

2 Getting Started

Installing the SIM Card and the Battery

When installing a SIM card, ensure that the golden contact area on the SIM card is facing downward and that the beveled edge of the SIM card is properly aligned with that of the SIM card slot.

The left slot is for SIM card 2 and the right slot is for SIM card $1. \ \ \,$



Removing the Battery and the SIM Card

Before removing the battery and the SIM card, ensure that your phone is powered off.




Installing a microSD Card



Before installing or removing a microSD card, power off the phone. After the phone is powered on, it will indicate whether the microSD card has been installed properly.

You can install a microSD card to expand the memory capacity of your phone. When inserting the microSD card, ensure that the golden contact area on the microSD card is facing downward.





Charging the Battery

To charge the battery, do the following:

- Connect the smaller end of the USB cable to the charger jack on the phone and the larger end to the charger.
- 2. Connect the charger to a power socket.
- Wait until the battery is fully charged. During charging, an animated charging icon is displayed. When the charging icon is static, the battery is fully charged.
- 4. Disconnect the charger from the power socket, and then from the phone.

Customizing the Home Screen

Your phone has three home screens. After adding widgets to the home screens, you can access these widgets in standby mode.

To switch between home screens, do the following: In standby mode, slide your finger horizontally across the screen to go to the left or right screen.

To add widgets to the home screen, do the following:

- 1. In standby mode, tap \oplus to open the widget menu.
- Touch and hold the desired widget, and drag it to the home screen.
- Tap to close the widget menu.

To reposition widgets on the home screen, do the following:

Touch and hold the icon of the widget you want to reposition, and drag it to the desired position on the screen.

To remove a widget from the home screen, do the following:

- 1. In standby mode, tap 🕙 to open the widget menu.
- On the home screen, touch and hold the icon of the widget you want to remove, and drag it to the widget menu.
- 3. Tap to close the widget menu.

access the submenu.

Working with the Main Menu

To work with the main menu, do the following:

- 1. In standby mode, tap $\ensuremath{\boxplus}$ to access the main menu.
- Slide your finger horizontally across the screen to go to the next or previous screen, and then tap the desired submenu to access it; or press or to scroll to the desired submenu, and then press to
- Slide your finger vertically across the screen to scroll through options, and then tap the desired option to

access it; or press or to scroll to an option, and then tap **OK** or press to access the option.

4. Tap **Back** to return to the previous menu. To return to the standby mode, press .

Accessing a Shortcut Menu

To access a shortcut menu, do the following:

In standby mode, tap $\stackrel{\bullet}{\smile}$ to open the onscreen keypad, $\stackrel{\frown}{\smile}$ to access the **Messaging** screen, and $\stackrel{\bullet}{\blacksquare}$ to access the **Phonehook** screen.

Phone Lock

The phone lock protects your phone from unauthorized use. By default, the phone lock is disabled. After the phone lock is enabled, the phone requests the phone code each time it is powered on.

To enable the phone lock, do the following:

- 1. Tap

 → Settings > Security settings > Phone lock.
- Tap the text box to open the onscreen keypad, enter the phone code, tap and then **OK**.

You can change the default phone code (**1234**) to any numeric string of four to eight digits.

To change the phone code, do the following:

- Tap > Settings > Security settings > Change password > Phone password.
- 2. Enter the old phone code, tap \blacksquare and then **OK**.
- 3. Enter the new phone code, tap 🛂 and then **OK**.
- 4. Enter the new phone code again to confirm it.

If you forget the phone code, contact your service provider.

Mass Storage

When the phone is connected to a PC through a USB cable, the option **Mass storage** is displayed on the phone screen.

If you select **Mass storage**, you can manage the files stored in the phone memory and on the microSD card.

The microSD card and the phone memory are displayed as removable disks on the PC. You can perform the following operations:

- · Double-click a disk to open it.
- · Copy, paste, or delete files on the disk.
 - Disconnect the phone from the PC.
- Щ
- Ensure that you connect and disconnect the USB cable properly.
- Do not run the formatting command on the PC to format the phone memory; doing so may damage the phone memory permanently.
- You can transfer data and charge the battery by connecting the phone to the PC through the USB cable.

