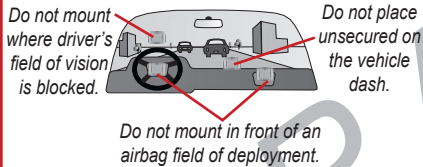

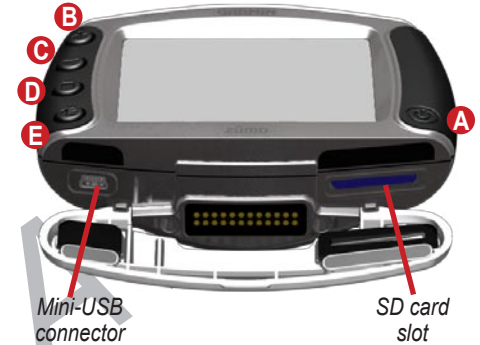
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GETTING STARTED

Looking at Your zūmo

- A** Power button
- B** Zoom in, increase volume, scroll through MP3s
- C** Zoom out, decrease volume, scroll through MP3s
- D** Page button—scroll through the Map page, Trip Computer, Music Player
- E** Volume level—use the **+** and **−** buttons to adjust the volume.

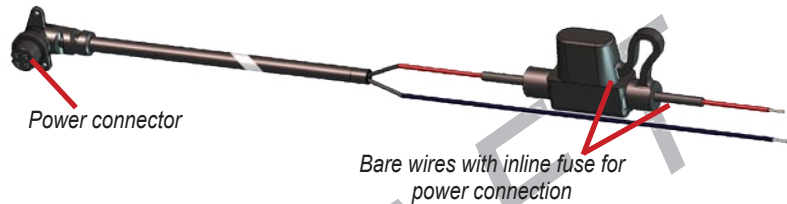

Step 1: Connecting Power to the Mount

Select a suitable location to mount the zūmo on your motorcycle based on available power sources and safe power cable routing.

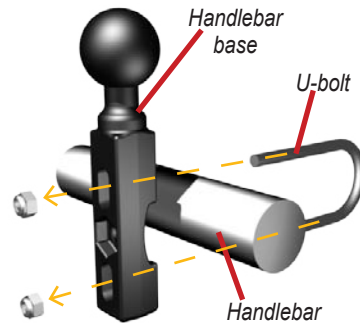


Step 2: Mounting the zūmo

This section illustrates two possible installation solutions: A) install the U-bolt on the handlebar and B) install the handlebar base to the clutch/brake clamp bracket. Custom mounts may require additional hardware (xref to Ram Web site?).

A) To install the U-bolt and handlebar base:

1. Place the U-bolt around the handlebar, and thread the ends through the handlebar base.
2. Tighten the nuts to secure the base.

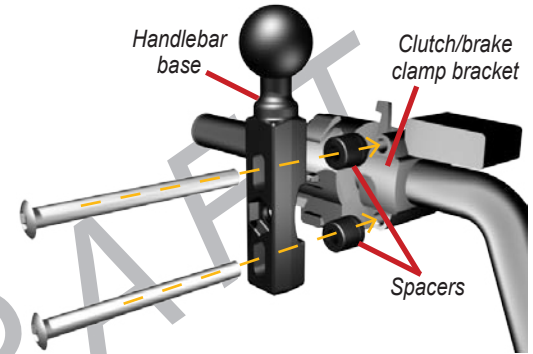


B) To install the handlebar base to the clutch/brake clamp bracket:



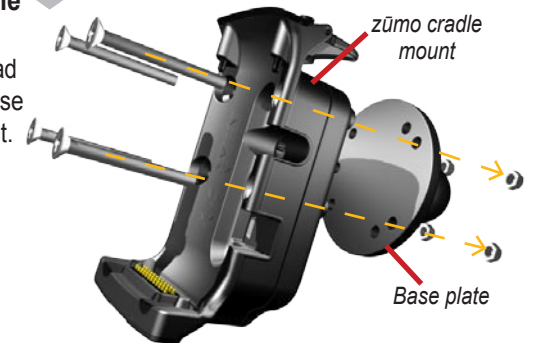
NOTE: Both 1/4" standard and M6 bolts are included. Match the size of the factory bolts on your clutch/brake clamp bracket.

1. Remove the two factory bolts on your clutch/brake clamp bracket.
2. Thread the new bolts through the handlebar base, spacers, and clamp bracket.
3. Tighten the bolts to secure the base.



To attach the base plate to the zūmo cradle mount:

1. Thread the M4 x 40mm flathead bolts and nuts to attach the base plate to the zūmo cradle mount.
2. Tighten the nuts to secure the base plate.



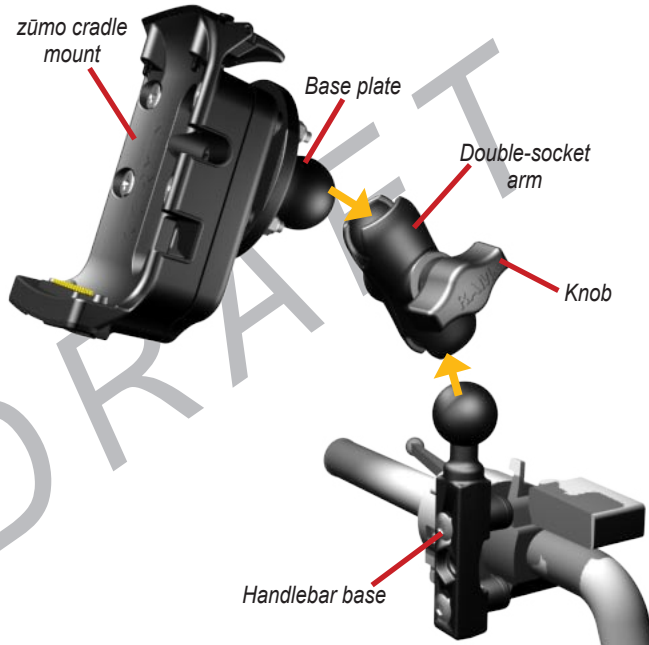
To attach the base plate to the handlebar base

