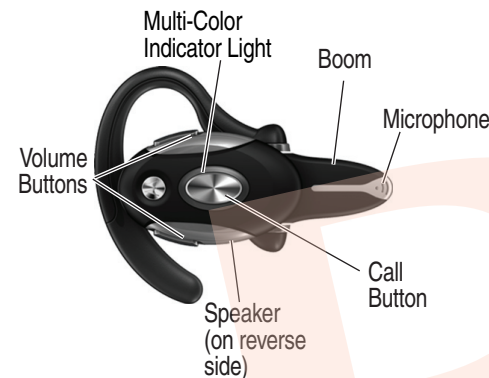




BEFORE YOU BEGIN

Before using this product, read the Important Safety and Legal Information pamphlet and follow its instructions.

Take a moment before you get started to familiarize yourself with your new H710 Headset.



1 CHARGE YOUR HEADSET

Charge your headset's battery for 2 hours:

- 1 Plug the Motorola charger into the end of the headset.

The indicator light turns red when the battery is charging. It may take up to 1 minute for the indicator light to turn on. When the headset's battery is fully charged (about 2 hours), the indicator light turns green.

- 2 Disconnect the charger.

Note: Headset is not functional while charging.

2 START BLUETOOTH FEATURE

Your Phone

Your phone's Bluetooth feature is off by default. To use your headset, you must turn on the Bluetooth feature in your phone.

For most Motorola phones (at the main menu):

- 1 Press **Menu** > **Settings** > **Connection** > **Bluetooth Link** > **Setup**.

- 2 Scroll to **Power**.

- 3 Select **Change**.

- 4 Scroll to **On**.

- 5 Press **Select** to turn on the Bluetooth feature. The Bluetooth feature remains on until you turn the feature off.

Note: These steps are for most Motorola phones. For other phones, see your phone's user's guide.

3 PAIR Your Headset and Phone

Before you can use your headset, you must pair (link) it with your phone.

Step A - ENSURE HEADSET IS IN PAIRING MODE

Power on headset by opening the headset boom to initiate easy pairing. After a few moments, the indicator light will be steadily lit in blue to indicate headset is in pairing mode.

Indicator Light (steadily blue for pairing mode)



If the headset does not enter pairing mode, see **TROUBLESHOOTING** for help.

PAIR CONTINUED Your Headset and Phone

Step B - SET YOUR PHONE TO LOOK FOR YOUR HEADSET

For most Motorola phones:

- 1 On your Motorola phone, press **Menu** > **Settings** > **Connection** > **Bluetooth Link** > **Handsfree** > **Look for Devices**.

The phone lists Bluetooth devices it finds.

- 2 Select **Motorola H710**.
- 3 Select **OK** or **Yes** to pair your headset with your phone.
- 4 Enter the passkey: **0000**
- 5 Select **OK**.

When your headset successfully pairs with your phone, the indicator light flashes purple and blue.

Note: These steps are for most Motorola phones. For other phones, see your phone's user's guide.

4 TEST AND USE

Your phone and headset are now paired and ready to make and receive calls. To confirm they are operating properly, make a call:

- 1 Place the headset over your ear.
- 2 On the phone, dial the number you want to call and press **SEND** key on your phone.
- 3 If your phone and headset are successfully paired, you will hear ringing on the headset.

After you have successfully paired your phone and headset, you don't need to repeat these steps. For daily use, ensure that your headset is turned ON and that your phone's Bluetooth feature is ON.

To save battery power, turn OFF the headset when you don't use it for an extended time by closing the boom.

USING A SECOND PHONE?

Your headset allows a simultaneous, multipoint connection to two Bluetooth phones.

To pair a second phone to your headset, follow these steps:

- 1 Turn off any phones already paired with your headset.
- 2 Turn off your headset by closing the headset boom.
- 3 Perform Step 2 ("Start Bluetooth Feature"), Step 3 ("Pair"), and Step 4 ("Test and Use") to pair your headset with your second phone.
- 4 To connect to both phones, turn on first phone.
- 5 Close the headset boom and then re-open it. The headset automatically connects to both phones.

TIPS FOR USING HEADSET WITH TWO PHONES

Use the following tips when operating the headset while connected to two phones:

- The most recently paired device connected to the headset is labeled the primary phone (the other phone is labeled the Secondary phone).
- Incoming calls can be answered from both phones. When answering a call, the idle phone is disconnected from the headset. When the call ends, connection to idle phone is automatically reestablished.
- Voice dial calls can be made from either phone. Use different key actions to select which phone to make a voice dial call (see "Making Calls" for details).
- Redialing a last call dials the number on the phone with the last outgoing call.

TROUBLESHOOTING

My headset will not enter pairing mode. Make sure that any devices previously paired with the headset are turned off. If the indicator light is flashing in blue, first turn off the other device, then close and reopen the headset boom. The indicator light becomes steadily lit in blue indicating the headset is now in pairing mode.

