REGULATORY NOTICES


CB :

- Only use batteries designed for this computer. The wrong battery type may explode, leak or damage the computer.
- Do not remove any batteries from the computer while it is powered on.
- Do not continue to use a battery that has been dropped, or that appears damaged (e.g. bent or twisted) in any way. Even if the computer continues to work with a damaged battery in place, it may cause circuit damage, which may possibly result in fire.

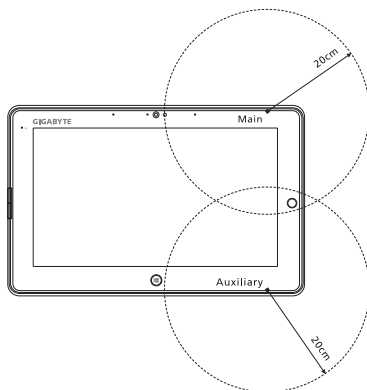

- (1) Users are requested to follow the RF safety instructions on wireless option devices that are included in the user's manual of each RF option device.

NOTE: The wireless Mini PCI adapter implements a transmission diversity function. The function does not emit radio frequencies simultaneously from both antennas. One of the antennas is selected automatically or manually (by users) to ensure good quality radiocommunication.

Battery Maintenance Guidance

Before you use your Slat PC on the road, you will have to charge the battery pack. The battery pack begins to charge as soon as the Slat PC is connected to external power using the power adapter. Fully charge the battery pack before using it for the first time. A new battery pack must completely charge before the Slat PC is disconnected from external power. It takes a few hours to fully charge the battery when the Slat PC is turned OFF. Please note the battery stops charging if the temperature is too high or the battery voltage is too high.



NOTE: Do not leave the battery pack discharged. The battery pack will discharge over time. If not using a battery pack, it must continue to be charged every three months to extend recovery capacity or else it may fail to charge in the future. Lithium-Ion rechargeable batteries require routine maintenance and care in their use and handling. Read through below instruction and your Slat PC will achieve the maximum battery life span.

Battery Maintenance :

- Do not leave batteries unused for extended periods of time, either in the Slat PC or in storage. When a battery has been unused for 3 months, check the charge status and charge or dispose of the battery as appropriate.
- The typical estimated life of a Lithium-Ion battery is about two to three years or 300 to 500 charge cycles, whichever occurs first. One charge cycle is a period of use from fully charged, to fully discharged, and fully recharged again. Use a two to three year life expectancy for batteries that do not run through complete charge cycles.
- Rechargeable Lithium-Ion batteries have a limited life and will gradually lose their capacity to hold a charge. This loss of capacity is irreversible. As the battery loses capacity, the length of time it will power the Slat PC decreases.
- The run time of your battery will vary depending on the product's configuration and the applications that you run. Routinely check the battery's charge status.
- Battery terminals must avoid contact with any metallic substance. For preventing shortage, avoid silver coins, tinsels and any other metallic substances to contact the + and - terminals of the battery. For example, it might happen by inserting the batteries to a coat pocket or a leather handbag with some metallic substances mounted on it (metal buttons or zippers). There is high possibility of causing short circuits and connection damage of the battery.
- Consider replacing the battery with a new one if you note either of the following conditions:
 - (1) The battery run time drops below about 80% of the original run time.
 - (2) The battery charge time increases significantly.
 - (3) If a battery is stored or otherwise unused for an extended period, be sure to follow the storage instructions in P10. If you do not follow the instructions, and the battery has no charge remaining when you check it, consider it to be damaged. Do not attempt to recharge it or to use it. Replace it with a new battery.

Charging :

The Lithium-Ion battery is recharged internally using the AC adapter. To recharge the battery, make sure the battery is installed and the Slat PC is connected to the AC adapter. The charge times will be significantly longer if your Slat PC is in use while the battery is charging. If you want to charge the battery more quickly, put your computer into Suspend mode or turn it off while the adapter is charging the battery. Please always follow the charging instructions provided with your Slat PC.

** If you happen to leave your battery pack to go through an extended period of self-discharge, say more than three months, the battery voltage level will become too low and needs to be Pre-Charged (to bring the battery voltage level high enough) before it automatically resumes its normal Fast Charge. Pre-Charge may take 30 minutes. Fast Charge usually takes 2~3 hours.*

Low Battery State :

When the battery level is low, a notification message appears. If you do not respond to the low battery message, the battery continues to discharge until it is too low to operate. When this happens, your Slat PC goes into Suspend mode. There is no guarantee your data will be saved once the Slat PC reaches this point.