1. Align the ball of the handlebar base and the ball of the base plate with the double-socket arm (shown on clutch/brake clamp bracket; same for U-clamp).

2. Tighten the knob slightly.

3. Adjust for better viewing and operation.

4. Tighten the knob to secure the mount.



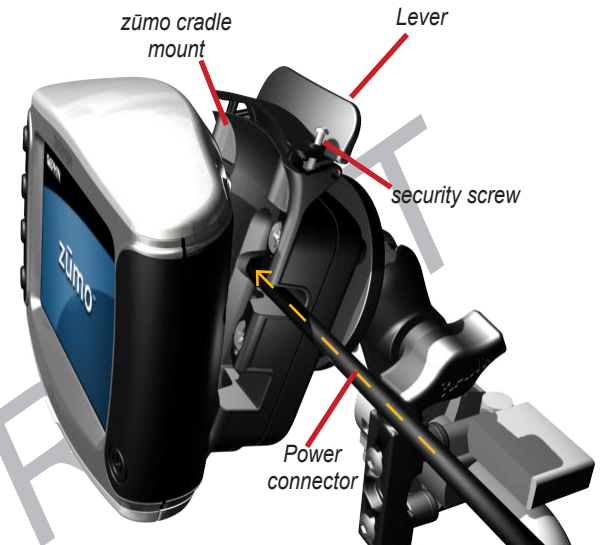
To install the zūmo into the cradle mount:

1. Plug the power connector into the side of the zūmo cradle mount.

2. Flip the lever up.

3. Place the zūmo into the cradle mount, and flip the lever down.

4. Tighten the security screw.



About the Security Screwdriver

The security screwdriver is needed to secure the zūmo to the motorcycle mount. You can connect the screwdriver to your key chain for easy access.



Step 3: Configuring the zūmo

To turn on your zūmo, press and hold the  **Power** button on the side of the unit. Follow the on-screen instructions to configure your zūmo.

Step 4: Acquiring Satellites

Go outdoors to an open area, away from tall buildings and trees. Turn on the zūmo. Acquiring satellite signals may take 30–60 seconds.

The  bars in the upper-left corner indicate GPS satellite strength. When the bars are green, your zūmo has acquired satellite signals, you can start navigating.

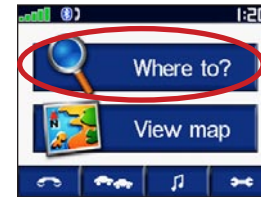
Step 5: Using the zūmo

- A** Touch to find a destination.
- B** Touch to view the map.
- C** Touch to make a call (when connected to a mobile phone with Bluetooth® wireless technology).
- D** Touch to view traffic incidents, when an FM traffic receiver is connected.
- E** Touch to listen to MP3 files loaded on the SD card or “Garmin” drive.
- F** Touch to adjust the zūmo’s settings.
- G** Touch to adjust the brightness of the screen.



Finding Your Destination

The Where to menu provides several different categories for you to use when you search for locations.



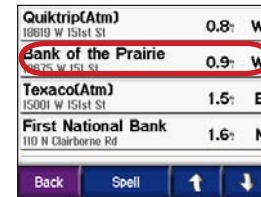
1 Touch **Where to**.



2 Select a category.



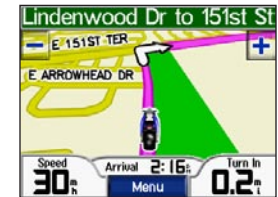
3 Select a sub-category.

5 Touch **Go**.

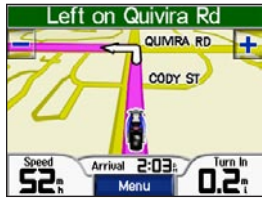

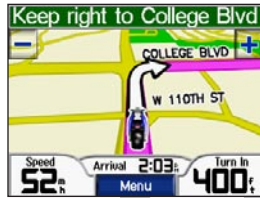

Following Your Route

As you travel, your zūmo guides you to your destination with voice prompts, arrows on the map, and directions at the top of the Map page. If you depart from the original route, your zūmo recalculates the route and provides new directions.



Your route is marked with a magenta line.



Follow the arrows as you take turns.



A checkered flag marks your destination.

Adding a Stop to Your Route

You can add a stop to your route. The zūmo gives you directions to the stop and then to your final destination.

1. With a route active, touch **Menu** on the Map page, and touch **Where to**.
2. Search for the extra stop.
3. Touch **Go**.
4. Touch **Add as Via Point** to add this stop before your destination. Or, touch **Set as new Destination** to make this your new final destination.



NOTE: You can add only one stop to your route.

Adding a Detour





If a road on your route is closed, you can take a detour.