PIN and PUK

The personal identification number (PIN) protects your SIM card from unauthorized use. The PIN unblocking key (PUK) unlocks the blocked PIN. Both the PIN and the PUK are provided with the SIM card. For details, contact your service provider.

 Tap > Settings > Security settings > SIM1 security settings/SIM2 security settings > SIM1 lock/SIM2 lock.
2. Enter the PIN, tap and then OK . If you enter incorrect PINs for a specified number of times consecutively, the phone prompts you to enter the PUK. If you enter incorrect PUKs for a specified number of times consecutively, the SIM card becomes permanently invalid. In this case, contact your service provider for a new SIM card.
Locking the Keypad
To lock the keypad, press in standby mode. To unlock the keypad, press any key to turn on the backlight, and then slide to the right. If the auto keypad lock function is enabled and the phone is in standby mode for a preset period, the phone locks the keypad automatically.
To enable the auto keypad lock function, tap \$\bigsep\$ > Settings > Security settings > Auto keypad lock, and then select the desired preset duration. When the keypad is locked, you can press to answer a call or make an emergency call.

To enable the PIN lock, do the following:

3 Voice Services

Making a Call

To make a call, do the following:

- In standby mode, tap to open the onscreen keypad.
- 2. Enter the phone number.
- To make an international call, tap * key twice to enter the plus sign (+), and then enter the country or region code, area code, and phone number in sequence.
- To call an extension, enter the phone number, tap
 three times to enter P, or four times to enter
 and then enter the extension number.
- 3. Press to dial the number.

In the dual-SIM card mode, tap to use the SIM1 network to make a call, or tap to use the SIM2 network to make a call.

- 4. Press to end the call.
- You can also make calls from the call history, phonebook, and messages.
 - During a call, you can press or to adjust the in-call volume.

Handling Incoming Calls

When there is an incoming call, do the following:

- Press or tap Answer to answer the call.
- Tap **Option** and select **Answer** to answer the call.
- Press or tap Reject to reject the call.
- Tap Silent to mute the speaker.

If the any key answer function is enabled, you can press

any key except \square , \parallel , and \parallel to answer a call.

To enable the any key function, do the following:

- 2. Select the desired profile except Silent.
- Tap Options > Customize > Answer mode.
- 4. Tap **On** and then **Done**.

4 Text Input

Changing the Text Input Mode

The indicator of the current text input mode is displayed on the top of the screen. You can tap on the onscreen keyboard to select the text input mode.

- Tap to close the keyboard and tap the text box to open the keyboard.
 - Tap ance to delete the last entered character.
 You can also touch and hold to clear all the entered characters at a time.
 - Tap 🚟 or 🌃 to switch between the keypad and the QWERTY keyboard.

Multi-Tap Input Mode

In multi-tap input mode, do as follows to enter letters:

- When the onscreen keyboard is a keypad, tap a key once to enter the first letter labeled on that key, twice to enter the second letter, and so on.
- When the onscreen keyboard is a QWERTY keyboard, tap the desired letter key.

- Tap or to switch between uppercase and lowercase.
 - When the onscreen keyboard is a keypad, tap to open the numeric keyboard, tap to open the symbol keyboard, and tap once to enter a space or tap twice to enter 0.
 - When the onscreen keyboard is a QWERTY keyboard, tap to open the numeric and symbol keyboard, tap to start a new paragraph, or tap to enter a space.
 - Tap or to go back to the keypad or the QWERTY keyboard.

Predictive Input Mode

In predictive input mode, when the onscreen keyboard is a keypad, do as follows to enter a word:

- Tap each key once according to the spelling sequence of the desired word.
 - The phone displays the commonly used words according to the sequence of key taps.
- Tap or ▶ to scroll left or right.
- 3. Tap the desired word.
 - In predictive input mode, if the onscreen keyboard is a QWERTY keyboard, predictive input is not supported.

Entering Digits

- In number input mode, tap the desired number key.
- In multi-tap input mode, when the onscreen keyboard is a keypad, tap the number key labeled

with the desired digit consecutively until the digit appears on the screen.

Entering Symbols

When the onscreen keyboard is a keypad, do as follows to enter symbols:

- 1. Tap to open the symbol keyboard.
- Tap or to scroll up or down.
- 3. To enter symbols, do the following:
- · To enter only one symbol, tap the desired symbol.
- To enter multiple symbols, tap to change the icon to a, and then tap the desired symbols.

