



# Load the input tray

- **NOTE:** When you add new paper, make sure that you remove all of the paper from the input tray and straighten the stack. Do not fan the paper. This reduces jams by preventing multiple sheets of paper from feeding through the product at one time.
- 1. Load the paper face-up with the top forward in the input tray.


The orientation of the paper in the tray varies depending on the type of print job. For additional information, see <u>Table 2-1 Input tray paper</u> orientation on page 15.

#### Tray adjustment for small paper sizes

To print on paper shorter than 185 mm (7.3 in), use the short-paper extender to modify the input tray.

- 1. Remove the short-paper extender tool from the storage slot on the right side of the input area.

2. Attach the tool to the paper length guide on the input tray.

Load the paper into the tray, and then adjust the paper guides until they are snug against the paper. 3.



- 4. Push the paper into the product until it stops, and then push the paper length guide in so the extender tool supports the paper.

- 5. When finished printing on short paper, remove the short-paper extender tool from the input tray, and then place it in the storage slot.

#### How to print (Windows)

The following procedure describes the basic printing process for Windows.

- 1. From the software program, select the **Print** option.
- 2. Select the product from the list of printers, and then click or tap the **Properties** or **Preferences** button to open the print driver.

**NOTE:** The name of the button varies for different software programs.

- 3. Click or tap the tabs in the print driver to configure the available options.
- Click or tap the **OK** button to return to the **Print** dialog box. Select the number of copies to print from this screen.
- 5. Click or tap the **OK** button to print the job.

#### Manually print on both sides (Windows)

- 1. From the software program, select the **Print** option.
- 2. Select the product from the list of printers, and then click or tap the **Properties** or **Preferences** button to open the print driver.

 Connect the telephone cable to the fax port on the product and to the telephone jack on the wall.



### **Print with EconoMode**

This product has an EconoMode option for printing drafts of documents. Using EconoMode can use less toner. However, using EconoMode can also reduce print quality.

HP does not recommend the full-time use of EconoMode. If EconoMode is used full-time, the toner supply might outlast the mechanical parts in the toner cartridge. If print quality begins to degrade and is no longer acceptable, consider replacing the toner cartridge.

**NOTE:** If this option is not available in your print driver, you can set it using the HP Embedded Web Server.

- 1. From the software program, select the **Print** option.
- 2. Select the product, and then click the **Properties** or **Preferences** button.

# A Cartridge is low or Cartridge is very low message displays on the product control panel

A **Cartridge is low** or **Cartridge is very low** message displays on the product control panel, and the product does not print.

**NOTE:** Toner level warnings and indicators provide estimates for planning purposes only. When an indicator shows low-toner levels, consider having a replacement cartridge available to avoid possible printing delays. You do not need to replace cartridges until print quality becomes unacceptable.

Once an HP toner cartridge has reached "very low", HP's Premium Protection Warranty on that toner cartridge has ended.

You can change the way the product reacts when supplies reach the Very Low state. You do not have to reestablish these settings when you install a new toner cartridge.

### **Enable or disable the Very Low settings**

You can enable or disable the default settings at any time, and you do not have to re-enable them when you install a new toner cartridge.

#### **LCD control panel**

- 1. On the product control panel, press the Setup 🔧 button.
- **2.** Open the following menus:

  - Supply Settings
  - Black Cartridge
  - Very Low Setting
- 3. Select one of the following options, and then press the OK button:

  - Select the **Prompt** option to set the product to stop printing and prompt you to replace the toner cartridge. You can acknowledge the prompt and continue printing.
  - Select the **Continue** option to set the product to alert you that the toner cartridge is very low, but to continue printing.

#### Touchscreen control panel

- 1. From the Home screen on the product control panel, touch the Setup 🚴 button.
- 2. Open the following menus:
  - System Setup
  - Supply Settings

- Black Cartridge
- Very Low Setting
- **3.** Select one of the following options:
  - Select the Stop option to set the product to stop printing until you replace the toner cartridge.
  - Select the Prompt option to set the product to stop printing and prompt you to replace the toner cartridge. You can acknowledge the prompt and continue printing.
  - Select the Continue option to set the product to alert you that the toner cartridge is very low, but to continue printing.

For models with fax, when the product is set to the Stop option there is some risk that faxes will not print after the new cartridge is installed if your product has received more faxes than the memory can hold while stopped.

