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## Safety Instructions

Use the following safety guidelines to help protect yourself and your notebook.

### When Using Your T1125 Notebook Computer



**CAUTION:** Do not operate your portable computer for an extended period of time with the base resting directly on your body. With extended operation, heat can build up in the base. Allowing sustained contact with the skin can cause discomfort or a possible burn.

- Do not attempt to service the notebook yourself. Always follow installation instructions closely.
- Do not carry a battery in your pocket, purse, or other container where metal objects (such as car keys) could short-circuit the battery terminals. The resulting excessive current flow can generate extremely high temperature and may cause burns to your skin.
- Be sure that nothing rests on your AC adapter's power cable and that the cable is not located where it can be tripped over or stepped on.
- While you are using the computer or charging the battery, place the AC adapter in a ventilated area, like on a desktop or on the floor. Do not cover the AC adapter with papers or other items that may prevent ventilation. Also, do not use the AC adapter while it is inside a carrying case.
- Do not insert objects into the air vent of your notebook computer. Doing so can cause short-circuiting and may result in fire or electrical shock.
- Use only the AC adapter and batteries that are supplied by your notebook manufacturer. Using other types of battery or AC adapter may heighten the risk of fire or explosion.
- Incorrectly installed or placed batteries may result in an explosion.
- Replace only with the same or a compatible battery recommended by the manufacturer.
- Please discard used batteries according to the manufacturer's instructions.
- Before you connect your notebook to a power source, ensure that the voltage rating of the AC adapter matches that of the available power source.
  - 115 V/60 Hz in most of North and South America and some Far Eastern countries such as South Korea.
  - 100 V/50 Hz in eastern Japan and 100 V/60Hz in western Japan.
  - 230 V/50 Hz in most of Europe, the Middle East, and the Far East.
- If you use an extension cord with your AC adapter, ensure that the total ampere rating of all devices plugged into the extension cord does not exceed its total capacity.
- When removing a battery from your notebook, first turn off the system, disconnect the AC adapter from the electrical outlet, and then remove the battery.
- To avoid risk of an electrical shock, do not connect or disconnect any cables, or perform any maintenance or reconfiguration of this product during a thunderstorm.
- Do not throw batteries into a fire, doing so may cause explosion. Check with local authorities first for battery disposal instructions.
- When setting up your notebook for work, place it on a level surface.

- When traveling, do not check your notebook as baggage. You can put your notebook through an X-ray security machine, but never put your notebook through a metal detector. - When traveling with the hard drive removed from your notebook, wrap the drive in an insulated material, such as cloth or paper. If you have the drive checked by hand, you may be asked to install the drive into your notebook. You can have the hard drive checked through an X-ray machine, but never put the drive through a metal detector.
- When traveling, do not place your notebook in the overhead storage compartment where it could shift around. Do not drop your notebook or subject it to other mechanical shocks.
- Protect your notebook, battery, and hard drive from environmental hazards such as dirt, dust, food, liquids, extreme temperature, and direct exposure to sunlight.
- When you move your notebook in environments where there is a substantial difference of temperature or humidity level, condensation may form on or within your notebook. To avoid damaging your notebook, please allow sufficient time for the moisture to evaporate before continuing use of the notebook.

*NOTICE: When taking your notebook from a colder to a warmer environment or vice versa, allow your notebook enough time to adapt to the new environment before turning on power.*

- When unplugging the power cord, please make sure that you pull on its connector or on its strain relief loop, and not on the power cord itself. As you pull out the connector, please ensure

that it is pulled out evenly in order not to bend its connecting pins. Also, before you connect the power cord, make sure that both connectors are correctly oriented and aligned.

- Before you clean your notebook, turn it off first, unplug it from its power source, and remove the battery.
- Handle interior components with care. When removing a component, please hold it by the edge and not on the connecting pins (such as the memory module).

