Drag > to display an option menu, from which you can:

- Touch to select a capture mode.
- - Touch to select a white balance.
  - Touch 🔯 to set the capture scenario, ISO, and more.
- **7** Touch **4** to toggle between the rear and front cameras.
- 8 Touch 3 to set the flashlight mode.

#### Taking a photo

- 1. On the home screen, touch
- 2. Frame the scene you wish to capture.
- 3. Touch and hold until the viewfinder frame color changes, which indicates that the camera is focused.
- 4. Release your finger to take the photo.

#### Shooting a video

- 1. On the home screen, touch
- 2. Frame the scene you wish to record.
- 3. Touch to start recording.
- Touch to stop recording.

#### Taking a panoramic photo

Are you still upset that your camera's view angle is not big enough to include the entire beautiful scene into one photo? Well, problem solved! Your phone's **Panorama** mode lets you take several photos and stitch them into a single photo.

- 1. On the home screen, touch
- 2. Drag > to open the settings menu. Then touch [ > Panorama.

- 3. Frame the scene you wish to capture.
- 4. Touch O.
- 5. Move your phone slowly to capture the view along the direction indicated by the arrow.

Your phone will capture multiple photos.

- If the viewfinder turns red, the view will not be captured. This may happen because you have moved your phone too fast or the viewfinder scope exceeds the limit of the panoramic view.
- 6. Your phone stops shooting when it has taken enough photos for a panoramic photo. You can also touch to stop shooting.
  Your phone then automatically stitch the photos into a panoramic photo.

## Gallery

**Gallery** is your personal treasure box of sweet memories.

Viewing photos or videos

In your **Gallery**, photos and videos are stored in separate albums.

- 1. On the home screen, touch
- 2. Touch the album you wish to view.
- 3. Touch the photo or video to view it in full screen mode.
- When viewing a photo, pinch two fingers together to zoom out or spread them apart to zoom in.

#### Playing a slideshow

- 2. Touch the album that stores the phones you wish to play.
- 3. Touch let o play photos in the album as a slideshow.
- 4. Touch the screen to stop the slideshow.

#### Editing a photo

You can remove red eye, crop a photo, and apply a number of effects to make your photos even more stunning.

- 1. On the home screen, touch
- 2. Touch the photo you wish to edit.
- 3. Touch = > Edit and then you can:
  - Touch \_\_\_ to lighten or shadow the photo.
  - Touch FX to cross-process or posterize the photo.
  - Touch **&** to tint the photo, make it negative.
  - Touch in to rotate or crop the photo.
- When you are done, touch SAVE.
   By default, edited photos are saved to DCIM/Camera.

#### Rotating a photo

- 1. On the home screen, touch
- 2. Touch the photo you wish to rotate.
- 3. Touch = > Rotate Left or Rotate Right.
- You can also enable the auto-rotate screen function to have your phone automatically adjust the display orientation when you rotate your phone.

#### Cropping a photo

  - Drag the grid to reposition it.
  - Drag the frames of the grid to resize it.

By default, cropped photos are saved to **DCIM/Camera**.

#### Sharing a photo or video

- 3. Touch <.
- 4. Select a sharing method and follow the onscreen instructions to share the photo or video.

#### Setting the wallpaper

- 1. On the home screen, touch
- 2. Choose the photo you wish to set as the wallpaper.
- 3. Touch = > Set picture as > Wallpaper.
- 4. Drag the frames of the grid to resize it.
- 5. When you are done, touch **SAVE**.

#### Music



- · Download songs from the web.

- · Copy songs from other devices using Wi-Fi.

#### Listening to music

- When a song is playing, touch to exit the playback screen and have the song still be played. To return to the music playback screen, open the notification panel and touch the playing song.

#### Creating a playlist

Creating playlists and adding songs to them let you listen to songs that fit your mood most.

- 3. Touch the text field to name the playlist.
- When you are done, touch Save.
   You can now add songs to the playlist.
- 5. In the displayed dialog box, touch **OK**.
- 6. Select the songs you want.
- 7. When you are done, touch **Done**.

#### Playing a playlist

You can share your favorite songs with your family and friends using email, Bluetooth, and more.

- 3. Touch and hold the song you wish to share.
- 4. From the displayed option menu, choose **Share**.
- 5. Select a sharing method and follow the onscreen instructions to share the song.

