1.1 Safety Precautions

Please read the safety precautions carefully to ensure the correct use of your mobile phone.



Do not crash, throw, or puncture your mobile phone. Avoid the falling, squeezing, and bending of your mobile phone.



Do not use your mobile phone in a moist environment, such as the bathroom. Prevent your mobile phone from being soaked or washed in liquid.



Do not switch on your mobile phone when it is prohibited to use phones or when the phone may cause interference or danger.



Do not use your mobile phone while driving.



Follow any rules or regulations in hospitals and health care facilities. Switch off your mobile phone near medical apparatus.



Switch off your mobile phone in aircraft. The phone may cause interference to control equipment of the aircraft.



Switch off your mobile phone near high-precision electronic devices. The phone may affect the performance of these devices.



Do not attempt to disassemble your mobile phone or its accessories. Only qualified personnel are allowed to service or repair the phone.

2.2 Important Information About the Battery

- If the battery has not been used for a long time, you may not be able to power on your mobile phone immediately after you begin charging the battery. Allow the battery to charge for a few minutes with the phone powered off before attempting to power the phone on.
- As it ages, the battery's performance will degrade, in particular it will not hold charge as it did when it was new. When the battery life becomes noticeably shorter than usual after being charged properly, replace the battery with a new one of the same type.
- Using data services increases the power consumption of the phone and will therefore reduce the length of time that the phone can be used between battery charges.
- The time required to fully charge the battery depends on the ambient temperature and the age of the battery.
- When the battery power is low, the phone will alert you and display a message. When the battery power is almost exhausted, your phone will power off automatically.

2.3 Power Saving Tips

The longevity of battery power depends on the network to which you connect, and how you use your mobile phone.

Try the following to conserve battery power:

- When your mobile phone is not in use, turn off the screen backlight.
- Reduce the time it takes for your screen backlight to turn off when your phone is idle.
- Lower the screen brightness.
- Turn off Bluetooth when you are not using it. Only make your phone visible to other Bluetooth devices when you need to establish a Bluetooth connection.
- Turn off Wi-Fi when you are not using it.
- Turn off your phone's GPS receiver when you are not using it.
- Lower the volume.
- Close power-draining programs, when you do not need them.
- Turn off the data service.

2.4 Power On or Off Your Mobile Phone

2.4.1 Powering On Your Mobile Phone

Press and hold (1). The first time you power on your phone, you will be asked to sign in to your account and set up your mobile phone.

(1) If personal identification number (PIN) protection is enabled on your mobile phone, you must enter your PIN before using the mobile phone.

2.4.2 Setting Up Your Mobile Phone

The first time you power on your mobile phone, the phone displays a setup wizard to help you set up the phone.

The setup wizard helps you:

- Create or sign in to your account
- Make some initial decisions about how you want to use your mobile phone

2.4.3 Powering Off Your Mobile Phone

- 1. Press and hold to open the **Phone options** menu.
- 2. Touch **Power off**.
- 3. Touch OK.

2.5 Using the Touchscreen

2.5.1 Touchscreen Actions

- **Touch**: Tap the screen with your finger to select an item, confirm a selection, or start an application.
- **Touch and hold**: Touch an item with your finger and do not release it until the mobile phone responds. For example, to open the options menu for the active screen, touch and hold the screen until the menu appears.
- Flick: Move your finger either vertically or horizontally across the screen.
- **Drag**: Touch and hold the desired item with your finger. To move an item, drag the item to any part of the screen. You can drag an icon to move or delete it.

2.5.2 Rotating Your Mobile Phone Screen

The orientation of most screens will change to landscape or portrait view when you rotate your phone sideways.

On the Home screen, touch Settings > Display > Auto-rotate screen to disable this function.


2.6 Locking and Unlocking the Screen

2.6.1 Locking the Screen

- When your phone is on, press (1) to lock the screen. When the screen is locked, you can still receive messages and calls.
- If your phone is idle for a while, the screen will lock automatically.


2.6.2 Unlocking the Screen

- 1. Press (1) to wake up the screen.
- 2. Drag the lock icon from left to right to unlock the screen.



(1) If you have set up a screen unlock pattern, you will be prompted to draw the pattern on the screen to unlock it.

2.7 Home Screen



Touch and hold a shortcut until the mobile phone vibrates, you can then drag it to your desired location or move it to the trash. You can also drag an icon from another area of the screen to the shortcut position.

2.7.2 Notification Panel

Your mobile phone will notify you when you receive a new message or there is an upcoming event. The notification panel also informs you of alarms and settings. Open the notification panel to see your network operator or to view a message, reminder, or event notification.


Opening the Notification Panel

- 1. When a new notification icon appears on the notification bar, place your finger on the notification bar and flick down to open the notification panel.
- You can also open the notification panel from the Home screen: Touch \equiv > **Notifications** to open the panel.
- 2. On the panel, you can:
 - Touch a notification to open the related application.
 - Touch Clear to clear all notifications.


Closing the Notification Panel

Touch and hold the bottom of the panel. Then flick up to close it.

2.7.3 Viewing Other Parts of the Home Screen



Flick your finger left or right across the Home screen.