When the onscreen keyboard is a QWERTY keyboard , do as follows to enter symbols:

- Tap as or to open the symbol keyboard.
- 2. Tap the desired symbol.

5 Messaging

Writing and Sending a Text Message

To write and send a text message, do the following:

- Tap □ > Messaging > Write message; or in standby mode, tap □ and select Write message.
- 2. Write the message.
- 3. Tap , Options, and then Send to.

- Tap Enter recipient and enter the phone number of a recipient; or tap Add from Phonebook and add a recipient from the phonebook.
 To add multiple recipients, repeat this step.
- Press or tap **Options**, and then select one of the following options:
- Send: to send the message to the recipient.
- Edit recipient: to edit the recipient.
- Remove recipient: to remove the recipient.
- Remove all recipients: to remove all recipients.
- Save: to save the message to Drafts and exit the Write message screen.

Writing and Sending a Multimedia Message

To write and send a multimedia message, do the following:

- Tap □ > Messaging > Write message; or in standby mode, tap □ and select Write message.
- 2. Write the message.
- 3. Tap and then **Options** to select one of the following options:
- Add picture: to add a picture to the message.
- · Add sound: to add an audio clip to the message.
- Add video: to add a video clip to the message.
- Add subject: to add a subject to the message.
- Slide options: to add a slide to the message, set the playing interval between two slides and so on.

- Switch to MMS: to change from a text message to a multimedia message. If you select Add picture, Add sound, Add video, or Add subject, the message automatically changes from a text message to a multimedia message.
- 4. On the **Write message** screen, press or tap Options, and select Send to.
- 5. Tap Enter recipient and enter the phone number of a recipient; or tap Add from Phonebook and add a recipient from the phonebook.

To add multiple recipients, repeat this step.

- 6. Scroll to the desired recipient, press or tap Options, and select one of the following options:
- **Send**: to send the message to the recipient.
- Send options: to set the send options.
- **Edit recipient**: to edit the recipient.
- · Remove recipient: to remove the recipient.
- Remove all recipients: to remove all recipients.
- Change to Cc: to copy the message to the recipient.
- Change to Bcc: to blind copy the message to the recipient.
- · Save to Drafts: to save the message to Drafts and exit the Write message screen.

- For the availability of the Multimedia Messaging Service (MMS) and the method for subscribing to the service, please contact your service provider.
 - Your phone supports a multimedia message with a maximum size of 300 KB.
 - Open multimedia messages with caution. Objects in multimedia messages may contain viruses (such as malicious software) that can damage your phone.
 - You can configure the network settings provided by the service provider in Profiles. To access Profiles, tap > Messaging > Message settings > Multimedia message > Profiles. Tap Add new and configure Profile name, MMSC address, Data account, Connection type, User name and Password.
 - By default, messages are stored in the phone memory.

6 Email (Optional)

Before sending or receiving emails, you must create and activate an email account.

Creating an Email Account

To create an email account, do the following:

1. Tap 🖽 > Email > Email accounts.

- Tap Options and select New account.
- 3. Tap Yes to start to create an account.
- Tap the desired type.
- Set the relevant parameters and save the email account.

Activating an Email Account

To active an email account, do the following:

- 1. Tap 🖽 > Email > Email accounts.
- 2. Tap the desired email account to activate it.

Writing and Sending an Email

To write and send an email, do the following:

- 1. Tap B > Email > Write Email.
- Tap To, Cc, or Bcc to add the email address of a recipient.
- Tap Subject to edit the email subject.
- 4. Tap **Attachments** to add an attachment.
- Set the email Priority.
- Tap the text box to edit the text content of the email.
- After editing, tap **Done**, and select one of the following options:
- · Send: to send the email.
- Send and save: to send and save the email.
- Save to Drafts: to save into Drafts and exit the editor screen.
- Quit without saving: to exit the email editor screen without saving the email.

7 Voice Mail

Adding or Changing a Voicemail Number

To add a voicemail number or change the existing voicemail number, do the following:

- 1. Tap Voice Mail > SIM1 Voice Mail/SIM2 Voice Mail.
- 2. Tap Options > Edit.
- 3. Edit the voicemail name and number.
- Tap **OK** and then **Yes** to save the setting.

