

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

Wor-Wic Community College and Salisbury University recognize the need and importance of facilitating the transfer of students with a major in Chemical Dependency Counseling from Wor-Wic Community College to Salisbury University as these students pursue their degree in Social Work. To enhance this transition and to assist in promoting the statewide move toward the increased educational requirements in the field of Chemical Dependency Counseling, a formal articulation agreement between Wor-Wic Community College and Salisbury University is being established. It is based on a thorough review of Chemical Dependency Counseling Curricula at both Wor-Wic Community College and the Social Work curricula at Salisbury University.

ACADEMIC AGREEMENTS

- A. In order to apply the full two years of Wor-Wic Chemical Dependency Counseling coursework to the major at Salisbury University, Wor-Wic Community College students will be required to:
 1. Complete the requirements for a Wor-Wic Community College Associate in Applied Science (A.A.S.) degree in Chemical Dependency Counseling as outlined in the attached document.
 2. Complete all articulated coursework with grades of "C" or better
 3. Complete **63** credits at Wor-Wic Community College.

- B. For admission to the Social Work Department at Salisbury University, Wor-Wic Community College students holding the A.A.S. under this agreement will be required to:
 1. Apply for admission to Salisbury University.
 2. Be accepted to Salisbury University
 3. Complete the A.A.S. in Chemical Dependency Counseling at Wor-Wic Community.

- C. Graduates of the Wor-Wic Community College who have completed the A.A.S. with a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 or higher will automatically be granted admission to Salisbury University as a social work major. However, in compliance with the Council on Social Work Education's accreditation requirements, a student's admission to the social work professional program is a separate process which occurs during the fall of the student's junior year and only for matriculated Salisbury University students in good academic standing. Specific information regarding requirements for the program can be found in the Social Work Undergraduate Student Handbook which will be made available to Wor-Wic Community College advisors.
- D. Salisbury University will have all articulated credits within this agreement applied to the Social Work degree, excluding the 8 practicum credits and the 1 SDV 100 Fundamentals of College Study credit. Students who complete all of the A.A. S. in Chemical Dependency Counseling requirements will be able to complete the Bachelor of Social Work degree at Salisbury University within two years (four semesters) if transferring to begin in a fall semester and if enrolled according to the attached sequence. Wor-Wic Community College students who have completed the A.A.S. degree under this agreement will enter Salisbury University with 54 credits which is 6 credits short of a full junior status.
- E. Appointed institutional representatives at Wor-Wic Community College and Salisbury University will ensure that appropriate personnel in their respective colleges are aware of this agreement, including the admissions and advising staffs, transfer coordinators and appropriate faculty and deans.

STUDENT SERVICES

- A. Students will be treated on an equal basis with native students in regards to the award and distribution of financial aid, campus housing, course selection, registration and other student services.
- B. Salisbury University will provide schedule requested appointments to provide information and assistance for Wor-Wic students interested in matriculating at Salisbury University.

*** The Social Work Curriculum requires a student to take one 3 hour social work elective (however students may take more than one social work elective as a means of meeting the 120 hour requirement). Graduates of the Wor-Wic Community College students who have completed the A.A.S. will have SOWK 455 (Substance Abuse: Issues and Services) waived because content in the A.A.S. in Chemical Dependency Counseling meets the requirements of that course. Therefore, students from Wor-Wic Community College who have completed the A.A.S. may take additional social work electives but are not required to do so.**

NOTE: A minimum of 30 credits of 300 and 400 level courses (with a grade of “C” or better in each course) is required for graduation.
