safety and usage information

Comply with the following precautions to avoid dangerous or illegal situations and ensure peak performance of your mobile phone.



Safety warnings

Keep your phone away from small children and pets

Keep your phone and all accessories out of the reach of small children or animals. Small parts may cause choking or serious injury if swallowed.

Protect your hearing



Excessive exposure to sound at high volumes can cause hearing damage. Always turn the volume down before plugging the earphones into an audio source and use only the minimum volume setting necessary to hear your conversation or music.

Install mobile phones and equipment with caution

Ensure that any mobile phones or related equipment installed in your vehicle are securely mounted. Avoid placing your phone and accessories near or in an air bag deployment area. Improperly installed wireless equipment can cause serious injury when air bags inflate rapidly.

Handle and dispose of batteries and chargers with care

- Use only Samsung-approved batteries and chargers specifically designed for your phone.
 Incompatible batteries and chargers can cause serious injuries or damage to your phone.
- Never dispose of batteries or phones in a fire.
 Follow all local regulations when disposing of used batteries or phones.

- Never place batteries or phones on or in heating devices, such as microwave ovens, stoves, or radiators. Batteries may explode when overheated.

Avoid interference with pacemakers

Turn off the phone in potentially explosive environments

Do not use your phone at refuelling points (service stations) or near fuels or chemicals. Turn off your phone whenever directed by warning signs or instructions. Your phone could cause explosions or fire in and around fuel or chemical storage and transfer areas or blasting areas. Do not store or carry flammable liquids, gases, or explosive materials in the same compartment as the phone, its parts, or accessories.

Reduce the risk of repetitive motion injuries

Turn off the phone near medical equipment

Your phone can interfere with medical equipment in hospitals or health care facilities. Follow all regulations, posted warnings, and directions from medical personnel.

Turn off the phone or disable the wireless functions when in an aircraft





assembling and preparing your mobile phone


Get started by assembling and setting up your mobile phone for its first use.

Install the SIM card and battery

When you subscribe to a cellular service, you will receive a Subscriber Identity Module (SIM) card with subscription details, such as your personal identification number (PIN) and optional services.

To install the SIM card and battery,

1. Remove the battery cover.





2. Insert the SIM card.





- Place the SIM card in the phone with the gold-coloured contacts facing down.
- Without inserting a SIM card, you can use your phone's non-network services and some menus.

3. Insert the battery.



4. Replace the battery cover.



Charge the battery

Before using the phone for the first time, you must charge the battery.

- 1. Open the cover to the multifunction jack on the side of the phone.
- 2. Plug the small end of the travel adapter into the multifunction jack.





Improperly connecting the travel adapter can cause serious damage to the phone. Any damages by misuse are not covered by the warranty.

- 3. Plug the large end of the travel adapter into a power outlet.
- 4. When the battery is fully charged (the icon is no longer moving), unplug the travel adapter from the power outlet.
- 5. Unplug the travel adapter from the phone.
- 6. Close the cover to the multifunction jack.



About the low battery indicator

When your battery is low, the phone will emit a warning tone and a low battery message. The battery icon will also be empty and blinking. If the battery level becomes too low, the phone will automatically power off. Recharge your battery to continue using your phone.

Insert a memory card (optional)

To store additional multimedia files, you must insert a memory card. Your phone accepts microSD™ or microSDHC™ memory cards up to 8 GB (depending on memory card manufacturer and type).



Formatting the memory card on a PC may cause incompatibility with your phone. Format the memory card only on the phone.

- 1. Open the cover to the memory card slot on the side of the phone.
- 2. Insert a memory card with the label side facing down.



3. Push the memory card in the memory card slot until it locks in place.

Push it gently until it disengages from the phone, and then pull the memory card out of the memory card slot.

Attach a hand strap (optional)

- 1. Remove the battery cover.
- 2. Slide a hand strap through the slot and hook it over the small projection.



3. Replace the battery cover.

using basic functions

Leam how to perform basic operations and use the main features of your mobile phone.

Turn your phone on and off

To turn your phone on,

- 1. Press and hold [7].
- 2. Enter your PIN and select **Done** (if necessary). To turn your phone off, repeat step 1 above.

