

Peer Editing Guide – Situation-Problem-Solution

Task 1: As a class create a check list of things to look for when editing. It may be helpful to break this down into the following categories:

Paragraph Structure

APA Referencing

Language Usage

Introduction

- a. Does the introduction begin with a hook?
- b. Is there enough necessary background information included?
- c. Is there a clearly stated thesis that mentions the situation, the problem/s and the solutions?

Situation

a. Is the situation clearly explained? Is evidence included?

Problem

a. Is the problem/s clearly identified?

Solution

a. Is the solution/s clearly identified?

Evaluation

a. Is the evaluation of the desired solution clearly expressed and argued?

Conclusion

- a. Does the conclusion begin with a restatement of the thesis?
- b. Are the main points summarised?
- c. Is there an attempt to connect the chosen solution to our lives?

Task 2: Use your editing checklist and the questions above to help you annotate another group's essay draft.
