



Front panel



1 Notification ED

This LED shows

- Solid green light when the phone is connected to the power adapter or a computer and the battery is fully charged.
- Flashing green light when you have a pending notification.
- Solid red light when the battery is being charged.
- Flashing red light when the battery level reaches very low.

2 MENU

Press to open a list of actions that you can do on the current screen.

3 HOME

- While on any application or screen, press to return to the Home screen.
- While on the main Home screen, press to show a snapshot of the Home screen.
- Press and hold to open the recently-used applications window

4 BACK

Press to go back to the previous screen, or to close a dialogal ox, options menu, the Notifications panel, or onscreen keyboard.

5 SEARCH

Press to open the Quick Search box.

Back cover

Removing the back cover

Remove the back cover to access the battery compartment, SIX card slot, and storage card slot.


- 1. Hold the phone securely with one hand and the back banel facing you.
- 2. Gently push the speaker with your thumb until the back cover disengages from the phone.



3. Carefully will the back cover to remove it.

Replacing the back cover

1. Insert the tabs inside the back cover into the holes on the bottom panel of the phone



2. Press the phone gainst the back cover until it clicks into place.

SIM card

The SIM card contains your phone number, service details, and phonebook/message memory. Your phone supports both 1.8V and 3 V SIM cards.




Some legacy SIM cards may not function with your phone. You should consult with your mobile operator for a replacement SIM card. There may be fees for this serv

Inserting the SIM card

The SIM card slot is located below the battery comparts.

- 1. Insert the SIM card with its gold contacts facing lown and its cut-off corner facing out from the slot.

Storage card

Removing the storage card

If your storage card is full, you can repla en with a new one.

- 1. Remove the back cover. Refer to "Removir g the back cover." The storage card slot is located below the battery compartment and to the right of the SIM card slot.
- 2. Push the storage card in to t from its slot. See "Inserting the storage ca


Removing the storage card while the phone is on

When you need to remove the storage card while the phone is on, unmount the storage card first to prevent computing or damaging the files in the storage card.

- 1. Press HOME > MENU, and then tap Settings.
- 2. Scroll down the screen, and then tap SD & phone storage.
- 3. Tap Unmount SD card.
- 4. Remove the storage card by following the instructions in "Removing the storage card."

Inserting the storage card

- 1. Remove the back cover. Refer to "Removing the back cover."
- 2. Insert the replacement storage card into the slot with its gold contacts facing down and push it in until it clicks into place.




Battery

Your phone comes with a recharc able Lithium-ion polymer or Lithium-ion battery and is designed to use only many active respecified original batteries and accessories. Battery performance depends on many factors, including network configuration, signal strength, the temperature of the a vironment in which you operate your phone, the features and/or settings you select and use, items attached to connecting ports, and your voice, data, and other programs ago patterns.


Inserting the battery

- 1. Pemov the back cover. Refer to "Removing the back cover."
- 2 Align the battery's exposed copper contacts with the battery connectors inside the attery compartment.
- 3. Insert the battery, contacts side first, and then goney push the battery into place.



Removing the battery


- 1. Remove the back cover. Refer to "Removing the back cover."
- 2. Lift the battery up from the groove at the top of the battery compartment.



Charging the battery

The battery is partially charged when shipped. Before you turn on and start using your phone, it is recommined that you charge the battery. Some batteries perform best after several full charge/alscharge cycles.

- 1. Attach the cover plug to the AC adapter.
- 2. Connect are end of the USB cable to the sync connector on your phone.



- 3. Connect the other end of the USB calle to the USB port of the AC adapter.
- 4. Plug in the AC adapter to an electrical outlet to start charging the battery.

As the battery is being charged, honotification LED (located on the right side of the earpiece) shows a solid red light when the battery is being charged. The light turns to solid green when the phone is My arged.

When you charge the botter, while the phone is on, the charging battery icon (🛂) is displayed in the table bar of the Home screen. After the battery has been fully charged, a



- Only the AC adapter and USB sync cable provided with your phone must be used to charge the battery.
- Do not remove the battery from the phone while you are charging it using the AC or car adapter.
- As a safety precaution, the battery stops charging when it overheats.

Finger gestures

Tap

When you want to type using the keyboard, select items onscreen such as application and settings icons, or press onscreen buttons, simply tap them with you finger.

Press and hold

To open the available options for an item (e.g. contact or link has velopage), simply press and hold the item.

Swipe or slide

To swipe or slide means to quickly drag your finger vertically or horizontally across the screen or optical trackball.

Drag

Press and hold your finger with some plessy e before you start to drag. While dragging, do not release your finger until you have reached the target position.

Flick

Flicking the screen is similar to sping, except that you need to swipe your finger in light, quicker strokes. This finder are ture is always in a vertical direction, such as when flicking the contacts or message set.

Rotate

For most screens, ou can automatically change the screen orientation from portrait to landscape trining the phone sideways. When entering text, you can turn the phone sideways to bring up a bigger keyboard. Refer to the Settings chapter for more details.

Pinch

For some applications, like Gallery or the web browser, you can "pinch" the screen using 2 fingers (for example, thumb and index fingers) to 20 m in or zoom out when viewing a picture or a web page.

Getting started

Once you've installed your SIM card, battery, and microSD card, you can turn on your phone and start using it.

Turning on your phone

Press the POWER button.



When you turn on the phone for the first time, you will be promoted to set up your phone. For more information on how to set up your phone for the first time see Setting up your phone for the first time."

Entering your PIN

If your SIM card is preset with a PIN (person I identification number), you will be prompted to enter the PIN to proceed. Enter the SIN IN, then tap OK.

To learn how to enable or disable the SIM PIN, see "Protecting your SIM card with a PIN" in the Security chapter.



Most SIM cards are preset with a PIN (personal identification number) that is provided by your mobile operator. When promoted, and the preset PIN, then tap **Enter**. If you enter the wrong PIN three times, the SIM card is packed. If this happens, you can unblock it with the PUK (PIN Unblocking Key) obtained from your nable operator.

Turning off your phone

If you do not need to use your phone, you can turn the power off to save battery life.

- 1. If the display is off, press the POWER button to turn the display back on.
- 2. Unlock your phone if the Lock screen is displayed. See "Unlocking the screen" in this chapter for details.
- 3. Press and hold the POWER button for a few seconds
- 4. When the Phone options menu appears, tab Power off
- 5. Tap OK when prompted to turn off the phone.

Setting up your phone for the first til ne

When you switch on your phone to the first time, you'll be asked to set up your phone. You can choose your language he viy urwant to connect to the Internet, and whether you want your current location to be automatically detected.

Be sure to sign in to your Google Account so you can use Google apps like Gmail™/Google Mail. You can also let up our other email accounts, favorite social networks like Facebook® and Twitter™, and hore.

Just follow the on creen instructions and you'll be up and running with your phone in no time.



Some features that need to connect to the Internet such as location-based services and auto-sync of your online accounts may incur extra data fees from your mobile operator. Don't worry. You can enable or disable them in your phone's settings as you go along later on. To find out how, see the Settings chapter.

Sleep mode

Sleep mode suspends your phone to a low power state while the display is off in order to save battery power. You will still be able to receive messages and calls while the phone is in Sleep mode.



For information on how to adjust the time before the screen turns of son " djusting the time before the screen turns off" in the Settings chapter.

Switching to Sleep mode

Briefly press the POWER button to turn off the display temporarily and switch your phone to Sleep mode. Your phone also automatically goes into Sleep mode when you leave the phone idle after a certain period of time. Switching to Sleep mode also prevents accidental button or touch screen presses when the phone is in your bag or pocket.

Waking up from Sleep mode

Your phone wakes up automatical when you have an incoming call. To wake up your phone manually, press the POWER button. You will then see that the phone has locked the screen. To find out how to unlock the creen, see "Unlocking the screen."

Unlocking the screen

Press the bar on the lock screen and then slide your finger down to unlock the screen or to answer an incoming will.





If you have set up a screen unlock pat ern, you will be prompted to draw the pattern on the screen before it unlocks. For more information on how to create and enable the screen unlock pattern, see "Protecting your phone with a screen oak" in the Security chapter.

Home screen

The Home screen provides you with a weather clock that shows the time and weather of your current location. Tap the respective item to open the associated application.

The Home screen also lets you add the items you want and need on the Home screen. Add items like application icons, shortcuts, folders, and widget to the you instant access to information and applications. To learn how to personalize our Home screen, see the Personalizing chapter.

Extended Home screen

The Home screen extends beyond the screen with to provide more space for adding icons, widgets, and more. There are 6 "additional" streets apart from the main Home screen.

You can go to the extended Home screen by liding our finger horizontally across the screen to go to the left or right side of the come screen. While on an extended Home screen, press HOME to return to the main Home screen

Checking notifications

Notification icons on the status bar report the arrival of new messages, calendar events, alarms set and ongoing settings such as when call forwarding is on or the current call status. You can open the Notifications panel to open the message, reminder, or event notification and see the mobile operator name.

Opening the Notifications panel

When a new notification icon displays in the status bar, press and hold the status bar, then slide your finger downward to open the Notification's parel.



If you have so vera potifications, you can scroll down the screen to view more notifications.



You can a so open the Notifications panel on the Home screen by pressing MENU and then tapping Notifications

Closing the Notifications panel

Do one of the following:

- Press and hold the bottom bar of the Notification; barel, then slide your finger up the screen.
- Press BACK.

Adjusting the volume

Adjusting the ringer volume changes the volume level of the phone ring tone, whereas adjusting the media volume changes the volume level of sound notifications, music or video playback. The ringer volume and media volume can be separately adjusted.

Adjusting the ringer volume

- 1. Press the VOLUME UP or VOLUME DOWN button on the left panel of the phone to adjust the ringer volume to your desired level. The Ringer volume window appears on the screen to display the volume levels. While in the lowes ringer volume level (Silent mode), press VOLUME DOWN once to set your phone to Vibrate mode. The phone vibrates and the vibrate mode icon () appears on the status bar.
- 2. While in Vibrate mode, press VOLUME of a ce to switch to silent mode. The speaker mute icon () displays on the status bay.



To quickly switch your phone to sile t mide, press and hold the POWER button, and then tap Silent mode on the options made

Adjusting the media volume

When playing music or witching video, press the VOLUME UP or VOLUME DOWN buttons on the left panel of the phone to adjust the media volume. The Music/video volume window appears on the screen to display the volume level.

