Camera lens



Left/Right soft Key

• Press to perform the function currently displayed in the bottom left/right corner of the screen.

Navigation Key

- In the standby mode, Navigation Key UP to access the Audio player
- In the standby mode, Navigation Key DOWN to access the Alarm
- Press the Navigation Key Left to access the user profiles
- Press the Navigation Key Right to access the Tone settings.

OK Key

- In the standby mode, press to enter the main menu.
- · Confirm a selection.

Dial/Answer Key

- Press to make a call.
- Press to answer a call.
- In idle mode, press to display call list

End/ Power Key

- Press to end a call.
- Press and hold to power on/ off the phone.

FM Key

• In idle mode, press to access FM radio.

TV Key

In idle mode, press to access TV player.

Volume Side Keys

• Press to increase or decrease the volume.

Standby mode

In the main display, you may see several icons displayed on your status bar. The meaning for each icon is explained below:

74	Vertical bars indicate the signal strength of the GSM network signal.
	Indicates the battery charge level.
	Indicates your phone is locked.
D	Indicates your phone uses the alert type of "Ring".
\$1 \$	Indicates your phone uses the alert type of "Vibrate and ring".
808	Indicates your phone uses the alert type of "Vibrate Only".
	Indicates your phone uses the alert type of "Vibrate then ring".
A	Indicates your phone uses the headsets profile settings.
©	Indicates the alarm clock is set.
W	Indicates a missed call.
	Indicates new text message(s).
a	Indicates new multimedia message(s).
6	Indicates new voice mail message(s).
	Indicates WAP push messages.
G	Indicates your phone has logged onto GPRS.


Getting started

Installing the SIM card and the battery


You need to insert the SIM card and charge the battery before using the phone.

- Keep all miniature SIM cards out of the reach of little children.
- Be careful to handle, insert or remove the SIM card since the SIM card and the contacts inside can easily be damaged by scratching or bending.
- Before installing/removing the SIM card, always make sure that the phone is switched off.

1. Remove the back cover (1) and lift the battery away (2).




2. Insert the SIM card (3), install the battery (4) and attach the battery cover as shown (5).



Note: make sure that the metallic contacts of the battery are facing the metallic contacts in the battery slot.

Installing a microSD Card

- 1. The microSD card slot is on the right side of your phone.
- 2. With the metal contacts facing to the metal contacts in the slot, gently slide the SD card into the slot and press down until the card locks into place (6).
 - Note: the metal contacts are facing front.
- 3. If you want to get the microSD card out, gently press the microSD card, then you can remove it from your phone.



Charging the battery

You must fully charge the battery before using your phone for the first time.

- 1. Connect Charger cable to the micro charger port on the left of your phone.
- 2. Connect charger to an AC wall outlet.

When all the battery scroll bars are steady, the battery is fully charged. Then you can disconnect the charger.

Switching the phone on and off

• Press and hold the Power Key.

Notes:

- 1. You can also use the phone without SIM card. If the phone asks PIN code, key in the PIN code, and press the Left Soft Key (LSK) to confirm.
- 2. Do not switch the phone on when the phone use is prohibited or when it may cause interference or danger.

Call Functions

This section gives you information about the calling service supported in your phone.

Making a call

In standby mode, key in the number, including the area code, and press the Dial Key.

To make a call from the Phonebook

In the standby mode, press the **Left soft key** to enter the main menu, and then select **Phonebook**. Scroll to the desired contact name or type the name in the search bar, and then press the Dial Key to make the call.

To make an international call

- 1. For international calls, enter the international prefix (Press the * Key twice quickly until "+" appears on the screen).
- 2. Key in the country code, area code and the phone number.
- 3. Press the Dial key to call.

Answering or rejecting an incoming call

- Press the Answer key to answer the call when the phone rings.
- To reject an incoming call, press the End key to reject the call.

Call Waiting

If you want to answer another incoming call, you should activate the call waiting function for the SIM at first. During a call, press the Answer key to answer the new incoming call. You can swap back anytime by pressing the Left Soft Key (LSK) and select **Swap**.

Input Method

You can key in text by pressing the keypad.

To select a writing language

Before you key in text, press **Options** and select **Writing Language**.

To insert a space

You could press the Space key to insert spaces.

To insert the symbols

Pressing the * key can access the symbols.



