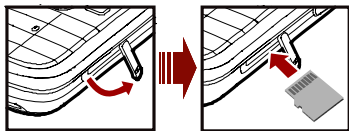
2 Getting Started

Installing the UIM Card and Battery

Make sure that the golden area on the UIM card is facing downwards and the cut-off edge is correctly aligned with the card holder.

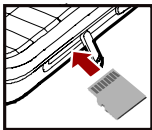


Installing the microSD Card







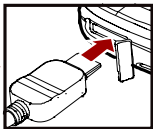
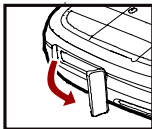
Install the microSD card correctly to avoid damaging your phone or the microSD card.



Charging the Battery

To charge the battery, do as follows:



1. Connect the charger connector to the charger interface at the bottom of the phone.
2. Connect the power plug of the charger to an AC power socket. During the charging process,  appears on the upper right corner of the screen in an animated status.
3. Wait until the phone is fully charged. When  becomes static, the battery is fully charged.
4. Disconnect the power plug of the charger from the AC power socket.
5. Disconnect the charger connector from the phone.














- Do not use a damaged battery or charger.
- Before using the travel charger, ensure that the battery is installed in your phone.

Powering On/Off the Phone

- When the phone is powered off, press and hold  to power it on.
- When the phone is powered on, press and hold  to power it off.




Using the Function Menu


To use the function menu, do as follows:



1. In standby mode, press  (**Menu**).
2. Press  (**Select**) or  to display the selected menu.
3. Display the submenu in either of the following methods:
 - Press  or  to select a submenu. Then press  (**Select**) or  to display it.
 - Press the key corresponding to the sequence number of a submenu to display it.
4. Press  (**Back**) to return to the previous menu or exit the function menu.
5. Press  to return to the standby mode.

3 Voice Services





Making a Call

1. In standby mode, press number keys to enter a phone number.
 - To make an international call, press  twice to enter +. Then enter the international long distance code, the country code, the area code and phone number in a sequence.
 - To call a phone number with an extension, press  three times to insert **P** or press  four times to insert **T** between the phone number and the extension number.

2. Press  to call the number.










3. Press  or  (**End**) to end the call or cancel the call.





- When the phone is locked, enter the lock code to unlock the phone first; otherwise, you can only make emergency calls or answer calls.
- In standby mode, press  to view **Calls**. Select a record and press  to call the number.
- Select a contact from the contacts and press  to call the number.
- Select a message in the inbox and press  to call the message sender.

Answering a Call

When there is an incoming call, you can select the following options:

- Press ,  (**Answer**), or  to answer it. Press  to reject it.
- If your phone is in silence or meeting mode, press  (**Reject**) to reject it. If your phone is not in silence or meeting mode, press  (**Silence**) to mute the ringtone, and press  (**Reject**) again to reject it.
- If the **Any Key Answer** function is enabled, press any key (except  and ) to answer it.
- If the headset is connected to the phone properly, press the button on the headset to answer an incoming call; press the button again to end the call.
- If the headset mode and the **Headset Auto Answer** function are enabled, and the headset is connected to the phone properly, the phone answers an incoming call automatically.

Operations During a Call


When there is an ongoing call, you can press  to activate or deactivate the speaker, or press  (**Options**) for the following options:

- **Mute/Unmute:** Allows you to mute or unmute your voice during a call. At first, the option is **Mute**. If you select it, the other party can not hear your voice during the call. If you access the **Options** menu again, the option is **Unmute**. If you select it, the other party can hear your voice again. This function is available only after the call is set up. You can not mute/unmute the ringtone.
- **Start Record:** Allows you to record the call. You can select **This Side** or **The Other Side**.





- **Save Number:** Allows you to enter a phone number and save it to the phonebook.
- **Contacts:** Allows you to search for or create a contact.
- **Messages:** Allows you to access the **SMS** menu.
- **Memo:** Allows you to access the **Memo** menu.
- **Voice privacy:** Allows you to set the privacy mode, including **Standard** and **Enhanced**.

4 Text Entry

Text Input Modes

The indicator of the current input mode is displayed on the upper left corner of the screen. You can press  to change the input mode.


-  In editing mode, press  once to delete the letter to the left of the cursor. Alternatively, press and hold  to clear all letters at a time. If there is no letter to delete, you can press  (**Back**) to return to the previous menu.



