

Operating the Infotainment System



Using Device Applications

Application icons are always located at the top of the screen. The icons display information about features on the device. Select the icons to change settings or view additional information.

	Select to set or change media type.
	Select for navigation options.
	Select for phone or Bluetooth®.
	Select to change settings.

Steering Wheel Controls

NOTE: Steering wheel controls may not be available in all vehicles or models.



- Select **①** to mute the volume.
- Select **②** to change the media type.
- Select **③** to adjust the volume.
- Select **④** to find radio stations or skip tracks.
- Select **⑤** to turn the volume up or down.
- Turn **⑥** to adjust the volume or press to turn off system.
- Use **⑦** to connect compatible external devices to system.
- Insert SD card in **⑦**.
- Select **①** to activate Voice Command.
- Insert a CD in **②**.
- Select **③** to eject a CD.
- Select icons on **④** to change system applications.

Additional Steering Wheel Controls

- Select ① to activate Voice Command (page 17).
- Select ② to talk on Bluetooth-connected phone.
- Select ③ to end phone call.

Multi-function Knob



You can permanently damage your ears and lose hearing if you listen to the device at a high volume. The volume is typically too loud if you cannot hear people speaking around you. Limit the amount of time you listen at high volume. If you experience ringing in your ears or muffled speech, stop listening and have your hearing checked.

- Turn ① to adjust the volume.
- Press ② to turn off system.

Satellite Signals

After the Infotainment System is turned on, it begins acquiring satellite signals. The system may need a clear view of the sky to acquire satellite signals. When at least one of the bars is green, your system has acquired satellite signals.

- Select to select the keyboard language mode.
- Select to enter special characters, such as punctuation marks.
- Select to change character capitalization.

Setting Your Locale

You must set a locale the first time you use the Infotainment System.

- 1 Select a country, and select **OK**.



- 2 Select **Agree**.

Resetting Your Locale

To reset your local, you must restore the Infotainment System to the factory default settings.

- 1 Select .
- 2 If necessary, select a settings category.
- 3 Select **Restore >Yes**.
- 4 Select a country, and select **OK**.

Using the On-screen Buttons

- Select to return to the previous page.
- Hold to quickly return to the main application page.
- Select or to see more choices.
- Hold or to scroll faster.

Using the On-screen Keyboard

See "Language and Keyboard Settings" to change the keyboard layout (page 31). Select a character on the keyboard to enter a letter or number.

- Select to add a space.
- Hold to delete a character.

The detailed maps loaded in your Infotainment System contain locations, such as restaurants, hotels, and auto services. You can use categories to browse for nearby businesses and attractions.

Finding a Location by Category

- 1 Select > Where To?.
- 2 Select a category.
- 3 If necessary, select a subcategory.
- 4 Select a location.

Searching Within a Category

To narrow your search results, you can search within some categories.

- 1 Select > Where To?.
- 2 Select a category.
- 3 If necessary, select a subcategory.
- 4 If necessary, select Spell.

Finding Fuel Stations

You can find nearby fuel stations.

- 1 Select > Where To? > Points of Interest > Fuel.
- 2 Select a fuel station.

Finding an Address

NOTE: The order of the steps may change depending on the map data loaded on your device.

- 1 Select > Where To? > Address.
- 2 Select a city.
- 3 Enter the address number, and select Done.
- 4 Enter the street name, and select Done.
- 5 If necessary, select Searching In to change the city, state, or province.
- 6 If necessary, select the city, the state, or the province.
- 7 If necessary, select the address.

Finding a Location Using the Map

You can find places included in the map data, such as restaurants, hospitals, and fuel stations.

- 1 Select > Browse Map.
- 2 Drag and zoom the map to display the area to search.
- 3 If necessary, select a category icon to view only a specific category of places.
- 4 Select a point, such as a street, intersection, or address location.
- 5 If necessary, select the map information box to view additional information.

Finding the Search Area

NOTE: By default, your device finds locations closest to your current location. You can find a location near another city or location.

