Mobile Phone

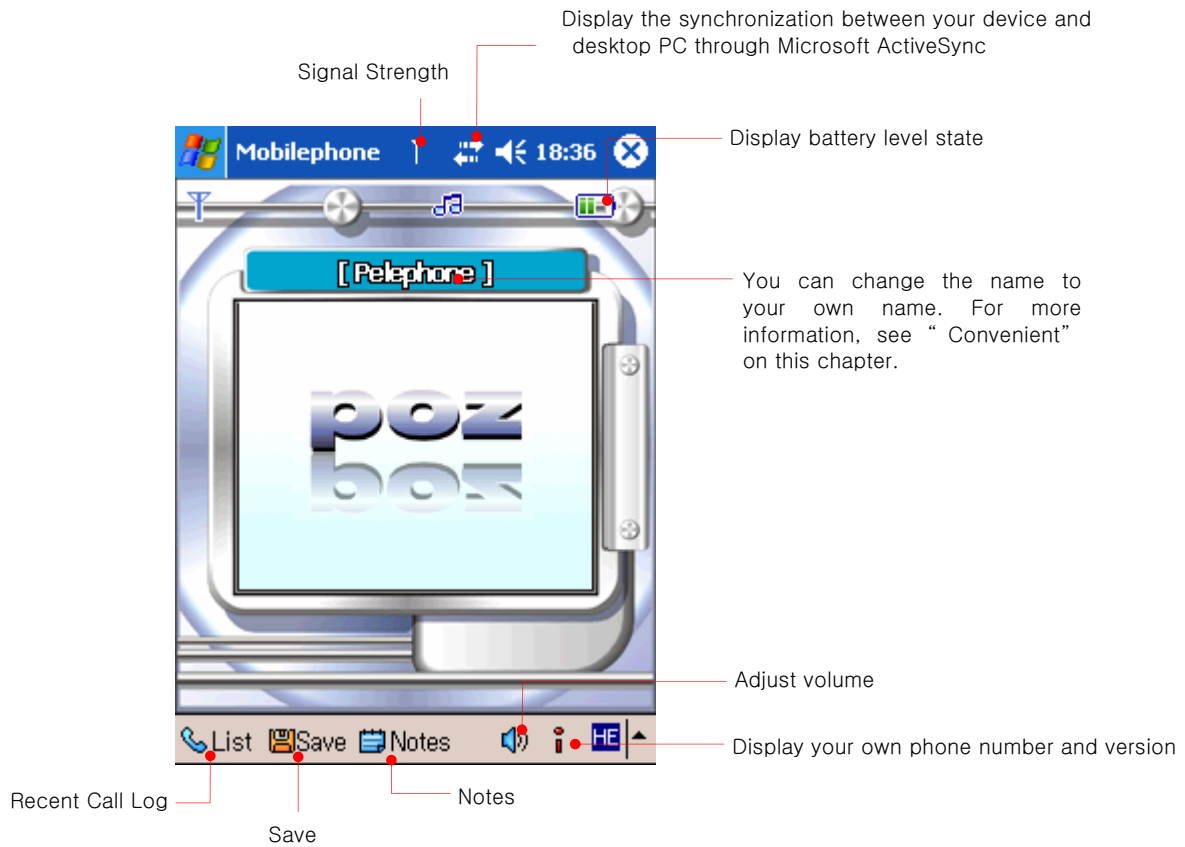
Your device has a built-in CDMA module that supports wide-range data communication and additional features including SMS (Short Messaging Services), along with voice calls. These features save you the trouble of having to purchase another cellular phone with a phone number. Remember that you have no other right to copy the ESN number against the communication law.

Phone Program

You can open the mobile phone program as follows :





- Start  button > “ MobilePhone” .
- Push the slide up.
- Select “ MobilePhone” on POZ Launcher program.





Indicators in the Phone display

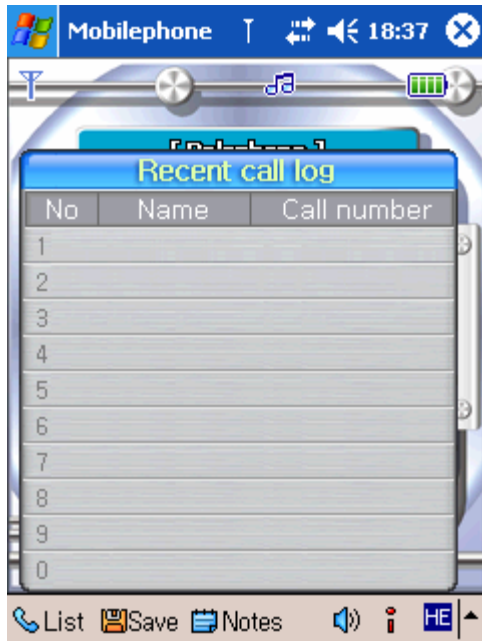

Voice message

When the voice message  icon appears, press    to hear your voice message that somebody sent to you.

Recent Call Log


Tap  or press  to have the recent call log appear.




Select the number you want and press  to make a call.

Find your colleagues using 4-digit number

This is how you can find your colleague's full phone number that includes 4-digit number you press.


Enter 4-digit number and press  .



Select the phone number you want and press  again.

save

tap Save  icon to save a new name with his phone number



Enter the first name and the last name.

The Display textbox shows you the full name as 3 different ways.




- A blank comes between the first name and the last name.
- The first name comes first and the last name comes last.
- No blank between the first name and the last name.

It is recommended that Display, phone number phone type should be entered and category should be also selected.

If this phone number is frequently used, you had better assign the speed dial to this phone number.

Tap OK to save it.


Adjust voice between you and your party

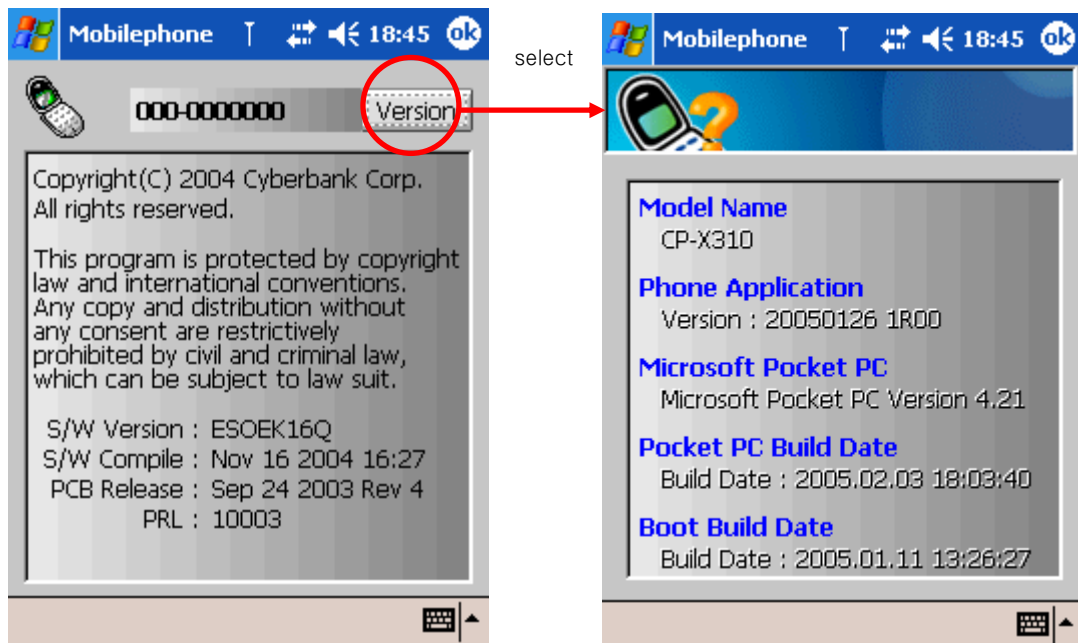
Tap  to adjust voice during conversation over the phone with your party. Or, push up or down the jog dial to adjust voice as shown below.



Select the bar you want and the volume pane disappear automatically.






See your own phone number and phone version

Tap  to see your own phone number and phone version and etc.




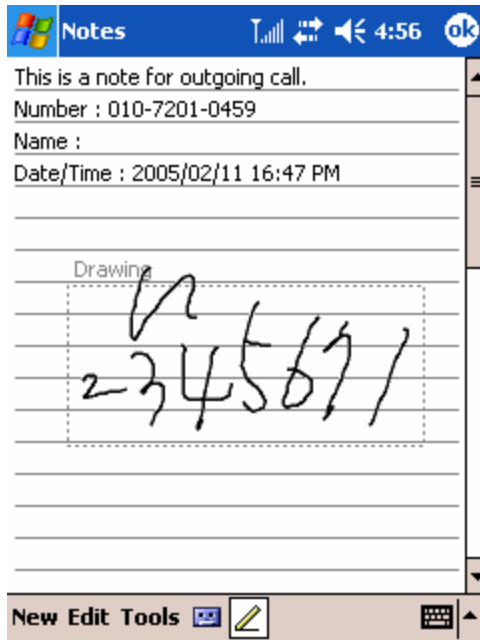
While on a call, the icons on the command bar


While communicating over your phone, you will also see icons on the Command bar as follows.

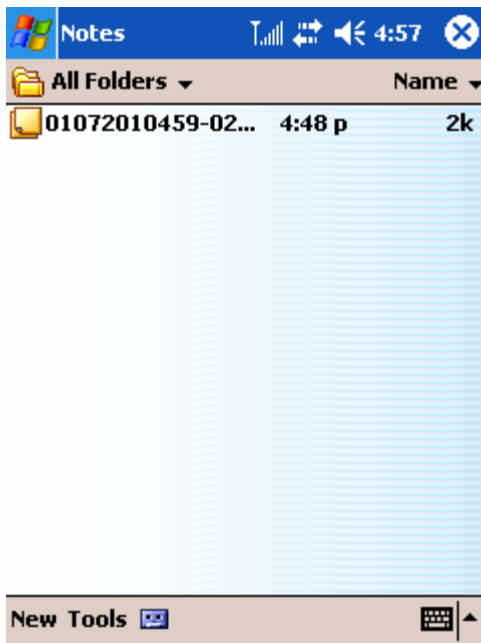
Icons	Descriptions
 Mute /  Un-mute	Tap one icon to have the other icon display. You can un-mute while communicating.
 Remove Key Sound /  Key Sound	Tap icon to have the other icon display. You cannot hear any key sound while tapping any key on your dial pad.
 User Information	Tap this icon to have the User Information screen display and you can select any number you have entered before to send out.

Call Notes

Tap  on the command bar to make notes during a voice call.

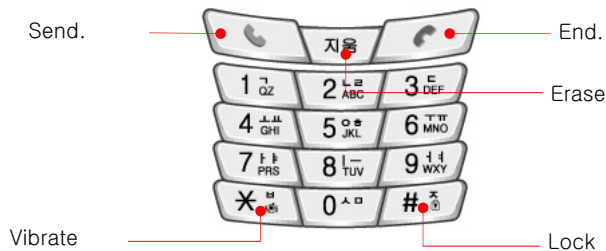


You can enter any contents you want and record your voice. When you finish entering any contents you want, tap  to display the folder(File Store\CallNotes).



Phone Keypad

Push up the slide to have the phone keypad appear as shown below.



Send() button

- After entering the phone number you want, press the Send button to make a call.
- Press the Send button to have the recent call log display. Select the phone number you want and press the Send button again to make a call.
- Enter the 4-digit phone number you remember and press the Send button to display the list of phone numbers that include 4-digit number. Select the phone number you want and press the Send button again to make a call.

Delete() button

- Press the Delete button to delete a last digit.
- Press and hold the Delete button to clear all digit.

End() button


Press the End button to end a call.



Press and hold the End button to turn the CDMA module off so that you cannot make and receive a call or even you cannot make the internet or messenger connected. Press and hold again the End button to turn on the CDMA module.

Vibrate () button

Press and hold the Vibrate  button to switch the current mode to the Vibrate mode. You

will see the Vibrate  indicator in the phone display. If you want to return to normal, press and hold the Vibrate button again.

Lock() button

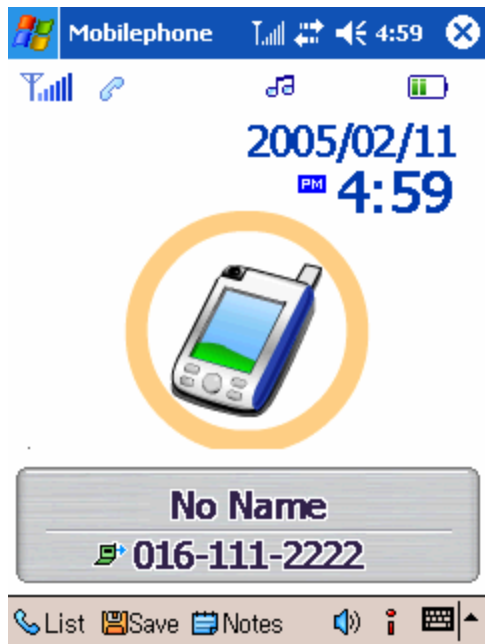
Press and hold the Lock button to lock your phone. When you try to use a locked phone, it asks you to enter the unlock code(the default code is "0000"). A locked phone still rings or vibrates for incoming calls or messages, but you must unlock it to answer.

Jog Dial()

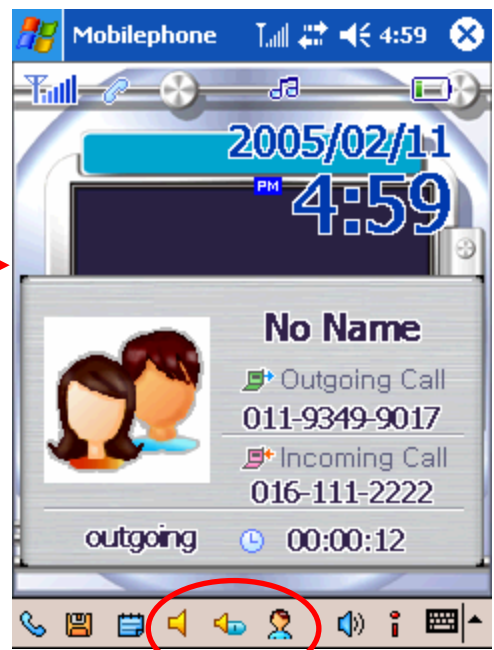
- When the phone program is on(idle state), press the Jog Dial to have the dialed phone number display. Press the Jog Dial again to make a call.
- While on a call, push up/down the Jog Dial to adjust the speaker volume.