For models with fax, when the product is set to the **Prompt** option there is some risk that faxes will not print after the new cartridge is installed if your product has received more faxes than the memory can hold while the product is waiting for the prompt to be acknowledged.

Once an HP toner cartridge has reached **Very Low**, HP's Premium Protection Warranty on that toner cartridge has ended. All print defects or cartridge failures incurred when an HP toner cartridge is used in Continue at very low mode will not be considered to be defects in materials or workmanship in the toner cartridge under the HP Print Cartridge Warranty Statement.

## **Replace the toner cartridge**

When a toner cartridge approaches the end of useful life, you are prompted to order a replacement. You can continue printing with the current cartridge until redistributing the toner no longer yields acceptable print quality.

**1.** Lift the scanner assembly.



2. Open the top cover.





4. Remove the new toner cartridge from the bag. Place the used toner cartridge in the bag for recycling.




5. Grasp both sides of the toner cartridge and distribute the toner by gently rocking the cartridge.

## Control panel help system (touchscreen models only)

The product has a built-in Help system that explains how to use each screen. To open the Help system, touch the Help ? button in the upper-right corner of the screen.

For some screens, the Help opens to a global menu where you can search for specific topics. You can browse through the menu structure by touching the buttons in the menu.

Some Help screens include animations that guide you through procedures, such as clearing jams.

For screens that contain settings for individual jobs, the Help opens to a topic that explains the options for that screen.

If the product alerts you of an error or warning, touch the Help ? button to open a message that describes the problem. The message also contains instructions to help solve the problem.

## **Restore the factory-set defaults**

Restoring the factory-set defaults returns all of the product and network settings to the factory defaults. It will not reset the page count, tray size, or language. To restore the product to the factory-default settings, follow these steps.

**CAUTION:** Restoring the factory-set defaults returns all of the settings to the factory defaults, and it also deletes any pages that are stored in the memory.

- 1. On the product control panel, press or touch the Setup & button.
- 2. Open the **Service** menu.
- 3. Select the **Restore Defaults** option, and then press or touch the OK button.

The product automatically restarts.

## Solve paper feed or jam problems

If the product has recurring problems with paper feeding or with jams, use the following information to reduce the number of occurrences.

#### The product does not pick up paper

If the product does not pick up paper from the tray, try these solutions.

- 1. Open the product and remove any jammed sheets of paper.
- 2. Load the tray with the correct size of paper for your job.
- 3. Make sure the paper size and type are set correctly on the product control panel.
- 4. Make sure the paper guides in the tray are adjusted correctly for the size of paper. Adjust the guides to the appropriate indentation in the tray.
- 5. Check the product control panel to see if the product is waiting for you to acknowledge a prompt to feed the paper manually. Load paper, and continue.
- 6. The pickup roller and separation pad might be contaminated.

#### The product picks up multiple sheets of paper

If the product picks up multiple sheets of paper from the tray, try these solutions.

- 1. Remove the stack of paper from the tray and flex it, rotate it 180 degrees, and flip it over. *Do not fan the paper*. Return the stack of paper to the tray.
- 2. Use only paper that meets HP specifications for this product.
- **3.** Use paper that is not wrinkled, folded, or damaged. If necessary, use paper from a different package.
- 4. Make sure the tray is not overfilled. If it is, remove the entire stack of paper from the tray, straighten the stack, and then return some of the paper to the tray.
- 5. Make sure the paper guides in the tray are adjusted correctly for the size of paper. Adjust the guides to the appropriate indentation in the tray.
- 6. Make sure the printing environment is within recommended specifications.

#### Frequent or recurring paper jams

Follow these steps to solve problems with frequent paper jams. If the first step does not resolve the problem continue with the next step until you have resolved the problem.

- 1. If paper has jammed in the product, clear the jam and then print a configuration page to test the product.
- 2. Check that the tray is configured for the correct paper size and type on the product control panel. Adjust paper settings if necessary.
- 3. Turn the product off, wait 30 seconds, and then turn it on again.
- 4. Print a cleaning page to remove excess toner from inside the product.

- a. From the Home screen on the product control panel, touch the Setup 🔧 button.
- **b.** Touch the Service menu.
- c. Touch the Cleaning Page button.
- **d.** Load plain letter or A4 paper when you are prompted.
- e. Touch the OK button to begin the cleaning process.

