


Mission Santa Barbara Instructions

Parts Drawing



• Before starting assembly, read through each step of the instructions and carefully study each photo. As you put the model together, it is a good idea to "test" fit the pieces together before using any glue.

• Spread out newspaper across the table or desk that you are working on. This will help to protect your work surface.

• Use scissors to trim any pieces where needed. PARENTAL SUPERVISION is recommended.

• Identify each piece of the model by matching it with the parts drawing above.

• Assemble the model with standard white glue. It is a good idea to hold the pieces together with toothpicks until the glue is dry. Once the glue is dry, twist the toothpick and carefully pull it out.

• Use a small brush, flat stick, or your finger to spread glue evenly on the surface.



• Do not glue any of the pieces to the base until after Step 10 is completed.

Note: The missions can either be assembled on the cardboard sheet (included) or on a sheet of foam (not included).


ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS

1. Place the 24" x 15" cardboard or foam base on a clean, flat surface.



2. Apply glue along the front edges of #2 and #3 and place them against #1 as shown below. Make sure the edges meet evenly. Note the position of the doors and windows.




3. Apply glue on the rear edges of side #2 and side #3. Put #4 in place and line up the edges so they are even.



4. Glue both #5 pieces to #6 as shown below. Glue them into place, making sure that all of the edges meet evenly. Apply glue to both #5 pieces and glue in place as shown. This section will be called the "main building."




5. Locate pieces #7 (there are four of them) and both #8 pieces. Glue them together as shown below. Make sure all edges meet evenly.





Glue both assemblies to piece #9 as shown. The wall will stick out on the left side when facing the model. This will be called the "bell tower assembly."




6. Glue both #10 pieces to the bell tower assembly as shown below.




7. Locate pieces #11 and #12. There are four of each. Glue them together as shown below and then glue them in place on top of the bell tower assembly.




8. Locate all four pieces of #13. Glue them together as shown below and glue them in place atop the towers.



9. Glue #14 onto the bell tower assembly as close to center as possible.




10. Glue #15 into place as shown below.



11. Now that the two basic sections of the mission are complete, the main building can be glued to the base. Glue the main building in place so that there is about 6" from the front of the base to the front door. The left side of the main building should be about 5" from the edge of the base. This will leave you enough room to create scenery for your model.


Glue the bell tower assembly into place, making sure that the doorways on the main building and bell tower assembly are even.



12. Locate both pieces of #16 roofing material. This is the roof of the main building. You will need to cut a small portion of the roof so that the bell tower assembly will fit tightly. Put the roof in place and make a mark where the bell tower meets the roof. Using scissors, just cut about 1/4" of away between the mark and the front edge of the roof as shown below. Make sure that the piece fits properly before gluing it into place.

Repeat this step for the other piece of roofing. Apply glue along the top edges of the main building and put the roof pieces in place.

Run a bead of glue along the joint where the 2 roof pieces meet.



13. Glue piece #17 roofing material into place as shown.



FINISHING

• When you paint your model, use only water-based paints.

• Check with your favorite hobby dealer for accessories such as grass, shrubbery, grave markers, action figures...etc. that will add realism to your model.