Make a call

Push up the slide and enter the phone number that includes area code.



It switches to next screen automatically







See " while on a call, the icons on the command bar"

Press  to end your call.



Also you can make a call as follows :


- When the mobile phone program is on, press  on the right corner of the command bar.

After enter the phone number you want, tap .



- When the area code is registered on the menu settings, enter the phone number without

the area code and press .

- Press and hold the last digit of phone number to dial the phone number you want.
- Press and hold the last digit of speed dial to dial the phone number you want.
- Select the Start  button > **Contacts** and tap and hold the contact you want to display the pop-up menu. Tap “ Call” to dial the phone number.

Receive an incoming call

When an call is incoming, your device opens the mobile phone program automatically. If you want to receive the call, do as follows :

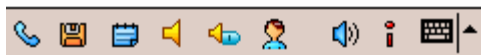
- Press the Jog Dial, regardless of whether the slide is up or down.
- Press , regardless of whether the slide is up or down.
- Press  .

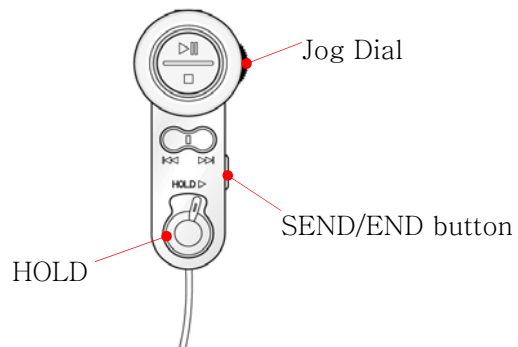


Press  to end the call.



Using the Remote Controller

While listening to music, press the SEND/END button of your remote controller to receive an incoming call.






Push up or down the Jog Dial to adjust the speaker sound.

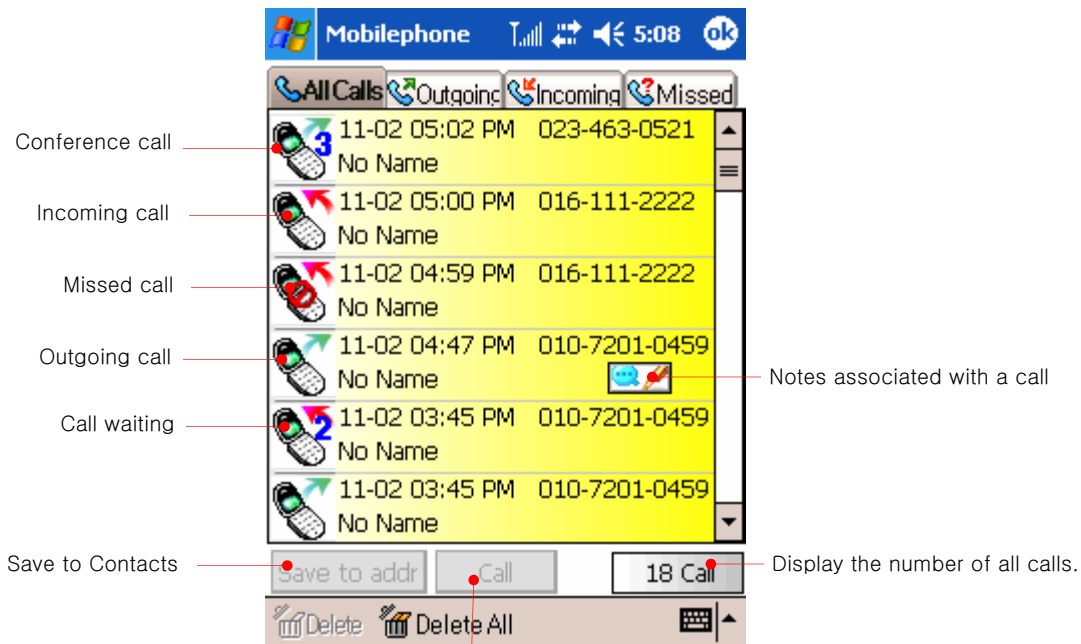
Again press the SEND/END button of your remote controller to end the call.

Call Log




While the mobile phone program opens, press  to display the mini launcher screen.



Select  using your stylus or press  down to select .




Make a call.

- Register for Caller ID to display the phone number of the caller.
- Select one call you want on the list and tap “ Save to Contacts ” to save it to Contacts.
- Select one call you want on the list and tap “ Make a call ” to dial the phone number.
- Select one call you want to delete and tap “ Delete ”  to delete one call on the list.
- Select all calls you want to delete and tap “ Delete All ”  to delete all calls on the list.
- Tap  to display the outgoing calls.

- Tap  Incoming to display the incoming calls.
- Tap  Missed to display the missed calls.

Tap “ Save to Contacts” to save a call named “ No Name” to Contacts.

Call Waiting

If you have subscribed to Call Waiting, your phone will beep during a call let you know you have an incoming call. Your phone may also display the incoming caller's identification.


You can also activate this feature with your phone; simply ask your service provider for the feature code, store it into your phone, then activate it.

Press    +  to activate call waiting. When you hear a beep sound over the phone, press .

Press     +  to de-activate call waiting. When you hear a beep sound over the phone, press .

When call waiting is activated, another incoming call lets you hear a beep sound over the phone.



Press  to swap between both calls.

Conference Call

This feature allows you to add a third party to a call. You can use this feature with local and long distance calls.






This feature may not be available in all wireless systems.

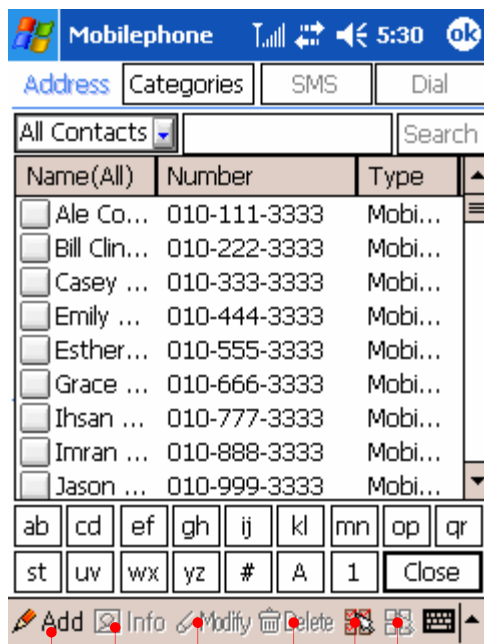

Contacts in the mobile phone program

While the mobile phone program opens, press  to display the mini launcher screen.



Select  using your stylus or press  down to select .



Show you the detailed information on the selected contact.

Make a new contact.

Modify the existing contact.

Delete the existing contact.

Select all contacts displayed.


Deselect the contacts already selected.

Select a contact and tap " SMS" to send text message.(you can select several contacts.)

Select a contact and tap " Dial" to make a call. "

Make a new contact and delete the existing contact.

Tap “ Add”  on the command bar to make a new contact.

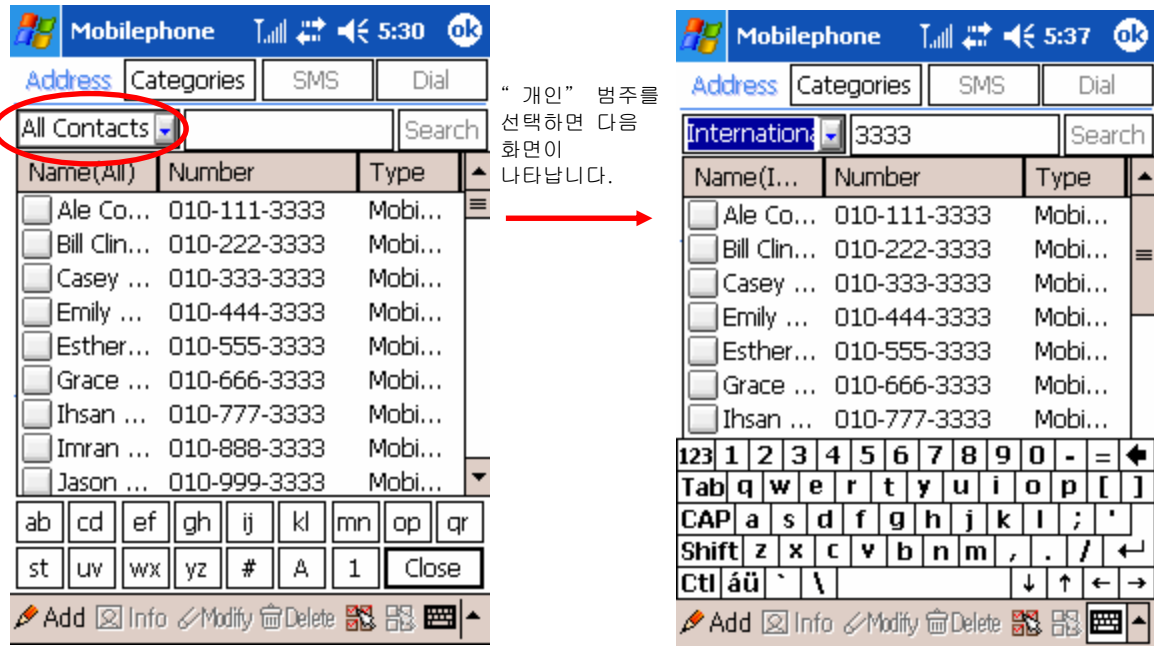


Enter the part or full phone number you remember and tap “ Search ” .

Tap “ all contacts ” drop-down list box and select category you want.




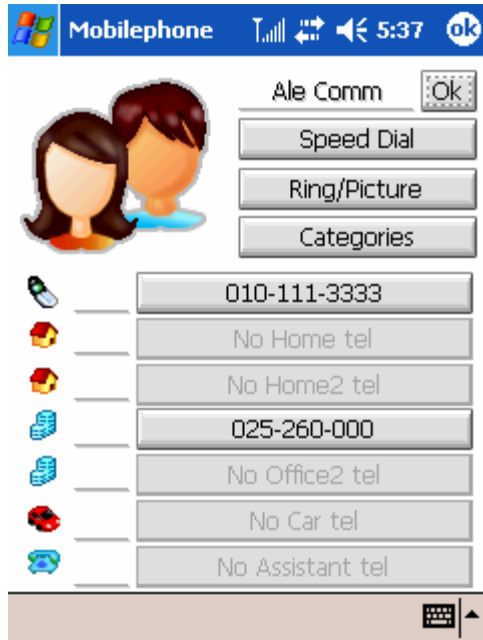
Select contacts you want.

User ring sound and picture associated with contact

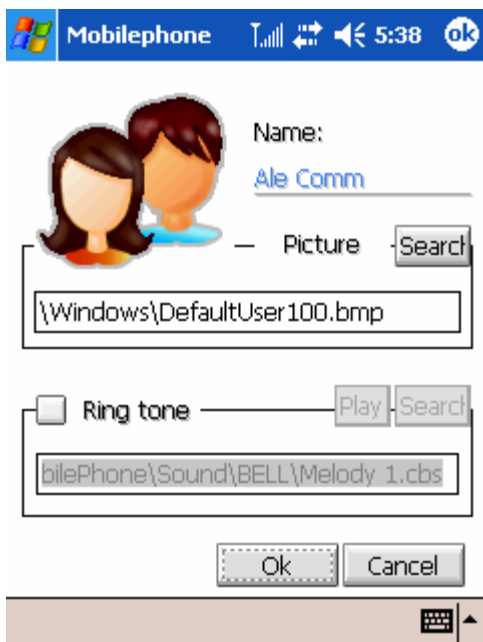
Save the picture you want to the folder “ Device\Magich Store\Cyberbank\MobilePhone\USERFILES” using Microsoft ActiveSync.

Select Contacts in the Mini Launcher screen and select contact you want.

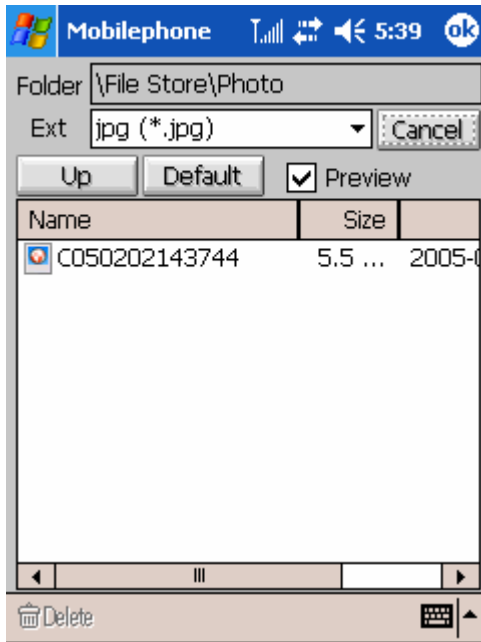
Tap “ Info”  icon on the command bar.




Tap “ Ring/Picture” .



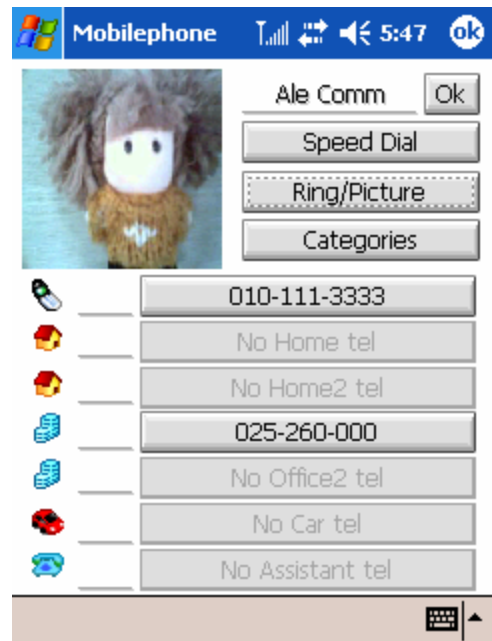
Tap “ Search “ next to the picture to select the picture you saved.



Select the existing picture (100x100 pixel, BMP file recommended) you saved and tap  on the right upper corner.





Tap “ OK” to display the picture on the contact screen.



Also, if you want personal ring you saved, select the check box next to “ use personal ring” and tap “ search” to select the personal ring(support 64 poly) you saved. Tap OK to save.

Modify contents and change speed dial on the existing contact

When you want to change the contents, tap “ Modify” .