To dial the existing voicemail number, do the following:

- Tap the voicemail number, or tap Options > Call voicemail.
- You can also tap in standby mode, and then touch and hold to dial the voicemail number.

8 Phonebook

Creating a Contact

To create a contact, do the following:

- 1. Tap \square > **Phonebook**; or in standby mode, tap \square .
- 2. Tap Options > Add new contact.
- Select To SIM1, To SIM2 or To phone to save the contact.
- 4. Enter the contact information and save the contact as follows:
- For the contact saved to SIM1 or SIM2, enter Name and Number, tap , OK, and then Yes to save the contact.
- For the contact saved to phone, enter Name, Number, Home number, Company name and Office number as required, set Caller picture and Caller ringtone, tap Options > Done, and then tap Yes to save the contact.

Searching for a Contact

- 1. Tap \square > **Phonebook**; or in standby mode, tap \square .
- 2. Enter the first letter of the contact name in the text box.
- 3. Press or to scroll to the desired contact.

Setting the Preferred Storage

To select the storage where you want to save new contacts, do the following:

- 1. Tap \blacksquare > **Phonebook**; or in standby mode, tap \blacksquare .
- Tap Options and select Phonebook settings > Preferred storage.
- Scroll to SIM1, SIM2, Phone, or All as desired.
- 4. Tap \mathbf{OK} to select the preferred storage.

Copying Contacts

You can copy contacts to the phone, the SIM card, or a file.

Copying One Contact

To copy one contact, do the following:

- 1. Tap \square > **Phonebook**; or in standby mode, tap \square .
- 2. Enter the first letter of the contact name in the text box.
- 3. Press or to scroll to the desired contact.
- 4. Tap Options and select Copy.
- Select To phone, To SIM1,To SIM2, or To file to copy the contact to the desired location.

Copying Multiple Contacts

To copy multiple contacts, do the following:

1. Tap \square > **Phonebook**; or in standby mode, tap \square .

- Tap Options and select Phonebook settings > Copy contacts.
- Tap the desired option, such as SIM1 to phone or Phone to SIM1.
- Tap the desired contacts to mark them, and then tap Options > Copy marked.
- 5. Tap Yes to copy contacts to the desired location.

Contact Group

You can create a contact group, such as **Family**, **Friend**, or **Colleague**, and then add relevant contacts to the group. The members in the group have some common features, such as **Caller ringtone** and **Caller picture**.

To create a contact group, do the following:

- Tap > Phonebook; or in standby mode, tap
 Tap Options and select Caller groups > Add new
- group.
- Set Group name, Caller ringtone, and Caller picture, and then tap Done.
- Tap **Yes** to save the contact group.

To add contacts to a contact group, do the following:

- 1. Tap \blacksquare > **Phonebook**; or in standby mode, tap \blacksquare .
- 2. Tap ${\bf Options}$ and select ${\bf Caller\ groups}.$
- Scroll to the contact group, tap **Options** and select **View numbers**.
- Tap Add and select the desired contacts from Phonebook.
- 5. Tap Add to add them to the contact group.

9 Multimedia

Camera

The phone features a built-in complementary metal-oxide-semiconductor (CMOS) camera.

- 1. Tap \square > Camera to access Camera.
- 2. On the picture taking screen, do the following:
- Tap to view photos or configure relevant settings.
- Tap or loadjust the exposure value.
- Tap to zoom in or to zoom out.
- Tap icons such as , , , , , , , and to configure the corresponding settings.
- 3. Focus the camera on the scene and press or tap to take a picture.
- Tap Back to save the picture. You can take another picture or tap Options and select Delete to delete the picture.

Video Recorder

To record a video clip, do the following:

- 1. Tap

 → Video recorder.
- 2. In video recording mode, you can do the following:
- Tap to configure the relevant settings.

- Tap to start recording or to pause.
- Tap or to adjust the exposure value.
- Tap to zoom in or to zoom out.
- Tap to stop recording and save the video clip as instructed.