Adjusting the erriece volume for phone calls

During a phone call, press the VOLUME UP or VOLUME DOWN button.

Adjusting the volume via settings

- From the Home screen, press MENU, and then tay see lings > Sound > Volume.
- 2. Drag the volume sliders to the left or right to adjust the volume levels of your phone's ringtone, media playback, alarms, and notifications.
 - Your phone briefly plays a sample tone with the volume being adjusted as you drag a slider.
- 3. If you want the same volume for your ringtone and notifications, select **Use incoming call** volume for notifications.
- 4. When you're done, tap OK.

Connecting your phone to a computer

Whenever you connect your phone to a computer using the USB cable, the Connect to PC dialog box displays and prompts you to choose the type of USB connection. Select one of the following choices, and then tap **Done**:

Charge only

Select this mode if you only want to charge the phone's bacter a using your computer.

HTC Sync

When selected, the phone automatically uses HTC sinc when connected to your computer and lets you synchronize Outlook and Windows Address Book (Outlook Express), contacts and calendar events between your computer and your phone. For more information, see "Synchronizing with your computer" in the Accounts and sync chapter.

Disk drive

This mode is available only when you have installed a microSD card on your phone. Select this mode when you want to use you storage card as a USB thumb drive, and copy files between your phone's storage car and your computer.

When Disk Drive more is enabled while your phone is connected to the computer, you will not be able to run applications that use the storage card, such as Music or Gallery. For more information, see "Copying files to and from the storage card" in this chapter.

Internet sharing

When your look of have Internet connection on your computer, you can select this mode to share your prone's mobile data connection with your computer. For more information, see "Using your phone as a modem (tethering)" in the Internet chapter.



If you do not want to show the Connect to PC dialog box everytime you connect the phone to the computer, clear the **Don't ask again** checkbox in the Connect to PC dialog box. The default connection type will be used when you connect the phone to the connecter.

To check or change the default connection type and to show a hide the Connect to PC dialog box, press HOME > MENU, and then tap Settings > Co. Nect to PC.

Copying files to and from the storage card

- 1. Connect the phone to your computer using the supplied USB cable.
- 2. When the Connect to PC dialog box appears, tap Disk drive, and then tap Done.
- 3. On your computer, the connected phone is recognized as a removable disk. Navigate to this removable disk and open it.
- 4. Do one of the following:
 - Copy the files from the computer to the phone's storage card's root folder.
 - Copy the files from the phone's storage card to fider in your computer or computer desktop.
- 5. After copying the files, unmount the removable disk (that is, the connected phone) as required by your computer's operating system to safely remove your phone.
- 6. Do one of the following:
 - Disconnect the phone from the computer.
 - If you want to keep the plane connected to the computer but want the phone to be able to access the sprace card, open the Notifications panel, tap **Disk drive**, select an option except **Disk drive**, and then tap **Done**. See "Opening the Notifications panel" in this chapter to pare how to open the Notifications panel.



Searching your phone and the Web

You can search for information on your phone and on the Web by using the **Quick Search Box**. Some applications, such as People or Mail, have their own search box, which you can use to search within those applications (the application's icon is at the left of the search box.)

Setting Web and phone search options

- 1. From the Home screen, press MENU, and then tap Settings
- 2. Scroll down the screen, and then tap Search.
- 3. Tap Google search, and then do the following:
 - Select Show web suggestions if you want to include suggestions from Google when doing a search.
 - Select Use My Location if you wan to include your location when doing a search and using other Google services.
 - Select Search history to an all personalized search history. You need to sign in to your Google Account to use this peature. The Show web suggestion check box needs to be selected for this option to be enabled.

Press BACK when you are done.

4. Tap Searchable tems, and then select the items you want included when doing a search.

Searching the Web and your phone using the Quick Search Box

- 1. From the Home screen, press SEARCH.
- 2. Enter the search item in the Quick Search Box. As you type, matching items on your search and suggestions from Google web search are shown as a list.



The suggested items that appear will depend on the option that you have selected in the search settings. See "Setting Web and phone search option" for details.

- 3. To target your search to just the Web or to a single application's information, tap 8 at the left of the search box, and then to be convepresenting where you want to search.
- 4. Do one of the following:
 - If what you're searching for it in the list of suggestions, tap it in the list. The item opens in the appropriate applicator
 - If what you're searching for a not in the list, tap to search the Web or, if you've targeted your search of a single application, within that application.

Personalizing

Making your phone truly yours

Make your phone look and sound just the way you want it. Per could be your phone with a different wallpaper, ringtone, and notification sound for events such as incoming text, email, calendar reminders, and more.

Your phone's Home screen is highly customizable and extents beyond the screen width, giving you plenty of space to add the information that matters most in your daily life and phone features that make communication quicker and easier. You have up to seven screens that extend to the left and right sides of your alsolay as your Home screen, on which you can add elements such as widgets, program icons shortcuts to information, and more.



To find out how to set notification sounds for events, see "Changing sound settings" in the Settings chapter.

Changing the ringtone

Choose from the available selections of ringtones on your phone. You can also download or copy ringtones or sones to your phone's storage card and choose one to use as your ringtone. To find out how you can copy files to your storage card, see "Copying files to and from the storage card."

- 1. From the some screen, press MENU, and then tap Settings.
- 2. Personalize > Default ringtone.
- 3. Tap eringtone you want to use. The ringtone briefly plays when selected.
- 4. Tap **OK**.



Personalizing your phone with scenes

Your phone becomes multiple phones in one when you use scenes. Scenes are personalized Home screen layouts that you can quickly apply to your phone. By switching between scenes, you instantly turn your phone into your perfect weekend phone, travel phone, work phone, or pure play phone.

Using a preset scene

Your phone features preset scenes, each preconfigured with a different wallpaper and collection of widgets that reflect different moments in your life. You can choose a scene that is suitable for work, play, travel, or your social life.

- 1. From the Home screen, press MENU, and her ap Scenes.
- 2. In the Choose a scene menu, select a presense and then tap Done.

Customizing and saving a scene

After selecting a preset scene yet can add widgets and other elements, arrange the layout, change the wallpaper, and save the whole Home screen as your personalized scene.

- 1. From the Home creen, press MENU, and then tap Scenes.
- 2. In the Choose a scene menu, select a preset scene that already has some widgets, or select Clean sate if you want to design your own Home screen.
- 3. Add widgets and other elements that you want.
- 4. Arrange the layout of your Home screen according to your preference.
- 5 Charge the Home screen wallpaper. You can also change the lock screen wallpaper.
- 6. When you are done designing your Home screen, press HOME > MENU and then tap Scenes again.
- 7. Under My scenes, make sure the Current (upgared of tion is selected and then tap Save.
- 8. Enter a new scene name for your Home sc een and then tap **Done**. Or, if you already created a scene, enter the same scene name, to **Done** and then tap **Replace**.

Renaming or deleting a scene

You can rename or delete a personalized scene that you created. Preset scenes cannot be renamed or deleted.

- 1. From the Home screen present ENU and then tap Settings > Personalize > Scenes.
- 2. Under My scenes on ss and hold a scene and choose whether to rename or delete it.

Changing your wallpaper

Personalizing your Home screen wallpaper with your favorite photo is a quick and easy way to change the feel of your phone and give it a fresh look. Browse the collection of wallpapers included in your phone or choose from photos that you have taken with the camera. You can also change your Home screen to use an animated wallpaper.

Changing your Home screen wallpaper

- 1. From the Home screen, press MENU, and then top Wallpaper.
- 2. Do one of the following:
 - Tap Live wallpapers to choose from prese animated wallpapers. Tap a wallpaper to view a preview of the animation, and then tap Set wallpaper.
 - Tap HTC wallpapers to choose from preset wallpapers and then tap Set wallpaper.
 - Tap Gallery to select a photo that you have taken using the camera or copied to your storage card. Crop the photo and then tap Save.
- 3. After changing the wallpupe transmer to save it to the scene that you created or save it as a new scene. To and put how to save a scene, see "Customizing and saving a scene".

Personalizing your Home screen with widgets

Widgets put at-a-glance important information and media content up front on your Home screen. Some widgets are already added to your Home screen for your convenience. You can add more from the available selections of widgets, or download more widgets.

Adding a widget to your Home screen

A wide selection of widgets is available for you to cha such as Calendar, Music, Photo Album, Friend Stream, Twitter, and more.

- 1. Go to the part of the Home screen where there's to add a new widget. To find out how, see "Navigating the Home screen".
- 2. Tap ____ or press and hold on the Home creen to open the Add to Home options menu.
- 3. Tap Widget and then select a widget that you want.
- 4. Most HTC widgets are available at ariety of designs and sizes to suit your needs. Tap the right or left arrow button the bottom of the screen to view the different styles, and then tap Select to choose one

You can also add widgets that allow you to quickly switch on or off certain settings of your phone, such as Wi-Land Mobile Network, Bluetooth, and more. Scroll down the widgets list, tap Settings, and then tap the widget that you want.

Downloading HTC widgets

A selection of an and useful HTC widgets are also available for download.

Adding folders on your Home screen

Use folders to group related applications and other shortcuts to keep your Home screen tidy and organized.



You can also add information folders that show up-to-date information such as Bluetooth received files, your Facebook phonebook, and more.

Creating a new folder and adding items to it

- 1. Go to the part of the Home screen where there's space to add a new folder. To find out how, see "Navigating the Home screen".
- 2. Tap ____ or press and hold on the Home screen to open the Add to Home options menu.
- 3. Tap Folder and then tap New Folder.
- 4. Press and hold an application icon or shortcut that you want to move to the folder. The phone then vibrates. Don't lift your inger.
- 5. Drag the application icon of shortest and drop it on top of the folder.

Simply tap the folder to open it. You can access the applications and shortcuts inside the folder.

Renaming a folder

- 1. Tap the folder to open it.
- 2. Press and hold the folder window's title bar.
- 3. Enter a new folder name and then tap OK.

Rearranging or removing widgets and icons on your Home screen

Rearrange the widgets and icons on your Home screen to give room for adding more items to the Home screen. You can also remove widgets and icons that you don't frequently use.

