
# **Prepare the batteries**

- The plug of the battery charger differs depending on the region where you purchased the camera. The above procedure uses the AC cable type battery charger as an example. If you received the plug-in type battery charger, plug it directly into an AC wall outlet.

# b. Insert the batteries in the camera.







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
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# **Button operations**



#### **1** POWER button

#### Turning the camera on and off

Power on:

- Camera turns on in shooting mode.
- Monitor turns on
- Lens extends

#### **2** Shutter button

#### Shooting pictures/movies

#### Shooting still pictures

Set the mode dial to a setting other than  $\Omega$ , and lightly press the shutter button (halfway). The green lamp lights when the focus and exposure are locked (focus lock). Now press the shutter button all the way (completely) to shoot a picture.





# Locking the focus and then composing the shot (focus lock)

Compose your picture with the focus locked, and then completely press the shutter button to shoot a picture.

• When the green lamp blinks, the focus is not adjusted properly. Try locking the focus again.

#### **Recording movies**

Set the mode dial to  $\Omega$ , and lightly press the shutter button to lock the focus, and then press the shutter button completely to start recording. Press the shutter button again to stop recording.

#### **3 button (Shooting)** Selecting shooting mode/Turning the camera on

Shooting mode is selected.

When Ŏ is pressed with the camera off, the camera turns on in shooting mode. ☞ "O/► Turning on the camera with the O or ► button" (P. 27)

#### **I** button (Playback) Selecting playback mode/Turning the camera on

The last picture taken is displayed.

· Press the arrow pad to view other pictures.

Use the zoom button to switch between close-up playback and index display.

 is pressed with the camera off, the camera turns on in playback mode.

This function reduces the blur incurred by a moving subject or camera movement when taking pictures.

Press or to decide the scene.

- The scene selection screen displays sample images and the shooting mode to best suit the situation.
- To switch to a different scene mode after a scene mode has been selected, set the mode dial to a different setting and then set it back to SCENE. The scene selection screen is displayed.
- By switching to the other scene, most settings will be changed to the default settings of each scene.

#### P Recording movies

Audio is recorded with the movie.

- During audio recording, only the digital zoom can be used. To record the movie with the optical zoom, set [] to [OFF].

This lights red during movie recording.

The remaining recording time is displayed. When the remaining recording time reaches 0, recording stops.

Flash shooting

Press ▷ \$ in shooting mode to select the flash mode. Press ⊛ for setting.

4	FILL IN	The flash fires regardless of the available light.







# **Operation guide**

BACK+ MENU :	Moves back one menu.
EXIT+ MENU :	Exits the menu.
( <b>◆</b> ) :	Press the arrow pad ( $\Delta \nabla \triangleleft \triangleright$ ) to select an item.
SET+OK :	Sets the selected item.










## **2** PANORAMA

#### Creating a panoramic picture

Panorama shooting lets you create a panoramic picture, using the OLYMPUS Master software from the provided CD-ROM. An Olympus xD-Picture Card is required for panorama shooting.



left to right

- ▷: The next picture is connected at the right edge.
- It is connected at the left edge.



bottom to top

- $\Delta$ : The next picture is connected at the top.
- $\nabla$ : The next picture is connected at the bottom.

Use the arrow pad to specify at which edge you want to connect the pictures, and then compose your shots so that the edges of the pictures overlap. The part of the previous picture where it will be joined to the next picture does not remain in the frame. You have to remember what the part in the frame looked like and take the next picture so it overlaps.



Panorama shooting is possible for up to 10 pictures. Press  $\circledast$  to exit panorama shooting.





Protected pictures cannot be erased using [ERASE], [SEL. IMAGE] or [ALL ERASE], but they are all erased by formatting.

 Select the picture with ⊲▷, and protect it by selecting [ON] with △∇. You can protect several frames in succession.

## **6** ERASE

Erasing selected pictures/Erasing all pictures

Protected pictures cannot be erased. Cancel protection before erasing protected pictures. Once erased, pictures cannot be restored. Check each picture before erasing to avoid accidentally erasing pictures you want to keep.

- When erasing pictures in the internal memory, do not insert the card into the camera.
- · When erasing pictures from the card, insert a card into the camera in advance.



