Chrome Remote Control

How to use the remote control

You can use the remote control that comes with your Chrome system from any direction, when the remote control is within 20 feet of the receiver.

The unique pairing of the remote control with the receiver allows more than one Chrome system to be used in the vicinity of other Chrome systems. The provided remote control and receiver are paired before delivery.

The remote control is powered by a small battery. The battery will last for approximately one year under normal daily operation. When the battery has depleted, instructions are provided in this guide to replace the battery.

The following table describes the most common functions of the buttons on the remote control provided with your Chrome system. Some buttons have more than one function, depending on what is displayed on the display at the time you press the button.

Remote Control navigation



Press the Mute button to mute your microphone



Press the Hang-Up button to end the meeting or call



Press the Menu Key to display the toolbar buttons (only available within a call)

Press the Select button (in the middle of the D-Pad) to select the currently highlighted display element. Press the Left, Right, Up, or Down buttons of the D-Pad to highlight an on-display element.

Keyboard navigation



Pressing a keyboard key provides for entry of one of three options: a lower case character, an upper case character, or a special character

Press a keyboard key to enter a lower-case character.



Press and hold the Function key and press a keyboard key to enter a special character, as denoted by the green color character found on that key

Press the Backspace key to delete the previous character entry

Press the Enter key to signal completion of a text entry, or select the currently highlighted on-display element.

Press the Up, Down, Left or Right arrow keys to highlight an on-display elements

Press the Menu key to display the toolbar buttons (only available within a call)

Replace Remote Control Battery

Follow these steps to remove and replace the battery of the remote control:

- 1. Locate the narrow end of the remote control with the battery compartment. It will be the end that has an open slot to fit a screwdriver.
- 2. Place a small flat head screwdriver in the slot of the battery compartment and slowly lift the screwdriver toward the front of the remote control (away from the keyboard side).
- 3. The battery holder will pop-out just enough to easily extract the holder with fingers.
- 4. Remove the depleted battery from the battery holder.
- 5. Replace with a new CR2032 battery. Minus (-) side of the battery will be up. There is only one way for the battery to easily fit into the battery holder.
- Align the battery holder with the battery compartment of the remote control and push into place. Battery holder will be fully contained within the remote control when correctly in position.
