

Phone at a Glance

All the pictures in this guide are for your reference only. Your phone's actual display features may be different to those described here, depending on its software version.



If you apply protective film on the phone, please use the protective film with good transmittance.

Installing the SIM/USIM Card

There are three steps to install the SIM card:



- 1. Remove the battery cover.
- 2. Remove the battery.
- 3 Insert the SIM/USIM card

(Optional) Installing the microSD Card

Your mobile phone is already equipped with a large-volume built-in embedded MultiMediaCard (eMMC). If you want to expand your phone memory, you can also insert a microSD card.



- 1. Remove the battery cover.
- 2. Remove the battery.
- Insert the microSD card into the card slot as shown in the diagram.

Installing the Battery



- Angle the edge labeled a (with the contacts) into the bottom end
 of the battery compartment.
- Push the edge labeled b into the compartment until the battery clicks firmly into place.

Charging the Battery

Before charging the battery, ensure that it has been properly installed on your phone.



- Connect the USB cable that came with your mobile phone to the charger.
- Connect the other end of the USB cable to your mobile phone.
 Then, to start charging, plug the charger into an electrical outlet.
 If you charge your mobile phone while it is powered on, the battery

ir you charge your mobile phone while it is powered on, the battery icon on the notification bar indicates the charging status. When the battery icon changes to _______, your mobile phone is fully charged.


Status Indicator

The color of the status indicator tells you the status of your mobile phone's battery.



Touchscreen Actions


Using your finger on the touchscreen, you can operate your phone conveniently.



Home Screen

You can set up the Home screen according to your own preferences, for example by adding a shortcut or a widget to your Home screen, changing the wallpaper, or setting the number of Home screen extensions.

To return to the Home screen from any of its extensions, press \(\int_{\text{.}}\).



When a new notification icon appears on the notification bar, place your finger on the notification bar and flick down to open the notification panel.

Adding a New Home Screen Item

- Touch and hold a blank area on the Home screen until the Add to home screen menu is displayed.
- You can also touch == > Add on the Home screen to display the Add to home screen menu.
- 2. Select an item to add it to the Home screen.



Removing a Home Screen Item

- Touch and hold an item on the Home screen until the item expands and the mobile phone vibrates.
- Without lifting your finger, drag the item to the trash can. When the item and the trash can turn red, the item is ready to be removed.
- Release the item to remove it from the Home screen.

Importing Contacts from a SIM/ USIM Card

- In the contact list, touch = > More > Import/Export.
- Select the SIM/USIM card.and then touch Next.
- Select the item which you want to copy contacts to in the displayed menu, and then touch Next.
- Select the contacts you want to import or touch Select All to select all contacts.
- Touch Copy.
- 6. Touch OK to import the contact.

Adding a Contact

- In the contact list, touch = > New contact.
- If you have more than one item with contacts, touch the item which you want to add contacts to in the displayed menu.
- Enter the contact's name, and then add detailed information such as phone number and address.
- When you are finished, touch Save to save the contact information.

Making a Call with the Dialer Application

 Your phone supports dual-card dual-standby mode, but the two SIM cards cannot be used simultaneously. When you are making a call with one SIM card, the other SIM card becomes unavailable, that is, no incoming calls can be received and the data services cannot be used.

On the home screen, touch to open the Phone.

Your mobile phone supports the Smart Dial function, that is, when you touch numbers on the dialer, the phone automatically searches among your contacts and lists the matching results ordered according to the accuracy of the match. If no contacts match the information entered, the phone will not display any result.

Creating and Sending a Multimedia Message

On the home screen, touch (a) to open the Messaging. You can use multimedia messages to make everyday communications very special. You can record a message and send it as an audio file, sing 'Happy Birthday' and send it to friend, or send a slideshow of photographs of a special event. The possibilities are encless.