Touch → to view thumbnails of the Home screen and its extensions. Touch a thumbnail to open the screen.

On the Home screen, touch > Home settings > Advanced settings > Screen number to set the number of extended screens.

2.7.4 Customizing the Home Screen

Adding a New Home Screen Item

1. Touch and hold a blank area on the Home screen until the **Add to home screen** menu is displayed.

You can also touch \equiv > Add on the Home screen to display the Add to home screen menu.

2. Select an item to add it to the Home screen.

Moving a Home Screen Item

- 1. Touch and hold an item on the Home screen until the item expands in size and the mobile phone vibrates.
- 2. Without lifting your finger, drag the item to the desired position on the screen, and then release it.

Removing a Home Screen Item

- 1. Touch and hold an item on the Home screen until the item expands and the mobile phone vibrates.
- 2. Without lifting your finger, drag the item to the trash can. When the item and the trash can turn red, the item is ready to be removed.
- 3. Release the item to remove it from the Home screen.

2.7.5 Service Shortcuts

- 1. Open the notification bar.
- 2. Touch 🔹 at the top of the screen to switch data services on or off.
- You can also touch <a>
 , <a>
 , <a>
 or <a>
 Ito turn the corresponding services on or off.

2.7.6 Setting a Home Screen Animation

- 1. On the Home screen, touch \equiv > Home settings > Animation.
- 2. Select an animation, and then touch **Save**.

2.7.7 Changing the Wallpaper

- 1. On the Home screen, touch \equiv > Wallpaper.
- 2. Touch the following menu items to select a picture and set it as the wallpaper:
 - Gallery
 - Live wallpapers
 - Wallpapers

2.7.8 Changing the Theme

1. On the Home screen, touch \equiv > Home settings.

- 2. Do any of the following:
 - Touch **Theme** to select a theme.
 - Touch Application icons to select a series of application icons.
- 3. Touch Save.

2.8 Application Screen

The Application screen holds icons for all of the applications on your phone. You can

touch **•** on the Home screen to open the application screen.

2.8.1 Moving Icons on the Application Screen

- 1. On the application screen, touch \bigcirc .
- 2. Touch and hold the icon you want to move on the application screen.
- 3. Without lifting your finger, drag the icon to the desired location, and then release it.

• To move more icons, repeat steps 2 and 3.

4. Touch 🗸 or 👈 to save.

2.9 Using a microSD Card

2.9.1 Using the microSD Card as a USB Mass Storage

To transfer all your favorite music and pictures from your PC to your mobile phone's microSD card, set the microSD card as a USB mass storage.

- 1. Connect your mobile phone to your PC with the USB cable provided. Your PC will detect the microSD card as a removable storage device.
- 2. Open the notification bar, and then touch **USB connected**.
- 3. Touch **Turn on USB storage** in the dialog box that opens to confirm that you want to transfer files.

You can now transfer files from your PC to your mobile phone's microSD card.

(1) When your microSD card acts as a USB mass storage, your mobile phone will not use this memory space. Ensure that you follow the correct procedures to disconnect the USB mass storage device (your mobile phone) from the PC when you have finished transferring files.

2.9.2 Removing the microSD Card

- 1. On the Home screen, touch \blacksquare > Settings.
- 2. Scroll down the screen, and then touch **Storage > Unmount SD card**.
- 3. Carefully remove the microSD card.

3 Calling

To make a phone call, you can dial a number using the keypad or touch a number saved in your contact list, on a webpage, or in other places. When you are in a call, you can answer other incoming calls or redirect them to your voicemail. You can also set up conference calls with several participants.

3.1 Making a Call

To make a call, you can use the **Phone** application, or select a number from **Contacts** or **Call log**.

When you are in a call, you can touch \triangle to use other functions. To return to the call screen, flick the notification bar down and touch **Current call**.

Period Control Cont

3.1.1 Making a Call with the Phone Application

Your mobile phone supports the SmartDial function, that is, when you touch numbers on the dialer, the phone automatically searches among your contacts and lists the matching results ordered according to the accuracy of the match. If no contacts match the information entered, the phone will not display any result.

1. On the Home screen, touch **Phone** to display the dialer.

If you are already working with **Contacts** or **Call log**, touch the **Phone** tab.

- 2. Touch the appropriate number keys to enter the phone number.
- 3. Touch *C* to initiate the call.

During a call, touch **Dialpad** to enter other numbers on the dialpad.

- 3.1.2 Making a Call from Contacts
- 1. On the Home screen, touch **Contacts** to display the contact list. If you are already working with **Phone** or **Call log**, touch the **Contacts** tab.
- 2. In the list, touch the contact you want to call.
- 3. Touch 🦿 to dial the phone number.

3.1.3 Making a Call from Call log

1. On the Home screen, touch **Phone** > **Call log**.

If you are already working with **Contacts** or **Phone**, touch the **Call log** tab.


- 2. Touch 🦿 to the right of the log entry to dial.
- ${f Q}_{{f N}}$ If you touch and hold a log entry, the options menu will open.