My phone doesn't find my headset. Make sure the indicator light on your headset is on (lit in blue) and steady when your phone is searching for devices (see step 3).

My headset worked before but now it's not working. Make sure your phone is on and the Bluetooth feature is turned on in your phone (see step 2). If the Bluetooth feature was turned off or was turned on only temporarily, you may need to restart the Bluetooth feature (see step 2) and pair your phone and headset again (see step 3).

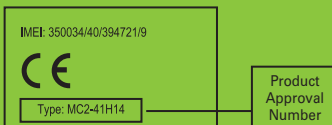

TURNING HEADSET ON AND OFF

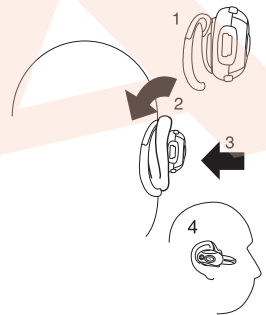
To turn your headset on, open the headset boom. The indicator light flashes blue (if connected with a device) or is steadily lit (if ready to be paired).

To turn your headset off, close the headset boom. The indicator light will turn off.



WEARING THE HEADSET

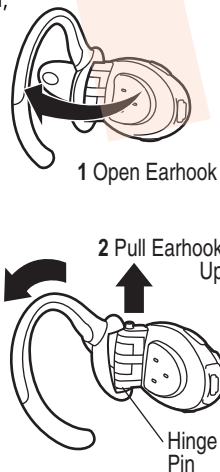
- 1 Open the headset boom, then open the earhook.
- 2 Loop the earhook over your ear.
- 3 Press the headset to your ear.
- 4 Point the headset boom towards your mouth.



CHANGING FOR USE ON OTHER EAR

You can wear your H710 headset on your left or right ear. The headset comes ready for the right ear. To change the headset for the left ear:

- 1 Open the headset boom, then open the earhook (90° from the headset).
- 2 Gently lift and pull the top of the earhook up and off the upper hinge pin. Then, pull it away to remove it.
- 3 Flip the headset over.
- 4 Hook the bottom of the earhook onto the lower hinge pin, then lift and pull the top of the earhook over the upper hinge pin.



CHANGING VOLUME BUTTON ORIENTATION

You can also change the orientation of the volume buttons on your headset.

- 1 Turn the headset power off.
- 2 Press and hold down the desired "volume up" button and open the boom. Keep the button held down until the indicator light flashes blue three times.



CHECKING BATTERY LEVEL

While turned on and not on a call, you can check your headset's battery charge level by pressing and holding both Volume buttons.

The indicator light displays charge status until you release the buttons. See "Indicator Light" for details on indicator light and charge status.

MAKING CALLS

Function	Action
Make a voice dial call (Primary phone)	Tap the Call button and speak the name after the tone
Make a voice dial call (Secondary phone)	Tap the Call button and either Volume button and speak the name after the tone
End a call	Tap the Call button
Answer a call	Open headset boom or tap the Call button (if boom is already open)
Ignore a call	Press and hold the Call button until you hear a beep

MAKING CALLS CONTINUED

Function	Action
Redial last call	Press and hold the Call button until you hear a beep
Answer a second incoming call	Press and hold the Call button (places first call on hold)
Reject second incoming call	Press and hold either Volume button until you hear a beep
Transfer a call from the headset to the phone	Press both Volume buttons and Call button
Disable the indicator light	Press and hold both Volume buttons while powering on headset
Mute or unmute a call	Tap both Volume buttons

Note: Your H710 supports both Handsfree and Headset Profiles. Accessing call functions depends upon which profile your phone supports. See your phone's user's guide for more information.

Note: Some features are phone/network dependent.

INDICATOR LIGHT

With the Charger Plugged In

Headset Indicator	Headset Status
Red	Charging (battery level less than 80% charge)
Yellow	Charging (battery level more than 80% charge)
Green	Charging complete

When Checking Battery Level

Headset Indicator	Headset Status
Red	Battery at less than 10% charge
Yellow	Battery between 10% and 80% charge
Green	Battery at more than 80% charge

INDICATOR LIGHT

With No Charger Plugged In

Headset Indicator	Headset Status
Off	Power off
Three blue flashes	Powering on/off
Steady blue	Pairing mode
Rapid blue/purple flashes	Pairing successful
Quick blue flash	Incoming/outgoing call
Slow blue pulse	Connected (on a call)
Slow blue flash	Standby (not on a call)
Slow red flash	Idle (not connected to phone)
Slow purple pulse	Connected call muted
Quick red flash	Low battery

Note: After 20 minutes on a call or of inactivity, the light stops flashing to conserve power, but the headset remains on.