1. With a route active, touch **Menu**.
2. Touch **Detour**.




Stopping the Route

1. With a route active, touch **Menu**.
2. Touch **Stop**.




Taking a Better Route

As you approach your destination, the zūmo evaluates road options, to find a better route. If the zūmo finds a better route,  or  appears in the right corner of the map. Touch  or  to take the better route.



Adjusting the Volume

Press the  button, and then use the  and  buttons to adjust the volume.

Adjusting the Brightness

On the Menu page, touch  > **Display** > **Brightness**. Touch  to lower the brightness and  to raise it. Touch **OK** when you are done.

Locking Your zūmo

1. On the Menu page, touch  >  **System** > Garmin Lock.
2. Touch **OK**, and enter a 4-digit PIN.
3. Touch **Yes** to accept the PIN.
4. Touch **OK**. Drive to a security location, and touch **Set**.

Each time you turn on the zūmo, enter the 4-digit PIN or drive to the security location.



What is a Security Location?

You can select any location, such as your home or office, for your security location. If you are at your security location, you do not need to enter a PIN. If you forget your PIN, drive to your security location to unlock the zūmo.

The Where to menu provides several different categories you can use to search for locations. To learn how to perform a simple search, see [page 4](#).


Finding an Address

1. From the Menu page, touch  **Where to** >  **Address**.
2. Select a state and city, if necessary.
3. Type the address number. Touch **Done**.
4. Type the street name until a list of streets appears, or touch **Done**.
5. Select the street.
6. Select a city, if necessary.
7. Select the address, if necessary. The Go page opens.
8. Touch **Go** to create a route to this address.



TIP: You can search for a **postal code**. Enter the postal code instead of the city name. (Not all map data provides postal code searching.)



TIP: Finding an intersection is very similar to finding an address. Touch  **Intersection**, and enter the two street names.

Entering Coordinates

If you know the geographic coordinates of your destination, you can use your zūmo to navigate to any location using its latitude and longitude coordinates.

From the Menu page, touch  **Where to** >  >  **Coordinates**.

Touch **Format** to change the appearance of coordinates. Because different maps and charts use different position formats, the zūmo allows you to choose the correct coordinate system for the type of map you are using.

Go Page Options


Touch an item in the search results list to view the Go page.



Touch **Go** to create a turn-by-turn route to this location.

Touch **Show Map** to view this location on the map. If the GPS is off, touch **Set Loc.** to select this place as your current location.

Touch **Save** to save this location as one of your Favorites. See [page 10](#).

If a mobile phone with Bluetooth wireless technology is connected, touch  to call this location.

Go Home



You can set a home location for the place you return to most often.

1. From the Menu page, touch  **Where to** >  **Go Home**.
2. Select an option.



Going Home

After you set your home location, you can route to it at any time by touching  **Where to** >  **Go Home**.

Changing Your Home Location



1. From the Menu page, touch  >  **User Data** > **Set Home Location**.
2. Select **Yes, enter my Address** or **Yes, use my current location**.

Finding Points of Interest

1. From the Menu page, touch  **Where to** >  **Food, Hotels.**
2. Select a category and a sub-category, if necessary. (Touch the arrows to see more categories.)
3. Select a destination.
4. Touch **Go**.

Finding a Place by Spelling the Name





If you know the name of the location you are looking for, you can spell it using the on-screen keyboard. You can also enter letters contained in the name to narrow the search.

1. From the Menu page, touch  **Where to** >  **Food, Hotels.**
2. Touch **Spell Name**.
3. Using the on-screen keyboard, enter letters in the name. Touch **Done**.
4. Touch the place you are looking for, and touch **Go**.



Using the On-Screen Keyboard

When an on-screen keyboard appears, touch a character to enter it. **Touch and slide the yellow box to scroll through the characters.**



- Touch  to enter numbers.
- Touch  to delete the last character entered; touch and hold  to delete the entire entry.
- Touch  to change the keyboard mode to use diacritical characters or special characters.

Finding Recently Found Places

Your zūmo stores the last 50 of your recent finds in the Recently Found list. The most recently viewed places appear at the top of the list. From the Menu page, touch  **Where to** >  **Recently Found** to view your recently found items.

Deleting Recently Found Places

To remove all places from the Recently Found list, touch **Clear**. Then touch **Yes**.




NOTE: When you delete recently found places, all items from the list are removed. It does not delete the actual place from your unit.



Favorites

You can save places in your Favorites, so you can quickly find them and create routes to them. Your home location is also stored in Favorites.


Saving Places You Find

1. After you have found a place you want to save, touch **Save**.
2. Touch **OK**. The place is saved in  **Favorites**.



Finding Saved Places

1. From the Menu page, touch  **Where to**.
2. Touch  **Favorites**. Your saved locations are listed.

Saving Your Current Location

From the Map page, touch the  vehicle icon. Touch **Yes** to save your current location.

Editing Saved Places

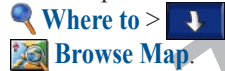
1. From the Menu page, touch  **Where to** >  **Favorites**.
2. Touch the location you want to edit.
3. Touch **Edit**.





4. Touch a button to edit the location:
 - Touch **Change Name**. Enter a new name, and touch **Done**.
 - Touch **Change Map Symbol**. Touch a new symbol.
 - Touch **Change Phone Number**. Enter a phone number, and touch **Done**.
 - Touch **Delete** to remove this item from the Favorites list. Touch **Yes**.

