
1 Getting Started



1. Connect the charger to the phone's charger connector.




- 2. Connect the charger plug to a power outlet.
- 3. The phone starts charging.



2 Call Functions

Making a Call

- 1. In standby mode, press the number keys to enter a phone number.
 - To make an international call, press 💮 to enter the plus sign (+). Then enter the country or region code, area code, and phone number.
 - To call an extension number, enter the switchboard number, press () to enter **P** or press () to enter **T**, and then enter the extension number.



2. Press 💛 to dial the number.

3. Press () to end the call or cancel the dialing.

Note

- If P is entered between the switchboard number and the extension number, the phone will prompt you to call the extension number after the call to the switchboard number is connected.
- If T is entered between the switchboard number and the extension number, the phone automatically dials the extension number after the call to the switchboard number is connected.

• You can also make a call from **Contacts** or **Call Log**.

Answering a Call

When there is an incoming call, press \smile to answer it or 0 to reject it.

- If you have enabled the any key answer function by selecting Menu > Settings > Call > Answer mode > Any key, you can press any key except and to answer a call.
- If the Headset auto-answer function is enabled, when the headset is connected to the phone, the incoming call is answered automatically. To set this function, select Menu > Settings > Call > Headset auto-answer.

3 Text Input

Entering English and Spanish

When you turn **Predictive input** on, your phone supports smart text input methods; otherwise, only traditional text input methods are supported. To turn on or off Predictive input, select **Menu > Settings > Phone > Text input settings > Predictive input**.

Predictive Input Mode

- Based on the sequence of the word, press the key labeled with the desired letter. Then the phone predicts the commonly used words according to the numeric sequence of key presses.
- 2. Select the desired word, and press 🔲 to enter the word.
- 3. Press m to display the symbol list. Then you can select
- and enter a symbol.

Note

The indicator of the current input method is displayed in the upper right corner of the screen. You can press 🍙 to change the input method.

Multi-tap Input Mode

In multi-tap text input mode, press the key labeled with the desired letter to enter the letter on the key.

• Press $\widehat{\mathbb{A}/\mathfrak{g}}$ to switch between uppercase and lowercase.

- Press m to display the symbol list. Then you can select and enter a symbol.
- Press unter a space.

Entering a Number

- In "123" input mode, press the key labeled with your desired number.
- In any text input mode except the "123", press (1) and then press a number key, or press and hold a number key to enter the desired number.

Adding a Contact

- 1. Select Menu > Contacts > Create contact.
- 2. On the edit screen, enter the information about the contact.

- Searching for a Contact
- 1. Select Menu > Contacts.
- Enter the name of the contact in the text box. The phone automatically lists the contacts that comply with the search information you entered.

5 Messaging

- 1. Select Menu > Messages > Create message.
- 2. Enter one or more recipients' numbers directly, or press to access the contact list and then select one or multiple

- recipients.
- 3. Enter text contents in the text box.
- 4. Select **Options** > **Send** to send the message.

6 Email

Before sending or receiving emails, you must create an email account.

Creating an Email Account

When you open the Email application for the first time, create an email account according to the on-screen instructions.

- 1. In standby mode, select **Menu** > **Email**. The phone asks whether you want to create an email account.
- 2. Select Yes.
- 3. From the displayed email server list, select the desired server.
- 4. Set the relevant parameters, and select **Done** to save the email account.
- If you want to create another email account, in standby mode, select Menu > Email > Settings > Account management > Create account.

Note

The parameters for the preset email servers are configured automatically. You only need enter your email address, user name, and password.

Creating and Sending an Email

- 6. In standby mode, select **Menu** > **Email**, then the email
 - account that you want to use to send the email.
- 7. Select Create to create an email.
- 8. Enter the subject, message body, and recipient's email
 - address in the corresponding fields.
- 9. Select **Options** > **Send** to send the email.

7 Multimedia

Camera

1. Select Menu > Multimedia > Camera.

- 2. In the viewfinder screen, press for the camera settings.
- 3. Press 🔲 to take a photo. Your photo is automatically saved to the album of the default storage that you select.

Music Player

Starting the Music Player

To start the music player, select **Menu** > **Multimedia** > **Music Player**.

When you access the music player for the first time, the phone prompts you to set the theme. The options are as follows:

- **Simple**: The information about the current song is displayed together with a waveform.
- Lyrics: The information about the current song is displayed

together with the lyrics of the song.

Adding a Playlist

- 1. Select Menu > Multimedia > Music Player.
- 2. Select Options > Media library > Playlist.
- 3. Select **Create** to create a new playlist. Open the playlist and select **Add** to add songs to the playlist.

Playing music

- When the music is played, you can do the following:
- Press 🔲 to pause or continue playing.
- Press b to play the next song. Press and hold for about 3 seconds to fast-forward the song.
- Press () to play the previous song. Press and hold () for about 3 seconds to rewind the song.
- Press the volume control keys to adjust the volume.
- Select **Options** > **Exit** to exit the music player.