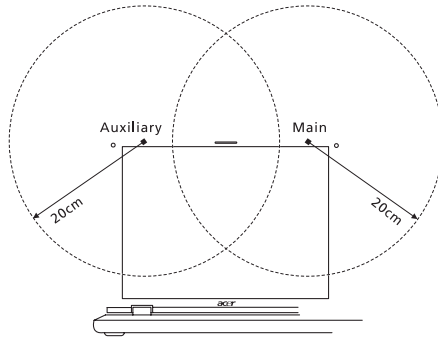

This manual will tell you how to setup and begin using your T1125. It provides basic configuring, operations and care, and troubleshooting.



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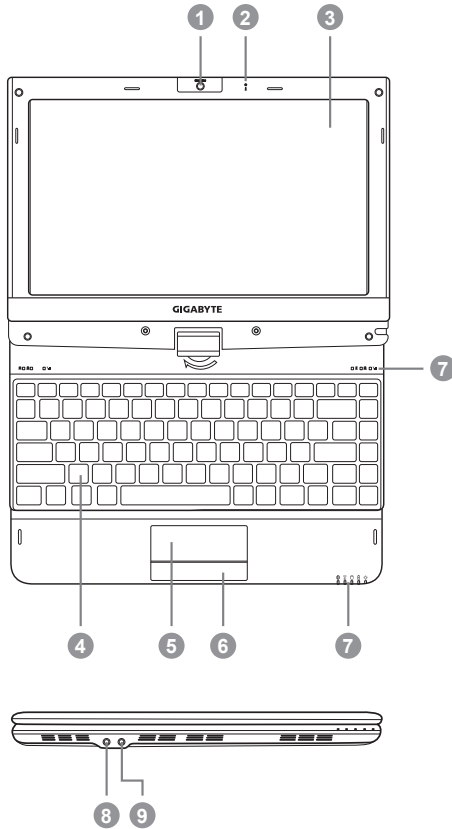
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





## Chapter 1 Knowing Your T1125 Series Notebook



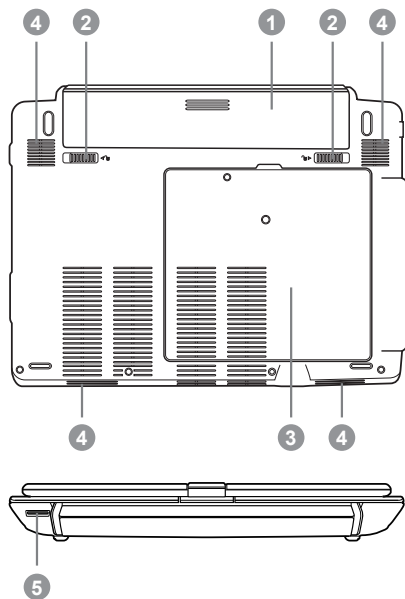

## Chapter 2 Using the T1125

This chapter will briefly explain the basics of using the T1125 notebook. It will also explain any necessary precautions when using the T1125.

## 2.1 The T1125 Keyboard

### The T1125 features a Windows Compatible Keyboard.

The set language of the keyboard will depend on the region. This section is for the English Qwerty Layout Keyboard. It is compatible with a standard 104/105 Key Windows keyboard, accessed by using specific key press combinations and the hotkeys. The number of keys on the keyboard will also vary by language and region.

### The T1125 Hotkeys

The computer employs hotkeys or key combinations to access most of the computer's controls like screen brightness and volume output. To activate hotkeys, press and hold the <Fn> key before pressing the other key in the hotkey combination.

Hotkey	Function	Description
<b>Fn+F1</b> 	Sleep	Puts the computer in Sleep mode
<b>Fn+F2</b> 	Wireless LAN	Enables/disables the Wireless LAN function
<b>Fn+F3</b> 	Brightness Down	Decrease the screen brightness
<b>Fn+F4</b> 	Brightness Up	Increases the screen brightness
<b>Fn+F5</b> 	Display Toggle	Switches display output between the display screen, external monitor (if connected) and both
<b>Fn+F6</b> 	Touchpad Toggle	Turns the internal touchpad on and off
<b>Fn+F7</b> 	Speaker Toggle	Turns the speaker on and off
<b>Fn+F8</b> 	Volume Down	Decreases the sound volume
<b>Fn+F9</b> 	Volume Up	Increases the sound volume
<b>Fn+F10</b> 	WWAN	Enables/disables the WWAN function
<b>Fn+F11</b> 	Bluetooth	Enables/disables the Bluetooth function
<b>Fn+F12</b> 	Webcam	Turns the internal webcam on and off