The product prints the first side and then prompts you to remove the page from the output bin and reload it in Tray 1, keeping the same orientation. Wait until the process is complete. Discard the page that prints.

- 5. Print a configuration page to test the product.
  - a. From the Home screen on the product control panel, touch the Setup 🔧 button.
  - **b.** Touch the **Reports** menu.
  - **c.** Touch the Configuration Report button.

If none of these steps resolves the problem, the product might need service. Contact HP customer support.

#### **Prevent paper jams**

To reduce the number of paper jams, try these solutions.

- 1. Use only paper that meets HP specifications for this product.
- 2. Use paper that is not wrinkled, folded, or damaged. If necessary, use paper from a different package.
- 3. Use paper that has not previously been printed or copied on.
- 4. Make sure the tray is not overfilled. If it is, remove the entire stack of paper from the tray, straighten the stack, and then return some of the paper to the tray.
- 5. Make sure the paper guides in the tray are adjusted correctly for the size of paper. Adjust the guides so they are touching the paper stack without bending it.
- 6. Make sure that the tray is fully inserted in the product.
- 7. If you are printing on heavy, embossed, or perforated paper, use the manual feed feature and feed sheets one at a time.
- 8. Verify that the tray is configured correctly for the paper type and size.
- 9. Make sure the printing environment is within recommended specifications.

- Check the EconoMode settings

### Print from a different software program

Try printing from a different software program. If the page prints correctly, the problem is with the software program from which you were printing.

## Set the paper-type setting for the print job

Check the paper-type setting if you are printing from a software program and the pages have any of these problems:

- smeared print
- fuzzy print
- dark print
- curled paper
- scattered dots of toner
- loose toner
- small areas of missing toner

#### Check the paper-type setting (Windows)

- 1. From the software program, select the **Print** option.
- 2. Select the product, and then click the **Properties** or **Preferences** button.
- 3. Click the **Paper/Quality** tab.
- 4. From the **Media:** drop-down list, select the correct paper type.
- Click the OK button to close the Document Properties dialog box. In the Print dialog, click the OK button to print the job.

#### Check the paper-type setting (Mac OS X)

- 1. Click the **File** menu, and then click the **Print** option.
- 2. In the **Printer** menu, select the product.

- **3.** By default, the print driver displays the **Copies & Pages** menu. Open the menus drop-down list, and then click the **Finishing** menu.
- 4. Select a type from the **Media-type** drop-down list.
- 5. Click the **Print** button.

### Check the toner-cartridge status

Check the supplies status page for the following information:

- Estimated percentage of cartridge life remaining
- Approximate pages remaining
- Part numbers for HP toner cartridges
- Number of pages printed

Use the following procedures to print the supplies status page:

#### LCD control panel

- 1. On the product control panel, press the Setup 🔧 button.
- 2. Open the following menus:
  - Reports
  - Supplies status
- **3.** Use the arrow keys to select **Print Supplies status page**, and then press the OK button.

#### **Touchscreen control panel**

- 1. From the Home screen on the product control panel, touch the Supplies 🔤 button.
- 2. Touch the Report button to print the supplies status page.

## **Print a cleaning page**

#### LCD control panel

- 1. From the product control panel, press the Setup 🔧 button.
- 2. Open the **Service** menu.
- 3. Use the arrow keys to select the **Cleaning mode** option, and then press the OK button.

The product prints the first side and then prompts you to remove the page from the output bin and reload it in Tray 1, keeping the same orientation. Wait until the process is complete. Discard the page that prints.

#### **Touchscreen control panel**

- **1.** From the Home screen on the product control panel, touch the Setup 💫 button.
- **2.** Touch the Service menu.

- **3.** Touch the Cleaning Page button.
- 4. Load plain letter or A4 paper when you are prompted.
- 5. Touch the OK button to begin the cleaning process.

The product prints the first side and then prompts you to remove the page from the output bin and reload it in Tray 1, keeping the same orientation. Wait until the process is complete. Discard the page that prints.

### Inspect the toner cartridge for damage

- 1. Remove the toner cartridge from the product, and verify that the sealing tape has been removed.
- 2. Grasp both sides of the toner cartridge and distribute the toner by gently rocking the cartridge.
- **3.** Check the memory chip for damage.
- 4. Examine the surface of the imaging drum on the toner cartridge.