Multi-tap Input

Using this mode requires you to press a key as many times as needed to enter the desired letter. To enter the word «home» in Multi-tap input mode "**abc**", press key 4(GHI), 4 (GHI), 6(MNO), 6(MNO), 6(MNO), 6(MNO), 3(DEF), 3 (DEF).

Numeric Input

Press the # Key to select "123" then you can enter the numbers.

Phonebook

Your phonebook list is saved either on the SIM card's memory or Phone's memory. You can also choose to list both.

Search

In standby mode, press the Left Soft key to enter the main menu, and then select Phonebook.

Now you can search names and numbers saved in the Phonebook

Key in full name or first character of contact person's name and the phonebook list will automatically jump to the character you have entered, or the matched contact will be displayed.

Add New Contact

Allows you create a new entry into the phonebook list. It will be saved either in phone memory or SIM card.

To add a new contact

1. In **Phonebook** menu, select **Add New Contacts**, press **Left Soft** key to choose **Options > Select**, and then enter the contact information.

Press Options > Done to save the new contact.

Note, If you want to change the storage location, please select **Options > Phonebook Settings > Preferred Storage**.



Notes:

- 1. Your phone allows you to save 1,000 entries of phone numbers.
- 2. Image and video can be selected from both default and file manager.

Caller Groups

In Standby Mode, press the **Left Soft** key to enter the main menu, then select **Phonebook**, press **Left Soft Key** to select **Options**, then select **Caller Groups**.

You can also add a **New Caller** group. With the **Caller Group** function, you can send a message to all members of a group at the same time.

Phonebook Settings

To access the **Phonebook Settings**, in standby mode, press the **Left Soft** key to enter the main menu, and then select **Phonebook**, press **Left Soft** key to select **Options**, and then select **Phonebook Settings**Your phone provides you various setting options to personalize your phone, including,

- Preferred Storage: You can choose your preferred storage in phone, SIM or both.
- **Speed dial:** If you assign the number to one of the speed dialing keys (from the key 2 to key 9) saved in the **Phonebook List**, you can dial the phone number by pressing and holding the number of the key assigned in standby mode. First, you should turn this feature on, and then set the number by associating with a contact.
- My Number: Allows you to define number or name.
- Extra numbers: Allows you to view owner number, fixed dial number (FDN), some SIM card cannot support it.
- Memory Status: You can check how many entries are stored in the SIM card or the phone's memory.
- Copy contacts: Allows you to copy the contacts among two storages.
- Move contacts: Allows you to move the contacts among two storages.
- Delete all contacts: Allows you to delete the contacts from the phone or SIM.

STK (SIM Toolkit)

In addition to the functions available on the phone, your service provider may offer additional applications such as weather or stock market information via the SIM card. This function is only supported when a SIM card is inserted. The submenu of this feature depends on the operator, and different operators may provide different services (some SIM cards do not support STK).

Call center

Your phone can save the call records of missed calls, received calls, dialed calls, durations and cost of calls in the **Call History** menu.

Notes:

- 1. Once the call list exceeds the memory limitation, the oldest one is deleted.
- 2. For the call logs, you can press the Dial key in standby mode to have a quick review.

Call history

Missed Calls

To view Missed Calls:

In the Call Center menu, choose Call History > Missed Calls, and press the Navigation Key to view the records.

Dialed Calls

To view Dialed Calls:

In the Call Center menu, choose Call history > Dialled Calls, and press the Navigation Key to view the records.

Received Calls

To view Received Calls:

In the Call Center menu, choose Call History > Received Calls, and press the Navigation Key to view the records.

Delete Call Logs

Your phone allows you to delete calls from the Missed Calls list, Dialed Calls list, Received Calls list, or All Calls lists.

Call timers

Your phone allows you to view the duration of both your incoming and outgoing calls.

Call Cost

This function allows you to check the cost of your last phone call, or the total cost of all calls made. Some SIM card cannot support this function.

Text Message Counter

This function allows you to check the numbers of text messages you've sent. You can press **Reset** to reset the message counter.

In Call center menu, choose Call history > Text Msg Counter to view the records.

The following items are available for the Text Message Counter:

- Sent: The number of Text messages you've sent.
- Received: The number of text messages you've received.

GPRS Counter

This function allows you to check the data size (both message and WAP) of the GPRS packet you've used. In the **Call Center** menu, choose **Call History > GPRS Counter** to view the content.