3.2 Answering or Rejecting a Call

3.2.1 Answering an Incoming Call

When you receive a phone call, the incoming call screen opens. If you have previously saved the caller's number in **Contacts**, the caller's name and number are displayed. If the caller's number is not saved in **Contacts**, the caller's number is displayed.

Drag \bigcirc to the right to answer the call.




3.2.2 Ending a Call

During a call, touch **End** to hang up.

3.2.3 Rejecting an Incoming Call

Drag 💿 to the left to reject the call.



3.3 Other Operations During a Call

3.3.1 Making a Conference Call

If you receive a new call while you are already in a call, you can add the second call to the call you are in. This feature is known as conference calling. You can also set up a conference call with multiple callers.

- Contact your network operator to ask if conference calls are supported and, if yes, how many parties can participate.
- 1. To initiate a conference call, dial the number of the first participant. After you have connected to the first participant, keep the connection open, touch **Add call**.
- 2. Enter the phone number of the next person you want to invite for the conversation and touch *c*, or select someone from your **Call log** or **Contacts**. The first participant is automatically placed on hold while you do this.
- 3. Once you have connected to the second person, touch **Merge calls** to begin the conference call.
- 4. To end the conference call and disconnect from everyone, touch End.

3.3.2 Switching Between Calls

If you receive a new call while you are already in a call, you can switch between the two calls.

- 1. While you are in the first call and the second call comes in, answer the incoming call, and then touch **Swap**.
- 2. The current call is placed on hold and you are connected to the first call.

3.4 Using the Call log

The **Call log** contains a list of calls that you have dialed, received, and missed. You can use the call log to find a recently called number quickly or add a number from the call log to your contact list.

3.4.1 Adding an Entry to Contacts

- 1. If you are already working with **Phone** or **Contacts**, touch the **Call log** tab.
- 2. Touch and hold the entry you want to add to your **Contacts**.

- 3. Touch Add to contacts in the options menu.
- 4. Touch Create new contact or scroll through the contact list and touch an existing contact name.

3.5 Direct Connect Call

With Direct Connect (DC), you can instantly talk to another Direct Connect user or group of users with the push of a button.

3.5.1 Dialing Direct Connect Numbers

A Direct Connect number follows the format as below:

There are three parts to a Direct Connect number. For example: xxx*xxxxx*xxxxx or xx*xxxx*xx. You must have all three parts when calling iDEN or 3G users. Here x represents any digit from 0 to 9. And each part is separated by an asterisk. A Direct Connect number contains a maximum of 15 characters (including asterisks).

3.5.2 Making Direct Connect Calls

- 1. Touch **Phone** to display the dialer.
- 2. Enter a Direct Connect number.
- 3. Push the Direct Connect button on the left side of your phone. Begin talking after your phone plays the Chirp sound.
- 4. Release the Direct Connect button to listen. The call will end automatically if no party speaks for several seconds.

• You can also go to **Contacts** or **Call log**, and then select any Direct Connect user to place the call to that user.

Last Call Notification

Upon completion of a Direct Connect call or a DC Group call, the Last Call Notification screen will appear. It shows the contact name or number on the last call, and the date and time of the call. The screen can be cleared by touching the indicated soft key, or it will disappear after a period of time. Push the Direct Connect button from the last call screen will attempt a restart of the last call indicated.

3.5.3 Answering Direct Connect Calls

- 1. When you receive a Direct Connect call, your phone will play an incoming Direct Connect call notification. Then the caller may begin speaking, or simply wait for you to respond to the notification.
- 2. After the caller finishes speaking, or releases the Direct Connect button, you will hear a tone to indicate that the floor is now open and you may speak.
- 3. Push the Direct Connect button on the left side of your phone. Begin talking after your phone plays the Chirp sound.
- 4. Release the Direct Connect button to listen. The call will end automatically if no party speaks for several seconds.

3.6 Alerts

Alerts let you notify others that you want to communicate with using Direct Connect. When a user receives an Alert, an incoming Alert tone will be played and the caller ID (name and Direct Connect number) will be displayed.

3.6.1 Sending Alerts

- 1. Touch **Phone** to display the dialer.
- 2. Enter a Direct Connect number.
- 3. Touch Send Alert icon.
- 4. When prompted, push the Direct Connect button to send the Alert.
- You can send an Alert from the Call log or Contacts. Touch an entry with a Direct Connect number, and then touch Send Alert.

3.6.2 Responding to an Alert

Answering an Alert

Push the Direct Connect button. This will start a Direct Connect call to the sender.

Ignoring an Alert

Touch Ignore to ignore the Alert.

Storing an Alert in Notifications

If you do not respond to an Alert, the Alert will be removed from your screen and will be placed as a missed Alert icon in the Notification bar.

3.6.3 Using the Alert Notification

- 1. Open the Notification panel.
- 2. Select the missed Alert. This will take you to the call log entry for missed Alert. You can either place a Direct Connect call or send another Alert to the sender.

3.7 DC Group Calls

A DC Group call is a Direct Connect call with more than one Direct Connect user.

