2. Install Hardware

Notice:

- 2-1. Turn off your computer -> Connect the Receiver to the Computer.
- 2-2. Select the Keyboard Channel.
 - 1) The two-channel switch is located on the back of the keyboard. Select channel "1" or "2".



- 2) Put the batteries into the battery case.
- 2-3. Link the Keyboard with the Receiver
 - 1) Turn on your PC \rightarrow Press the IDLink Button on the receiver.
 - 2) Press the ID Link Button on the back of the keyboard.
 - 3) If youneed to re-link the keyboard or after changing the batteries, please repeat the above linkage step 1~2.
 - 4) If the selected channel is interfered by other wireless-keyboard users nearby, please change the Link ID by re-linkage or select the other channel immediately.
 - 5) There are 256 changeable IDs for each channel.