Switch to the offline profile

By switching to the offline profile, you can use your phone's non-network services in areas where wireless devices are prohibited, such as aeroplanes and hospitals.

To switch to the offline profile, in Menu mode, select $Settings \rightarrow Phone profiles \rightarrow Offline \rightarrow Save$.



Follow all posted warnings and directions from official personnel when in areas where wireless devices are prohibited.

Use the touch screen

Your phone's touch screen lets you easily select items or perform functions. Learn basic actions to use the touch screen.




- To avoid scratching the touch screen, do not use sharp tools.
- Do not allow the touch screen to come in contact with other electrical devices.
 Electrostatic discharges can cause the touch screen to malfunction.
- Do not allow the touch screen to come in contact with water. The touch screen may malfunction in humid conditions or when exposed to water.




- For the optimal use of the touch screen, remove the screen protection film before using your phone.
- Your touch screen has a layer that detects small electrical charges emitted by the human body. For best performance, tap the touch screen with your fingertip. The touch screen will not react to touches of sharp tools, such as a stylus or pen.
- Touch an icon to open a menu or launch an application.



 Drag your finger up or down to scroll through vertical lists.



 Drag your finger left or right to scroll through horizontal lists.



Access menus

To access your phone's menus,

- 1. In Idle mode, select **Menu** to access Menu mode.
- 2. Select a menu or option.
- 3. Press the Back key to move up one level; Press [70] to return to Idle mode.

Use widgets

Learn to use widgets on the widget toolbar.



- Some of your widgets connect to web services. Selecting a web-based widget may incur additional charges.
- Available widgets may vary depending on your region or service provider.

Open the widget toolbar

In Idle mode, select the arrow at the bottom left of the screen to open the widget toolbar. You can rearrange widgets on the widget toolbar or move them to the idle screen.

Move the widgets to the idle screen

- 1. Open the widget toolbar.
- 2. Drag a widget from the widget toolbar to the idle screen. You can position the widget anywhere on the screen.



To move the widgets from the idle screen to the widget toolbar back, select and drag a widget to the widget toolbar.

Change the widgets

- 1. Open the widget toolbar.
- 2. Select prom the widget toolbar.
- 3. Select the widgets you want to include to the widget toolbar and select **Save**.

Customise your phone

Get more from your phone by customising it to match your preferences.

Adjust the volume of the key tones

In Idle mode, press the Volume key and adjust the key tone volume.

Adjust the vibration intensity on the touch screen

You can adjust the intensity of the vibration when you touch the phone screen.

- 1. In Idle mode, press the Volume key.
- 2. Select **Vibration** and adjust the intensity of the vibration.

Switch to or from the silent profile

In Idle mode, select **Keypad** and touch and hold **#** to silence or unsilence your phone.

Set a phone profile

To change the ringtone of the current profile,

In Menu mode, select Settings → Phone profiles.

2. Scroll to the profile you are using.



If you are using the silent or offline profile, you are not allowed to change the ringtone.

- 3. Select Edit → Voice call ringtone.
- 4. Select a ringtone category → a ringtone.
- 5. Select Save or Set → Save.

To switch to another profile, select it from the list and select **Save**.

To create a phone profile,

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Phone profiles.
- 2. Select Create.
- 3. Enter a name for the profile and select **Done**.
- 4. Customise the sound settings as desired.
- 5. When you are finished, select **Save**.

Select a wallpaper (Idle mode)

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Display and light → Wallpaper.
- 2. Scroll left or right to an image.
- 3. Select Set.

Select a theme for the display

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Display and light → My theme.
- 2. Select a theme and select Save.

Lock your phone

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Security → Phone lock → On → Save.
- 2. Enter a new 4- to 8-digit password and select **Done**.

3. Enter the new password again and select **Done**.



- The first time you access a menu that requires a password, you will be prompted to create and confirm a password.

Use basic call functions

Learn to make or answer calls and use basic call functions.

Make a call

- 1. In Idle mode, select **Keypad** and enter an area code and a phone number.
- 2. Press [to dial the number
- 3. To end the call, press [7].

Answer a call

- 1. When a call comes in, press [-].
- 2. To end the call, press [7].

Adjust the volume

To adjust the volume during a call, press the Volume key.

Use the speakerphone feature

- 2. To switch back to the earpiece, select **4** again.



