SPECIAL RECOGNITION: BRANDON MOLDENKE



Whitmer student **Brandon Moldenke** was honored by Superintendent **Patrick Hickey** at the June 30 Board Meeting.

A LASTING IMPACT

Superintendent Hickey presented a plaque to **Brandon Moldenke** which reads: "For the life-changing impact you have on peers and adults, overcoming obstacles with a positive attitude, living courageously and loving life. You are an inspiration to all who are so fortunate to know you."

Mr. Hickey shared a letter from Coach Bell about Brandon (at right).



When Brandon was at Jefferson, I was inspired to watch this young man defy his disease and refuse to use his walker or accept any help from anyone going up and down the steps at Jefferson. He refused to use the elevator. He wasn't on my team but I stood from a distance and I admired this young man. Little did I know a letter home would alter the course of MY life. I sent a letter home to all prospective players in grades eight to twelve, introducing myself as the new head football coach. His parents were not very happy since their son could not participate in sports. Mr. Bernhardt called me into his office and notified me of the issue that I had caused with my letter.

To me it was simple... Who says he cannot be part of our football family? There were plenty of things he could do to be a part of the team. I emailed his dad and I met him with the possibilities to be a part of our family. Brandon fit in right away with our players from day one. He can be found hanging in the locker room before, between, and even after practice. He participates in most of the events we do and travels to games where he is on our sideline. During practice, Brandon keeps us on time and manages our practices from above. I watch him every day at practices. He overcomes his obstacles and climbs the stadium steps to complete his job. He even turns on the scoreboard now before heading up to the press box. In a brief amount of time in 2012, he became one of the guys and part of the family. He built relationships that are still strong today. We honored him for all he has done in 2013 with his own varsity jacket. Brandon is NOT our manager. He is part of our team. He is family.

I was bound and determined to find a way to put a spotlight on young men and women like Brandon. Upon reading an article about Victory Day, I immediately thought of Brandon. I knew this was a way of incorporating what we do with young men and women who are not able to play our sport. Victory Day was brought to Washington Local because of Brandon and his impact on our football program. I love watching him enjoy the spotlight. Last year, he wore a GoPro camera on his head, so we could see his perspective on the events. This year, Brandon will be our guest speaker and will teach us his lesson on living with cerebral palsy.

Brandon has taught me so many things. I believe he was put in my life for a reason. His positive attitude and his love for life is uplifting and it puts things in perspective. When I am faced with difficulties in life and through my job I often think of Brandon climbing the stadium steps and how he overcomes life's obstacles with a positive attitude. You will never hear Brandon complain. He has taught me to enjoy life, don't stress about what you cannot control, and to find a way to do something positive for someone, even if it's just a smile.

Several moments stand out to me over the last three years... The first one was when Brandon was being carried off the field against Central when we won 42 to nothing. Chris Boykin and Nate Holley made sure Brandon got back to the lockerroom to be part of the celebration. The next moment was when we were at Detroit Catholic Central in 2013 and Brandon was running on our sideline during warm-ups. He was determined to run 50

yards. He fell a few times but he kept getting up and finished.

The most memorable moment for me was when he invited me to the NHS Induction Ceremony. He does not know how much that impacted me. I am so honored to be a part of his life.

In all my years of teaching, I have never had a student or family member who has impacted my life like Brandon. Football season is right around the corner. I am not sure what I am more excited about, the start of our season, or the fact that I will be seeing Brandon every single day. He is family, and he is my hero.

TEACHING OTHERS

Brandon's work with the football team led to Coach **Gary O'Connor** inviting him to become involved with the baseball program. Brandon became the baseball team announcer and is now known as the "Golden Voice of Panther Baseball."

Brandon is also part of the Teaching Professions program at Whitmer. Special guests were invited to watch Brandon present his lesson on "Living with Cerebral Palsy" to third graders at McGregor Elementary (in **Amy Ross**' class), where Brandon completed a student teaching assignment.

Superintendent Hickey shared, "I've seen thousands of lessons in my 30-year career in education. Little did I know that the best one I would ever see would be by a student who was still in high school. The lesson that I got to see was Brandon teaching young people about the disease he has and doing it in such a way that he had the respect of these young people. The questions that were asked were beautiful and life-affirming. Brandon Moldenke is having life-changing impact in our school district. I had the opportunity to sit next to his mom and dad during the lesson. The tears that I shed, the tears that his parents shed, and the tears that were shed by all who got to witness that lesson inspired me to invite him here."