#### Setting a song as the ringtone

Want to hear your favorite song whenever you receive an incoming call? Simply set the song as your ringtone.

- 1. On the home screen, touch <a> </a>.
- 2. Choose a category.
- 3. Touch and hold the song you wish to set as the ringtone.
- 4. From the displayed option menu, choose **Set as ringtone**.

## Internet connection

#### Mobile data connection

After you insert a SIM card into your phone and power it on for the first time, your phone automatically registers with your service provider's data services.

#### Enabling data services

- 1. On the home screen, flick down from the status bar to open the notification panel.
- 2. Touch to enable your phone's data services.
- When you don't need to access the Internet, disable data services to save battery power and reduce data usage.

#### Wi-Fi network

When you use your phone at home, you can connect to the Wi-Fi hotspot created from your router. Some public places, such as hotels and libraries, may also have available Wi-Fi networks. Though, please bear in mind that these may not be free to use.

#### Connecting to a Wi-Fi network

- 1. On the home screen, touch and then the All tab.
- In the WIRELESS & NETWORKS area, touch the Wi-Fi switch to turn on Wi-Fi.
- In the WIRELESS & NETWORKS area, touch Wi-Fi.
   Your phone then scans for available Wi-Fi networks and displays them if any.
- Choose the Wi-Fi network you wish to access and touch Connect.
   For an encrypted Wi-Fi network, enter the password when prompted.
- If Wi-Fi and mobile data are both enabled, your phone connects to the Wi-Fi network preferentially. When Wi-Fi becomes unavailable, your

phone automatically switches to the mobile data connection.

## Sharing your phone's mobile data connection

Want to access the Internet from multiple devices when you are on the go? Use USB tethering or set your phone as a Wi-Fi hotspot to share its data connection with other devices.

#### USB tethering

You can share your phone's data connection with a computer using USB.

To use USB tethering, you may need to install your phone's driver on the computer, depending on your computer's operating system.

- 1. Use a USB cable to connect your phone to the computer.
- 2. On the home screen, touch and then the All tab.
- 3. In the WIRELESS & NETWORKS area, touch More....
- 4. Touch Tethering & portable hotspot.
- Select the **USB tethering** check box to share your phone's data connection
- You cannot use your phone's USB tethering function while the phone is in USB storage mode.

#### Using your phone as a Wi-Fi hotspot

Your phone can also function as a Wi-Fi hotspot for other devices, such as your computer.

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🔯 and then the All tab.
- 2. In the WIRELESS & NETWORKS area, touch More....
- 3. Touch **Tethering & portable hotspot** > **Configure Wi-Fi hotspot**.
- 4. Name the Wi-Fi hotspot.
- 5. Select an encryption mode.
- lt is recommended that you set the encryption mode to WPA2PSK to

better secure the Wi-Fi network.

6. Set the key to the Wi-Fi hotspot.


When other devices want to access your phone's network, this key must be entered.

- 7. Select the **Portable Wi-Fi hotspot** check box.
- 8. You can now search for and access your phone's Wi-Fi network from other devices.

## Controlling your data usage


Your phone's data usage control function lets you check and control your data usage. Set a data usage cycle and the mobile data limit for a period of time and you will be notified when your data usage reaches this limit. You can also query the data usage within a certain period of time or data usage consumed by an application.

On the home screen, touch > All. In the WIRELESS & NETWORKS area, touch More... > Data usage to configure your data usage settings.





Turns the mobile data connection on or off. To configure data control and query data usage, the mobile data connection must be turned on.



On the **Data usage** screen, touch **=** to open an option menu, from which you can:

- Turn data roaming on or off.
- · Prevent background mobile data traffic.
- Turn automatic data synchronization on or off.
- Select the Show Wi-Fi usage check box. The Wi-Fi tab page will appear on the data usage screen. Touch the tab to view Wi-Fi data usage.
- Touch Mobile hotspots and select the Wi-Fi networks that are mobile hotspots to prevent applications from accessing these networks in the background. If an application is downloading a large file using these networks, you will be notified.

## Sharing data

#### Bluetooth

Your phone is Bluetooth-capable, allowing you to connect to other Bluetooth-enabled devices for wireless data transmission. When you use Bluetooth, stay within 10 meters (33 feet) of other Bluetooth devices.

