Audex™ Jacket Series

The Audex Jacket is the first to combine coveted Burton® apparel with leading Bluetooth® wireless technology from Motorola. This cutting edge technology provides music and wireless communications on or off the mountain. Answer calls from friends and control your favorite tunes using the integrated control panel on your sleeve. Free yourself to enjoy other activities while your compatible mobile phone and iPod® stay in your pockets and out of your way.

The Audex Jacket features integrated stereo speakers in the hood, a microphone and chest/battery module embedded within the inside pocket of the jacket, as well as a control panel on the sleeve that allows remote operation of your phone and iPod. When you prefer a more secluded experience, enjoy instant privacy by listening to music or conducting calls with a wired headset plugged into the 3.5mm headset jack on the chest module. When it is time to wind down, the removable electronics make it easy to clean your jacket.

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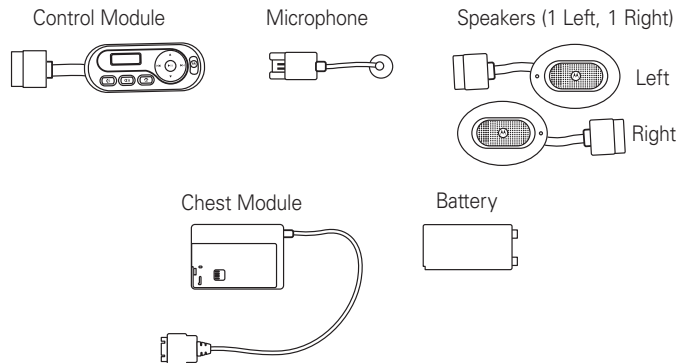
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Audex Components

Take a moment before you get started to familiarize yourself with the components of your new Audex Jacket. The following components are provided in the box included with your jacket:

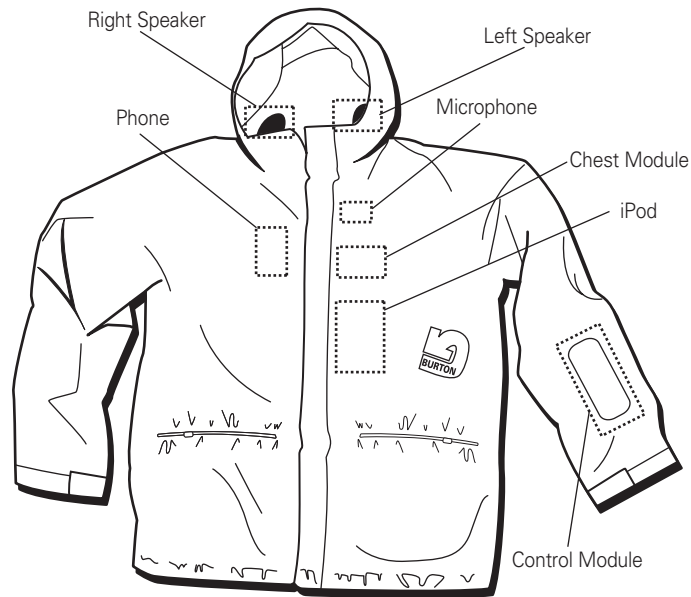
- Control Module
- Chest Module
- Speakers (2)
- Microphone
- Battery



Installing Your Audex Components

For instructions on installing the components on your jacket, see the *Audex Jacket Series Quick Start Guide* (included in your box of components).

Once installed and connected, the components are located on the jacket as shown below:



The following items must be purchased separately:

- Bluetooth Phone
- iPod (requires iPod with Dock Connector)

Charging the Battery

Your Audex system utilizes a rechargeable battery that is installed in the Chest Module. The battery powers all electronic components that come with your jacket.

Follow these steps to charge the battery:

- 1 If necessary, install the proper country power adapter on the wall charger connector as shown in the example.