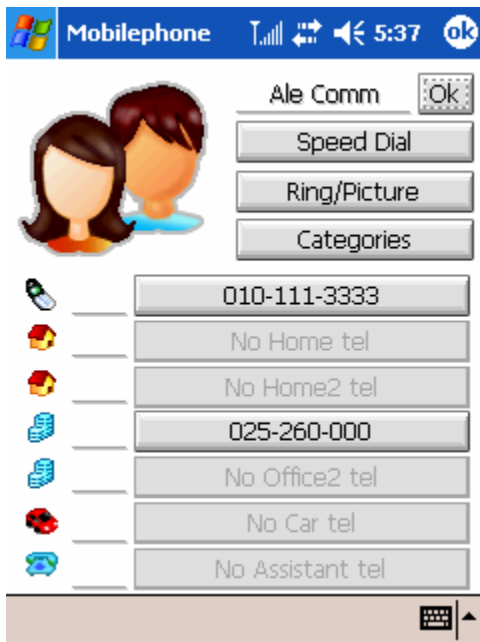

Select the phone type on the Type text box. You have to remember that you can save a phone number at a time. If you want to save more than two phone number, save one phone number and tap OK to save it and then open this contact and save another phone number.

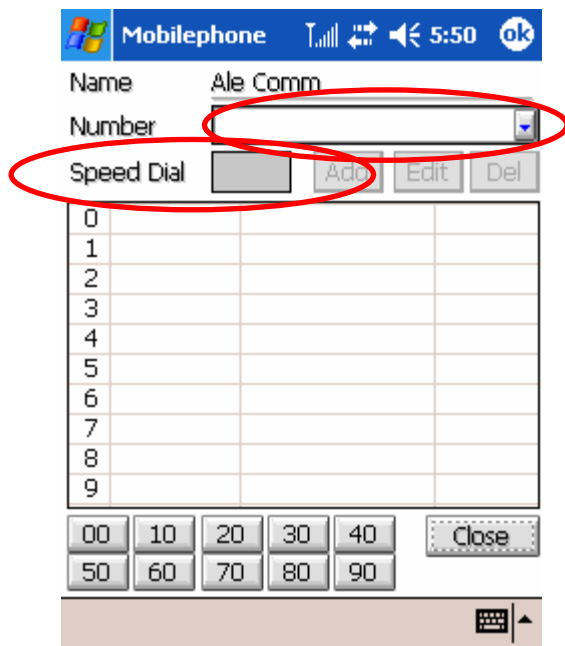
If necessary, assign the speed dial to this contact and tap OK to save it.

Add, modify and delete a speed dial through the info icon on the command bar

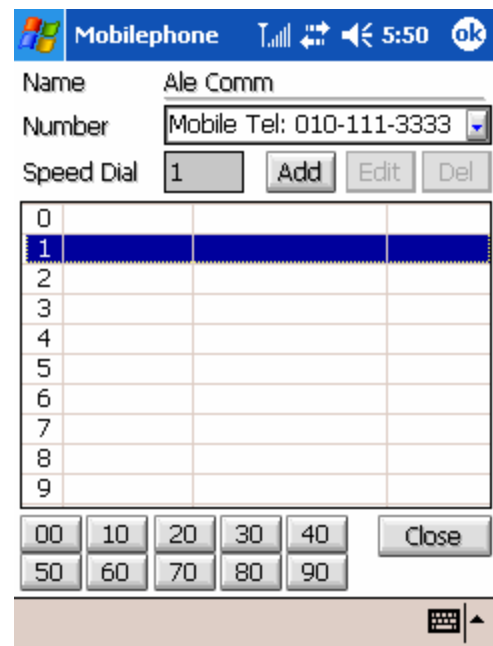
Open the Contacts program and tap “ Info” .



Tap “ Speed Dial” .



This is an example that you can assign two speed dials to one contact.



Select the phone number in the “ Number” text box to assign a speed dial to.

Select the available number in the list to have the selected number display in the Speed Dial text box.


- Tap “ Add” to save it.
- Tap “ Edit” or “ Del” to change or delete the assigned speed dial.




You can have different speed dials for different phone types.

Dial the phone number using a speed dial

If you want to dial phone number using the speed dial, do as follows :

- One-digit number (0 ~ 9): Tap and hold the corresponding speed dial number.
- Two-digit number (10 ~ 99): tap the first digit of the speed dial number, and then tap and hold the second digit of the speed dial number.

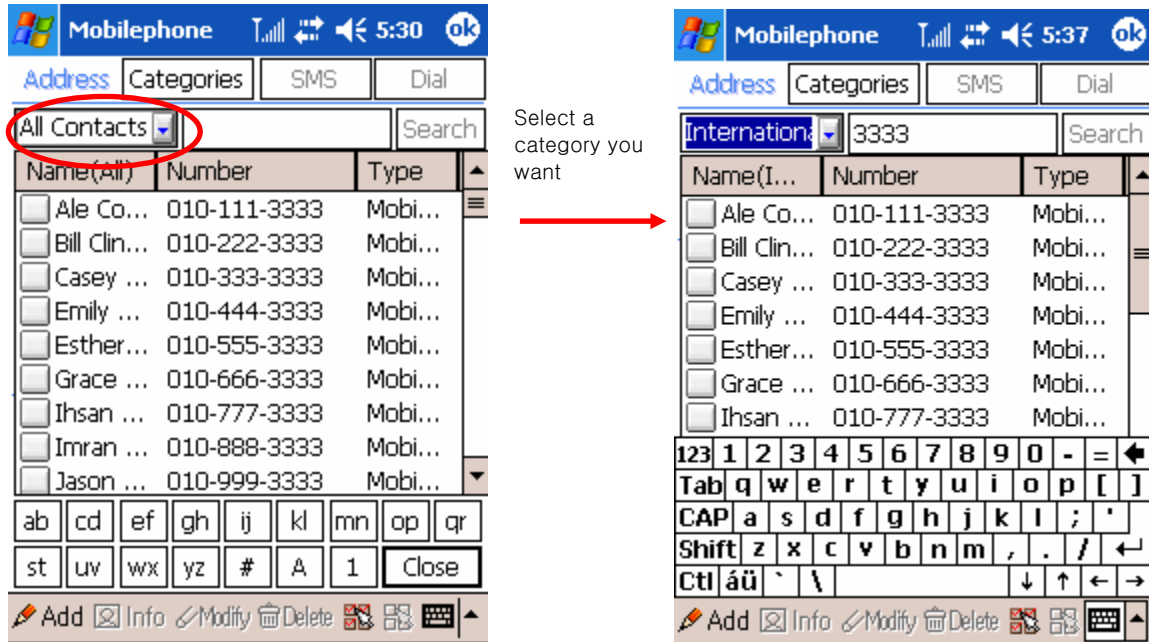
- Or tap the corresponding speed dial and tap  .

- When you can not the speed dial number, tap  **and select**  . Tap **Contacts**  and tap Speed Dial. Select the speed dial you want and tap “ Call” to make a call.

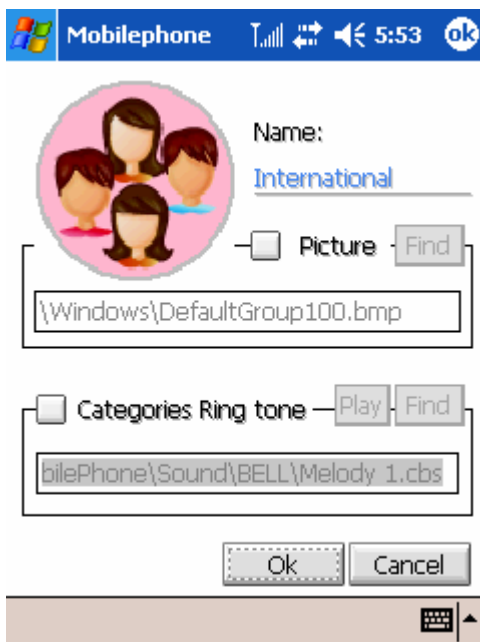
Category picture and category ring

Save a picture to “ My device\File Store\Cyberbank\MobilePhone\USERFILES” folder using Microsoft ActiveSync.

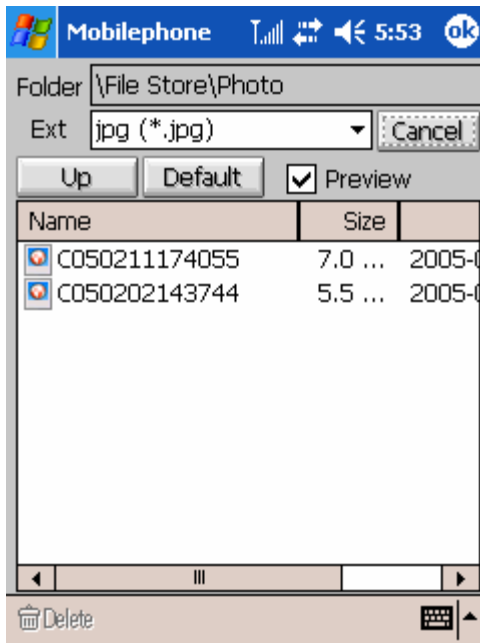
If you want to assign a picture by category or assign a ring by category, Tap “ all contacts” drop-down list box and select a category you want.




Tap “ Category” .



Select the “ Picture” check box to associate the picture you saved to the specific category and then tap “ Search” .



Select the picture(100x100 pixel, BMP file recommended) you saved and tap  to save it.



If you want to associated the category ring to the specific category, select the “ Category Ring” check box and tap “ Search” to find the ring you saved.

Associate a contact with Category

Select a contact to associate with category and tap “ Info ” on the command bar.




Tap “ Categories ” .

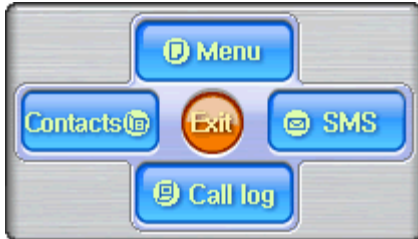


When you associate a contact with more than one categories, you have to specify the priority category to the contact.




Tap OK to save it.

Change Skin

When the mobile phone program opens, tap  to have the mini launcher display as shown below.

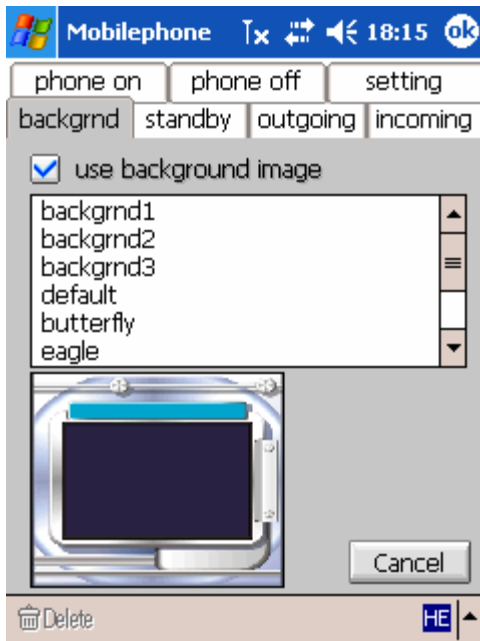

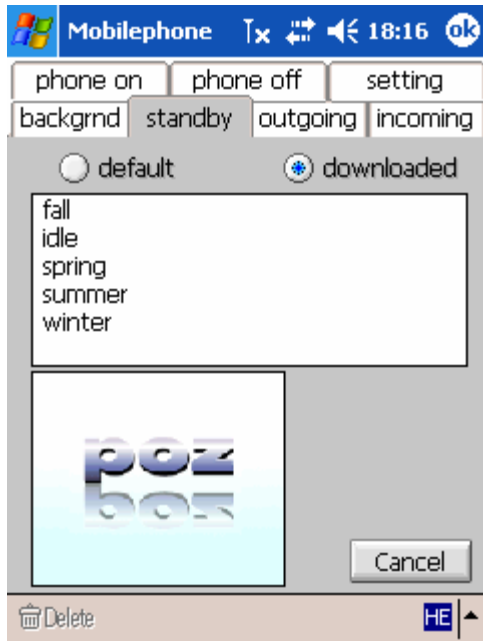
Tap  with your stylus or push up  to have  selected.

Tap “ Change Skin” to change all animation files you want to change.

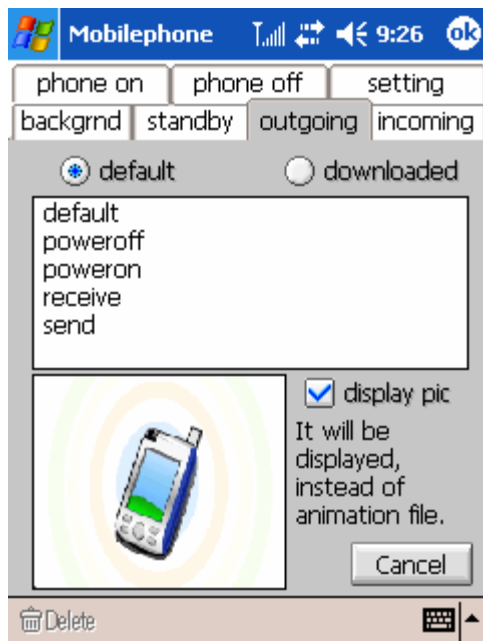
You can set the 7 different skins on the 7 tab.



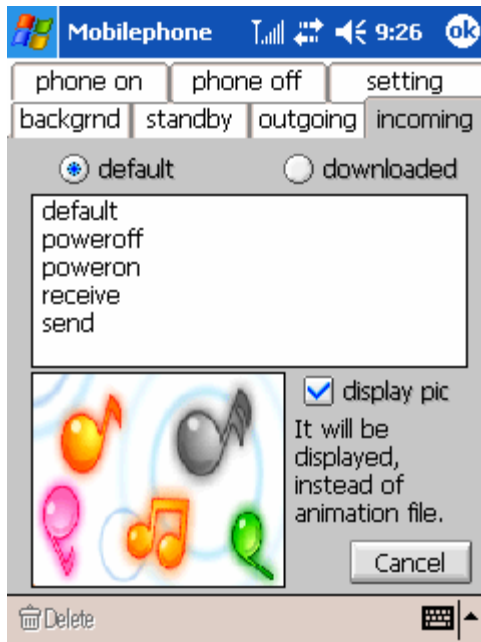
Select the background of your mobile phone program.



