1 Getting to Know Your Phone

	 Power on or off the phone (by pressing and holding the key). End a call or reject an incoming call. Return to the standby mode.
	Select the option displayed on the lower left corner of the screen.

• + 9 ₉₉₆₂	 Enter numbers, letters, and symbols. Call the voice mail center in the standby mode (by pressing and holding the 1 key). Speed-dial a phone number in the standby mode (by pressing and holding the 2-9 key). Select a submenu item labeled with the corresponding number.
8*	 Enter the * symbol, + symbol, P character, or T character by pressing it once, twice, three times or four times. Switch between the Meeting profile and the current profile (by pressing and holding it).

4	Launch the music player in the standby mode (by pressing and holding it).


Installing the Battery



Installing the Micro SD Card

To install the Micro SD Card, do as follows:

- 1. Open the rubber cap of the Micro SD card slot.
- 2. Insert the Micro SD card into the slot.
- 3. Close the rubber cap after inserting the Micro SD card completely





Install the Micro SD card correctly to avoid damaging your phone or the Micro SD card.

Charging the Battery

To charge the battery, do as follows:

1. Connect the charger to the charger connector.



- 2. Connect the charger to an AC power socket.During the charging, appears on the upper right corner of the screen in an animated status.
- 3. Wait until the phone is fully charged.If If becomes static, the battery is fully charged.
- 4. Disconnect the charger from the power socket.
- 5. Press the gray buttons on both sides of the charger connector to disconnect it from the phone.



- Do not use a damaged battery or charger.
- Before using the travel charger, ensure that the battery is installed in your phone.
- Do not pull out the charger connector immediately without pressing the buttons on both sides of it.

Powering On/Off the Phone

- When the phone is powered off, press and hold *i* to power it on.
- When the phone is powered on, press and hold ∠ to power it off.

Using the Function Menu

 $\overline{}$

To use the function menu, do as follows:

- 1. In the standby mode, press \bigcirc or \Box (Menu).
- 2. Press (-) to view the function menus.
- 3. Press \Box (Select) or \bullet to display the selected menu.
- 4. Display the submenu in either of the ways:
- Press \rightleftharpoons to select a submenu. Then press \Box (Select) or to display it.
- Press the corresponding number key to display the submenu.
- 5. Press (Back) to return to the previous menu or exit the function menu.
- 6. Press $\boxed{\ }$ to return to the standby mode.

3 Voice Services

Making a Call

- 1. In the standby mode, press number keys to enter a phone number.
- To make an international call, press ••• twice to enter the international long distance code "+". Then enter the country code/region code, area code, and phone number in a sequence.
- To call a phone number with an extension, press •• three times to insert "**P**" or press •• four times to insert "**T**" between the phone number and the extension number.
- 2. Press \square to dial a phone number.
- 3. Press \frown or \frown (**End**) to end a call or cancel a dialing.
 - When the phone is locked, enter the lock code to unlock the phone first; otherwise, you can make emergency calls or answer calls only.
 - In the standby mode, press 🗀 to view the **Call Log**. Select a record and press 🔂 to dial.
 - Select a contact from the contacts and press \Box to dial.
 - Select a message in the inbox and press \Box to dial.

Answering a Call

When there is an incoming call, you can:

- Press \square , \square' (Answer), or to answer it.
- Press 🔄 to reject it.

- Press (Silence) to mute it and then press (Reject) to reject it.
- Press any key (except $\overline{\ }$ and $\overline{\ }$) to answer it if the auto-answer function is enabled.
- If the headset is connected to the phone properly, press the button on the headset to answering an incoming call; press the button again to end the call.
- If the headset profile and the headset auto answer function is enabled, and the headset is connected to the phone properly, the phone answers an incoming call automatically.

Operations During a Call

You can press \bigcirc to enable or disable the speaker, or press \Box (**Options**) to select the following options:

- **Mute/Unmute**: Mute or unmute your voice during a call. At first, the option is **Mute**. If you select it, the other party during the call cannot hear you any more. If you access the **Options** menu again, the option is **Unmute**. If you select it, the other party can hear you again. This function is available only after the call is set up. You cannot mute/unmute the ringtone.
- Start Record: Allow you to record the call, you can select This Side or The Other Side.
- **Save Number**: Allows you to enter a phone number and save it to the phonebook.
- Contacts: Allows you to search for or create a contact.
- Messages: Allows you to display the Messages menu.
- Call Memo: Allows you to enter the Call Memo menu.
- Voice privacy: Allows you to set the privacy mode, including Activate and Deactivate.