The following power adapters are provided with your jacket:

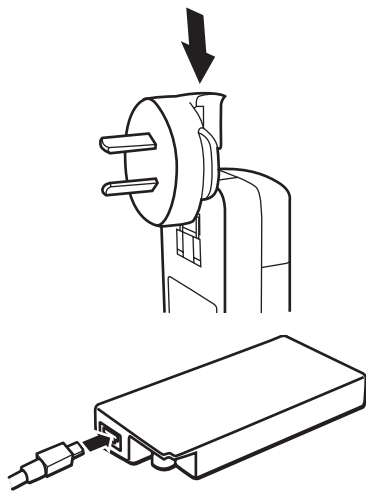
- UK (SYN7455A)
- Europe (SYN7456A)
- Australia / New Zealand (SYN8127B)

- 2 Plug the charger into the battery's charging port as shown.

Be sure to align the plug correctly. If the plug does not connect to the unit easily, try flipping it over and re-inserting.

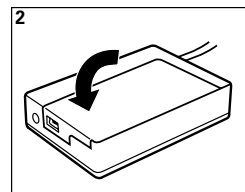
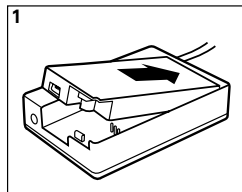
- 3 Plug the charger into an electrical wall outlet.

The red indicator light turns on when the battery is charging. When the battery is fully charged (about 2 hours), an additional green indicator light turns on.



Installing Your Battery

Follow the steps shown in the diagram to install the battery into the Chest Module.



Battery Tips

Battery performance depends on network configuration, signal strength, operating temperature, features selected, and voice, data, and other application usage patterns.

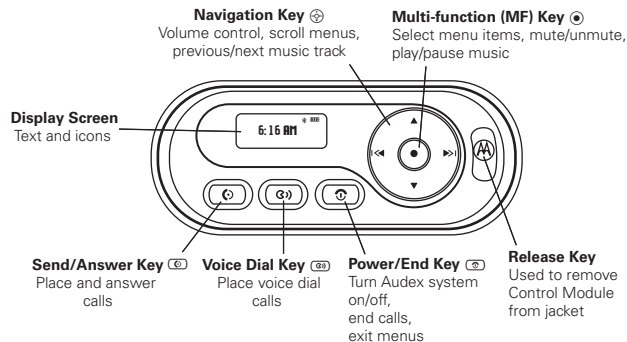
- Always use Motorola Original batteries and chargers. The warranty does not cover damage caused by non-Motorola batteries and/or chargers.
- New batteries or batteries stored for a long time may take more time to charge.
- When charging your battery, keep it near room temperature.
- When storing your battery, keep it partially charged in a cool, dark, dry place.
- Never expose batteries to temperatures below -10°C (14°F) or above 60°C (140°F).
- It is normal for batteries to gradually wear down and require longer charging times. If you notice a change in your battery life, it is probably time to purchase a new battery.

Warning: Never dispose of batteries in a fire because they may explode.

Basic Audex Operation

The Audex system is operated using the Control Module. The Control Module furnishes a combination of buttons and a display screen to operate your phone and iPod with your jacket. Here's a quick anatomy lesson of the Control Module.







Control Module Keys

Several push button keys and a multi-position navigation key allow you to perform tasks with your phone and iPod using the Control Module on your jacket.

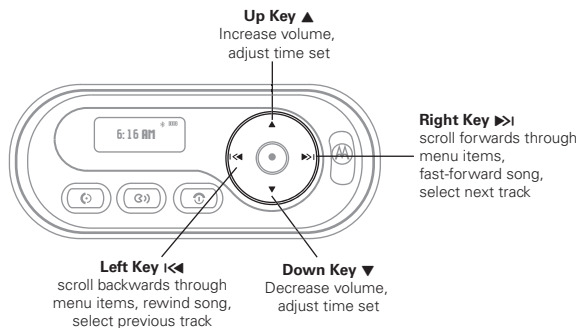
Push Button Keys

Push button keys are used to operate the Control Module. Each key provides multiple functions when used within the jacket

Navigation Key

The navigation key is a multi-position controller that provides easy scrolling capabilities on the Control Module.



