GETTING STARTED

SPEAKER CONNECTION

- Connect the left and right speakers to the Speaker Terminals with the RED wire s to Red terminals and the BLACK wires to Black terminals.
- 2. For better stereo effect move the two speakers away from the main unit.






- 1. This mirco System operates on AC120V/60Hz line power supply.
- The remote control unit operates on 1 pc "CR 2025" lithium battery (included). To power up the remote control, remove the insulation tab from the back of unit.



Connect the power cord to an AC120V/60Hz power source.

REPLACING BATTERY FOR THE REMOTE CONTROL

- 1. Turn over the remote control, and remove the battery door.
- 2. Install 1 pc "CR2025" lithium battery according to the polarity diagram on the battery compartment.
- 3. Replace the battery door.





SETTING THE CLOCK

NOTE: The clock has to be set the first time you use the unit. If the unit is disconnected from the AC power for more than I minute, you need to re-adjust the clock.

TO SET THE CURRENT TIME

For example to set the clock at 7:30 AM

1. In STANDBY Mode, press MEMORY button once. Hour digits flash.






Note: If no button is pressed in 8 seconds, the unit will exit the setting mode.

2. Press the or button to adjust the hour.







Note: Make sure the hour is set AM or PM correctly.

3. Press MEMORY button to confirm the selection and the minute digits flash.





4. Press the or button to adjust the minutes.





5. Press MEMORY button again to complete setting.







Press the STAND BY button to turn on the unit, then press VOLUME +/- button to adjust the sound to comfortable level. The volume level will show on display for a few seconds.







To temporarily shut off the sound from the speakers press the MUTE button. The display will cycle between the current function indication (radio frequency or CD elapsed time) and "VOL 0" to indicate that the system is in the Mute mode.

Press the MUTE button again the cancel Mute mode and restore the sound from the speakers.





USING HEADPHONES (Headphones Not Included)

Connect a set of stereo headphones with 3.5mm mini plug to the headphone jack on the front panel. The speakers are automatically shut off when headphones are in use.



Note: to establish a safe headphones sound level:

Start your volume control at a low setting.

Slowly increase the sound until you can hear it comfortably and clearly, and without distortion.

The sound equalization can be adjusted for optimum sound reproduction depending on the style of music you are playing. By pressing the EQ button, you can switch between Flat, ROCK, JAZZ, POP or CLASSIC.






COMPACT DISC OPERATION

PLAYING A CD

1. Press the CD Button to select the CD function.








- 3. Place the CD with label side up inside the CD compartment. Press the OPEN/CLOSE button again to close the CD door.
- 4. After a few seconds, the total number of tracks and total playing time will appear in the Multi function Display.





Press the ►II button to start playing the CD.






6. You can key in directly the track number you wish to play by pressing the number key on remote control.For example to play track #12:Press "+10" Button followed by "2" Button track #12 will start play back automatically.

Note:

PAUSE MODE

To pause temporarily during CD playback press the PLAY/PAUSE ►II button again. The sound stops but the disc continues to spin. The elapsed time display flashes indicating that the system is in the Pause mode. Press the PLAY/PAUSE ►II button once more to cancel Pause mode and resume playback at exactly the same point on the disc.

REPEAT PLAYBACK

Use the Repeat feature to repeat either a single track or all tracks continuously.



Single Track Repeat

Press the ►► or ►► buttons to select the desired track, then press the REPEAT button once. The "REP" indicator flashes and the selected track will be repeated continuously.

All Tracks Repeat

Press the REPEAT button twice. The "REP" indicator remains 'on'. Press the PLAY/PAUSE ▶II button to begin playback. The entire disc will be repeated continuously.

To Cancel Repeat Playback

Press the REPEAT button until the Repeat indicator disappears. Repeat will also be canceled when the CD door is opened, the Tuner function is selected, or the power is switched 'off'.

RANDOM PLAYBACK

The Random feature allows you to play the tracks on a disc in random order. You can select Random Playback while the disc is stopped or while the disc is playing.

If the disc is stopped, press the RANDOM button followed by the PLAY/PAUSE ►II button. The RANDOM indicator appears and all the tracks on the disc will be played in random order. If the disc is playing, just press the RANDOM button. The RANDOM indicator appears. When the current playing track ends random playback will begin.

To cancel Random Playback and resume normal playback, press the RANDOM button again. The RANDOM indicator goes 'off'. Random playback is also canceled by pressing the STOP ■ button.

DISC ERROR

Note: If the disc is dirty, damaged or unreadable, or if the disc is inserted upside down, the "DISC" indicator will appear in the display. If this occurs, clean the disc, insert the disc correctly, or try another disc.