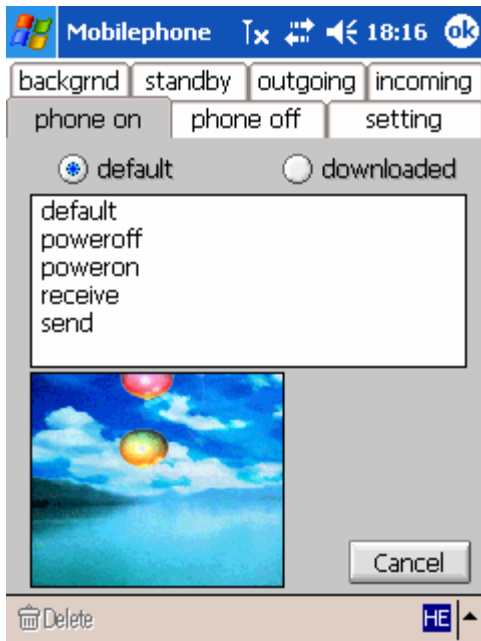
Select the standby file that is displayed on the background of your mobile phone program.



Select the outgoing file that is displayed when you make a call using your mobile phone program.



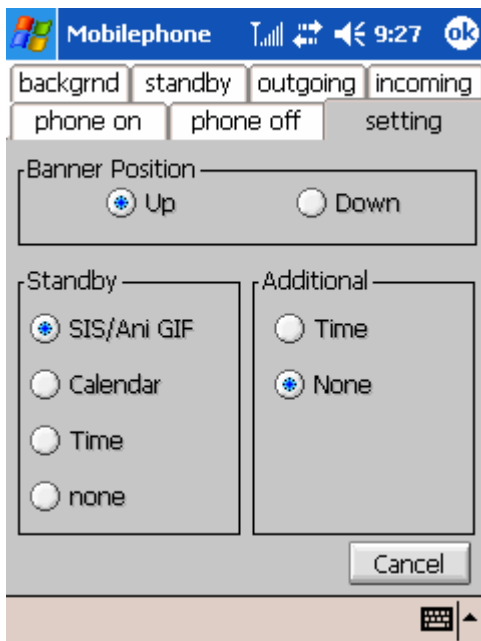
Select the incoming file that is displayed when you receive a call using your mobile phone program.



Select the phone on file that is displayed when you turn on CDMA module.




Select the phone off file that is displayed when you turn off CDMA module.






Select the position of banner that is displayed on the mobile phone program. If you want to change the [Cyberbank] to another banner, see “ Convenience ” section of this chapter.

Change number fonts

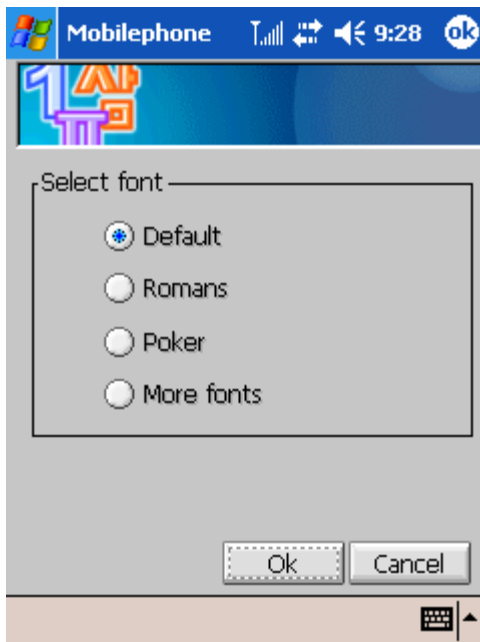
When the mobile phone program opens, tap  to have the mini launcher display as shown below.



Mini launcher screen

Tap  with your stylus or push up  to have  selected.


Tap “ Number Font” to change the font of the numbers that are displayed when you press corresponding number keys to dial a phone number.



For example, when you select the poker selection box, the number will be displayed as shown below.






Reset Calls

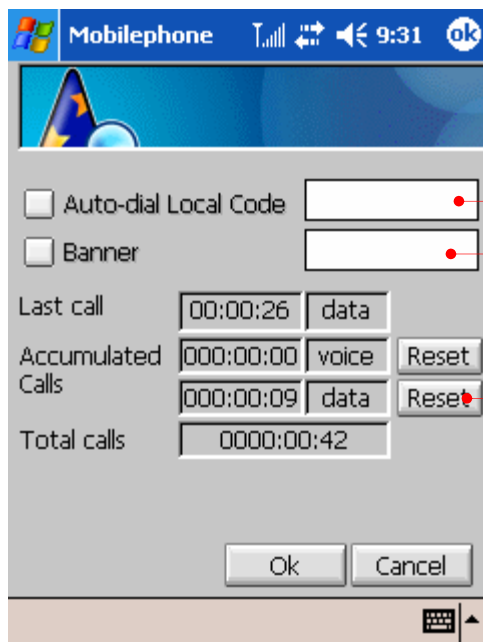
When the mobile phone program opens, tap  to have the mini launcher display as shown below.



Mini launcher screen

Tap  with your stylus or push up  to have  selected.

Tap “ Reset Calls ” to have the area code display automatically, to change the banner of the mobile phone program or reset the time of all calls.




Enter the area code you use frequently.

Enter the banner you want instead of [Pelephone].




This is the time you have used since you reset the mobile phone program. If you don' t want to reset total calls, you have to deselect the call time setting of the phone setting. For more information, see “ Initialization ” section of this chapter. “

Password

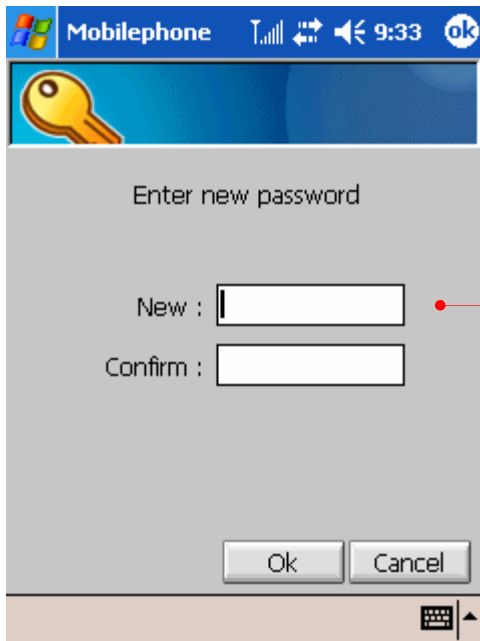
When the mobile phone program opens, tap  to have the mini launcher display as shown below.



Mini launcher screen

Tap  with your stylus or push up  to have  selected.

Some of the mobile phone settings require the password. If you want to change this password, tap " Password" .




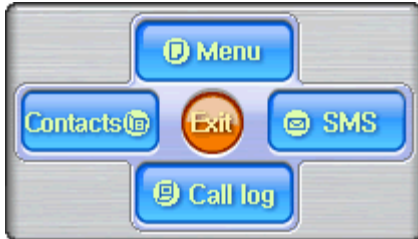
The default password is " 0000" . If you want to change this password enter the 4-digit number.






Please memorize your new password. See your local dealer or service center when you forget your new password.

Set the Send/End button

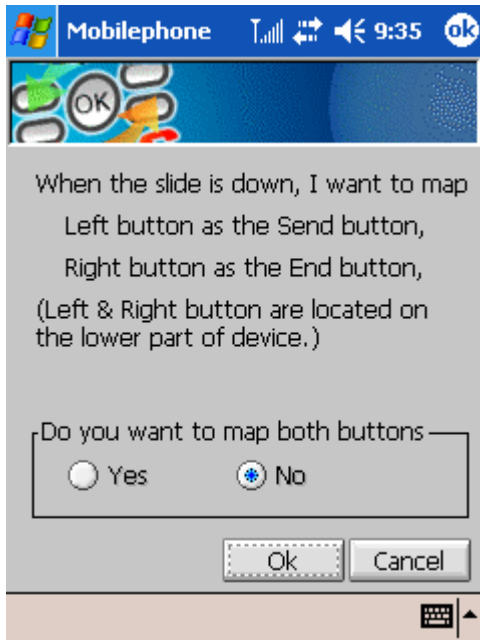
When the mobile phone program opens, tap  to have the mini launcher display as shown below.

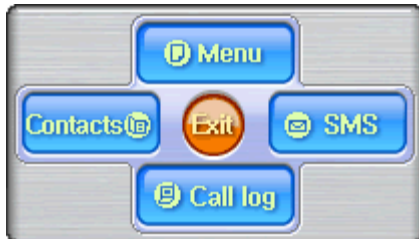
Tap  with your stylus or push up  to have  selected.

When the slide is down, if you want to use both hardware buttons of your device as the Send button and the End button, tap “ Send/End Button” .






Bell Ring

When the mobile phone program opens, tap  to have the mini launcher displayed as shown below.



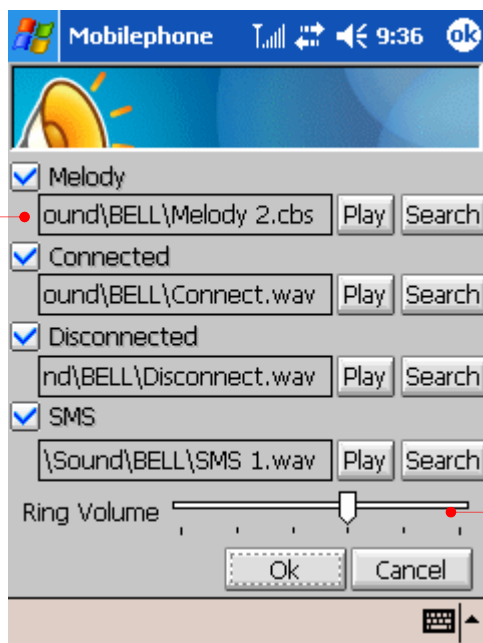

Tap  with your stylus or push up  to have  selected.

Tap Sound Control ()


If you want to change melody, sound when a call is connected or disconnected and adjust the ring volume, tap “ Ring Setting” .

When deselected, the corresponding sound doesn't alert you.






Move the slide to adjust the ring volume.

Keytone Setting

When the mobile phone program opens, tap  to have the mini launcher display as shown below.

Tap  with your stylus or push up  to have  selected.

Tap Sound Control ()

If you want to set the key tone or the slide up/down alert that sounds when you press the number keypad or when you push the slide up or down, tap “ Keytone Setting” .






SMS(Short Messaging Service)

When the mobile phone program opens, tap  to have the mini launcher display as shown below.

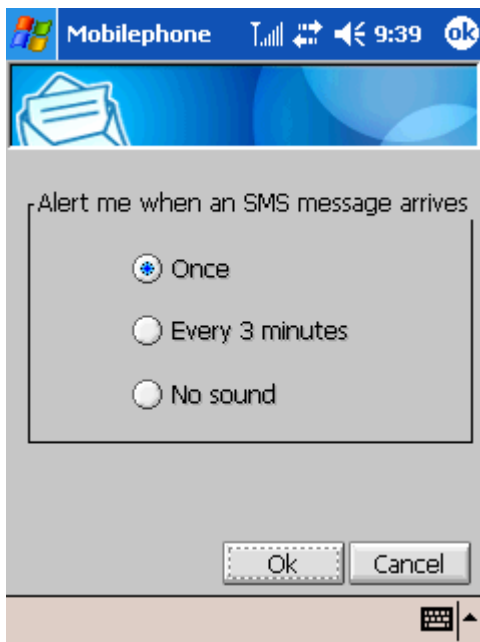

Tap  with your stylus or push up  to have  selected.

Tap Sound Control ().

Tap “ SMS” to set the alert that sounds when a message(SMS) arrives.






Earphone

When the mobile phone program opens, tap  to have the mini launcher display as shown below.

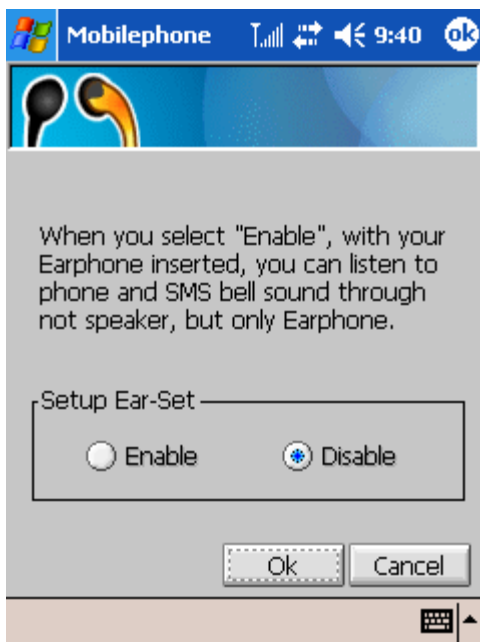

Tap Sound Control .

Tap “ Earphone” to set the earphone.






Ring Type

When the mobile phone program opens, tap  to have the mini launcher display as shown below.

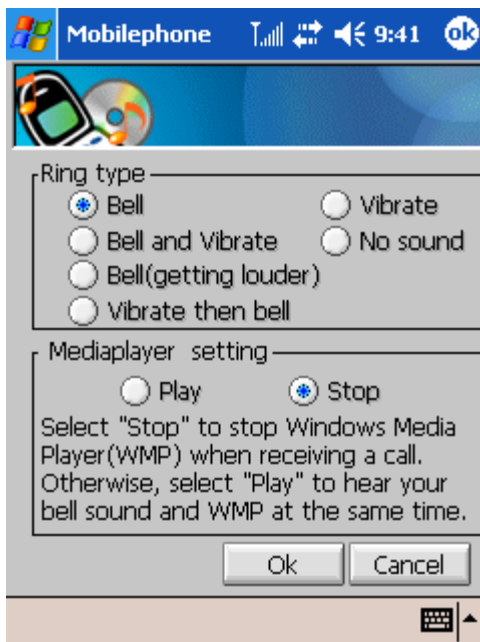

Tap Sound Control ()

Tap “ Ring Type ” to change the ring type and set Windows Media Player when a call is received.






Speed Dial

When the mobile phone program opens, tap  to have the mini launcher display as shown below.

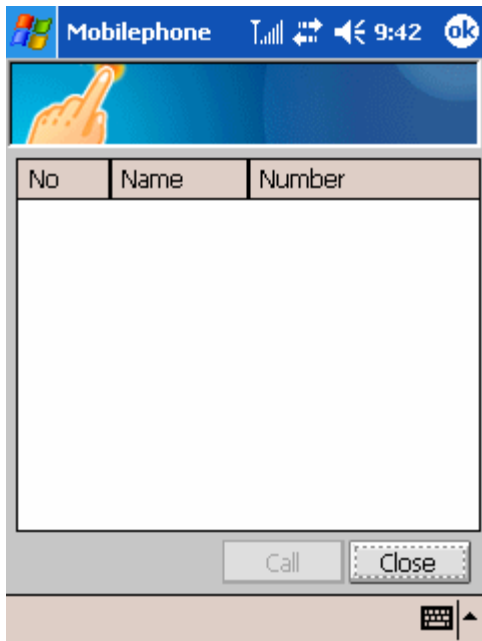

Tap Contacts ()

If you want to see the speed dial list for contacts you use frequently, tap “ Speed Dial” .