Each position on the navigation key provides multiple functions:

Key	Function
▲ Up	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• increase volume• adjust time value in time setting
▼ Down	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• decrease volume• adjust time value in time setting

Key	Function (Continued)
◀◀ Left	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• access main menu (from Idle screen)• scroll backward through menu items• start song over• play previous song (press twice)• rewind song (press and hold)
▶▶ Right	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• access main menu (from Idle screen)• scroll forward through menu items• skip to next song• fast-forward song (press and hold)

Control Module Display

A display panel on the Control Module provides text and indicators for status, navigation, and current activity when using your Audex jacket.

There are three main areas on your display panel:

- Status
- Navigation
- Current Activity

Status

The status area provides jacket operational and configuration status, and is highlighted in the figure below:

Use the following tips for navigating the main menu:

- The main menu is accessed by first pressing the  key, then pressing the  and  keys to navigate through the initial menu selections.
- Use the  key to make menu selections.
- Use the **Back** selection in each menu to step backwards.
- iPod menu is only accessible when the iPod is connected in the jacket.




Calling Menu

The following selections are provided in the calling menu:

Note: The calling menu is only accessible during a call.

Menu	Description
1) Mute/Unmute	mutes/unmutes microphone during a call
2) Hold/Resume	places on hold/resumes connected call
3) Call Time	displays connected call duration
4) Back	exits calling menu


Use the following tips for navigating the main menu:

- While in a call, press the  and  keys to navigate through the menu selections.
- Use the  key to make menu selections.
- Use the **Back** selection in each menu to move backwards.

Using Your Audex Jacket

This section provides instructions on performing operating tasks with Audex.

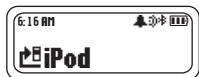
Turning Your Audex Jacket On & Off

To turn on or off Audex, press and hold  key on the Control Module for at least 5 seconds until the Motorola logo is displayed.

When turned on, the Audex system establishes a connection with your phone and iPod (however, the connection assumes an established Bluetooth link exists with your phone).

Note: Ensure your phone's Bluetooth feature is turned on and is paired with the jacket. To pair your phone and jacket, see "Pairing Your Audex Jacket and Phone" on page 12.

- When connecting to the iPod, the iPod Connected icon is displayed for a few seconds.



- When connecting to the phone, the Phone Connected icon is displayed for a few seconds.



- Once the Audex jacket is connected to the phone and iPod, the iPod menu is displayed.



- If the phone is already on a call when connecting to the Audex jacket, the Call Connected icon is displayed for a few seconds.




- If only the phone is connected to the jacket (and the phone is not currently on a call), the Idle Mode screen is displayed.
- While connected to the phone, the Control Module light indicator around the navigation key flashes quickly every 3 seconds
- When disconnecting your phone or iPod, the Disconnected icon is displayed for a few seconds.






Idle Mode

When not operating the phone or iPod, the Audex system is placed in Idle mode. When in Idle mode, the following screen is displayed:




Upon operating the phone or iPod, the clock is minimized and displayed in the upper left of the display screen. If a song is paused, the Pause () is also displayed.

Pairing Your Audex Jacket and Phone

- 1 Press  key to return to Idle Mode screen. If a song is playing, it is paused.
- 2 Select **Bluetooth** in main menu and press  key.
- 3 Select **Find Me** and press  key.




The Audex jacket is placed in Bluetooth pairing mode for 3 minutes (the Bluetooth icon  remains flashing during pairing mode).