- Touch > Messaging > Compose new message.
- Enter a phone number in the To field, or touch to select a contact from Contacts or Groups.
- 3. Touch the composition text box to start entering your message.
 - If you want to enter a smiley, touch = , and then touch Insert smiley.
- Touch = to display the options panel.
 - Touch Add subject to add the message subject. Your mobile phone is now in multimedia message mode.
 - Touch Attach to add a picture, music, or video file.
 - Touch Insert quick text to replay quickly when you are busy.
 - Touch More to insert contacts or view all threads.
- When the message is ready to be sent, touch Send.

Connecting Internet

Get online using your phone's WLAN to save your money.

Turning On WLAN

- Touch = > Settings.
- Touch Wireless & networks, and then select the WLAN check box to turn on WLAN.

Opening the Browser

Touch Browser to open the home page.

When known or open WLAN networks and mobile data networks are available at the same time, your phone will preferably select a WLAN network for Internet access.

Touch == to open the browser options menu and perform one of the following operations:

- . Close: Touch to guit or minimize the window.
- Bookmarks: Touch to display bookmarks.
- Windows: Touch to view thumbnails of open browser windows.
 You can switch to another browser window or open a new one on this screen.
- Backward: Touch to browse the last web page.
- Forward: Touch to browse the next web page.
- More: Touch to open other menus and perform operations such as searching, selecting text, downloading, or setting options.

Opening a Webpage

- In a browser window, touch the URL field at the top of the screen.
- Use the keyboard to enter a webpage address. You can touch
 to enter the web page address by voice.

Turning Off Your Data Service

When you are not using your data service, to eliminate unwanted data traffic, you can turn it off quickly.

- 1. Open the notification bar.
- Touch at the top of the screen to switch data services on or off.
 - (1) You can also touch (2), (3), (3) or (4) to turn the corresponding services on or off.

Play Store

Android Play Store provides direct access to applications and games which you can download and install on your phone.

Opening Play Store

- On the Home screen, touch > Play Store.
- When you open Play Store for the first time, the Google Play Terms of Service window will appear. Touch Accept to continue.

Installing an Application

- In the Play Store, select a category, and then touch the application you want to download. On the application details screen, you can view more information about this application, such as its cost, overall rating, user comments, and similar applications. When scrolling down, you can also view developer's information including other applications from the same developer and the link to the developer's website. In addition, you can send the developer an email.
- To install the application, touch Install (if it is free) or touch the button with a price (if it is not free), and confirm your download or purchase.
- To check the progress of a download, open the notification panel. Most applications are installed within seconds. To stop an application from downloading, touch the cross (x).

After the application has been downloaded and installed on your mobile phone, the content download icon appears in the notification har.

Uninstalling an Application


- You cannot uninstall the applications that are pre-installed on the system.
- On the Settings screen, touch Applications > Manage applications.
- 2. Touch an application, and then touch Uninstall.

Opening Your Camera

You can take and share photos using the camera. Your camera supports multiple capture modes and photo effects. After taking a picture, access the **Gallery** to view it. For information on how to share photos and videos, see the User Guide.

- Touch Camera to open the camera. The camera opens in landscape mode, ready to take a picture or record a video.
- Touch to close the camera.

Capture Screen



On the capture screen, touch = to show the capture panel.

Using the microSD Card as a USB Mass Storage

To transfer all your favorite music and pictures from your PC to your mobile phone's microSD card, set the microSD card as a USB mass storace.

- Connect your mobile phone to your PC with the USB cable provided. Your PC will detect the microSD card as a removable storage device.
- Open the notification bar, and then touch USB connected.
- Touch Turn on USB storage in the dialog box that opens to confirm that you want to transfer files.


You can now transfer files from your PC to your mobile phone's microSD card.

① When your microSD card acts as a USB mass storage, your mobile phone will not use this memory space. Ensure that you follow the correct procedures to disconnect the USB mass storage device (your mobile phone) from the PC when you have finished transferring files.

Playing Music

You can listen to music that you have stored on your microSD card using the music player . The music player will automatically search for any music on the microSD card sort it into albums and playlists.