When the mobile phone program opens, tap  to have the mini launcher display as shown below.



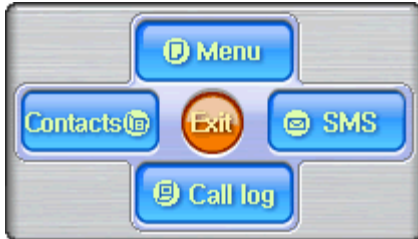
Tap Contacts ()

When you need to send a long digit number such as your phone number, social security number or your bank account number to your calling party by press the corresponding keypad, you can send these numbers at a time. Tap “ User Information” to edit these numbers in advance.

When the mobile phone program opens, tap  to have the mini launcher display as shown below.

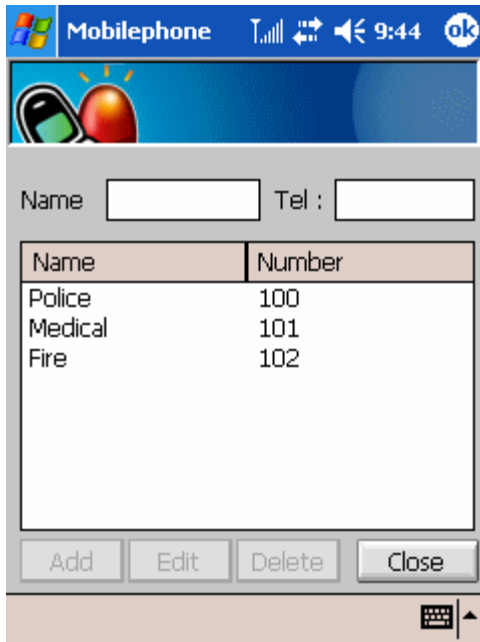

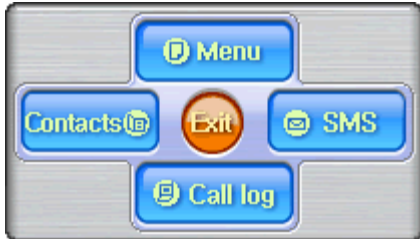
Tap Contacts ()

Recent Outgoing Calls

When the mobile phone program opens, tap  to have the mini launcher display as shown below.

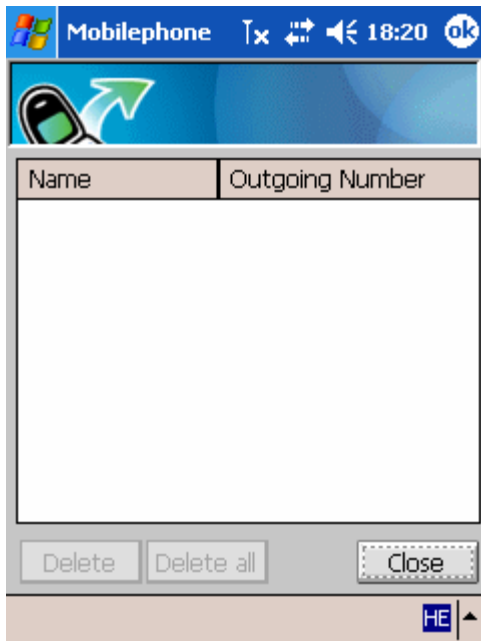

Tap  with your stylus or push up  to have  selected.

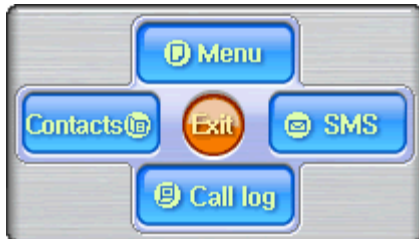
Tap **Contacts** ()

Tap “Recent Outgoing” to delete the recent outgoing call log you have used recently.






NAM

When the mobile phone program opens, tap  to have the mini launcher display as shown below.

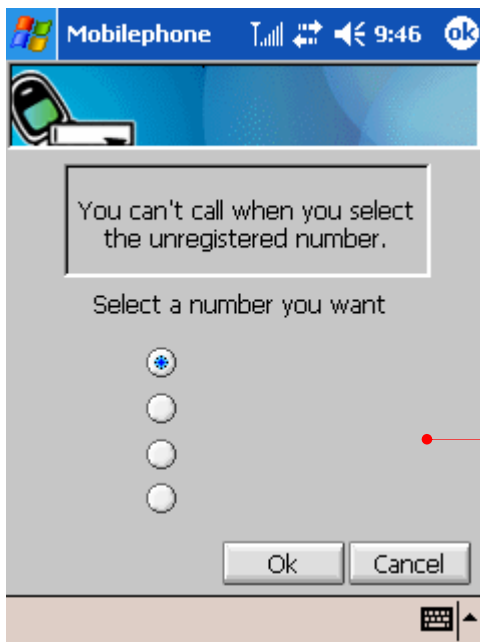


Mini launcher screen

Tap  with your stylus or push up  to have  selected.

Tap Contacts ()


Tap “ Select NAM” to choose other phone number if you registered for more than one phone number. (Contact your service provider for details.)



When you have only one phone number registered, please do not change the phone number.




Note: You need at least one active number to make calls.
You can not change from one NAM to another during a call.

Voice Mail

When the mobile phone program opens, tap  to have the mini launcher display as shown below.

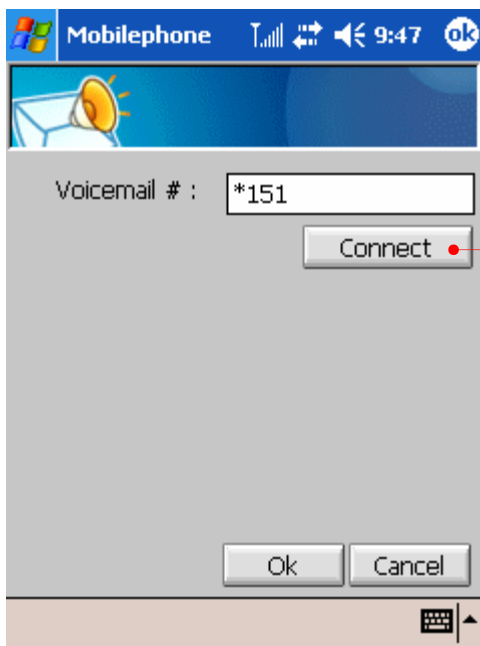


Mini launcher screen

Tap  with your stylus or push up  to have  selected.

Tap “ Add On Service” ().

Tap “ Voicemail” to register or unregister voice mail.




Tap “ connect” to retrieve the voice message. Tap “ Unregister” to have registration disabled temporarily. Contact your service provider for more details.






Voice mail is the network service that requires a subscription from your service provider.

Call Forwarding

When the mobile phone program opens, tap  to have the mini launcher display as shown below.



Mini launcher screen


Tap  with your stylus or push up  to have  selected.

Tap “ Add On Service” ().

Tap “ Call Forwarding” to forward incoming calls to another number so you won’ t miss an important call.






Automatic Answer

When the mobile phone program opens, tap  to have the mini launcher display as shown below.

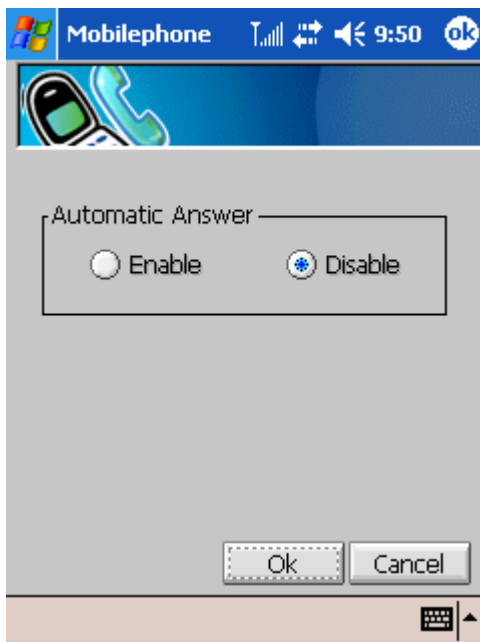


Mini launcher screen


Tap  with your stylus or push up  to have  selected.

Tap “ Add On Service” ().

With this on, your phone answers incoming voice calls after two ring.






Data Backup

When the mobile phone program opens, tap  to have the mini launcher display as shown below.



Mini launcher screen

Tap  with your stylus or push up  to have  selected.

Tap “ Add On Service” ().

Tap “ Data Backup” to backup data.




This function will backup all data and save them at “ My Device\File Store\Cyberbank\” folder.






While building the backup data, do not perform soft reset. This may cause the errors in backup.

Restrict Calls

When the mobile phone program opens, tap  to have the mini launcher display as shown below.



Mini launcher screen


Tap  with your stylus or push up  to have  selected.

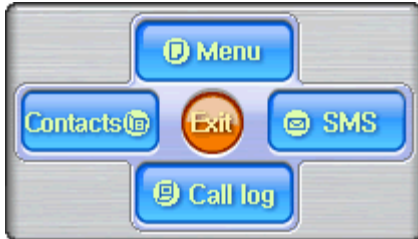
Tap “Options” ().

Tap “Restrict Calls” to restrict incoming and outgoing calls. Outgoing calls are restricted from a list of restrictions that you create yourself.






Initialization

When the mobile phone program opens, tap  to have the mini launcher display as shown below.

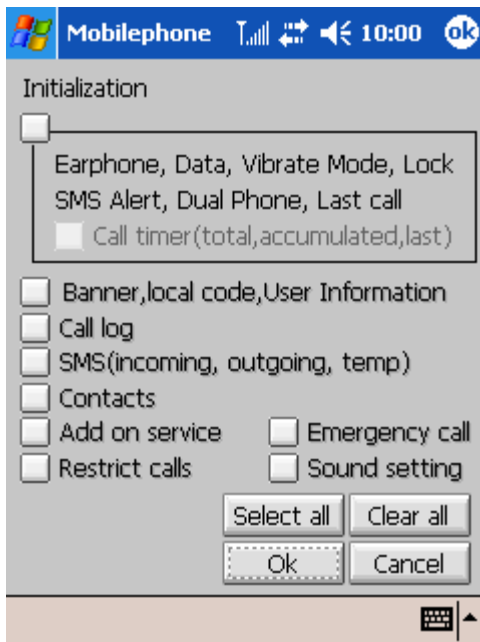


Mini launcher screen


Tap  with your stylus or push up  to have  selected.

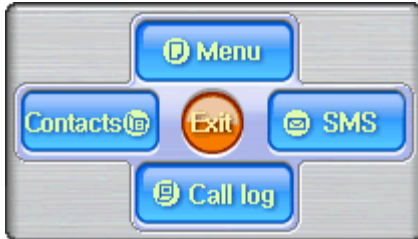
Tap “ Options” ().

Tap “ Phone Initialization” to reset all information you have set before.






Data Communications

When the mobile phone program opens, tap  to have the mini launcher display as shown below.

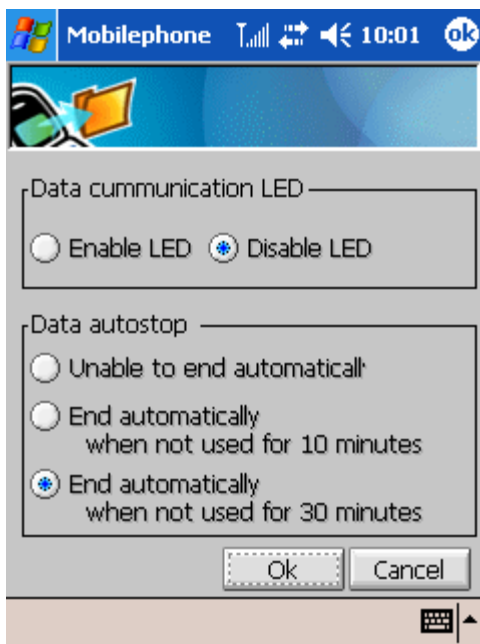


Mini launcher screen


Tap  with your stylus or push up  to have  selected.

Tap “Options” ().

Tap “Data Communications” to have data communications disconnected automatically.






Slide-Up Action

When the mobile phone program opens, tap  to have the mini launcher display as shown below.

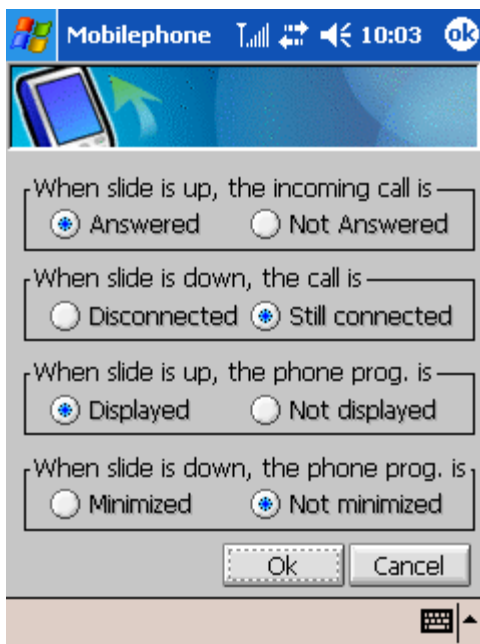


Mini launcher screen

Tap “Options” ().

Tap “Slide-Up Actions” to change the settings when you push up or down the slide.






Keypad backlight

When the mobile phone program opens, tap  to have the mini launcher display as shown below.

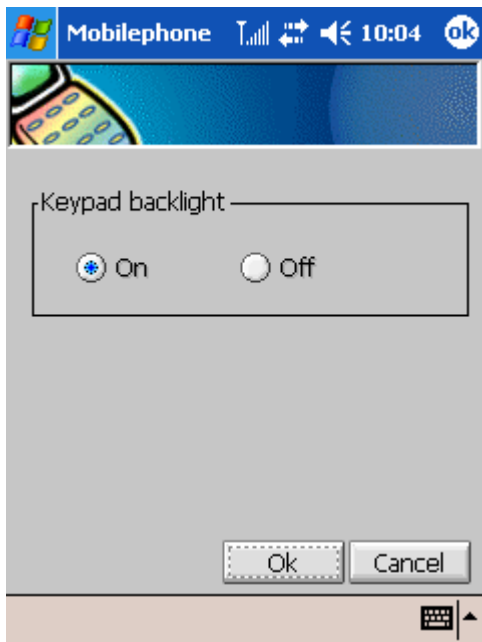

Tap “ Options” ().