Smart English Input

You can enter English letters as follows:

1. According to the sequence of the word, press each corresponding key only once for one letter. Then the phone displays the common words according to the numeric sequence of key presses.
2. Press  to view alternative words.
3. Press  to switch between the uppercase and lowercase.

4. Press  or  to confirm the selection; or press  to confirm the selection and enter a space after the word.




- Press  to enter a full stop or symbols.
- Press  to enter a space and press and hold it to enter **0**.
- Press  to display the symbol list. Then you can enter symbols.



Alphabetical Text Input

The alphabetical text input allows you to enter uppercase or lowercase English letters. You can press the key labeled with the required letter once to enter the first letter on the key, twice to enter the second letter on the key, and so on.

If the letter you want to enter is labeled on the same key as the previous one, you can enter the latter letter only after the cursor appears again or


press  to move the cursor to the next space.



- Press  repeatedly to enter a common punctuation.
- Press  once to enter a space, twice to enter **0**.





Entering Numbers

- In "123" input mode, directly press the number key labeled with the required number.
- In "Abc" input mode, press a number key repeatedly or press and hold it until the required number appears on the screen.

- In "En" input mode, press a number key and then press  until the required number appears on the screen. Or you can press and hold the key until the required number appears on the screen.





Writing and Sending a Message




To write and send a message, do as follows:

1. Select **Menu > Messages > SMS > Create Message**. In standby mode, you can also press , select **SMS > Create Message**.
2. Write a message. You can enter up to 160 English letters. When writing a message, press  (**Options**) for the following options:
 - **Send**: Allows you to send the message.
 - **Save**: Allows you to save the message to **Drafts**.
 - **Insert Template**: Allows you to insert a common phrase.
 - **Insert Contact**: Allows you to select a contact from the phonebook and insert the phone number into the message.
 - **Priority**: Allows you to set a priority for the message sent to the recipients. The priorities are **Normal**, **Urgent** and **Emergency**. The message priority function is network dependent.
 - **Delivery Report**: Allows you to receive a message delivery report from the short message service center (SMSC).
3. Press  in the text editing screen to send the message directly, or select **Options > Send** to send the message.
4. Enter the phone number of a recipient.
Up to 100 recipients can be added in the following methods:
 - Enter the phone number(s) directly.

- Press  (Options). Then select **Contacts** to select the phone number(s).
 - Press  (Options). Then select **Groups** to select a group.
 - Press  (Options). Then select **abc** to enter lowercases.
 - Press  (Options). Then select **ABC** to enter uppercases.
5. Press  to send the message.


Reading a Message



To read a message stored in the inbox, do as follows:

1. Select **Menu > Messages > SMS > Inbox**.
2. Press  to select a message.
3. Press  to read the message, or press  (Options) for the following options:
 - **View**: Allows you to read the message.
 - **Reply**: Allows you to edit a message and reply the message sender.
 - **Delete**: Allows you to delete the message.
 - **Delete Multiple**: Allows you to delete multiple messages at a time.
 - **Forward**: Allows you to forward the message.
 - **Extract**: Allows you to extract the number contained in the message, or the number of the message sender. For the number, you can select the option **Edit Before Call**, **Call** or **Save**.
 - **Move To Phone/Move To R-UIM**: Allows you to move the message to the phone or to the UIM card.
 - **Copy To Phone/Copy To R-UIM**: Allows you to copy the message to the phone or to the UIM card.


6 MMS

Writing and Sending a Multimedia Message

1. Select **Menu > Messages > MMS > New Message**. In standby mode, you can also press , select **MMS > New Message**.
2. Enter the content of a multimedia message in the following fields:
 - **Recipient:** Allows you to enter the message recipients. You can add up to 20 recipients.
 - **Subject:** Allows you to enter the subject of the message.
 - **Slides:** Allows you to insert images, audio files, video files and texts into a slide. You can set the duration of displaying each slide for your preview.
 - **Timing:** Allows you to set the duration of switching the slides.

 The capacity of a multimedia message can be up to 300 KB, including the slides.
3. After you edit the multimedia message, select **Options > Send** and press  to send it.

Receiving a Multimedia Message


If you select **MMS > Settings > Receive options > Download timing > Manual**, a notification can be received in the inbox and you can press  to view the notification. Then select **Options > Receive** to receive the multimedia message.



If you select **MMS > Settings > Receive options > Download timing > Automatic**, the multimedia message is downloaded in the inbox directly.