# Menu operations

#### MEMORY FORMAT (FORMAT)..... Formatting the internal memory or card

All existing data, including protected pictures, are erased when the internal memory or card is formatted. Make sure that you save or transfer important data to a computer before formatting.

- Make sure there is no card inserted in the camera when formatting the internal memory.
- · Be sure that the card is inserted in the camera when formatting the card.
- Before using non-Olympus cards or cards which have been formatted on a computer, you must format them with this camera.

#### BACKUP..... Copying pictures in the internal memory to the card

Insert the optional card into the camera. Copying data does not erase the picture in the internal memory.

 It takes some time to back up data. Check if the battery is not empty before starting the copy.

₽∠⊟ ......Selecting a display language

You can select a language for on-screen display. Available languages vary depending on the area where you purchased this camera.

You can add other languages to your camera with the provided OLYMPUS Master software.

#### PIXEL MAPPING ......Adjusting the image processing function

The pixel mapping feature allows the camera to check and adjust the CCD and image processing functions. It is not necessary to operate this function frequently. Approximately once a year is recommended. Wait at least one minute after taking or viewing pictures to allow the pixel mapping function to perform properly. If you turn the camera off during pixel mapping, start again. Select [PIXEL MAPPING]. When [START] is displayed, press @.




To play back camera images on a TV, set the video output according to your TV's video signal type.

 TV video signal types differ by country/region. Check the video signal type before connecting the camera to the TV.

NTSC: North America, Taiwan, Korea, Japan PAL: European countries, China

#### Playing back pictures on a TV

Turn off the camera and the TV before connecting.

#### Settings on the camera

Turn the camera on and press ► to select the playback mode.

 The last picture taken is displayed on the TV. Use the arrow pad to select the picture you want to display.

#### Settings on the TV

Turn the TV on, and set it to video input mode.

 For details of switching to video input, refer to your TV's instruction manual.

#### POWER SAVE...... Setting the camera to the power save mode

YES	If there is no operation for 3 minutes, the camera automatically goes into sleep mode. If there is no operation for 15 minutes thereafter, the camera automatically turns off.
NO	The camera is not set to the power save mode.

# Direct printing (PictBridge)

#### Using the direct printing function

By connecting the camera to a PictBridge-compatible printer, you can print out pictures directly. Select the pictures you want to print and the number of prints on the camera's monitor.

To find out if your printer is compatible with PictBridge, refer to the printer's instruction manual.

#### What is PictBridge?

A standard for connecting digital cameras and printers of different makers and printing out pictures directly.

- Available printing modes, paper sizes etc., vary depending on the printer you use. Refer to the instruction manual for your printer.
- For details of printing paper types, ink cassettes, etc., refer to the printer's instruction manual.

#### EASY PRINT


[EASY PRINT] can be used to print out the picture displayed on the monitor. The selected picture is printed using the standard settings of your printer. The date and file name are not printed.

#### STANDARD

All printers that support PictBridge have standard print settings. If [STANDARD] is selected on the settings screens (P. 33), pictures are printed according to these settings. Refer to the printer's instruction manual for its standard settings or contact the printer manufacturer.

# **1** Display the picture you want to print out on the monitor in the playback mode.

2 Turn the printer on and plug the USB cable provided with the camera into the multi-connector of the camera and the printer's USB port.



- The [EASY PRINT START] screen is displayed.
- For details of how to turn the printer on and the position of the USB port, refer to the printer's instruction manual.

**3** Press △凸.


- When printing is finished, the picture selection screen is displayed. To print another picture, press ⊲▷ to select a picture, and press △□.
- When you are finished, disconnect the USB cable from the camera with the picture selection screen displayed.
- **4** Remove the USB cable from the camera.







5 Remove the USB cable from the printer.



You can use [EASY PRINT] even when the camera is turned off or in shooting mode. With the camera turned off or in shooting mode, connect the USB cable. The selection screen for the USB connection is displayed. Select [EASY PRINT].





#### How to make print reservations

Print reservation allows you to save printing data (the number of prints and the date and time information) with the pictures stored on the card. With print reservation, you can print out pictures easily either at home using a personal DPOF-compatible printer or at a photo store that supports DPOF. DPOF is a standard format used to record automatic print information from digital cameras.