In noisy environments, you may have difficulty hearing the calls while using the speakerphone feature. For better performance, use the normal phone mode.

Use the headset

By plugging the supplied headset into the phone's multifunction jack, you can make and answer calls:

- To redial the last call, press and hold the headset button.
- To answer a call, press the headset button.
- To end a call, press and hold the headset button.

Send and view messages

Learn to send or view text (SMS), multimedia (MMS), or email messages.

Send a text or multimedia message

- In Menu mode, select Messages → Create new message → Message.
- 2. Select Tap to add text.
- 3. Enter your message text and select **Done**.▶ p. 27

- 4. Select Tap to add recipient → Enter manually.
- 5. Enter a recipient number and select **Done**. For sending as a text message, skip to step 7. For attaching multimedia, continue with step 6.
- 6. Select Add multimedia and add an item.
- 7. Select **Send** to send the message.

Send an email

- In Menu mode, select Messages → Create new message → Email.
- 2. Select **Tap to add subject**.
- 3. Enter a subject and select **Done**.
- 4. Select Tap to add recipient → Enter manually.
- 5. Enter an email address and select **Done**.
- 6. Select Tap to add text.
- 7. Enter your email text and select **Done**.

- 8. Select **Attach multimedia** and attach a file (if necessary).
- 9. Select **Send** to send the message.

Enter text

With your phone's touch screen, you can enter text and create messages or notes.

When entering text, you can change the text input mode:

- Select T9 to switch between T9 and ABC modes.
 Depending on your region, you may be able to access an input mode for your specific language.
- Select **Abc** or **T9Ab** to change case or switch to Number mode.
- Select (a) to switch to Symbol mode.
- Select EN to change the input language.

You can use the following text input modes:

Mode	Function	
ABC	Select an appropriate virtual key until the character you want appears on the display.	
Т9	 Select appropriate virtual keys to enter an entire word. When the word displays correctly, select to insert a space. If the correct word does not display, select to select an alternate word. 	
Number	Select an appropriate virtual key to enter a number.	
Symbol	Select an appropriate virtual key to enter a symbol.	

View text or multimedia messages

- In Menu mode, select Messages → My messages → Inbox.
- 2. Select a text or multimedia message.

You can view all text or multimedia messages sent to and received from a specific contact like a messenger.

- In Menu mode, select Messages → Conversations.
- 2. Select a contact.

View an email

- In Menu mode, select Messages → My messages → Email inbox.
- 2. Select an account.
- 3. Select **Download**.

- 4. Select an email or a header.
- 5. If you selected a header, select **Retrieve** to view the body of the email.

Add and find contacts

Learn the basics of using the phonebook feature.



The memory location to save new contacts may be preset depending on your service provider. To change the memory location, in Menu mode, select **Phonebook** \rightarrow **More** \rightarrow **Settings** \rightarrow **Save new contacts to** \rightarrow a memory location.

Add a new contact

- In Idle mode, select **Keypad** and enter a phone number.
- 2. Select More → Add to Phonebook → New.
- 3. Select a number type (if necessary).

- 4. Enter contact information.
- 5. Select **Save** to add the contact to memory.

Find a contact

- 1. In Menu mode, select **Phonebook**.
- 2. Select Search.
- 3. Enter the first few letters of the name you want to find and select **Done**.
- 4. Select the contact's name from the search list.



Once you have found a contact, you can:

- call the contact by pressing [--]
- edit the contact information by selecting **Edit**.

Use basic camera functions

Learn the basics to capture and view photos and videos.

Capture photos

- 1. In Idle mode, press and hold [a] to turn on the camera.
- 2. Rotate the phone anti-clockwise to landscape view.
- 3. Aim the lens at the subject and make any adjustments.
 - To set the exposure value, select 2.
 - To zoom in or out, press the Volume key.
- 4. Press [6] to take a photo.

 The photo is saved automatically.
- 5. Press the Back key or [167] to take another photo (step 3).

After capturing photos, select to view photos. 30

View photos

In Menu mode, select My files \rightarrow Images \rightarrow My photos \rightarrow a photo file.

While viewing photos, select \bigcirc \rightarrow \bigcirc or \bigcirc to zoom in or out. Press the Back key to exit the zoom screen.

Capture videos
