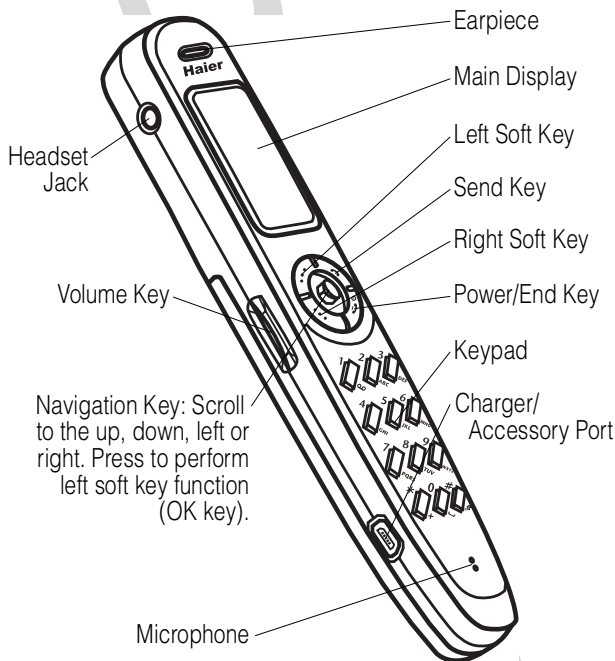

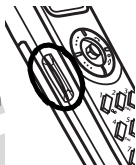

The SAR limit set by the FCC is 1.6 W/kg.<sup>1</sup> Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions accepted by the FCC with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output.

The highest SAR value for the model phone as reported to the FCC when tested for use at the ear is 0.586 W/kg and when worn on the body is 0.586 W/kg. (Body-worn measurements differ among phone models, depending upon available enhancements and FCC requirements.)

1. The SAR limit recommended by international guidelines (FCC) for mobile phones used by the public is 1.6 watts/kilogram (W/kg) averaged over ten grams of tissue. The limit incorporates a substantial margin for safety to give additional protection for the public and to account for any variations in measurements.

While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various phones and at various positions, they all meet the government requirement.

The FCC has granted an Equipment Authorization for this model phone with all reported SAR levels evaluated as in compliance with the FCC RF exposure guidelines. ## Installing the SIM Card

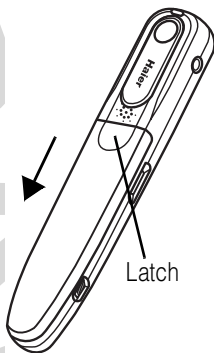
Your Subscriber Identity Module (SIM) card contains your phone number, service details, and phonebook/message information.

**Caution:** Do not bend or scratch your SIM card. Avoid exposing your SIM card to static electricity, water, or dirt.

### Step

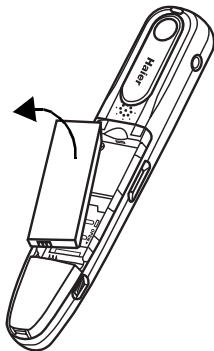
- 1 If the phone's battery door is already in place, press the latch to remove the battery door from your phone.

**Note:** Turn off your phone every time when you remove/insert the SIM card.

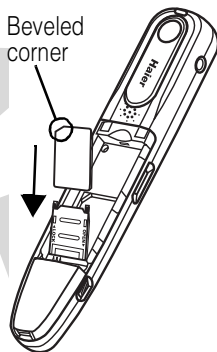


## Step

- 2 Lift the battery up from the top end and remove it from the phone.

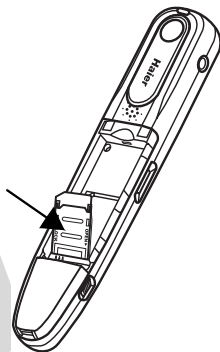


- 3 Fit the SIM card into the slot, with the metal contacts facing down and the beveled corner pointed at the notch of the SIM card compartment (as shown).

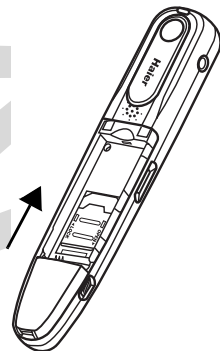


## Step

- 4 Push the slot into the SIM card compartment so that it clicks into place.



- 5 Slide the slot upper cover in the direction shown until it locks into place.



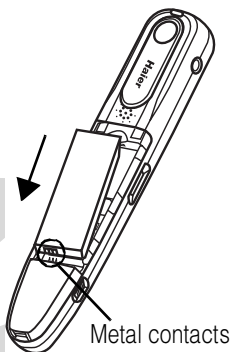
# Installing the Battery

You must install and charge the battery to use your phone.