Moving a widget or icon

- 1. Press and hold the widget or icon you want to move.
 - The phone vibrates and you'll see a green box around the widget or icon. Don't release your finger.
- 2. Drag the widget or icon to a new location on the screen.
 - Pause at the left or right edge of the screen to drag the widget or icon onto another Home screen panel.
- 3. When the widget or icon is where you want it, release your finger.
 - If you've released your finger on a message shows that there's no space to place the widget or icon, drag it got coeft again to another Home screen panel.

Removing a widget or col

Phone calls

Making calls

There are several convenient methods to make a call from your prone.



Most SIM cards are preset with a PIN (personal identification number) that is provided by your mobile operator. When prompted, enter the preset PIN, then tap Enter. Tyok enter the wrong PIN three times, the SIM card is blocked. If this happens, you can unproduct with the PUK (PIN Unblocking Key) obtained from your mobile operator. See "Restoring a SIM card that has been locked out" in the Security chapter for details.



The two prongs underneath the back cover act as the antenna for your phone. You must install the back cover properly for the antenna to function. I lead how to secure the back cover, see "Replacing the back cover" in the Basics chapter.

Calling somebody using your phone

You can either dial a number d'éatl, or you can use the Smart Dial (see "Smart Dial") feature to search and call a contact in you contacts lit or a number from call history.

- 1. From the Home screen tap Phone.
- 2. Begin entering the first few digits or characters by tapping the keys on the phone keypad. As you enter digits or letters, the panel displays numbers and names that match the keys you tapped
 - If you enter a wrong digit, tap to erase that digit. To erase the entire number, press and hold
- Tap to close the phone keypad and to see if there are more matching numbers or contacts. To browse through the filtered list, flick through the list or slide your finger up or down the list slowly.
- 4. To place a call, do one of the following:
 - If there are no matching contacts in the st, fite entering the number, tap Call.
 - Tap the phone number or contact from the list.
 - To call a different phone number a societed with the contact, tap 🖪 at the right side of the contact name. On the contact screen, tap the number you want to call.

Smart Dial

The phone dialer's Smart Dial feature makes it quick and easy for you to place a call. Simply enter the phone number or first lew letters of the person you want to call. Smart Dial automatically searches and leters your contacts list (stored on your phone and SIM card) and the phone numbers from the call history.

Calling a speed dial number

- 1. From the Home screen, tap Phone.
- 2. On the phone keypad, press and hold the number that is associated with the contact you want to call.

The number 1 on the phone keypad is generally reserved for your oicemail. Press and hold this button to call voicemail and retrieve your voicemail messages.

Adding a contact to speed dial

- 1. From the Home screen, tap Phone.
- 2. Press MENU, and then tap Speed dial > Add new.
- 3. Enter the name of the contact you want to add. When the name comes up in the list, tap the name.
- 4. On the Speed dial screen, select the phore number of the contact to use, and the phone keypad assignment. Tap Save.

Calling a phone number in a text message

- 1. From the Home screen tat > Messages, and then tap the message with the phone number.
- 2. In the message with the phone number.
- 3. On the Select ak screen, tap the number you want to call.
- 4. Edit the hone number if needed, and then tap Call.



To call the message sender, in the All messages list, press and hold the message, and then tap Call on the options menu.

For more information about text messages, see the Messages chapter.

Calling a phone number in an email

- 1. From the Home screen, tap O > Mail.
- 2. Open the email account where the email in the number is located.
- 3. In the email account's inbox, tap the email to open it.
- 4. In the email body, tap the phone number. The phone dialer screen opens with the phone number already entered.

The phone will recogn be a proper as a phone number if the number has a minimum of 5 digits and have at least one of the following:

- Numbers pred ded by a "+" in front. For example, +1-987-654-321 or +1987654321.
- Numbers en losed in parenthesis in front. For example, (02)987654321 or (02)987-654
- Numbers separated by dashes. For example, (02)-987-654-321 or 0987-654-321.
- 5. Tap Call.

Making an emergency call

You can make emergency calls from your phone even if you don't have a SIM card installed or your SIM card has been blocked.

- 1. From the Home screen, tap Phone.
- 2. Dial the international emergency number for your locale (fo and then tap Call.



Additional emergency numbers may be included in your M ontact your mobile operator for details.

If you enabled the unlock screen pattern and/or the Mock, and you forgot the unlock pattern or SIM PIN, you can still make emergency calls by tapping Emergency call on the



Receiving calls

When you receive a phone call from a contact, the Incoming call screen appears and displays the caller ID icon, name, and phone number of the calling party. When you receive a phone call from someone who is not stored in People, only the default caller ID icon and phone number appear on the Incoming call screen.

Answering an incoming call

Depending if the display is on or off, you need to:

- If the display is on, tap Answer.
- If the display is off, the display will turn on an wing the Lock screen. Drag the bar down to answer the call.





Muting the ringing sound without rejecting the call

Do one of the following:

- Press the VOLUME DOWN button.
- Place the phone face down on a leveled surface



If the phone is already facing down, the phone will still ring when there are subsequent incoming calls.

Automatically scaling down the ring volume when picking up the phone

You can set your phone to at torn it cally scale down the ring volume when you pick up the phone to answer calls.

- 1. From the Home servin, press MENU and then tap Settings > Sound.
- 2. Scroll down the screen and then select the Quiet ring on pickup check box.
- 3. Press BACK.

Rejecting an incoming call

Depending if the display is on or off, you need to:

- If the display is on, tap Decline to reject and send the call to your voice mail.
- If the display is off, the display will turn on showing the Lock screen. While the Lock screen is showing, drag the bar up to reject and send the call to voicemail.
- If the display is off, the display will turn on showing the look area. While the Lock screen is showing, press MENU, and then tap End call to reject and send the call to your voicemail.

Rejecting a call and sending a text message

You can automatically send a default text me says to the caller and reject the incoming call.

To reject and send a message when you receive an incoming call, press MENU, and then tap Send message.

Editing the default message

You can change the message that I sent out.

- 1. From the Home screen, tap Phone.
- 2. Press MENU, and hen ap Phone settings > Edit default message.
- 3. Enter the new message, and then tap OK.

HTC Caller

Exprytime you make a call or your friend gives you a ring, you get to see your friend's latest odate from social networks like Facebook or Twitter right on the call screen.

You also won't miss people's birthdays. You'll see a minday reminder, if your friend's birthday will occur sometime within the next seven days



Using in-call options



When a call is in progress, use the cuttons onscreen to mute or unmute the microphone or to turn on or off the speakerphore. You an also press MENU to open the call options to let you add a call, place the call on bold in ute the microphone, and more.

Handling multiple calls

Your phone notifies you when you have another incoming call, and gives you the option of rejecting or accept the the call. If you are already on a call and accept the new call, you can choose to switch between the two callers.

- 1. When you receive another call, tap **Answer** to accept the second call, and to put the first call or hold.
- 2. To switch between callers, tap the person you want to talk to on the screen.



3. To end the current call and return to the other call, tap End call.

You can start a conference call be week all parties by merging the calls. To merge the call, tap λ at the bottom right of the screen.

Setting up a conference call

- 1. Make a call to the first conference call participant.
- 2. When connected, press MENU, tap Add call, and then dial the number of the second participant. The first participant is put on hold when you dial the second participant.
- 3. When connected to the second participant, tap 1 (merge
- 4. To add another participant to the conference call, tap on the conference call screen, and then dial the number of the contact you want to in the conference call.
- 5. When connected, tap to add the participant to the conference call.

 When you want to talk to a person in the conference call in private, tap , and then select Private call on the options menu.
- 6. When finished, tap End call.



Not all mobile networks support conference camp. Contact your mobile operator for details.

Putting a call on hold

Press MENU and then tap Hold to put the call on hold. When you put a call on hold, the Hold call icon () appears the status bar. Press MENU, and then tap **Unhold** to resume the call.

Muting the microphone during a call

On the screen, ap to toggle between turning the microphone on or off. When the microphone is turned off, the Mute icon () appears in the status bar.

Turning the speakerphone on or off during a call

On the screen, tap to toggle between turning to speakerphone on or off.

The speakerphone icon () appears in the start hen the speakerphone is on.



Ending a call

Do one of the following to enter call:

- On the screen, tap Encl call
- If you are using the provided wired headset, press and hold the button to end the call.

If the phone number of the person who called is not in your contacts list, you can choose to save the number to your contacts list after you hang up.


Using call history

When you miss a call, the missed call icon () appears in the title bar. Use the Call history tab in the People application to check who the caller was or view all your dialed numbers and received calls.

- 1. From the Home screen, tap Phone.
- 2. Tap D at the bottom-right corner of the screen.
- 3. Do one of the following:
 - Tap the name or number in the list to call.

Call services

Your phone can directly link to the mobile phone network, and enable you to access and change the settings of various phone services for your phone. Call services may include call forwarding, call waiting, voicemail, and more. Contact your mobile operator to find out about the availability of call services for your phone.

To open call services, press HOME > MENU, and then tap Services > Call.

Fixed Dialing Numbers

Restrict outgoing calls to a fixed set of numbers. To enable this feature, you must know your SIM card's PIN2 code.

Voicemail service

Shows the current voicemail service being use

Voicemail settings

Specify another voice mail number a side from the voice mail number on your SIM card.

Clear voicemail notification

If you have a notification of a jew voicemail, you can clear the notification with this option.

TTY mode

Select this option when you want to use a compatible TTY (teletypewriter, also known as a TDD or Text Telephone) device with your phone. If you have a hearing, speech, or language difficulty, you can use a TTY to communicate using your phone.

Hearing aids

If you use a hearing aid, select this option to reduce interference when using the phone.

Phone settings

Edit the call reject message, choose whether to open the message editor when you reject a call with a message, and choose whether to allow au or atic saving of an unknown contact number when a call with that number ends.

Cell broadcast

Enable or disable receipt of cell broad case mussages from your service provider.

Cell broadcast settings

Configure channels and language for cell broadcast messages.

Call forwarding

Select how you want your phone to handle busy, unanswered, and unreachable calls. You can also set the call to wording option for all incoming calls.

Call barring settings

Choose whether to block various categories of incoming and outgoing call.

Additional settings

Enable or disable operator services such as caller ID and call waiting.

Turning Airplane mode on or off

In many countries, you are required by law to turn off the phone while on board an aircraft. A way to turn off the phone function is to switch your phone to Airplane mode. When you enable Airplane mode, all wireless radios on your phone are turned off, including the call function, data services, Bluetooth, and Wi-Fi.

