Prerequisite: Math 263 and Physics 3.

Corequisite: Math 275.

Advisory: Eng Gen 102, Eng Gen 121, or EET 120.

This course covers electric circuit analysis in time and frequency domains, transient, and steady state solutions. Topics include linear circuit analysis techniques, Kirchhoff's Laws, Network Theorems, mesh and nodal analysis, OP amps and amplifiers, Thevenin/Norton equivalents circuits, natural-forced-complete response of RLC circuits, AC circuits, phasors, three phase power, and frequency response and resonance. The laboratory includes experimental verification of the laws of AC and DC circuits, Kirchhoff's laws, and Thevenin's theorem using instruments such as millimeter, oscilloscopes, and signal generators.

Note: EET 120 is a recommended prerequisite for students who have not had previous circuit experience. Required of all Engineering students. A first course in electrical engineering for Engineering students. Consists of lecture, hands-on circuit design lab, and LabVIEW.

Topics include: Generalized Hooke's law, material properties, allowable stresses, factor of safety, statically indeterminate members, shear and moment diagrams; beam deflection and slope by double integration, singularity functions, superposition and moment-area. Column buckling and Castigliano methods are also studied. Topics also include thermal expansion and indeterminate forms.