The following options are available for the GPRS counter:

- Last Sent: The GPRS volume that you sent last time.
- Last Received: The GPRS volume that you received last time.
- All Sent: The total GPRS volume that you've sent.
- All Received: The total GPRS volume that you've received.
- Reset Counter: Press to reset the counters.

Call Settings

- Caller ID: Allows you to either send or hide your ID during calling or sending out the message. Your phone is defaulted in **Set By Network**, which means your ID is determined by your service provider.
- Call Waiting: Allows you to enable the call waiting function.
- Call Divert: Allows you to set the call condition by which the calls are diverted to another number.
- Call Barring: Allows you to restrict both incoming calls and outgoing calls from your phone.
- Line switching: This is a network service to select phone line 1 or 2.
- Closed User Group: This is a network service.

Advance Settings

- Blacklist: Allows you to filter and block incoming calls for certain contacts you defined.
- Auto Redial: If turned on, your phone will make repeated attempts to connect the call after an
 unsuccessful call attempt.
- IP dial: allows you set the IP call.
- Background sound: Allows you to set the background sound when you make a call.
- Call Time Display: Allows you to enable or disable the call time display on the phone screen.
- Call Time Reminder: Allows you to set a time reminder alarm during a call.
- Auto Quick End: Allows you to set the time when the call will be ended automatically.
- Reject By Messaging: Allows you to set it on or off. If it is on, you can reject a call by sending a message
 when a call is incoming.

Settings

Phone Setting

Time and Date

This function allows you to set your home city and view/change the time and date settings in your phone. You can also choose to update with time zone.

Schedule Power On/Off

You are allowed to schedule the power on and off time for 4 different time settings.

Language

This phone allows you to set a language for the display in this phone.

In the Settings menu, choose Phone Settings > Language.

Note: The option of Automatic depends on your service provider and languages supported by your phone. If you select Automatic, your phone will auto detect the language supported by your SIM and phone.

Pref. input method: Allows you to predefine your writing Language.

Display

This feature allows you to personalize your display setting through these following options:

- **Wallpaper:** Allows you to change your wallpaper displayed on the idle screen.
 - 1. In the Settings menu, choose Phone Settings > Display > Wallpaper.
 - Choose User Defined and select an image from the File Manager.
 - 3. Or, choose **System** and press **OK**.
- Screen Saver: Allows you to play different screen savers. The waiting time after which the screen saver is activated is from 5 sec. to 1 min.

After the above setting is completed, go back to the Screen Saver submenu and choose Select to enter either System or User Defined to choose an image as your screen saver.

- Power On Display: Allows you to set the power-on animation from the system or the File Manager.
- Power off display: Allows you to set the power-off animation from the system or the File Manager.
- Main Menu Style: Press to set the style of main menu to matrix.
- Show Date and Time: If turned on, the time and date will be shown in Standby mode.
- Show Owner Number: If turned on, the owner number will be shown in Standby mode.

Themes

You can choose the theme that you prefer.

Greeting Text

This function indicates the message when you power on in the main screen display. You may edit any message for your welcome note.

Dedicated Key

This function allows you change the features with the Navigation keys.

Auto Update Of Date and Time

You can set on or off.

Flight Mode

Select from **Normal** mode, **Flight** mode and **Query** when power is on.

Misc. Settings

This menu allows you to set the LCD backlight.

Network Settings

While in this mode, you can search the network, set your preferred network, or change the GPRS connection.

Security Settings

This function allows you to activate a password to protect your phone against unauthorized use. Your phone provides the following options for your selection:

- **SIM Lock:** To prevent your SIM card from illegal use, your SIM card is protected by a PIN code. If you set the SIM lock to **On**, you can only use your cellular phone by entering the correct PIN code every time you turn it on. If you enter the wrong PIN code three times, your SIM card will be locked and a PUK code will be required. Contact your service provider for more information.
- **Phone Lock:** You can turn Phone Lock on or off to protect your phone from unauthorized use. If you switch the phone lock on, you need to enter the password to set the request on. The default password is 1122
- Auto Keypad Lock: This allows you to lock the phone's keypad to prevent accidental key pressing. In the Auto Keypad Lock submenu, select the time and press OK
- **Fixed Dial:** This function dials only the numbers in the fixed dialing number (FDN). To save and edit numbers on the list, you need the PIN2 code.
- Barred Dial: Allows you to switch on or off restricted call function. However, you need to check if your SIM supports this function.
- Change Password: Allows you to change PIN, PIN2 and the Phone Lock Password.