- 1. From the Home screen, press MENU and then tap Setting
- 2. Select or clear the Airplane mode check box to each disable Airplane mode. When enabled, the Airplane mode icon (🛧) is displayed in the status bar.



When you disable Airplane mode, the call function is turned back on and the previous state of Bluetooth and Wi-Fi is restored.

About People

In **People**, you can easily manage your communications with corrects via phone, messaging, and email. You can also view updates on their Facebook and Finkr accounts.

If you are synchronizing contacts with your Google account, with your PC, and/or with an Exchange Server, any contacts stored in those accounts are displayed in People. You can also synchronize contacts from your Facebook account in People. For more information on synchronizing accounts, see "Ways of getting contacts into your phone" in this chapter.

Gives you access to all contacts on your phone, including Google contacts, Exchange ActiveSync contacts, Phone contacts, contacts store and your SIM card, and Facebook contacts. You can also use this tab to open or update My ontact card. For more information, see "Setting up My Contact Card" in this chapter.

2 Groups tab

Lets you assign contacts to goods so you can easily send an SMS, MMS, or email message to a whole group. For more information see "Contact groups" in this chapter.

3 Online directories tab

Search for contacts of your inline directories such as your Exchange ActiveSync or Facebook account to cory to you phone.

4 Call history tab

Lists all your dale numbers and received and missed calls. See "Using Call History" in the Phone calls charater.

Setting up My contact card

My confact card provides a convenient way to store your personal contact information so that you can easily send it via SMS, MMS, email, or Bluetooth.

Contact information and conversations

When you tap a contact on the People screen, the contact details screen opens, showing you the information stored for that contact, exchanged messages and phone calls with that contact, Facebook notifications, and more.

The contact details screen has the following tabs:



1 Details tab

Shows the information you have stored for the contact, and allows you to get in touch with the contact directly by tapping any of the distance methods. For example, if the contact has a stored work phone number, tap Call Work to call that number.

You can also add one of the contact's phonon numbers as a speed dial number. For information, see "Adding a contact to speed dia" in the Phone calls chapter.

2 Messages tab

Shows your exchanged SMS in as ges with the contact. Tap a message to view it. To send a new message, press MENU and tap and message. For more information about messages, see the Messages chapter

3 Mail tab

Shows email message is you have received from the contact. Tap an email message to view it. To send a new email message, press MENU and tap **New mail**. For more information about email, see the Email chapter

4 Updates and events tab

Shows the contact's Facebook status, updates, and events, and shows when he or she uploads new places to Flickr. When there is a notification of the contact's birthday, you can tap the notification to call the contact directly or send a message greeting.

You need to be logged in to your Facebook account to see the updates and events. If you are not logged in, tap Link to Facebook.

5 Gallery tab

Shows the contact's Facebook and Flickr photo album. To an album to look at the photos in the album.

You need to be logged in to your Facebook and FI k accounts to see the photo albums. If you are not logged in, tap Link to Facebook and You Link to Flickr.

6 Call history tab

Lists all your incoming, outgoing, and miss of calls to and from the contact. Tap a list item to call the contact using the displayed number

People widget

Put the group of people you contact most right on the Home screen of your phone by adding them as the People widget. Using the People widget, you can instantly place a call, send a message, or view details of a favorite contact with a single top.

Adding the People widget

Slide your finger left or right on the Home screen to find the People widget. If you do not find the People widget on the Home screen, follow his procedure to add the widget to the Home screen.

When you start a program or select a field that requires text of rum lers, the onscreen keyboard becomes available.

Using the landscape onscreen keyboard

When entering text, you can choose to use the land cape orientation of the onscreen keyboard. Turn the phone sideways to use a larger keyboard that lets you type easily using two thumbs.





- The Auto-rotate screen check box in HOME > MENU > Settings > Display needs to be selected for the screen orientation to automatically change.
- The landscape or atation keyboard is not supported in all applications.

You can choose from three different keyboard layouts to suit your typing style. To change the keyboard layout, do the following:

Enabling multiple keyboard languages

Entering words with predictive text

The onscreen keyboard has predictive text to help you type quickly and accurately. Predictive text input is enabled by default, and word suggestions are displayed as you type.

To enter a word in predictive mode, do any of the following:

- If you see the word you want highlighted in green or orange you an simply tap the space bar to insert the word into your text.
- If you see the word you want shown in the suggestions left is you have finished typing the entire word, tap the word to insert it into you tex
- If an arrow is shown to the right of the suggestion list cap the arrow to see more suggestions.

Adding a word to the predictive text dictional

Your phone comes with a list of words that i references for predictive text suggestions. Sometimes you may need to add a vord the predictive text dictionary, for example a name or a specialized technical word.

While entering text using the Wind TY keyboard layout, if you tap any word on the suggestion list, it is autom trical, added to the predictive text dictionary if it was not in the dictionary already.

You can also add a word the list manually:

Editing or deleting a word in the user dictionary

Sending text and multimedia messages

New message notifications

Depending on your notification settings, the phone will play a ring tone, vibrate, or display the message briefly in the status bar when you receive a new text or multimedia message. A new message icon also appears in the notifications area of the status bar to notify you of a new text or multimedia message. The Messages application icon (if shown on the Home screen) also displays the number of new messages.

WAP push messages

WAP push messages contain a web link. Often, the link will be to download a file that you have requested, for example a ring tone.

Managing message conversations

Text and multimedia messages that are sent to and received from a contact (or a number) are grouped into conversations or message threads in the All messages screen. Threaded text or multimedia messages let you see exchanged messages (similar to a chat program) with a contact on the screen.

Delivery reports

Select this option to receive a report on the delivery status of your message.

Select this option if you want to receive a report whether each recipient has read or has deleted the message without leading it.

Auto-retrieve

Select this option to automatically retrieve all your MMS messages completely. When selected, the 1MS message header plus the message body and attachments will automatically cownload to your phone. If you clear this check box, only the MMS message header with the retrieved and shown in your All messages screen.

Roming auto-retrieve

Select this option to automatically retrieve all your MMS messages completely when roaming. This may incur significant phone charges.

Priority setting

Set the message priority of MMS messages sent.

Maximum message size

Set the maximum file size of an MMS message. The MMS message will not be sent out if it exceeds the file size set here.

Vibrate

Select this option if you want the phone to vibrate when a new text or multimedia message arrives.





For an Exchange ActiveSync account, you can mark an email. In mark an email, while viewing an email, tap the white flag on the upper-right can enough the screen. The flag turns red when you mark the message.



You can copy, look up, translate, or share text from an email message. For information on how to do this, see "Copying text, looking up information, and sharing" in the Internet chapter.

Editing email account settings

Deleting an email account

- 1. From the Home screen, tap 🔘 > Mail.

Adding the Mail widget

Add the Mail widget to let you view your POP3/IMAP or Exchange ActiveSync emails on the Home screen. To learn how to add widgets, refer to "Adding a widget to your Home screen" in the Personalizing chapter.

About Calendar

Use your phone's **Calendar** to create and manage your events meetings, and appointments. You can also set up your phone to stay in sync with the following types of calendars:

 On your phone, sign in to your Google Account so your be able to sync your phone's Calendar with your Google Calendar online. If you have not signed in to your Google Account yet, see the Accounts and sync chapter to fine out how to sign in.



You can create multiple Google Calendars only in Google Calendar on the Web. After creating them in Google Calendar on the Web, you'll be able to see them in the Calendar application on your phone.

For more information about creating and managing multiple Google Calendars, visit the Google website at the following URL: http://creating.com.

- If you're using Microsoft Outlook on your computer, you can set up HTC Sync on your computer to sync Outlook all odar with your phone's Calendar. See "Synchronizing with your computer" in the Appoints and sync chapter for details.
- If you have a Microsoft exc ange ActiveSync account and you have added it on your phone, you can said your phone's Calendar with your Exchange ActiveSync calendar events. See the small and Accounts and sync chapters for details.

Creating a calendar event

You can exacte events that appear on your phone only, as well as events that sync with your Google Calendar, your computer's Outlook Calendar, or Exchange ActiveSync calendar.

- 1. From the Home screen, tap , and then tap Calendar.
- 2. On any Calendar view, press MENU and then tap wevent.



When you are in the Month or Agenda view, you can also tap \(\frac{1}{2}\) at the bottom-right of the screen to create a new event.

- 3. If you have more than one calendar, so led a calendar in which to add the event:
 - Select My Calendar to create an investment will appear only on your phone.
 - Select your Google Account o create a Google Calendar event. If you have several Google Calendars on the Web select one in which to add your event.
 - Select PC Sync to greate Outlook Calendar event to sync with your computer.
 - Select Exchange & create an Exchange ActiveSync calendar event.
- 4. Enter a name for the event.
- 5. To specify the and time of the event, do one of the following:
 - If there is a time frame for the event, tap the From and To date and time to set them.
 - If it is a special occasion such as a birthday or a whole-day event, set the **From** and **To** date, then select the **All day** check box.
- 6. Enter the event location and description.

7. Set the reminder time.



You can add another reminder time in a Google Calendar event. Press MENU and then tap Add reminder

- 8. If the event occurs on a regular basis, tap the Repetition box and then choose how often the event occurs.
- 9. Scroll to the bottom of the screen and then tap Add.

Inviting guests to your event (Google Account only

If you want to invite guests to your event, you need to create and add the event in your Google Calendar. An invitation email will be sent to your guests using your Google Account.

- 1. Open Calendar and create a new event. The Calendar field and then select your Google Account (or one of your other Cape Calendars). For the steps, see "Creating a calendar event".
- 2. Add details about the event, such as late and time, location, and more.
- 3. In the Guests field, enter the spail addresses of everyone you want to invite to the event. Separate multiple addresses with commas (,).
 - If the people to whom you send invitations use Google Calendar, they'll receive an invitation in Calendar and by email.
- 4. Tap Add to add the event to your Google Calendar.

Sending a meeting request using Calendar (Exchange ActiveSync only)

If ou have a Exchange ActiveSync account set up on your phone, you can use Calendar to create a meeting appointment and send a meeting request email to the people you want to invite a your meeting.

- 1. Open Calendar and create a new event. Tap the and and then select Exchange.