CAUTION: To protect your Slat PC from damage, use only the power adapter that came with it because each power adapter has its own power output rating.

Once your Slat PC goes into suspend mode as a result of a dead battery, you will be unable to resume operation until you provide a source of power either from an adapter or a charged battery. Once you have provided power, you can press the Suspend/ Resume button to resume operation. In Suspend mode, your data is maintained for some time, but if a power source is not provided promptly, the power indicator stops flashing and then goes out, in which case you have lost the data that was not saved. Once you provide power, you can continue to use your computer while an adapter charges the battery.

Storage :

- Charge or discharge the battery to approximately 50% of capacity before storage.
- Charge the battery to approximately 50% of capacity at least once every three months.
- Remove the battery and store it separately from the Slat PC.
- Store the battery at temperatures between 5°C and 20°C (41°F and 68°F).



CAUTION: The battery self-discharges during storage. Higher temperatures (above 20°C or 68°F) reduce the battery storage life.

Handling Precautions :

- Do not disassemble, crush, or puncture a battery.
- Do not short the external contacts on a battery.
- Do not dispose of a battery in fire or water.
- Do not expose a battery to temperatures above 60°C (140°F).
- Keep the battery away from children.
- Avoid exposing the battery to excessive shock or vibration.
- Do not use a damaged battery.
- If a battery pack has leaking fluids, do not touch any fluids. Dispose of a leaking battery pack (see Disposal and Recycling section).In case of eye contact with fluid, do not rub eyes. Immediately flush eyes thoroughly with water for at least 15 minutes, lifting upper and lower lids, until no evidence of the fluid remains. Seek medical attention.

Transportation :

Always check all applicable local, national, and international regulations before transporting a Lithium-Ion battery. Transporting an end-of-life, damaged, or recalled battery may, in certain cases, be specifically limited or prohibited.

Disposal and Recycling :

Lithium-Ion batteries are subject to disposal and recycling regulations that vary by country and region. Always check and follow your applicable regulations before disposing of any battery. Contact your local battery recycling organization. Many countries prohibit the disposal of waste electronic equipment in standard waste receptacles. Place only discharged batteries in a battery collection container. Use electrical tape or other approved covering over the battery connection points to prevent short circuits.