Media Player

The media player plays audio clips stored in the **Audio** folder and video clips stored in the **Videos** folder in the phone memory or on the microSD card. The **Audio** folder and the **Videos** folder can be accessed from **File manager**. To obtain better sound quality, it is recommended that you use the headset to listen to audio clips.

To play a clip, do the following:

- In standby mode, tap > Media player > Now playing to access Media Player.
- Tap to start playing the clip. When the clip is being played, you can do the following:
- Press or to adjust the volume, or tap to mute.
- Tap and to switch between clips.
- Press the button on the headset cable to switch between clips.

3. Press to stop playing the clip.
4. Press to go to the previous menu.
Only files in .mp4 and .3gp formats are supported. Files in other formats may not play.

Image Viewer


The **Image Viewer** provides the following options for all pictures in the phone memory and on the microSD card: **View**, **Browse style**, **Send** (by MMS or Bluetooth), **Use as** (Wallpaper, Screen saver or Caller picture), **Rename**, **Delete**, **Sort by** (Name, Type, Time, Size or None), **Delete all files** and **Storage** selection.

FM Radio

For G7205, the headset cable also functions as an antenna. To ensure reception of radio programs, do not disconnect the headset from the phone or bend the headset cable.

For G7206, to ensure reception of radio programs, pull out the TV & FM radio antenna.

- 1. For G7205, connect the headset to the phone.
- In standby mode, tap > FM radio to access FM Radio.
 When listening to the radio, you can do the following:
- Press to stop or continue the playing.
- Press or to adjust the volume.



 Press to view or edit the channel list, manually set a frequency, automatically search for and save channels, configure the relevant settings, record the audio clip, and so on.

Sound Recorder

The sound recorder functions as a digital recorder. To record an audio clip, do the following:

- 2. Tap to record an audio clip.

 During the recording, tap to pause or to continue.
- Tap to stop recording the audio clip, and then save the recorded clip as instructed.

TV (for G7205)

To ensure reception of TV programs, pull out the TV antenna.

In standby mode, tap \boxplus > **TV** to access **TV**. When watching the TV, you can do the following:

- Tap or switch to the adjacent channel.
- Tap to exit.
- Tap to access the channel list.
- Tap to adjust the volume.
- Tap to access the Write message screen.
- Press to view or edit the TV program list, automatically search for and save channels, manually set a channel, set the area, and so on.

TV (for G7206)

To ensure reception of TV programs, pull out the TV $\&\,\text{FM}$ radio antenna.

In standby mode, tap \square > **TV** to access **TV**. When watching the TV, you can do the following:

- Tap to record a video clip.
- Tap to mute.
- Tap to take a picture.
- Press or tap to adjust the volume.
- Tap or to switch to the adjacent channel.
- Tap to access the Write message screen.
- · Tap Back to exit.
- Tap Options to view or edit the channel list, automatically search for and save channels, manually

set a channel number, play the recorded clip, configure the relevant settings, and so on.

10 WAP Browser

You can access Wireless Application Protocol (WAP) sites and use WAP-based services on your phone. To access WAP sites on your phone, you need to subscribe to the service from your service provider and set the relevant parameters on your phone.

For details about the service and the charges, contact your service provider.

Configuring Network Settings

To access WAP sites on your phone, you need to set your data account and WAP parameters first.

Setting the Data Account

To set the data account, do the following:

- Tap > WAP browser > Internet service >
 Settings > Data account, or tap > Settings >
 Connectivity > Data account.
- Tap Options > Add.
- Set the parameters based on the information provided by your service provider.
- 4. Tap **OK** and then **Yes** to save the settings.

Setting the WAP Parameters

To set the WAP parameters, do the following:

- Tap > WAP browser > Internet service > Settings > Select profile, select one option.
- Tap > WAP browser > Internet service > Settings > Profiles > SIM1/SIM2.
- 3. Tap Add new.
- Set the parameters based on the information provided by your service provider.
- Tap **Done** to save the settings.
- Select your service provider, tap **Options** > **Activate**.

Accessing a Website

To access a website, do the following:

- Tap > WAP browser > Internet service > Input address.
- 2. Enter a Uniform Resource Locator (URL) address.
- 3. Tap **Options** > **Done** to access the website.

11 Bluetooth

The Bluetooth function enables you to synchronize data between a PC and your phone, exchange data with other Bluetooth devices, and connect a Bluetooth headset to your phone.