4 Text Entry

Text Input Modes

The indicator of the current input mode is displayed on the upper right corner of the screen. You can press (#) to change the input mode.

Entering English

Smart English Input

You can enter English letters as follows:

1. Corresponding to the sequence of the word, press the key labeled with the desired letter once.

Then the phone displays the commonly used words according to the numeric sequence of key presses.

- 2. Press for view alternative words.
- 3. Press (1) or (1) enter a letter.

- Press once to enter a full stop.
 - Press to enter a space and press and hold it to enter **0**.
 - Press to display the symbol list. Then you can enter symbols.

Alphabetical Text Input

The alphabetical text input allows you to enter uppercase or lowercase English letters. You can press the key labeled with the desired letter once to enter the first letter on the key, twice to enter the second letter on the key, and so on.

If the letter you want to enter is on the same key as the previous one, you can enter the latter only after the cursor appears again or $\sqrt{2}$

press \checkmark to move the cursor to the next space.

- Press <a>
 repeatedly to enter a commonly used punctuation.
 - Press once to enter a space, twice to enter **0**.

Entering Spanish

You can enter Spanish words in the Spanish text input mode.

Traditional Spanish text input and smart Spanish text input are similar to traditional English text input and smart English input. For details, see "Entering English" on page 14.

Entering Numbers

- In the "123" input mode, press number keys to enter numbers.
- In "Abc" input modes, press a number key repeatedly until the number appears.

• In the "En" input mode, press a number key and then press a until the number appears.

Entering Symbols

In any input mode, you can enter a symbol as follows:

- 1. Press •• to display a symbol list.
- 2. Press to select a symbol.
- 3. Press \bigcirc to enter the symbol.

Writing and Sending a Message

To write and send a message, do as follows:

- Select Menu > Messages > SMS > Create Message.
 You can also access the Create Message menu by pressing and holding ______ in the standby mode.
- 2. Write a message with entering up to 160 English letters or 70 Spanish letters.

When writing a message, press \Box (**Options**) to select the following options:

- Send: Allows you to send the message.
- Save: Allows you to save the message to the Draft.
- Insert Template: Allows you to insert a commonly used phrase.
- **Insert Contact**: Allows you to select a contact from the phonebook and insert the phone number into the message.
- **Priority**: Allows you to set the priority of messages sent to the recipients. The priorities are **Normal** and **Urgent**. The message priority function is network dependent.
- **Callback Number**: Allows you to set the callback number. The callback number is sent to the message recipient by default. You can set it to either your phone number or other numbers. When the recipient receives your message, the callback number can be viewed and provided for calling back. Select **On** and enter the phone number.
- **Delivery Report**: Allows you to require a message delivery notification from the SMSC.
- 3. Press (•) in the text editing screen to send the message directly, or select **Options** > **Send** to send the message.

- 4. Enter the phone number of a recipient. Up to 100 recipients can be added by the following options:
- Enter the phone number(s) directly.
- Press \frown (Search). Then select Contacts to select the phone number(s).
- Press 🖾 (Search). Then select Groups to select a group.
- 5. Press $\textcircled{\bullet}$ to send the message.

Reading a Message

To read a message stored in the inbox, do as follows:

- 1. Select Menu > Messages > SMS > Inbox.
- 2. Press \frown to choose a message.
- 3. Press (•) to read the message, or press (•) (Options) to select the following options:
- View: Allows you to read the message.
- **Reply**: Allows you to edit a message to reply the message sender.
- **Delete**: Allows you to delete the message.
- **Delete Multiple**: Allows you to delete multiple messages at a time.
- Forward: Allows you to forward the message.
- Extract: Allows you to extract the number contained in the message, or the number of the message sender. You can select Edit before call, Call or Save the number.

Writing and Sending a Multimedia Message

- 1. Select Menu > Messages > MMS > New Message.
- 2. Enter the content of a multimedia message (MMS) in the following fields:
- **Recipient**: Allows you to enter the recipients of message. You can add up to 20 recipients.
- Subject: Allows you to enter the subject of message.
- Slides: Allows you to insert images, audio files and texts into a slide. You can set the duration of displaying each slide for your preview.
- Timing: Allows you to set the duration of switching the slides.
- The capacity of a MMS can be up to 200 KB, including the attached file and slide.
- 3. After you write the multimedia message, select Menu > Send and press (OK) to send it.

Receiving a Multimedia Message

If MMS > Settings > Receive options > Download timing setting is Manual, a notification will be received in Inbox and you can press (\bullet) to view the notification, then select Menu > Receive to receive the MMS.