Connectivity

Bluetooth (BT)

Your phone is designed to be compliant with Bluetooth technology. Bluetooth technology enables wireless connections between electronic devices. The Bluetooth connection can be used to listen to stereo music, send images, video, texts and vCards.

To start using Bluetooth technology

Your Bluetooth connection needs to be configured prior to operation. Your phone provides the following options:

- Power
- Inquiry audio device
- My device
- Active devices
- Settings
- About

Power

- 1. In Settings > Connectivity.
- 2. Select Bluetooth.
- 3. Select **Power** to switch on/off the Bluetooth connectivity.

Inquiry Audio Device

To pair with BT audio device, follow the steps below:

- 1. In Settings menu, choose Connectivity > Bluetooth.
- 2. You will have to power on the Bluetooth connectivity of your phone and the device you wish to connect first.
- 3. After the Bluetooth connectivity is turned on, select **Inquiry audio device**. Your phone will automatically search the device.
- 4. Whenever you select the device, there will be a pop-up message to notify you.
- 5. Press **Pair** to pair your phone with the headset. You might need to enter the headset password which is factory-set, refer to its documentation for further information.
- 6. Then you might add the BT headset to trust list and connect the headset by selecting Yes.

Notes:

- 1. Before using the BT headset, please make sure your device has been full charged.
- 2. The BT headset added to trust list would be displayed in **My device** list. In the future, if you wish to connect you mobile phone with a certain BT headset, you can select from **My device** list for connection.
- 3. All active devices you have connected will be displayed in **Active devices** and you can disconnect anytime by pressing **Disc**.

To pair BT devices

- 1. In **Settings** menu, choose **Connectivity > Bluetooth**.
- 3. Go to My device.
- Select Inquiry new device, then press the left soft key, your phone will automatically search all BT devices.
- 5. To pair with the BT device, press **Pair**. You should create your own password, and agree with the owner of the other device to use the same password. Device that do not have a user interface have a factory-set password. Refer to its documentation for further information.

To connect BT Devices

- 1. In Settings menu, choose Connectivity > Bluetooth.
- 2. Go to My device and select the BT device you wish to connect.
- 3. Select **Options** > **Connect**.
- 4. Before the BT device is connected, your phone will ask you which profile you wish to connect (it will depend on how many profiles your BT device supports).

To send data using Bluetooth connectivity

- 1. Select the object your want to send.
- 2. Select Options > Send.
- 3. Choose Via Bluetooth, then your phone will search for the BT device.
- 4. Select the device you would like to share following by sending action.

To receive data using Bluetooth connectivity

When you receive data through Bluetooth, a notification message will be popped up to ask if you are willing to accept. If you decide to receive the message, press **Yes** and the data will be saved in **Received** folder of **File Manager.**

To listen to stereo music

- 1. In **Settings** menu, choose **Connectivity > Bluetooth**.
- 2. If you have already paired the stereo Bluetooth headset, please go to **My Device** and select the headset you wish to connect. If you never pair the Bluetooth headset before, please pair the headset first.

→ Notes:

- 1. Operating your phone in an invisible mode is a safer way to avoid malicious software.
- 2. Do not accept BT connectivity from sources you do not trust.

About

You may find out your device name, device address, and supported service information here.

Conn. Management

This function allows you to see the connection.

Data Account

You can access WAP via GSM Data or GPRS. To get the analogue number or ISDN number information, you may need to contact your operator for the service. To get the access point of GPRS, you may need to contact your operator for the service.

Restore Factory Settings

This function allows you to reset most of the original factory phone settings back to their original settings. The Phone Lock Password is needed to access this function.

Sound effects

This function allows you to choose the audio effect and bass enhancement.

Messaging

Your phone supports voice mail notification messages and text messages. Voice mails, short message service (text messages) and multimedia message (MMS) are network service. Please check your service provider for further details on the fees.

Writing a Message

To write a message:

- 1. From the main menu, select **Messaging**.
- 2. Choose Write Message > Text Message / Multimedia Message.
- 3. In multimedia message content, you are able to add a picture, sound, video, and/or an attachment into your message.
- 4. After you're finished, select **Options** and then **Send To**.
- 5. Add the recipient by inputting the number manually or searching them in the phonebook.
- 6. Finally, select **Options** and select the **Send** option to send the message.



→ Notes:

- 1. To key in the content, please refer to "Input Method".
- 2. To use the multimedia message function, your network operator or service provider support is necessary. Only phones equipped with this function can receive and display multimedia messages.

