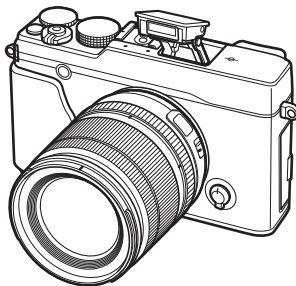

### IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

- **Read Instructions:** All the safety and operating instructions should be read before the appliance is operated.

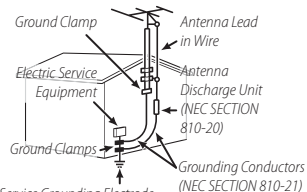


#### Antennas

**Outdoor Antenna Grounding:** If an outside antenna or cable system is connected to the video product, be sure the antenna or cable system is grounded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built-up static charges. Section 810 of the National Electrical Code, ANSI/NFPA No. 70, provides information with respect to proper grounding of the

mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size of grounding conductors, location of antenna discharge unit, connection to grounding electrodes, and requirements for the grounding electrode.

#### EXAMPLE OF ANTENNA GROUNDING AS PER NATIONAL ELECTRICAL CODE



Power Service Grounding Electrode System (NEC ART 250, PART H)

#### Use

### The Battery and Power Supply

**Note:** Check the type of battery used in your camera and read the appropriate sections.

The following describes the proper use of batteries and how to prolong their life. Incorrect use can shorten battery life or cause leakage, overheating, fire, or explosion.

#### Li-ion Batteries

Read this section if your camera uses a rechargeable Li-ion battery.

The battery is not charged at shipment. Charge the battery before use. Keep the battery in its case when not in use.

#### ■ Notes on the Battery

The battery gradually loses its charge when not in use. Charge the battery one or two days before use.

Battery life can be extended by turning the camera off when not in use.

Battery capacity decreases at low temperatures; a depleted battery may not function at when cold. Keep a fully charged spare battery in a warm place and exchange as necessary, or keep the battery in your pocket or other warm place and insert it in the camera only when shooting. Do not place the battery in direct contact with hand warmers or other heating devices.

#### ■ Charging the Battery

Charge the battery in the supplied battery charger. Charging times will increase at ambient temperatures below +10°C (+50°F) or above +35°C (+95°F). Do not attempt to charge the battery at temperatures above 40°C (+104°F); at temperatures below 0°C (+32°F), the battery will not charge.

Do not attempt to recharge a fully charged battery. The battery does not however need to be fully discharged before charging.

The battery may be warm to the touch immediately after charging or use. This is normal.

#### ■ Battery Life

At normal temperatures, the battery can be recharged about 300 times. A noticeable decrease in the length of time the battery will hold a charge indicates that it has reached the end of its service life and should be replaced.

#### ■ Storage

Performance may be impaired if the battery is left unused for extended periods when fully charged. Run the battery flat before storing it.

If the camera will not be used for an extended period, remove the battery and store it in a dry place with an ambient temperature of from +15°C to +25°C (+59°F to +77°F). Do not store in locations exposed to extremes of temperature.

#### ■ Cautions: Handling the Battery

- Do not transport or store with metal objects such as necklaces or hairpins.
- Do not expose to flame or heat.
- Do not disassemble or modify.
- Use with designated chargers only.
- Dispose of used batteries promptly.
- Do not drop or subject to strong physical shocks.
- Do not expose to water.
- Keep the terminals clean.
- The battery and camera body may become warm to the touch after extended use. This is normal.

#### ■ Disposal

Dispose of used batteries in accord with local regulations.

#### AC Power Adapters (Available Separately)

Use only FUJIFILM AC power adapters designated for use with this camera. Other adapters could damage the camera.

- The AC power adapter is for indoor use only.
- Be sure the DC plug is securely connected to the camera.
- Turn the camera off before disconnecting the adapter. Disconnect the adapter by the plug, not the cable.
- Do not use with other devices.
- Do not disassemble.
- Do not expose to high heat and humidity.
- Do not subject to strong physical shocks.
- The adapter may hum or become hot to the touch during use. This is normal.
- If the adapter causes radio interference, reorient or relocate the receiving antenna.

### Using the Camera

- Do not aim the camera at extremely bright light sources, such as the sun in a cloudless sky. Failure to observe this precaution could damage the camera image sensor.
- Strong sunlight focused through the viewfinder may damage the panel of electronic viewfinder (EVF). Do not aim the electronic viewfinder at the sun.