If **MMS > Settings > Receive options > Download timing** setting is **Automatic**, the MMS will be downloaded in Inbox directly.

Viewing a Multimedia Message

Do the following to view messages stored in the inbox:

- 1. Select Menu > Messages > MMS > Inbox.
- 2. Press a to view messages.
- 3. Press (**OK**) to view details or press (**Menu**) to select the following items:
- Open: Allows you to view details of the message.
- Reply: Allows you to reply a message to the message sender.
- **Reply all**: Allows you to reply all the messages to the message senders.
- Move: Allows you to move the message(s) to My folders.
- **Delete**: Allows you to delete the message.
- Delete all: Delete all the messages in the inbox.
- **Sort**: Allows you to sort the messages in the inbox according to date and address.
- Filter view: Allows you to view the specified message(s).

7 Contacts

Adding a Contact

To add a contact, do as follows:

- 1. Select Menu > Contacts > Add New.
- 2. Press (b) to enter information in Name, and then press (OK).
- 3. Enter the necessary information of contact.

You can enter information in **Mobile Number**, **Home Number**, **Office Number**, and **Fax Number**. (At least one number field is required.).You can enter the email of the new contact and select a group, a notes, a custom tone and an image for the contact.

4. Press \Box (Save) to save the contact to the phonebook.

Searching a Contact

To search a contact, do as follows:

- 1. Select Menu > Contacts > Search.
- 2. Enter the name of the contact. Then press \Box (Search) or \bullet].
- 3. After searching the contact, press (Options) for the following options:
- View: Allows you to view the details.
- Edit: Allows you to edit the contact.
- Add New: Allows you to add a new contact.
- Send Message: Allows you to send a message to the contact.
- **Delete**: Allows you to delete the contact.
- Call: Allows you to making a call to the contact.

- Edit Before call: Allows you to modify the number before you call it.
- Ш
- In the standby mode, press $\overline{}$ to access **Contacts**.
- To quickly search a contact, you can press the number key (except and or) to enter the first letter of the contact name. Then the phone lists English contacts that start with the letter.

Searching a Contact by Location

You can find a contact according to the sequence number. Each contact in the phonebook has an independent sequence number, which is from 1 to 1000. You can quickly search a contact by the sequence number.

To search a contact, do as follows:

- 1. Select Menu > Contacts > Search By Location.
- 2. Input the sequence number of the contact directly, and then press \Box (**View**) or \bigcirc to view the details.

8 Alarm Clock

After the alarm clock is enabled, the phone notifies you at the specified time when the phone is powered on. You can set up to five alarm clocks.

Enabling an Alarm Clock

- 1. Select Menu > Applications > Alarms.
- 2. Press *content* to select an alarm clock.
- 3. Press \Box (**On**) to turn on the alarm clock, or press to set the following options:
- Title: Allows you to set the title of the alarm clock.
- Time: Allows you to set the time.
- Cycle: Allows you to set the alerting cycle mode
- **Ring**: Allows you to set the alerting ringtone.
- 4. Press (Save) to save the alarm clock.
 - When the alarm clock alerts, press □ (Stop) to stop it or press □ (Snooze) to snooze it for five minutes.
 - If nothing is done to the alarm clock when it alerts, it stops temporarily after 45 seconds and alerts again five minutes later. It alerts five times before it stops thoroughly.
 - If you select Cycle > Custom, press to scroll from Sunday to Saturday and press b to select the days; press again to deselect the days, and then press
 □ (Save) to confirm.

Disabling an Alarm Clock

- 1. Select Menu > Applications > Alarms. $\overline{\nabla}$
- 2. Press *constant to select an alarm clock.*
- 3. Press \Box (**Off**) to disable the alarm clock.
 - Select Menu > Applications > Alarms > Cancel All to disable all alarm clocks.

9 Security

Enabling/Disabling the Phone Lock

The phone lock protects your phone from unauthorized use. The phone lock function is not enabled when you purchase the phone. You can change the default phone lock code "1234" to any numeric string of 4 to 8 digits.

- 1. Select Menu > Settings > Security Settings > Phone Lock.
- 2. Select one of the following phone lock modes:
- Immediately: Lock the phone immediately.
- **Power On**: Enable the phone lock when the phone is powered on next time.
- Off: Disable your phone lock.

Changing the Phone Lock Code

Do remember your phone lock code. If you forget it, contact your local dealer.

```
1. \ Select \ Menu > Settings > Security > Change \ Phone \ Code.
```

2. Enter the correct phone lock code and press \Box (**OK**).

3. Enter the new phone lock code and press \Box (**OK**).

4. Enter the new phone lock code again and press \Box (**OK**).

Locking the Keypad

When the keypad is locked, you can still answer an incoming call or make emergency calls by pressing \Box .

