### Safety instructions

### **Safety instructions**

Perfect technology: Prerequisite for your safety High-quality materials and excellent workmanship ensure that Porsche Classic Communication Management has a long service life. Porsche Classic Communication Management needs your attention and care to fulfil its potential. This will ensure that Porsche Classic Communication Management can be relied upon even in critical situations.

Porsche Classic Communication Management is the central control unit for the radio, media functions, iPod, external audio sources, sound settings, navigation and BT telephony.

The following points must be observed to ensure that you do not endanger or harm yourself or others when using Porsche Classic Communication Management:

#### **MARNUNG**

Risk of accident

Any distraction may cause control of the vehicle to be lost.

Only operate Porsche Classic Communication Management when the vehicle is safely under control and the traffic situation permits. If in doubt, stop the vehicle and operate Porsche Classic Communication whilst stationary.

#### **A** WARNUNG

Risk of accident

The navigation system only provides the driver with support and suggests a route.

This does not release the driver from the full responsibility for correct driving style and behaviour in road traffic in accordance with the rules of the German Road Traffic Regulations (StVO) and other relevant regulations. The driver is responsible for assessing the traffic situation. The driver retains sole responsibility for driving the vehicle safely.

Remain aware of the traffic situation.

#### **▲** WARNUNG

Risk of injury

Risk of injury. Do not use the telephone close to explosive substances (e.g. at a petrol station) or close to explosives.

In certain hazardous areas, such as close to petrol stations, fuel depots, chemical plants and blasting operations, mobile phones must be switched off. Their use could interfere with technical equipment.

- Observe relevant instructions.
- ► Observe legal regulations and local restrictions when using the telephone.

#### **HINWEIS**

Risk of damage

The Porsche Classic Communication Management contains high-quality electronic components whose maintenance and care requires special attention.

#### The following points should be observed:

- The screen is susceptible to scratches.
- The device must not be splashed with liquids.
  The ingress of liquids may destroy the device.
- Clean your Porsche Classic Communication Management carefully from time to time with a dry, clean and soft cloth (microfibre cloth) or a cleaning brush.
- Do not exert excessive pressure on the surface when cleaning.
- Never use solvents such as methylated spirits, thinners, petrol, acetone or alcohol (ethanol, methanol or isopropyl alcohol) or abrasives.
- Remove fingerprints with a damp cloth or mild detergent.
- Never spray detergents or other liquids directly onto the screen. Instead, moisten a cloth and gently wipe the screen.
- ► In the event of a malfunction never open the Porsche Classic Communication Management device yourself! In the event of a fault have the device repaired at a qualified specialist workshop.

We recommend that a Porsche Partner is used for this work as they have trained workshop personnel and the necessary parts and tools.

Use the **PHONE** button to switch to Bluetooth®-hands-free mode.

Use the BACK button to return to the previous menu step.

#### G Left knob ■

- Press and hold the left knob → to switch the device on and off.
- Turn the left knob ( ) to adjust the volume of the active audio source
- Press the left knob briefly to → activate or deactivate the mute function
- Press the left knob briefly to → briefly to cancel an incoming announcement (TA).
- H Besides the touchscreen the right-hand knobe is the central control element:
  - Turn the knob ( ) to highlight the desired menu item.
  - Press → to select a highlighted menu item.
  - Turn (•) to change the value of some of the settings (such as the fader).
  - Press and hold the left knob → to activate Apple/Android speech recognition.
- Skip left/Skip right
- Press the skip buttons 
   to highlight the next/previous station or track.
- Press the skip buttons to highlight the desired menu item.
- J Touchscreen display
  In addition to the right-hand knob the
  touchscreen is also a central control element.
  Any menu item can be selected directly from the

- K Microphone The built-in microphone is used to make a telephone call with the Bluetooth® hands-free kit.
- L Sensor for switching between day/night settings The day/night sensor enables the device to detect the current ambient lighting level and adjust the display brightness accordingly.

- > Aux-In: 3.5 mm jack connection for external media sources.