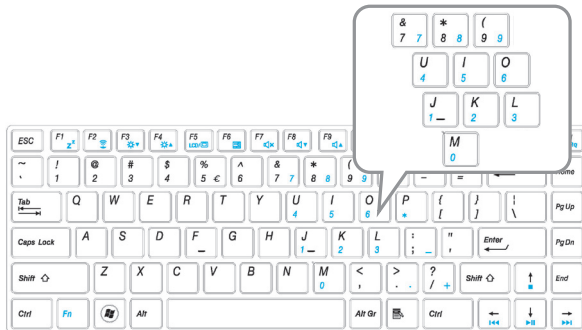
The T1125 keyboard does not have a numeric keypad but it does have the keypad overlay so that it can function like one would. It is located as seen above towards the center right side of the keyboard. The function of each key is shown in light blue to show what it does.



### Enabling The Overlay

The numeric keypad overlay acts the same way a normal numeric keypad would. To enable the numeric keypad overlay, simply hit the key.

This will enable the numeric keys and convert those keys to their blue (secondary) value. The keys will operate in this mode until the overlay is disabled by again pressing the key.

### Windows Keys

The T1125 keyboard has two keys that are specific to windows, namely the Windows Start Button key, which activates the Start menu.

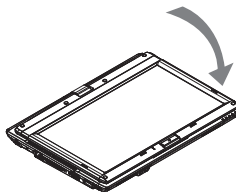
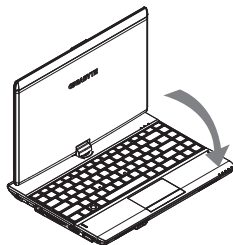
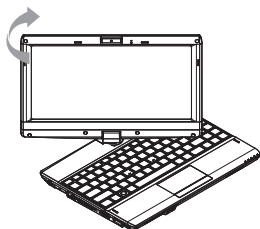

## 2.2 Use your T1125 as a Tablet PC

1. Open the lid (the screen display) of T1125.
2. On the top center above the keyboard is the pivot connecting the display panel to the bottom case. There is a sign "↻".
3. Follow the sign to turn the screen clockwise up to 180 degree so that the screen is facing out.
4. Lay the turned screen down into the flat position. The keyboard will be covered by the display. Simply touch the screen to operate T1125 as a Tablet PC.
5. When done with Tablet PC, reverse the screen to 90 degree, turn (counter clockwise to 180 degree) to set T1125 back to original position.

Please note that the screen can only rotate at 180 degree clockwise. Be sure to turn the screen according to the sign. forcing

## 2.3 The T1125 Quick Battery Life Test

### How To Test the Battery Life

The T1125 features a special function to test the life remaining in the battery. This function is tied to the secondary mouse button of the units touchpad. The below section briefly explains how to use this feature on the notebook to enable you to check the battery life of the T1125.

Locate the secondary mouse button (Right Button) and look for the small battery icon next to the button as shown below. You can then press the button in for about 3 to 5 seconds to begin the test. (The notebook needs to be off to enable the test).

The LED indicators will show the battery capacity status as following:

- 5 LED indicators on: Battery capacity 100%
- 4 LED indicators on: Battery capacity 80%
- 3 LED indicators on: Battery capacity 60%
- 2 LED indicators on: Battery capacity 40%

- 1 LED indicator flashing: Low battery capacity
- No LED indicator on:

- A. Please check the battery is inserted properly.
- B. No battery capacity.

## 4.1 The T1125 Notebook Hardware

GIGABYTE Smart Switch allows users to switch Windows® 7 system to either 64-bit or 32-bit. The Smart Switch can be accessed from the desktop (see figure icon).

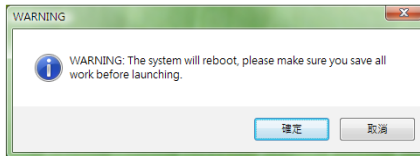


You can also access Smart Switch from Windows Gadget (see below icon).