Viewing a Multimedia Message

To view multimedia messages stored in the inbox, do as follows:

1. Select **Menu > Messages > MMS > Inbox**.

2. Press  to select a message.




3. Press  to view contents of the message or press  (**Options**) for the following options:

- **Open:** Allows you to view contents of the message.
- **Reply:** Allows you to reply the message to the message sender.
- **Reply all:** Allows you to reply the message to the message sender and all other message recipients.
- **Forward:** Allows you to forward the message.
- **Move:** Allows you to move the message(s) to **My folders**.
- **Delete:** Allows you to delete the message.
- **Delete All:** Delete all the messages in the inbox.
- **Sort:** Allows you to sort the messages in the inbox according to the date or address.
- **Filter View:** Allows you to view the specified message(s).

7 Contacts




Adding a Contact

To add a contact, do as follows:

1. Select **Menu > Contacts > Add New**.
2. Press  to enter information in **Name**, and then press  (**OK**).
3. Enter the necessary information about a contact.
You can enter information in **Mobile Number**, **Home Number**, **Office Number**, and **Fax Number**. (At least one number field is required). You can enter the email of a new contact and select a group, notes, a customized tone, and an image for the contact.
4. Press  (**Save**) to save the contact to the phonebook.




Searching for a Contact

To search for a contact, do as follows:

1. Select **Menu > Contacts > Search**.
2. Enter the name of a contact. Then press  (**Search**) or .
3. After the contact is found, press  (**Options**) for the following options:
 - **View**: Allows you to view the details.
 - **Edit**: Allows you to edit the contact.
 - **Add New**: Allows you to add a new contact.
 - **Send Message**: Allows you to send a message to the contact.

- **Send Via Bluetooth:** Allows you to send the contact by Bluetooth.
- **Delete:** Allows you to delete the contact.
- **Copy To Phone/Copy To UIM Card:** Allows you to copy the contact to the phone or to the UIM card.
- **Call:** Allows you to call the number of the contact.
- **Edit Before Call:** Allows you to modify the number before you call.





- In standby mode, press  (**Contacts**) to access the phonebook.
- To quickly search for a contact, you can press the number key (except  and ) to enter the first letter of the contact name. Then the phone lists English contacts that start with the letter.

Searching for a Contact by Location

You can quickly search for a contact according to the sequence number. Each contact in the phonebook has a unique sequence number.





To search for a contact, do as follows:

1. Select **Menu > Contacts > Search By Location**.
2. Enter the sequence number of the contact directly, and then press  (**View**) or  to view details of the contact.







8 Alarm Clock

After the alarm clock is activated, the phone notifies you at the preset time. You can set up to five alarm clocks.

Activating an Alarm Clock


1. Select **Menu > Tools > Alarms**.
2. Press  to select an alarm clock.
3. Press  (**On**) to activate the alarm clock, or press  for the following options:
 - **Title:** Allows you to set the title.
 - **Time:** Allows you to set the time.
 - **Cycle:** Allows you to set the alerting mode.
 - **Ring:** Allows you to set the alarm tone.
4. Press  (**Save**) to save the settings of the alarm clock.




- When the alarm clock alerts, press  (**Stop**) to stop it or press  (**Snooze**) to snooze it for five minutes.
- If no operation is performed to the alarm clock when it alerts, the alarm clock stops temporarily after 45 seconds and alerts again five minutes later. It alerts five times before it stops thoroughly.
- If you select **Cycle > Custom**, press  to scroll from Sunday to Saturday and press  to select the days; press  again to deselect the days. Then press  (**OK**) to confirm.

Deactivating an Alarm Clock

1. Select **Menu > Tools > Alarms**.

2. Press  to select an alarm clock.

3. Press  (**Off**) to deactivate the alarm clock.



Select **Menu > Tools > Alarms > Cancel All** to deactivate all alarm clocks.


Activating/Deactivating the Phone Lock

The phone lock protects your phone from unauthorized use. By default, the phone lock function is not activated. You can change the default phone lock code **0000** to any numeric string of 4 digits.

1. Select **Menu > Settings > Security Settings > Phone Lock**.
2. Select one of the following phone lock modes:
 - **Immediate**: The phone is locked immediately.
 - **Power On**: The phone lock is activated when the phone is powered on next time.
 - **Off**: The phone lock is deactivated.

Changing the Phone Lock Code

Do remember your phone lock code. If you forget it, contact your local dealer.

