recommend registering your product at http://register.wdc.com.

This chapter describes how to upgrade the system firmware and perform simple troubleshooting. If you encounter an error message, refer to the "Common Error Messages" on page 193 for possible corrective action.

Solutions to more serious problems may require contacting your dealer or an authorized service center for assistance. For more information, refer to "WD Service and Support" on page 2.

System Firmware Upgrade

Firmware is an important set of instructions that tells your media player how to operate, what the interactive screens look like, and how to do what you tell it to do. Upgrading the firmware is important because WD is always developing newer, faster, and more efficient ways of doing things that your media player needs to know.




Important: Make sure the media player's AC power adapter remains connected during the firmware update. A power disruption during the update process can corrupt the system firmware. Also, make sure that you do not unplug the USB storage device if doing a manual update.

Automatic

The New Firmware menu appears in the media player's Home screen when updated firmware becomes available, providing the option to automatically upgrade the firmware.



Note: You must have Auto Detect New Firmware set to **On** to automatically upgrade firmware. See "Auto Detect New Firmware" on page 184.



To update the firmware automatically:

- 1. Press **HOME**, then select New Firmware. Press **OK**.
- 2. Select **OK** on the firmware update prompt, and then press **OK**. This restarts the system.
- 3. After restarting, the system automatically enters firmware upgrade mode.



4. Once the update process finishes, the media player restarts. When the media player restarts, the new firmware loads automatically.



Manual

To update the firmware manually:

- 1. Go to http://support.wdc.com and download the latest firmware update file for the media player.
- 2. Click "Downloads," then the product name (or photo). Download the WD TV Live Hub media player firmware zip file to your computer.
- 3. Using an unzip utility, extract the zip file contents to the root directory of a USB device connected to your computer.
- 4. Safely remove the USB device from the computer and attach it to the media player.
- 5. Connect the USB device to the media player's USB port. If the Sync and Transfer screen appears, select **Cancel**, then press **OK**.
- 6. Follow steps 1-4 under "To update the firmware automatically:" on page 189.
- 7. If the Sync and Transfer screen appears, select **Cancel** or **OK** if you want to access video, music, or photo files on the attached USB device.

FAQs

How do I find media files and create playlists?

Several media player applications are currently available, such as Winamp and iTunes, that let you play, arrange, and edit media files. These media players also let you create playlists and edit the metadata information for media files. You can search the Internet with your browser to locate where these applications are available for download.

How do I copy the files from my music CD to my computer?

Digital audio extraction, or *Ripping*, is the process of copying audio (or video) content to a hard drive, typically from removable media, such as CDs or DVDs, or from media streams.

To rip music from CDs to a computer:

- 1. Insert the CD into the optical drive of your computer.
- 2. Open the program that you use to rip the music to your computer, such as iTunes or Windows Media Player.
- 3. Press the **Import** button (using iTunes),
 - OR -

Press the **Rip** button (using Windows media player).

- 4. Click the music you want to copy (Windows media player) and note where the music files are saved after they are copied. iTunes imports the entire CD into your iTunes music library.
- 5. Click the **Start Rip** button (Windows Media Player).
- 6. When ripping is complete, remove the CD. The music is now on your computer.



Note: Some music may be covered by copyright laws which prevent its copying or distribution.

Can I use a universal remote control with the media player?

You can use most popular universal remote control devices such as the Logitech Harmony models.

Multiformat Content Playback

Multiformat is a file type that groups other files of the same digital content but may be encoded in different digital formats. For example, a single video file may actually include a few components such as video, audio, and photo grouped together.