3.7.1 Creating DC Groups

- 1. Touch **Contacts > DC Groups**.
- 2. Touch \equiv > Create DC Group.
- 3. Touch Enter number to enter contacts to be added.
- You must add two or more contacts, or you can select two or more contacts from Contacts or Call log.
- 4. Touch \equiv > Save DC Group.
- 5. Enter the group name.
- 6. Touch **Done** to save the group.

3.7.2 Adding Group Members

You can use the **Add members** function to add participants to an active Direct Connect call or DC Group call.

- 1. Touch **Contacts > DC Groups**.
- 2. Touch and hold the group to which you want to add members.
- 3. Touch Edit DC Group.
- 4. Touch Add members.

5. Select members to add, and then touch Add.



• You can push the Direct Connect button to start the DC Group call immediately without saving the group.

6. Touch **Done** to save the group.

Adding a Member to DC Groups Stored in Contacts

- 1. Touch and hold the contact you want to add to a group.
- 2. Touch Add to DC Group.
- 3. Select the groups to which you want to add the contact.
- 4. Touch Add

3.7.3 Viewing the DC Group Details

- 1. Touch **Contacts > DC Groups**.
- 2. Touch the group you want to view. Then you can do the following:
 - Touch and hold a contact, you can make a Direct Connect call, send an Alert, or remove it from the group.
 - Save an unknown number to Contacts.
 - Touch \equiv , you can make a DC Group call, send an Invitation, edit the group, or delete the group.

3.7.4 Removing a Member from a DC Group

1. Touch **Contacts > DC Groups**.

- 2. Touch and hold the group from which you want to remove members.
- 3. Touch Edit DC Group.
- 4. Touch to remove the contact from the group.
- 5. Touch **Done** to save the group.

3.7.5 Deleting a DC Group from Contacts

- 1. Touch **Contacts > DC Groups**.
- 2. Touch \equiv > Delete DC Groups.
- 3. Select groups which you want to delete.

4. Touch **Delete** to confirm.

3.7.6 Making DC Group Calls

1. From **DC Groups** or **Call log** tabs, touch the DC Group call icon.

2. Push the Direct Connect button to start the DC Group call.

3.7.7 Answering DC Group Calls

Proceed as if answering a Direct Connect call from one user.

() Only one person at a time may speak on a DC Group call.

3.7.8 Sending a DC Group Call Invitation

You can send a DC Group Invitation to inform multiple Direct Connect users that you want to include them in a group call. The users you invite can join or decline by following prompts on the phone.

1. Touch **Contacts > DC Groups**.

- 2. Touch a DC Group to open it.
- 3. Touch 📃 > Invite.
- 4. Push the Direct Connect button to send an Invitation to all the members in the group.

3.7.9 Responding to a DC Group Call Invitation

When you receive a DC Group call Invitation, you can either touch **Join** to join the DC Group call or touch **Ignore** to ignore the Invitation if you do not want to join the DC Group call.

3.7.10 Attempting to Join a DC Group Call After it has Ended

If you attempt to join a DC Group call after it has ended, a message will display.

- If you push the Direct Connect button, the DC Group call will begin.
- If you touch **Invite**, another message will display. You can push the Direct Connect button to send an Invitation.
- If you touch **Dismiss**, then no operation will be performed.

3.8 Direct Connect Settings

Touch **Settings** > **DC settings**, and then you can control how your phone handles Direct Connect calls, DC Group calls, and so on.

- One touch DC: Set the Direct Connect button behavior.
- Exiting DC Group call I initiated: Select the check box to allow the call to continue when you exit a DC Group call you initiated.
- Add member to ongoing call: Select the check box to allow a member to add a contact to a Direct Connect or DC Group call.
- Blocked DC list: View and modify the list of users you have blocked from making a Direct Connect call to you.
- Invitation ringtone: Set your default incoming DC Group Invitation ringtone.
- Invitation timeout: Set the length of time you want the Invitation ringtone to play.
- Alert ringtone: Set your default Alert ringtone.
- Alert timeout: Set the length of time you want your Alert ringtone to play.
- My DC Number: View your DC number.
- **DC button backlight**: Select the check box to turn on the Direct Connect button light on incoming DC events.
- Vibrate for missed DC Events: Select the check box to make your mobile phone vibrate for the missed DC events.

3.8.1 Setting One Touch DC

One touch DC allows you to quickly access Direct Connect contacts when the Direct Connect button is pushed from the Home screen.

1. Touch **Settings > DC settings > One touch DC**.

- 2. Select one of the following items:
 - Off
 - Call log
 - Last call
 - Contacts

3.9 Interrupt Request

3.9.1 Sending an Interrupt Request

- 1. During a Direct Connect call or a DC Group call, when another party is speaking and you want to speak, then you can touch **Interrupt** to send a message to the speaker that you want to talk.
- 2. If the Interrupt was sent successfully, you will get a successful message.
- 3. After the speaker releases the Direct Connect button, you can push and hold the Direct Connect button to talk.

3.9.2 Responding to an Interrupt Request

During a Direct Connect call or a DC Group call, when you are speaking, you may receive an Interrupt Request from other party in the call. This is to inform you that the other party wants to speak.

Releases the Direct Connect button to open floor for the requesting party to speak.

