Safety and Use

We recommend that you read this chapter carefully before using your device. The manufacturer disclaims any liability for damage, which may result as a consequence of improper use or use contrary to the instructions contained herein.

TRAFFIC SAFETY:

Given that studies show that using a mobile phone while driving a vehicle constitutes a real risk, even when the hands-free kit is used (car kit, headset...), drivers are requested to refrain from using their mobile when the vehicle is not parked.

When driving, do not use your device and headphone to listen to music or the radio. Using a headphone can be dangerous and forbidden in some areas.

When switched on, your device emits electromagnetic waves that can interfere with the vehicle's electronic systems such as ABS anti-lock brakes or airbags. To ensure that there is no problem:

- do not place your device on top of the dashboard or within an airbag deployment area.
- check with your car dealer or the car manufacturer to make sure that the dashboard is adequately shielded from mobile phone RF energy.

CONDITIONS OF USE:

This is because, for purposes of system efficiency and to minimize interference on the network, the operating power of your mobile device is automatically decreased when full power is not needed for the call. The lower the power output of the device, the lower its SAR value.

If you are not using an approved accessory ensure that whatever product is used is free of any metal and that it positions the device the indicated distance away from the body.

Organizations such as the World Health Organization and the US Food and Drug Administration have stated that if people are concerned and want to reduce their exposure they could use a hands-free device to keep the device away

from the head and body during phone calls, or reduce the amount of time spent on the device.

Your device is equipped with a built-in antenna. For optimal operation, you should avoid touching it or degrading it. As mobile devices offer a range of functions, they can be used in positions other than against your ear. In such circumstances the device will be compliant with the guidelines when used with headset or USB data cable.

2 – Keys and Connectors

Key	Function
Recent Apps Key	Press to view recent used applications.
Home Key	From any application or screen, Press to return to the Home screen.
Back Key	Press to go back to the previous screen, or to close a dialog box, options menu, the notification panel, etc.
Function Key	Press to launch the user programmed app or function.
Power Key	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Press: Lock the screen/Light up the screen. • Press and hold: Show the pop-up menu to select from Power off/Reboot/Airplane mode. • Press and hold the Power key for more than 10s to restart. • Press and hold the Power key and Volume down key for more than 24 to reset. • Press the Power key and Volume down key to capture a screenshot.

3.1—Installing or Removing the Battery



Note: The CR4900 has a backup battery enabling main battery hotswapping without closing applications, entering sleep mode or being plugged into a power source. The backup battery will power the unit for approximately 10 minutes during a hot-swap, if a charged battery is not

replaced the unit will shut down and any unsaved data could be lost.

3.2 – Installing or Removing the microSD Card

Insert the microSD card with the golden contacts facing downwards into the slot. To remove the microSD card, gently press in and slide it out.

Note: To avoid data loss and SD card damage, before removing the SD card, please ensure that the SD card is unmounted (Settings\Storage\Unmount SD card).



3.3 – Charging the Battery

The CR4900 has two batteries:

Standard/Extended Battery: 3.7V, 4,000mAh

Backup Battery: 3.7V, 60mAh

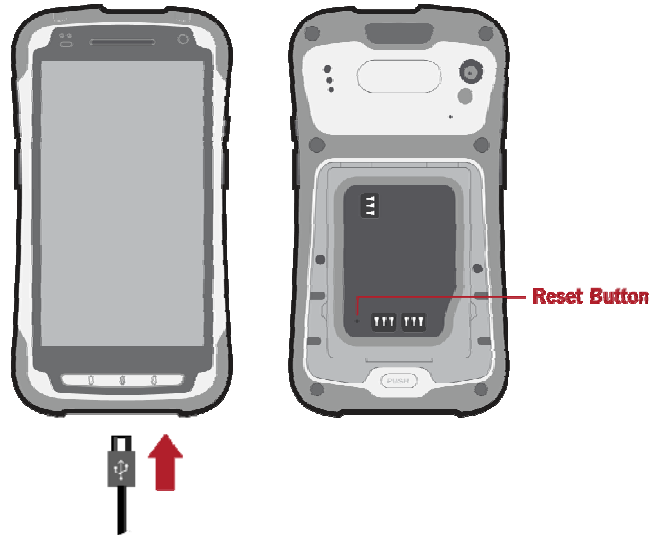
Charging Rate Time: < 4 hrs / 6 hrs (from Low-Battery Shutdown level)

Connect the battery charger to your device and wall socket respectively, the LED indicator will illuminate red while charging.