**CAUTION:** Do not touch the roller (imaging drum) on the cartridge. Fingerprints on the imaging drum can cause print-quality problems.

- If you see any scratches, fingerprints, or other damage on the imaging drum, replace the toner cartridge.
- If the imaging drum does not appear to be damaged, rock the toner cartridge gently several times and reinstall it.
- 5. Print a few pages to see if these steps resolved the issue.

### Check the paper and printing environment

#### Use paper that meets HP specifications

Use different paper if you are having any of the following problems:

- The printing is too light or seems faded in areas.
- Specks of toner are on the printed pages.
- Toner is smearing on the printed pages.
- Printed characters seem misformed.
- Printed pages are curled.

Always use a paper type and weight that this product supports. In addition, follow these guidelines when selecting paper:

- Use paper that is of good quality and free of cuts, nicks, tears, spots, loose particles, dust, wrinkles, voids, staples, and curled or bent edges.
- Use paper that has not been previously printed on.
- Use paper that is designed for use in laser printers. Do not use paper that is designed only for use in inkjet printers.
- Use paper that is not too rough. Using smoother paper generally results in better print quality.

#### Check the product environment

Verify that the product is operating within the environmental specifications listed in the product Warranty and Legal Guide.

### Check the EconoMode settings

HP does not recommend the full-time use of EconoMode. If EconoMode is used full-time, the toner supply might outlast the mechanical parts in the toner cartridge. If print quality begins to degrade and is no longer acceptable, consider replacing the toner cartridge.

Follow these steps if the entire page is too dark or too light.

- 1. From the software program, select the **Print** option.
- 2. Select the product, and then click the **Properties** or **Preferences** button.
- 3. Click the **Paper/Quality** tab, and then locate the **Quality Settings** area.
  - If the entire page is too dark, select the **EconoMode** setting.
  - If the entire page is too light, select the **FastRes 1200** setting.
- 4. Click the **OK** button to close the **Document Properties** dialog box. In the **Print** dialog, click the **OK** button to print the job.

## Improve copy and scan quality

## Check the scanner glass for dirt and smudges

Over time, specks of debris might collect on the scanner glass and white plastic backing, which can affect performance. Use the following procedure to clean the scanner.

- 1. Press the power button to turn the product off, and then disconnect the power cable from the electrical outlet.
- 2. Open the scanner lid.
- 3. Clean the scanner glass and the white plastic backing underneath the scanner lid with a soft cloth or sponge that has been moistened with nonabrasive glass cleaner.
  - **CAUTION:** Do not use abrasives, acetone, benzene, ammonia, ethyl alcohol, or carbon tetrachloride on any part of the product; these can damage the product. Do not place liquids directly on the glass or platen. They might seep and damage the product.
- 4. Dry the glass and white plastic parts with a chamois or a cellulose sponge to prevent spotting.
- 5. Connect the power cable to an outlet, and then press the power button to turn the product on.

### **Check the paper settings**

#### **LCD control panel**

- 1. On the product control panel, press the Setup 🔧 button.
- 2. Open the following menus:
  - System Setup
  - Paper Setup
- 3. Select Def. paper size.
- 4. Select the name of the paper size that is in the input tray, and then press the OK button.
- 5. Select Def. paper type.
- 6. Select the name of the paper type that is in the input tray, and then press the OK button.

#### **Touchscreen control panel**

- 1. From the Home screen on the product control panel, touch the Setup 🚴 button.
- 2. Open the following menus:
  - System Setup
  - Paper Setup
- 3. Select the Paper Size option, and then touch the name of the paper size that is in the input tray.
- 4. Select the Paper Type option, and then touch the name of the paper type that is in the input tray.

## **Optimize for text or pictures**

The following copy-quality settings are available:

- Auto Select: Use this setting when you are not concerned about the quality of the copy. This is the default setting.
- Mixed: Use this setting for documents that contain a mixture of text and graphics.
- Text: Use this setting for documents that contain mostly text.
- Picture: Use this setting for documents that contain mostly graphics.

#### LCD control panel

- **1.** Load the document on the scanner glass according to the indicators on the product.
- 2. On the product control panel, press the Copy Menu 🖹 button.
- 3. Select the **Optimize** menu.
- 4. Use the arrow buttons to scroll through the options, and then press the OK button to select an option.
- **5.** Touch the Start Copy **button** to start copying.