Tap “ Keypad Back-Light” to set the keypad on.






CDMA status LED

When the mobile phone program opens, tap  to have the mini launcher display as shown below.

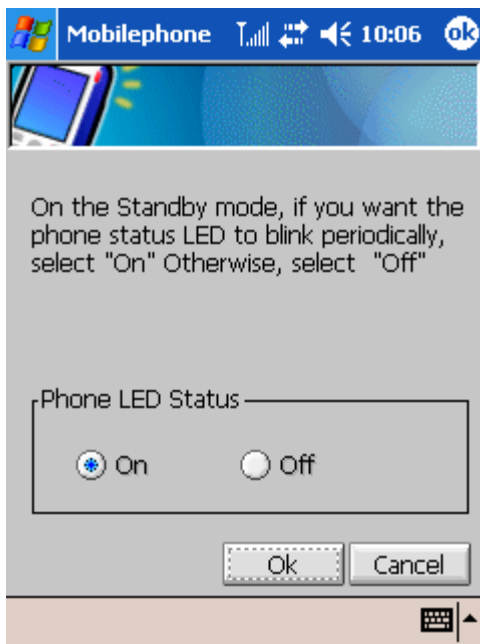

Tap "Options" () and tap .

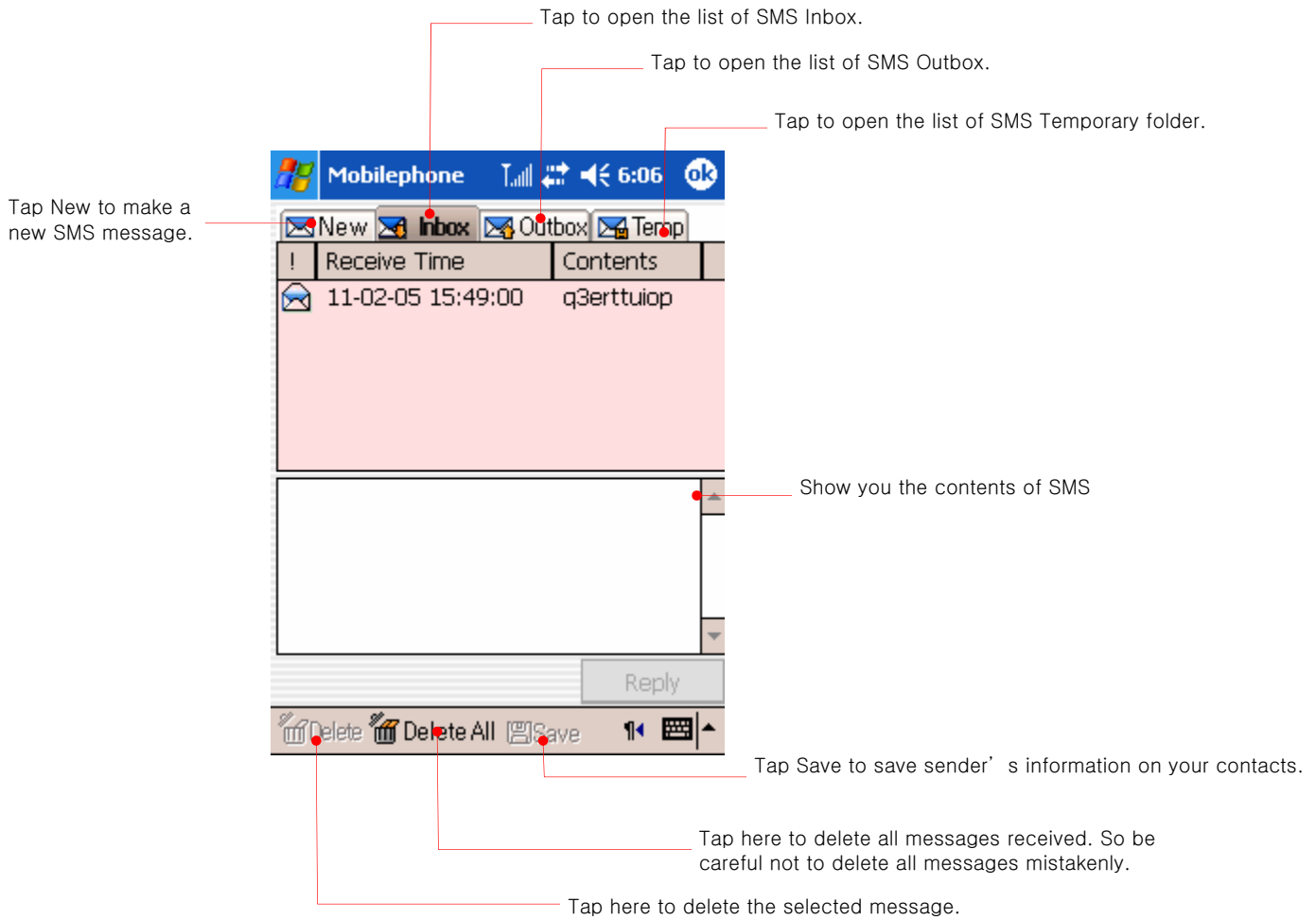
Tap "CDMA STATUS LED" to have CDMA status LED blink periodically.



SMS(Short Message Service)

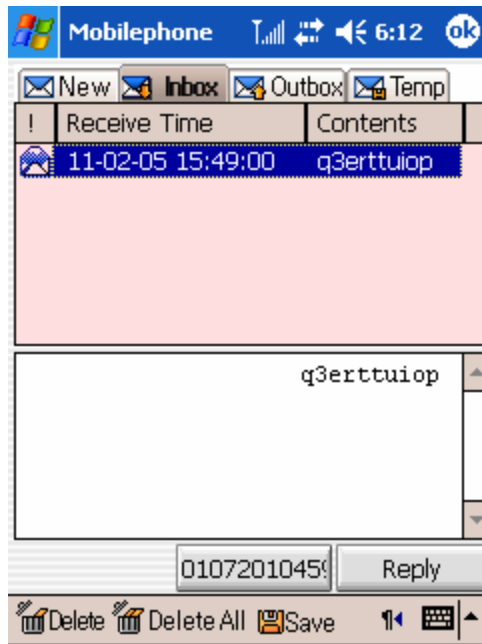
Contact your service provider before using this function.


Tap the MSG button on the phone program to display the SMS message screen. When you receive a SMS message,  appears on the phone status pane of the phone program. When you tap this icon on the phone status pane of the phone program, nothing happens and you have to tap the SMS button on the right side of the phone program.

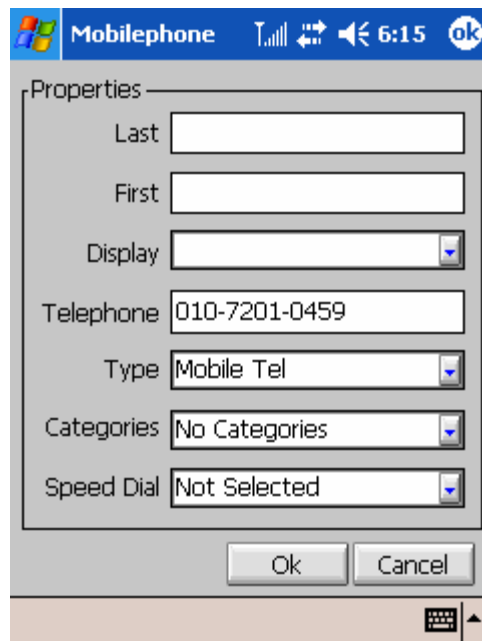


During data communications(Internet), if SMS message is sent or received, the Internet may be disconnected depending on the settings of your service provider.

Add sender's phone number to your contacts



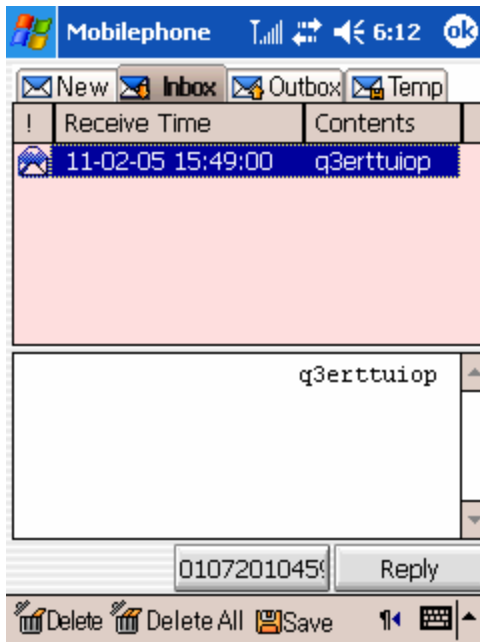
Tap  to save the sender's phone number.



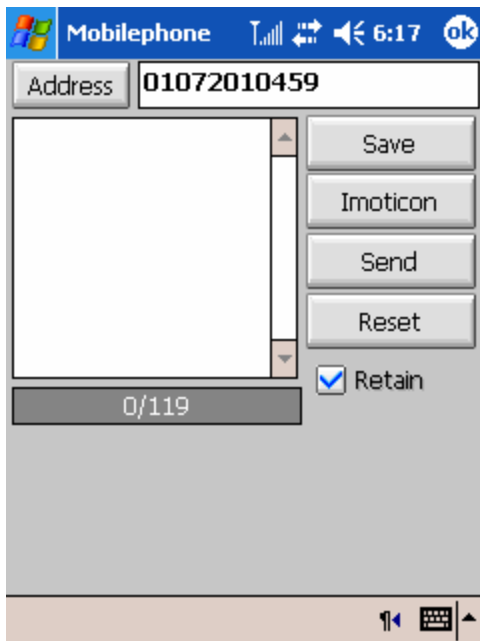
Enter any necessary information and tap OK.

Reply to SMS

Among the messages listed on the Inbox, select a message you want to reply to.



Tap the Reply button



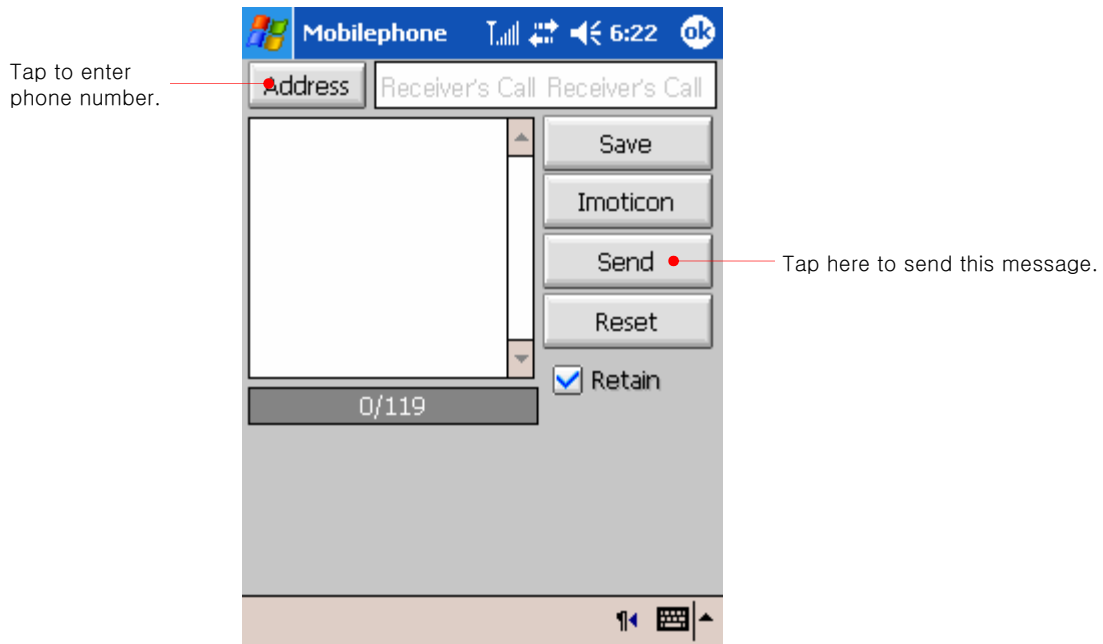
When you finish the contents, tap Send to this message.



When you enter several phone numbers, each phone number should be separated by semicolon (;).

Compose a new message

Tap New to compose a new SMS.



Enter messages on the text box and tap the Send button to send the message.

Chapter 8

Microsoft Pocket Outlook

Microsoft Pocket Outlook includes Calendar, Contacts, Tasks, Inbox, and Notes. You can use these programs individually or together. For example, e-mail addresses stored in Contacts can be used to address e-mail messages in Inbox.

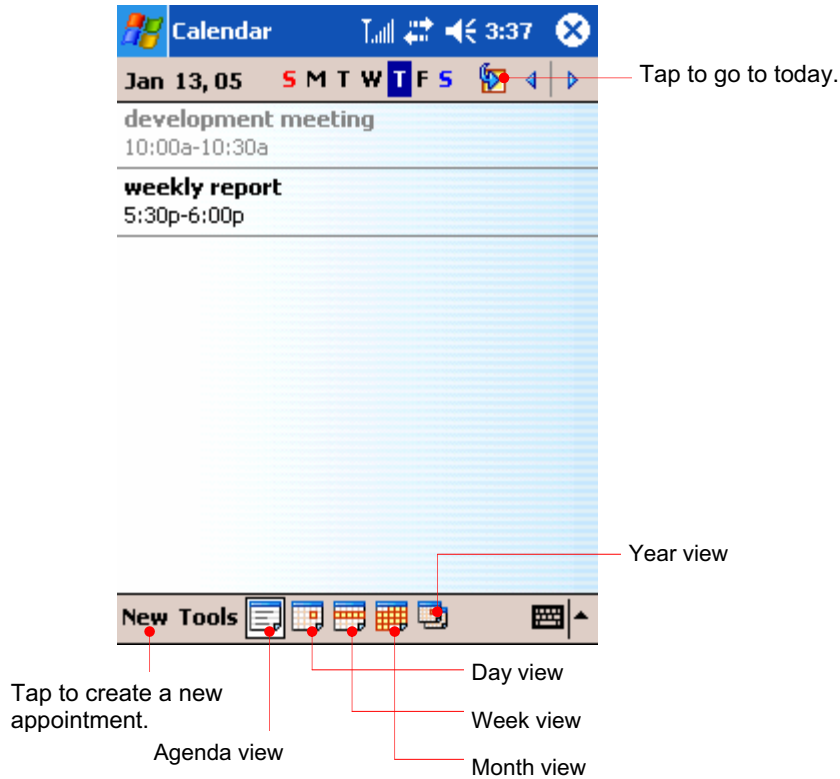
Using ActiveSync, you can synchronize information in Microsoft Outlook on your desktop PC with information in Pocket Outlook on your device. Each time you synchronize, ActiveSync compares the changes you made on your device and desktop PC and updates both computers with the latest information. For information on using ActiveSync, see ActiveSync Help on your desktop PC.