#### Take Test Shots

Before taking photographs on important occasions (such as at weddings or before taking the camera on a trip), take a test shot and view the results to ensure that the camera is functioning normally. FUJIFILM Corporation can not accept liability for damages or lost profits incurred as a result of product malfunction.

#### Handling

To ensure that images are recorded correctly, do not subject the camera to impact or physical shocks while images are being recorded.



## Product Care

**Camera body:** For continued enjoyment of your camera, use a soft, dry cloth to clean the camera body after each use. Do not use alcohol, thinner, or other volatile chemicals, which could discolor or deform the leather on the camera body. Any liquid on the camera should be removed immediately with a soft, dry cloth. Use a blower to remove dust from the monitor, taking care to avoid scratches, and then gently wipe with a soft, dry cloth. Any remaining stains can be removed by wiping gently with a piece of FUJIFILM lens-cleaning paper to which a small amount of lens-cleaning fluid has been applied. To prevent dust entering the camera, replace the body cap when no lens is in place.

**Image sensor:** Dust can be removed from the image sensor using the  **SENSOR CLEANING** option in the setup menu ( 110).

**Interchangeable lenses:** Use a blower to remove dust, then gently wipe with a soft, dry cloth. Any remaining stains can be removed by wiping gently with a piece of FUJIFILM lens-cleaning paper to which a small amount of lens-cleaning fluid has been applied. Replace the front and rear caps when the lens is not use.

### Control Lock

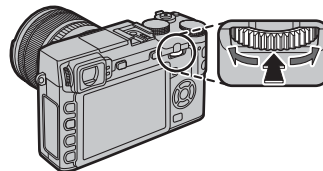
To prevent accidental operation of the selector and **AE-L** and **AF-L** buttons during shooting, press **MENU/OK** until  is displayed. The controls can be unlocked by pressing **MENU/OK** until  is no longer displayed.

### **The Selector**

Press the selector up (①), right (③), down (④), or left (②) to highlight items. The up, left, right, and down buttons also double as the **Fn3** (AF mode; 000), **Fn4** (film simulation; 000), **Fn5** (flash mode; 000), and **Fn6** (focus-frame selection; 000) buttons, respectively ( 000).



### **The Command Dial**



**Rotate** the command dial to select options in the quick menu display ( 000), view pictures ( 000), adjust the size of the focus area ( 000), or choose a shutter speed ( 000, 000, 000, 000) or combination of shutter speed and aperture (program shift, 000).

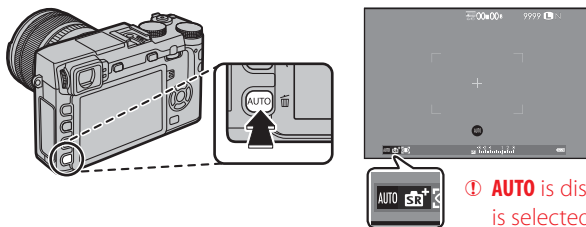


**Press** the center of the command dial to zoom in on the active focus area during shooting ( 000) or playback ( 000), or press and hold the center of the command dial to choose a manual focus assist option ( 000).



### The AUTO (Auto Mode) Button

Press a function button (by default, **Fn2/AUTO**) button to select **SR<sup>+</sup> ADVANCED SR AUTO** mode or an auto mode in which you can choose the scene. Press the button again to exit auto mode.



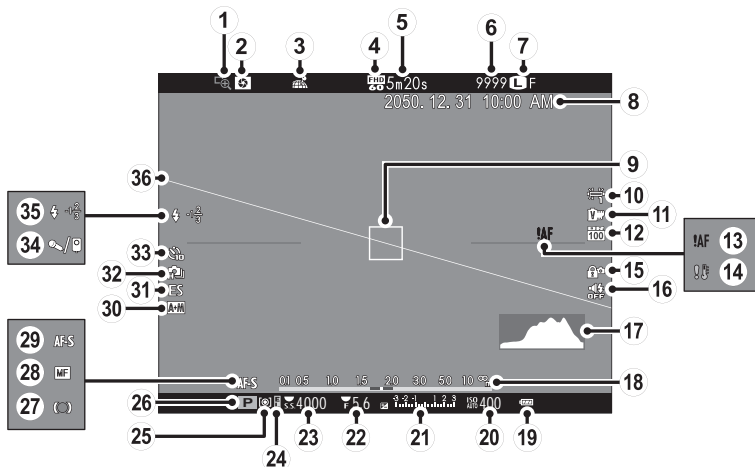
**AUTO** is displayed in red when auto mode is selected.