PROGRAMMING CD TRACKS

With this function you can program up to16 titles in the order you desire. **Note**: Programming can only be done when the player is in stop mode.

1. Press MEMORY Button to start programming the tracks. "MEMORY" and Pr. © appears in the display.

Select the desired track by pressing the CD skip buttons I◄◄ / ▶►I
or use the remote control to key in directly the track number
you want to program. The selected track blinks.





 Press the MEMORYButton again to enter the selected track in program memory #1. The program number advances to Pr □2













- 4. Repeat steps 2&3 to program additional tracks 16 tracks can be memorized.
- 5. Press ▶■ PLAY/PAUSE button to start playing the tracks in your programmed order.
- 6. To clear the programmed tracks, press STOP button at stop mode.

LISTENING TO RADIO

RADIO TUNING

1. Press the TUNER/BAND button to select TUNER function, press again to change bands.



2. Tune to the desired station as follows:

Automatic Tuning - Depress the <a> or >> buttons for at least one second until the display begins to move, then release the buttons. The tuner will scan up or down and then stop on the next strong station. Repeat this procedure until the display shows the frequency of your desired station.

Manual Tuning - Repeatedly press ► or ► buttons until the display shows the frequency of your desired station. Use Manual Tuning to select weaker stations that are bypassed by Automatic Tuning.

Note: The "FM ST" indicator will appear in the display if you tune to an FM Stereo broadcast. If FM Stereo reception is noisy or weak you may press the ST/MONO button on the remote control to switch to the FM Mono mode. Reception will usually improve but the sound will not longer be in stereo.







- 3. Adjust the VOLUME and EQ controls as desired.
- 4. When you are finished listening press the STAND BY button to return the system to the Standby (Power Off) mode.

FOR BETTER RECEPTION





Fully unwind the wire antenna. Then extend the wire antenna and place it the position that sounds best.



Rotate the unit from side to side.

TO PRESET CHANNELS

This unit is equipped with 12 preset memories for AM and 20 preset memories for FM. Once they are preset, they can be instantly accessed by pressing the appropriate number keys on the remote control.


1. Press the TUNER/BAND button to operate the unit in the radio mode and select the band.








4. While the channel indicator is blinking, press the MEMO UP/PRESET button to select the desired preset channel. EXAMPLE: CHANNEL 01.







5. Press the MEMORY Button again to enter your station in memory channel 1.






6. Tune to another station and repeat steps 3 to 5 to store the station in another preset channel.

Note: Your can also store stations in the preset memories by using the numeric buttons on the remote control instead of the buttons on the front panel.

RECALLING PRESET STATIONS

1. Press the TUNER/BAND button to operate the unit in the radio mode and desired band.







AUX OPERATION

To listen to the sound from a stereo TV, stereo VCR, or DVD player through the speakers of this system, connect the left/right Audio Out jacks of the external device to the left/right AUX IN jacks on the back of this system. Connection cables are not included.

Press the AUX button on the front panel or the remote control to select the Aux function. The "LINE" indicator appears in the display. Operate your external device as usual. When you hear the sound from the external device, adjust the VOLUME and EQ controls of this system as desired.

Note: It is not necessary to disconnect the external device when you are finished listening. You may leave the external device connected to the AUX IN jacks and select the external device by pressing the AUX button whenever you wish.



DISPLAY MODE FUNCTION

Repeatedly pressing this button cycles the display through various modes as follows: In Standby (Power Off) Mode - Current Time > Timer On Time > Timer Off Time > Current Time, etc. In Tuner Mode - Station Frequency > Current Time > Timer On Time > Timer Off Time > Station Frequency, etc.

In CD Play Mode - Elapsed Time of The Current Track > Remaining Time Till The End Of The Disc > Current Time > Timer On Time > Timer Off Time > Elapsed Time Of The Current Track, etc.



MISCELLANEOUS OPERATIONS

The following functions are accessible on the remote control.

SLEEP OPERATION

When the unit is ON, press the SLEEP button. The display shows 10 minutes of playing time momentarily and then returns to the current function mode. The unit will automatically turn off after 10 minutes.



- 1. When the unit is "On", press the sleep button repeatedly until the desired sleep period is reached. The time increases in increments of 10 minutes and can be set from 10 minutes up to 90 minutes.
- 2. The unit will automatically turn off after the set time has elapsed.
- 3. To cancel the Sleep operation, press the SLEEP button repeatedly and release when "00" is displayed or simply switch the unit to standby and turn on again.

TIMER OPERATION

The unit can be set to turn on and off at predetermined times in any function mode. To set the on/ off times proceed as follows:

SETTING TIMER ON


The following procedure shows the setting of TIMER to on at 7:30 AM and to off at 8:15 AM (in CD mode).

