RESTAURANT RAVES

Downtown's Red Ash Italia is known for its creative take on wood-fired Italian classics, while fans of L'oca d'Oro in Mueller clamor for the housemade pastas.

Colorful and airy **Grizzelda's** transports diners to Mexico with its authentic dishes, while Old Thousand serves creative Chinese fare and cocktails in a cool vintage space.

Situated in the former Seaholm Power Plant, the industrial-chic Boiler Nine Bar + Grill offers ember-roasted fare and cocktails on three levels, including a rooftop and sultry subterranean lounge. It's located in the new Seaholm neighborhood, a hidden oasis along Lady Bird Lake that's home to some of the buzziest new restaurants and shops in Austin.

Butter coffees and bone broths top the innovative, healthy menu at Picnik in North Austin. The food hall craze hits Austin with Fareground at One Eleven Congress Plaza downtown, Look for delectable bites from Antonelli's Cheese Shop, Contigo Fareground and Dai Due Taqueria.

DRINK SPOTS

Inspired by NYC punk venues, Moloko is a self-described "dive cocktail bar" located in trendy East Austin. In a swanky lounge with a large dance floor **Sellers Underground** mixes craft cocktails named for 1970s films.

Modeled after Belgium's most revered pubs, Mort Subite offers an expansive menu of Trappist beers and Belgian spirits. A culinary brewery, The Brewer's **Table** features beer aged in oak barrels and food prepared on a wood-fired grill.



Fleet Coffee offers small-batch coffee with experimental concoctions like the Cinnamon Toast Crunch-infused milk and espresso. Stonehouse Coffee + Bar serves Cuvee Coffee and pastries during the day, and craft beer and wine after dark.

SHOPPING & ENTERTAINMENT

Domain NORTHSIDE is an upscale shopping destination in North Austin with stores that include Nordstrom and local brands, along with the boutique



Archer Hotel Austin and the Rock Rose district, which rivals downtown for entertainment and dining options.

Grab your board and head to **NLand** surf park, where you can hit the waves then dine on farm-fresh fare at Blue Prairie, overlooking the water.

St. Elmo Public Market, a new mixeduse development set to open in South Austin in early 2018, will house creative workspaces, a live music venue and a hotel.

ARTS & MUSIC

The Contemporary Austin has reopened at the Jones Center on Congress Avenue, with 7,000 more square feet of installation space. Free family artmaking workshops are offered each month during Second Saturdays.

Located downstairs from ACL Live, **3TEN** is a 350-seat listening room that presents smaller "house" shows.

The **Texas Biennial** (from the team that hosts East Austin and West Austin Studio Tours) returns to Austin in fall 2017, with some 250 Texas artists exhibiting contemporary works.

e like to do things differently in Austin, and our LGBTO scene is no exception. Curran Nault, University of Texas at Austin professor and artistic director of OUTsider Fest, discovered that when he moved here from San Francisco. There's not really a gayborhood vibe. "It's different in that there's a crossover in interests. People flock to what they're excited about regardless of orientation," notes Nault.

He also found a unique kind of creative energy in Austin, buoyed by the relatively low cost of living. "People were doing risky weird stuff because they could afford to. I wanted to tap into that." Armed with an understanding of both the LGBTQ and artistic communities, he and a group of friends

hatched OUTsider Fest as a nexus for art, academia and a celebration of the LGBTO community.

In the past four years, it seems to have accomplished some lofty goals—breaking down barriers between artist groups, fostering some fantastic collaborations and creating something with permanency.

Wherever you fall on the spectrum, you can follow your artistic dreams in Austin. Find contemporary art at the Jones Center and sculpture at Umlauf Sculpture Garden. Enjoy performances at ZACH Theatre or experimental theaters like The Vortex. Spend a day touring the Blanton Museum of Art's exhibits or make a quick stop at the Austin Art Garage.

he Red River Cultural District has long been one of the top spots to find live music in Austin. "Red River is important to Austin's music scene because you can walk from door to door and find something amazing and discoverable. The venues are the right size and the right cluster to provide for venue-hopping," notes local live music expert and fan Maggie Lea.

Maggie and Tamara Hoover co-own Cheer Up Charlies, a cocktail bar and live music venue which relocated to Red River in 2014. On a street already packed with excellent live venues (like the **Mohawk** and **Stubb's**), they brought a fresh vibe. Their goal was, and is, to create "an everybody space—a playful, comfortable yet outspoken space for live music, local gatherings, LGBTQ events, literary and storytelling events, and weekend dance parties."

Like the rest of Austin, the area isn't immune to development. But that doesn't keep local venues from rocking every night, whether your tastes run from punk to country, rock, goth, funk, EDM or just a good old-fashioned get down. If you're visiting the area, kick off your stay with a local beer at Cheer Up Charlies, and spend a night reveling in the wide diversity of music and people.

OUTDOOR ADVENTURES

Hiking, biking, standup paddleboarding, swimming, bat watching (yes, you read that right)—no matter your bliss, you really can choose your own outdoor adventure in Austin. ou don't have to venture far to enjoy nature in Austin, whether you're looking to walk a few minutes to your next adventure or take a short drive to nearby Texas Hill Country.

DOWNTOWN

Get outdoors in the heart of downtown at **Zilker Park**, a 351-acre oasis of lush grass, colorful botanicals, quiet picnic areas, outdoor music concerts and gorgeous waterfront views of Lady Bird Lake. Soak in the sunshine at the park's famous **Barton Springs Pool**, where you can jump into the spring-fed waters or kick back on the grassy hillside.