- ◆ At default settings, **AUTO MODE ON/OFF** is assigned to the **AUTO (Fn2)** button, but it can be assigned to other function buttons as desired (📖 000).

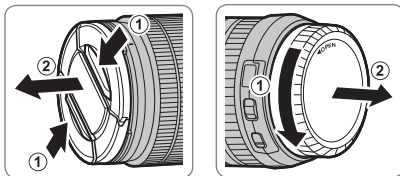

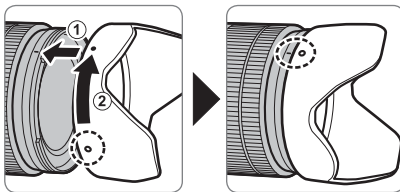

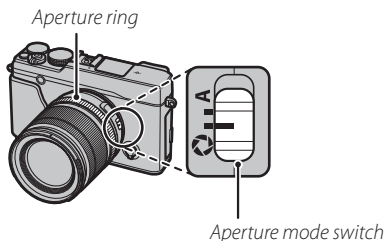

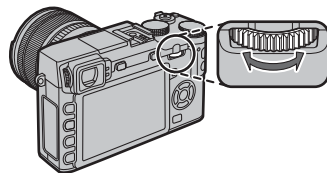

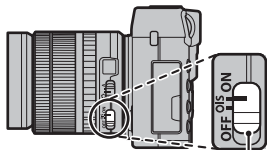
The method used to adjust aperture can be selected using the  **APERTURE SETTING** option (📖 97) in the shooting menu. When an option other than **AUTO** is selected, aperture can be adjusted using the command dial.



-  Selecting **S.S** for  **COMMAND DIAL SETTING** > **COMMAND DIAL SETTING** (📖 000) allows the command dial to be used to choose the shutter speed (📖 000, 000, 000, 000), the exposure time for long time-exposures when the shutter-speed dial is rotated to **T** (time), or, in program AE mode (mode **P**), different combinations of shutter speed and aperture (program shift, 📖 000).
-  Assigning **COMMAND DIAL SETTING** to a function button makes it easy to switch between shutter speed and aperture (📖 000).

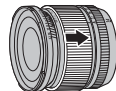

**Manual Focus Lenses**

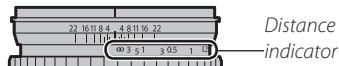
Slide the focus ring to the front for autofocus.

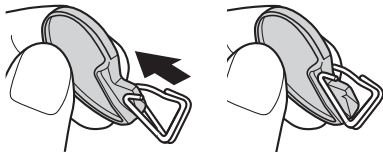

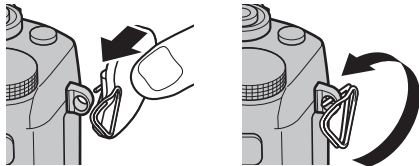

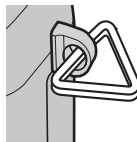

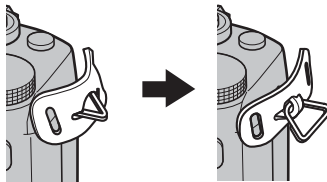
### 3 Pass the clip through the eyelet.

Rotate the clip fully through the eyelet until it clicks closed.



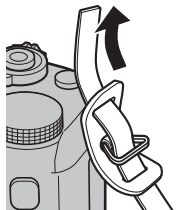
### 4 Attach a protective cover.

Place a protective cover over the eyelet as shown, with the black side of the cover toward the camera. Repeat Steps 1–4 for the second eyelet.



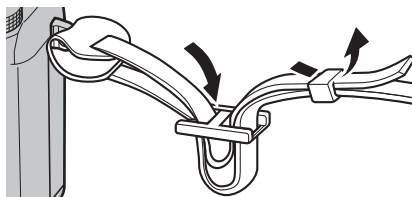
### 5 Insert the strap.

Insert the strap through a protective cover and strap clip.



### 6 Fasten the strap.

Fasten the strap as shown. Repeat Steps 5–6 for the second eyelet.



- ⓘ To avoid dropping the camera, be sure the strap is correctly secured.

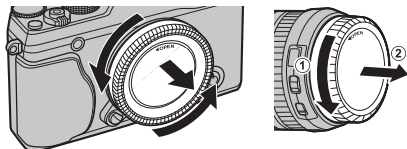
## Attaching a Lens

Lenses attach as described below.