Your phone is designed to use only the Haier batteries and accessories. We recommend that you store batteries in their protective cases when not in use.

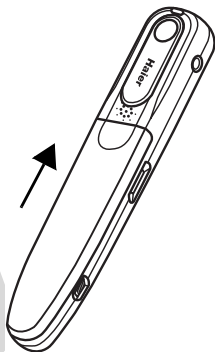
## Step

- 1 Remove the battery from the plastic case.
- 2 Insert the battery with the metal contacts on the bottom end in alignment with the ones on the phone. Push the top end of the battery into the battery compartment so that it clicks into place.



## Step

- 3 Place the battery door back on the phone, aligning the tabs on the battery door with the groove on the phone. Slide the battery door in the direction shown until it locks into place.



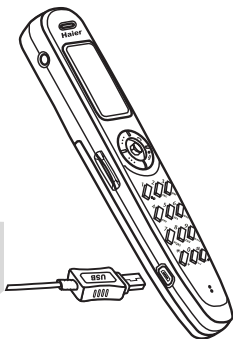
## Charging the Battery

New batteries are partially charged. Before using your phone, charge the battery as described below. Some batteries perform best after several full charge/discharge cycles.

### Step

- 1 With the phone facing up, plug in the travel charger.

**Note:** The charger connector is keyed and can only be inserted 1 way (with the text *USB* facing up).



- 2 Plug the other end into the USB port on your personal computer.
- 3 When done charging, unplug the travel charger from the USB port and then disconnect it from your phone.

When you charge the battery, the battery power level indicator in the display shows how much of the charging process is complete. At least 1 segment of the battery power level indicator must be visible to ensure full phone functionality while charging.

When battery power is low, your phone will play the warning tones to warn you (see page 49). Charge the battery immediately.

If battery power runs out, your phone turns off.

## **Battery Use**

To maximize your battery's performance:






- Always use the Haier batteries and battery chargers. The phone warranty does not cover damage caused from using non-Haier batteries and battery chargers.
- Charging begins when the battery power level indicator appears in the display. Batteries stored for a long time may require 10-20 minutes to charge before the display is turned on.
- Battery life would be shorter than normal if users play games or use phones in low signal strength areas.
- Maintain the battery at or near room temperature when charging.
- Do not expose batteries to temperatures below  $-10^{\circ}\text{C}$  ( $14^{\circ}\text{F}$ ) or above  $45^{\circ}\text{C}$  ( $113^{\circ}\text{F}$ ). Always take your phone with you when you leave your vehicle.
- When you do not intend to use a battery for a while, store it uncharged in a cool, dark, dry place, such as a refrigerator.
- Over time, batteries gradually wear down and require longer charging times. This is normal. If you charge your battery regularly and notice a decrease in talk

time or an increase in charging time, then it is probably time to buy a new battery.



**Caution:** The rechargeable batteries that power this phone must be disposed of properly and may need to be recycled. Contact your local recycling center for proper disposal methods. Never dispose of batteries in a fire because they may explode. Refer to your battery's label for battery type.

## Turning On Your Phone

### Step

- 1 Press and hold  to turn on the phone.
- 2 If necessary, enter your SIM card PIN code and press **OK**  to unlock the SIM card.  
**Caution:** If you enter an incorrect PIN code 3 times in a row, your phone disables the SIM card and displays SIM Blocked.
- 3 If necessary, enter your 4-digit (up to 8-digit) unlock code and press **OK**  to unlock the SIM card.
- 4 Enter the current time according to the default 24-hour format (for example, enter 14:00 instead of 2:00 pm) and press **OK**  to confirm.
- 5 Enter the current date (for example, enter 2004/07/20) and press **OK**  to confirm.



**Tip:** To reset date and time, press **MENU**  > **Setting** > **Clock** > **Set the date** and **Set the time**. To select a date format or time format, press **MENU**  > **Setting** > **Clock** > **Date format** or **Time format**.

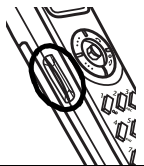
Your phone starts to connect to your service provider and then enters the idle display if connection is successfully established.

## Adjusting Volume

On the idle display:

### Step

Scroll the volume key up or down to increase or decrease earpiece volume during a call. The phone saves the settings seconds later.



## Displaying Your Phone Number



You can display your phone number to people you call.