Finding a Place Using the Map


Use the Browse Map page to view different parts of the map. Touch



Tips for Browsing the Map

- Touch the map and drag to view different parts of the map.
- Touch  and  to zoom in and out.
- Touch any object on the map. An arrow appears pointing at the object you selected.
- Touch **Back** to return to the previous screen.
- Touch **Save** to save this location to your **Favorites**.
- Touch **Go** to navigate to the selected location.
- If the GPS is off, touch **Set Loc.** to set your location to the selected location.

Expanding Your Search

1. From the Menu page, touch  **Where to** > **Near...**
2. Select an option:
 - Where I Am Now**—searches for places near your current location.
 - A Different City**—searches for places near the city you enter.
 - My Current Route**—searches for places along the route you are currently navigating.
 - My Destination**—searches for places near your current route destination.
3. Touch **OK**.



NOTE: Your zūmo automatically searches for places near your current location.

USING THE MAIN PAGES

Map Page

On the Menu page, touch  **View map** to open the Map page. The  vehicle icon shows your current location.

To save your current location, touch the vehicle icon, and touch **Yes**.

Touch the text bar to open the Turn List page.

Touch  to zoom out.

Touch  to zoom in.

Touch **Menu** to return to the Menu page.

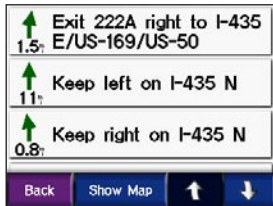
Touch **Arrival** or **Speed** to open the Trip Information page.

Touch **Turn In** to open the Next Turn page.

Trip Information Page

The Trip Information page shows your current speed and provides helpful statistics about your trip. To view the Trip Information page, touch **Speed** or **Arrival** on the Map page.

Resetting Trip Information

If you want accurate trip information, reset the trip information before beginning a trip. If you make frequent stops, leave the zūmo turned on so it can accurately measure elapsed time during the trip.

Touch **Reset Trip** to reset the information on the Trip Information page. Touch **Reset Max** to reset the maximum speed.

Touch **More** to view total time, moving time, and stopped time

Touch the fuel gauge to set/reset the fuel gauge. **Warning:** Garmin is not to blame if you run out of gas!!





Turn List Page

When you are navigating a route, the Turn List page shows turn-by-turn instructions for your entire route and the distance between turns. Touch the green text bar on the top of the Map page to open the Turn List page. Touch a turn on the list to view the Next Turn page for that turn. Touch **Show Map** to view the entire route on the Browse Map.

Next Turn Page

When you are navigating a route, the Next Turn page shows the turn on the map and the distance and time left before you reach the turn. To view an upcoming turn on the map, touch **Turn In** on the Map page, or touch any turn from the Turn List page.

Touch  and  to view other turns in the route. When you are finished viewing the Next Turn page, touch **Back**.

USING HANDS-FREE FEATURES

Using Bluetooth® wireless technology, your zūmo can connect to your mobile phone and become a hands-free device. To see if your device with Bluetooth technology is compatible with the zūmo, visit www.garmin.com/bluetooth/.

Understanding Bluetooth Technology

Bluetooth® wireless technology establishes a wireless link between devices, such as a mobile phone, wireless headset, or helmet, and the zūmo. The first time you use two devices together you must “pair” them by establishing a relationship using a PIN/passkey. After the initial pairing, the two devices can connect automatically each time you turn them on.




NOTE: You might have to set your device to connect automatically when the zūmo is turned on.

Pairing Your Device

To pair and connect, your device and the zūmo must be turned on and be within 10 meters of each other.

Initiate pairing from your zūmo or from your mobile phone. Refer to your device’s instructions.

To pair using the zūmo settings:

1. On the zūmo’s Menu page, touch  > **Bluetooth**.
2. Touch the **Add** button next to the “Connections” heading.
3. Enable your device’s Bluetooth component and enable Find Me/Discoverable/Visible mode. These settings might be in a Bluetooth, Connections, or Hands-free menu.
4. Touch **OK** on the zūmo.
5. Select your device, and touch **OK**.
6. Enter the zūmo’s Bluetooth PIN (**1234**) in your phone.
7. On the zūmo, touch and hold **Back** to return to the Menu page.

To pair using the phone settings:

1. Enable the phone’s Bluetooth component. This might be in a menu called Settings, Bluetooth, Connections, or Hands-free.
2. Initiate a search for Bluetooth devices. This might be located in a menu called Bluetooth, Connections, or Hands-free.
3. Select the zūmo from the list of devices.
4. Enter the zūmo’s Bluetooth PIN (**1234**) into your phone.
5. On the zūmo, touch and hold **Back** to return to the Menu page.

Paired and Ready

When your phone is connected to your zūmo, you are ready to make phone calls. Touch  to access the Phone menu.

When you turn on the zūmo, it tries to connect to the last phone with which it was connected.

Getting a Call

When you get a call, the Incoming Call window opens.

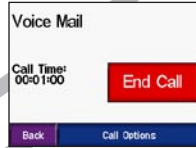


Touch **Answer** to answer the call. Touch **Ignore** to ignore the call and stop the phone from ringing.

The internal microphone is in the front of the zūmo; speak normally when on a call. Adjust the volume using the volume knob.

In a Call

After you have made or answered a call, the **In Call** icon floats in the upper-right corner of the screen. Touch **In Call**.



Touch **End Call** to hang up.

Touch **Call Options** view the following in call settings:



Mute Microphone to mute the microphone.