① Care is required to prevent dust entering the camera while attaching and removing lenses.

### 1 Remove the body and rear caps.

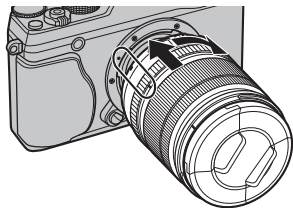
Remove the body cap from the camera and the rear cap from the lens.



① Do not touch the camera's internal parts.

### 2 Attach the lens.

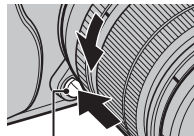
Place the lens on mount, keeping the marks on the lens and camera aligned, and then rotate the lens until it clicks into place.



① Do not press the lens release button while attaching the lens.

### Removing Lenses

To remove the lens, turn the camera off, then press the lens release button and rotate the lens as shown.

① To prevent dust accumulating on the lens or inside the camera, replace the lens caps and camera body cap when the lens is not attached.

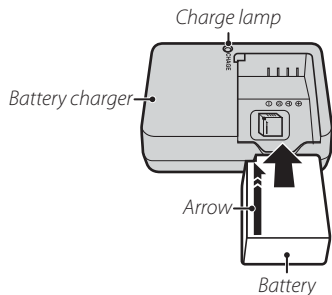

## Charging the Battery

The battery is not charged at shipment. Before use, charge the battery in the supplied battery charger.

### 1 Place the battery in the charger.

Place the battery in the supplied battery charger as shown.



The camera uses an NP-W126 rechargeable battery.

- ◆ The supplied AC cord is for use exclusively with the supplied battery charger. Do not use the supplied charger with other cords or the supplied cord with other devices.

### 2 Plug the charger in.

Plug the charger into an indoor power outlet. The charging indicator will light.

#### The Charging Indicator

The charging indicator shows battery charge status as follows:

Charging indicator	Battery status	Action
Off	Battery not inserted.	Insert the battery.
	Battery fully charged.	Remove the battery.
On	Battery charging.	—
Blinks	Battery fault.	Unplug the charger and remove the battery.

### 3 Charge the battery.

Remove the battery when charging is complete. See the specifications (📖 149) for charging times (note that charging times increase at low temperatures).

- ⓘ Unplug the charger when it is not in use.

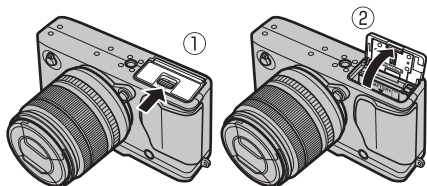


## Inserting the Battery and a Memory Card

The camera has no internal memory; instead, pictures are stored on optional SD, SDHC, and SDXC memory cards (sold separately). After charging the battery, insert the battery and memory card as described below.

### 1 Open the battery-chamber cover.

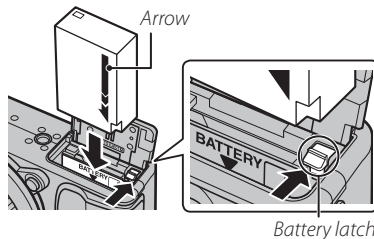
Slide the battery-chamber latch as shown and open the battery-chamber cover.



- ① Do not open the battery-chamber cover when the camera is on. Failure to observe this precaution could damage image files or memory cards.
- ① Do not use excessive force when handling the battery-chamber cover.

### 2 Insert the battery.

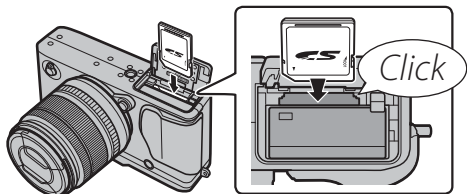
Using the battery to keep the battery latch pressed to one side, insert the battery contacts first in the direction shown by the arrow. Confirm that the battery is securely latched.



- ① Insert the battery in the correct orientation. *Do not use force or attempt to insert the battery upside down or backwards.* The battery will slide in easily in the correct orientation.

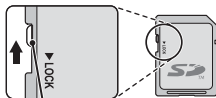
### 3 Insert the memory card.

Holding the memory card in the orientation shown, slide it in until it clicks into place at the back of the slot.



① Be sure card is in the correct orientation; do not insert at an angle or use force.

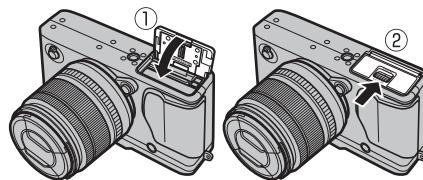
② SD/SDHC/SDXC memory cards can be locked, making it impossible to format the card or to record or delete images.