**Tip:** Scroll to **Preset** to use the settings configured by your service provider.

## Making a Call

On the idle display:


Press	To
1 keypad keys	enter a phone number
	<b>Tip:</b> If you make a mistake, press <b>CLEAR</b>  to clear the last digit, or press and hold <b>CLEAR</b>  to clear all digits.
2 	make the call
3 	end the call


**Tip:** To enter an extension, press and hold  to insert a “P” (pause character) and then enter an extension.



**Tip:** To make an international call from the idle display, press and hold  to insert a “+” and then enter the country code, area code (omitting the starting 0), and phone number.

## Answering a Call

When you receive a call, your phone rings and/or vibrates and displays an incoming call message.

Press	To
1 	answer the call




Press	To
2 	end the call

**Tip:** When **Anykey answer** is active, press any of the keys except  to answer the call. (To activate, press **MENU**  > **Setting** > **Call feature** > **Anykey answer** > **ON.**)

**Note:** If the phone is locked, you must unlock it to answer calls.

## Muting a Call

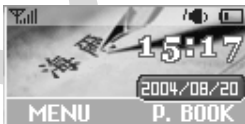
You can make the 3rd party not hear your voice when a call is in progress.

Press	To
1 <b>OPTIONS</b> 	open the options menu
2  up/down	scroll to <b>Mute</b>
3 <b>OK</b> 	mute the call


# Basic Operation



---



## Using the Main Display



The *idle display* is the standard display when you are *not* on a call or using the menu. The main display shows the phone status, including network signal, battery power level and time as well as date indicators. You can press any of the keys to turn backlight on if the display turns off after a while.

The MENU indicator indicates that you can press the left soft key  to display the main menu.



Labels at the bottom corners show the current soft key functions. Press the left soft key  or right soft key  to perform the function indicated by the left or right soft key label.









Scroll  up/down/left/right or press  straight in from the idle display to quickly access 5 phone features.










When you receive an incoming call, the main display may show the caller's number and name.







**Tip:** To see a caller's name in the display, the caller's number must match an entry in your phonebook. To create a phonebook entry, see page 85.

At the top of the display are the following status indicators:

Icon	Name	Description
	<b>Signal Strength</b>	Indicates strength of signal being received. The more vertical bars, the better the reception (5 bars maximum).  Bars differ in color by signal strength: <b>green &gt; orange &gt; red.</b>
	<b>Battery Power Level</b>	Indicates remaining battery power. The more bars, the more battery power available (3 bars maximum). The icon flashes when battery power is near empty.  Bars differ in color by battery power level: <b>green &gt; orange &gt; red.</b>

	<b>Roaming</b>	Indicates you are surfing over another service provider's wireless network.
	<b>Call Connected</b>	Indicates you are on a call.

	<b>Line 2 (Phone Number 2)</b>	Indicates the other telephone line or phone number you are using to receive and send calls.
	<b>Call Muted</b>	Indicates the microphone is turned off and other party(ies) on a call cannot hear your voice.



# Using Menus







From the idle display, press **MENU**  to display the main menu.

## Selecting a Menu Feature

To select a phone feature, starting from the idle display:

### Find the Feature




**MENU**  > **Phonebook** > **Add**

Use  to scroll, and   to select the soft key functions listed in the bottom left and right corners of the display. Pressing  straight in (**OK**  ) functions the same as the left soft key. To select **Add** in a list, you may press .

**Note:** In this user's guide, "Find the Feature" always indicates the feature's position in the main menu.


## Entering Feature Information

Some features require you to enter information:






- Enter numbers or text with keypad keys. A *flashing cursor* shows where text is entered.
- Press  left/right to select an option. Press  right to check/uncheck a feature.
- If you enter or edit information and do not want to save changes, press  to exit without saving.

## Entering Text

Multiple text entry modes make it easy for you to enter names, numbers, and messages on your phone. Most text entry screens let you enter letters, numbers, and/or

symbols as required. Press  from a text entry screen to select a text entry mode. The text entry mode you select remains active until you change it by selecting another mode.

To select a text entry mode with ease:

- Press  once to insert a space.
- In the **TAP English** text entry mode, press and hold  to switch among **abc** (lower case)/**Abc** (initial capital letters)/**ABC** (upper case).
- In the **iTAP English** text entry mode, press and hold  to toggle between **a** (lower case) and **A** (upper case).
- Press  or  to select the **Symbol** text entry mode.





## Setting Ready-to-Use Text Entry Modes

You can predefine your custom text input modes.