If you're looking to get active *on* the water, rent a stand-up paddleboard from **SUP ATX** at the Texas Rowing Center to paddle Lady Bird Lake. Or explore downtown's waterfront on a guided kayak tour with **Live Love Paddle**.

Runners and bikers will love the 10mile **Ann and Roy Butler Hike-and-Bike Trail** at Lady Bird Lake, which passes over shimmering waters and offers panoramic views of Austin's skyline.

Once the sun begins to set, get a good spot on **Congress Avenue Bridge** to watch an incredible phenomenon—
1.5 million Mexican free-tailed bats fluttering into the night sky from beneath the bridge—which occurs nightly from March to October.

EASY DAY TRIPS

In nearby Dripping Springs, escape to **Hamilton Pool Preserve**, a natural pool and waterfall encircled by a stalactite-studded grotto (reservations required in peak months).

Or take to the skies at **Lake Travis Zip Line Adventures** in Leander, where you'll boat across Lake Travis and then soar above the tree canopy on five zip lines.

At **Colorado Bend State Park** in Bend, bring your mountain bike to kick up dirt on 35 miles of multi-use trails, or rent a kayak to shoot the rapids.



oy Seiders and his brother and co-founder Ryan grew up in the Hill Country just west of Austin. They always had a passion for the outdoors, and in 2006 they set out to design a cooler that was "built for the wild." In doing so, they tapped into something remarkable. In the last decade, YETI coolers have become the symbol for Austin's serious obsession with the outdoors.

"Yeti is all about the enjoyment and passion of outdoor pursuits. Given the vibrant community here, Austin was a natural fit when it came time to put down roots and build a business," Roy espouses. "Austinites are incredibly fortunate in that we have easy and affordable access to some outstanding outdoor venues, many of which are smackdab in the middle of our city. And our weather allows people access virtually year-round. It is a huge contributor to the high quality of life in this town."

If you're new to town or just visiting, Roy suggests swimming at Barton Springs or Deep Eddy
Pool, jogging the hike-and-bike trail around Lady Bird Lake and the Barton Creek Greenbelt, climbing Mt. Bonnell for the views, and of course, stopping in at the YETI flagship store (located at South Congress and Barton Springs Road) after watching the Congress Avenue Bridge bats for a frosty beverage.

Lakana & Justin Trubiana, Co-Owners of Dee Dee Northern Thai Street Food ver the past 10 years, Austin's food scene has evolved tremendously, landing us on numerous lists of great food cities. Much of that evolution is due to our food truck culture. The opportunity to test the waters with a smaller format endeavor has changed the restaurant game, especially in the realm of multicultural offerings.

Lakana Sopajan Trubiana and her husband Justin, owners of Dee Dee Northern Thai Street Food, have experienced the change first-hand. "There's always something new just around the corner that you've never had before. The food truck scene lets people dream and experiment. Austin is lucky in that way," she observes.

Lakana is from northern
Thailand, where she helped
her family plant vegetables and
prepare food. She now serves
that style of food—Isaan—at
her food truck on Cesar
Chavez. "We couldn't think of
a better place to start this
business," Lakana says. "It
reminds us a little bit of street
food markets that can be
found all across Thailand."

As for her culinary exploration, Lakana finds herself pairing

la Barbecue's supermoist brisket with Dee Dee's own green papaya salad, a Texas twist on a traditional Thai dish. She and husband Justin also stop by Paperboy on East 11th Street, or finish up their long days with Pastor or Barbacoa street tacos at Las Trancas.

Austin's history is the story of Texas itself.
Delve into these storied roots with a visit to some of the town's many museums and historic sites that let you experience Austin's fascinating past.



et an insider's look at the history and culture of Texas at the **Bullock Museum**, which features fun interactive exhibits and an IMAX Theatre.

Make a stop at the **Texas Capitol Visitors Center**, housed in the
1857 General Land Office
Building, and sign up for a free
tour of the **Texas State Capitol**.

Spend the afternoon at the University of Texas at Austin, home to impressive museums that include the Blanton Museum of Art, the natural history-focused Texas Memorial Museum, and the LBJ Presidential Library, with inspiring exhibits on President Lyndon B. Johnson and his beloved wife, Lady Bird.

Celebrate African-American heritage at the **George Washington Carver Museum and Cultural Center** through exhibits, programs and theatrical productions.

Join a guided tour of the Creolestyle **French Legation Museum**, downtown Austin's oldest wooden building, which is surrounded by a lush park. Experience the everyday lives of some of Austin's earliest residents at the antebellum **Neill-Cochran House Museum.** built in 1855.

Tour the trio of free **Brush Square Museums**, including the stone home of Susanna Dickinson (the only Anglo adult survivor of the Battle of the Alamo); the Victorianstyle residence of writer O. Henry; and the Austin Fire Museum, housed in the still-active Fire Station #1.

See the final resting place of many Texas notables (including politicians and high-profile citizens) at the **Texas State Cemetery**, founded in 1851.

Stroll along Congress Avenue, built as a ceremonial boulevard in 1839. Some of the notable buildings here include the Old Bakery & Emporium (now housing an art gallery), the century-old Paramount Theatre (a performance venue and movie theater), the ornate Walter Tips Building, the Scarbrough Building (Austin's original office tower) and the Littlefield Building (one of Austin's first skyscrapers).
