



KATHLEEN COOPER '70, '71, BUSINESS THOUGHT LEADER. The U.S. under secretary for economic affairs from 2001 to 2005, she is a director of the Williams Companies, a Fortune 200 energy firm, and a founding director of Texas Security Bank in Dallas. She is also a former chief economist for ExxonMobil.



KALPANA "K.C." CHAWLA '84, ASTRONAUT. Born in India, she was the first woman from that nation to travel in space. She was among the crew members who died in the 2003 *Columbia* space shuttle accident. UT Arlington's first Residential Learning Center is named in her honor.



ROLAND G. FRYER JR. '98, ECONOMIST. A Harvard University professor, he was named to *Time* magazine's list of the top 100 scientists and thinkers and as one of the world's top eight young economists by *The Economist*. He also received one of 22 MacArthur Fellowships, often called "genius grants," in 2011.



MARTHA BURK '68, '74, WOMEN'S ISSUES EXPERT. The first woman to earn a Ph.D. at UT Arlington, she is a political psychologist and co-founder of the Center for Advancement of Public Policy. She is a former chair of the National Council of Women's Organizations.



ESTIMATED EXPENSES (2012–2013 ACADEMIC YEAR)

Tuition and Fees*: \$9,152 for in-state undergraduates, \$18,004 for out-of-state undergraduates, and \$18,174 for international undergraduates.

These expenses do not include fees for parking, international student insurance or additional tuition rates assessed by the academic college units, such as College of Nursing, for enrollment in specific courses. The rate for the Designated Enhanced Tuition can range from \$7-\$96 per semester credit hour depending upon the course and the academic college unit.

Flat Rate Tuition: The flat rate for 12 or more credit hours for the 2012-2013 academic year is \$4,439 per semester.

Books and Supplies: \$1,160

Residence Living: Residence hall prices range from \$2,630 to \$5,410 per academic year. UT Arlington-owned apartments range from \$472/month to \$1,068/month and come furnished and unfurnished. Meals: Depending on the residence hall, meal plan participation may or may not be required. Several