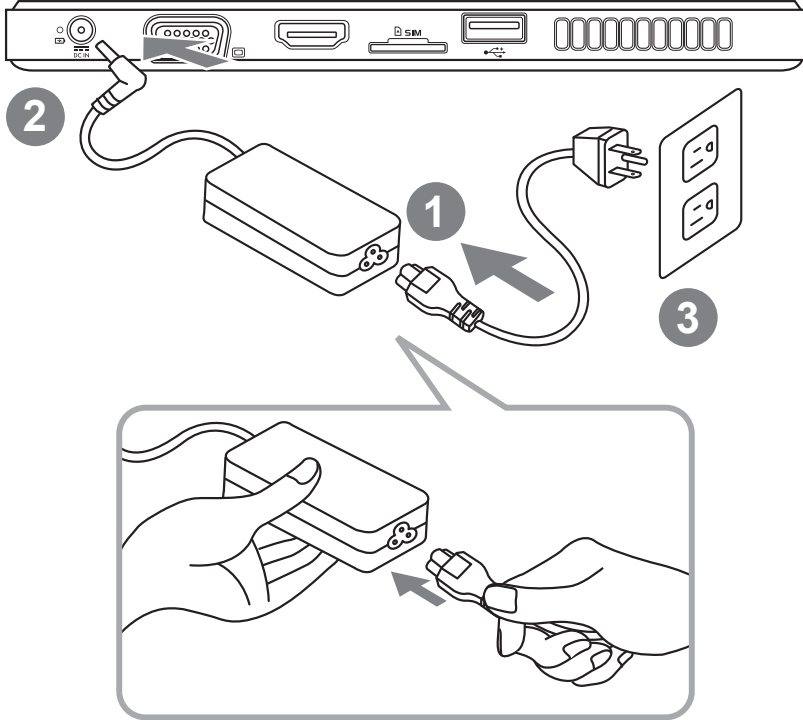

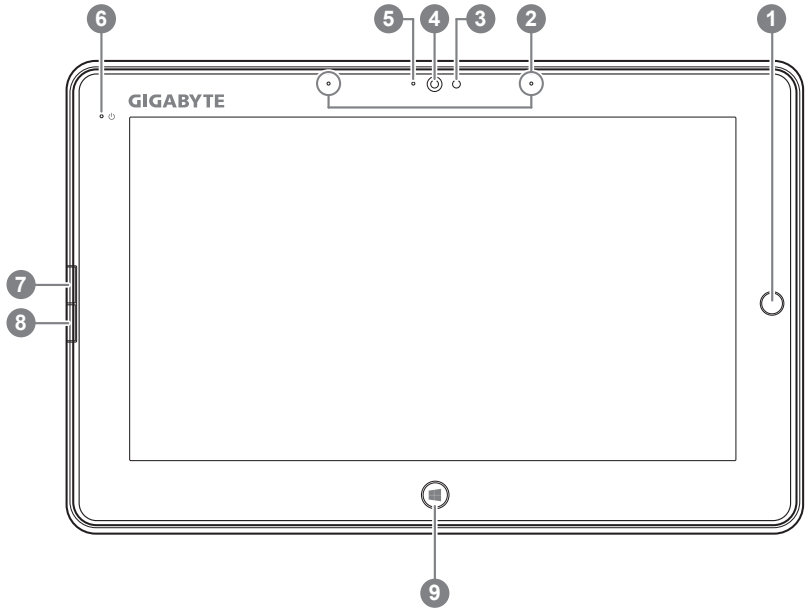
Using GIGABYTE Slate PC for the First Time