Touch Tones displays the __ page so you can use automated systems, such as voice mail, touch **123**. Enter the required information. Touch **Back**.

Using Call Waiting



NOTE: If your phone does not support call waiting through Bluetooth, this feature will not work.

If you get a call during a call, the Incoming Call window appears. Touch **Answer** to answer the call. The first call is placed on hold.

To switch between calls:

1. Touch **In Call** to open the In Call menu.



2. Touch **Switch To**.
3. Touch **End Call** to hang up; this does not disconnect the call on hold.

Phone Menu

On the Menu page, touch **Phone** to open the Phone menu. Press **Status** to view the connected phone's signal strength, battery level, and name.





NOTE: Not all phones support all features of the zūmo Phone menu. For example, your phone might not support voice dialing or phone book transfer.

Using Your Phone Book



NOTE: The phone book feature is only available if your phone supports phone book transfer.



Each time your mobile phone connects with the zūmo, the phone book is automatically loaded into the zūmo. It may take a few minutes for the phone book to be available.

1. On the Menu page, touch .
2. Touch  **Phone Book**.



3. Touch the phone book entry you want to call.



Dialing a Point of Interest

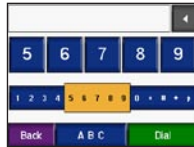
1. On the Menu page, touch .
2. Touch  **Food, Hotels**.
3. Search for the point of interest you want to call. Open the Go page.



4. Touch **Dial** or .

Dialing a Number

1. On the Menu page, touch .
2. Touch  **Dial**.





3. Enter the number, and touch **Dial**.

Viewing Your Call History



NOTE: Call History is only available if your phone supports call history transfer.



Each time your phone connects to the zūmo, your call history is automatically transferred to the zūmo. It may take a few minutes to transfer this data to the zūmo.

1. On the Menu page, touch .
2. Touch  **Call History**.
3. Touch **Missed, Dialed,** or **Received** to view those calls. The calls are listed in chronological order; the most recent calls are at the top of the list.
4. Touch an entry to place a call to it.



Calling Home

Enter a phone number for your home location, so you can quickly call home.

Entering Your Home Location and Phone Number

1. On the Menu page, touch .
2. Touch  **Call Home**.
3. If you have not set your home location ([page 8](#)), follow the prompts to set your home location. Touch **Save**.
4. Touch **Yes** to enter a phone number.
5. Enter the phone number, and then touch **Done**. The zūmo dials your home phone number.

Calling Your Home



1. On the Menu page, touch .
2. Touch  **Call Home**.
3. The zūmo dials your home phone number.

Placing Calls Using Voice Dial



NOTE: Voice dial is only available if your phone supports voice dialing.

You can place calls by speaking the contact's name.

1. On the Menu page, touch .
2. Touch  **Voice Dial**.
3. Speak the contact name.



NOTE: You may need to “train” your mobile phone to recognize your voice commands. Refer to your phone's instructions.

USING FM TRAFFIC

Your zūmo can receive and use traffic information using an optional FM TMC traffic receiver (such as the GTM 20™) or an XM Smart Antenna (such as the GXM 30™ XM Smart Antenna). When a traffic message is received, your zūmo displays the incident on the map and can change your route to avoid the traffic incident. [\[Add XM info\]](#)

To purchase an FM TMC traffic receiver, go to www.garmin.com/products/zumo500 or www.garmin.com/products/zumo550, and then click Accessories. For coverage areas, refer to at www.garmin.com/fmtraffic.



NOTE: The FM traffic receiver and zūmo must be in data range of an FM station transmitting TMC (Traffic Message Channel) data to receive traffic information.




NOTE: Garmin is not responsible for the accuracy of the traffic information. The FM traffic receiver

simply receives signals from the traffic service provider and shows that information on your zūmo.















NOTE: You can only access the traffic information if the zūmo is connected to an FM traffic receiver.

Viewing Traffic Incidents

1. On the Menu page, touch  to show a list of traffic incidents.
2. Select an item to view details.
3. Select an option.

Severity Color Code


The bars to the left of the traffic symbols indicate the traffic incident's severity:

- Green = Low severity; traffic is flowing normally.
- Yellow = Medium severity; traffic is a bit congested.
- Red = High severity; traffic is heavily congested or stopped.

Avoiding Traffic

The Map page displays  when there is a traffic incident on your current route or on the road on which you are traveling.



1. From the Map page, touch .
2. Select an item to view details.
3. Touch **Avoid**.


Purchasing an Additional Traffic Subscription

If your subscription expires, you can renew it at Garmin's FM Traffic Web site at www.garmin.com/fmtraffic. You can purchase additional subscriptions at www.garmin.com/fmtraffic.



NOTE: You do not need to activate the subscription included with your FM traffic receiver (if it came with one). The subscription activates automatically after your zūmo acquires satellite signals while receiving traffic signals from the pay service provider.

Adding a Subscription

1. On the Menu page, touch .
2. Touch  >  **Services**.
3. Touch **Add**.
4. Write down the FM traffic receiver's unit ID. Go to www.garmin.com/fmtraffic to purchase a subscription and get a code.

5. After you receive the 25-character code, touch **Next** on the zūmo, and enter the code.

6. Touch **Done**.

The traffic subscription code cannot be reused. You must obtain a new code each time you renew your service. If you own multiple FM traffic receivers, you must obtain a new code for each receiver.

You can store files, such as MP3s and JPEG image files, in the zūmo's internal memory or on an optional SD card.



