





Insert batteries





Make sure to match the "+" and "-" of the batteries with the marks inside the battery compartment.


Improper use of batteries may cause battery leakage and corrosion. To operate the remote control correctly, follow the instructions below:

- Do not insert the batteries in the wrong direction.
- Do not charge, heat, open, or short-circuit the batteries.

Using the remote control

Point the remote control at the remote sensor.



15. Outdoor Antenna Grounding

The introduction of KODAK Picture CD

Now, you can playback Kodak Picture CDs on this player and view your wonderful pictures on your TV in the comfort of your living room.

When a Kodak Picture CD is inserted on a player an automatic slide show is launched. Each picture in the Kodak Picture CD will be displayed consecutively in a slide-show fashion and will be scaled to fit in the whole TV screen.

General function:

- You can set slideshow transition modes for any pictures.
- Press PAUSE to stop playing.
- Press

 or

 to see the previous or next picture.
- Press PLAY to continue slideshow transitions.
- Press STOP to return to root menu.

Image Rotation

There are three modes to rotate a picture: original, 90 Deg, and 180 Deg. These operations are allowed only when a picture is being displayed normally and will be cancelled automatically when a new picture is displayed. The ANGLE keys are used to select the different rotation modes:

Press ANGLE

OSD display 👛 original.

Press ANGLE again



Zoom Function:

This player provides both Zoom in/out and Zoom pan function. Press the **ZOOM** consecutively, the picture will zoom in/out in turn as followings:



Note: During the ZOOM function, slide show transitions and image rotation are disabled. Q off: close zoom, press **PLAY** again to resume slide show transition mode.

Digest function

- Press the MENU to enable the function. The television screen can display up to 12 pictures at a pro ratio.
- Press Direction key to select any picture displayed on the screen, then press PLAY, the selected picture will zoom in and start slideshow transition.

Note: the quality of the picture displaying on your screen is mostly subjected to your display equipment.

• It is normal for the cover and rear panel to become warm after the player has been operating for an extended period of time.






- Press STEP during playback to pause playback.