- From the music library, select a way to view your music.
- 2. Touch the music file you want to play.



While playing music, touch \(\sum_{\text{to return}} \) to return to the Home screen, the music will continue to play in the background and you can use other applications. Open the notifications panel and touch the playing music to return to the music playing screen.

Synchronizing Information

Some applications on your mobile phone give you access to the same personal information that you can add, view, and edit on your computer. If you add, change, or delete your information in any of these applications on the web, the updated information also appears on your mobile phone.

This is made possible through over-the-air data synchronization. The process occurs in the background and does not interfere with use of your mobile phone. When your phone is synchronizing, a data synchronization icon will be shown in the notification bar.

How Can I Use a microSD Card to Import Contacts to My Phone from a Different Mobile Phone?

Your mobile phone only supports contact files in the .vcf format.

- Save the contacts you want to import to your mobile phone to a microSD card as a .vcf file.
- Insert the microSD card into your mobile phone and find the .vcf file using ES File Explore.
- Touch the .vcf file. The phone displays a reminder asking whether you aggregate it if the contacts already exist.
- 4. Touch Yes/No to import the contacts.
 - ① Compatibility problems may occur with .vcf files created by different mobile phones and certain contact information may be lost after contacts are imported.

How Can I Use Hi Suite to Import Contacts to My Phone from a Different Mobile Phone?

Your mobile phone only supports contact files in the .vcf format.

- Save the .vcf file containing the contact information you want to import to a PC.
- On the Home screen, touch Settings > Applications > Development > USB debugging.
- 3. Use a USB cable to connect your phone to the PC.
- Visit http://www.huaweidevice.com/worldwide to download and install Hi Suite.
- Open Hi Suite and follow the instructions to complete the installation.
- Hi Suite will start automatically after the installation is complete. Click Contacts. Right-click the contact list and choose Import. Follow the instructions and select the .vcf file you want to import.

Disconnect your mobile phone from the PC after the contacts have been imported.

How Do I Set a Song As a Phone Ringtone?

In **Songs** panel, touch and hold the song to be set as ringtone, and then touch **Use as phone ringtone**.

How Do I Prevent Automatic Change of Screen Orientation When Rotating My Phone?

On the Home screen, touch Settings > Display > Autorotate screen to disable the function.

How Do I Set an Unlock Pattern?

On the Home screen, touch Settings > Security > Set up screen lock > Pattern

How Can I Change the Input Method?

Touch and hold the area where you write text and then select the input method you prefer.

How Do I Stop the Song Playing in the Background?

Touch the notification bar, flick downwards to open the notifications panel, touch the music playing notification to go to the music playing screen, and then stop playing the song.

How Do I Return to the Call Screen?

While in a call, if you're on another screen, you can touch the notification bar, and flick downwards to open the notifications panel. Then touch the current call notification to return to the call screen.

How Do I Create an Application Shortcut on the Home Screen?

Touch and hold an application icon on the application screen until the Home screen is displayed. Then drag the icon to where you want to place it and release your finger.

How Do I Hide the Keyboard?

Touch to hide the keyboard.

How Do I Forward a Message?

Touch and hold a message, and then touch **Forward** in the menu that opens.

Why Am I Unable to Use Navigation?

Navigation is unavailable in some countries or regions.

How Do I Use Quick GPS?

On the Home screen, touch == > Settings > Location > A-GPS.

Quick GPS downloads data to enhance the GPS satellite information and may therefore incur additional data charges.

Warnings and Precautions

This section contains important information pertaining to the operating instructions of your device. It also contains information about how to use the device safely. Read this information carefully before using your device.

Flectronic Device

Power off your device if using the device is prohibited. Do not use the device when using the device causes danger or interference with electronic devices.