3.10 Missed DC Event

If you are on a call and missed a Direct Connect call, a DC Group call, an Alert, or an Invitation, icons will display in the notification bar. You can open the notification panel to select a missed event notification, and then you can respond to the event.

3.11 Concurrency

3.11.1 Receiving a Voice Call During a Direct Connect Call

When you receive a voice call during a Direct Connect call, you can drag the icon on the screen left or right to answer or reject it. If you answer the voice call, the Direct Connect call will end.

3.11.2 Receiving a Direct Connect Call During a Voice Call

When you receive a Direct Connect call during a voice call, the phone displays the missed Direct Connect call screen. Touch **Ignore** to continue with the voice call; touch **Hold voice call** to put the voice call on hold, a message displays, and then you can do the following:

- Push and hold the Direct Connect button to make a Direct Connect call.
- Touch **Send Alert**, a message displays, and then you can push the Direct Connect button to send an Alert.
- Touch **Resume voice call** to return to the voice call.
- (1) If you do not respond to the missed Direct Connect call screen, then the notification will disappear after several seconds.

3.11.3 Receiving a DC Group Call During a Voice Call

When you receive a DC Group call during a voice call, the phone displays the missed DC Group call screen. Touch **Ignore** to continue with the voice call; touch **Hold voice call** to put the voice call on hold, a message displays, and then you can do the following:

- Push and hold the Direct Connect button to make a Direct Connect call to join the group call
- Touch **Invite**, a message displays, and then you can push the Direct Connect button to send an Invitation to the group members.
- Touch **Resume voice call** to return to the voice call.

3.11.4 Receiving an Alert During a Voice Call

When you receive an Alert during a voice call, the phone displays the incoming Alert screen. Touch **Ignore** to continue with the voice call; touch **Hold voice call** to put the voice call on hold, a message displays, and then you can do the following:

- Push and hold the Direct Connect button to make a Direct Connect call.
- Touch **Send Alert**, a message displays, and then you can push the Direct Connect button to send an Alert.
- Touch **Resume voice call** to return to the voice call.

3.11.5 Receiving an Invitation During a Voice Call

When you receive an Invitation during a voice call, the phone displays the missed Invitation screen. Touch **Ignore** to continue with the voice call; touch **Hold voice call** to put the voice call on hold, a message displays, and then you can do the following:

- Touch **Join** to join the DC Group call.
- Touch **Resume voice call** to return to the voice call.

3.11.6 Converting a Direct Connect Call to a Voice Call

When a quick Direct Connect call turns into a longer conversation, the phone supports the switch between a Direct Connect call and a voice call.

During a Direct Connect call, if you have saved the voice call number of the other party

on the phone, touch \equiv > **Convert to voice call** to convert the Direct Connect call to a voice call.

3.12 Using Airplane Mode

Some locations may require you to turn off your phone's wireless connections. Rather than powering off your phone, you can place it in **Airplane mode**.

- 1. Press and hold ① .
- 2. Touch Airplane mode in the options menu.

4 Contacts

The **Contacts** application enables you to save and manage information such as phone numbers and addresses of your contacts. After you save contact information on your mobile phone, you have easy access to the people with whom you want to communicate.

4.1 Opening the Contacts Application

If you have not yet added any contacts to your mobile phone, **Contacts** displays a message with hints on how to start adding contacts information.

On the Home screen, touch **Contacts** to open the **Contacts** application. All of your contacts are displayed alphabetically in a list that you can scroll through.

4.2 Importing Contacts from a USIM Card

- 1. In the contact list, touch \equiv > More > Import/Export.
- 2. Touch Import from USIM card.
- 3. Wait for the USIM card contents to be loaded. Select the contacts you want to import or touch **Select all** to select all contacts.

- 4. Touch Copy.
- 5. If you have more than one account on your phone, touch the account into which you want to import the contacts.

4.3 Adding a Contact

- 1. In the contact list, touch \equiv > New contact.
- 2. If you have more than one account with contacts, touch the account to which you want to add the contact.
- 3. Enter the contact's name, and then add detailed information such as phone number and address.
- 4. When you are finished, touch **Done** to save the contact information.

4.4 Adding a Contact to Your Favorites

- Touch and hold the contact you want to add to Favorites. Then touch Add to favorites.
- Touch a contact, and then touch the star to the right of the contact's name. The star turns gold.

4.5 Searching for a Contact

- 1. In the contact list, touch \equiv > Search.
- 2. Enter the name of the contact you wish to search for. As you type, contacts with matching names appear below the search box.

• On the contact list screen, you can touch a letter on the right to display contacts starting with the touched letter.

4.6 Editing a Contact

You can make changes to the information you have stored for a contact at any time.

1. In the contacts list, touch and hold the contact whose details you want to edit, and then touch **Edit contact** in the options menu.

- 2. Touch the category of contact information you wish to change: name, phone number, email address, or any other information you recorded earlier.
- 3. Make the desired changes to the contact information, and then touch **Done**. To cancel all of your changes, touch **Cancel**.