#### Turning on Bluetooth

- 1. On the home screen, touch and then the All tab.
- 2. In the WIRELESS & NETWORKS area, touch Bluetooth.

When Bluetooth is turned on, your phone's name is displayed at the top of the **Bluetooth** screen. Touch the name to set whether your phone is visible to other Bluetooth devices.

To rename your phone, touch = > Rename phone. When you are done, touch Rename to save the changes.

#### Searching for and pairing with other Bluetooth devices

To exchange data with another Bluetooth device, enable Bluetooth on both devices and pair them with each other.

- 1. On the home screen, touch and then the All tab.
- 2. In the **WIRELESS & NETWORKS** area, touch **Bluetooth**.

Your phone then scans for Bluetooth devices in range.

3. From the list of detected Bluetooth devices, touch a device and follow the onscreen instructions to pair with it.

To disconnect from other Bluetooth devices, in the **Paired devices** area, touch **②** > **Unpair**.

Certain Bluetooth devices may not be compatible with each other.

#### Transferring files using Bluetooth

Bluetooth enables you to conveniently send photos, videos, and other files to your family and friends. You can share files with Bluetooth-enabled devices directly without an Internet connection.

- 2. Touch and hold the file you wish to send.
- 3. From the displayed option menu, choose **Share** > **Bluetooth**.
- 4. From the detected Bluetooth device list, select a device.

#### Receiving files using Bluetooth

- When your phone receives a file transmission request, open the notification panel.
- 2. Touch Bluetooth share: Incoming file.
- 3. Touch **Accept** to start receiving the file.

When the file is received, your phone displays a notification of the success. Open the notification panel to read the notification. By default, received files are saved to the **bluetooth** folder.

#### DLNA

The Digital Living Network Alliance (DLNA) aims to implement intercommunication between computers and other electronic products through wired and wireless networks, providing users with seamless digital media services. DLNA enables users on the same Wi-Fi network to share multimedia files easily. Using DLNA, you can:

- Share multimedia files with your friends.
- · Access multimedia files on other DLNA devices.
- Play multimedia files on other devices and control the playback.
- Before you use DLNA, ensure that your phone and other DLNA devices have connected to the same Wi-Fi network and DLNA is enabled on all devices.

On the home screen, touch to display the DLNA screen. You can then share photos, videos, and songs with other DLNA devices, as well as view and download the multimedia files shared by other DLNA devices.

## Connecting your phone to a computer

When you connect your phone to a computer using a USB cable, select a USB connection type when prompted.

Media device (MTP)	Send multimedia files, such as photos, songs, and videos, between your phone and the computer.
Camera (PTP)	Export photos from your phone to the computer.
USB mass storage	Use your phone as a mass storage device.

## File Manager

**File Manager** helps you manage files and applications in your phone's internal storage and microSD card. You can view, create, edit, delete, move, archive, compress, and decompress files.

### Creating a folder

You can create folders to better manage files stored in your phone's internal memory and microSD card.

- 2. Select where you wish to create the folder, namely, **Internal** or **SD card**.
- 3. Touch = > New folder.
- 4. In the displayed dialog box, name the new folder.
- 5. Touch Save.

## Searching for a file

Too many files stressing you out? The search function helps you find what you need in no time.

- 2. Select where you wish to search, namely, Internal or SD card.
- 3. Touch **=** > **Search** to enter part or all of the file name.
- 4. Touch  $\c Q$  in the lower right corner of the keyboard.

## Copying or moving a file

- 1. On the home screen, touch
- 2. Touch and hold the file you wish to copy or cut.
- 3. From the displayed option menu, choose **Copy** or **Cut**.
- 4. Select where you wish to paste the file.

#### 5. Touch Paste.

## Compressing or decompressing files

You can compress files into .zip files to save space or decompress .zip and .rar files.

- 2. Touch and hold the file or folder you wish to compress.
- 3. From the displayed option menu, choose **Compress**.
- 4. Select the save path of the compressed file and name the file.
- 5. Touch OK.

To decompress a file, touch and hold it and choose **Extract** from the displayed option menu.

## Renaming a file

- 1. On the home screen, touch = .
- 2. Touch and hold the file you wish to rename.
- 3. From the displayed option menu, choose **Rename**.
- 4. In the displayed dialog box, enter a new name for the file.
- 5. When you are done, touch **OK**.