Only the images stored on the card can be reserved to print. Insert a card with recorded pictures into the camera before making print reservations.

Pictures with print reservations can be printed using the following procedures.

#### Printing using a DPOF-compatible photo store.

You can print the pictures using the print reservation data.

#### Printing using a DPOF-compatible printer.

Printing is possible directly from a card containing print reservation data, without using a computer. For more details, refer to the printer's instruction manual. A PC card adapter may also be necessary.

#### Note

- DPOF reservations set by another device cannot be changed by this camera. Make changes using the original device. If a card contains DPOF reservations set by another device, entering reservations using this camera may overwrite the previous reservations.
- You can make DPOF print reservations for up to 999 images per card.
- Not all functions may be available on all printers, or at all photo stores.

#### To use print services without using DPOF

Pictures stored in the internal memory cannot be printed at a photo store. The pictures need to be copied to a card before taking them.
 ISP "BACKUP Copying pictures in the internal memory to the card" (P. 27)

#### Single-frame reservation

  - The "Photo Print" window is displayed.
- 3 Click "Settings" in the "Photo Print" window.
  - The printer settings screen is displayed. Make the necessary printer settings.
- **4** Select a layout and size.
  - To print the date and time with your image, check the box next to "Print Date", and select between "Date" and "Date & Time".
- 5 Select the thumbnail image that you want to print and click "Add".
  - A preview of the selected image is displayed on the layout.

# To download and save images to a computer without using OLYMPUS Master

# To increase the number of languages

Be sure that your batteries are fully charged!

- Make sure that your PC is connected to the Internet. Click "Update Camera" an on the OLYMPUS Master main menu.
  - After selecting the "Update Camera" function OLYMPUS Master shows a Window with security advices.



- **2** Plug the USB cable into the USB port on the computer.
- **3** Plug the other end of the USB cable into the camera's multiconnector.
  - The camera turns on automatically.
  - The monitor turns on and the selection screen for the USB connection is displayed.

- **4** Select [PC], and press ∞.

  - OLYMPUS Master will identify the current version of your camera's firmware.

# Shooting tips and information

### Tips before you start taking pictures

### The camera does not turn on even when batteries are loaded

#### The batteries are loaded incorrectly

· Reload the batteries correctly.

#### The batteries are exhausted

· Replace or charge the batteries.

### The batteries are temporarily unable to function because of the cold

 Battery performance declines in low temperatures, and the charge may not be sufficient to turn on the camera. Remove the batteries and warm them by putting them in your pocket for a while.

### No picture is taken when the shutter button is pressed

### The camera is in sleep mode

- To save battery power, the camera automatically goes into sleep mode and the monitor turns off if there is no operation when the camera is turned on. No picture is taken even if the shutter button is fully pressed in this mode.
   Operate the zoom button or other buttons to restore the camera from sleep mode before taking a picture. If the camera is left for 15 minutes, it automatically turns off. Press **POWER** to turn the camera on.
- To prevent the camera from automatically entering sleep mode, set [POWER SAVE] to [NO].
- POWER SAVE Setting the camera to the power save mode" (P. 29)

### The mode dial is in the position of GUIDE


• No pictures can be taken when the shooting guide is being displayed. Take pictures after making the settings by following the shooting guide, or turn the mode dial and set it to a shooting mode other than **GUIDE**.

### The flash is charging

• Wait until the \$ (flash charge) mark stops blinking before taking the picture.

### The memory gauge is full

• No pictures can be taken when the memory gauge is full. Wait until there is space in the memory gauge.



### The date and time have not been set

#### The camera has been used in the same condition from the time of purchase

- No date and time have been set for the camera at the time of purchase. Set the date and time before using the camera.
- Set the date and time" (P. 6), " Setting the date and time" (P. 28)

#### The batteries have been removed from the camera

 The date and time settings will be returned to the factory default settings if the camera is left without the batteries for approximately 3 days. Before taking important pictures, check that the date and time settings are correct.

### Shooting tips

### Focusing on the subject

There are several ways to focus, depending on the subject.

#### When the subject is not in the center of the frame

• Place the subject in the center of the frame, lock the focus on the subject, and then recompose your picture.

#### The subject is moving quickly

 Focus the camera on a point roughly the same distance away as the subject you want to shoot (by pressing the shutter button halfway), and then recompose your picture and wait for the subject to enter the frame.