 For the steps, see "Creating a calendar event"
- 2. Add details about the meeting, such as date and time, location, and more.
- 3. Press MENU and then tap Meeting Invitation.
- 4. Tap A and choose attendees from your contacts or Company Directory.
- 5. Enter your message and then top Send.
- 6. Tap Add to add the meeting an pointment to your Exchange ActiveSync Calendar.

Changing calendar views

When you open Calendar, it displays the Month view by default. You can also display the Calendar in Agenda, Day, or Week view. To change between calendar views, press MENU, and then choose the type of view that you want.

Month view

In Month view, you'll see markers on days that have events






- Tap Tap to the bottom left of the screen to switch to Agenda view. Tap + on the bottom in the create a new event.
- Tap aday to view the events of that day.
- Press and hold a day to open an options menu from which you can also choose to create an event or switch to either Day or Agenda view
- Slide your finger up or down the screen to yield earlier or later months.

Day and Agenda views

Day view displays a list of the events of the cay and also shows weather information at the bottom of the screen when you're viewing events of the current day. Agenda view shows a list of all your events in chronological order.





The color bars on the left side of the every indicate the type of calendar in which the event is part of. To find out what each or lor epresents, press MENU and then tap More > Calendars.

When in Day view, slide left or the toss the screen to view earlier or later days.



- In Day view, the weather information appears only if the event is within the five-day forecast of the Weather application.
- Weather information does not appear in Day view when you change Day view to display as a time list. See "Changing Calendar settings" for details.

Week view

Week view is lays a chart of the events of one week.

When in Veck view:

- You an press and hold on a time slot to create a new event at that time.
- Tap an event to view its details.
- Slide left or right across the screen to view earlier or later weeks.



In a crowded Week view, it may be easier to select an event by using the optical trackball. Then press the optical trackball to view details about the selected event.

Viewing, editing or deleting an event

You can view, edit, or delete events you created. You can also view event invitations that other people sent to you.

Viewing and editing an event

- 1. From the Home screen, tap on, and then tap Calendar,
- 2. In Month view, tap the day when the event takes place and then tap the event to open it.

 The Event details screen then opens and shows the symmetry of the event.
- 3. When viewing the event summary, you can be following:
 - Find the event's location in Maps.
 - If it's a Google Calendar or Exchange ActiveSync calendar event, check the participants of the event.
 - Change the reminder time
 - If it's a Google Calendar every respond whether you'll attend the event.
 - Press the BACK but on in your phone to save changes you made on the Event details screen.
- 4. To edit more de tils about the event, press MENU while you're on the Event details screen and then tax dit vent.
- 5. Make your changes to the event.
- 6. The four education of the screen and then tap Save.

Deleting an event

There are a number of ways to delete an event.

- While viewing the summary of an event on the Event letails screen, press MENU and then tap **Delete event**.
- In Day, Agenda or Week view, press and old a vevent and then tap Delete event.
- When editing an event, scroll down to the bottom of screen and then tap Delete.
 - If the event repeats, you'll be asked hether you want to delete just that occurrence, this and all future occurrences or all past and future occurrences in your Calendar.

Calendar event reminders

If you have set at least one reminder for an event, the upcoming event icon will appear in the notifications area of the status bar to remind you of the upcoming event.

Viewing, dismissing, or snoozing event reminders

- 1. Tap the status bar, then slide your finger down the screen to be notifications panel.
- 2. Do one of the following:
 - Tap Clear to dismiss event reminders and all other rotifications. Other types of notifications such as new messages and missed calls will also be deleted.
 - After sliding open the Notifications panel, too the calendar event reminder. You'll then
 see a list of all pending event reminders. Tap Snooze all to snooze all event reminders
 for five minutes, or tap Dismiss all to dismiss all event reminders.
 - Press BACK to keep the remode pending in the notifications area of the status bar.



Displaying and synchronizing calendars

You can select which calendars to show or hide on your phone's Calendar, and which ones to keep synchronized.

Showing or hiding calendars

In any Calendar view, press MENU, tap More > Calendars, and then select or clear a calendar to show or hide it. Tap All calendars to display all calendars

The calendars are kept synchronized on your phone, whether or not you hide them.

Choosing which Google Calendars are synchronized on your phone

You can choose which Google Calendars to keep synchronized on your phone or which ones to stop synchronizing.

Stop synchronizing a Google Calendar

- 1. In any Calendar view, press MENU and then tap More > Calendars.
- 2. Press MENU again and hen Remove calendars.
- 3. Select a Google cale of remove from your calendars list, and then tap OK.
- 4. Press BACK to too te Calendar with the new changes and return to the Calendar view you were viewing

The calendar that you remove from your calendars list will no longer be synchronized on your phone by you remain subscribed to them and can work with them in Google Calendar or the Vico.

Adding a Google Calendar to sync with

Only the calendars that you've created or subscribed to on the Web, but previously removed from your calendars list, are shown in the list of calendars that you can add.

- 1. In any Calendar view, press MENU and there are More > Calendars.
- 2. Press MENU again and then tap Add calendars
- 3. Select a Google Calendar to add to your calendars list, and then tap OK.
- 4. Press BACK to update Calendar vita the new changes and return to the Calendar view you were viewing.

Changing Calendar settings

You can change Calendar's settings to specify how it displays events and how it notifies you of upcoming events. In any Calendar view, press MENU and then tap **More > Settings** to access Calendar's settings.

Reminder settings

Choose how you want Calendar to issue event remipders when there are upcoming events.

All calendars

Select this check box to use the same event reminder settings for all types of calendars. If you clear this check box, you can set different reminder settings for each calendar.

Set alerts & notifications

Configure event reminders to open an alert send you a notification, or turn off event notifications on your phone.

Default reminder time

Choose how soon before an event you want to be notified.

Select ringtone

Choose a ringtone to sound when you receive an event reminder.

Vibrate

Choose you want your phone to vibrate when you receive an event notification.

Hide declared events

Choose whether to show or hide events to which you've declined invitations.

Calendar view settings

Choose what appears in Calendar when opened and what's shown in Day, Week, and Month views.

Start in

Choose the default Calendar view that is a sea ayed when you open Calendar.

Day views

Choose whether to display Day way in the form of an event list or time list.

First day of week

Set the Month and Veel views to start on a Sunday or Monday.

Include weather

Make sure this cheer box is selected so that weather information is shown in Day view's event list.

City

By default, Day view displays your current location's weather. You can change it to display the weather of another city.

Sending a vCalendar

You can send a calendar event as a vCalendar to someone's phone or your computer using Bluetooth. You can also send it as a file attachment with your message.

- 1. From the Home screen, tap , and then tap Calendar,
- 2. In Month view, tap the day when the event takes place.
- 3. Press and hold the calendar event you want to send, and then tap Share vCalendar.
- 4. Choose whether to send the event using Blueto th or send it by email.
- 5. If you chose to send using Bluetooth, in the next law teps, you'll be asked to turn on Bluetooth on your phone and connect to the receiving Bluetooth device so the vCalendar can be sent. Follow the steps in "Sending" for nation from your phone to another device" in the Bluetooth chapter.

If you chose to send by email, a new message window opens and automatically includes the vCalendar as an attachmen. Your default email account that's selected in the Mail application will be used to send a more information about using the Mail application, see the Email chapter.



You can also choose to see the Calendar in a multimedia message. For more information about sending a multimedia less ge, see the Messages chapter.

About the Calendar widget

There's Calcudar widget available that you can add to your Home screen, and it comes in different calendar views. Tapping a day or event on the widget brings you to the Calendar as lication.

To find out how you can add a widget, see "Personalizing your Home screen with widgets" in the Personalizing chapter.

Clock and Weather

About the HTC Clock widget

The HTC Clock widget that's by default added on the Home streen's nows your current date, time, and location. You can tap the weather image on this vidget to open the Weather application and check for more weather forecasts. See "Checking weather" for details.



The HTC Clock odget comes in a variety of looks and designs. You can add another clock widget to the extended Home screen, if you want to have another clock that shows the time of another sit. To find out how you can add a widget, see the Personalizing chapter.



About the Clock application

The **Clock** application is more than just a regular date and time clock. It functions as a desk clock that shows the date, time, and weather information, and it can turn into a night clock or screensaver. It has a world clock that shows you the current time in leveral locations across the globe. There's also an alarm clock, stopwatch, and countdown tiner.

To open the Clock application:

- Tap the HTC Clock widget on the Home screen.
- From the Home screen, tap > Clock.

Tap the tabs at the bottom row or slide your finger across the tabs to switch between the different functions of the Clock application.



Using Desk Clock

Opening the Clock application brings you directly to the Desk Clock screen.

The Desk Clock displays the current date, time, and weather, an alarm clock indicator, and a battery charging indicator. You can dim the screen to show only the time and date on the Desk Clock.




- 1 The alarm clock indicator shows whether the alarm clock is on or off. To find out how to turn on and set the alarm clock, see "Setting the alarm clock".
- 2 Below they are time, you'll see the weather information of your current location. Tapping the weather information brings you to the Weather application where you can see weather forecasts of the next few days. See "Checking weather" for more information about the Weather application.
- The battery charging indicator shows the battery charge level. You'll see it only when your phone is plugged with the power adapter or connected to your computer.
- 4 This button to dim the screen and display only the time and date on the Desk Clock. To light up the screen again, tap anywhere on the screen or part the BACK button on your phone.
- Tap this button to dim the screen and go into screen are the few minutes. To light up the screen again, tap anywhere on the screen or press the BACK button on your phone.

You can change the Desk Clock screen to display the date and time of another time zone. To find out how to select a different time zone, see "Setting the time zone, date, and time".

Using World Clock

Use the Clock application's World Clock screen to check the current time in several places around the globe simultaneously. You can also set your home city, add more cities to the world clock list, and manually set your time zone, date, and time.



Setting your home city

- 1. Tap the HTC/Clark widget on the Home screen.
- 2. Tap the World Clock tab.
- 3. Press And then tap Home settings.
- 4. Interval home city's name. As you enter letters, the list is filtered to show matching cities and countries.
- 5. Scroll through the list and tap your home city.

Se tire the time zone, date, and time

To set the time zone, date, and time on your phone manually, you need to turn off auto time synchronization first.