We recommend installing the Mediabox in the glove compartment or centre console.

#### **HOME** screen

### **Operating PCCM/PCCM Plus**

#### **Basic functions**

### Switching Porsche Classic Communication Management on and off

#### Switching on/off via the ignition

Switch on the ignition. Porsche Classic Communication Management is active.

#### Switching on/off via the left-hand knob

If you do not wish the Porsche Classic Communication Management to be permanently active, you can also switch it on/off using the left-hand knob.

▶ Press the left knob→● for at least one second.

#### Adjusting the volume

- ► Turn the left knob ( ). Depending on situation, you can change the volume as follows
  - the active audio source,
  - a traffic announcement.
  - an announcement by the navigation,
  - the telephone ringing tone during an incoming call
  - making a hands free telephone call.

#### Mute

Mute audio source:

 Briefly press the left knob - The active audio source is muted

#### **Cancel muting**

➤ To cancel muting briefly → press or turn the left knob (●).



#### Information

Muting is also used to cancel incoming traffic announcements (TA)

#### Selecting the operating mode

The various Porsche Classic Communication Management modes are selected by pressing the HOME; TUNER; MEDIA; PHONE and NAV buttons.

### Menu types and operation options

The Porsche Classic Communication Management screen is a colour touch screen. All of the menu functions, list entries and input menus, as well as the arrow symbols and scroll bars are operated by lightly touching the respective part of the screen.

#### Which menus are available?

#### The HOME Menu

The functional range of Porsche Classic Communication Management is divided into the following main menus via the HOME menu:

- TUNER (button in the HOME menu or the button): Radio main menu,
- MEDIA (button in the HOME menu or the button): Media main menu,
- PHONE (button in the HOME menu or the button):: Telephone, main menu
- NAV (button in the HOME menu or the button): Navigation main menu,
- Map (button in the HOME menu): Calendar configuration,
- Sound (button in the HOME menu): Sound settings.
- Settings (button in the HOME menu): General device settings.

In many of these main menus various sub menus are combined to form a single topic.

#### Jump back to the HOME menu

Press the HOME key to return to the HOME-Menu.

#### **Options menus**

# Calling up and operating menu types Call up main menus

► To call up a main menu, press the corresponding key on the Porsche Classic Communication Management or select the corresponding button via the menu HOME on the touchscreen. You can change from one main menu to another menu at any time. To return to the top level of a main menu, use the BACK button until you return to the top level of the main menu.

#### Call up options menus

 To access an Options menu, select the Options button in the main menu on the touch screen.

#### Operating menus with the touchscreen

► Touch the individual menu items or buttons directly on the screen.

#### Operating menus with the right-hand knob

As an alternative to operating via the touchscreen operation, the menu items can also be operated using the right-hand knob  $\blacksquare$ 

► Highlight a menu item by turning the right-hand knob ( )

#### **Exit menus**

#### Jump back to the next higher menu

Press the BACK button to cancel an operation and go to the next higher menu

#### Jump back to main menu

Press a main menu button to return to the corresponding main menu.

#### Return to the top level of a main menu

Press the BACK button several times to reach the top level of the main menu. Alternatively, press the corresponding key on the Porsche Classic Communication Management or select the corresponding button in the menu HOME via the touchscreen

#### Operating lists

The following options are available for highlighting a menu item:

- ► Turning the right knob ( ) A highlighted menu item is indicated by an orange frame.
- ► Press the right-hand knob →
  - or -
- Select a menu entry via the touchscreen: Confirm the selection.

#### Operating the input menus

In some cases data can be entered into Porsche Classic Communication Management. For example, when entering a telephone number.

► To enter data in an input menu touch the characters on the screen

Mark the characters by turning the right-hand knob (●) and select them by pressing the righthand knob →●

To confirm and accept the data entered so far, select the corresponding button, e.g. in the menu.

