


SIM/USIM Card and Battery

Before using the phone, install a SIM/USIM card on the phone. Power off the phone before removing the SIM/USIM card or the battery.



microSD Card

The phone supports a microSD card of up to 8 GB.



Charging the Battery

2 Getting Started

Powering On and Off

To power on your phone, press and hold for about 3 seconds. If required, enter the phone password, personal identification number (PIN), or PIN unblocking key (PUK) as prompted.

If Auto power-on and power-off is enabled, your phone will

automatically power on or off at the preset-time. To set the automatic power-on and power-off time, select Menu > Settings > Phone > Auto power-on and power-off > Power-on time or Power-off time.

Keypad Lock

To lock the keypad, press and hold # for about 3 seconds in standby mode. When the keypad is locked, you can still press to answer a call or make an emergency call.

To unlock the keypad, press (Unlock), then (OK).

If the **Auto keypad lock** function is enabled, the phone will lock the keypad automatically after being idle in standby mode for a pre-defined period. To set this function, select **Menu** > **Settings** > **Phone** > **Auto keypad lock**.

Phone Lock

The phone lock protects your phone from unauthorized use. By default, the phone lock is disabled. To enable or disable the phone lock, select **Menu** > **Settings** > **Security** > **Phone lock**. Once the phone lock is enabled, you must enter a passcode each time you power on the phone.

The preset passcode is **1234**. You can select **Menu** > **Settings** > **Security** > **Change phone lock code** to change the passcode to any numeric string of four to eight digits.

Do remember your passcode. If you forget it, contact the service center

PIN and PUK

The personal identification number (PIN) protects your SIM/USIM card from unauthorized use. If you incorrectly enter the PIN a specified number of times, the PIN is blocked and the phone prompts you to enter the PIN unblocking key (PUK). If this occurs, enter the PUK to unblock the blocked PIN.

If you incorrectly enter the PUK a specified number of times, the SIM/USIM card will become permanently invalid, and you must contact your service provider for a new SIM/USIM card.

Both the PIN and the PUK are provided with your SIM/USIM card. For details, contact your service provider.

Power Saving Mode

To set the power saving mode, select Menu > Settings > Phone > Power-saving mode. If the power-saving mode is enabled, the keypad backlight will be off from 9:00 to 17:00.

3 Call Functions

Making a Call

- 1. In standby mode, enter the phone number.
 - To make an international call, press * twice to enter the plus sign (+). Then enter the country or region code, area code, and phone number.
 - To call an extension number, enter the phone number, press * three times to enter P or four times to enter W, and enter the extension number.
- Press to dial the number.
- 3. Press on to end the call or cancel the dialing.



- If you enter **P** between the phone number and the extension number, after the phone number is connected, the phone automatically dials the extension number.
- If you enter W between the phone number and the extension number, after the phone number is connected, the phone prompts you to choose whether to dial the extension number.
- You can also make a call from call logs and contacts.

Answering a Call

When there is an incoming call, press ____ to answer it or _____ to reject it. If the Any key answer function is enabled, you can press any key

except , c , or to answer the call. To enable the any key answer function, select Menu > Settings > Call > Answer mode > Any key.

If the Headset auto-answer function is enabled and a headset is connected to the phone, the phone will automatically answer incoming calls for a pre-defined period. To enable the headset auto-answer function, select Menu > Settings > Call > Headset auto-answer

4 Text Input

Your phone provides multiple text input modes. In editing mode, the current text input mode is indicated on the screen. To switch between text input modes, press #.



- Press once to delete the character to the left of the cursor, or press and hold (to delete all the characters to the left of the
- On the message editing screen, select Options > Text input settings to configure text input settings, such as the default input language, and whether to enable first letter capitalized and predictive input.

Entering a Word

Multi-tap Input Mode

In multi-tap input mode, press the number key labeled with the desired letter once to enter the first letter on the key, twice to enter the second letter on the key, and so on.

Predictive Input Mode

- 1. Press each key once according to the spelling sequence of the desired word. The phone displays candidate words that may be spelt by the keystroke sequence.
- 2. Press 🗀 and 🖵 to scroll to the desired word.

3. Press to enter the word, or press to enter the word followed by a space.

Voicemail

Voicemail is a network-dependent service. To subscribe to voicemail, contact your network operator.

Before using voicemail, select Menu > Messages > Voicemail to set the voicemail number.

Setting the Connection Profile

Before accessing the Internet using your phone, set up your account first. Generally, the account has been preset on your phone. If you want to use another account, contact your service provider for the account information, and then create the account.