Manually Locking the Keypad

In the standby mode, press and hold * to lock the keypad.

Automatically Locking the Keypad

If the auto keyguard function is enabled, after the phone has been idle for a preset period in the standby mode, the keypad is locked automatically.

1. Select Menu > Settings > Phone Settings > Auto Keyguard.

- 2. Press \frown for the following options:
- Off: Disable the auto keyguard function.
- **15 Seconds**, **30 Seconds** or **1 Minutes**: When the phone has been idle for the selected time in the standby mode, the keypad is locked automatically.
- 3. Press (Select) to save the settings.

Unlocking the Keypad

In the standby mode, press \Box (Unlock) and then press $\bullet \star$ to unlock the keypad.

10 Music

Adding the Playlist

- 1. In the standby mode, you can adding a playlist in either of the ways:
- Options when no playlist saved: Select Menu > Multimedia > Media Player > Add New Playlist.
- Options when some playlist saved: Select a playlist, and then press (Options) to select Add New Playlist.
- 2. Enter the name of the playlist, and then press \Box (**OK**).
- 3. Press \Box (Add) to add the songs.
- 4. Press $\widehat{\bigcirc}$ $\widehat{\bigcirc}$ to select phone or micro SD card for the memory in use.
- 5. Press $\textcircled{\bullet}$ to select or deselect the songs in the play list.
- 6. Press \Box (Add) to save the settings.

Launching the Media Player

In the standby mode, you can launch the music player by the following options:

- Press and hold
- Select Menu > Multimedia > Media Player > Music Now.

Selecting a Playlist

After launching the music player, you can do as follows:

- 1. Press (Add Tracks) to select From Play List.
- 2. Press $\stackrel{\frown}{\frown}$ to select a playlist, and then press $\stackrel{\frown}{\Box}$ (**Play**).
- 3. Then the phone loads the playlist.



ш You can also select a playlist directly, and then press \Box (Options) to select Play to load the playlist.

Playing Music

In the Media Player screen, you can do as follows:

- 1. Press \bigcirc to play a song.
- Press $\overleftarrow{}$ to play the next song.
- Press and hold $\underbrace{}^{\leftarrow}$ to play the song by fast forward.
- Press (to play the previous song.
- Press and hold \bigcup to play the song by fast backward.
- Press 🕑 to pause playing; press 🕑 again to continue playing.
- Press 👓 to load the current playlist.
- Press *constant* to stop playing.
- 2. Press $\overline{}$ (Minimize) to return to the Multimedia screen. You can use other functions while the phone is playing the mp3 files
- 3. Press 2^{s} to switch off the music player and return to the standby mode.

Setting the Equalizer

- 1. In the standby mode, select Menu > Multimedia > Media **Player** > **Music Now** to launch the music player.
- 2. Press (Options) and select Settings for the following options:
- Shuffle: Allows you to set the shuffle mode.
- Loop: Allows you to set the loop mode.

- Equalizer: Allows you to set the Equalizer.
- When the phone is playing songs, press the key on the headset to play the next song or press and hold it to switch off the music player.

11 Video Player

Selecting a Video File

- 1. In the standby mode, select **Menu** > **Multimedia** > **My Files** > **Videos**.
- 2. Press (i,j) to select phone or micro SD card for the memory in use.
- 3. Press a to select a video file.
- ☐ If you want to select a video file from the Micro SD Card, the Micro SD Card must be inserted in your phone beforehand.

Playing a Video File

In the **Videos** interface, after you select a video file, you can do as follows:

- 1. Press 🕑 to play a video file.
- Press () to play the next video file.
- Press and hold $\underbrace{\bigcirc}$ to play the video file by fast forward.
- Press 🗸 to play the previous video file.
- Press and hold \bigcup to play the video file by fast backward.
- Press O to pause playing; press O again to continue playing.
- Press ____ to stop playing.
- Press 🤝 to display the full screen.

- Press increase the volume.
- Press to decrease the volume.
- 2. Press $\overline{}$ (**Back**) to switch off the video player.

12 Recorder

Recording a Sound Clip

- 1. In the standby mode, select **Menu** > **Multimedia** > **Recorder**.
- 2. Press (•) to start recording, press (•) again to pause recording.
- 3. Press (Back) to stop recording, with displaying a prompt to confirm.
- 4. Press (Yes) to save the sound clip to Menu > Multimedia > My Files > Musics > Recorder.
 - Press $\overline{}$ (No) to return to the previous menu.
 - When recording a sound clip, you can press □ (Stop) to save the sound clip to Menu > Multimedia > My Files > Musics > Recorder automatically.
 - When recording a sound clip, make the microphone of your phone near the sound source for a better recording effect.