- 1. Tap the HTC Clock widget on the Home screen.
- 2. Tap the World Clock tab.
- 3. Press MENU and then tap cocal ime settings to open the Date & time settings screen.
- 4. Clear the Automatic check box
- 5. Tap Select time zone Scroll through the list and then tap the time zone that you want.
- 6. To change the date, to Set date. Adjust the date by rolling the day, month, and year scroll wheels onscree and then tap Done.
- 7. To change the time, tap **Set time**. Adjust the time by rolling the hour and minute scroll wheels onscreen and then tap **Done**.
- 8. Tap the Use 24-hour format check box to toggle between using a 12-hour or a 24-hour time format.

9. Tap Select date format then select how you want dates to be displayed. (The selected date format also applies to the date displayed in the alarm clock.)



You can also press HOME > MENU and then tap **Settings > Date & time** to open the Date & time settings screen.

Adding a city to the World Clock screen

Add more cities to the World Clock screen so you can instruct check the date and time in these cities. In addition to the current and home cities, the Yorld Clock screen can display up to 15 cities.

- 1. Tap the HTC Clock widget on the Home screen.
- 2. Tap the World Clock tab.
- 3. Tap Add city. Enter the city name you want to add. As you enter letters, the list is filtered to show matching cities and countries

Setting the alarm clock

- To turn off an alarm, clear the check box (box tapping it) of that alarm.
- If you need to set more than three claims press MENU while you're on the Alarms screen and then tap Add alarm.

Deleting an alarm

- 1. Tap the HTC Clock widge on the Home screen.
- 2. Tap the Alarms tab.
- 3. On the Alarms screen, press MENU and then tap Delete.

Changing alarm sound settings

If you've set one or more alarms, you can change their settings such as the alarm volume, how long to snooze the alarm, and more.

- 2. Tap the Alarms tab.
- 3. On the Alarms screen, press MENU and then tap Settings. You can change the following settings:

Alarm in silent mode

This option is selected by default, which allows the alarm to sound even when your phone's volume is set to silent mode. Clear this check box if you want to silence the alarm when the volume is in silent mode.

Alarm volume

Set the volume level that you want or the alarm.

Snooze duration

Set how long to snooze between alarms.

Side button behavior

Choose what hope as to the alarm when pressing the side button (VOLUME UP/DOWN) of your phore. You can set the button to snooze, dismiss the alarm, or disable the button.

The side button works only when the phone's screen is not locked. While on the lock screen, to puse onscreen **Snooze** button to snooze, or slide down the screen to dismiss the

Checking weather

If you consented to turn location service on when you were setting up your phone for the first time, you'll see the weather of your current location right on the HTC Clock widget of your Home screen.

You can also use the Weather application to check the current year for and weather forecasts for the next four days of the week. In addition to your current location's weather, this application also displays the weather forecasts of other cities around the globe.



If you declined to turn location service on during first-time setup of your phone, turn location service on in your phone's settings so that you'll be able to check your current location's weather on the HTC Clock widget, Weather application, and the Weather widget. Press HOME > MENU, tap Settings > Location, and then select the Use wireless networks neck box.

- 1. Connect to the Internet using your phone's Wi-Fi or data connection. To find out how, see the Internet chapter.
- 2. From the Home screen, tap 6 > Veather.
- 3. On the Weather screen, you it is see your current location's weather. To check the weather in other cities, so ip of your finger up or down the screen.



- 4. The Weather application automatically a while ids and displays the latest weather updates. You can also download the most letent weather anytime by tapping ...
- 5. To see more weather details or the Web, tap Weather at the bottom center of the Weather screen.

Adding a city to the Weather creen

Add more cities to the Veather screen so you can instantly check the weather forecasts in these cities. In addition to your current location, the Weather screen can display up to 15 cities.

- 1. From the Homereen, tap > Weather.
- 2. On the Weather screen, tap
- 3. Enter the location you want to add on the text field. As you enter text, the list is filtered to show the possible locations based on the letters you entered.
- 4. Tap the desired city to select it.

Changing the order of cities on the Weather screen

 - To set autoupdate schedule, tap Update frequency and choose a schedule.
 - Ta T mperature scale to choose whether to display weather in Celsius or Fahrenheit.

About the Weather widget

Use the **Weather** widget to instantly check weather for casts of your current location and other cities without having to open the Weather application.

The Weather widget comes in different looks and styles. You can add this widget to the Home screen, if it's not yet added. To find a throw you can add a widget, see "Adding a widget to your Home screen" in the Personal ring chapter.

Internet

Data connection

Your phone will be automatically configured to use your mobile operator's data connection when you turn on your phone (if the SIM card is inserted) for the first time.

Checking the data connection you are using

- 1. From the Home screen, press MENU and then tac Settings > Wireless & networks.
- 2. Tap Mobile networks > Network operators Access Point Names.

Turning the data connection on or off

Turning your data connection off can be potimize your battery life. It can also save money on data charges. However, when your data connection is turned off, you may not always receive automatic updates to your entail, social network accounts, and other synchronized information.

- 1. From the Home screen press MENU and then tap Settings > Wireless & networks.
- 2. Select the **Mobile Petwork** check box to turn on the data connection; clear the check box to turn off the data connection.

Creating a new access point

When you need to add another data connection on your phone, obtain the access point name are settings (including username and password if required) from your mobile operator.

- the Home screen, press MENU and then tap Settings > Wireless & networks.
- 2. Tap Mobile networks > Access Point Names.
- 3. On the APNs screen, press MENU and then Lan New APN.
- 4. In the Edit access point screen, enter the APN settings. Tap the APN setting item to edit it.
- 5. Press MENU and then tap Save when you fill ish setting up the new APN.

Enabling data roaming

Data roaming lets you connect to your mobile operator's partner networks and access data services when you are out of our mobile operator's coverage area.



Accessing data services while paming may incur significant charges. Inquire about the data roaming tariffs with your mobile operator before enabling data roaming.

- 1. From the Hone school, press MENU and then tap Settings > Wireless & networks.
- 2. Tap Mobile networks and then select the Data roaming check box.

Select the **Data roaming sound** check box if you'd like your phone to play a sound so you'll know when it's connecting to a roaming network.

Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi provides wireless Internet access over distances of up to 300 feet (100 meters). To use Wi-Fi on your phone, you need access to a wireless access point or "hotspot".



The availability and range of the Wi-Fi signal depends on the number infras ructure, and other objects through which the signal passes.

Turning Wi-Fi on and connecting to a wireless network

- 1. From the Home screen, press MENU, and then to Settings > Wireless & networks.
- 2. Select the Wi-Fi check box to turn Wi-Fi on. The pinene will scan for available wireless networks.
- 3. Tap Wi-Fi settings. The network name and security settings of detected Wi-Fi networks are displayed in the Wi-Fi networks section.
- 4. Tap a Wi-Fi network to connect if y u selected an open network, you will be automatically connected to the network. If you selected a network that is secured with WEP, enter the key and then tap Connect.
 - Depending on the network type and its security settings, you may also need to enter more information or choose a security certificate.

When your phone is connected to a wireless network, the Wi-Fi icon appears in the status bar and tells you the approximate signal strength (number of bands that light up). If **Network notification** in Wi-Fi settings is enabled, this icon appears in the status bar whenever the phone detects an available wireless network within range.



The next time your phone connects to a previously accessed secured wireless network, you will not be promitted to enter the key or other security information again, unless you reset your phone to its factory, refault settings.

Connecting to a Wi-Fi network with EAP-TLS security

You may need to install a network certificate (1912) to your phone before you can connect to a Wi-Fi network with EAP-TLS authentication pro pool.

- 1. Save the certificate file to the root folder of the storage card.
- 2. From the Home screen, press MENU, and hen tap Settings > Security.
- 3. Tap Install from SD card.
- 4. Select the network certificate ended to connect to the EAP-TLS network.
- 5. Follow the steps in the previous section to connect to the Wi-Fi network.

Checking the wireless network status

- 1. From the Home screen, press MENU and then tap Settings > Wireless & networks.
- 2. On the Wireless & networks screen, tap Wi-Fi settings, and then tap the wireless network that the phone is currently connected to.

A message box is then displayed showing the Wi-Fi network names atus, speed, signal strength, and more.



If you want to remove the wireless network settings on your phone, tap Forget on this window. You need to enter the settings again if you want to connect to this wireless network.

Connecting to another Wi-Fi network

- 1. On the Wireless & networks screen, tap Wi Fi settings. Detected Wi-Fi networks are displayed in the Wi-Fi networks section. In manually scan for available Wi-Fi networks, on the Wi-Fi settings screen, press Mi Nord then tap Scan.
- 2. Tap another Wi-Fi network to connect to it.



If the wireless network you want to connect to is not in the list of detected networks, scroll down the screen, then tap Add WinFi retwork. Enter the wireless network settings, and then tap Save.

Adding the Data connection and Wi-Fi widgets

Add the Data connection and/or Wi-Fi widget to the Home screen to make it faster for you to turn on or off these connections. Tap the widget to turn on or off the connection.

Connecting to a virtual private network (VPN)

From your phone, you can add, set up, and manage virtual private networks (VPNs) that allow you to connect and access resources inside a secured local network, such as your corporate network.

Preparing your phone for VPN connection

Depending on the type of VPN you are using at work and have required to enter your login credentials and/or install security certificates to fore you can connect to your company's local network. You can get this information from your network administrator.

Also, your phone must first establish a Wi-Fi or data connection before you can initiate a VPN connection. For information about setting up and using these connections on your phone, see "Data connection" and "Wi-Fi Latins chapter.

Setting up secure credential storage

If your network administrator instructs you to download and install security certificates, you must first set up the phone's secure credential storage.

- 1. From the Home screen press (ENU, tap Settings > Security, and then tap Set password.
- 2. Enter a new pass or (at least 8 characters without any spaces) for the credential storage, scroll down and confirm the password, and then tap OK.
- 3. Select the Weese are credentials check box.

You can then download and install the certificates needed to access your local network Your network act pinistrator can tell you how to do this.

Adding a PN onnection

- From the Home screen, press MENU, and then tar Settings > Wireless & networks > VPN settings.
- 2. Tap Add VPN, and then tap the type of VPN you want to add.
- 3. Tap the VPN settings and set them up according to the security details you have obtained from your network administrator.

The VPN is then added to the VPN section of the VPN settings screen.