### Subjects that are difficult to focus on

 Under certain types of conditions, it is difficult to focus using auto focus. The green lamp on the monitor lights, allowing you to check if the focus is locked.

The green lamp blinks. The subject cannot be brought into focus.

The green lamp lights, but the subject cannot be brought into focus.

In these cases, focus (focus lock) on an object with high contrast at the same distance as the intended subject, recompose your shot and then take the picture. If the subject has no vertical lines, hold the camera vertically and focus the camera using the focus lock function by pressing the shutter button halfway, and then return the camera to the horizontal position while keeping the button pressed halfway and take the picture.

### Taking pictures without blurring

Hold the camera correctly and press the shutter button gently to shoot the picture. In addition, turn the mode dial to (()) when taking a picture to reduce blurring.

The factors that can cause the picture to blur are as follows:

- When you use the optical zoom, digital zoom, or zoom at such higher magnifications to shoot the picture
- · When the shutter speed is set low to shoot a dark subject
- When the flash cannot be used or a low shutter speed set shooting mode is selected.

### Taking pictures without the flash

The flash fires automatically when there is insufficient light or when blurring may occur. If the subject is too far away, the flash may have no effect. Here is how to take pictures without the flash in this type of situation.

#### Set the camera to (()) mode

- Because the sensitivity of the CCD increases automatically, you can hold the camera and take pictures in darker places with the flash off.
- (P. 15) \* (\*\*\*) Shooting pictures using digital image stabilization

### The picture is too grainy

There are several factors that can cause the picture to appear grainy.

### Using the digital zoom to take close-up pictures

• With the digital zoom, part of the image is cropped and enlarged. The greater the magnification, the grainier the picture appears.

# Taking pictures with the mode dial set to $\mathfrak{B}_{\mathbf{s}}$ or SCENE mode set to $\mathfrak{B},$ 📸 or 🏙

• When taking pictures with the above scene modes, noise reduction can be automatically turned on for clearer pictures of dark subjects. If noise reduction does not turn on, the picture may appear grainy.

### Taking pictures of a white beach or snow scene

 Often, bright subjects (such as snow) turn out darker than their natural colors. Adjust [EXPOSURE COMP.] toward [+] to make these subjects closer to their real shades. Conversely, when you are shooting dark subjects, it can be effective to adjust toward [–]. Sometimes, using the flash may not produce the brightness (exposure) that was intended.

EXPOSURE COMP. Changing picture brightness" (P. 23)

### Taking pictures of a subject against backlight

- Set the flash to [\$] to activate fill-in-flash. You can shoot a subject against backlight without the face of the subject appearing dark. [\$] is effective for shooting against backlight and under fluorescent and other artificial lighting.
- "> \$ button Flash shooting" (P. 17)

### Increasing the number of pictures that can be taken

There are two ways to record the pictures you take with this camera.

#### Recording pictures to the internal memory

 Pictures are recorded to the internal memory, and when the number of storable still pictures reaches 0, you connect the camera to a computer to download the pictures, and then erase the pictures from the internal memory.

#### Using a card (optional)

- Pictures are recorded to the card when inserted in the camera. When the card
  is full, you download the pictures to a computer, and then either erase the
  pictures from the card or use a new card.
- Pictures are not recorded to the internal memory when a card is inserted in the camera. Pictures in the internal memory can be copied to the card using the [BACKUP] function.
- "BACKUP Copying pictures in the internal memory to the card" (P. 27) "The card" (P. 62)

### Extending the useful life of the battery

- Performing any of the following operations when not actually taking pictures can deplete the battery power.
  - · Repeatedly pressing the shutter button halfway
  - Repeatedly using the zoom
  - Not using the power save mode ([POWER SAVE] set to [NO])
- To save battery power, turn off the camera whenever it is not in use.

### Functions that cannot be selected from menus

- · Some items may not be selectable from the menus when using the arrow pad.
  - · Items that cannot be set with the current shooting mode
  - Items that cannot be set because of an item that has already been set:
     [s]] and [4], etc.

