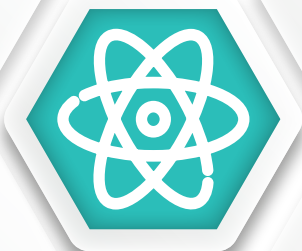

Portugal is located in the Iberian Peninsula (southwestern Europe), lying between Spain in the north and east and the Atlantic Ocean in the west and south. It also includes 2 archipelagos, Azores and Madeira, which provides Portugal of one of the biggest exclusive economic zone being the 4th largest in the EU and the 20th world wide. It's one of the oldest countries in Europe (since 1143) and is a part of the European Union since 1986. Portugal is also a great spot to travel in your holidays having become one of the tourist top choices lately.

The warm weather combined with amazing beaches, and of course great wine and beer combined with the affordable cost of living are just a few of the many reasons why you should think about joining us. You can also expect the warm welcome of the Portuguese people as well as a terrific cuisine! Have you ever tried codfish? Well not only is one of our most consumed fishes it actually merges with our culture, being one of the most important and even for many the traditional dish for Christmas Eve. Well such an important part of our culture deserves a special praise, that's why we have more than 1000 different ways to prepare cod, and also why our amazing Local BEST group have adopted this name to refer to our beloved members "the codfishes" (or in Portuguese "Bacalhaus"). Other Portuguese delicacies include "Cozido à Portuguesa" Oporto's "Francesinha" and Aveiro's "ovos moles".

Also known as Portuguese Venice, the city is full of canals, bridges, and painted boats called "moliceiros". These boats were used to remove the excess vegetation in the canals and to carry animals and goods. Nowadays they are a picturesque way to go sightseeing. Due to its proximity to the sea, Aveiro has relied on economic activities related to it, such as salt production, this being a major source of income for centuries, being able to produce enough to supply the entire country and even export. Unfortunately nowadays the production has decreased significantly.



Aveiro is also known for its characteristic buildings with Art Nouveau details, such as the use of tiles and curved lines. Some of these are located near the "Praça do Peixe" (fish square), known for its fish market. This square is a great spot for a night out due to the many bars around the market.

Among some other attractions of the city are the Cathedral of Aveiro, the Cultural and Congress Center (located in a beautiful defunct ceramics factory) and the Aveiro Museum. You can also enjoy a relaxing walk in one of the several beautiful parks spread around the city, or head to the beach, where you can find the tallest lighthouse in Portugal. You can also enjoy some of Aveiro's typical sweets such as "ovos moles" and "tripa".

University of Aveiro

Somewhere down the line you will be provided the opportunity of getting to know this amazing University. Funded in 1973 mostly with engineering courses, the university of Aveiro is a public university located in Aveiro that soon began to grow to be one of the major, most dynamic and innovative universities in Portugal. This institution counts with over 15000 students and over 1000 staff members, that work daily to improve the quality of the University.



Most of the buildings are located in the Santiago campus. Some of them were designed by a team of renowned Portuguese architects, such as Álvaro Siza Vieira, Vitor Figueiredo and Eduardo Souto Moura.

Things to bring

But check this list and make sure nothing is left behind:

- a) ID, passport** (with Visa, if required).
- b) Travel and health insurance.** You should bring your European Health Insurance Card, if you have one.
- c) Student Card.** This might be useful to get discounts on stuff.
- d) Notebook** for sessions.
- e) Money** for your personal expenses (souvenirs, shopping items, etc.).
- f) Medicines** (if needed).
- g) Casual clothes.** The weather at the time of the course is expected to be warm (25°C-30°C), but it is advisable to bring at least one sweater or light jacket, especially for the nights.
- h) Swimwear** and **sunscreen**.
- i)** One or two sets of **fancy attire** for some of the more formal events, such as the opening ceremony.
- j) Traditional food and drinks** from your country. These will be important for the International Evening. You can also cook your traditional meal here, as long as it doesn't take much time (1 hour at most). As for any ingredients you might want to buy here, send us an email (with photos!) so we can check whether those ingredients are available in Portugal. You are also encouraged to bring objects representative of your country, such as flags, instruments, hats and traditional costumes.

Getting to Aveiro

By Airplane

Mainland Portugal has three major airports: Francisco Sá Carneiro (Porto), Portela (Lisbon) and Faro Airport (Faro). Below you can find information on how to get to Aveiro from each one of these three airports.

Oporto

1. At the airport, follow the indications leading to the metro station called "Aeroporto".
2. Find a ticket machine and get a Z4 ticket (2,00 € + 0,60 € for the "Andante" card). Usually there are staff members nearby helping with the ticket machines.
3. Get on a line E metro headed towards the "Estádio do Dragão" station.
4. Get off the metro at the "Campanhã" station. The trip takes around 30 min.
5. Both the "Campanhã" and the "São Bento" metro stations are also train stations, so there you can buy a train ticket to Aveiro. There are several categories of trains, the cheapest one being the "Urbano" (an all yellow train), leaving Porto more or less once every hour. The ticket to Aveiro costs 3,55 € and the trip takes around 1 hour.

Keep in mind that you are coming **from Porto-Campanhã or Porto-São Bento** and going to **Aveiro** in the website!!



Getting to Aveiro

Lisbon

1. At the airport, get to the metro station called "Aeroporto".
2. Get a Carris/Metro ticket (1,45 €+0,50€ for the card "Viva Viagem").
3. Get on a "Linha Vermelha" (red line) metro headed towards the "S. Sebastião" station.
4. Get off the metro at the "Oriente" station. The trip takes around 10 min.
5. The "Oriente" metro station is also a train station, so there you can buy a train ticket to Aveiro. The cheapest option is the "Intercidades" train, costing 20,90 € (15,70 € for passengers under the age of 25, as long as you show your ID). As you buy the ticket, it might be a good idea to ask what the platform number of your train is, as it doesn't appear on the ticket (alternatively, you can check the information displays, but those are in Portuguese). The trip takes around 2h25min.