## Deleting a file

- 1. On the home screen, touch = .
- 2. Touch and hold the file you wish to delete.
- 3. From the displayed option menu, choose **Delete**.
- 4. Touch OK.

## Creating a shortcut for a file or folder

- 2. Touch and hold the file or folder you want to create a shortcut for.
- 3. From the displayed option menu, choose **Desktop shortcuts**.

## Checking the memory status

Before you put large files into your phone's internal storage or microSD card, make sure that there is enough memory.

- 2. Touch = > Storage.
- 3. On the **Storage settings** screen, view the total and available memory in your phone and microSD card.

## Managing applications

## **Obtaining applications**

Want to discover a rich collection of applications and try out the hottest games? You can either download applications from an application store, or connect your phone to a computer and copy downloaded applications from the computer.

## Installing an application

- It is recommended that you download applications from Play Store, because some third-party applications may not be compatible with your phone.
- 1. On the home screen, touch 👔 .
- 2. Select the application you wish to install.
- 3. Touch = > Install.
- 4 Touch **Done**
- During the installation, a **Install blocked** message may be displayed. Read the message carefully. If you want to continue with the installation, touch then **All** > **Security**, and select the **Unknown sources** check box to allow installation of third-party applications. Then touch to proceed.

## Viewing applications

You can view applications installed on your phone.

- 1. On the home screen, touch and then the All tab.
- 2. In the Apps area, touch Manage apps.
- 3. Flick to ALL.
- 4. Select the application you wish to view.

## Uninstalling an application

You can uninstall unwanted applications to increase your phone's available memory.

- 1. On the home screen, touch and then the All tab.
- 2. In the Apps area, touch Manage apps.
- 3. Flick to ALL.
- 4. Select the application you wish to uninstall.
- 5. Touch Uninstall > OK.
- Some pre-installed applications can't be uninstalled.

## Clearing the application cache

You can clear the application cache to free up some phone memory.

- 1. On the home screen, touch and then the All tab.
- 2. In the Apps area, touch Manage apps.
- 3. Flick to ALL.
- 4. Touch Clear cache.

## Google services

To use Google services, you must sign in to a Google account. If you don't have one, open a Google application and follow the onscreen instructions to create your Google account.



Google applications, services, and functions vary by country and service provider. Please follow local laws and regulations when you use Google services.

#### **Gmail**

Gmail is an email service provided by Google. When you first use Gmail, emails on your web account will be synchronized to your phone.

#### Sending emails

- On the home screen, touch to enter you mailbox. If you have more than one Gmail accounts, select the one you wish to use.
- 2. Touch
- 3. Enter the recipients and subject. Compose your message.
- 4. When you are done, touch .

#### Checking your emails

- 1. On the home screen, touch Mark to enter you mailbox. If you have more than one Gmail accounts, select the one you wish to use.
- 2. From the email list, select the email you wish to read.
  - Touch **\( \strice{1} \)** to reply to the sender.
  - Touch > Reply all to reply to all.
  - Touch > Forward to forward the email.

## Google Talk

Google Talk is an instant chat application provided by Google. With Google Talk, you can reach your friends using messages, or voice and video chats.

#### Adding a friend

- 2. Touch 🖳 .
- 3. Enter the email address of the person you wish to add.
- 4. Touch  $\checkmark$ .

If the recipient accepts your invitation, he or she will appear in your friend list.

#### Starting a conversation

- 2. From your friend list, touch the one you wish to talk to.
- 3. Type what you wish to say.
- 4. When you are done, touch .

## Maps

Google Maps helps you find out where you are, shows you how to get to a destination, and displays real-time traffic. You can also have a satellite view of your current location or other places and check their traffic maps.

#### Turning on location services

Before you use Maps to search for a location, turn on your location services.

- 1. On the home screen, touch and then the All tab.
- Touch Location services.
- Select the GPS satellites check box.

#### Searching for places of interest

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🛂 .
- 2. Touch Q
- 3. Enter the location you wish to search for.
- 4. Touch Q.

The search results are marked on the map by letters.

5. Touch a mark to see how to get there and view more details

#### Checking how to get to a place

- 1. When you browse a map, touch r.
- 2. Touch the first text box to enter the start point. Then, touch the second text box to enter the destination.
- 3. Select a transportation method: by car, public transportation, or foot.
- 4 Touch **GET DIRECTIONS**

Available routes are then shown in a list.