#### **Touchscreen control panel**

- **1.** Load the document on the scanner glass according to the indicators on the product.
- 2. From the Home screen on the product control panel, touch the Copy button.
- 3. Touch the Settings button, and then scroll to and touch the Optimize button. Touch the arrow buttons to scroll through the options, and then touch an option to select it.
- 4. Touch the Start Copy button to start copying.

## Edge-to-edge copying

The product cannot print fully edge-to-edge. There is a 4 mm (0.2 inch) unprintable border around the page.

#### Considerations for printing or scanning documents with cropped edges:

- When the original is smaller than the output size, move the original 4 mm (0.2 inch) away from the corner indicated by the icon on the scanner. Recopy or scan in this position.
- When the original is the size of the printed output that you want, use the Reduce/Enlarge feature to reduce the image so the copy is not cropped.

## Clean the pickup rollers and separation pad in the document feeder

If the document feeder experiences paper-handling problems, such as jams or multiple-page feeds, clean the document-feeder rollers and separation pad.

**1.** Lift the document-feeder input tray.



2. Use a moist, lint-free cloth to wipe both pickup rollers and the separation pad to remove dirt.

**CAUTION:** Do not use abrasives, acetone, benzene, ammonia, ethyl alcohol, or carbon tetrachloride on any part of the product; these can damage the product. Do not place liquids directly on the glass or platen. They might seep and damage the product.

**3.** Close the document-feeder input tray.





## Improve fax image quality

- Check the scanner glass for dirt or smudges
- <u>Check the send-fax resolution setting</u>
- <u>Check the lightness/darkness setting</u>
- <u>Check the Error Correction setting</u>
- <u>Check the Fit-to-Page setting</u>
- Clean the pickup rollers and separation pad in the document feeder
- Send to a different fax machine
- Check the sender's fax machine

#### Check the scanner glass for dirt or smudges

Over time, specks of debris might collect on the scanner glass and white plastic backing, which can affect performance. Use the following procedure to clean the scanner.

- 1. Press the power button to turn the product off, and then disconnect the power cable from the electrical outlet.
- **2.** Open the scanner lid.
- 3. Clean the scanner glass, the document feeder strips, and the white plastic backing with a soft cloth or sponge that has been moistened with nonabrasive glass cleaner.
- **CAUTION:** Do not use abrasives, acetone, benzene, ammonia, ethyl alcohol, or carbon tetrachloride on any part of the product; these can damage the product. Do not place liquids directly on the glass or platen. They might seep and damage the product.
- 4. Dry the glass and white plastic parts with a chamois or a cellulose sponge to prevent spotting.
- 5. Close the scanner lid.
- 6. Connect the power cable to an outlet, and then press the power button to turn the product on.

## Check the send-fax resolution setting

#### LCD control panel

- 1. On the product control panel, press the Setup 🔧 button.
- 2. Select Fax Setup.
- 3. Select Send Fax Setup, and then select Def. Resolution.
- 4. Select the desired resolution setting, and then press the OK button.

#### Touchscreen control panel

- 1. From the Home screen on the product control panel, touch the Setup 💫 button.
- **2.** Select Fax Setup.

- **3.** Select Advanced Setup, and then select Fax Resolution.
- 4. Select the desired resolution setting, and then touch OK.

### Check the lightness/darkness setting

If the fax output is too light or too dark, check the lightness/darkness setting to make sure it is appropriate for the fax job.

#### **LCD control panel**

- 1. On the product control panel, press the Setup 🔧 button.
- 2. Select Fax Setup.
- **3.** Select **Fax Send Setup**, and then select **Def. Light/Dark**.
- 4. Adjust the setting for your fax job, and then press the OK button.

#### **Touchscreen control panel**

- 1. From the Home screen on the product control panel, touch the Setup 🚴 button.
- 2. Select Fax Setup, and then select Advanced Setup.
- **3.** Select Lighter/Darker, and then adjust the setting for your fax job.

### **Check the Error Correction setting**

Usually, the product monitors the signals on the telephone line while it is sending or receiving a fax. If the product detects an error during the transmission and the error-correction setting is On, the product can request that the portion of the fax be resent. The factory-set default for error correction is On.

You should turn off error correction only if you are having trouble sending or receiving a fax, and you are willing to accept the errors in the transmission. Turning off the setting might be useful when you are trying to send a fax overseas or receive one from overseas, or if you are using a satellite telephone connection.