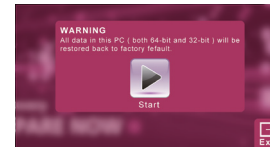

2. Both 64-bit and 32-bit systems will be restored back to factory defaults when pressing "Start" button.

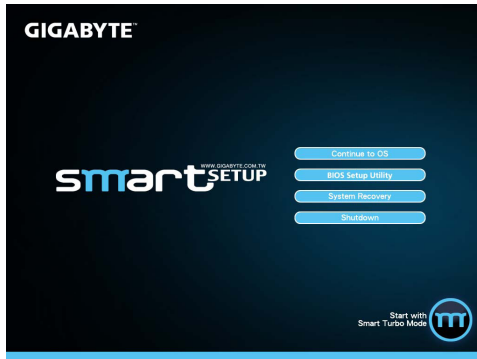

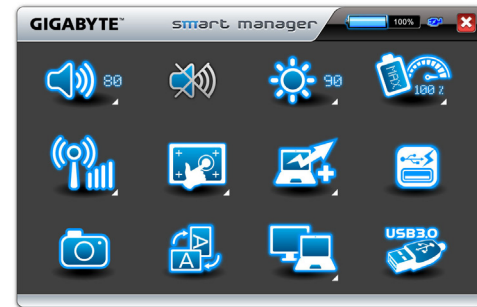

### 4.4 GIGABYTE Smart Manager

The GIGABYTE Smart Manager is a simple utility that gives direct control of system settings to the user in a simple interface. Due to variations of Smart Manager versions, the interface, icons, sequence and functions might be different comparing to the guide. Please operate the Smart Manager by the version preloaded.



**Battery Status:**

The Battery icon with capacity status will be shown on the screen after the battery is placed.



**AC-IN:**

The AC-IN icon will be shown on the screen once the AC Adapter is plugged in. The battery icon will be shown on the screen when using battery as the main power source.



**Volume control:**

Press the volume control icon to adjust the volume level.



**Mute:**

Press the mute icon to enable/disable the mute mode.

**Brightness:**

Press the brightness icon to adjust the level of the display backlight brightness.

**Power mode:**

Press the power mode icon to select different power management mode.

**Communication:**

Press the communication icon to enable/disable 1/Wireless LAN 2/Bluetooth 3/3G Functions.

**Touch Screen:**

Press the Touch Screen icon to enable/disable Touch Screen function and to enable touch screen calibration function.

**Smart Turbo:**

Press the Smart Turbo icon to enable/disable Smart turbo function. GIGABYTE Smart Turbo over-clocking technology enhanced system performance. You can select the over-clocking frequency percentage you requested. (Optional)

**Smart Charge:**

Press the Smart Charge icon to select the USB power supplying mode under Sleep Mode when using battery as the main power source.

\*The Introduction of GIGABYTE Smart Charge function

The GIGABYTE Smart Charge allows you to charge your digital devices through USB ports while the computer is in the sleep mode. When your computer is powered through an

AC adapter by direct AC power supply, you will be able to use Smart Charge when the computer is in Off/Sleep/Hibernation mode. However, if the battery pack is the sole power supply for your computer, Smart Charge only works in Off/Hibernation mode.

To ensure sufficient power supply for system operation, you can set the computer (via GIGABYTE Smart Manager) to automatically cease this function at 50/40/30% of power level.

## 4.5 GIGABYTE Utility Driver Disc

The GIGABYTE T1125 comes with a Driver and Utilities Disc should you need to reinstall any drivers, or if you are installing the operating system because it did not ship with the notebook. Before installing drivers, check on the notebook and with the supplier as to whether they have already installed all the drivers with the operating system. If not, place the Driver CD into the optical device. An installation screen will appear. You can then install all or the needed drivers from the interface.

This section will briefly cover some frequently encountered problems and questions and provide a quick guide to assist with solve these problems. Most problems can be resolved quickly, simply and easily and are not always a system problem. Should you encounter a problem that is not yet or differently listed, please consult the GIGABYTE Website or call your unit supplier for assistance?

