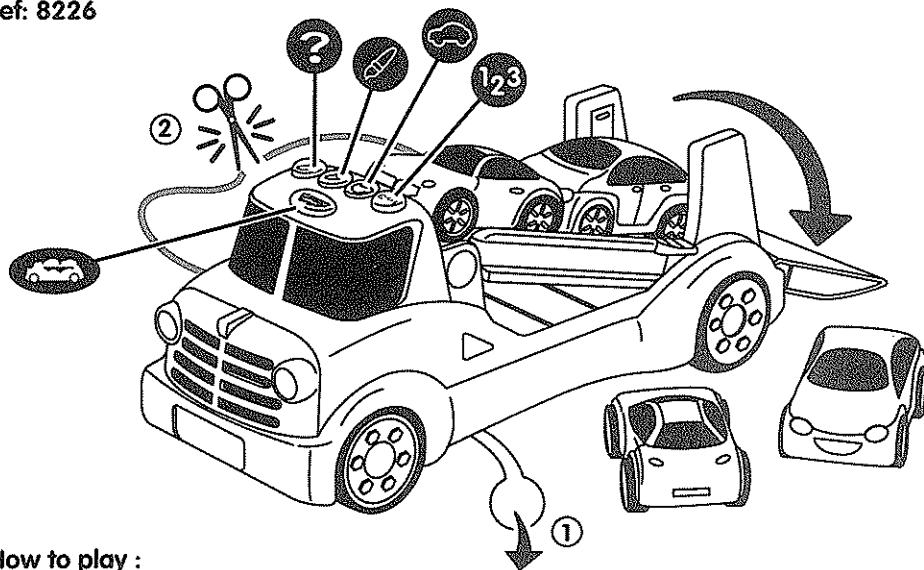







Smart Talking Truck

User manual for the parents

How to play :

- (1) Remove the "Pull Tag" from the chassis.
- (2) Cut away the yellow string which is attached with the green car.
- (3) Press  : Truck engine sound.
- (4) Press  : Learn how to count number of cars.
- (5) Press  : Listen to the four different car sounds.
- (6) Press  : Learn how to study the four different colors of the cars.
- (7) Press  : for Quiz mode. Follow the instruction to park the car on the parking ramp.

"Note: To ensure the truck correctly identifies the cars place each car one at a time and make sure the first car on the top/ bottom bays are pushed to the end"

Remarks:

The proper functions will perform well and accurately under the following conditions:

- (a) When removing a car from the truck, wait until the sentence is spoken before replacing it to obtain the next sentence.
- (b) The car should be placed correctly on their slots
- (c) If the truck stops recognizing the cars or recognizes incorrectly, please replace the batteries.



Instructions :

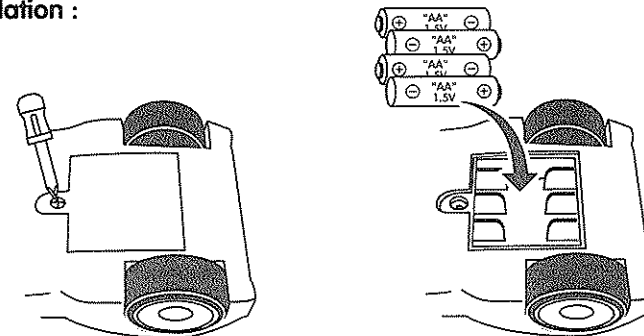
- Batteries should be installed and changed by an adult.
- Open the battery compartment with a screw-driver
- Make sure the batteries are installed in the right direction according to the diagram. A wrong position can damage the toy, provoke fire or the batteries explosion.
- Close the lid of the battery compartment
- Do not mix old and new batteries.
- Do not store batteries with metal objects: fire or explosion hazard.
- Remove batteries when the toy is not used for a long period of time.
- Do not throw batteries in a fire.
- Do not attempt to recharge batteries which are not rechargeable.
- Do not attempt to open batteries or rechargeable batteries.
- In case a battery is swallowed consult immediately the doctor or a poison center.
- If available get rid of your used batteries through a collection center.
- Use preferably alkaline batteries.
- Never let button-cell batteries in reach of young children.
- Rechargeable batteries are only to be charged under adult supervision.
- Rechargeable batteries are to be removed from the toy before being charged.
- Exhausted batteries are to be removed from the toy.
- The supply terminals are not to be short-circuited.
- Different types of batteries or new and used batteries are not mixed.
- Do not mix alkaline, standard (carbon-zinc), or re-chargeable (nickel-cadmium) batteries.
- In case of malfunction, open the battery compartment, remove the batteries, re-install them and close the battery compartment.

Battery Installation :



- (1) Use a cross shape screwdriver to remove the screw attaching the battery lid.
- (2) Slide the lid to the side and remove.
- (3) Install 4 "AA" size 1.5V batteries. Make sure that the + and - poles are positioned properly.
- (4) Replace the battery compartment lid and screw in.