1. Select **Menu > Settings > Security Settings > Change Phone Code**.
2. Enter the correct phone lock code and press  (OK).
3. Enter the new phone lock code and press  (OK).
4. Enter the new phone lock code again and press  (OK).

PIN and PUK





The personal identification number (PIN) protects your UIM card from unauthorized use. The PIN unlocking key (PUK) can unblock the blocked

PIN. Both the PIN and PUK are delivered with your UIM card. For details, consult your service provider.


If you enter wrong PINs for a specified number of times consecutively, you are required to enter the PUK.

If you enter wrong PUKs for a specified number of times consecutively, the UIM card is invalidated permanently. Contact your service provider for a new card.

Locking the Keypad

When the keypad is locked, you can still answer an incoming call by pressing  (Answer),  or , and you can make emergency calls by pressing .


Manually Locking the Keypad

In standby mode, press and hold  to lock the keypad.

Automatically Locking the Keypad

If the auto keyguard function is enabled, after the phone has been idle for a preset period in standby mode, the keypad is locked automatically.



1. Select **Menu > Settings > Phone Settings > Auto Keyguard**.

2. Press  for the following options:

- **Off:** Allows you to disable the auto keyguard function.
- **15 Seconds, 30 Seconds or 1 Minute:** In standby mode, when the phone has been idle for the selected time, the keypad is locked automatically.


3. Press  (Select) to save the settings.

In standby mode, press  (**Unlock**) and then press  to unlock the keypad.

Adding a Playlist


1. In standby mode, select **Menu > Multimedia > Music Player > Playlists**. Then press  (**Add**) to add a new playlist.


 If you have already saved a playlist on your phone, press  (**Options**) and select **Add New Playlist**.


2. Enter the name of the playlist, and then press  (**OK**).

3. Press  (**Add**) to add songs.

 If you have already saved a playlist on your phone, press  (**Options**) and select **From My Files** or **From Playlists** to add songs. If you select **From Playlists**, press  to select a playlist, and then press  (**Add**) to add all the songs in the selected playlist to the new playlist. You can also press  to enter the selected playlist and select one or more songs. Then you can press  (**Add**) to add the selected songs.

4. Press  to select the phone or the microSD card as the memory in use.

5. Press  to select or deselect the songs in the playlist.

6. Press  (**Options**), and select **Add** to save the settings.



















After launching the music player, you can do as follows:


1. Press  (**Add Tracks**) to add tracks.
2. Press  to select **From My Files** or **From Playlists**.
 - If you select **From My Files**, press  to select the phone or the microSD card as the memory in use. Press  to select or deselect the songs. Press  (**Options**) and select **Add**. Then the phone loads the playlist.
 - If you select **From Playlists**, press  to select a playlist and press  (**Play**) to add and play the songs in the selected playlist. You can also press  to enter the selected playlist and select one or more songs. Then you can press  (**Play**) to add and play the songs.


- If a playlist already exists in the music player, press  (Options) and select **Current Playlist** to access the **Current Playlist** screen. Then press  (Options) and select **Add Tracks** to add tracks.
- You can also select a playlist directly. Press  (Options) and select **Play** to load the playlist.



Playing Music

On the music player screen, you can do as follows:

1. Press  or  to play a song.
 - Press  or  to play the next song.
 - Press and hold  or  to fast forward the song.
 - Press  or  to play the previous song.
 - Press and hold  or  to rewind the song.
 - Press  or  to pause the song; press  or  again to continue playing the song.
 - Press  to load the current playlist.
 - Press  to stop playing.
 - Press  to increase the volume.
 - Press  to decrease the volume.


2. Press  (**Minimize**) to minimize the music player. You can use other functions while the phone is playing music.

3. Press  to return to the standby mode and the music is still playing.


 If music playing is stopped in the music player, you can press  to exit the music player directly.

Setting the Equalizer

1. In standby mode, select **Menu > Multimedia > Music Player > Music Now!** to launch the music player.



2. Press  (**Options**) and select **Settings** for the following options:


- **Shuffle**: Allows you to set the shuffle mode.
- **Loop**: Allows you to set the loop mode.
- **Equalizer**: Allows you to set the equalizer.

 When the phone is playing songs, press the button on the headset to play the next song.

Selecting a Video File









1. In standby mode, select **Menu > Multimedia > My Files > Videos**.
2. Press  to select the phone or the microSD card as the memory in use.
3. Press  to select a video file.


 If you want to select a video file from the microSD card, the microSD card must be inserted into your phone beforehand.