## 5.1 Troubleshooting

**Warning:** Under the condition that you can't handle problems, please contact to your dealer to get professional assistance and service.

### AC Adapter

Trouble	Solution
No power supplied to notebook	<p>Make sure the AC adapter is well connected to the power source and Notebook.</p> <p>Check the cable and plug to make sure they are OK. If they are broken, please contact your local dealer ASAP.</p>

### Battery Pack

Trouble	Solution
No power supplied to notebook	<p>The remaining power in battery pack may be not enough to power on the machine. Connect AC Adapter to recharge it.</p>
Can't be recharged after connecting AC adapter	<p>Check temperature of battery pack's surface. Battery pack can't be recharged if its temperature is too high or too low. Recharge it only after its temperature is the same with the normal environment one.</p> <p>If battery pack is fully discharged, it won't be recharged at once. Please wait for a few some minutes.</p> <p>If the power indicators of the battery pack are always not lit up, its life may be over. Please contact your dealer to buy another one.</p>

Battery life depends on usage conditions of the Notebook. You can change the settings in the Power Manager of the OS to save power.

Battery life is not as long as it should be

Battery pack can't exert its full capacity if it works when not fully recharged frequently. Power Notebook by battery pack until its power drops to a critically low level and the machine emits a high-pitched beep or displays a warning message; after that, recharge battery packs to make battery pack work longer.

**!** **WARNING:** Please pay attention to the following information regarding the battery pack:

1. Be sure to recycle the waste batteries properly.
2. Do not place the batteries near high-temperature locations, fire source or in burning fire as this may cause the batteries to explode
3. Do not assemble/disassemble /modify the batteries without authorization.
4. Use the battery pack provided by the original manufacturer only. Batteries other than those supplied by the original manufacturer may damage the device.

### Keyboard

Trouble	Solution
Press character keys but number displayed instead of character	Check if Num Lock is activated.
Confusing display	Make sure there is no software to configure the keyboard.



**!** **WARNING:** Please pay attention to the following information about keyboard maintenance.

1. *Dust build-up may occur in the keyboard after long-term use. It is recommended to clean the keyboard with a small brush. Please shut down the machine before cleaning the surface of the keyboard and wipe it with a soft cloth, dipped in cleaner or water, gently.*
2. *In case any liquid enters the keyboard, shut off the power supply immediately, remove the batteries and contact the original manufacturer directly for repair. Do not disassemble the keyboard yourself for repair.*

#### **Hard Disc Drive (HDD)**

Trouble	Solution
HDD can't be booted	The operating system is corrupted by incorrect operation or virus. Try to clean the virus and then configure your operating system correctly.
	Maybe the documents of your OS run in error; please refer to the manual of your OS.
HDD performs very slowly	There is too much file fragment. Use disk defrag tools to rearrange the programs on the hard disk.

**!** **WARNING:** Please pay attention to the following information about Hard Drive maintenance.

1. *The hard disk is a high-speed data storage device. Avoid using the Notebook in unstable locations as far as possible to prevent hard disk damage and data loss.*
2. *Please use the computer in accordance with normal startup/shutdown procedures; improper startup/shutdown may shorten the service life of the hard disk.*

#### **LCD**

Trouble	Solution
The screen is blank	Press hot key Fn + F5 to change the display mode if certain external monitor is connected. Make sure the system isn't in the mode of Hibernation or Standby.

**!** **WARNING:** Please pay attention to the below points on the mounting design of the panel for the LCD module.

1. *Do not put heavy force along the edges of the active area.*
2. *Do not put a heavy shock or stress on the panel and film surface.*
3. *Do not put heavy goods on the display panel.*
4. *The LCD screen is the most fragile component of the Notebook and is prone to damage under external forces. Do not place any object on the keyboard or between the keyboard and the screen to prevent damage to the LCD screen.*
5. *When traveling with GIGABYTE Notebook, place it in a special case in a tidy manner as far as possible. Excess objects may squeeze the machine and therefore damage the LCD screen.*
6. *Do not touch the screen with sharp objects or fingers directly.*
7. *It is recommended that the LCD screen be wiped with a special screen cleaning cloth. Wipe the screen gently to avoid breakage of the screen.*
8. *Prevent any liquid from entering the LCD screen as this may damage the elements of the LCD screen.*

**Printer**

Trouble	Solution
The data can't be output from notebook to printer	Make sure the printer is powered on. Make sure its cable is OK and its USB interface is well connected to Notebook.
Error printing	Make sure your printer is compatible with your Notebook. Please refer to the user's manual of your printer for help.