NOTE: The zūmo is not compatible with Windows® 95, Windows 98, or Windows Me operating systems. This is a common limitation of most USB mass storage devices.

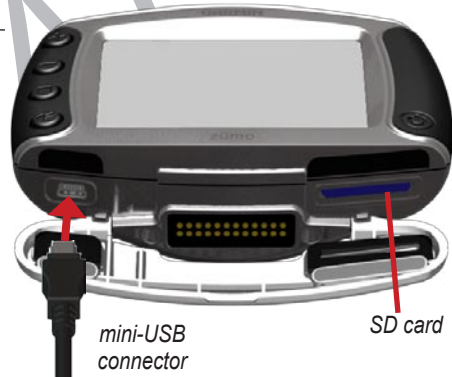
NOTE: The zūmo does not support M4A/M4P files.

Step 1: Insert an SD Card (Optional)

To insert or remove the card, press it in until it clicks.

Step 2: Connect the USB Cable

1. Plug the small end of the USB cable into the mini-USB connector.




2. Connect the larger end of the USB cable to an available USB port on your computer.

Two additional drives appear in your computer's list of drives. "Garmin" is the available storage in the zūmo's internal memory. The other removable disk drive is the SD card.



NOTE: On some operating systems, the zūmo drives may not be named automatically. See your operating system's Help file or [page 39](#) to learn how to rename the drives.

Step 3: Transfer Files to Your zūmo


1. Connect the zūmo to your computer.
2. Double-click  **My Computer**.
3. Browse your computer for the file you want to copy.
4. Highlight the file, and select **Edit > Copy**.
5. Open the "Garmin" drive or the SD card drive.
6. Select **Edit > Paste**. The file appears in the list of files on the zūmo memory or SD card.

Step 4: Eject and Unplug the USB Cable

When you are finished transferring files, double-click the  **Unplug or Eject** icon in your Windows system tray.

Select **USB Mass Storage Device**, and click **Stop**. Select the zūmo drives, and click **OK**. You can unplug the USB cable from your zūmo now.

Deleting Files from Your zūmo


With the zūmo connected to your computer, open  **My Computer**. Open the "Garmin" or SD card drive. Highlight the file that you want to delete, and press the **Delete** key on your computer's keyboard.




CAUTION: If you are not sure about a file's purpose, do **NOT** delete it. Your zūmo memory contains important system files that should **NOT** be deleted. Be especially cautious of files located in folders entitled "Garmin."


LISTENING TO MP3 FILES

Load MP3 files to the internal memory or SD card using USB Mass Storage. See [pages 22–23](#) for more information.

1. On the Menu page, touch .
2. Touch **Browse**.
3. Touch a category.
4. To play the entire category from the beginning of the list, touch **Play All**. To play starting with a specific song, touch the title.
5. Touch **Back** to exit the music page to view other pages, such as the map.



Tap  to go to the beginning of the song; touch and hold to skip back.

Tap  to skip to the next song; touch and hold to skip ahead.

Touch  to stop the song.

Touch  to pause the song.

Touch  to repeat. Touch  to shuffle.


Touch the album art to view details about the MP3 file.



NOTE: The zūmo plays MP3 files only; it does not support M4A/M4P files.

Tip about volume.

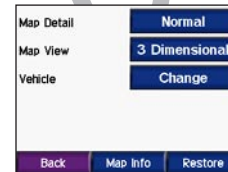

Changing the Map Settings

From the Menu page, touch  >  **Map**.



Map Detail—adjust the amount of detail shown on the map. Showing more detail may cause the map to redraw slower.

Map View—change the perspective of the map.



- **Track Up**—display the map in 2 dimensions (2D) with your direction of travel at the top.
- **North Up**—display the map in 2D with North at the top.
- **3D**—display the map in 3 dimensions (3D) in Track Up.

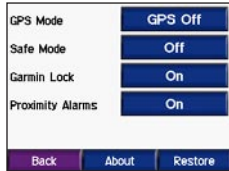
Vehicle—touch **Change** to change the icon used to show your position on the map. Touch the icon you want to use, and then touch **OK**. Download additional vehicle icons at www.garmin.com/vehicles.

Map Info—view the maps loaded on your zūmo and their version. Touch a map to enable (check mark) or disable (no check mark) that map.

Restore—restore the original map settings.

Changing the System Settings

From the Menu page, touch  >
 **System.**



GPS Mode—enable and disable GPS and WAAS/EGNOS. See www.garmin.com/aboutGPS/waas.html for information about WAAS/EGNOS.

Safe Mode—turn on or off Safe Mode. When your vehicle is moving, Safe Mode disables all functions that require significant operator attention and could become a distraction while driving.

Garmin Lock—turn on Garmin Lock™ to lock your zūmo. Enter a 4-digit PIN, and set a security location. For more information, see [page 6](#).



Proximity Alarms—turn on or off the

alerts when you approach Custom POIs. This option is only visible if you have loaded Custom POIs. See [page 35](#) for more information about Custom POIs.

About—display your zūmo's software version number, unit ID number, and audio version number. You need this information when you update the system software (see [page 33](#)) or purchase additional map data (see [page 33](#)).

Restore—restore the system settings.

Localizing Your zūmo


From the Menu page, touch  >
 **Locale.**





To change a setting, touch the button next to the icon.

To change all settings, touch **Change All**. In each screen, touch the button next to the setting you want, and then touch **Next**.

Locale—select your location.