- 4 Using your phone, perform a Bluetooth device discovery (refer to your phone manual for detailed instructions on accessing Bluetooth and putting it in device discovery mode). For most Motorola phones, you can find the Bluetooth option under the Main Menu or Connections menu:

After accessing Bluetooth:

- a Select **Look for Devices**.
The phone lists Bluetooth devices it finds.
- b Select **Audex**.
- c Select **OK** or **Yes** to pair your jacket with your phone.
- d Enter the passkey: **0000**
- e Select **OK**.






When your Audex jacket successfully pairs with your phone, the light indicator around the navigation key flashes rapidly 5 times and the Bluetooth icon  changes from flashing to steadily lit. Each time you power the Control Module on/off, the jacket tries to establish a Bluetooth connection with the same phone. If after 30 seconds, that phone is not found, the jacket automatically goes into Bluetooth pairing mode (Bluetooth icon flashes).

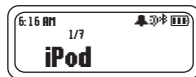
Note: Step 4 is for most Motorola phones. For other phones, see your phone's user's guide for instructions on performing a Bluetooth device discovery.

Playing Music


Selecting a Song to Play


To listen to a song, you must first select from your iPod.


- 1 Press  key to return the Idle Mode screen, then select **iPod** in main menu and press  key.
- 2 Select song selection category and press  key.
- 3 Select playlist/album/artist and press  key.
- 4 Select song and press  key. The iPod Song icon is displayed.

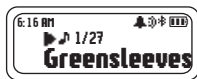


Playing a Song

Once you select a song, you can play it by pressing the  key.









Note: When a song is selected, the Song () icon is displayed. To select a song, see “Selecting a Song to Play”.


The iPod Play () icon is displayed and the song is played on your jacket.





The song title and artist are displayed scrolling across the screen.

Music Features

To do this...	Do this
Pause a song	Press  key.
Change the song volume	Press the  and  keys.
Fast-forward a song	Press and hold  key.
Rewind a song	Press and hold  key.
Skip to next song	Press  key. (If playing last song on song list. song is paused).
Start song over	Press  key. (If playing first song on song list. song is paused).
Play the previous song	Press  key twice.

When playing, the song is automatically paused when you make or receive a call, or press the  key.


To continue to play the song (once phone call is ended), do one of the following:

- Quick press (tap) the  key.
- First select **Back To iPod** in the iPod menu, then press  key.

Making and Receiving Calls

Making a Voice Dial Call

Note: To make a voice dial call, your phone must support voice dial features.

- 1 Press  key. If a song is playing, it is paused.



- 2 Speak name of person to call. Name is repeated over jacket speaker and the Call Dialing icon is displayed.



Once connected, the Call Connected icon is displayed.




Making a Handset Dial Call


- 1 Dial the phone number using the phone handset. You will hear dialing over the jacket speakers. (If a song is playing, it is paused.)
- 2 Press Send key on the phone.


Once connected, the Call Connected icon is displayed.




Making a Call Using a Recent Call Phone Number

- 1 Press  key to return to Idle Mode screen. If a song is playing, it is paused.



Shortcut: Press  key from the Idle Mode screen to directly access the Dialed Calls menu (skipping steps 2 and 3).

- 2 Select **Recent Calls** in main menu and press  or  key.



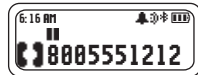
- 3 Select **Dialed Calls** or **Received Calls** and press  key.



- 4 Select phone number and press  or  key. The Call Dialing icon is displayed.




Once connected, the Call Connected icon is displayed for a few seconds. Then the caller ID dialed is displayed during the call.



Receiving a Call




When an incoming call is active, the Call Dialing icon and caller ID is displayed.




- **To answer an incoming call**, press the  key. If a song is playing, it is paused.

Once connected, the Call Connected icon is displayed for a few seconds. If available, the phone number dialed is displayed during the call.



- **To ignore an incoming call**, press the  key.
- **For calls that are missed**, the Missed Call () icon is displayed until any button is pressed on the Control Module. If the  key is pressed, the Received Calls menu is displayed.



