The Lancaster County Department of Parks and Recreation manages nine parks, including three recreational trails. With our diverse resources, we can provide many opportunities for the Boy Scouts of Lancaster County and surrounding areas. From group camping to individual work on merit badges, we can assist Scouts in meeting their Scouting goals. Following is a list of various ways we can assist all levels of Boy Scouts from Tiger Cubs to Eagles and beyond.

EDUCATION

The Lancaster County Environmental Center is a Division of the Parks Department which focuses on environmental education. The EE Team presents thousands of programs each year on topics such as wildlife, plants, outdoor living skills, Native Americans and many others. Presentations may be tailored for large groups or small, young or old. For more information on the costs of programs, call our office or visit our website.

TIGER CUBS



While much of Tiger Cubs is completed within the family and den units, we can enhance many programs and help everyone get the most out of various activities. The Environmental Education Team can present programs on weather, trees, animals and

conservation. They can also lead discovery hikes in any of our parks focusing on a topic of your choice.

BOBCAT AND WOLF

For the Bobcat, we can visit den meetings and present programs on any nature topic of interest. We can assist in advancement for Wolf as well. Programs on Native Americans, birds and knots are popular. Several team members are certified by the PA Fish & Boat Commission to teach the SMART Angler introduction to fishing program.

BEAR

For the upcoming Bear we offer many activities. From bird box construction to wildlife, nature crafts to maps and orienteering, we can develop fun and educational programs to help meet your Scouts' needs.