Keep in mind that you are coming **from Lisboa-Oriente** and going to **Aveiro** in the website!!

Tip: While from Oporto the tickets are always the same cost so you can buy it in the same day, from Lisbon they increase exponentially so try to book your ticket in advance, or at least the trip back from Aveiro to Lisbon.



Getting to Aveiro

Faro

1. At the airport, get to the bus stop. You're looking for the bus number 16.
2. Get on the bus and buy a ticket from the driver. It costs 2,22 €.
3. Get off the bus at the train station. The trip takes around 20 min.
4. Buy a train ticket to Aveiro. The cost is 38,70 € (29,10 € for passengers under the age of 25, as long as you show your ID) and the trip takes around 6h10min. As you buy the ticket, it might be a good idea to ask what the platform number of your train is, as it doesn't appear on the ticket (alternatively, you can check the information displays, but those are in Portuguese).

Tip: While from Oporto the tickets are always the same cost so you can buy it in the same day, from Faro they increase exponentially so try to book your ticket in advance, or at least the trip back from Aveiro to Faro.

By Train

If you're coming by train the most likely scenario is that you're arriving in Porto-Campanha or in Lisbon-Oriente. In that case you just need to buy the train ticket to Aveiro there.

Arrival by Bus

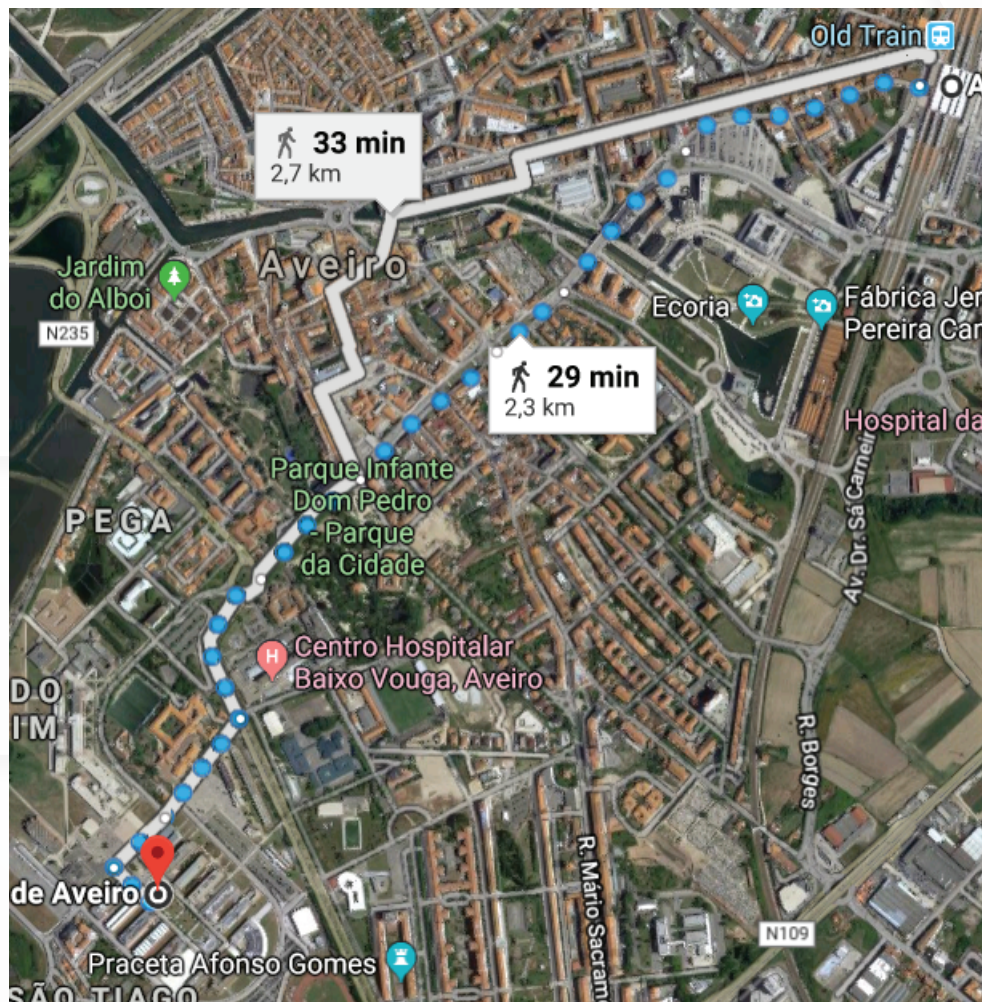

Additional Information

Timezone

At the date of the event the timezone is Western European Summer Time (UTC+1).

Weather

August and September are some of the warmest months in Aveiro, but due to the city's proximity to the ocean the temperatures rarely get higher than 30°C. Another characteristic of Aveiro's weather is that it can be quite windy and the nights are relatively cold.

Electricity

The electric current used throughout Portugal is the European standard 220-240 V, A.C. 50Hz. The sockets are two-pin, and adapters may be bought at most electrical stores.

Money

The currency in Portugal is the single currency of European Union, the Euro. The banks are open from 8:30 to 15:00 (or until 15:30, in some cases), and since we are the country that invented the interbanking system "Multibanco", there are ATMs almost everywhere. However, it's always better to have some cash on you (10€ or so), given that some of the party locations may not have ATMs nearby. It's always a good idea to bring 2 bank cards, in case something happens to one of them.