Connecting to a VPN

Disconnecting from a VPN

- 2. Tap the VPN connection to return to the VPN settings screen, and then tap the VPN connection to disconnect from it.

When your phone has disconnected from the VPN, the VPN disconnected icon is displayed in the notification area of the title bar.

Open the web browser to start surfing the web. The browser is fully optimized and comes with advanced features that let you enjoy Internet browsing on your phone.



You must have an active data connection or Wi-Fi connection to access the internet

Opening the browser

From the Home screen, tap -> Internet.

Going to a web page

- 1. On the browser screen, press MENU and then tap the URL field on top of the screen.
- 2. Enter the web page address using the keyboard. As you enter the address, matching web page addresses will appear on the screen. Tap an address to go directly to that web page or continue entering the web page address.
- 3. Tap the Enter key on the on creen keyboard.

Setting your home page

Changing the streen orientation





- 4. Choose the type of **Security** and set the **Parsword** (key) for your wireless router. If you selected **None** in Security, you don't seed to enter a password.

The password is the key other propresed to enter on their device so they can connect and use your phone as a wireless outer.

5. Select the Portable Wi- The stot check box to turn on your phone's wireless router.

Your phone is ready to be seed as a wireless router when you see on the status bar. Only two devices can or fect to your phone's wireless router at one time so if a third device tries to connect to your phone, it won't be able to.



Bluetooth

Using Bluetooth

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communications technology at allows devices to exchange information over a distance of about eight meters without equiring a physical connection.

Turning Bluetooth on or off

- 1. From the Home screen, press MENU, and then tap Settings > Wireless & networks.
- 2. Select or clear the Bluetooth check box.

An even easier way to turn Bluetooth or or of its with the Bluetooth widget on the Home screen. For instructions on adding a violet o the Home screen, see "Adding a widget to your Home screen" in the Persona and chapter.



Turn off Bluetooth when not in use to conserve battery power, or in places where using a wireless device is prohibited, such as combourd an aircraft and in hospitals.

Changing the phone name

The phone name identities your phone to other devices.

- 1. From the form screen, press MENU, and then tap Settings > Wireless & networks.
- 2. If the Blut oth check box is not selected, select it to turn Bluetooth on.
- 3. Tap Bu et ooth settings > Device name.
- 4. Into the name for your phone in the dialog box, and then tap OK.

Connecting a Bluetooth headset or car kit

You can listen to music over an Bluetooth stereo headset, or have hands-free conversations using a compatible Bluetooth headset or car kit. It's the same procedure to set up stereo audio and hands-free.

For you to listen to music with your headset or car kit, the headset or car kit must support the A2DP Bluetooth profile.

Turn on the headset and put it in "pairing" mode. Refer to the instructions that came with the headset to find out how.

- 1. From the Home screen, press MENU, and then table tings > Wireless & networks > Bluetooth settings.
- 2. If Bluetooth is not switched on, tap the Bluetooth check box to switch it on.
- 3. Tap Scan for devices. Your phone will stall to scan for Bluetooth devices within range.
- 4. When you see the name of you head set displayed in the Bluetooth devices section, tap the name. Your phone then do notically tries to pair with the headset.
- 5. If automatic pairing fails enter he passcode supplied with your headset.

The pairing and contection status is displayed below the hands-free headset or car kit name in the Bluetooth devices section. When the Bluetooth headset or car kit is connected to your phone, the Bluetooth connected icon is displayed in the status bar. Depending on the type of headset or car kit you have connected, you can then start using the headset or car kit to listen to music and/or make and receive phone calls.

Reconnecting a readset or car kit

Weny u have paired a headset with your phone, you should be able to reconnect it automatically by turning on Bluetooth on your phone, and then turning on the headset. However, sometimes you will need to reconnect manually, for example if you have been using your headset with another Bluetooth device.

- 1. Put the headset in pairing mode.
- 2. On your phone, press HOME > MENU and ther tap Settings > Wireless & networks > Bluetooth settings.
- 3. If Bluetooth is not switched on tab he Bluetooth check box to switch it on.
- 4. Tap the headset's name in the B letooth devices section.
- 5. If prompted to enter a bask too , try 0000 or 1234, or consult the headset/car kit documentation to find the passcode.

Sending and receiving information using Bluetooth

You can use Bluetooth to transfer information between your phone and another Bluetoothenabled device such as a phone or notebook computer. You can send the following types of information, depending on the device you are sending to:

- Images and videos
- Calendar events
- Contacts
- Audio files

Before you begin, set the receiving device to discoverable mode. You may also need to set it to "Receive Beams" or "Receive Files". Refer to the device's documentation for instructions on receiving information over Bluetooth

The first time you transfer information between your phone and another device, you need to enter or confirm a security passcoles. After that, your phone and the other device are paired, and you will not need to exchange passcodes to transfer information in the future.

- 1. On your phone, open the application that contains the information or file you want to send.
- 2. Follow the steets are the type of item you want to send:
 - Photo or Vide (in Camera). After capturing a photo, on the preview screen, tap the Share by the A, and then tap Bluetooth.
 - Photo and videos (in Gallery). On the Albums tab [], tap an album. Tap the Share out on [], tap Bluetooth, select the items you want to share, and then tap Next.
 - Calendar event. In the Calendar's Day view, Agenda view, or Week view, press and hold be event, and then tap Share vCalendar > Bluetooth.
 - Contact. On the People screen's All tab press and hold the contact, and then tap Send contact as vCard. Tap the down array icc i, and then select Bluetooth from the displayed list.
 - Music track. With the track displayed on the Now playing screen, press MENU, and then tap Share > Bluetooth.
 - Voice recording. On the main to be recorder screen, tap the Share button then tap Bluetooth.
- 3. If you are prompted to turn or B uetooth, tap Yes.
- 4. Tap the name of the receiving device.
- 5. If prompted, according connection on the receiving device, and enter the same passcode on both your phose and the other device, or confirm the auto-generated passcode.
- 6. On the receiving device, accept the file.

The location where the information is saved depends on the type of information and the receiving device:

If you send a calendar event or contact, it is normally added directly to the corresponding
application on the receiving device. For example, if you send a calendar event to a
compatible phone, the event is shown in that phone's calendar application.

 If you send another file type to a Windows computer, it is normally saved in the Bluetooth Exchange folder within your personal document folders.

On Windows XP, the path may be:

C:\Documents and Settings\[your username]\My Documents\B\\etaetooth Exchange

On Windows Vista, the path may be:

C:\Users\[your username]\Documents

On Windows 7, the path may be:

C:\Users\[your username]\My Documents\Blueto xchange Folder

 If you send a file to another device, the say location may depend on the file type. For example, if you send an image file to another hobile phone, it may be saved in a folder named "Images".

Receiving information from another devi-

Your device is capable of receiving a wide variety of file types with Bluetooth, including photos, music tracks, and decuments such as PDFs.

To receive files from another vice, you need to have an SD card installed in your phone.

- 1. From the Home so sen press MENU, and then tap Settings > Wireless & networks > Bluetooth setting
- 2. If Bluetocal is wit switched on, tap the Bluetooth check box to switch it on.
- 3. Select the Discoverable check box.
- On the anding device, send one or more files to your phone. Refer to the device's locu nentation for instructions on sending information over Bluetooth.
- 5. If prompted, accept the pairing request on your phone and the receiving device.
 - Also enter the same passcode on both your phot, and the other device, or confirm the auto-generated passcode.
 - A Bluetooth authorization request is then displaced on your phone.
- 6. If you want to automatically receive fires from the sending device in future, select the Always check box.
- 7. Tap Accept or OK.
- 8. When your phone receive, a fire ransfer request notification, slide down the notifications panel, tap the incoming file of fication, and then tap Accept.
- 9. When a file is transferred, notification is displayed. To open the file immediately, slide down the notification, panel, and then tap the relevant notification.

When you open a received file, what happens next depends on the file type:

- Media files and ocuments are usually opened directly in a compatible application. For example, if you open a music track, it starts playing in the Music application.
- For a vCalendar file, select the calendar where you want to save the event, and then tap Import. The vCalendar is added to your Calendar events. For information on using Calendar, see the Calendar chapter.
- For a vCard contact file, if there are multiple vCard files on your storage card, you can choose to import one, several, or all of those contacts to your contacts list.

Adding the Bluetooth received folder to the Home screen

You can add a folder to the Home screen that shows all files you have received with Bluetooth.

- 1. From the Home screen, tap
- 2. On the Add to Home screen, tap Folder > Bluetooth received.
- 3. Press and hold the Bluetooth received folder icon, and drag it to the Home screen position you want.

To view the folder contents, tap the folder icon. To open a file, tap the file name.



Camera

Camera basics

Whether traveling for business or fun, enjoy taking photos and videos of your trip and encounters with your phone's camera.



Photos and videos you captured with the camera are stored anto the microSD card.

- From the Home screen, tap Solution > Camera to option the camera in photo mode and take photos.
- From the Home screen, tap ② > Camco der to open the camera directly in video mode so you can immediately start capturing videos.

Viewfinder screen

The camera displays in landscare wew only. You'll find the following controls on the Viewfinder screen:



1 Menu tab

Tap to open the menu panel and change tamera settings. See "Camera settings" for details.

2 View button

Tap to open the Gallery application so you can browse through and view the photos and videos in your storage card.

See the Gallery chapter to details.

3 Auto-focus indicator

Whenever you point the camera at a different subject or location, the screen shows the auto-cush dicator at the center as the camera automatically focuses on the center of the screen.

When you appeared her area on the screen, the indicator will move to where you tapped and the camera will automatically focus on that area.

4 Zoom button

Tap to display or hide the onscreen zoom bar. See "Zooming" for details.

Using the optical trackball as the shutter release

The optical trackball works as the shutter release for the camera. Press the optical trackball to take a photo or begin capturing video. Press it again to stop capturing video.

Review screen

After capturing a photo or video, the Review screen will display he photo or the starting image of the video that you have just captured. You can talk to e anscreen buttons to delete the photo or video, view it in the Gallery application

Zooming

Before taking a photo or video, you can first use the onscreen zoom bar to zoom in or out of your subject.

1. To display the onscreen zoom bar, tap the **Zoom** button . You can also slide your finger up or down the Viewfinder screen.

While the zoom bar is shown on the Viewfinder screen, or who also see the remaining photo shots or remaining video recording duration the upper-right side of the screen.