- 1 Select > Where To? > Near.
- 2 Select an option.
- 3 If necessary, select a location.

- 5 If necessary, select the street.

You can set your home location for the location you return to most often.

- 1 Select **▲** > Where To? > Go Home.
- 2 Select Enter My Address, Use My Current

Location, or Recently Found.

The location is saved as "Home" in the Saved menu (page 15).

Editing Your Home Location Information

- 1 Select **▲** > Where To? > Go Home.
- 2 Select Enter My Address, Use My Current
- 3 Select **▲** > Where To? > Favorites > Home.
- 4 Select the information box on the map.
- 5 Select Edit.
- 6 Enter your changes.
- 7 Select Done.

Setting a Simulated Location

- If you are not receiving satellite signals, you can use the Infotainment System to set a simulated location.
- 1 Select **▲** > System.
 - 2 Select GPS Simulator > On > OK.
 - 3 Select **▲** > View Map.
 - 4 Select an area on the map.
 - 5 Select Set Location.

Going Home

Select **▲** > Where To? > Go Home.

Finding Recently Found Places

Your device stores the last 50 locations you have found.

- 1 Select **▲** > Where To? > Recently Found.
- 2 Select a location.

Clearing the List of Recently Found Places

Select Where To? > Recent > Clear > Yes.

Starting a Route to a Saved Location

- 1 Select **▲** > Where To? > Favorites.
- 2 If necessary, select a category, or select All Saved Places.
- 3 Select a location.
- 4 Select Go!.

Editing a Saved Location

- 1 Select **▲** > Where To? > Favorites.
- 2 If necessary, select a category.
- 3 Select a location.
- 4 Select More Information > Edit.
- 5 Select an option:
 - Select Name.
 - Select Phone Number.
 - To assign categories to the Favorite, select Categories.
 - To change the symbol used to mark the Favorite on a map, select Change Map Symbol.
- 6 Edit the information.
- 7 Select Done.

Saving Your Current Location

From the map, select the vehicle icon.

- 2 Select Save.
- 3 Enter a name, and select Done.
- 4 Select OK.

- 4 Select More Information > Delete.
- 5 Select Yes.

Planning a Trip

You can use the trip planner to create and save a trip with multiple destinations.

- 1 Select Trip Planner.
- 2 Select .
- 3 Select Start Location.
- 4 Search for a location (page 14).
- 5 Select Select.
- 6 To add additional locations, select .
- 7 Select Next.
- 8 Enter a name, and select Done.

Editing a Trip Itinerary

- 1 Select Trip Planner.
- 2 Select a saved trip.
- 3 Select an option:
 - Select a location in the trip to change the arrival or departure time.
 - Select a location in the trip, and then select Duration to record how long you stay at a location.
 - Select a travel time to change the route preference for that portion of the trip.
 - Select Map to view the trip on the map.
- 4 Select an option:
 - Select Edit Destinations to add and delete locations, or to change the order of locations.
 - Select Delete Trip.
 - Select Rename Trip.

Navigating to a Saved Trip

- 1 Select Trip Planner.
- 2 Select a saved trip.
- 3 Select Go!.
- 4 If prompted, select Next Destination.
- 5 Select Start.

Editing a Saved Trip

- 1 Select Trip Planner.
- 2 Select a saved trip.
- 3 Select Edit.
- 4 Select an option:
 - Select Edit Destinations to add and delete locations, or to change the order of locations.
 - Select Delete Trip.
 - Select Rename Trip.

Optimizing a Saved Trip

- You can arrange the stops on your trip in the most efficient order.

 - 3 Select Optimize.

Starting a Route Using Voice Command

You can say the names of popular, well-known locations.

About Voice Command

NOTE: Voice Command is not available for all languages and regions, and may not be available on all models.

Voice Command allows you to use your device by saying words and commands. The Voice Command menu provides voice prompts and a list of available commands.

Activating Voice Command

Select on the upper-left corner of the device (page 12).

appears in the upper-right corner of the screen.