#### **LCD control panel**

- 1. On the product control panel, press the Setup 🔧 button.
- 2. Select **Fax Setup**, and then select **All Faxes**.
- **3.** Select **Error Correction**, and then select **On**.

#### Touchscreen control panel

- 1. From the Home screen on the product control panel, touch the Setup & button.
- 2. Select Service, and then select Fax Service.
- **3.** Select Error Correction, and then select On.

## **Check the Fit-to-Page setting**

If the product printed a fax job off the page, turn on the fit-to-page feature from the product control panel.

**NOTE:** Make sure that the default paper size setting matches the size of the paper in the tray.

#### LCD control panel

- 1. On the product control panel, press the Setup 🔧 button.
- 2. Select Fax Setup, and then select Recv. Fax Setup.
- **3.** Select **Fit to Page**, and then select **On**.

#### Touchscreen control panel

- 1. From the Home screen on the product control panel, touch the Setup & button.
- 2. Select Fax Setup, and then select Advanced Setup.
- **3.** Select Fit to Page, and then select On.

### Clean the pickup rollers and separation pad in the document feeder

If the document feeder experiences paper-handling problems, such as jams or multiple-page feeds, clean the document-feeder rollers and separation pad.


1. Lift the document-feeder input tray.



2. Use a moist, lint-free cloth to wipe both pickup rollers and the separation pad to remove dirt.

**CAUTION:** Do not use abrasives, acetone, benzene, ammonia, ethyl alcohol, or carbon tetrachloride on any part of the product; these can damage the product. Do not place liquids directly on the glass or platen. They might seep and damage the product.

**3.** Close the document-feeder input tray.



### Send to a different fax machine

Send the fax job to a different fax machine to see if another machine will successfully receive the fax job.

- If another fax machine receives the fax successfully, check the connection and settings on the original receiving fax machine.
- If another fax machine does not receive the fax successfully, check the fax settings on your product. If the fax is still unsuccessful, there might be interference on the phone line. Try to resend the fax later.

## Check the sender's fax machine

Ask the sender to darken the contrast setting on the sending fax machine, and then resend the fax.

If the received fax quality is still poor, check the fax settings on your product.

## Solve wired network problems

Check the following items to verify that the product is communicating with the network. Before beginning, print a configuration page from the product control panel and locate the product IP address that is listed on this page.

- Poor physical connection
- <u>The computer is using the incorrect IP address for the product</u>
- The computer is unable to communicate with the product
- <u>The product is using incorrect link and duplex settings for the network</u>
- <u>New software programs might be causing compatibility problems</u>
- The computer or workstation might be set up incorrectly
- The product is disabled, or other network settings are incorrect

**NOTE:** HP does not support peer-to-peer networking, as the feature is a function of Microsoft operating systems and not of the HP print drivers. For more information, go to Microsoft at <u>www.microsoft.com</u>.

#### **Poor physical connection**

- 1. Verify that the product is attached to the correct network port using a cable of the correct length.
- 2. Verify that cable connections are secure.
- 3. Look at the network port connection on the back of the product, and verify that the amber activity light and the green link-status light are lit.
- 4. If the problem continues, try a different cable or port on the hub.

#### The computer is using the incorrect IP address for the product

- 1. Open the printer properties and click the **Ports** tab. Verify that the current IP address for the product is selected. The product IP address is listed on the product configuration page.
- 2. If you installed the product using the HP standard TCP/IP port, select the box labeled **Always print to this printer, even if its IP address changes**.
- **3.** If you installed the product using a Microsoft standard TCP/IP port, use the hostname instead of the IP address.
- 4. If the IP address is correct, delete the product and then add it again.

#### The computer is unable to communicate with the product

**1.** Test network communication by pinging the network.

- a. Open a command-line prompt on your computer. For Windows, click **Start**, click **Run**, type cmd, and then press Enter.
- **b.** Type ping followed by the IP address for your product.

For Mac OS X, open the Network Utility, and then supply the IP address in the correct field in the **Ping** pane.

- **c.** If the window displays round-trip times, the network is working.
- 2. If the ping command failed, verify that the network hubs are on, and then verify that the network settings, the product, and the computer are all configured for the same network.