If the device loses power during use, remove battery, press the reset button to wake the backup battery from sleep mode, and replace with a fully charged battery or connect to a power source.

To view more detailed information about battery usage time or charge remaining on the battery, go to **Settings\Device\Battery**.

Note: To reduce power consumption, when the battery is fully charged, disconnect your charger; switch off WLAN, Bluetooth or background-running applications when not in use; reduce the backlight time, etc.



Powering On Your Device

Hold down the Power key until the device powers on. It will take a few seconds before the screen lights up.

Setting Up Your Device for the First Time: The first time you power on the device, you should set the following options: Input method, Google account, location, etc.

Powering Off Your Device

Hold down the **Power** key from the Home screen until the device options appear, select **Power off**.



3.4 – Powering On/Off

Similar to swiping, but flicking the finger in a quick motion will make the movement faster.

Pinch/Spread:

Place two fingers on the screen surface and draw them apart or together to scale an element on the screen.

Rotate:

Automatically change the screen orientation from portrait to landscape by turning the device sideways to get a wider view.

Status Bar

- Status/Notification indicators
- Touch and drag down to open the notification panel.

Search Bar

- Tap to enter text search screen.
- Tap microphone to enter voice search screen.

Swipe left or right to see additional home page items.

Tap an icon to open an application, folder, etc.

Favorite Applications Tray

- Tap to open an application.
- Touch and hold to move or change applications.

Tap to enter application list.



3.5 – Using the Touchscreen

You can move all of items (applications, shortcuts, folders and widgets) you use most frequently to your Home screen for quick access. Touch the Home key to switch to the Home screen.



Tap:

To access an application, tap it with your finger.



Touch and Hold:

Touch and hold an item to enter the available options.



Drag:

Touch and drag an object on the screen to move to another location.



Slide/Swipe:

Slide the screen up and down, left and right to scroll through applications, images, web pages, etc.



















The device also supports one finger zoom (Messaging, Browser, Email, Camera and Gallery) by double tapping the screen then sliding with one finger to zoom in and out.

Quick Setting Panel

Touch and drag down the Notification panel to open the Quick setting panel. You can enable or disable functions or change modes by touching the icons.

Touch to access **Settings**, where you can set more items.

4.3 – Search Bar

The device provides a Search function that can be used to locate information within applications, the device, or the web.

4.4 – Lock/Unlock Your Screen

To protect your device and privacy, you can lock the device screen by creating a variety of patterns, PIN or password etc.

4.5 – Personalize Your Home Screen

Add:

You can touch and hold a folder, an application, or a widget to activate the Move mode and drag the item to any Home screen as you prefer.

Reposition:

Touch and hold the item to activate the Move mode, drag the item to the desired position and then release. You can move items both on the Home screen and the Favorite tray. Hold the icon on the left or right edge of the screen to drag the item to another Home screen.

Remove:

Touch and hold the item to activate the Move mode, drag the item up to the top of the “X” icon, and release after the item turns red.

4.6 – Volume Adjustment

You can set the ringer, media and device ringtone volumes to your preference by pressing the Volume up/down key, or touching **Settings\Sound & Notification\Media volume** to set the volume.

5.1 – Connecting to WiFi

To connect to the Internet with this device, you can use a WLAN network.

WiFi

Using WiFi, you can connect to the Internet when your device is within range

of a wireless network.

With the USB cable, you can transfer media files and other files between your microSD card/internal storage and the computer.

To Connect/Disconnect Your Device to/from the Computer*

To Connect:

- Use the USB cable supplied with your device to connect the device to a USB port on your computer. You will receive a notification that the USB is connected.
- Open the Notification panel and touch Connected as a media device, then make a selection in the dialog that opens to confirm that you want to transfer files.

To Disconnect (for mass storage):

- Open the Notification panel and touch Connected as a media device.
- Touch to cancel Media device (MTP) in the dialog that opens.

Create folders:


To improve the organization of items (shortcuts or applications) on the Home screen, you can add them to a folder by stacking one item on top of another. To rename a folder, open it and touch the folder's title bar to input the new name.

