

5 Installing the UIM Card and the Battery

Contact the network operator for whether a User Identity Module (UIM) card is needed.

Ensure that the golden contact area on the UIM card is facing downwards and the beveled edge is correctly aligned with the card holder.








6 Charging the Battery

Connect the charger to the charger interface at the lower position of the right side of your phone.



- 2. Connect the charger to an alternating current (AC) power socket.
- 3. When the battery is being charged, the charging icon is displayed in the animated status. When the charging icon becomes static, it indicates that the battery is fully charged.
- 4. Disconnect the charger from the AC power socket.
- 5. Disconnect the charger from the phone.

7 Using the Stylus

- 1. A stylus can be used to tap and drag:
- Tap: to select an item or display a menu by touching the stylus to the screen.
- Drag: to select several characters by touching the stylus to the screen and then moving the stylus.
- 2. When you use the phone for the first time, calibrate the phone screen as follows:
- Select Menu > Settings > Display settings > Screen Calibration.
- Calibrate the screen by tapping the cross marks (+) displayed on the screen in sequence according to the on-screen instructions.

Note

- During the calibration, tap the center of + accurately, to ensure that the phone can respond to your tap and text entry on the screen correctly after the calibration.
- When you edit a text message or other text contents, if the phone does not respond to your handwriting, switch the text input mode to the handwriting mode first.

8 Using the Function Menu

1. In standby mode, press or to display the Menu screen.
screen.
2. Press to scroll to a menu item.
3. Press (Select) or to display the menu.
4. Perform one of the following operations to display a submenu:

- Press to scroll to a submenu, and then press (Select) or to display the submenu.

 Press the number key corresponding to the number of a submenu to display the submenu.
- 5. Press (Back) to return to the previous menu or exit the function menu.
- 6. Press to return to the home screen.

9 Making a Call

- 1. In standby mode, you can
- Tap to access the on-screen numeric keypad.
 Press a number key to access the on-screen numeric keypad.
- Press the number keys on the keypad or tap the number keys on the on-screen numeric keypad to enter the phone number.
- 3. Press or tap to dial the number.
- 4. Press to end the call.

- In standby mode, press **** twice to enter +, three times to enter P, and four times to enter T.
- When the phone is locked, enter the phone lock code to unlock the phone first; otherwise, you can only dial emergency numbers and answer calls.
- In standby mode, press to access All Calls.

- Select a contact from the phonebook and then press to call the contact.
- Select a message from the inbox and then press to call the message sender.

10 Answering a Call

When there is an incoming call, press (Answer), or to answer it; press to reject it.

- When there is an incoming call, you can press to mute the speaker and then press (Reject) again to reject it. If the phone is in the Silent mode, you can just press (Reject) to reject it.
- If the any-key answer function is enabled, press any key (except and to answer the call.
- If the headset auto-answer function is enabled and the headset is connected to the phone, the phone answers the call automatically.
- If the headset is connected to the phone, you can press the button on the headset cable to answer or end the call.

11 Creating and Sending a Text Message

- 1. Select Menu > Messages > SMS > Create Message.
- 2. Enter the text contents
- 3. Add the message recipient(s).
- 4. Press to send the message.

Note

- Your phone supports sending and receiving of long text messages beyond the character limit for a single message. The duration of receiving a complete long message depends on the network condition. When a long message cannot be completely displayed, select and open the long message again until it is completely received.
 - Long text messages can be saved only in the phone memory.
 - Your phone can receive delivery reports. If you select Menu > Messages > SMS > Settings > Send Settings > Delivery Report > Activate, after a message is sent successfully, your phone will receive a delivery report. To deactivate this function, select Menu > Messages > SMS > Settings > Send Settings > Delivery Report > Deactivate.

12 Creating and Sending a Multimedia Message

- 1. Select Menu > Messages > MMS > Create MMS.
- $2. \;\; \text{Edit}$ the message by adding contents to the following fields:

- Recipient: to add the recipient(s) of the message. Up to 20 recipients can be added.
- Subject: to enter the subject of the message.
- Slides: to insert pictures, audio files, video files, and text into a message.
- 3. After you edit the message, select ${\bf Options} > {\bf Send}$ to send the message.

The MMS function is network dependent. If you cannot send or receive multimedia messages, contact your network operator.

13 Receiving a Multimedia Message

After you select Menu > Messages > MMS > Settings > Receive options > Download timing > Manual, you will receive a message notification in the inbox first. In this case, you need to press to read the message notification and then select <math>Options > Receive to receive the multimedia message.

After you select Menu > Messages > MMS > Settings > Receive options > Download timing > Automatic, the phone automatically downloads a multimedia message to the inbox.

14 Viewing a Multimedia Message

Inbox stores the received multimedia messages. To view a multimedia message in the inbox, do as follows:

- $1. \ \ Select\ Menu>Messages>MMS>Inbox.$
- 2. Press to scroll to the desired message.
- 3. Press to view the contents of the message.
- 4. Select **Options** for the following options:

- Open: to open the message.
- Answer: to access the screen for editing a multimedia message and then edit a new multimedia message to reply to the message
- Reply All: to edit a new multimedia message to reply to the message sender and all other message recipients.
- Forward: to forward the message.
- $\bullet \quad Move: \ \ to \ move \ the \ message \ to \ My \ folders \ under \ MMS.$
- Delete: to delete the message.
- Delete All: to delete all the messages in the inbox.
- Sort: to sort the messages in the inbox according to Date or Address.
- Filter View: to list the messages meeting the specified condition that can be Show All, Read, Unread, MMS, Notification, High Priority.