**Audio**

Trouble	Solution
	Adjust sound controller.
	Check the setting of sound volume of software.
No sound emitted	Check if the ear phone is firmly connected. Check the Devices Manager of Windows. Be sure the Sound function has been activated and isn't interfering with other hardware.

**USB**

Trouble	Solution
Equipments connected can't work	Check and be sure USB port of notebook is firmly connected with the USB cord of the equipment. Be sure the driver of the equipment is installed correctly.

**Stand by / Hibernation**

Trouble	Solution
Can't enter into Standby/ Hibernation	Please check if the Windows Media Player is running. If Yes, the notebook can't enter into Standby or Hibernation mode. Please close Windows Media Player.

**LAN**

Trouble	Solution
Can't be connected	Be sure the RJ45 connector is firmly connected to the network hub or switch.

## 5.2 Frequently Asked Questions

- ◆ My computer switches to hibernation mode much too quickly and I have to constantly hit a key or move the mouse to bring back the screen. What can I do?
  - This is part of Windows Power Management. Access Power Management by clicking on Start / Control Panel / Performance and Maintenance / then Power Options, and change the time next to the "Turn off Monitor" option to the time you want. You have the choice of either adjusting time for the power supply or for the battery.

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- ◆ I've heard that cleaning and rearranging files on the hard drive will improve program's launch speed. How do I do this?
  - Good disk maintenances can improve program launch speed. This normally includes deleting unnecessary files, and defragmenting the hard disk so the files can be more efficiently grouped. Windows contains maintenance based utilities for these tasks; run Disk Cleanup to remove unnecessary files, and Disk Defragmenter to defragment fragmented file blocks. For more info on these utilities, please refer to your Windows documentation or Windows help.

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- ◆ What kind of external microphone can I use with my notebook computer?
  - You will need to use a self-amplifying microphone.

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- ◆ There are echoes coming from my speakers. What can I do?
  - Double click on the Speaker icon on the task bar. Then, under the Microphone Balance, check the Mute box.

---

- ◆ Because of a software problem, I was unable to shut the computer down from Windows, I pressed the power button to power off the computer, but it didn't work. How can I force a power off computer switches to hibernation mode much too quickly and I have to constantly hit a key or move the mouse to bring back the screen. What can I do?
  - Make sure you press the power button for at least 5 seconds. Normally, this will force the computer to shut off completely.

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- ◆ Why can't I charge the battery of my notebook computer after it is out of use for some time?
  - After your notebook computer has not been used for a long time (for example: more than one month), the battery will enter into low voltage protection mode. Under this circumstance, restoring to normal voltage will require the battery to be slowly charged for several hours. Once the battery has been fully charged, your computer will resume to normal operation.

- ◇ My computer says: “CMOS Battery Low”, what should I do?
- If your computer is without power (i.e. unplug the computer power source from the power outlet and remove the battery pack from it) for over 45 days, you would lose the information stored in CMOS. Please follow the steps below to reconfigure your CMOS settings:
  - step1. Press F2 to enter into the BIOS setup utility.
  - step2. Select “Load Optional Defaults?” When you see the following prompt, choose <OK> and then press <Enter>.
  - step3. Select “Save Changes and Exit”, select <OK> and press <Enter> to restart your computer

◇ How to unplug or eject devices?

- 1. In the notification area next to your task bar, double-click on the Safe Removal icon. Safe removal displays a list of Plug and Play devices that support safe removal and that are currently attached to the system. If you do not see the Safe Removal icon, your device does not support safe removal, and you cannot unplug or eject your device using Safe Removal.
- 2. In Safely Remove Hardware, in the list of devices, select the device that you want to unplug or eject, and then click on Stop. This tells the system that you will be unplugging or ejecting the device.
- 3. In Stop a Hardware device, click OK. A notification appears stating that it is now safe to unplug or eject the device.