Playing a Video File

On the video screen, after you select a video file, you can do as follows:









- Press  to display the full screen.



Recording a Sound Clip


1. In standby mode, select **Menu > Multimedia > Recorder**.
2. Press  to start recording; press  again to pause.

16 Bluetooth®

You can use the built-in Bluetooth function of your phone to synchronize data between a PC and your phone, or exchange data with other Bluetooth devices. You can also call by using the Bluetooth headset or Bluetooth loudspeaker.

Bluetooth supports a wireless connection between Bluetooth devices within a distance of 10 m; however, the Bluetooth wireless connection can be disturbed by other electronic devices and blocked by obstacles, such as walls.

In certain areas, using Bluetooth devices might be restricted or prohibited. Observe applicable laws and regulations.

Do not accept the connection request of an unknown device. Thus, you can prevent your mobile phone from the intrusion of destructive contents.









The Bluetooth function supported by your phone meets the requirements of Bluetooth Specification 2.0. It works normally only when you use it with compatible Bluetooth devices. For more information, refer to the user manuals of related devices, or consult the manufacturers of related devices.

Sending Data Through the Bluetooth Connection








You can set up only one Bluetooth connection each time.

1. Select **Menu > Settings > Phone Settings > Bluetooth > Switch On/Off > On** to activate Bluetooth.

2. Launch the application that contains the file to be sent. For example, if you want to send an image to another device, you need to launch the **My Files** application.
3. Select the file you want to send. Press  (**Options**) and select **Send > Bluetooth**.
 -  If the Bluetooth function is not activated, the phone displays "Switch On Bluetooth?" on the screen.
 - Select **Yes** to activate Bluetooth and access the **Device List** screen.

5. If the device that is to be connected with requests identity authentication before connection, your phone displays "Enter PIN code:" on the screen. Create a shared password. After the same password is entered on both devices, the Bluetooth connection is set up.
6. After the connection is set up, information about the data being transferred is displayed on your phone.

Receiving Data Through the Bluetooth Connection


1. When other device sends data to your phone through Bluetooth, your phone displays "Receive File?" on the screen.
 - Press  (Yes) to receive the data. The filename and receiving progress are displayed on the screen.
 - Press  (No) to reject the data.

 For the first time to connect with another device through Bluetooth, your phone displays "Enter PIN code:" on the screen for you to authenticate the identity of the device. Enter the password of one to eight digits, and press  (Select). After the same password is entered on the other device, your phone starts to receive data.
2. When your phone displays "Receive Successful!" on the screen, it indicates that the data is received and saved under **My Files**.
 -  If a microSD card is installed on your phone, the phone saves the received data in the microSD card by default. Otherwise, the phone saves the received data in the phone memory.



Other Bluetooth Operations


You can set the basic settings for the Bluetooth functions. Select **Menu > Settings > Phone Settings > Bluetooth** for the following options:


- **Switch On/Off:** Allows you to enable or disable the Bluetooth function.

- Files or VCard files can be transferred between your phone and a Bluetooth device that supports the OPP function.
 - Your phone only support the FTP Server rather than the FTP Client.

Electronic Device

Power off your device if using the device is prohibited. Do not use the device when it causes danger or interference with electronic devices.

Medical Device

- Power off your device and follow the rules and regulations set forth by the hospitals and health care facilities.
- Pacemaker manufacturers recommend that a minimum distance of 15 cm be maintained between a device and a pacemaker to prevent potential interference with the pacemaker. If you are using a pacemaker, use the device on the opposite side of the pacemaker and do not carry the device in your front pocket.
- Some wireless devices may affect the performance of the hearing aids. For any such problems, consult your service provider.

Potentially Explosive Atmospheres

Switch off your device in any area with a potentially explosive atmosphere, and comply with all signs and instructions. Areas that may have potentially explosive atmospheres include the areas where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle engine. Triggering of sparks in such areas could cause an explosion or fire, resulting in bodily injuries or even deaths. Do not switch on the device at refueling points such as service stations.

- Use accessories authorized by manufacturers. Using unauthorized accessories will render the warranty null and void.
- Keep the ambient temperature between 0°C and 45°C while the device is being charged. Keep the ambient temperature between -20°C to 60°C for using the device powered by battery.

Preventing Hearing Damage

Using the receiver, earbuds, headphones, speakerphone, or earpieces at high volume can result in permanent hearing loss. Be extremely careful when listening at high decibel levels.