The input menus include some buttons in addition to numbers

- deletes the last entry in the input field.
- switches to digits and special characters
  switches to extended special characters
- switches to letters/switches to Cyrillic alphabet (only if Russian is selected as menu
- language)
  switches between upper and lower case
  letters
- inserts blanks
- confirms the entry and searches for entries in the phone book
- dials the entered phone number
- ends the current call
  - is used to enter GSM service codes
- # is used to enter GSM service codes
- + is used to enter country codes
- + is used to change values
- is used to change values

### **Sound settings Sound**

The sound settings in the **Sound** menu are used to set the sound of your Porsche Classic Communication Management for the audio sources as follows:

#### **Default Equalizer Settings**

- 1. Press Sound button.
- 2. Select menu item Equalizer.
- 3. Select the desired option
  - Bose
  - or –
  - Pop
  - or -
  - Rock
  - or -
  - Klassik
  - or -
  - Jazz
  - or –

Custom settings.

### i Information

Select **Bose** if you have connected a Bose sound system.

#### **Custom Equalizer Settings**

- 1. Press Sound obutton.
- 2. Select menu item Equalizer.

- 3. Select the Option Custom settings.
- 4. Touch + and or turn the right knob ( ) to select the desired setting (6 bands or bass and treble).

### 1 Information

Depending on the technical requirements of the vehicle either a 6-band equalizer or the settings for bass and treble appear in **Custom settings**.

#### **Resetting the Equalizer Settings**

- 1. Press Sound do button.
- 2. Select menu item Equalizer.
- 3. Select the option Reset Equalizer Settings.
- 4. Select the Reset button.

#### Switch Loudness on/off

As the human ear is most sensitive at medium frequencies it makes sense to use this function at low volume

where the system increases high and low frequencies This results in better audibility.

- 1. Press Sound do button.
- 2. Check box Loudness activate or deactivate.

#### Set Fader

The fader setting is used to adjust the volume level distribution between the rear and front speakers.

- 1. Press Sound button.
- 2. Select menu item Fader.
- 3. Touch + and or turn the right knob (•) to select the desired setting.

#### **Adjust Balance**

The balance setting is used to adjust the volume level distribution between the left and right speakers.

- 1. Press Sound button.
- 2. Select menu item Balance.
- 3. Touch and or turn the right knob ( ) to select the desired setting.

#### **Rest sound settings**

**Reset sound settings** is used to delete all sound settings and reset them to default values.

- 1. Press **Sound** button.
- 2. Select Menu item Reset sound settings.
- 3. Select the Reset button.

### 1 Information

To adjust the volume of different audio sources separately (for example navigation, radio or AUX), select the menu item **Volume** in the Settings menu.

- button illumination
- factory settings (Factory reset)

#### Setting the time

- 1. Press Settings on button.
- 2. Select the menu item Time.
- 3. Use the on-screen keyboard or to set the desired time.
- 4. Select the OK button.

The time settings can also be accessed directly by pressing the clock.

#### Setting the date

- 1. Press Settings on button.
- 2. Select the menu item Date.

3. Use the on-screen keyboard or to set the desired date.

4. Select the OK button.

#### Set the date format

- 1. Press Settings on button.
- 2. Select the menu item Time.
- 3. Use the on-screen keyboard or 
  to set the desired time format.
- 4. Select the OK button.

#### Synchronise time

The signal that determines the time is set using the **Synchronize time** menu item.

- 1. Press Settings on button.
- 2. Select the menu item **Synchronise time** and choose between
  - RDS
  - or –
  - GPS
  - or -
  - Manual.
- 3. Select the OK button.

#### Set standby time

The **Standby** menu item is used to set a time for which the device remains active when the vehicle is left for a short period, avoiding the need for the device to restart when returning to the vehicle.

- 1. Press Settings on button.
- 2. Select the menu item **Standby** and choose hetween
  - 5 minutes.
  - or -
  - 15 minutes.
  - or -
  - 30 minutes,
  - or –
  - Off.

#### Switching tone button on/off

- 1. Press Settings on button.
- 2. Select the menu item Tone button.
- 3. Activate or deactivate the check box.

#### Activate automatic day/night mode








Fig.: Playing music PCCM Plus