## The product is using incorrect link and duplex settings for the network

Hewlett-Packard recommends leaving these settings in automatic mode (the default setting). If you change these settings, you must also change them for your network.

### New software programs might be causing compatibility problems

Verify that any new software programs are correctly installed and that they use the correct print driver.

### The computer or workstation might be set up incorrectly

- 1. Check the network drivers, print drivers, and the network redirection settings.
- 2. Verify that the operating system is configured correctly.

### The product is disabled, or other network settings are incorrect

- 1. Review the configuration page to check the status of the network protocol. Enable it if necessary.
- 2. Reconfigure the network settings if necessary.

## Solve wireless network problems

- <u>Wireless connectivity checklist</u>
- <u>The product does not print after the wireless configuration completes</u>
- <u>The product does not print, and the computer has a third-party firewall installed</u>
- The wireless connection does not work after moving the wireless router or product
- <u>Cannot connect more computers to the wireless product</u>
- <u>The wireless product loses communication when connected to a VPN</u>
- The network does not appear in the wireless networks list
- The wireless network is not functioning
- Perform a wireless network diagnostic test
- <u>Reduce interference on a wireless network</u>

### Wireless connectivity checklist

- Verify that the network cable is not connected.
- Verify that the product and the wireless router are turned on and have power. Also make sure that the wireless radio in the product is turned on.
- Verify that the service set identifier (SSID) is correct. Print a configuration page to determine the SSID. If you are not sure the SSID is correct, run the wireless setup again.
- With secured networks, verify that the security information is correct. If the security information is incorrect, run the wireless setup again.
- If the wireless network is working correctly, try accessing other computers on the wireless network. If the network has Internet access, try connecting to the Internet over a wireless connection.
- Verify that the encryption method (AES or TKIP) is the same for the product as it is for the wireless access point (on networks using WPA security).
- Verify that the product is within the range of the wireless network. For most networks, the product must be within 30 m (100 ft) of the wireless access point (wireless router).
- Verify that obstacles do not block the wireless signal. Remove any large metal objects between the
  access point and the product. Make sure poles, walls, or support columns containing metal or concrete
  do not separate the product and wireless access point.
- Verify that the product is located away from electronic devices that might interfere with the wireless signal. Many devices can interfere with the wireless signal including motors, cordless phones, security system cameras, other wireless networks, and some Bluetooth devices.
- Verify that the print driver is installed on the computer.
- Verify that you have selected the correct printer port.
- Verify that the computer and product connect to the same wireless network.
- For Mac OS X, verify that the wireless router supports Bonjour.

# The product does not print after the wireless configuration completes

- 1. Make sure that the product is turned on and in the ready state.
- 2. Turn off any third-party firewalls on your computer.
- 3. Make sure that the wireless network is working correctly.
- 4. Make sure that your computer is working correctly. If necessary, restart the computer.
- 5. Verify that you can open the product HP Embedded Web Server from a computer on the network.

# The product does not print, and the computer has a third-party firewall installed

- 1. Update the firewall with the most recent update available from the manufacturer.
- 2. If programs request firewall access when you install the product or try to print, make sure you allow the programs to run.
- **3.** Temporarily turn off the firewall, and then install the wireless product on the computer. Enable the firewall when you have completed the wireless installation.

# The wireless connection does not work after moving the wireless router or product

- 1. Make sure that the router or product connects to the same network that your computer connects to.
- 2. Print a configuration page.
- **3.** Compare the service set identifier (SSID) on the configuration page to the SSID in the printer configuration for the computer.
- 4. If the numbers are not the same, the devices are not connecting to the same network. Reconfigure the wireless setup for the product.

### **Cannot connect more computers to the wireless product**

- 1. Make sure that the other computers are within the wireless range and that no obstacles block the signal. For most networks, the wireless range is within 30 m (100 ft) of the wireless access point.
- 2. Make sure that the product is turned on and in the ready state.
- **3.** Turn off any third-party firewalls on your computer.
- 4. Make sure that the wireless network is working correctly.
- 5. Make sure that your computer is working correctly. If necessary, restart the computer.

### The wireless product loses communication when connected to a VPN

• Typically, you cannot connect to a VPN and other networks at the same time.

### The network does not appear in the wireless networks list

- Make sure the wireless router is turned on and has power.
- The network might be hidden. However, you can still connect to a hidden network.