Note

When a song is played, you can press •••• or 0 to minimize the music player screen. In this case, the music player is running in the background.

FM Radio

Note

Before listening to the radio, connect a compatible handset to your phone. The headset cable also functions as the radio's antenna when



the radio is switched on. To ensure good radio reception, do not disconnect the headset from the phone or severely bend the headset cable.

Switching On the FM Radio

Select Menu > Multimedia > FM radio. The radio will turn on tuned to the last channel listened to.

When you listen to the radio for the first time, press (Options) for the following options:

- Automatic tuning: automatically search for available channels and save them to the channel list.
- Manual tuning: manually search for available channels and save them to the channel list.
- Precise tuning: manually adjust the frequency in increments of 0.1 MHz.
- Set frequency: enter a frequency and press •••• to play the program.

Listening to the FM Radio

- When listening to the radio:
- Press 🔲 to switch between the headset and the speaker.
- Press in or in to switch between channels saved in the channel list.
- Press 🔘 or 🕞 to adjust the frequency with a precision of 0.1 MHz.
- Press •••• or 🕐 to return to the standby screen and

the radio continues to play in the background.

- Press the volume control keys to adjust the volume.
- Select **Options** > **Exit** to switch off the radio.

Recorder

1. In standby mode, select Menu > Multimedia > Recorder.

- 2. Press 🔲 to start recording. While recording, you can press 🔲 to pause, and again to resume recording.
- Select **Stop** to stop recording. The phone automatically
- saves the recording to the default folder.
- 4. Press 🔲 to play the recording.

Note

To ensure an optimal audio effect, keep your phone's microphone close to the sound source when recording.

8 Dial-up Internet Access

After connecting your phone to a Windows XP, Windows Vista, or Windows 7-based computer, you can use your phone as a high-speed USB modem.

Before using your phone as a USB modem, check that your phone is powered on, you are in a service area, your UIM card supports this function, and you have subscribed to the data service.

- To use your phone as a USB modem:
- Use a USB cable to connect your phone to a computer, and select **Charge** from the displayed dialog box on your phone screen.
- 2. Check that a USB modem is displayed in the modem list of your computer's device manager application.
- Open the computer's control panel, and follow the new connection wizard's instructions to create a connection.
- 4. Enable the connection, and set up a dial-up connection to access the Internet.

- When setting up the dial-up connection, set the telephone number to #777, and enter your user name and password, for which you can contact your service provider.
- The data service is network-dependent. Before using your phone as a USB modem, contact your service provider for the availability of 17

the data service.

9 Bluetooth

Bluetooth-based Data Transfer

You can exchange data between your Bluetooth phone and other Bluetooth devices. If you want to exchange data between your phone and another device, that device must support Bluetooth and the Bluetooth function must be enabled.

- Select Menu > Settings > Connectivity > Bluetooth to enable the Bluetooth function.
- Select Search for devices to search a Bluetooth device. When a Bluetooth device is found for the first time, authentication is required so the 2 devices are paired.
- After pairing, you can connect to the paired device and exchange data between your phone and the other Bluetooth device.

Using Bluetooth Headset

You can talk by using the Bluetooth headset or Bluetooth loudspeaker. For more information, refer to the user manuals of the relevant devices.

- 4. Open the Bluetooth headset and keep it in the discoverable state.
- Select Menu > Settings > Connectivity > Bluetooth to enable the Bluetooth function.
- 6. Select **Search for devices** to search for a Bluetooth device.

When a Bluetooth device is found for the first time, authentication is required.

10 Security

Keypad Lock

Note 📔

When the keypad is locked, you can still press \smile to answer incoming calls or make emergency calls.

To lock the keypad, press and hold (e) for about 3 seconds in standby mode.

To unlock the keypad, press . , then .

If the **Auto keypad lock** function is enabled, the phone's keypad will automatically lock after being idle in standby mode for a pre-defined period. To set this function, select **Menu** > **Settings > Phone > Auto keypad lock**.

Phone Lock

The phone lock protects your phone from unauthorized use. By default, the phone lock is disabled. To enable or disable the phone lock, select **Menu > Settings > Security > Phone lock**. Once you enable the phone lock, you must enter the password. The default password to unlock your phone is 1234, and it can be changed to any numeric string of one to eight digits in length. To change the password, select **Menu > Settings > Security > Change phone lock code**.

11 Warnings and Precautions

This section contains important information pertaining to the operating instructions of your device. It also contains information about how to use the device safely. Read this information carefully before using your device.

Electronic Device

Power off your device if using the device is prohibited. Do not use the device when using the device causes danger or interference with electronic devices.

Medical Device

- Follow rules and regulations set forth by hospitals and health care facilities. Do not use your device when using the device is prohibited.

Battery and Charger