<b>TAP English</b>	Type letters, numbers, and symbols by pressing a key 1 or more times (see page 36).
<b>iTAP English</b>	Let the phone predict each word as you type it (see page 37).
<b>123</b>	Enter numbers only (see page 39).
<b>Symbol</b>	Enter symbols only (see page 38).

## Setting Words to Complete Automatically

**Word completion** allows you to quickly enter a word after you key in the 1st 3 characters.

1 keypad keys	enter the 1st 3 characters of a word
2 	open the word candidates list
3 	scroll to the desired word
4 OK 	select the word

## Using TAP English

**TAP English** is the standard mode for entering text on your phone.

Press  from any text entry screen and select **TAP English**.

Press	To
1 keypad key 1 or more times	select a letter, number, or symbol
2 keypad keys	enter remaining characters
3 <b>OK</b> 	store text

### General Text Entry Rules

Press a key repeatedly to cycle through its characters.



- If you do not press a key for 2 seconds, the highlighted character is accepted, and the cursor moves to the next position.

## Using iTAP™ Software Predictive Text Entry Mode

**iTAP English** is a predictive text entry mode that lets you enter a word using 1 keypress per letter.

Press  from any text entry screen and select **iTAP English**.

### Entering Words

Press	To
1 keypad key 1 time	enter the 1st letter of a word <b>Tip:</b> The letters associated with the key are shown at the bottom of the display.
2 keypad keys (1 per letter)	enter the rest of a word <b>Tip:</b> Alternative words and letter combinations are shown at the bottom of the display. The word choices update with each keypress.
3  up/down/left/right	highlight the word you want
4 <b>OK</b> 	enter the word at flashing cursor location <b>Tip:</b> <b>iTAP English</b> automatically inserts a space after each word.





For example, to spell the word “phone,”

press      . The display shows **phone**.

## Entering Novel Words

You can coin words **iTAP English** does not recognize.

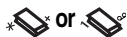
### Step

- 1 Press **CLEAR**  1 or more times to delete letters until a letter combination matches the start of a word.
- 2 Press  up/down/left/right to highlight the desired letter or letter combination.
- 3 Press **OK**  to select the letter or letter combination.
- 4 Press  left to move cursor to the left and “lock” the selected word portion.
- 5 Continue to enter letters and highlight the letter combinations you want to spell a word.

Your phone stores the unrecognized word and includes it in the list of alternative word choices. When memory space for unrecognized words is filled, your phone deletes the oldest words as it adds new words.

## Entering Numbers

Press	To
1 keypad key 1 time	prepare to put <b>ITAP English</b> in the <b>123</b> text entry mode
2  up/down/left/ right	scroll to the number
3 keypad keys	enter numbers
4 <b>OK</b> 	enter the numbers at flashing cursor location

## Deleting Letters and Words

With the cursor to the right of the text you want to delete:

- Press **CLEAR**  to delete 1 letter at a time.
- Press and hold **CLEAR**  to delete the entire line.

## Locking and Unlocking Your Phone

You can lock your phone manually or set your phone to lock automatically whenever you turn it off. To use a locked phone, you must enter the unlock code. A locked phone still rings and/or vibrates for incoming calls/messages, *but you must unlock it to answer/read.*


You can make emergency calls on your phone even when it is locked.

**Tip:** The default phone code is “1234.” Please change the phone code after you receive your phone and keep it safely.

## ***Locking Your Phone Manually or Automatically***

### **Find the Feature**


**MENU**  > **Setting** > **Security**  
> **Code status** > **Phone lock** > **Lock now** or **Automatic lock** > **ON**

<b>Press</b>	<b>To</b>
1 keypad keys	enter your phone lock/unlock code if you want to lock the phone manually
2 <b>OK</b> 	lock the phone

**Tip:** To unlock the phone, refer to the steps above.

## ***Locking and Unlocking the Keypad***

You can lock the keypad to avoid accidental keypresses.



Press  to answer calls even if the keypad is locked.

The keypad will be locked when no activity occurs in 20 seconds if you choose to lock it automatically.

### **Find the Feature**

**MENU**  > **Setting** > **Key lock**  
> **Lock now/Auto**



**Tip:** To unlock the keypad, press **UNLOCK**  and \* from the idle display.

## Setting Closed User Groups



You can subscribe closed user groups that are able to call you and receive your calls to the service provider. Select **Preset** to use the default closed user group you subscribed to your service provider.