Write-protect switch

Before inserting a memory card, slide the write-protect switch to the unlocked position.

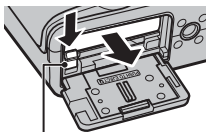
### 4 Close the battery-chamber cover.



### ● Removing the Battery and Memory Card

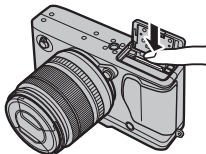
Before removing the battery or memory card, **turn the camera off** and open the battery-chamber cover.

To remove the battery, press the battery latch to the side, and slide the battery out of the camera as shown.



Battery latch

To remove the memory card, press it in and release it slowly. The card can then be removed by hand. When a memory card is removed, the card could be ejected too quickly. Use your finger to hold it and gently release the card.



### ⓘ Batteries

- Remove dirt from the battery terminals with a clean, dry cloth. Failure to observe this precaution could prevent the battery from charging.
- Do not affix stickers or other objects to the battery. Failure to observe this precaution could make it impossible to remove the battery from the camera.
- Do not short the battery terminals. The battery could overheat.
- Read the cautions in “The Battery and Power Supply” (ⓘ v).
- Use only battery chargers designated for use with the battery. Failure to observe this precaution could result in product malfunction.
- Do not remove the labels from the battery or attempt to split or peel the outer casing.
- The battery gradually loses its charge when not in use. Charge the battery one or two days before use.

## ■ Compatible Memory Cards

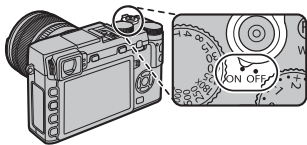
FUJIFILM and SanDisk SD, SDHC, and SDXC memory cards have been approved for use in the camera. A complete list of approved memory cards is available at [http://www.fujifilm.com/support/digital\\_cameras/compatibility/](http://www.fujifilm.com/support/digital_cameras/compatibility/). Operation is not guaranteed with other cards. The camera can not be used with *xD-Picture Cards* or **MultiMediaCard** (MMC) devices.



### ⓘ Memory Cards

- ***Do not turn the camera off or remove the memory card while the memory card is being formatted or data are being recorded to or deleted from the card.*** Failure to observe this precaution could damage the card.
- Format memory cards before first use, and be sure to reformat all memory cards after using them in a computer or other device. For more information on formatting memory cards, see page 113.
- Memory cards are small and can be swallowed; keep out of reach of children. If a child swallows a memory card, seek medical assistance immediately.
- miniSD or microSD adapters that are larger or smaller than the standard dimensions of an SD/SDHC/SDXC card may not eject normally; if the card does not eject, take the camera to an authorized service representative. Do not forcibly remove the card.
- Do not affix labels to memory cards. Peeling labels can cause camera malfunction.
- Movie recording may be interrupted with some types of SD/SDHC/SDXC memory card. Use a **CLASS10** card or better for movies and burst photography.
- Formatting a memory card in the camera creates a folder in which pictures are stored. Do not rename or delete this folder or use a computer or other device to edit, delete, or rename image files. Always use the camera to delete pictures; before editing or renaming files, copy them to a computer and edit or rename the copies, not the originals. Renaming the files on the camera can cause problems during playback.

## Turning the Camera on and Off






Rotate the **ON/OFF** switch to **ON** to turn the camera on. Select **OFF** to turn the camera off.

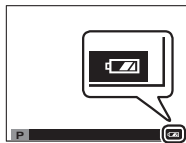


- ◆ Press the  button to start playback. Press the shutter button halfway to return to shooting mode.
- ◆ The camera will turn off automatically if no operations are performed for the length of time selected for  **POWER MANAGEMENT > AUTO POWER OFF** (📖 109). To reactivate the camera after it has turned off automatically, press the shutter button halfway or turn the **ON/OFF** switch to **OFF** and then back to **ON**.
- ◆ For information on startup options, see page 109.
- ⚠ Fingerprints and other marks on the lens or viewfinder can affect pictures or the view through the viewfinder. Keep the lens and viewfinder clean.



### Battery Level

After turning the camera on, check the battery level in the display.

Indicator	Description
 (white)	Battery partially discharged.
 (white)	Battery about two-thirds charged.
 (white)	Battery about one-third charged. Charge as soon as possible.
 (red)	Low battery. Charge battery.
 (blinks red)	Battery exhausted. Turn camera off and recharge battery.



