i-mode is an online service used with i-mode terminal. This service supports connection to i-mode sites (programs) or i-mode compatible sites that provide a variety of useful information and allows you to exchange i-mode mail.

Main features of F905i

i-mode mail and Deco-mail pictograms

In addition to message text, you can attach up to 10 files (images, etc.) or files of up to 2 Mbytes in total to a message. →P175

- On horizontal display, the display position of the guide area, etc. are different, but the same operations as those on vertical display can be performed.

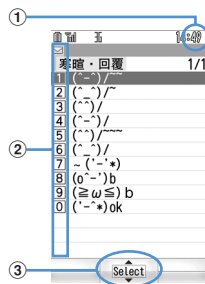


Operations that can be executed by pressing , , , and are displayed in the guide area. Displayed operations vary by the screen. Display locations and keys correspond as shown in the figure.