### Find the Feature

**MENU**  > **Setting** > **Security**  
> **Closed user group** > **On**

## Setting and Changing Codes

You can set and change the following codes that block other people from using your phone and data in it.

|-------------------|-----------------------------------------------------------------------|
| <b>PIN code</b>   | Lock your SIM card when you turn your phone off.                      |
| <b>PIN2</b>       | Lock certain subscription-dependent features every time you use them. |

| <b>SIM lock</b>   | Lock your phone when you insert an unidentified SIM card.             |

## ***If You Forget Codes***

If you forget your codes, contact your service provider.

## ***If You Enter the Wrong PIN or PIN2 Code 3 Times in a Row***

If you enter a wrong PIN or PIN2 code 3 times in a row, your phone prompts you to enter the PUK or PUK2 code to unblock your SIM card. For the PUK and PUK2 codes, contact your service provider.

# Customizing Your Phone

You can set the amount of time that the display and the keypad backlights remain on.

<p><b>I cannot send/receive calls.</b></p>	<p>Make sure that you have a phone signal (the signal strength indicator should have at least 1 segment showing). Avoid electrical or radio interference, and obstructions such as bridges, parking garages, or tall buildings.</p> <p>Your phone also may have the <b>Call barring</b> feature turned on. <p><b>My phone has poor reception and drops calls.</b></p>	<p>Make sure you have a phone signal (the signal strength indicator should have at least 1 segment showing). Stay clear of any obstructions such as bridges, parking garages, or tall buildings.</p>

<p>I cannot hear others on my phone.</p>	<p>While on a call, scroll the volume key up. Your phone display should show the volume increasing.</p>  <p>Also, make sure that your phone's earpiece is not blocked by its carrying case.</p>
<p>How do I see the calls I sent or received?</p>	<p>To see the most recent calls you dialed or received:</p> <p><b>MENU</b>  &gt; <b>Call Meter</b> &gt; <b>Dialed calls</b> or <b>Received calls</b></p>
<p>My phone's display is too dark.</p>	<p>Use the <b>Adjust contrast</b> feature to change the level of contrast in your display.</p> <p>You can also use the <b>Backlight</b> feature to change the length of time that the display backlight stays on (see page 43).</p>
<p>My phone's battery charge doesn't last as long as I expected. What can I do to extend battery life?</p>	<p>Battery performance is affected by charge time, feature use, temperature changes, backlight use, and other factors. For tips on extending battery life, see page 23.</p>

<p><b>I am unable to record a voice note, voice tag, or voice command.</b></p>	<p>Try moving to a quieter location to make your voice recording. Hold the phone about four inches (10 centimeters) from your mouth, and speak directly into your phone's microphone with a normal tone of voice.</p>
<p><b>I launched the micro-browser but the display shows: Not Available.</b></p>	<p>You may be in an area without service, or you may be connected to a network that does not support Internet access.</p>
<p><b>I launched the micro-browser but the display shows: Request timed out. Gateway is not responding.</b></p>	<p>Try again in a few minutes. The servers may be temporarily busy.</p>

# Care and Maintenance

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It is recommended that you observe the cautions below to prevent possible damage to your phone and to keep your phone in good condition.

## ***When using your phone***

- Avoid using your phone in dusty, extremely high or low temperature environments.
- Your phone does not provide water-proof capability. Do not spill water onto the phone or use it in the water or rain.
- Avoid removing the battery without turning off the phone in advance. If you want to remove the battery, turn phone power off 1st.
- Do not apply strong force or shock to the phone.
- Keep the phone and its accessories away from small children.
- Do not insert metal objects into the battery charger socket of the phone. This can short-circuit the battery and result in danger.
- Back up your Phonebook data regularly onto the SIM card.

## ***When cleaning your phone***

- Use soft, clean and slightly moistened cloth to clean your phone. Do not let water come into any openings

(such as earpiece and microphone) or remain on metal surface (such as the metal contacts).

- Do not wipe your phone with any corrosive liquid or coarse objects. This can damage the outer case of your phone.

### ***When carrying or storing your phone***

- Do not leave your phone in hot enclosed places (such as in a car under direct sunlight).
- Avoid pressing and shaking the phone when you carry it.
- Remove the battery from phone if it is not going to be used for a long period of time. Keep the phone and battery in a cool and dry place.

### ***When using the accessories***

- Use only approved batteries and accessories. Use of non-approved accessories can cause damage to your phone or even yourself.
- Do not use the battery and charger for other purposes.

### ***When using your phone in public areas***

Use the phone with manner. Turn it off or make it silent when you are asked to.

### ***When the phone appears to be broken***

Do not attempt to disassemble or fix the phone by yourself. Seek your original dealer for help.