- 5. Touch the route you prefer to display it on the map.
- 6. To start a new search, touch = > Clear Map to clear the search results.

#### YouTube

As a free online streaming media service provided by Google, YouTube lets you conveniently search for, watch, and upload videos.

#### Searching for a video

- 1. On the home screen, touch 👛 .
- 2. Touch Q.
- 3. Enter keywords.
- 4. Touch  $\c Q$  in the lower right corner of the keyboard.
- 5. From the search results, touch a video.

#### Sharing a video

From the video list, select the video you wish to share. Then, touch < to share it with your family and friends in a number of ways, for example, Bluetooth and email.

## **Play Store**

Play Store is application market provided by Google, where you can download applications, games, and view and update downloaded content.

#### Installing an application

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🐷 .
- 2. Find the desired application.
- 3. Follow the onscreen instructions to download and install it.

#### Uninstalling an application

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🕟 .
- 2. Touch  $\equiv$  > My Apps.
- 3. From the application list, touch the application you wish to uninstall.
- 4. Touch **Uninstall** > **OK** to uninstall the application.

## Basic utilities

Your phone comes with a variety of useful applications, such as Calendar, Clock, and Calculator, helping you keep yourself organized.

#### Calendar

Always forgetting birthdays and other important events? Problem solved! **Calendar** on your phone is a personal assistant that helps you keep track of all your important dates. You will never miss another anniversary, meeting, or appointment again.

#### Creating an event

- 1. On the home screen, touch 28.
- 2. Touch = > New event.
- 3. Enter event details, such as the event name, time, and location.
- 4. Touch 🗸 .
- You can also touch any date on the calendar to create an event.

#### Viewing calendar events

Add calendar events to your phone and set reminders for them. You don't need to worry about forgetting important appointments any more.

- Touch the time in the upper left corner to switch between day, week, month, agenda views.

Your calendar events are displayed in the agenda view, which lets you know your daily schedule at a glance.

**Weather** lets you check the date and time at cities around the world, get the latest weather information in any cities, and share the information with your family and friends.

Before you use **Weather**, turn on your phone's GPS and data services.



- 3 Touch **◄))** to enable or disable the speaker.
- 4 Touch to go to the next station.
- **5** Touch ★ to display the station list.
- 6 Touch **(b)** to turn the FM radio on or off.

# Accounts and synchronization

You can synchronize data on your phone, such as contacts, emails, and events, to and from the web.

## Adding an account

- 1. On the home screen, touch and then the All tab.
- 2. In the ACCOUNTS area, touch Add account.
- 3. Select an account type.
- 4. Follow the onscreen instructions to enter your account information.
- 5. Configure the account and set the type of data you wish to synchronize. When an account is set up, it appears in the **ACCOUNTS** area.
- The types of data you can set to synchronize to your phone vary by account type.

## **Deleting an account**

- 2. In the **ACCOUNTS** area, select an account type.
- 3. Select the account you wish to delete.
- 4. Touch = > Remove account.
- 5. In the displayed dialog box, touch **Remove account**.

## Turning on data synchronization

- 1. On the home screen, touch and then the All tab.
- 2. In the **ACCOUNTS** area, select an account type.
- 3. Select the account you wish to synchronize.

4. Touch Sync email to turn on data synchronization.



You can touch = > Sync now to have the account synchronize data from the web in the background.

## Modifying account synchronization settings

- 1. On the home screen, touch and then the All tab.
- 2. In the **ACCOUNTS** area, select an account type.
- 3. Select the account whose synchronization settings you wish to modify. The **Sync settings** area displays data you can synchronize.
- 4. Select the data you wish to synchronize.

## Turning on or off airplane mode

Your phone's signal reception or transmission may interfere with an airplane's flight system. Power off your phone or switch to airplane mode as required when you are on a flight.

  - Touch Phone ringtone to select a ringtone.
  - Touch Notification ringtone to select a tone for a new message, new email, upcoming event, and more.

  - Touch System to turn the notification tone or vibration on or off when you touch or lock the screen, take a screenshot, dial a number, and more.
- To adjust the volume, you can press the volume buttons from the home

screen or most application screens (for example, the call, music, and video playback screens).

## Display settings