Panoramic View

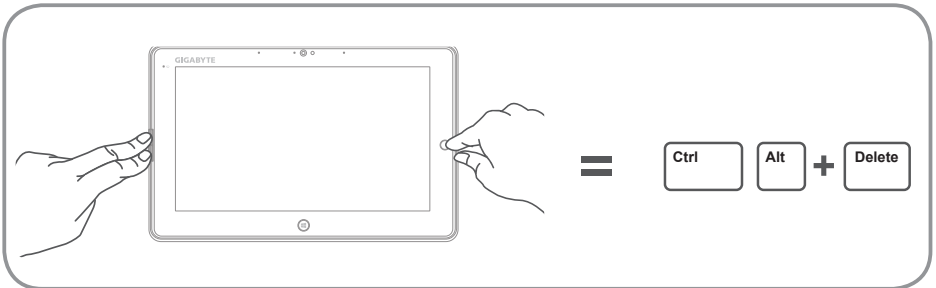

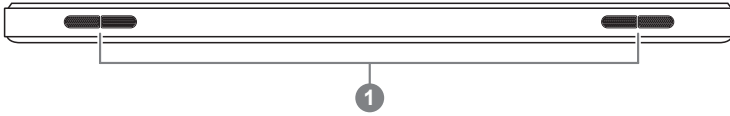

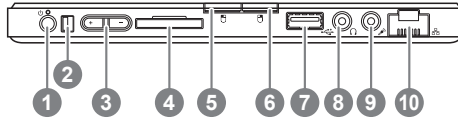

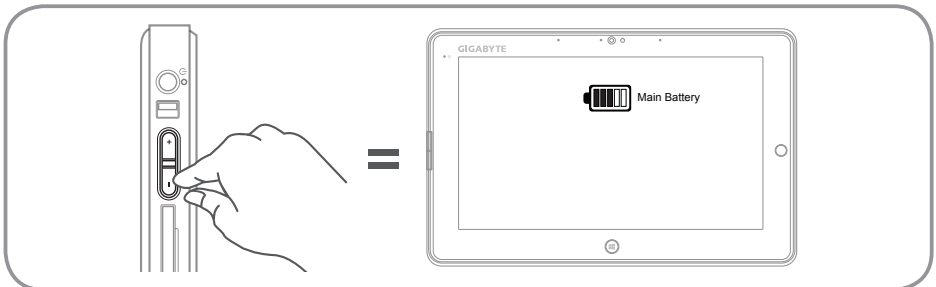

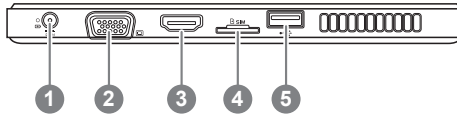

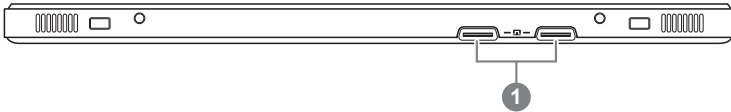

■ GIGABYTE Smart Manager

You can activate GIGABYTE Smart Manager by double clicking on the shortcut icon on the desktop if the machine you purchased has the operation system built-in. GIGABYTE Smart Manager is an icon-based control interface, enabling users to intuitively access common system setup as well as GIGABYTE exclusive utilities. Please be noted that the GIGABYTE Smart Manager interface, icons, utilities and software versions may vary based on the purchased models. Please operate GIGABYTE Smart Manager according to the default built-in version.

■ GIGABYTE Driver Update Utility

You can search devices driver and update it online by double clicking on the shortcut icon on the desktop if the machine you purchased has the operating system built-in. GIGABYTE Driver Update Utility can search the latest drivers and be downloaded automatically. Users are able to tell from the driver version on the machine and online that decide to update drivers.

■ Activate GIGABYTE BIOS Setup Utility

Press and release the Power Button to turn on the operation system. Press "+" to enter into GIGABYTE BIOS Setup Utility. It is recommended to use USB keyboard for setting up BIOS functions under BIOS setup Utility.

Smart USB Backup Guide (Original: Recovery Image USB)

WARNING

- You can backup original recovery image through this application in case of losing by device damage.
- You can backup original recovery image to USB disk and restore the system if any storage system replacement with the recovery USB disk.
- Before you restore the system through the recovery USB disk, please make sure that you have already made the backup of your data.
- Please DO NOT shut down or un-plug the system when performing backup through recovery USB disk.

- Please plug in the USB disk which is at least 20GB in capacity to make the original image (backup the data in USB first. All data will be eliminated during the creation of recovery USB disk)

- Insert the driver disk to your optical drive and run the install of “Smart USB Backup” (for none-ODD model, please use USB ODD device or download from <http://www.gigabyte.com>)

- Run the “Smart USB Backup” after finishing the install.

- Select your USB disk from the drop-down list and start to create the recovery USB disk.

- The window will pop out when the creation of recovery disk is done.
- Please press F12 on starting the system when you need to restore the system. Select “boot from recovery USB disk” and the system will be restored.
- The time needed for restore will be around 30 mins(time needed may vary by USB disk model) .

Recovery Guide

System Recovery (Restore your laptop operating system)

When something is going wrong with the laptop operating system, the storage of the laptop has a hidden partition containing a full back up image of the operating system that can be used to restore the system to factory default settings.



Note

- If the storage has been switched or the partition deleted, the recovery option will no longer be available and a recovery service will be needed.
- The recovery function is only available on devices with O/S preinstalled. Devices with DOS do not have the recovery function.

Launch System Recovery

The system recovery feature is preinstalled before the laptop is shipped from the factory. The option menu allows you to launch the Windows recovery tool to reinstall the operating system to factory default.

The brief introduction below will show you how to start the recovery tool and restore your system.



All ready to go

Make sure your PC is plugged in. This will take a few minutes.

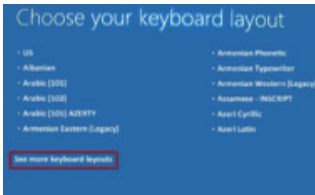

**Here are what will happen**

- Your files and personalization settings won't be changed.
- Your PC settings will be restored to factory default settings.
- Apps from Windows Store will be kept.
- Apps you installed from discs or websites will be removed.
- A list of removed apps will be saved on your desktop.

**Choose “Reset your PC”**

► Just remove my files

Only personal data and files will be removed, but computer settings will be kept.

► Fully clean the drive

The drive will be completely restored to factory default settings. It takes more time. > [Click on “Reset” to execute recovery function.]

**Here are what will happen**

- All of your personal files and apps will be removed.
- Your PC settings will be restored to factory default settings.

**Advanced options****System Restore**

Use a restore point recorded on your PC to restore Windows.

**System Image Recovery**

Recover Windows using a specific system image file.

**Automatic Repair**

Fix problems that keep Windows from loading.

**Command Prompt**

Use the Command Prompt for advanced troubleshooting.

**UEFI Firmware Settings**

Change settings in your PC's UEFI firmware.