4.7 Communicating with Your Contacts

From the **Contacts** or **Favorites** tab, you can quickly call or send a text (SMS) or multimedia (MMS) message to a contact's default phone number. You can also open details to view a list of all the ways you can communicate with that contact. This section describes how to communicate with a contact when you view your contacts list.

4.7.1 Using Quick Contact for Android

- 1. Touch the contact's picture or picture frame (if you have not assigned a picture to the contact) to open Quick Contact for Android.
- 2. Touch the icon for the way you want to communicate with the contact.
- The icons available depend on the information you have entered for the contact, the applications installed on your phone, and the accounts you have.

4.7.2 Communicating with a Contact

- 1. In the contacts list, touch the contact that you want to communicate with.
- 2. On the contact's details screen, touch the icon to the right of the number to call or send messages.

4.8 Deleting a Contact

- 1. In the contacts list, touch and hold the contact that you want to delete, and then touch **Delete contact** in the options menu.
- 2. Touch **OK** to confirm that you want to delete the contact.

4.9 Backing Up and Synchronizing Contacts

You can back up contacts from your phone to a microSD card, or synchronize phone contacts with a server using your Google account.

4.9.1 Using a microSD Card to Back Up Contacts

Backing Up Contacts

1. In the contact list, touch \equiv > More > Import/Export.

2. Touch **Export to SD card** in the displayed menu.

3. Touch **OK** to export your phone contact's information to the installed microSD card. You can copy the .vcf files backed up on the microSD card to your computer. The files are stored in the root directory of the microSD card.

Restoring Contacts

- 1. In the contact list, touch \equiv > More > Import/Export.
- 2. Touch Import from SD card in the displayed menu.

If there is more than one .vcf files saved on the microSD card, you can choose to restore one, multiple, or all the of them.

4.9.2 Using a Google Account to Synchronize Contacts

You can synchronize contacts using your Google account. For details, see Changing an Account's Synchronization Settings.

4.10 Joining and Separating Contacts

You may have duplicate contacts if you import contacts by:

- Adding an account, such as a Gmail account.
- Using the social networking services such as Facebook or Twitter.
- Using other methods, such as exchanging emails.

To avoid duplication, join two or more contacts together to form a single contact.

Availability of Facebook or Twitter may vary depending on your country or

carrier. Please use them according to local laws and regulations.

4.10.1 Joining Contacts

- 1. On the Home screen, touch **Contacts**.
- 2. Touch a duplicated contact, and then touch \equiv > Edit contact.
- 3. Touch \equiv > Join.
- 4. Select the contact to be joined to combine two duplicate contacts.

Two contacts will be joined together and displayed as one contact. Touch the contact to view the joined information. You can see that the contact is joined together by two contacts. You can also combine more than two contacts.

4.10.2 Separating Contacts

If contact information from different sources was joined together in error, you can separate the contacts.

- 1. On the Home screen, touch **Contacts**.
- 2. Touch the joint contact to be separated, and then touch \equiv > Edit contact.
- 3. Touch \equiv > Separate.
- 4. Select OK.

The joint contact is then separated into two contacts displayed separately in Contacts.

4.11 Sending Contacts

You can send contacts as a .vcf file via Bluetooth or Email.

- 1. In the contacts list, touch \equiv > More > Send contacts.
- 2. Select contacts that you want to send.
- 3. Touch Send.
- 4. Select the way you prefer to send the contacts you have selected, for example Bluetooth or Email.

• You can send one contact by another way. Touch and hold a contact, touch **Send contact**, and then select the way you prefer to send.

5 Using the Onscreen Keyboard

5.1 Displaying the Keyboard


To enter text, use the onscreen keyboard. Some applications open the keyboard automatically. In others, touch a text field to open the keyboard.

Touch \bigcirc to hide the keyboard.

• Touch and hold a text field to open the **Edit text** menu.

5.1.1 Choosing an Input Method

- 1. Touch and hold a text field until the **Edit text** menu is displayed.
- 2. Touch Select input method.
- 3. Select the input method.
- 5.1.2 Using the Swype Keyboard



Touch once to capitalize the next letter you type. Touch twice for all caps.



- 5.1.3 Using the Android Keyboard



Touch once to capitalize the next letter you type. Touch twice to capitalize all letters to be entered.

The keyboard layout may vary slightly depending on the field where you are entering text. The previous figure is provided for your reference only. On the Home screen, touch Settings > Language & keyboard > Android keyboard > Voice input to turn on or turn off voice input.

5.1.4 Using the Landscape Keyboard

If you find the keyboard inconvenient or difficult to use, turn your mobile phone sideways. The screen will display the keyboard in landscape orientation, providing you with a wider keyboard layout.

5.1.5 Using the Phone Keypad

Press Fn and shift to switch between input modes. In different input modes, the cursor is displayed in different forms, as described in the following table.

	Cursor:	To enter the character printed at the top of a key, press $[Fn]$ first and then the desired key.
Fn	Cursor:	To enter only the characters printed at the top of keys, press Fn twice before typing. Press Fn again to switch back to the main characters printed on keys.
	Cursor:	To enter one uppercase letter, press shift first and then the desired key.
shift	Cursor: 人	To enter only uppercase letters, press shift twice before typing. Press shift again to input lowercase letters.
-		To delete a character, press — . Press and hold the key to delete more characters quickly.
L		To start a new line, press 🛥 .