# The wireless network is not functioning

- 1. Make sure that the network cable is not connected.
- **2.** To verify if the network has lost communication, try connecting other devices to the network.
- **3.** Test network communication by pinging the network.
  - a. Open a command-line prompt on your computer. For Windows, click **Start**, click **Run**, type cmd, and then press Enter.
  - **b.** Type ping followed by the router IP address.

For Mac OS X, open the Network Utility, and then supply the IP address in the correct field in the **Ping** pane.

- **c.** If the window displays round-trip times, the network is working.
- 4. Make sure that the router or product connects to the same network that the computer connects to.
  - **a.** Print a configuration page.
  - **b.** Compare the service set identifier (SSID) on the configuration report to the SSID in the printer configuration for the computer.
  - **c.** If the numbers are not the same, the devices are not connecting to the same network. Reconfigure the wireless setup for the product.

# Perform a wireless network diagnostic test

From the product control panel, you can run a diagnostic test that provides information about the wireless network settings.

#### LCD control panel

- 1. On the product control panel, press the Setup 🔧 button.
- 2. Select Network Setup, and then select Wireless Menu.
- Select Network Test, and then press the OK button. The product prints a test page that shows test results.

#### Touchscreen control panel

- 1. From the Home screen on the product control panel, touch the Setup 🚴 button.
- 2. Select Network Setup, and then select Wireless Menu.
- 3. Select Run Network Test. The product prints a test page that shows test results.

#### **Reduce interference on a wireless network**

The following tips can reduce interference in a wireless network:

- Keep the wireless devices away from large metal objects, such as filing cabinets, and other electromagnetic devices, such as microwaves and cordless telephones. These objects can disrupt radio signals.
- Keep the wireless devices away from large masonry structures and other building structures. These objects can absorb radio waves and lower signal strength.
- Position the wireless router in a central location in line of sight with the wireless products on the network.

# Solve fax problems

- Check the hardware setup
- Faxes are sending slowly
- Fax quality is poor
- Fax cuts off or prints on two pages

### Check the hardware setup

- Several possible fixes are available. After each recommended action, retry faxing to see if the problem is resolved.
- For best results during fax problem solving, make sure the line from the product is connected directly to the wall phone port. Disconnect all other devices that are connected to the product.
- 1. Verify that the telephone cord is connected to the correct port on the back of the product.
- 2. Check the phone line by using the fax test:

The report contains the following possible results:

- **Pass**: The report contains all of the current fax settings for review.
- **Fail**: The report indicates the nature of the error and contains suggestions for how to resolve the issue.
- 3. Verify that the product firmware is current:
  - a. Go to <u>www.hp.com/support</u>.
  - **b.** Click **Drivers & Software**, type your product number in the window, and then click **Search**. If necessary, click your model in a list of similar products.

The Software & Driver Downloads page opens.

- c. Select your operating system from the drop-down menu, and then click **Next**.
- d. Click the plus sign next to Firmware, and then click HP LaserJet Firmware Update Utility.
- e. Click Download.

**f.** When the download is complete, follow the on-screen instructions to install and run the utility.

The utility checks for firmware updates for your HP product. If updates are found, the utility installs the available update.

- g. When firmware updates are complete, try to resend the fax.
- 4. Verify that the fax was set up when the product software was installed.

From the computer, in the HP program folder, run the Fax Setup Utility.

5. Verify that the telephone service supports analog fax.

**NOTE:** HP products are designed specifically for use with analog phone services.

- If using ISDN or digital PBX, contact your service provider for information about configuring to an analog fax line.
- If using a VoIP service, change the Fax Speed to Slow(V.29) from the control panel. Ask if your service provider supports fax and for the recommended fax modem speed. Some companies might require an adapter.
- If you are using a DSL service, make sure that a filter is included on the phone-line connection to the product. Contact the DSL service provider, or purchase a DSL filter if you do not have one. If a DSL filter is installed, try another filter because filters can be defective.
- 6. If the error persists, find more detailed problem-solving solutions in the sections that follow this one.

### **Faxes are sending slowly**

The product is experiencing poor phone line quality.

- Retry sending the fax when the line conditions have improved.
- Check with the phone service provider that the line supports fax.
- Use white paper for the original. Do not use colors such as gray, yellow, or pink.
- Divide large fax jobs into smaller sections, and then fax them individually.
- Turn off the Error Correction setting.