Accessing a Webpage

To access a webpage, open the browser and then do as follows.

- Select **Open homepage** to display the home page.
- Select Open new page, and enter a website address.
- Select Bookmarks, and select one from the list.
- Select **Saved pages** to view the webpages you have saved.
- · Select History, and select one from the list.

10 USB

Connect your phone to a PC with the USB cable, double click My Computer, find the disk named Orinoquia and double click it. The following dialog box will appear on your PC.



Select your desired function in the dialog box:

- Start Mobile Modem: use the phone as a USB modem.
- Start PC Suite: use the phone through PC Suite on the PC.
- File Transfer: use the phone as a USB mass storage device.



- If the PC cannot recognize your phone, restart the PC, and then retry.
- If the dialog box does not appear, open My Computer and find the driver for the phone (appears as a CD driver).
- For Windows 7, you need select My Computer > Orinoquia, and then double click the file Setup.exe to display the dialog.

Installing PC Suite

PC Suite helps you perform most of the phone operations on a PC. It is supplied with your phone. The PC Suite installation program runs automatically when you use the PC Suite function for the first time. Follow the wizard to complete installation, and restart your PC for the installation to take effect.



- To download the latest PC Suite software, go to http://www.huaweidevice.com, and then search for the desired software.
- For the way of using PC Suite, refer to the help of the PC Suite.

USB-based Internet Access

Your phone can be used as a modem after connecting your phone to a PC with the USB cable. The PC can access the Internet through the phone.

The USB modem driver and management program runs automatically when you use the USB modem function for the first time. Follow the wizard to complete installation.

After installation, start the management program, set up a connection, and then access the Internet.



Note

- Only the Windows 2000, Windows XP, 32-bit and 64-bit versions of Windows Vista, and Windows 7 operating systems support the function.
- For details, contact your service provider.

USR disk

Your phone can be used as a USB mass storage device. You can save files to the microSD card.

When you are using the USB disk function, other USB functions are unavailable.

11 Bluetooth

Your phone supports Bluetooth. You can synchronize files between your phone and a PC, transfer data between your phone and other Bluetooth devices, and talk on the phone using a Bluetooth headset

Select Menu > Settings > Connectivity > Bluetooth, and then switch on or off the Bluetooth.

Using a Bluetooth Headset

A Bluetooth headset is not included in the product package and must be purchased separately.

- 1. Select Search for devices to search for the Bluetooth devices.
- 2. Select your Bluetooth headset from the list.
- 4. Enter the password of the Bluetooth headset to pair the headset with your phone. When the Bluetooth headset is connected to your phone, the headset icon 🔝 is displayed on the standby screen, indicating that you can use the headset.

Transferring Data

Select Search for devices to search for available Bluetooth devices, and then connect your phone with the desired device. Then you can transfer data between your phone and the Bluetooth device. When you pair your phone with the device for the first time, a password is required.

12 Troubleshooting

If you encounter any problem when using your phone, try to solve the problem according to the following table. If the problem still

Problem	Ensure that
The battery cannot be charged.	The charger is properly connected to your phone and the power socket.
The phone cannot be powered on.	 The battery power is enough. The battery is properly installed. Press and hold .
Cannot make a call except an emergency call.	You are in the network service area. The call restriction function is not enabled.

Problem	Ensure that
Bad call quality.	 The signal strength is strong enough. If you are indoors, move near a window for better reception.
The signal strength is not strong enough or your phone is often offline.	Move near to a place with strong signal strength.
The phone cannot find other Bluetooth devices or fails to send or receive data via Bluetooth.	The Bluetooth function of both devices is turned on. The distance between the two Bluetooth devices is less than 10 meters. There are no obstacles between the two devices. The other Bluetooth device is set to visible.

13 Warnings and Precautions

This section contains important information pertaining to the operating instructions of your device. It also contains information about how to use the device safely. Read this information carefully before using your device.

Electronic Device

Power off your device if using the device is prohibited. Do not use the device when using the device causes danger or interference with electronic devices

Medical Device

- Follow rules and regulations set forth by hospitals and health care facilities. Do not use your device when using the device is prohibited.
- Pacemaker manufacturers recommend that a minimum distance
 of 15 cm be maintained between a device and a pacemaker to
 prevent potential interference with the pacemaker. If you are
 using a pacemaker, use the device on the opposite side of the
 pacemaker and do not carry the device in your front pocket.

Potentially Explosive Atmosphere

Power off your device in any area with a potentially explosive atmosphere, and comply with all signs and instructions. Areas that may have potentially explosive atmospheres include the areas where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle engine.