5.2 Customizing Keyboard Settings

1. On the Home screen, touch **Settings > Language & keyboard**.

2. In Keyboard settings, select an input method to customize the keyboard settings.

6 Messaging

The **Messaging** application allows you to exchange text messages (SMS) and multimedia messages (MMS) with anyone using an SMS-or-MMS-capable phone. With the **Email** application you can read and send emails.

6.1 SMS and MMS

6.1.1 Opening Messaging

Touch **Messaging**.

- 6.1.2 Creating and Sending a Text Message
- 1. Touch **Messaging > New message**.
- 2. Enter a phone number or a contact's name in the **To** field, or touch **L** to select a contact from **Contacts**.

As you enter the phone number or the contact's name, the phone displays possible matches from your contacts. Select a contact from the list of possible matches or continue entering.

After you select a contact or finish entering a number, add a comma and you can enter another recipient. You can also touch a previously entered contact again to edit or delete it.

3. Touch the composition text box to start entering your message.

4. When you are ready to send the message, touch \triangleright .

Sent and received messages will be displayed in a message thread, grouping together the messages in a conversation.

6.1.3 Creating and Sending a Multimedia Message

You can use multimedia messages to make everyday communications very special. You can record a message and send it as an audio file, sing 'Happy Birthday' and send it to friend, or send a slideshow of photographs of a special event. The possibilities are endless.

- 1. Touch **Messaging > New message**.
- 2. Enter a phone number in the **To** field, or touch **1** to select a contact from Contacts.
- 3. Touch the composition text box to start entering your message.
- 4. Touch \equiv to display the options panel.
 - Touch Add subject to add the message subject. Your mobile phone is now in multimedia message mode.
 - Touch Add to add a picture, music, or video file.
- 5. When the message is ready to be sent, touch

 \clubsuit On the message editing screen, you can also touch \oslash , and then select your desired files to add.

• You can select a media file (music, video or picture) and send it as an attachment in a multimedia message. In File Manager, touch and hold a media file, and then touch Share > Messaging.

Adding a Slideshow

If you want to attach more than one file to your message, use the **Slideshow** option.

- 1. On the message editing screen, touch \equiv to display the options panel.
- 2. Touch Add > Slideshow, and then select a slide to start editing it.
- 3. Touch \equiv and then touch **More > Add slide** to add more slides.
- 4. Touch **Done** to finish composing your message and return to the multimedia message screen.
- 5. To alter your multimedia message, touch the slideshow on the multimedia message screen. When the message is ready to be sent, touch **Send**.

6.1.4 Opening and Viewing a Multimedia Message

- 1. In the message list, touch the message thread you wish to view.
- 2. Touch the multimedia message to view the message.

6.1.5 Replying to a Message

- 1. In the message list, touch a text or multimedia message thread to open it.
- 2. Touch the text box to compose your message. Once finished, touch \triangleright .

You can also do the following to reply to a message: Touch \equiv > Multiselect, select one or more message threads, and touch **Reply**.

6.1.6 Copying a Text Message to Notepad or Calendar

1. In the message list, touch a text message thread to open it.

- 2. Touch and hold one of the messages, and then touch **Copy message to**.
- 3. Touch **Notepad** or **Calendar** to save it as a note or an event.

For information about how to use **Notepad** or **Calendar**, see the relevant sections of this guide.

6.1.7 Customizing Message Settings

In the message list, touch $\overline{\equiv}$, and then touch **Settings** to customize the message settings.

6.2 Email

Your mobile phone also puts email at your fingertips. With your phone's **Email** application, you can use your email account with Yahoo!, AOL, or other popular email services on your phone.

6.2.1 Adding an Email Account

When using the **Email** application for the first time, you must configure an email account. The Email setup wizard helps you to configure your account. A number of popular email systems are supported. You can work with the same email service that you use on your PC or you can select another email service.

- 1. On the Home screen, touch **E** > **Email**.
- 2. In the email system list, select a system, or select Others.
- 3. To customize your email settings, follow the onscreen instructions, and then touch **Next**.
- 4. Enter the account name and the name you want other people to see when they receive an email from you.
- 5. Touch Done.

Adding Other Email Accounts

- 1. After creating your initial email account, touch \equiv on the **Inbox** screen, and then touch **More** > **Accounts** to access the accounts screen.
- 2. Touch \equiv on the accounts screen, and then touch **Add account** to create another email account.
- When adding an additional email account, you have the option to use the new account to send all outgoing messages.

6.2.2 Viewing an Email Message

- 1. On the accounts screen, touch the email account you want to use.
- 2. Access a folder, and then touch the message that you want to view.

6.2.3 Saving an Email Attachment

- 1. On the accounts screen, touch the email account you want to use.
- 2. Touch the email message you want to view.
- 3. Touch **Save** next to the attachment in the email.
- 4. Select a path for saving the attachment and touch **Save**.