You can turn on the Bluetooth function by configuring Bluetooth settings.

Synchronizing Data

Before synchronizing data between a PC and your phone, ensure that the PC supports the Bluetooth function and that the operating system of the PC is Windows 2000 or Windows XP.

To synchronize data, do the following:

Connecting a Bluetooth Headset to Your Phone

14 Tools

Alarm

You can set five alarms on your phone.

To set an alarm, tap $\stackrel{\textstyle \Box}{\boxplus} >$ **Alarm** in standby mode, enable or disable the alarm, and then set the alert time, repeat mode, snooze duration, and alert type.

Once the alarm is enabled, the alarm icon is displayed on the standby screen.

Calendar

You can add events to the calendar and keep track of important events.

To access **Calendar**, tap \square > **Calendar** in standby mode.

Tasks

You can add tasks to the phone. You can also view, edit, and delete tasks as desired.

Ebook

You can use Ebook to read .txt files.

To access **Ebook**, tap \square > **Ebook** in standby mode.

Calculator

To access **Calculator**, tap \square > **Calculator** in standby mode.

To calculate, enter the number to be calculated, select a mathematical operation by tapping the corresponding key, enter another number to be calculated, and then tap to obtain the result.

Unit Converter

To access **Unit Converter**, tap \square > **Unit converter** in standby mode.

Tap **Weight** or **Length**, select the unit, enter the value, tap **I**, and then tap **OK** to obtain the result.

Currency Exchanger

To access Currency exchanger, tap $\ensuremath{\boxplus}$ > Currency exchanger in standby mode.

Please ensure that the GPRS settings in your phone are correctly configured for using Opera. Contact your operator for GPRS settings.

Configuring Network Settings

To use Opera to access the Internet on your phone, you need to set your data account and WAP parameters, and activate a network connection profile first.

Setting the Data Account

To set the data account, do the following:

Which are the factors that affect the lifetime of the battery?	 The lifetime of the battery depends on the number of times that the battery has been charged, the duration that the battery is charged each time, and the duration that the battery has been in service. The lifetime also depends on the ambient temperature, internal temperature of the battery, contact between the battery and the phone, and signal strength of the phone.

When there is an incoming call, why is the caller's name not displayed?	The name and number of the caller is not stored in your phonebook or the phonebook is being initialized.
What should I do when I power on my phone and the phone requires the phone code?	 The phone has a phone lock function that is disabled by default. If the phone lock function is enabled, the phone code is required when the phone is powered on. By default, the phone code is 1234. If your SIM card is locked, unlock it by entering the PUK delivered with the SIM card. If you have lost the PUK, go to the nearest service store of the network service provider for assistance.
How do I maintain my phone and accessories?	Prevent dust and water from entering your phone. Do not use your phone in a dusty or moist environment. Avoid dropping your phone and prevent physical impact to the phone. Do not install and remove your SIM card frequently. To prevent the housing or the display of your phone from scratches, avoid placing your phone near sharp objects.

Question	Answer
Why cannot my phone be powered on?	 The battery of your phone is almost used up. The power key of your phone does not function properly.
Why cannot I make a call from my phone?	There is no signal or the signal strength is weak. Check whether your phone is within the service area and check that the signal strength is strong. Check whether there are barriers (such as buildings) around, which block the signal.
Why does noise occur during a call?	The signal strength is weak. You are far from the signal transmission tower, or the signal is blocked by surrounding buildings.

Why cannot my phone detect the SIM card?	The SIM card may be damaged. Replace it with another SIM card that works properly and check again.

19 Warnings and Precautions

This section contains important information pertaining to the operating instructions of your device. It also contains information about how to use the device safely. Read this information carefully before using your device.

Electronic Device

Power off your device if using the device is prohibited. Do not use the device when using the device causes danger or interference with electronic devices.

Medical Device

- Follow rules and regulations set forth by hospitals and health care facilities. Do not use your device when using the device is prohibited.
- Pacemaker manufacturers recommend that a minimum distance of 15 cm be maintained between a device and a pacemaker to prevent potential interference with the pacemaker. Potentially Explosive Atmosphere

Safety of Children

Battery and Charger