Voice Command Tips

- Speak in a normal voice directed at the Infotainment System.
- Reduce background noise, such as voices or the radio, to increase the accuracy of the voice recognition.
- Speak commands as they appear on the screen.
- Respond to voice prompts as needed.
- Listen for two tones to confirm when the system enters and exits Voice Command mode.

Starting a Route

- 1 Search for a location (page 14).
- 2 Select a location.
- 3 Select **Go!**.
- 4 If necessary, select an option.
- 5 If necessary, select a route.

Following a Route

The route is marked with a magenta line. A checkered flag marks your destination.

As you travel, the navigation system guides you to the destination with voice prompts, arrows on the map, and directions at the top of the map. If you depart from the original route, the device recalculates the route and provides new directions.



Adding a Point to a Route

Before you can add a stop to a route, you must be navigating a route.

- 1 While navigating a route, select to return to the main menu.
- 2 Select **Where To?**.
- 3 Search for the location (page 14).
- 4 Select **Go!**.
- 5 Select **Add to Active Route**.

Taking a Detour

While navigating a route, you can use detours to avoid obstacles ahead of you, such as construction zones.

NOTE: If the route you are currently navigating is the only reasonable option, your device might not calculate a detour.

Select > **Detour**.

Stopping a Route

Select > **Stop**.

Using myTrends

Before you can use this feature, you must save at least one location and enable the travel history feature (page 31).

Using the myTrends™ feature, your navigation system predicts your destination based on your travel history, the day of the week, and the time of day. After you have driven to a saved location several times, the location may appear in the navigation bar on the map, along with the estimated time of travel, and traffic information.

Changing the Map Perspective

2 If the zoom controls are hidden, select the map to display the zoom controls.

3 Select the map to switch to browsing mode.

Map buttons appear.

- To rotate the map view, select .

• To switch between North Up and 3-D views, select .

• To center the map on your current location, select .

Viewing the Entire Route on the Map

1 While navigating a route, select the navigation bar at the top of the map.


2 Select **Map**.

Viewing the Next Turn

While navigating a route, a preview of the next turn, lane change, or other maneuver appears in the upper-left corner of the map.

The preview includes the distance to the turn or maneuver and the lane in which you should be traveling, if available.

From the map, select to view the next turn on the map.



The details for the turn appear. If available, an image of the junction appears for junction on major roadways.



Map Pages

Viewing Junctions

While navigating a route, you can view the junctions on many major roadways. When you approach a junction in a route, the image of that junction appears briefly, if available.

From the map, select to view the junction, if available.



Viewing Traffic Alerts

While you navigate a route with an active traffic subscription, traffic alerts may appear.

Select the alert to view more information.

Viewing Current Location Information

You can use the Where Am I? page to view information about your current location. This feature is helpful if you need to tell emergency personnel your location.

Select > Where Am I?.

Finding Nearby Services

You can use the Where Am I? page to find nearby services, such as hospitals, police stations, and fuel.

- From the map, select **Where Am I?**.
- Select a category.
- Select a location.



Viewing Trip Information

The trip information page displays your present speed and provides statistics about your trip.

From the map, select **Speed**.



Hands-Free Phone Calls

Hands-Free Phone Calls

Using Bluetooth® wireless technology, your Infotainment System can connect to your mobile phone to become a hands-free device.

Your phone may not support all of the hands-free phone features Infotainment System provides.

Using the Hands-Free Phone Menu

Select



- Select **①** to make a call.
- Select **②** to change phone or disable Bluetooth connection.
- Select **③** to view call history.
- Select **④** to call Home.
- Select **⑤** to call a POI.
- Select **⑥** to view and call contacts.
- Select **⑦** to view phone messages.

Pairing Your Phone

Before you can use hands-free calling, you must pair your device with a compatible mobile phone. Pairing your phone with your device allows your phone and device to recognize each other and connect quickly.

- 1 Place your phone and your device within 33 ft. (10 m) of each other.
- 2 Select > **Bluetooth > Enabled > OK** to enable Bluetooth technology.
- 3 Select **Add**.
- 4 On your phone, enable Bluetooth wireless technology.
- 5 Select **OK**.