Medical Device

- Follow rules and regulations set forth by hospitals and health care facilities. Do not use your device when using the device is prohibited.
- Pacemaker manufacturers recommend that a minimum distance of 15 cm be maintained between a device and a pacemaker to prevent potential interference with the pacemaker. Potentially Explosive Atmosphere

Traffic Security

Observe local laws and regulations while using the device. In addition, if using the device while driving a vehicle, comply with the following guidelines:

- Concentrate on driving. Your first responsibility is to drive safely.
- Do not talk on the device while driving. Use hands-free accessories.
- When you have to make or answer a call, park the vehicle at the road side before using your device.
- RF signals may affect electronic systems of motor vehicles. For more information, consult the vehicle manufacturer.
- In a motor vehicle, do not place the device over the air bag or in the air bag deployment area. Otherwise, the device may hurt you owing to the strong force when the air bag inflates.

 Do not use your device while flying in an aircraft. Power off your device before boarding an aircraft. Using wireless devices in an aircraft may cause danger to the operation of the aircraft and disrupt the wireless telephone network. It may also be considered illegal.

Operating Environment

- Do not use or charge the device in dusty, damp, and dirty places or places with magnetic fields. Otherwise, it may result in a malfunction of the circuit
- The device complies with the RF specifications when the device is used near your ear or at a distance of 1.5 cm from your body.
 Ensure that the device accessories such as a device case and a device holster are not composed of metal components. Keep your device 1.5 cm away from your body to meet the requirement earlier mentioned.
 - On a stormy day with thunder, do not use your device when it is being charged, to prevent any danger caused by lightning.
- When you are on a call, do not touch the antenna. Touching the antenna affects the call quality and results in increase in power consumption. As a result, the talk time and the standby time are reduced.
- While using the device, observe the local laws and regulations, and respect others' privacy and legal rights.
- Keep the ambient temperature between -10°C and +45°C while the device is being charged. Keep the ambient temperature between -10°C to +45°C for using the device powered by a battery.

Prevention of Hearing Damage

Using a headset at high volume can damage your hearing. To reduce the risk of damage to hearing, lower the headset volume to a safe and comfortable level.

Safety of Children

Comply with all precautions with regard to children's safety. Letting the child play with your device or its accessories, which may include parts that can be detached from the device, may be dangerous, as it may present a choking hazard. Ensure that small children are kept away from the device and accessories.

Accessories

Choose only batteries, chargers, and accessories approved for use with this model by the device manufacturer. Battery and Charger

- Unplug the charger from the electrical plug and the device when not in use.
- The battery can be charged and discharged hundreds of times before it eventually wears out. When the standby time and the talk time are shorter than the normal time, replace the battery.
- Use the AC power supply defined in the specifications of the charger. An improper power voltage may cause a fire or a malfunction of the charger.
- Do not connect two poles of the battery with conductors, such as metal materials, keys, or jewelries. Otherwise, the battery may be short-circuited and may cause injuries and burns on your body.
- If battery electrolyte leaks out, ensure that the electrolyte does not touch your skin and eyes. When the electrolyte touches your skin or splashes into your eyes, wash your eyes with clean water immediately and consult a doctor.
- If there is a case of battery deformation, color change, or abnormal heating while you charge or store the battery, remove

the battery immediately and stop using it. Otherwise, it may lead to battery leakage, overheating, explosion, or fire.

- If the power cable is damaged (for example, the cord is exposed or broken), or the plug loosens, stop using the cable at once.
 Otherwise, it may lead to an electric shock, a short circuit of the charger, or a fire.

Cleaning and Maintenance

Certification Information (SAR)

This device meets guidelines for exposure to radio waves. Your device is a low-power radio transmitter and receiver. The SAR limit adopted by USA and Canada is 1.6 watts/kilogram (W/kg) averaged over one gram of tissue. The Highest SAR value

reported to the FCC for this device type when tested for use at the ear is 0.668 W/kg, when properly worn on body is 1.08 W/kg, and when using Wi-Fi hotspot function is 1.08 W/kg.