15 Recording an Audio Clip

1. In standby mode, select **Menu** > **Tools** > **Recorder**. 2. Press , or tap or to start recording. 3. Press (Stop) or , or tap or to stop recording. 4. Press , or tap or to play the audio clip. Press to adjust the volume.

All the audio clips are saved in the recorder folder under Menu > My Files > Musics.

16 Listening to the Radio

- 1. In standby mode, tap or select Menu > Radio.
- 2. Select Tuning > Automatic Tuning.
- 3. Press to switch between channels.

Press to adjust the volume.

Note

- After connecting the headset to the phone, you can listen to radio programs through either the headset or the loudspeaker.
- The headset also functions as the antenna. Therefore, during the search for channels, it must be connected to the phone to ensure that channels are found successfully and correctly.
- In the area covered with strong signals, even if the headset is not connected to the phone, you can also listen to radio programs. If you pull part of the stylus out of the phone in this case, the program reception can be better.
- When listening to the radio, you can tap **Hide** to hide the radio screen and play the radio in the background. Then the radio status bar indicating the channel frequency appears on the standby screen. You can tap the status bar to access the radio screen again or tap

 to switch off the radio.

17 Phone Lock

The phone lock protects your phone from unauthorized use. The default phone lock code is **1234**. You can change the code to a string of one to eight digits.

If the phone lock is enabled, you need to enter the correct phone lock code when powering on the phone.

18 PIN and PUK

Contact the network operator for whether a UIM card is needed. The personal identification number (PIN) protects your UIM card from unauthorized use. The PIN unlocking key (PUK) is used to unblock the blocked PIN. Both PIN and PUK are delivered with the UIM card. For details, contact your network operator.

If you enter wrong PINs for a specified number of times consecutively, you need to enter the PUK code to unblock the PIN.

If you enter wrong PUKs for a specified number of times consecutively, the UIM card is invalidated permanently. In this case, contact your network operator for a new card.

19 Locking the Keypad

In standby mode, press and hold #60 or tap to lock the keypad. When the keypad is locked, you can press to answer incoming calls or make emergency calls. (When the phone enters the power-saving mode with the screen backlight off, press or to turn on the screen backlight.)

• You can press and then *+* to unlock the keypad.

• You can also tap **Unlock** and then to unlock the keypad. If the auto-keyguard function is enabled, after the phone is idle for a preset period of time, the keypad is locked automatically.

20 Changing the Text Input Mode

The phone displays the indicator of the current text input mode on the screen. When no letters are selected in the input field, press to change the text input mode. When letters are selected, press #↠to change the letters between lowercase and uppercase. Note • In editing mode, you can switch between keypad input and handwriting input by tapping or • In editing mode, press (Clear) once to delete the letter before the cursor. Press and hold (Clear) to delete all the letters at a time. • In "En" input mode, press O - to enter a space. In "Abc" input mode, press O — once to enter a space, twice to enter 0, and three times to enter a

carriage return.

• In "Abc" input mode, press I = repeatedly to select and enter a commonly used punctuation. In "En" input mode, press I = once to enter a full stop, and twice or three times to enter a smiley.

21 Handwriting Text Input

In handwriting input mode, you can input English characters and numbers by writing on the phone screen with a stylus.

- 1. Write the character or number you want to input in the correct order of strokes.

 Then the candidate characters or numbers are listed on the screen.
- 2. Tap the desired character or number to enter it.

22 Entering English (En)

In "En" input mode, enter English letters as follows:

1. Press each key only once according to the sequence of letters in a

word.

Then the phone displays the commonly used words according to the numeric sequence of key presses.

2. Press to scroll to the desired word.

3. Press $\boxed{\# \hat{\mathbf{a}} \uparrow}$ to switch between uppercase and lowercase.

4. Press O - to enter the word.

Press O - to enter the word followed by a space.

23 Entering English (Abc)

In "Abc" input mode, press the key labeled with the desired letter once to enter the first letter on the key, twice to enter the second letter on the key, and so on.

Note

If the letter you want to enter is on the same key as the previous one, enter the latter after the cursor appears

again or after you press to move the cursor to the next space.

24 Entering Numbers

- In "123" input mode, press the key labeled with the desired number.
- In "Abc" input mode, press the key labeled with the desired number continuously, or press and hold it until the desired number appears on the screen.

In "En" input mode, press the key labeled with the desired number and then press until the desired number appears on the screen.

25 Entering Symbols

- 1. In any input mode, press *+** to display a symbol list.
- 2. Press to move the highlight to the previous or next line.
 3. Press the corresponding number key to enter the symbol.

26 Warnings and Precautions

This section contains important information pertaining to the operating instructions of your device. It also contains information about how to use the device safely. Read this information carefully before using your device.

■ Electronic Device

Power off your device if using the device is prohibited. Do not use the device when using the device causes danger or interference with electronic devices.

■ Medical Device

- Follow rules and regulations set forth by hospitals and health care facilities. Do not use your device when using the device is prohibited.
- Pacemaker manufacturers recommend that a minimum distance of 15 cm be maintained between a device and a pacemaker to prevent potential interference with the pacemaker. If you are using a pacemaker, use the device on the opposite side of the pacemaker and do not carry the device in your front pocket.
- Some wireless devices may affect the performance of hearing aids.

■ Potentially Explosive Atmosphere

Safety of Children