Inbox

Your phone saves the text messages and multimedia messages (MMS) that have been received in the Inbox folder.

To Read Messages

When you've received a message, icons will indicate that this is a message is from a SIM card or another phone in the Inbox. If your inbox is full since the messages you have received are saved in SIM as default setting, your message will be saved on the phone instead of the SIM card. If the phone's inbox is full also, there will be a pop-up window to remind you that your inbox is full and cannot accept any new messages.

- 1. From the main menu, select Messaging.
- 2. Then select Inbox. All received messages are listed in this folder.

Drafts

Your phone saves the saved messages in the Draft folder.

Outbox

Your phone saves the messages that unsent in the **Outbox** folder.

Sent Messages

Your phone saves the messages sent successfully in the Sent Messages folder.

Delete Messages

You are able to delete all of the messages in a folder, or even the total messages at once.

Broadcast Message

Your phone allows you to receive commercial messages. You can either enable or disable the receiving mode and set some other settings based on your personal preference.

Templates

There are several default text message and MMS templates in your phone.

Message Settings

Your phone allows you to set up default settings in the text message and MMS features.

- 1. Go to Messaging and choose Message Settings.
- 2. Then select **Text Message** or **Multimedia Message** to change the settings.
- 3. Choose the field you would like to change.

You can customize your text message with the following options:

- Profile Settings: If more than one message profile is allowed by your SIM, you may edit the profiles separately.
- Voicemail Server: Your phone allows you to access your voice mailbox quickly if your operator supports this function. Your voice mail number will be provided by your service provider and displayed in the phone. In the Standby mode, press and hold the 1 key to call your voice mail directly.
- Common Settings: If Delivery Report is on, the network will send delivery reports on your
 messages. If Reply Path is on, you'll transmit the number of your text message center together with
 the message. The recipients can then reply using your text message center, and not theirs. This can
 speed up the rate of transmission of the message. This feature is subscription dependent. If Save
 Sent Message is turned on, the successfully sent messages will be saved in Sent box.
- Memory Status: Allows you check your memory status in either the phone, or the SIM card.
- Preferred Storage: Allows you to change your preferred storage to either your SIM, or the phone.
- Preferred Connection: Allows you to set your preferred connection.

MMS message provide the following options to customize:

Profiles: You may receive and send multimedia messages through a certain network or service provider.

To activate a profile setting, select it and then choose **Activate**.

Common Settings: see following settings.

- Compose: You can compose the format of your phone based on the options listed below:
 - Slide Time: Define the time for the delay between each slide.
 - Creation Mode: If you select Restricted, the device prevents you from sending messages that may not be supported. To include content in your message without notifications, select Free.

- Memory Status: Allows you check the used and free memory.

Multimedia

Mobile TV

Your phone is capable of delivering full length analog, broadcasting television programs from some of the most popular TV channels. TV function may only be available in an analog signal coverage region.

To start using

- To open TV, press the TV key in idle mode. The system will show program availability in your location. In the first start-up, this may take a few minutes. You can pull out the TV antenna and adjust it for better reception.
- To select a program, you can press **Options** and choose **Change Channel**.

If it cannot find any program when you open TV, please press Options and choose Auto Search to search for a signal again. Be sure to check if your country & region is correctly set. Your phone provides the following selections for your option:

- **Sound Settings**: Allows you to switch 3D Surround and Mute on or off.
- Add to Favorite: Allows you to edit your Favorite Channel list.
- **TV Recorder**: Allows you to record the current TV program.
- Storage: Allows you to choose the storage for recording file.
- Restore Default: Allows you to restore the default settings.
- Exit: Exit from mobile TV mode and return to idle mode

Sound Recorder

To Start Recording

- 1. In Multimedia menu, choose Sound Recorder.
- 2. Select **Options > New record** to start recording.



- 1. During recording, you can pause or continue the voice recording anytime by pressing the OK key.
- 2. After the recording is completed, the voice file is saved as AMR, WAV or AWB format.

FM Radio

This feature allows you to listen to your favorite FM radio station anytime with frequency ranging from 87.5 MHz to 108.0 MHz.

To Start Using

Organizer

Calendar

- 4. Choose a type of the event. Input the start and end time of your event, and describe the event contents in **Subject** and **Details**.

- 7. Choose Alarm Clock to turn on or off.

- 9. Then you can edit other information.