Caution

- Unplugging or ejecting a device that supports safe removal without first than using the Safe Removal application to warn the system can cause data to be lost or your system to become unstable. For example, if a device is unplugged during a data transfer, data loss is likely. If you use Safe Removal, however, you can warn the system before you unplug or eject a device, preventing possible loss of data. If you use Safe Removal, however, you can warn the system before you unplug or eject a device, preventing possible loss of data.

Note

- For removable storage devices that can safely be removed while the system is on, the system disables write caching by default. It does this so the devices can be removed without loss of data. When write caching is disabled, however, the system will likely experience slower performance, so be sure to enable write caching when you have finished removing the device.

- ◇ Does the T1125 provide a hardware switch or function button to enable/disable the Bluetooth function?
- the T1125 provides a combined function button to enable/disable the 3.5G (Fn+F10) and Bluetooth (Fn+F11) functions.
- ◇ What is the capacity of SDHC cards that T1125 can support?
- The specification of SDHC that T1125 SD card reader supports shall be in accordance with that of the SD Association. Currently, the maximum capacity announced by SD Association is 32GB <http://www.sdcard.org/developers/tech/sdhc/>

- ◇ How can T1125 BIOS be upgraded in the DOS and Windows mode?
- ➔ Please refer to GIGABYTE website “How to upgrade T1125 BIOS in the DOS and Windows mode?”

### 5.3 Questions And Answers

**Q:** I can feel a mild heat next to the battery pack. Is this normal?

**A:** The battery will generate heat during recharging and discharging. There is a protection circuit inside the Notebook to prevent overheating. User needs not worry.

**Q:** My battery operation time is not as long as it should be. Why?

**A:** The battery is heat sensitive and can only be charged to its maximum if the battery and its environmental temperature remain within 15-25°C (59-77°F). The more the temperature deviates from this range during recharging, the less chance there is for the battery to be fully charged. In order to recharge the pack to its full capacity, users are requested to cool down the unit by unplugging the AC Adapter. Wait until it is cooled down. Then plug in the AC Adapter to start recharging again.

**Q:** I did not use my spare battery for a few days. Even though it was fully recharged, there wasn't as much power left as a newly charged one. Why?

**A:** The batteries will self-discharge when they are not being recharged. To make sure a battery pack is fully charged, recharge before use. Always keep the battery inside the Notebook and have the AC adapter connected whenever possible.

**Q:** I did not use my spare battery for months. I have a problem with recharging it.

**A:** If you happen to leave your battery pack to go through an extended period of self-discharge, say more than three months, the battery voltage level will become too low and needs to be Pre-Charged (to bring the battery voltage level high enough) before it automatically (for Li-Ion only) resumes its normal Fast Charge. Pre-Charge may take 30 minutes. Fast Charge usually takes 2~3 hours.

## 5.4 The Notebook Care

Through prolonged use the Notebook might become dirty or due to some form of accident require cleaning. It may also become damaged due to travel and use. Please follow the below guidelines to care for and clean the Notebook.

Ensure to always carry your Notebook in a Handy Bag or Case so that it is protected during travel and is better able to handle any of the normal bumps, knocks and drops that occur.

Should the work surface of the notebook (Palm Rest, Touch Pad etc.) become dirty, a slightly damp cloth and certified computer cleaner can be used to clean the surface. Do not use any Household or abrasive cleaners as these can damage the surface.

To clean the LCD Panel, please use a slightly damp cloth and approved LCD Cleaner ONLY. Any form of Household or abrasive cleaner can damage the LCD Panel.

In the event that any liquid is spilled in / onto the notebook immediately switch off the machine regardless of any data that might be lost, remove the AC Adaptor if plugged in and remove the battery pack. DO NOT switch the unit back on, immediately contact the provider of the notebook to arrange to have the unit dried and checked for any kind of damage.
