

RFN SelectComm-MRB User's Guide

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1 About the RFN SelectComm-MRB

The RFN SelectComm-MRB is a radio communications device designed for use in Cooper Power System's EkaNet RF mesh networks. It has no sensor or meter directly associated with it, and can be used in a variety of applications to extend the range and reliability of the RF mesh network. It is designed to be used in Cooper's LCR, Relay, Gateway, Energy Harvesting Relay, and Field Tool products. The RFN SelectComm-MRB provides a 915 MHz radio interface.

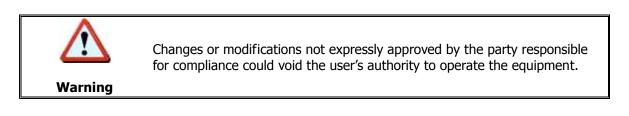
The RFN SelectComm-MRB operates from a DC power source of either 12 VDC or 5 VDC, received from the host device. The radio modules operate in license-free bands at 915 MHz (902.75 to 927.25 MHz). RFN SelectComm-MRB Nodes are fully compatible with mesh network hardware, protocols and operations. Two radio transmission data rates are available: 76.8 kb/s and153.6 kb/s. The transmission power of the 915 MHz radio is adjustable from 30 dBm to -20 dBm.

2 Regulatory Notices

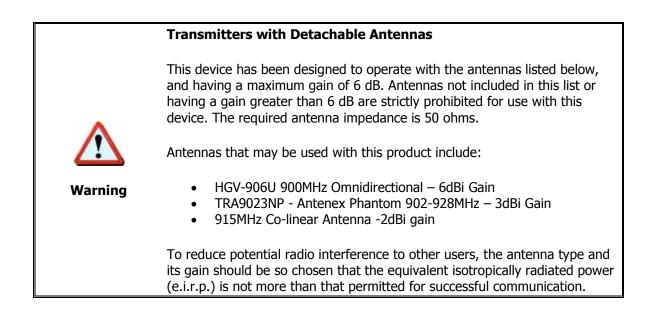

Warning	As such, the radio component of this device is intended only for OEM integrators under the following two conditions:
	The antenna must be installed such that 20 cm is maintained between the antenna and users.
	The transmitter module may not be co-located with any other transmitter or antenna.
	As long as the two conditions above are met, further transmitter testing will not be required. However, the OEM integrator is still responsible for testing their end product for any additional compliance requirements required with this module installed (e.g., digital device emissions, PC peripheral requirements).
	In the event that these conditions cannot be met (for example, co-location with another transmitter), then the FCC authorization is no longer considered valid and the FCC ID cannot be used on the final product. In these circumstances, the OEM integrator will be responsible for re- evaluating the end product (including the transmitter) and obtaining a separate FCC authorization.
	End Product Labeling
	This transmitter module is authorized only for use in devices where the antenna may be installed such that 20 cm may be maintained between the antenna and users (for example access points, routers, wireless ASDL modems, certain laptop configurations, and similar equipment). The final end product must be labeled in a visible area with the following: "Contains FCC ID: P9X-RFNSCOMMMRB, IC: 6766A-RFNSCOMMMRB".
	The radio component is an integral part of the RFN SelectComm- MRB and cannot be removed.
