





3. Setting Up the Product

3-1. Control Panel Usage




Button	Name	function
FEED	Paper Feed/ Down button	Advances the supply. Clears error message. Moves down through menu options.
	Enter button	Selects the highlighted menu option.
\triangle	Up button	Moves up through menu options.
O	Power button	Turns the printer on and off. Press for two seconds to turn power on. Press for three seconds to turn power off. Wakes the printer from sleep mode.

✓ NOTE


- 1. The battery status LEDs indicate amount of power remaining. Actual run-time remaining depends on factors such as the contents of output, distance to computer, etc.
- 2. When the battery level is very low, high density printing can result in the printer switching off during printing resulting in possible loss of data.

3-2. Installing battery



Remove the battery door. Insert the battery as shown.


Replace the battery door.

▼ NOTE

You must fully charge the battery when you receive the printer.


Batteries can be charged in the printer or in an optional external cradle

3-3. Battery removel



Remove the battery door. Lift out the battery.

3-4. Battery Charging



- 1. Turn off the printer.
- 2. Be sure that the AC plug is correct.

 If AC plug is wrong, change the plug to the correct one.
- 3. Open the DC jack by pulling on the rubber cover and insert DC jack into the printer.
- 4. Plug the AC plug into an electrical outlet.
- 5. The charge indicator LED (located on the AC charger as shown) shows red or green according to the status.

3-4-1 The status of lamp in charging



✓ NOTE

If there is trouble while charging the battery, the charge indicator LED blinks green. Try unplugging and reconnecting charger, charging should resume. Charging is complete when the LED changes to solid green.





3-6. Belt clip Usage



Insert screw into belt clip.




Tighten the screw with driver as shown.


▼ NOTE

The belt clip is included with the printer but is not required to be used or installed!


3-7. Roll Paper Installation



Open the Paper cover by pressing the Open button and set the width of paper guide by turning the knob with finger.



Put the stock in so it unrolls from the bottom. Remove the stock core when it is empty. Pull a short length of stock out of the printer.




Close the cover.




Press the Feed Key once to arrange the paper.

3-8. Peel Mode

Peel Mode



With a roll of stock installed, slide the peeler body towards the back of the printer.




Press the feed button.

Lift the peeler wing and slide the peeler body towards the front of the printer.








Insert the strap into the hook on the printer.






Place the end of the strap into the hook of shoulder strap.




After pulling out the end of the strap tightly, put it into the clip to be fastened.

3-10. Self Test



Turn off the printer.



Press and hold the feed button and power button.

✓ NOTE

- 1. For Hex Dump mode, do steps 1-2 then press the feed button.
- 2. After printing ASCII pattern, the diagnostic test is complete.
- 3. If the feed button is not pressed to go to Hex Dump mode, the printer exits diagnostics after three seconds.

Upon initial installation or for troubleshooting, you can run the diagnostic test to get information about:

Firmware version, emulation, codepage, sensor settings, interface settings, etc. If no issues are found with diagnostic test, examine other devices and software. The diagnostic test is working independent of devices and software.


• Do not overheat the motor

To prevent the motor from overheating, stop the printer for at least 30 seconds after continuously printing 1.5 meters.

4. Peripherals Connection

This printer can communicate with Peripherals device via Bluetooth and cables.

4-1 Bluetooth Connection




- Printer can be connected to the PDA and PC which can do wireless communication.
- 2. By using Bluetooth function supported in PC, printer can be connected.

✓ NOTE

Refer to the Bluetooth Manual for more details on connection.

4-2. Interface Cable Connection



1. Connect USB or Serial cable into the cable connector on the printer.

▼ NOTE

Use the cable offered by the manufacturer (USB, Serial)


2. Connect the interface cable into the USB or Serial port of the device (PDA, PC, etc.)

5. Printer cleaning

If the interior of the printer is dusty, printing quality can be lowered. In this case, follow the instructions below to clean the printer.

5-1. PrintHead Cleaning

- 1. Use an applicator swab moistened with an isopropyl alcohol to clean the print head and remove any dusts.
- 2. Once cleaning is complete, allow the printer to dry then install the stock and close the cover.




▼ NOTE

- 1. Make sure to turn the printer power off prior to cleaning
- 2. The printhead can become very hot during printing; allow the printer approximately 10 minutes to cool before cleaning.
- 3. Do not touch the printhead, it can be damaged by static electricity.
- 4. Take care not to allow the print head to become scratched and /or damaged in any way.

5-2. Platen Roller Cleaning

- 1.Clean the platen roller with a clean soft cloth moistened with isopropyl alcohol or a cleaning pen.
- 2. Turn the platen roller with your finger to clean the entire surface.