 **Text Language**—change all on-screen text to the selected language. Changing the text language does not change the language of user-entered data or map data, such as street names.

 **Voice Language**—change the language for voice prompts. Languages noted with a person's name are text-to-speech (TTS) voices, which have an extensive vocabulary and pronounce the street names as you approach turns. The pre-recorded voices (those without a person's name) have a limited vocabulary and do not speak names of locations or streets.



 **Time Format**—choose a 12-hour, 24-hour, or UTC time format.

Time Zone—select a time zone or nearby city from the list.

Daylight Saving—set to **On**, **Off**, or **Auto**, if it is available.

 **Units**—change units of measure to **Kilometers** or **Miles**.


Customizing the Display

From the Menu page, touch  >
 **Display.**





Color Mode—select **Daytime** for a light background, **Nighttime** for a dark background, or **Auto** to automatically switch between the two.

Splash Screen—select an image to be shown when you turn on the zūmo. First, load JPEG images. See [pages 22–23](#).

Screen Shot—enable Screen Shot mode. Touch the  camera icon to take a picture of the screen. The picture bitmap file is saved in the **Garmin\scrn** folder on the “Garmin” drive.

Changing the Navigation Settings

From the Menu page, touch  >  **Navigation**.



Route Preference—select a preference for calculating your route. Select **Faster Time** to calculate routes that are faster to drive but can be longer in distance. Select **Shorter Distance** to calculate routes that are shorter in distance but can take more time to drive.



Vehicle Type—specify your vehicle type to optimize routes.

Avoidances—select the road types you want to avoid on your routes. The zümo uses these road types only if alternative routes take you too far out of your way or if no other roads are available. If you have an FM traffic receiver, you can also avoid traffic incidents.

Attention Tone—turn on or off the attention tone.

Restore—restore the original navigation settings.

Bluetooth Technology Settings

From the Menu page, touch  >  **Bluetooth**.

Connections—select a device to connect to. Select **Add Device** to pair with a mobile phone that has Bluetooth® wireless technology. See [pages 14–17](#).

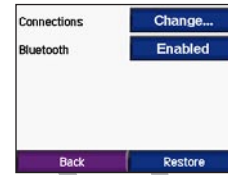
Touch **Change** if you want to connect to a different phone in the list. Select your phone, and touch **OK**.




NOTE: The zümo’s PIN code (or passkey) is **1234**.

Drop—select the phone you want to disconnect, and touch **Yes**.

Remove—select the phone you want to delete from the zümo’s memory, and touch **Yes**.




Bluetooth—enable and disable the Bluetooth component. The  **Bluetooth** icon appears on the Menu page if the Bluetooth component is enabled. To prevent a phone from automatically connecting, select **Disabled**.

Friendly Name—touch **Edit** to enter a friendly name that identifies your zümo on mobile phones with Bluetooth technology. Touch **Done**.

Restore—restore the original Bluetooth settings. Restoring the Bluetooth settings does not clear the pairing information.

Restoring All Settings

1. From the Menu page, touch  >
2. Touch **Restore**.

Clearing User Data



CAUTION: This deletes all user-entered information.

1. Hold your finger on the lower-right corner of the zümo’s screen while turning on the zümo.
2. Keep your finger pressed until the pop-up window appears.
3. Touch **Yes** to clear all user data. All original settings are restored. Any items that you have saved are erased.

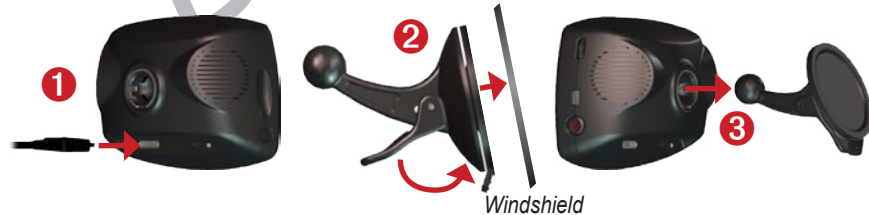
APPENDIX

Installing the zūmo in your automobile

Your zūmo 550 includes an additional cradle mount for your automobile so you can easily transfer the unit. Select a suitable location in your vehicle for safe power cord routing and safe operation.

To install the zūmo into the auto mount:

1. Place the suction cup on the windshield. Flip the lever back, toward the windshield.
2. Place zūmo into the cradle mount
3. Plug the power cable into the side of the zūmo cradle mount.



4. Snap the socket on the back of the zūmo onto the ball on the end of the suction cup arm.
5. Plug the power cable into a power receptacle in your vehicle. Your unit should turn on automatically if it is plugged in and your vehicle is running.

To remove the zūmo from the mount, turn the zūmo as far as you can to the right or left. Apply pressure in that direction until the zūmo snaps off the mount.

To remove the suction cup from the windshield, flip the lever toward you. Pull the tab on the suction cup toward you.

Mounting on Your Dashboard

Use the enclosed mounting disk to mount your unit to the dashboard and to comply with certain state regulations.



Important: The **permanent** mounting adhesive is extremely difficult to remove after it is installed.

To install the mounting disk:

1. Clean and dry the dashboard where you are placing the disk.
2. Remove the backing from the permanent mounting adhesive on the bottom of the disk.
3. Place the disk on the dashboard.
4. Place the suction cup mount on top of the disk. Flip the lever down (toward the disk).



Resetting Your zūmo

If your unit locks up (freezes up), press and hold the  **Power** button and tap the  **Page** key.