 Press MODE Button repeatedly until the TIMER ON setting indlcator " ON " flashes in the display.





2. Press the MEMORY button. The Hour digits flash.





3. Press the or ▶ buttons to adjust the hour. Observe the AM / PM indicators.






4. Press MEMORY Button to confirm the hour setting. The minute digits flash.






5. Press the or ▶ buttons to adjust the minutes.









7. Press MODE button repeatedly until the display returns to the current function mode. The "ON" indicator will remain on the display.








1. Press MODE Button repeatedly until the TIMER OFF setting indicator " OFF" flashes in the display.








2. Press the MEMORY button. The Hour digits flash.










 Press MEMORY button to confirm hour setting. The minute digits flash.









6. Press the MEMORY Button to complete setting. TIMER OFF time is displayed with icon flashing.



Note: If no button is pressed within 5 seconds after pressing the mode button the unit will exit the setting mode.

7. Press MODE button again. CD information and icon " ON OFF" are displayed.



8. Press STAND BY button to turn off the unit. It will turn on automatically at the timer on time, and will turn off automatically as well at the timer off time. The current time and TIMER ON/OFF indicator will appear on the display.





SNOOZE FUNCTION

If the unit has switched itself on by means of the timer function, press the SNOOZE on the remote control switch the unit to Standby mode for approximately 5 minutes. The current time, TIMER ON/OFF and SNOOZE indicator will appear on the display. After this time the unit switches on again. Press SNOOZE again for another 5 minutes or switch the unit off with ON/STAND BY






CLEARING TIMER ON SETTING

1. To clear the TIMER ON setting, press MODE button repeatedly until icon "ON" appear in the display left top corner with "O" flashing.









3. Press MODE Button twice. TIMER ON setting indicator "ON" disappears and display shows icon " ② OFF"._____



CLEARING TIMER OFF SETTING

4. Press MODE button repeatedly until icon " ④ **OFF**" appear in the display left top corner with " ④ " flashing.



5. Press TIMER Button once to enter TIMER OFF setting mode. TIMER OFF setting indicator " 4 OFF" flashes.




6. Press MODE Button once. TIMER OFF setting indicator " OFF" disappears.





RESET BUTTON

If your system is subject to a sudden power surge the internal computer may lock up or freeze to prevent permanent damage to the system. If you find that the system will not respond to any commands from the front panel controls or the remote handset, lift the front of the system upward. The RESET button is located inside a small hole on the upper right corner of the bottom panel. Use a toothpick, a straightened paper clip, or similar device to depress the RESET button for at least 1 second. The internal computer will reset itself and the system will return to the Standby (Power Off) mode. Note: Pressing the RESET button will reset the internal computer to the factory default settings and all timer and preset station memories will be erased. It will be necessary to reprogram the station memories and the timer settings once again.



CARE AND MAINTENANCE


COMPACT DISC CARE






- To remove a disc from its storage case, press down on the center of the case and lift the disc out, holding it carefully by the edges. Discs should be stored in their cases after use to avoid scratches.
- Handle the disc only by its edges. Never allow your fingers to come in contact with the shiny, unprinted side of the disc.
- Do not attach any tape, stickers, etc and or write anything on either side of the disc.
- Clean the disc periodically with a soft, lint-free, dry cloth. Never use detergents or abrasive cleaners to clean the disc. If necessary, use a CD cleaning kit.







 When cleaning the disc, wipe in straight lines from the center of the disc to the outer edge of the disc. Never wipe in circular motions.



Note: Always press the STOP button and wait for the disc stop rotating before opening the CD door to remove the disc.


- If there is a scratch, dirt or fingerprint on the CD, it may cause tracking error. Before playing, clean the CD with a cleaning cloth. Wipe the CD from the center out. Don't store discs in places with high temperatures or high humidity – they can become warped. After playing, store the CD in its case.






CLEANING THE LENS

A dirty lens will cause sound skipping. If the lens is very dirty, the player may not work. We suggest using a special cleaning disk(not included) available in most music and Hi-Fi stores. However, if you do not have one, you may use a cotton swab very slightly dampened with alcohol to clean the lens.



CLEANING THE UNIT

- To prevent fire or shock hazard, disconnect your unit from the AC power source when cleaning.
- If the cabinet become dusty wipe it with a soft cloth. Do not use any wax or polish sprays on the cabinet.
- If the cabinet becomes dirty or smudged with fingerprints it may be cleaned with a soft cloth slightly dampened with a mild soap and water solution. Never use abrasive cloths or polishes as these will mar the finish of your unit.