 - Schedule appointments and meetings using Calendar.
 - Keep track of friends and colleagues using Contacts.
 - Keep a to-do list in Tasks.
 - Capture thoughts and ideas with Notes.

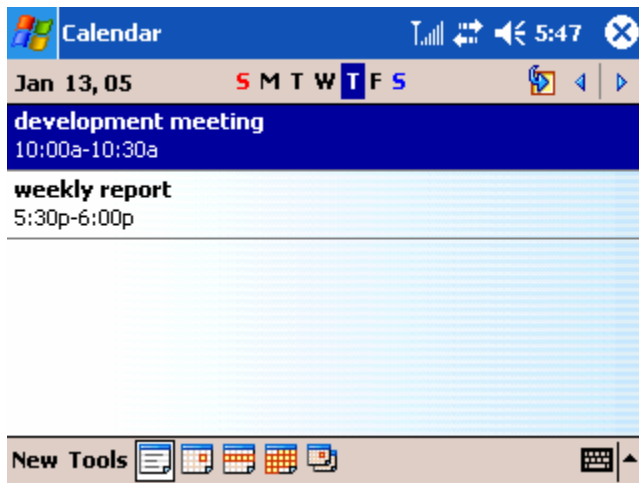

Calendar : Scheduling Appointments and Meetings

Use Calendar to schedule appointments, including meetings and other events. You can check your appointments in one of several views (Agenda, Day, Week, Month, and Year) and easily switch views by using the **View** menu.



When you select landscape on the settings you will have a screen as follows :



(If you want to select “landscape”,  > “Settings” > “System” tab > “Screen ”  icon. For more detailed information, see the screen setting on chapter 6 Configuring Device.) For description below, portrait screens are used.

You can customize the Calendar display (for example, change the first day of the week), by tapping **Options** on the **Tools** menu.

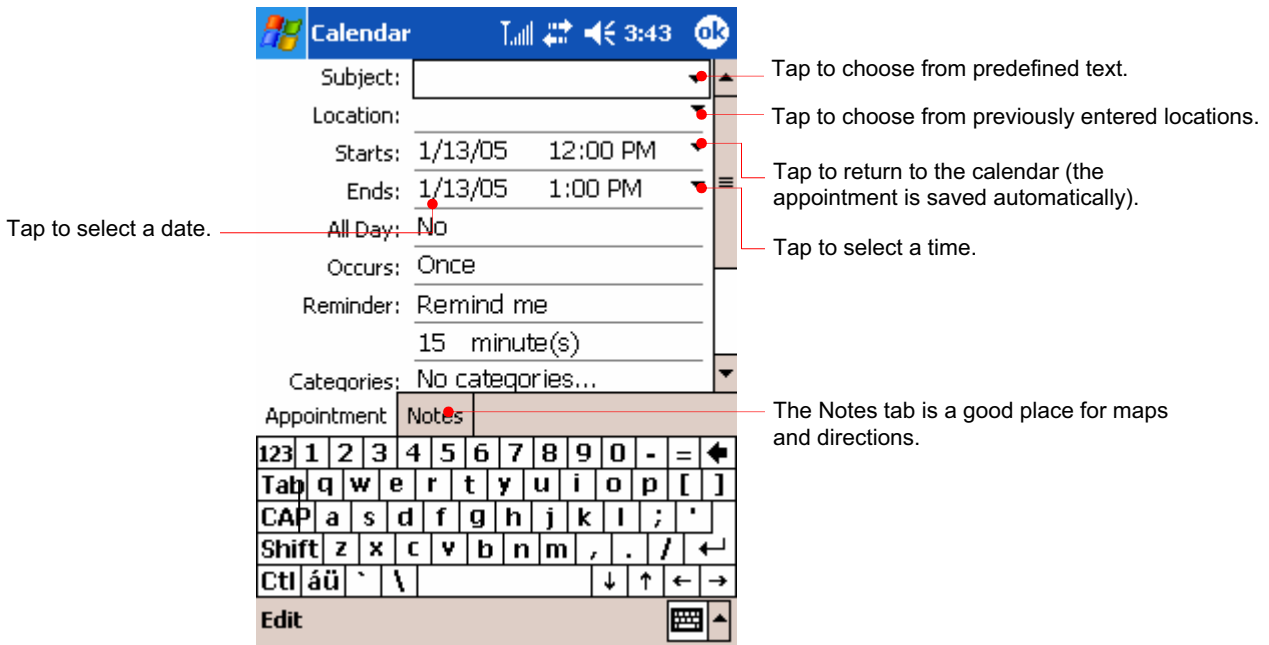

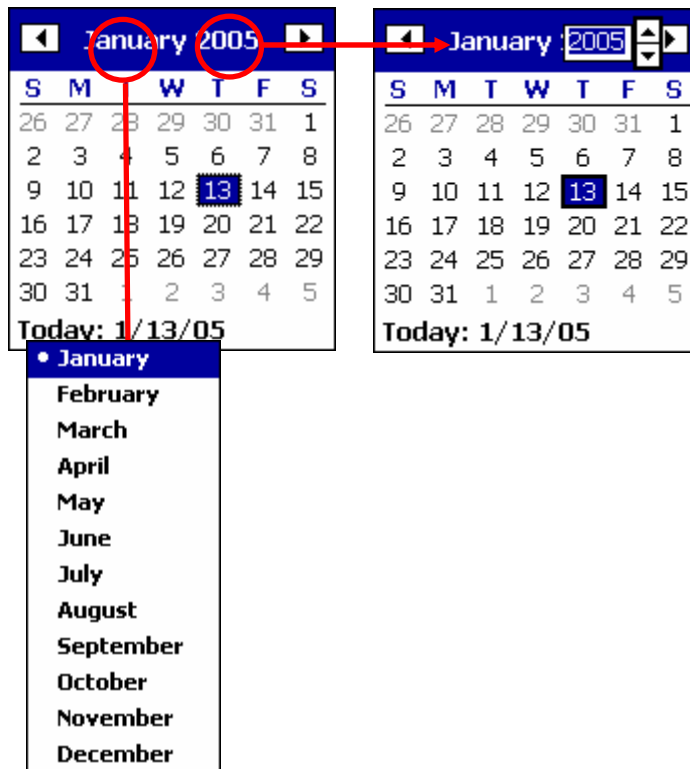
General Appointments

To create an appointment

1. In Day or Week view, tap the desired date and time for the appointment.
2. Tap **New**.



3. Using the Input panel, tap first to select the field, and then enter a description and a location.
 4. If needed, tap the date and time to change them.
- For example, select the date to have the calendar pane displayed as below.



5. Enter other desired information. You will need to hide the Input panel to see all

available fields.

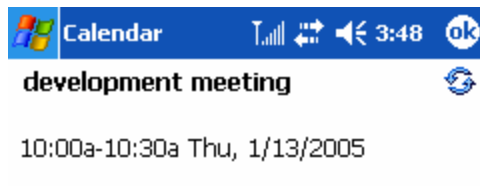
6. To add notes, tap the **Notes** tab. You can enter text, draw, or create a recording. For more information on creating notes, see “Notes: Capturing Thoughts and Ideas,” later in this chapter.

7. Tap **OK** to return to Calendar.

Microsoft Pocket Word

Microsoft Pocket Word works with Microsoft Word on your desktop PC to give you easy access to copies of your documents. You can create new documents on your device, or you can copy documents from your desktop PC. Synchronize documents between your desktop PC and your device regularly so that you have the most up-to-date content in both locations.

To use Pocket Word

1. On the **Start** menu, tap **Programs**, and then tap the Pocket Word icon.



Tap to make a new word file.

Tap to show and hide toolbar.

When you select landscape on the settings you will have a screen as follows :



(If you want to select "landscape",  > "Settings" > "System" tab > "Screen"  icon.

For more detailed information, see the screen setting on chapter 6 Configuring Device.)

For description below, portrait screens are used.

2. Tap **New** to open a blank document.

You can open only one document at a time; when you open a second document, you will be asked to save the first. You can save a document you create or edit in a variety of formats, including Pocket Word (.psw), Rich Text Format (.rtf), and Plain Text (.txt). You can enter information in Pocket Word in four modes: typing, writing, drawing, and recording. Use the **View** menu to switch between modes. Each mode has its own toolbar, which you can show and hide by tapping the Show/Hide Toolbar button on the Command bar.

Typing Mode. Use the Input panel to enter typed text into the document with either the keyboard or the Letter Recognizer.

For more information on entering typed text, see “Entering Information” in chapter 3.

Writing Mode. In writing mode, use your stylus to write directly on the screen. Ruled lines are displayed as a guide, and the zoom magnification is greater than in typing mode to allow you to write more easily. For more information on writing and selecting writing, see “Entering Information” in chapter 3.

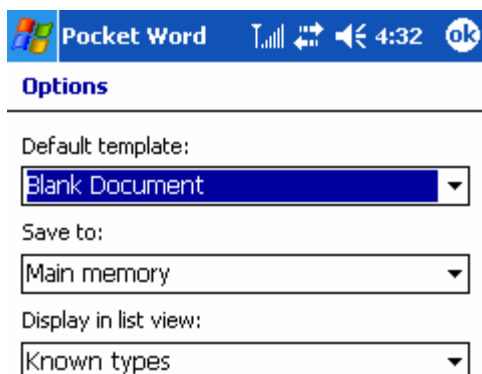
Written words are converted to graphics (metafiles) when a Pocket Word document is converted to a Word document on your desktop PC.

Drawing mode. In drawing mode, use your stylus to draw on the screen. Gridlines appear as a guide. When you lift your stylus off the screen after the first stroke, you will see a drawing box indicating the boundaries of the drawing. Every subsequent stroke within or touching the drawing box becomes part of the drawing. For more information on drawing and selecting drawings, see “Entering Information” in chapter 3.

Recording mode. Use recording mode to embed a recording into your document.

Recordings are saved as WAV files. For more information on recording, see “Entering Information” in chapter 3.

To open a template rather than a blank document, select a template for new documents. On the **Tools** menu, tap **Options**, and then browse to select the default template. When you tap **New**, the template appears with appropriate text and formatting already provided.



Tips for Working in Pocket Word

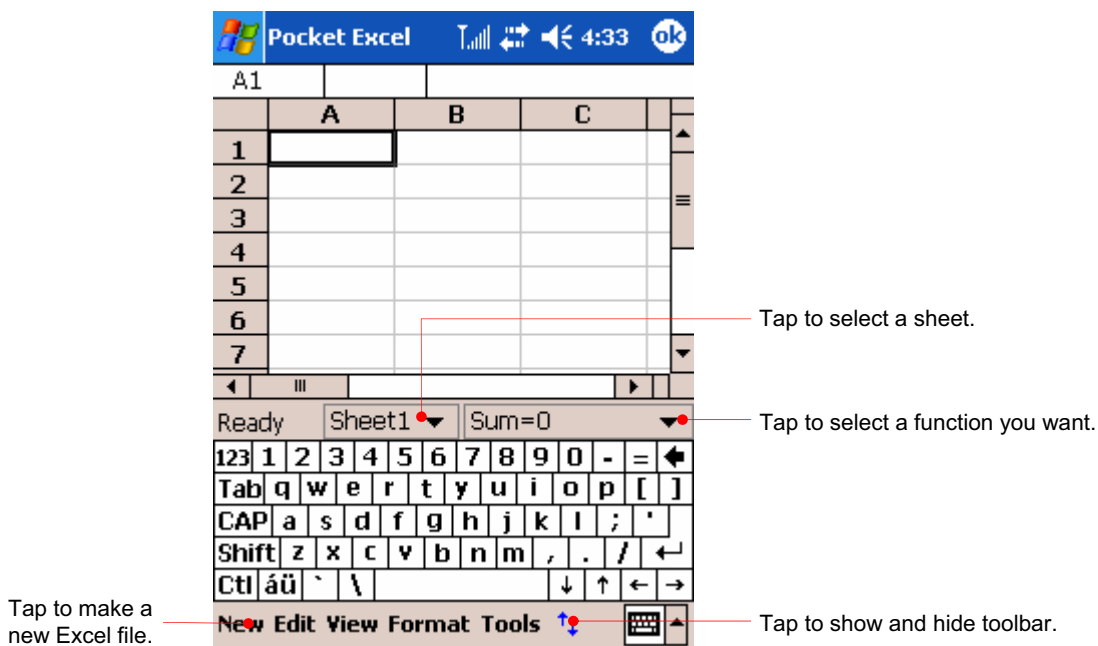
- You can change the zoom magnification by tapping **View** and then **Zoom**. Then select the percentage you want. Select a higher percentage to enter text and a lower one to see more of your document.
- If you are opening a Word document created on a desktop PC, select **Wrap to Window** on the **View** menu so that you can see the entire document.

Microsoft Pocket Excel

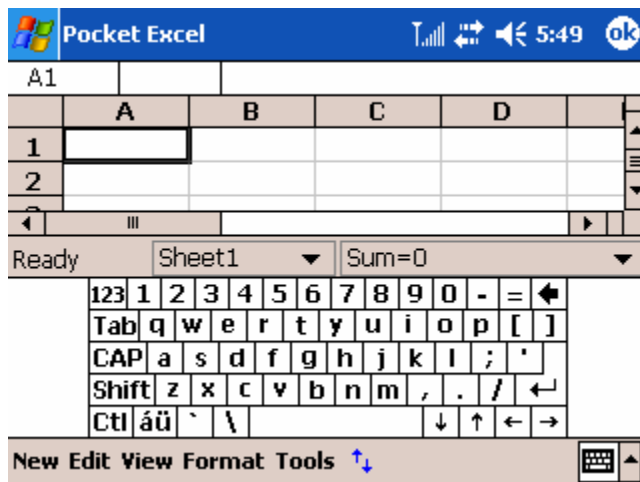
Microsoft Pocket Excel works with Microsoft Excel on your desktop PC to give you easy access to copies of your workbooks. You can create new workbooks on your device, or you can copy workbooks from your desktop PC to your device. Synchronize workbooks between your desktop PC and your device so that you have the most up-to-date content in both locations. Pocket Excel provides fundamental spreadsheet tools, such as formulas, functions, sorting, and filtering, which enable you to create simple workbooks, such as expense reports and mileage logs.