For all instances of receiving an incoming call, the iPod will be paused if playing music. To continue playing music, press the  key.

Ending a Call








To end a call, press  key. The Call Ended icon is displayed.




When the call ends, if a song is paused, do one of the following to continue to play the song:


- Quick press (tap) the  key.
- First select **Back To iPod** in the iPod menu, then press  key.

Calling Features



To do this...	Do this
Mute / unmute a call	Press  key when on a call, OR Select Mute/Unmute in calling menu and press  key. While call is muted, Muted is displayed next to the Call Connected icon. When call is unmuted, Connected text is redisplayed.
Change the call volume	Press the  and  keys.
Hold / resume a call	Select Hold/Resume in calling menu and press  key. Call On Hold icon is displayed.
View call time	Select Call Time in calling menu and press  key.
End a call on hold	Press  key.

Locking/Unlocking Control Module Keys

To lock keys on the Control Module, press and hold  key for 5 seconds.

The Hold/Lock Mode  icon is displayed and the Control Module keys are disabled (locked).

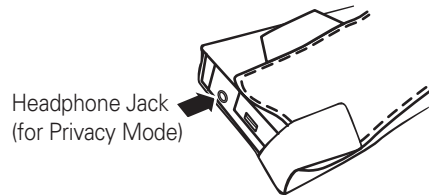


To unlock keys on the Control Module, press and hold  key for 5 seconds until the Hold/Lock Mode  icon is no longer displayed.

Using Privacy Mode

Your Audex system allows you to listen to audio in privacy using headphones. In privacy mode, all audio from your phone or iPod is output to your headphones (while the speakers in the jacket hood are silent).





To use privacy mode, connect your headphones into the headphone jack on the Chest Module.

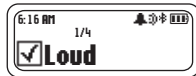


Note: Chest Module holder design may vary among jackets.

Customizing Your Audex Jacket




Setting Ring Style

- 1 Press  key to return to Idle Mode screen. If a song is playing, it is paused.
- 2 Select **Ring Styles** in main menu and press  key.
- 3 Select **Styles** and press  key.
- 4 Select ring style and press  key. A Checkmark icon is displayed.




Setting Ring Tones

Note: Audex ringtones are used only when the phone is in silent or vibrate mode. Otherwise, the phone's ringtones are used.

- 1 Press  key to return to Idle Mode screen. If a song is playing, it is paused.
- 2 Select **Ring Styles** in main menu and press  key.
- 3 Select **Ring Tones** and press  key.







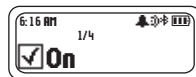
- 4 Select a ringer and press  key. A Checkmark icon is displayed.



Turning Bluetooth® Indicator Light On and Off



Note: This procedure turns the Bluetooth indicator light on/off on the Control Module, but does not turn off the Audex Bluetooth connection or link features.

- 1 Press  key to return to Idle Mode screen. If a song is playing, it is paused.
- 2 Select **Bluetooth** in main menu and press  key.
- 3 Select **Bluetooth Light** and press  key.
- 4 Select **On** or **Off** and press  key. A Checkmark icon is displayed.




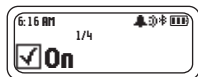
Saving Battery Power

This procedure allows you to shorten the length of time that buttons and indicators remain lit on the Control Module (thereby extending battery life).








- 1 Press  key to return to Idle Mode screen. If a song is playing, it is paused.
- 2 Select **Battery Save** in main menu and press  key.

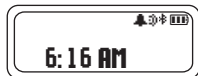


- 3 Select **On** or **Off** and press  key. A Checkmark icon is displayed.



Setting Time

- 1 Press  key to return to Idle Mode screen. If a song is playing, it is paused.
- 2 Select **Set Time** in main menu and press  key.
- 3 Adjust time as follows:
 - Press  and  keys to move between values (currently selected value flashes).
 - Press  and  keys to change value.
- 4 Press  key to commit changes.