A list of nearby Bluetooth devices appears.

- 6 Select your phone from the list, and select **OK**.
- 7 If necessary, on your phone, confirm that the device is allowed to connect.
- 8 If necessary, enter the device Bluetooth PIN (1234) into your phone.

Disconnecting Your Phone

- 1 Select > **Bluetooth > Enabled**.
- 2 Select **Disabled > OK**.

Your phone is disconnected from your device but remains paired with your device.

Tips After Pairing the Devices

- After the initial pairing, the system and your phone can connect automatically each time you turn them on.
- When your phone is connected to the system, you are ready to make phone calls.
- When you turn on the Infotainment System, it tries to connect to the last phone to which it was connected.

- You might need to set your mobile phone to connect to the system automatically when the system is turned on.

Placing a Call

Your Infotainment System and phone must be paired before you can place a call using the hands-free feature.

Dialing a Number

- 1 Select > **Dial**.
- 2 Enter the number.
- 3 Select **Call**.

Calling a Contact in Your Phone Book

- Your phone book is loaded from your phone to the device each time your phone and the device connect. It may take a few minutes for the phone book to be available. Some phones do not support this feature.

 - 3 Select **Call**.

- To mute the microphone, select **Mute Mic**.
- To hang up, select **End Call**.
- Select ① to end a call.
- Select ② to place a call on hold.
- Select ③ to mute a call.
- Select ④ to view the keypad.
- Select ⑤ to add a call for a conference.
- Select ⑥ to view contacts.
- Select ⑦ to switch to the phone.

Receiving a Call

Your call history is loaded from your phone to the device each time your phone and the device connect. It may take a few minutes for the call history to be available. Some phones do not support this feature.

- 2 Select a category.
- A list of calls appears, with the most recent calls at the top.
- 3 Select a call.

Traffic on Your Route

When calculating your route, the system examines the current traffic and automatically optimizes the route for the shortest time. If a severe traffic delay occurs on your route while you are navigating, the system automatically recalculates the route.

Your system may route you through a traffic delay if a better alternative route does not exist. The delay time is added into your estimated time of arrival automatically.

Viewing Traffic on Your Route

- 1 While navigating a route, select
- 2 Select **Traffic Search**.

A list of traffic events appears, organized by their location on the route.

- 3 Select an event.

Manually Avoiding Traffic on Your Route

When you are receiving traffic information, a traffic icon appears on the map. The traffic icon changes color to indicate the severity of traffic conditions on your route or on the road you are currently traveling.

Color	Severity	Meaning
Green	Low	Traffic is flowing freely.
Yellow	Medium	Traffic is moving but there is a delay. There is moderate traffic congestion.
Red	High	Traffic is not moving or moving slowly. There is a severe delay.
Gray	No signal	Traffic information is not available.

Taking an Alternate Route

- 1 While navigating a route, select .
- 2 Select **Alternate Route**.
- 3 Select a route.

Viewing Traffic on the Map

The traffic map shows color-coded traffic flow and delays on nearby roads.

- 1 From the map, select .
- 2 Select **Traffic Conditions**.

Traffic in Your Area

Searching for Traffic Delays

- 1 From the map, select .
- 2 Select **Traffic Conditions**.
- 3 Select an item in the list.
- 4 If there is more than one delay, use the arrows to view additional delays.

Receiving Traffic Data

When you have a traffic subscription and your vehicle is within a traffic coverage area, the Infotainment System displays traffic information.

About the Traffic Icon

When you are receiving traffic information, a traffic icon appears on the map. The traffic icon changes color to indicate the severity of traffic conditions on your route or on the road you are currently traveling.

 - 4 Write down the Infotainment System unit ID.
 - 5 Go to www.garmin.com/suzuki to purchase a subscription and get a 25-character code.
- The traffic subscription code cannot be reused. You must obtain a new code each time you renew your service. If you own multiple FM traffic receivers, you must obtain a new code for each receiver.