To use Pocket Excel

1. On the **Start** menu, tap **Programs**, and then tap the Pocket Excel icon.

When you tap **New**, the template appears with appropriate text and formatting already provided. You can open only one workbook at a time; when you open a second workbook, you will be asked to save the first. You can save a workbook you create or edit in a variety of formats, including Pocket Excel (.pxl) and Excel (.xls).

Tips for Working in Pocket Excel

- View in full-screen mode to see as much of your worksheet as possible. Tap **View** and then tap **Full Screen**.
- If your workbook contains sensitive information, you can protect it with a password. To do so, open the workbook, tap **Edit**, and then tap **Password**.
- Freeze panes on a worksheet. First, select the cell where you want to freeze panes. Tap **View** and then tap **Freeze Panes**. You might want to freeze the top and leftmost panes in a worksheet to keep row and column labels visible as you scroll through a sheet.
- Split panes to view different areas of a large worksheet. Tap **View** and then tap **Split**. Then drag the split bar to where you want it. To remove the split, tap **View** and then tap **Remove Split**.
- Show and hide rows and columns. To hide a row or column, select a cell in the row or column you want to hide. Tap **Format**, then tap **Row** or **Column**, and then tap **Hide**. To show a hidden row or column, tap **Tools**, then tap **Go To**, and then type a reference that is in the hidden row or column. Tap **Format**, then tap **Row** or **Column**, and then tap **Unhide**.


Microsoft Windows Media Player

Use Microsoft Windows Media Player for Pocket PC to listen to digital audio and video files, such as songs or movie clips.

Media Player supports file formats, such as MP3, WMA, WMV, ASF and WMP.

To start Windows Media Player

On the **Start** menu, tap **Programs**, and then tap the **Windows Media Player** icon.

Pictures

Configuring Pictures

Tools—Options from either the main screen or while viewing an image allows you to set various properties about image display and slideshow playback.

In the **Slide Show** tab, you can change the delay between slides or turn on the slideshow as a screensaver when your device has been idle a set amount of time.

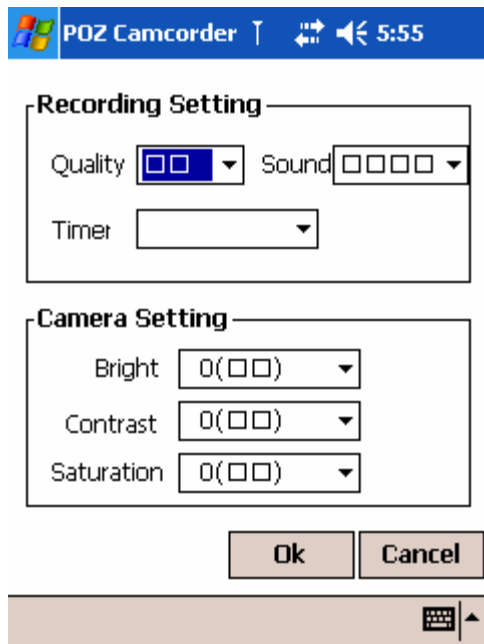
When POZ camcorder program opens and it is in the View mode, you can have the shortcut for each function on the keypad.

For example, press  on the keypad in the View mode to playback/pause.



Options

POZ Album helps you to edit, save and manage the pictures you snap using the digital Camera lens.

You can open POZ Album program as follows :

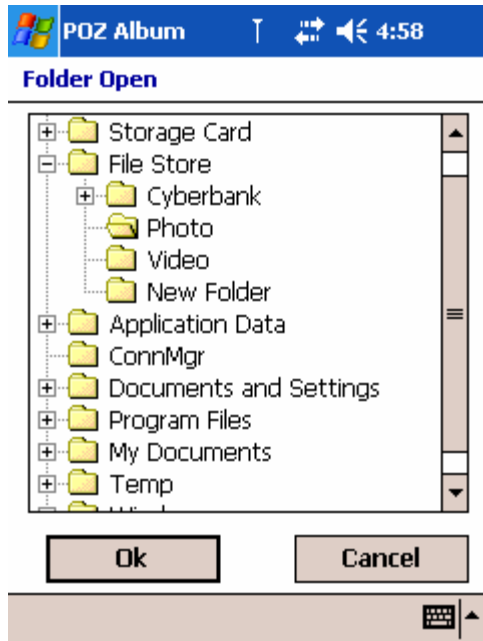

- Select the shortcut  icon for POZ Album on the POZ Camera program.



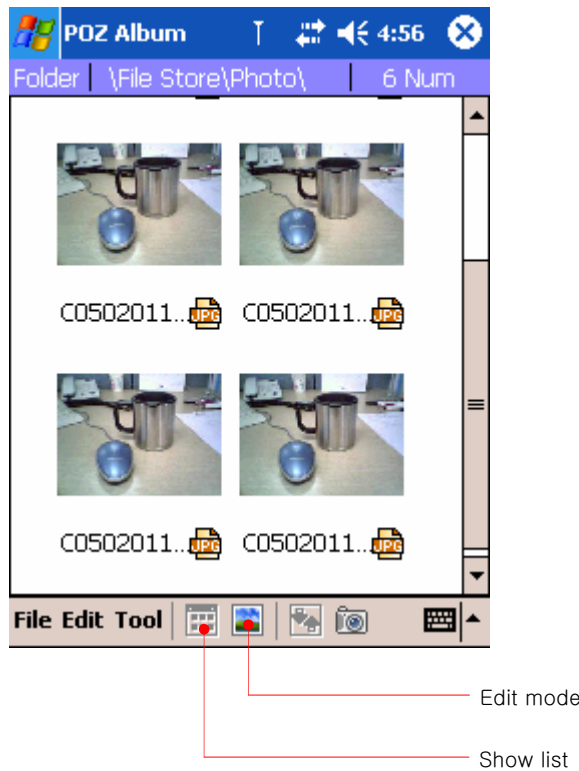

Tap “Open Folder” on the File menu to open pictures you have snapped on the POZ Camera.

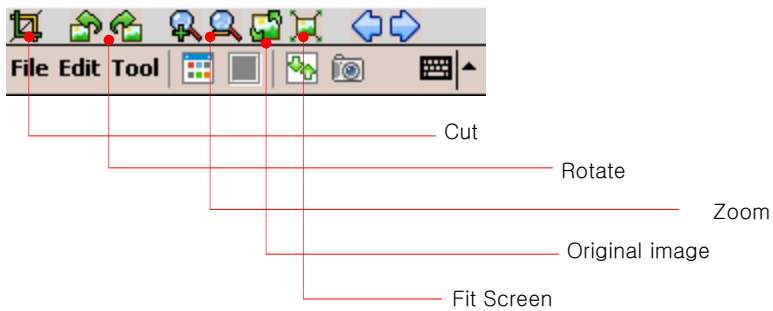
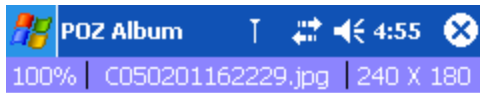

If you want to make a new album, select "Add Album" on the File menu. (If you want to use the existing album, select "Add Album" on the File menu.)



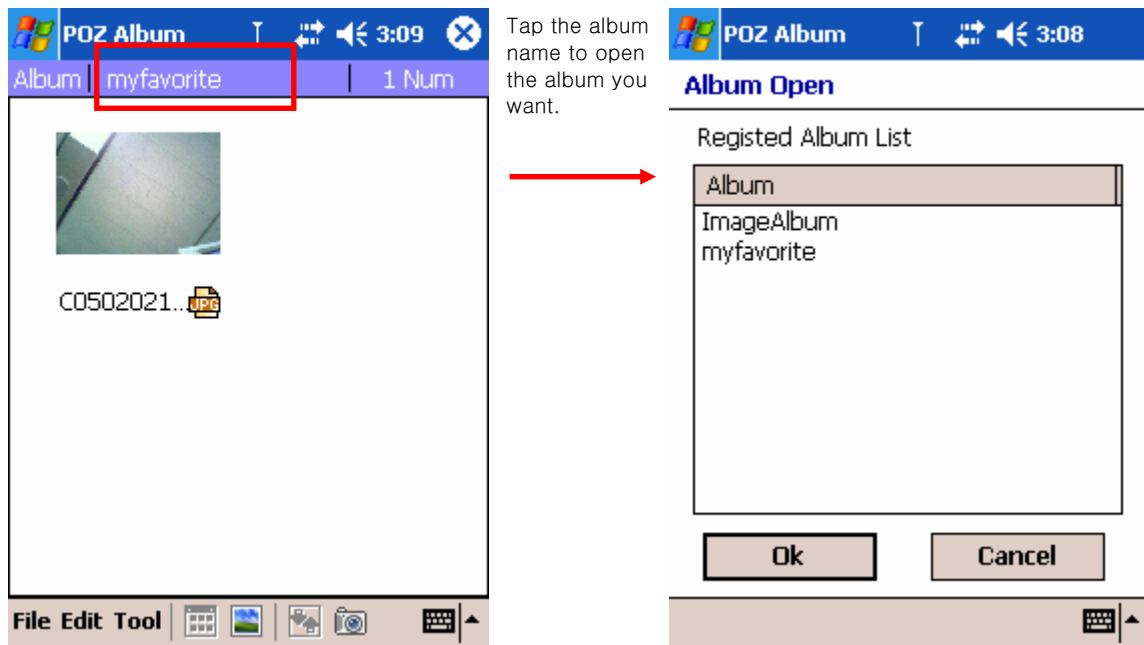

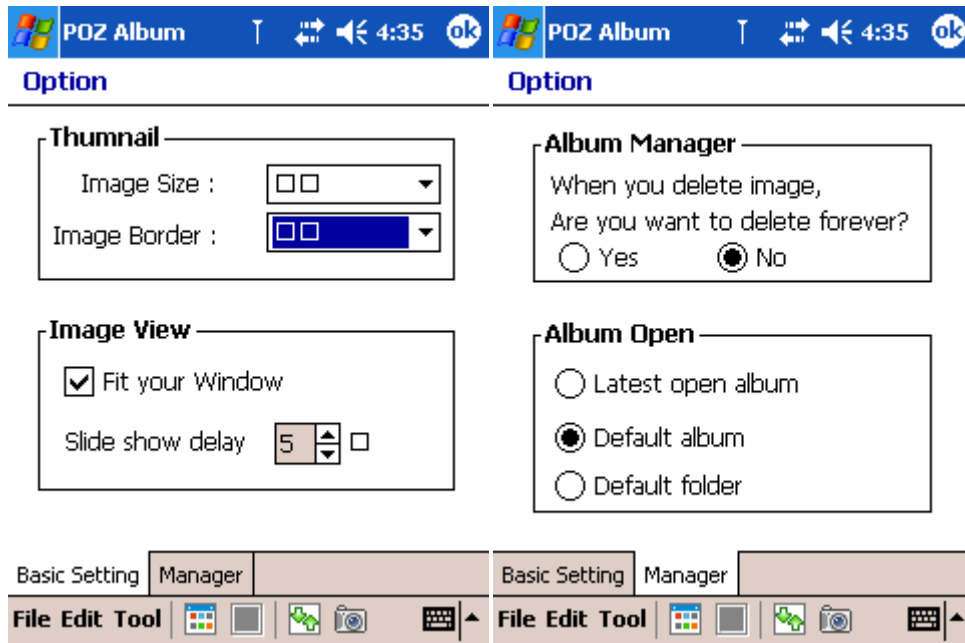

Glossary

AC adapter

An external power supply that converts AC power from a standard household electrical outlet to the low-voltage DC power required to operate your device.

Backup

A duplicate copy of your device files and data that is stored on your desktop PC, on a SD card, or in the Built-in Flash.

Cradle

A desktop base for your device that allows instant connectivity to a desktop PC.

DHCP (Dynamic Host Configuration Protocol)

A protocol that assigns a dynamic IP address to your device each time you connect to a network.

DNS (Domain Name System)

An Internet service that translates domain names into IP addresses. For example, the domain name www.NATE.com might translate as 198.125.247.4.

Driver

A control program that enables a computer to work with a specific peripheral device.

IMAP4 (Internet Messaging Access Protocol v4).

A protocol that enables a computer to retrieve messages from a mail server.

IP (Internet Protocol)

The standard by which packets of information are transmitted over the Internet.

IrDA (Infrared Data Association Protocol)

An established standard for infrared communications between computers and other peripherals and devices.

ISP (Internet Service Provider)

A commercial business that provides Internet access to individuals or businesses, usually for a fee.

LAN (local area network)

A group of computers, usually in close proximity (either in the same building or in buildings in close proximity), that are linked together to share files and exchange data.

POP3 (Post Office Protocol v3)

A protocol that enables a computer to retrieve messages from a mail server.

Proxy server

A server that sits between a client computer or Web browser and the Internet. A proxy server provides security by filtering requests and can improve performance by storing local copies of requested information.

Reset

The process of restarting your device and reinitializing the operating system. Performing a reset erases any unsaved data in open documents, but preserves data that has been saved.

Partnership

An established relationship between your device and your desktop PC for the purpose of synchronizing and transferring data.

PIM (Personal Information Manager)

An application or set of applications that organizes information such as addresses, appointments, and notes.

Restore

To return your device to the state it was in when data was last backed up. This involves copying your backup data to your device.

RAM (Random Access Memory)

Volatile memory that can be read and written. Data stored in RAM is retained only while power is maintained.

ROM (Read-Only Memory)

Nonvolatile flash memory that contains the Microsoft Windows for Pocket PC operating system and pre-installed programs.

SD(Secure Digital) Memory Card

A removable media for high-performance memory cards.

SMTP (Simplified Mail Transport Protocol)

A protocol for sending e-mail messages between computers on the Internet.

Stylus

A pen-like utensil designed to select items on a touch screen.

Synchronization

The process of comparing the files or data between device and desktop PC to ensure that they contain exactly the same information.

Touch screen

A touch-sensitive screen that allows you to open files, launch programs, and select text by touching or tapping the screen with the stylus.

USB (Universal Serial Bus)

A newer standard for connecting peripheral devices. USB supports relatively fast data transfer rates and can be used to connect multiple devices to a single computer.