Maintenance and Care

Please use the following guidelines for proper maintenance and care of your Audex Jacket:

Care

- Allow jacket to completely dry after riding or exposure to moisture. Do not expose the Audex components to moisture.
- This jacket is a high-tech piece of apparel. Do not expose the Audex components to excessive force or impact. Be careful not to drop the Audex Jacket.

Washing Instructions

- **Excessive washing is not recommended.**
- Before washing the jacket, you must remove your iPod, phone, and all Audex Jacket components. See "Contents" on page 3 for a listing of all components. Warranty will no longer be valid if components are not removed prior to washing.
- Tuck in all cords, close pockets, and zip the jacket closed.
- Follow washing instructions on the inside of the jacket. These are as follows:
 - Machine Wash Warm (Below 30c) using powdered detergent. Rinse thoroughly.
 - DO NOT Bleach.
 - Tumble dry low heat, or hang dry in shade.
 - DO NOT iron.
 - DO NOT dry clean.
 - DO NOT use fabric softener.
 - Periodically replenish water repellent finish – spray on only.
- Allow your jacket to completely dry before reinstalling the Audex electronic components.

Avoid Hearing Damage

Using the headset at high volume may result in permanent hearing loss. If you experience ringing in your ear, reduce the volume or discontinue using Audex Jacket Series. With continued use at high volume, your ear may become accustomed to the sound level, which may result in permanent damage to your hearing. Keep Audex Jacket Series volume at a safe level.

Avoid Moisture

It is important to properly dry jacket after every use by hanging in a warm, dry location. Do not expose the Audex components to moisture.

Location of Use

Audex Jacket Series is NOT to be used in the vicinity of any explosive or hazardous substances, as it may become volatile and cause serious injury or death.

See "Electromagnetic Interference" above for restrictions on using Audex Jacket Series in medical facilities and aboard aircraft.

Proper Care of your Audex Jacket

Do Not Modify or Dismantle

Do not attempt to open Audex Jacket system components. Doing so may expose you to electric shock and serious injury. There are no user-serviceable parts inside. Any attempt to alter or repair the module will void the limited warranty. Users are not permitted to make changes or modify the device in any way. Changes and modifications void the user's authority to operate the device. See 47 CFR Sec. 15.21.

Battery

Do not attempt to remove the internal rechargeable battery. Disposal of devices that contain internal rechargeable batteries must be in accordance with local environmental regulations.

Temperature

- Do not use your Audex Jacket in temperatures lower than -10°C / 14°F or higher than 60°C / 140°F. **Battery life may temporarily shorten in low-temperature conditions.**
- Do not recharge your Audex Jacket in temperatures lower than 0°C / 32°F or higher than 40°C / 104°F.
- Conditions inside a parked car can exceed this temperature range. Do not store your Audex Jacket in a parked car.
- Do not store your Audex Jacket in direct sunlight.
- Storing your Audex Jacket fully charged in high temperature conditions may permanently reduce the life of the battery.

Shock

Do not expose your Audex Jacket to excessive force or impact. Be careful not to drop your Audex Jacket.

Charger

Do not force the charging cable connector into the battery charging port. If the connector won't go into the port, try flipping the connector 180 degrees. Do not attempt to charge your Audex Jacket with any charger other than the one designed by Motorola specifically to be used with this product.

Cleaning

To clean components in your Audex Jacket System, use a soft cotton cloth to gently brush all surfaces to remove any grit or particles that might scratch the surfaces. Please note the following:

- The Audex Jacket components are not waterproof**, and excessive moisture will damage the electronic circuitry. Do not rinse or immerse any modules.
- Before cleaning, make sure the Audex Jacket System is unplugged from the wall charger.
- Do not clean the modules with soaps, detergents, ammonia, alkaline cleaners, abrasive cleaning compounds or solvents. These substances may leak into the module and damage the electronic circuitry.