## Basic Setup

A language-selection dialog is displayed the first time the camera is turned on. Set up the camera as described below (you can reset the clock or change languages at any time using the  **DATE/TIME** or  **言語/LANG.** options in the setup menu; for information on displaying the setup menu, see page 106).

### 1 Choose a language.

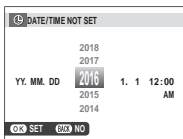


Highlight a language and press **MENU/OK**.



Press **DISP/BACK** to skip the current step. Any steps you skip will be displayed the next time the camera is turned on.

### 2 Set the date and time.



Press the selector left or right to highlight the year, month, day, hour, or minute and press up or down to change. To change the order in which the year, month, and day are displayed, highlight the date format and press the selector up or down. Press **MENU/OK** to exit to shooting mode when settings are complete.



- ◆ If the battery is removed for an extended period, the camera clock will be reset and the language-selection dialog will be displayed when the camera is turned on.

## Changing Basic Settings

To change the language or reset the clock:

### 1 Display the desired option.

Display the setup menu and select  言語/LANG. to change the language or  DATE/TIME to reset the clock (📖 105).

### 2 Adjust settings.

To choose a language, highlight the desired option and press **MENU/OK**. To set the clock, press the selector left or right to highlight the year, month, day, hour, or minute and press up or down to change, then press **MENU/OK** once the clock has been set to your satisfaction.

## Choosing a Display

The camera is equipped with an electronic viewfinder (EVF) and an LCD monitor (LCD). Follow the steps below to choose a display.

### 1 Display the setup menu.

1.1 Press **MENU/OK** to display the menu for the current mode.



1.2 Press the selector left to highlight the tab for the current menu.



1.3 Press the selector down to highlight the setup menu tab containing **EVF EVF/LCD SETTING**.



1.4 Press the selector right to place the cursor in the setup menu.



### 2 Select **EVF EVF/LCD SETTING**.



Highlight **EVF EVF/LCD SETTING** and press **MENU/OK**.

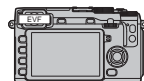
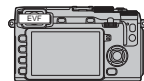


### 3 Choose a display.

Highlight one of the following options and press **MENU/OK**.



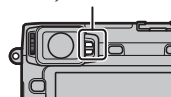
Option	Description
 <b>EYE SENSOR</b>	Automatic display selection using eye sensor
<b>LCD</b>	LCD monitor only
<b>EVF</b>	Viewfinder only
<b>EVF ONLY</b> + 	Viewfinder only; eye sensor turns display on or off



### The Eye Sensor

The eye sensor turns the viewfinder on when you put your eye to the viewfinder and turns it off when you take your eye away (note that the eye sensor may respond to objects other than your eye or to light shining directly on the sensor). If automatic display selection is enabled, the LCD monitor will turn on when the viewfinder turns off.

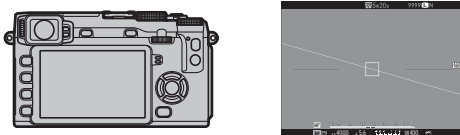
Eye sensor



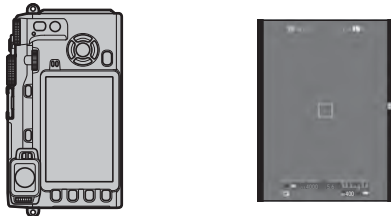


### The Viewfinder Display

When **ON** is selected for **SCREEN SET-UP > EVF AUTOROTATE DISPLAYS** in the setup menu (☰ 000), the indicators in the viewfinder automatically rotate to match camera orientation.



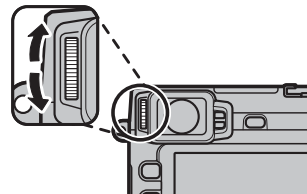
↙ Orientation changed from "wide" to "tall"

### Focusing the Viewfinder

The camera is equipped with diopter adjustment in the range  $-4$  to  $+2\text{ m}^{-1}$  to accommodate individual differences in vision. Rotate the diopter adjustment control until the viewfinder display is in sharp focus.

### Adjusting Display Brightness

The brightness of the viewfinder and LCD monitor can be adjusted using the options under **SCREEN SET-UP**. Choose **EVF BRIGHTNESS** to adjust viewfinder brightness (☰ 000) or **LCD BRIGHTNESS** to do the same for the LCD monitor (☰ 000).