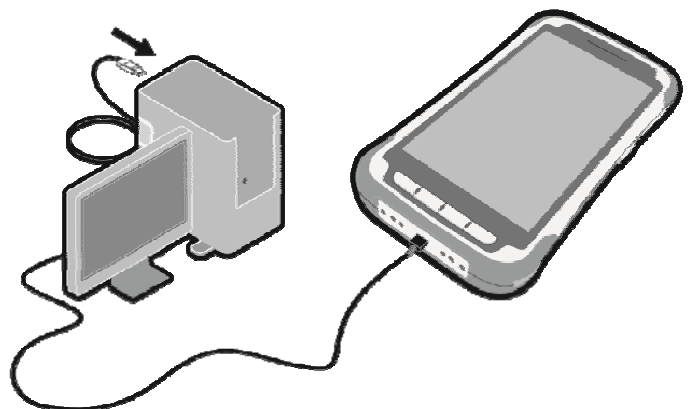
Wallpaper customization:

Touch Settings on the applications screen then touch Display\Wallpaper to customize wallpaper.

5.2 – Connecting to a Computer

To Turn WiFi On and Connect to a Wireless Network

- Tap **Settings\WiFi**.
- Tap the  switch to turn on/off WiFi.
- The detailed information of detected WiFi networks is displayed in the WiFi networks section.
- Tap a WiFi network to connect. If the network you selected is secured, you are required to enter a password or other credentials (you can contact the network operator for details). When finished, touch **CONNECT**.



* You can change your default connection mode via **Settings\Storage**, touch the icon **\USB computer connection**. Some operations which are available under mass storage are not usable under MTP and PTP.



- **Add network:** Allows you to manually add a network from its SSID
- **Saved networks:** Lists all networks that have been logged into on the device
- **Refresh:** Reloads the list of available networks within radio range
- **Advanced Wi-Fi:**
 - **Network notification:** Enable/disable notification when networks are within radio range
 - **Scanning always available:** Enable/disable scanning for wireless networks
 - **Keep Wi-Fi on during sleep:** Enable/disable setting
 - **Wi-Fi frequency band:** Select Automatic detection or limit only to 2.5 GHz or 5.0 GHz bands
 - **Install certificates:** Manually install certificates from downloads, internal storage or microSD



Bluetooth

Section 5.3 details information about connecting to a Bluetooth device. To access advanced settings, press the  icon at the top right portion of the screen.

- **Refresh:** Lists available Bluetooth connections within range
- **Rename this device:** Allows user to change the identification of a connected device
- **Show received files:** Shows a list of files received over Bluetooth connection

Data Usage

Data usage shows a detail of incoming and outgoing data graphically and in list form based on application. To access advanced settings, press the  icon at the top right portion of the screen.

- **Network restrictions:** Enable/disable metering on saved wireless networks





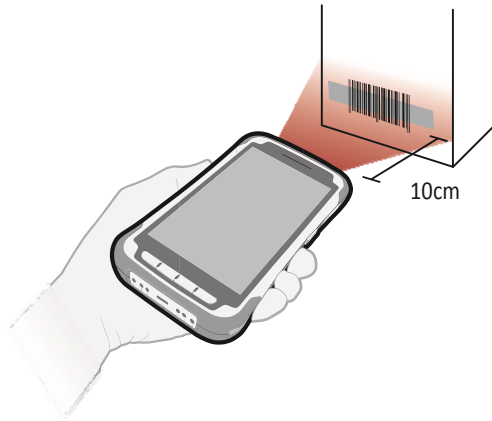

Cleaning the CR4900

The CR4900 window should be clean to allow the best performance of the device. The window is the clear plastic piece inside the head of the reader. Avoid touching the window. Your CR4900 uses CMOS technology that is much like a digital camera. A dirty window may stop the CR4900 from reading barcodes.

If the window becomes dirty, clean it with a soft, non-abrasive cloth or a facial tissue (no lotions or additives) that has been moistened with water. A mild detergent may be used to clean the window, but the window should be wiped with a water moistened cloth or tissue after using the detergent.

To clean your reader, wipe down with a damp cloth or cloth with mild detergent to remove dirt and debris. If also disinfecting the unit, use a disinfectant from your reader's approved list (http://codecorp.com/assets/data_sheet/Disinfectant-Ready-Plastics---Healthcare-Data-Sheet.pdf) and follow the instructions on the disinfectant packaging for proper use and exposure time.