Playing a Sound Clip

- 1. In the standby mode, select **Menu** > **Multimedia** > **Recorder**.
- 2. Press (Voice Folder).
- 3. Press $\widehat{\mathfrak{S}}$ $\widehat{\mathfrak{S}}$ to select **Phone** or **Micro SD Card**.
- 4. Press $\stackrel{\sim}{\longrightarrow}$ to select a sound clip and then press $\stackrel{\sim}{\textcircled{}}$ to play it.
- 5. Press (Back) to view the sound clip list.
- 6. Press \Box (**Options**) for the following options:
- **Play**: Allows you to lay the sound clip.

17 Troubleshooting

If you encounter any problem when using your phone, try to solve the problem according to the following table. If the problem still occurs, contact the service provider or the dealer.

The phone cannot be powered on.	The battery power is enough. The battery is properly installed. Press and hold / .

Bad call quality.	 The signal strength is strong enough. If you are staying indoors, move near to a window.
During a call, the other side cannot hear your voice.	The microphone is not covered.

Problem	Ensure that
Your phone displays "No service found", "Service unavailable" or "Network problem".	 You are not in an area with weak magnetic field (in a tunnel or surrounded by buildings). If so, move to another area and try again. Do not visit the service option without authorization from your service provider.

18 Warnings and Precautions

Electronic Device

- Power off your phone near high-precision electronic devices. The phone may affect the performance of these devices.
- Such devices include hearing aids, pacemakers, fire alarm systems, automatic gates, and other automatic-control devices. If you are using an electronic medical device, consult the device manufacturer to confirm whether the radio wave affects the operation of this device.
- Pacemaker manufacturers recommend that a minimum separation of 15 cm be maintained between a mobile phone and a pace-maker to avoid potential interference with the pace-maker. To achieve this, use the phone on the opposite ear to your pacemaker and do not carry it in a breast pocket.

Hospital

Pay attention to the following points in hospitals or health care facilities:

- Do not take your phone into the operating room (OR), intensive care unit (ICU), or coronary care unit (CCU).
- Do not use your phone at places for medical treatment where phone use is prohibited.
- When using your phone near someone who is suffering from a heart disease, turn down the ring tone volume or vibration properly so that it does not affect the person.
- Area with Inflammables and Explosives

In any area with inflammables and explosives, power off your phone and do not take out, install or charge the battery, to avoid explosion and fire. Areas with inflammables and explosives include, but are not limited to:

- Gas station
- Area for storing fuels (such as the bunk under the deck of a ship)
- Device/Vehicle for transporting and storing fuels or chemical products
- Area with chemical substances and particles (such as: granule, dust, metal powder) in the air
- Area with the sign of "Explosives"
- Area with the sign of "Power off bi-direction wireless equipment"
- Area where it is generally suggested to stop the engine or a vehicle

Traffic Safety

- Please observe local laws and regulations on phone use. Do not use your phone while driving to avoid traffic accident.
- Secure the phone on its holder. Do not place the phone on the seat or other places where it can get loose in a sudden stop or collision.
- Use the phone after the vehicle stops at a safe place.
- If your phone supports the hands-free function, or the phone can be used with earphones, or there is any vehicle-mounted equipment with hands-free function, use them in emergency.
- Do not place the phone over the air bag or in the air bag outspread area. Otherwise, the phone may hurt you owing to the strong force when the air bag inflates.
- Observe the rules and regulations of airline companies. When boarding or approaching a plane, power off the phone and take out the battery. In areas where phone use is prohibited, power off the phone. Otherwise, the radio signal of the phone may disturb the plane control signals. Power off your phone before boarding an aircraft.

Storage Environment

- Do not place magnetic storage media such as magnetic cards and floppy disks near the phone. Radiation from the phone may erase the information stored on them.
- Do not put your phone, battery, or other accessories in containers with strong magnetic field, such as an induction cooker and a microwave oven. Otherwise, circuit failure, fire, or explosion may occur.
- Do not leave your phone, battery, or charger in a very hot or cold place. Otherwise, malfunction of the products, fire, or explosion may occur.
- Keep the ambient temperature between 0°C and 45 while the °C battery is being charged. Keep the ambient temperature between -20 °C to 60°C for storing the battery. If the ambient temperature is too low (especially below 0°C) or too high, the capacity and life of the battery will be reduced.