NOTE: If you need to reset your unit often, update the system software. See [page 33](#) for information about updating the software.

Caring for Your zūmo

Your zūmo contains sensitive electronic components that can be permanently damaged if exposed to excessive shock or vibration. To minimize the risk of damage to your zūmo, avoid dropping your unit and operating it in high-shock and high-vibration environments.

Cleaning the Unit

The zūmo is constructed of high-quality materials and does not require user maintenance other than cleaning. Clean the unit's outer casing (not the touch screen) using a cloth dampened with a mild detergent solution, and then wipe dry. Avoid chemical cleaners and solvents that can damage plastic components.

Cleaning the Touch Screen

Clean the touch screen with a soft, clean, lint-free cloth. Use water, isopropyl alcohol, or eyeglass cleaner, if needed. Apply the liquid to the cloth, and then gently wipe the touch screen.

Protecting Your zūmo

- Carry and store your zūmo in the included carrying case.
- Do not store the zūmo where prolonged exposure to extreme temperatures can occur (such as in the trunk of a car), because it can cause permanent damage.
- **Do not expose the zūmo to water. Contact with water can cause this unit to malfunction.**
- Though a PDA stylus can also be used to operate the touch screen, never attempt this while operating a vehicle. Never use a hard or sharp object to operate the touch screen or damage may result.

Avoiding Theft

- To avoid theft, remove the zūmo and mount from sight when not in use. Remove the mark on the windshield left by the suction cup.
- Do not keep your unit in the glove compartment; thieves know where to look.
- Register your product at www.garmin.com/registration. This may help if your unit is stolen.
- Use the Garmin Lock™ feature. See [page 6](#).

Changing the Fuse

An AGC/3AG 2-Amp, high-breaking capacity, 1500 A-rated fuse is located at the tip of the vehicle adapter. Periodically, you may need to change the fuse. Unscrew the black, round end piece, and replace the fuse.



Charging the zūmo

To charge the zūmo, connect the power cable to the zūmo and a power source.

Calibrating the Screen

If the touch screen is not responding properly, calibrate the touch screen. Turn the unit off. Press and hold the **Power** button for about one minute until the Calibration screen appears. Follow the on-screen instructions.

Using a Remote Antenna

You can use an optional external remote antenna (Garmin GA 25MCX). To purchase, go to the Garmin Web site at www.garmin.com/products/sp550, and click the **Accessories** link.

Remove the weather cap from the antenna connector located on the left side of the zūmo, and connect the antenna.

Updating the zūmo Software



Use WebUpdater to update your zūmo software. Go to www.garmin.com/products/webupdater/ to download the WebUpdater program.

After downloading WebUpdater to your computer, connect your zūmo to your computer, run WebUpdater, and follow the screen prompts. After confirming that you want to perform an update, WebUpdater automatically downloads the update and installs it on your zūmo.

If you register your zūmo, you will receive notification of software and map updates. To register your zūmo, go to www.garmin.com/registration/.

You can also download software updates from www.garmin.com/products/zumo550. Click **Software Updates**. Click **Download** next to the unit software. Read and agree to the terms. Click **Download**. Select **Run** (or **Open**). Your software is updated.

Purchasing and Loading Additional MapSource Maps

To find out the version of the maps that are loaded on your zūmo, open the Menu page. Touch  >  **Map** > **Map Info**. To enable additional maps, you need your unit ID (see [page 26](#)) and serial number (see [page vi](#)).

Check www.garmin.com/unlock/update.jsp to see if an update for your map software is available.



You can also purchase additional MapSource map data from Garmin and load the maps on your zūmo's internal memory or on an optional SD card.

To load maps to your zūmo memory or SD card, select the name for your "Garmin" drive or SD card drive. Refer to the MapSource Help file for more information about using MapSource and loading maps on your zūmo.

Using the Garmin Travel Guide™

Much like a paper travel guide, the Garmin Travel Guide provides detailed information about places, such as restaurants and hotels. To purchase the Travel Guide accessory, go to the Garmin Web site at www.garmin.com/extras. You can also contact your Garmin dealer to purchase accessories.

To use the Travel Guide:

1. Insert the SD card into your zūmo.
2. Touch  **Where to** >  **Extras**.
3. Touch the Travel Guide.
4. Touch a category. Touch a sub-category, if necessary.
5. Touch a location in the list.
6. Do one of the following:
 - Touch **Go** to go to the location.
 - Touch **Map** to show this item on a map.
 - Touch **Save** to save this location in your Favorites.

Touch **More** to view more information about the location.

Custom POIs (Points of Interest)

Load custom points of interest (POIs) onto your zūmo. POI databases are available from various companies on the Internet. Some custom databases contain alert information for points, such as safety cameras and school zones. You will receive a warning if you are traveling too fast near these custom POIs.

Use the Garmin POI Loader to load POIs into your unit. Download the POI Loader from www.garmin.com/extras.

Using the POI Loader program, you can store the Custom POIs on your “Garmin” drive or your SD card. You can also customize the proximity alert settings for each POI using the POI Loader. Refer to the POI Loader Help file for more information; press F1 to open the Help file.

To view your Custom POIs, touch  **Where to** >  **Extras** > **Custom POIs**.


To delete the Custom POIs from your zūmo, connect your zūmo to your computer. Open the **Garmin\poi** folder in the “Garmin” drive or the SD card drive. Delete the file entitled **poi.gpi**.