### Viewing pictures on a computer

### Viewing the entire picture on a computer screen

The size of the picture displayed on a computer screen changes depending on the computer settings. When the monitor setting is  $1,024 \times 768$  and you are using Internet Explorer to view a picture with an image size of  $2,048 \times 1,536$  at 100%, the entire picture cannot be viewed without scrolling. There are several ways you can view the entire picture on the computer screen.

### View the picture using image browsing software

Install the OLYMPUS Master software from the provided CD-ROM.

### Change the monitor setting

 The icons on the computer desktop may be rearranged. For details of changing the settings on your computer, refer to the computer's instruction manual.

# **Glossary** of terms

#### CCD (Charge-Coupled Device)

This converts light passing through the lens into electrical signals. On this camera, light is picked up and converted into RGB signals to build a single image.

#### DCF (Design Rule for Camera File System)

A standard for image files by the Japan Electronics and Information Technology Industries Association (JEITA).

#### DPOF (Digital Print Order Format)

This is for saving desired print settings on digital cameras. By entering which images to print and the number of copies of each, the user can easily have the desired images printed by a printer or print lab that supports the DPOF format.

#### EV (Exposure Value)

A system for measuring exposure. EV0 is when the aperture is at F1 and the shutter speed is 1 second. The EV then increases by 1 each time the aperture increases by one F stop or the shutter speed increases by one increment. EV can also be used to indicate brightness and ISO.

#### Exposure

The amount of light used to capture an image. The exposure is determined by the time the shutter is open (shutter speed) and the amount of light that passes through the lens (aperture).

#### Image size

The size of an image expressed by the number of pixels that make up the image. For instance, a picture taken with an image size of  $640 \times 480$  fills the computer screen when the monitor setting is  $640 \times 480$ . However, if the monitor setting is  $1,024 \times 768$ , the picture only takes up part of the screen.

#### JPEG (Joint Photographic Experts Group)

A compression format for still images. Photographs (pictures) taken using this camera are recorded onto the card in JPEG format. By downloading these images to a computer, users can edit them using graphics application software or view the images using an Internet web browser.

#### Noise reduction

When shooting in dark places, shutter speeds become slower as there is less light focused on the CCD. During long exposures, signals are generated by parts of the CCD where no light is focused and are recorded on the picture as noise. When noise reduction works, the camera automatically reduces the noise to produce clearer images.

#### NTSC (National Television Systems Committee)/PAL (Phase Alternating Line)

Television formats. NTSC is mainly used in Japan, North America and Korea. PAL is mainly used in Europe and China.

#### PictBridge

A standard for connecting digital cameras and printers of different makers and printing out pictures directly.

#### Pixels

A pixel is the smallest unit (dot) used to make up an image. Clear large-sized printed images require millions of pixels.

#### Sleep mode

A mode designed to save battery life. The camera automatically enters the sleep mode if you do not operate it for a certain time. To exit the sleep mode, use any button on the camera (shutter button, arrow pad, etc.).

#### TFT (Thin-Film Transistor) Color Monitor

A transistor color monitor constructed using thin-film technology.

# Miscellaneous

### Camera care

#### Cleaning the camera

#### Exterior:

 Wipe gently with a soft cloth. If the camera is very dirty, soak the cloth in mild soapy water and wring well. Wipe the camera with the damp cloth and then dry it with a dry cloth. If you have used the camera at the beach, use a cloth soaked in clean water and wrung well.

#### Monitor:

· Wipe gently with a soft cloth.

#### Lens:

 Blow dust off the lens with a commercial blower, then wipe gently with a lens cleaner.

#### Batteries/Charger:

· Wipe gently with a soft, dry cloth.



- Do not use strong solvents such as benzene or alcohol, or chemically treated cloth.
- · Mold may form on the lens surface if the lens is left dirty.


#### Storage

- When storing the camera for extended periods, remove the batteries and card, and keep in a cool, dry place that is well ventilated.
- Periodically insert the batteries and test the camera functions.

# Useful use of the accessories

### The card

Pictures can be recorded on the optional card.

The internal memory and card are the camera's media for recording pictures, similar to film in a film camera.

Pictures recorded to the internal memory or card can be easily erased on the camera or processed using a computer.

Unlike portable storage media, the internal memory cannot be removed or exchanged. The number of recordable pictures can be increased by using a card with a larger capacity.

- ② Contact area The part where the data transferred from the camera enters the card.


