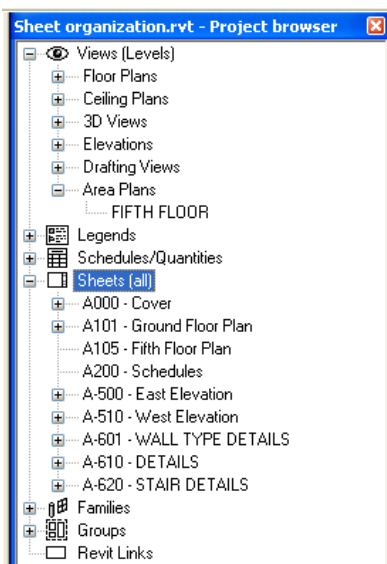

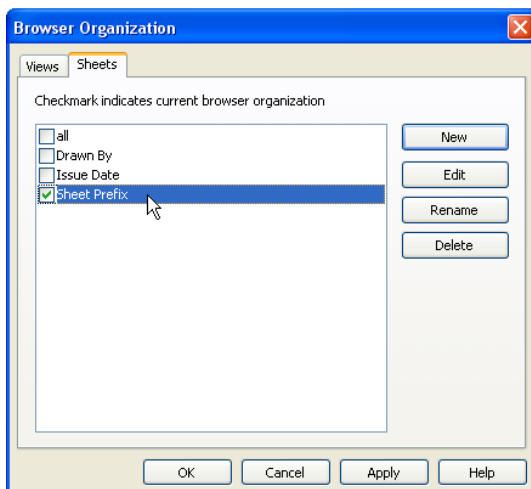

As your project grows, so does the list in your project browser. Let's take a look at how we can manage the sheets in this list.



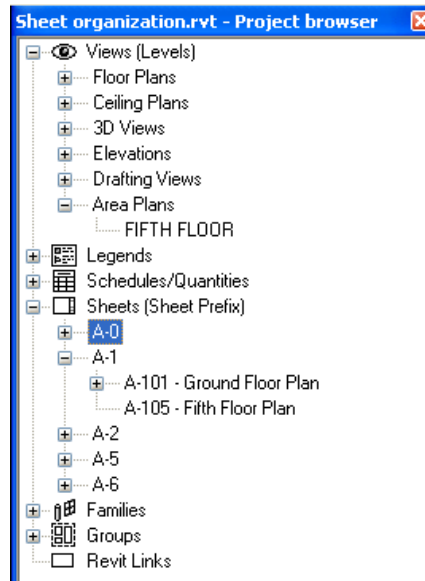
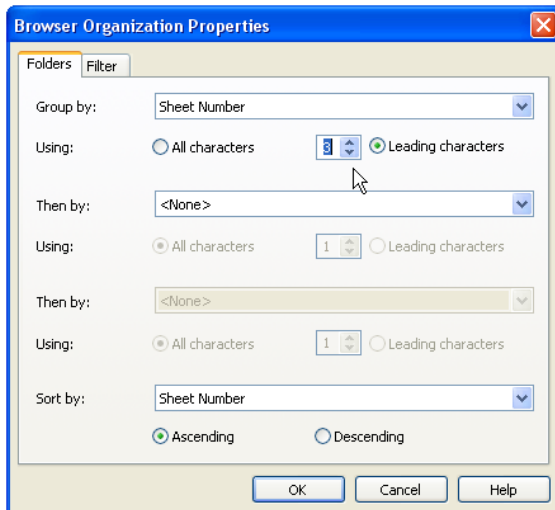
Out of the box organization

From the Settings pulldown, select Browser Organization. Select the sheets tab and then select Sheet Prefix.

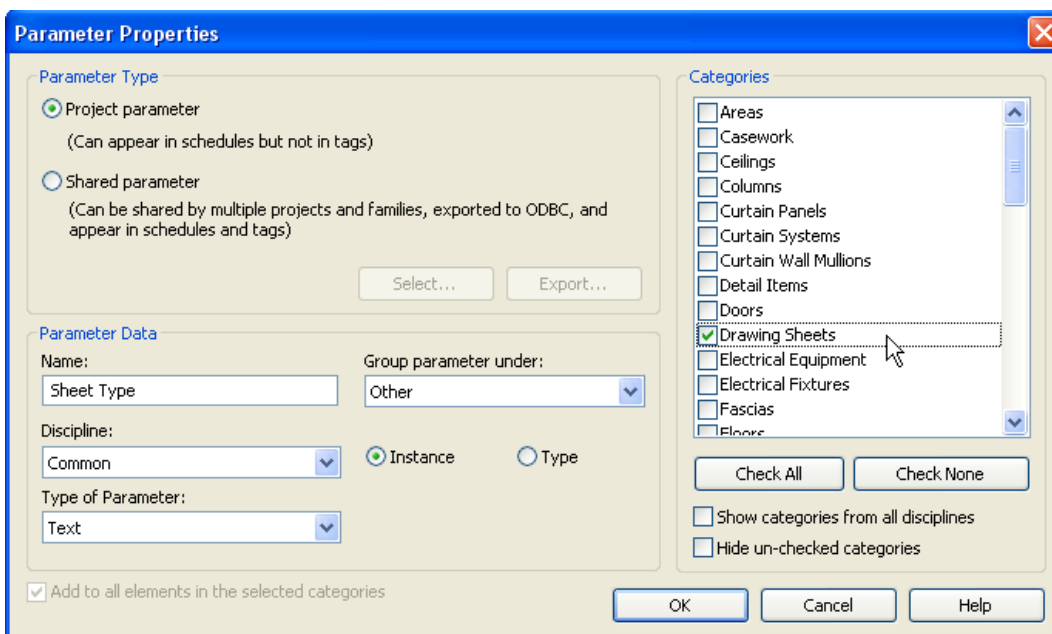
After selecting the edit button, increase the number of leading characters to 3, to match the AIA sheet naming convention of Discipline and Sheet number.



Now you are able to see the sheet series and then expand that out in order to see all the sheets.

If you want to take it a step further, you can add a parameter for sheet type. This will allow you to have schematic design sheets and construction documents, etc. all live together happily.

From the Settings pulldown, select project parameters and select add. Create the sheet type parameter and select the category of drawing sheets.

Now change your Browser organization to group by sheet type first and then by sheet number.