Tasks

You can also view, edit or delete the tasks from the options under this feature. For the first-time user, you will need

Alarm

Internet Service

This phone supports a WAP Browser. You can obtain various services such as up-to date news, weather, sport, and other information- as well as other Internet services. These services are designed and maintained by WAP service providers.

Notes:

- 1. To activate WAP service, you may need to contact your service provider.
- 2. Do not switch the phone on when wireless phone use is prohibited, or when it may cause interference or danger.

Homepage

To access the browser from the Standby mode, go to Internet Service in Services and select Homepage. Once connected, the homepage is displayed. The content depends on the service provider. To exit the browser, press the End kev.

You can set the homepage address in Services > Internet Service > Settings > Profiles.

You can use this menu to save important URL addresses to a quick access WAP page.

Recent Pages

You can view the recent pages that you've visited.

Offline Pages

You can view the saved offline pages that you've visited.

Input Address

You can key in the URL address. When you are done, select **Options > Done**. Your phone will connect you to the URL address that you've just keyed in. After the address is entered, you may select the URL and then select Options > Go To to connect to next time.

Service Inbox

WAP push messages are saved here.

Settings

GPRS (General Packet Radio Service) is a technology that is used for sending and receiving data over the mobile network.

WAP Setting

If the settings have made by the service provider, you may begin immediately. If the accessed profiles have been assigned by your service provider, select a profile and activate it. Otherwise, you may key in the setting manually. For appropriate settings, contact your network operator or service provider.

Key In The Service Settings Manually:

- From the main menu, select Services > Internet Service > Settings > Profiles. 1.
- 2. Select a profile from the list. Select Activate Profile to activate the selected profile. You may edit the profile in Profile Name, Homepage, Data Account, Connection Type, User Name, or Password. To get more information, you may need to contact your operator.

Note: In most cases, you only need to use ONE of the default profiles to access the Internet. The settings are different from operator to operator. Please consult your operator or service provider for the correct settings and proceed with care. Wrong settings will cause the connection to fail.

Browser Options

You can set the timeout value for the browser. The purpose is to stop the browser from connecting to the website if the website does not respond within the timeout. Also, you can choose to either to turn On, or turn Off the image

while browsing.

Service Message Settings

You can choose either to receive or reject the service messages that are saved in the service inbox sent by your service provider.

Clear Cache

The information or date you have accessed is all stored in the cache of the phone. A cache is a file buffer used to store data only temporarily. You can clear the cache by selecting this option.

Clear Cookies

Under the consideration of privacy and security issue, we would suggest you to clear cookies which may contain sensitive information just in case your phone is misplaced, lost or stolen.

Trusted Certificates

This function is used to indicate your trusted certificates while browsing, and allows you to manage your trust list.

User profiles

Your phone provides 6 different profiles, including General, Meeting, Outdoor, Indoor, Silent and Headset profiles. **Note**: If you customize the alert type, the indication icon may be changed.

The Headset profile is activated when the headset is plugged in.

Extra

Calculator

The calculator applies simple calculator functions, such as addition, subtraction, multiplications and division.

Currency Converter

First, you should enter the rate, and then enter the local data.

Press the OK key, and the foreign data conversion will be shown automatically.

Stopwatch

This function is designed to store the timepiece, which is to start or stop for exact timing.

To use stopwatch

- 1. From the main menu select **Extra** > **Stopwatch**.
- 2. Select **Typical stopwatch.** You can choose different record methods and view records.

- **Split Timing:** When you select this, the timepiece will be saved and continue to count when you press **Split.** The 2nd timepiece is recorded based on the continuous timing. You can stop and resume anytime.
- Lap Timing: When you select this, the timepiece will be saved and start the new timing when you press Lap. The 2nd timepiece is recorded in new timing. You can stop and resume anytime.

Make sure your cellular phone is switched on and in a service area. In idle mode, input the SOS number, then press the Dial Key. Advise where you are and do not hang up without permission.

Using the Cellular Phone and Charger

Danger:

Only use the battery and charger approved by the manufacturer. Using other brands may cause battery leakage, overheating, explosion or even fire.

Caution:

Keep the phone away from dust, water and damp areas. Dust, water or other liquids may cause overheating, electrical leakage, and/or phone failure.

The phone, battery, charger and AC adapter are not waterproof. Keep them away from liquid.

Warning:

Do not bump, shake or tamper with the phone or charger. This may cause battery leakage, overheating, explosion or even fire.