Camera settings

Open the menu panel to change basic camera settings and access more camera settings. You can also switch between photo and video modes from the menu panel.



Changing basic settings

There's a Brightness bas that allows you to adjust the brightness level. Slide your finger up or down the Brightness bar to increase or decrease brightness.

Image properties

Slide four finger across each of the slider bars to adjust the contrast, saturation, and sharps

Effect

You can apply a special effect to photos and videos that you will capture. Scroll through the Effect menu and choose from effects such as epis, solarize, posterize, and more.

Changing advanced settings

- 1. On the Viewfinder screen, tap 2 to op in the menu panel.
- 2. Tap in the menu panel to display the Settings menu and access more camera settings. The following are settings that you can change from the Settings menu:

White balance

White balance enables to a camera to capture colors more accurately by adjusting to your current lighting environment. White balance settings include: Auto, Incandescent, Fluorescent, David ht, and Cloudy.

ISO (photo mode only)

You can choose an ISO level or set it back to Auto. Higher ISO numbers are better for taking pictures in low light conditions.

Resolution

Select a photo or video resolution to use for capturing.

Widescreen (photo mode only)

Metering mode

Set now the camera measures the amount of light to calculate the best exposure:

- Spot metering mode allows the camera to persuare light around the focus point.
- Center area mode allows the camera to reasure light in the center.
- Average mode allows the camera to head re light in the whole image.

Review duration

Set the time for a captured phick of video to be displayed on the Review screen before the camera changes back to the View inder screen.

Flicker adjustment

When taking indoor shot under fluorescent lighting, keep this setting on Auto or change it to the proper figuracy (50Hz or 60Hz) of the power in your country to reduce flicker.

Auto Focus

This option enables or disables centered auto focus. Auto focus is enabled by default.

Face detection

This option allows the camera to automatically recognize faces and adjust the focus when you capture photos or videos of people. Face detection will be turned off if you disable auto focus.

Shutter sound

Select or clear this check box, depending on whether you want the camera to play a shutter sound when you press the shutter release.

Time stamp (photo mode only)

Select this check box when you want the date and time to be do ad on captured photos.

Grid (photo mode only)

Select this check box when you want to display a Viewfinder screen so you can easily frame and center your subject before taking the photo.

About the Gallery application

Using the Gallery application, you can view photos and watch victor that you've taken with your phone's camera, downloaded, or copied onto your storage care. You can also take a look at your photos and your friends' photos that are on your oc al networks (Facebook and Flickr only).

For photos that are in your storage card, you can debasil editing such as rotate and crop. You can also easily make a photo as your contact pietro or wallpaper and share photos to your friends.

Selecting an album

From the Home screen, tap Gallery.

The Gallery application opensur at Albums screen where your photos and videos are organized by albums for easy yearing.



The following are preset albums:

- Camera shots lets you view photos and ideos that are stored in the camera's folder.
- Photos and videos that you set as your favorites will be grouped under My favorites.
- All photos lets you view all photos that are stored in all the folders on the storage card.
- All videos lets you vie / Il videos that are stored in all the folders on the storage card.
- All downloads less you view photos and videos that you downloaded.

Folders in your sto ago and that contain photos and videos will also be treated as albums and will be listed below the preset albums. The actual folder names will be used as the album names.

Simply tap an album to view the photos and/or videos in that album.




If there are photos or videos under the root path of your storage card (that are not contained in folders), they will be grouped under the **Other** album.

Viewing photos and videos

After selecting an album from the Gallery application's Albums screen, you can browse through the photos and videos of that album either in filmstrip or grid view. Tap a photo or video to view it in full screen.

Browsing in filmstrip or grid view





Using Google Maps

Google Maps lets you track your current location, view real-time raffic situations, and receive detailed directions to your destination. It also provides a search polymere you can locate places of interest or an address on a vector or aerial map, or resultance in street level.



- You need an active mobile data or Wi-Fi connection to use Coops Maps.
- The Google Maps application does not cover every country or city.

Viewing locations

Turning on location services

Before you open Google Maps and find pur location or search for places of interest, you must enable location sources.

Viewing map layers

Initially, Google Maps opens with a street map. You can view additional map layers, such as satellite images, traffic information, your Google Latitude friends' locations, and Wikipedia information on locations. You can also view maps that you and other people have created in Google Maps on the web.



- To select more layers such as transit lines or maps that you have created in Google Maps on the web, tap More layers.
- To clear layers and view only the street map, tap Clear map.

Searching for a location

Your location is not shared automatically. You must join Latitude and then invite your friends to view your location or accept their invitations.

Opening and Joining Latitude

- 3. After you've joined Latitude and closed the application, you can do any of the following to open it from the Home screen:
 - From the Home screen, tap



The next time you want to visit the same place, simply access the footbrint. You can then dial the phone number or view the location in Google Maps

Setting a sound profile

Switch to vibrate or silent mode, or use the normal phone sound settings.

- 2. In the Choose a Profile options menu, tap the sound profile you want to use.

Enabling or disabling touch tones

You can choose to play a sound when you are selecting items onscreen.

- 1. From the Home screen, press MENU and then tap Settings > Sound.
- 2. Scroll down the screen, and then select on the Audible selection check box.

Choosing the notification sound

You can select the sound to play when your phone receives new notifications.

- 1. From the Home screen, press and then tap Settings > Sound > Notification sound.
- 2. Select your preferred national in the list, and then tap OK.



Changing the phone language

When you turn your phone on for the first time, you are prompted to select the language you would like to use. You can also change the language on the fly whenever you like. Changing the language adjusts the keyboard layout, date and time formatting and more. The languages available to choose from may depend on the version of phone you have.

- 1. From the Home screen, press MENU and then tap Settings> Language & keyboard > Select language.
- 2. Tap the language and corresponding region you want to use.
- 3. Press HOME to return to the Home screen. You make eed to wait briefly as the new



Optimizing your phone's battery life

When you're on the go, it's not always easy to charge your phone's battery as often as you'd like. Follow these tips to extend the time between charges:

- Turn off wireless functions such as Bluetooth, Wi-Fi, and data connection when you're not using them. See the Internet and Bluetooth chapters for details.
- Use only GSM networks. See "Using the GSM network of your hobile operator" in this chapter for details
- Do not use GPS satellites to determine your GPS location. See the Maps and location chapter for details.
- Lower the screen brightness. See "Adjusting the screen brightness manually" in this chapter for details.
- Switch off screen animations. See "Switching animation effects on or off" in this chapter for details
- Cut down on activities such as internet browsing. Wireless data consumes a lot of power.
- Avoid making very long prior estalls or using the camera for extended periods of time.

Using the GSM network of your mobile operator

Switch to using the 55.1 network of your mobile operator if you're not using a data connection to connect to the Internet. Connecting to your mobile operator's GSM network consumes less battery power

- 1. From the Home screen, press MENU, and then tap Settings.
- 2. Tap Wireless & networks > Mobile networks > Network Mode.
- 3. Tab GSM only.

Checking the power usage of applications

- 1. From the Home screen, press MENU and then sap Settings.
- 2. Scroll down the screen, and then tap Ab ut phone > Battery > Battery use.

Managing memory

Checking how much phone memory is available for use

- 1. From the Home screen, press MENU and then tap Settings
- 2. Scroll down the screen, and then tap SD & phone storage. The available phone memory is displayed in the Internal phone storage section.

Checking the available storage card space

- 1. From the Home screen, press MENU and then tap sexings.
- 2. Scroll down the screen, and then tap SD & phone storage. The total and available storage card space is displayed in the SD card accton.

Clearing application cache and data

- 1. From the Home screen, pressive and then tap Settings.
- 2. Scroll down the screen, and then tap Applications > Manage applications.
- 3. On the Manage application screen, tap the application whose cache and/or data you want to delete

Uninstalling third-party applications

- Uninstall downloaded programs from Android Market you no longer use. See "Finding and Installing Apps" for android Market" in the More apps chapter for details.

Network

Check information about your mobile operator and its sarvice status.

Phone identity

Check information about your phone and the SIM card you are using.

Battery

Check information about the battery such as its current battery level, status, and what programs are using the battery.

Hardware information

Check the Wi-Fi MAC and Bluet and addresses.

Software information

Check the version and other information about the Android platform being used by the phone. You can also creck the version of the web browser.

Legal information

Read legate formation from HTC and Google, and licenses used by the phone.

Update and reset

Updating your phone's system software

From time to time, system software updates for your phone may be vailable. Your phone can check and then notify you if an update is available. You can then download and install the update to your phone.

Depending on the type of update, the update may case in our personal data and customized settings, and also remove any programs you have installed. Make sure that you have backed up the information and files you want to seep. See "Backing up phone data" in this chapter for details.



Checking and downloading system software up and may incur additional data transfer fees from your mobile operator.

Checking for phone system software updates manually

- 1. From the Home screen, press MENU and then tap Settings.
- 2. Scroll down the screen, and then tap About phones System software updates.
- 3. On the System software update screen, tap Check now.

Performing a hard/factory reset

You can return your phone to its original state, as it was when it left the factory. This is also called a hard reset. You might want to do this if you are giving your phone to a friend or relative and you want to remove all your data first, or if your phone as a persistent problem that is not solved by powering off the phone and then powering an again.

A factory reset is a drastic measure. It permanently erases at your personal data and customized settings, and also removes any programs your lave installed. Make sure that you have backed up the information and files you want to keep.



If your phone hangs or freezes, we recommend that you a "oft" reset instead of a hard/factory reset. To perform a soft reset, remove the battery, wait for a lew seconds, and then re-install it. After re-installing the battery, turn on the phone.

Performing a factory reset via settings

The most convenient way to do a factor reset is via the phone settings.

- 1. From the Home screen, press NENU and then tap Settings.
- 2. Scroll down the screen, and the stap SD & phone storage > Factory data reset.
- 3. On the Factory data reget screen, tap Reset phone, and then tap Erase everything.

Performing a factory reset using phone buttons

If you cannot turn on your phone or access the phone settings, you can still perform a factory reset by sing the buttons on the phone.

- 1. With the properturned off, press and hold the VOLUME DOWN button, and then briefly press the POWER button.
- 2 Press VOLUME DOWN to select CLEAR STORAGE, and then press POWER to reset the evice.