6.2.4 Creating and Sending an Email Message

- 1. On the accounts screen, touch the email account you want to use.
- 2. On the **Inbox** screen, touch \equiv , and then touch **Compose** in the options panel.
- 3. In the **To** field, enter the recipients' name or email address.

4. Enter the subject of your message and compose the message.

To send an attachment with the message, touch Ξ , and then touch Add attachment.

5. When you are finished, touch **Send**.

If you are not ready to send the message, touch Save as draft or touch \bigcirc to save the message as a draft.

6.2.5 Replying to an Email Message

- 1. On the accounts screen, touch the email account you want to use.
- 2. Touch the email message to which you want to reply.
- 3. Touch **Reply** or **Reply all** to reply to the email message.

6.2.6 Deleting an Email Account

- 1. On the accounts screen, touch and hold the email account you want to delete.
- 2. Touch Remove account.
- 3. Touch OK.

6.2.7 Changing Email Account Settings

You can change a number of account settings, including how often you check for emails, how you are notified of a new mail, and details about the servers the account uses to send and receive mails.

- Your account's incoming and outgoing settings depend on the kind of email service you are using. You can enter the necessary details manually, although you may need to contact your email service provider to obtain the correct information.
- 1. Touch **Email**.
- 2. On the accounts screen, touch and hold the email account you want to change.
- 3. Touch Account settings.
- 4. Change General settings, Notification settings, or Server settings.

7 Getting Connected

7.1 Mobile Networks

Your mobile phone will be automatically configured to use your network operator's 2G/3G service (if available) when you turn on the phone for the first time. Note that the USIM card must be inserted (some CDMA mobile phones have an integrated UIM card and do not need a separate UIM card)

7.1.1 Checking the Network Connection

- 1. Touch **Settings**.
- 2. Touch Wireless & networks > Mobile networks.
- 3. Touch **Network operators** or **Access Point Names** to check the network connection.
- Your mobile phone will automatically read the access point settings from the USIM card (if any). For this reason, do not change the access point parameters; otherwise, you might not be able to access network resources.

7.1.2 Turning on the Data Service

- 1. Touch **Settings**.
- 2. Touch Wireless & networks > Mobile networks.
- 3. Select the **Data enabled** check box to turn on the data connection.

7.2 Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi gives you wireless access to broadband Internet. To use Wi-Fi on your mobile phone, you must have an access to wireless access points (hotspots). Obstacles that block the Wi-Fi signal will reduce its strength.

7.2.1 Turning On Wi-Fi

- 1. Touch **Settings**.
- 2. Touch Wireless & networks, and then select the Wi-Fi check box to turn on Wi-Fi.

7.2.2 Connecting to a Wireless Network

- 1. After turning on Wi-Fi, touch **Settings**.
- Touch Wireless & networks > Wi-Fi settings. You will see a list of detected Wi-Fi networks in the Wi-Fi networks section.
- 3. Touch a Wi-Fi network to connect to it.
 - If you select an open network, you will be automatically connected to the network.
 - If you select a network that is secured with Wired Equivalent Privacy (WEP) and connect to it for the first time, enter the password as prompted, and then touch **Connect**. If you connect to a secured wireless network that you have already used, you will not be prompted to enter the password again unless you have reset your mobile phone to its default settings.



• On the Wi-Fi settings screen, touch Add Wi-Fi network to add a new Wi-Fi network.

7.3 Sharing Your Phone's Data Connection

You can share your mobile phone's data connection with a single computer via a USB cable: USB tethering. You can share your mobile phone's data connection with a number of devices at the same time, by turning your phone into a portable Wi-Fi hotspot.

7.3.1 Installing the USB tethering Driver

If your computer is running Windows 7 or a recent distribution of some flavors of Linux (such as Ubuntu), you typically do not need to prepare your computer for tethering. But if you are running an earlier version of Windows or another operating system, you may need to prepare your computer to establish a network connection via USB. Install the **USB tethering** driver in the following steps:

- 1. Connect a USB cable to a computer. The computer will automatically recognize the phone.
- Choose Start > My Computer, and then double-click Mobile Partner.

- 3. Open the **drivers** folder and then open the **usbnet** driver win2k xp folder. Double-click the link DownloadActiveSync.url.
- 4. Download and install ActiveSync 4.5 or a later version.
- 5. After the installation, you are able to use USB tethering.

7.3.2 Sharing Your Phone's Data Connection via USB

To use USB tethering in different operating systems, you may need to prepare your computer to establish a network connection via USB.

- (1) You cannot share your mobile phone's data connection and access its microSD card via USB at the same time.
- 1. Touch **Settings**.
- 2. Touch Wireless & networks > Tethering and Mobile HotSpot.
- 3. Select the **USB tethering** check box to share your data connection.


7.3.3 Sharing Your Phone's Data Connection as a Portable Wi-Fi Hotspot

- 1. Touch **Settings**.
- Touch Wireless & networks > Tethering and Mobile HotSpot.
- 3. Select the **Mobile HotSpot** check box to share your data connection.
- When Mobile HotSpot is selected, you can touch Mobile HotSpot settings to change its network name or secure it.

7.4 Browser

Your mobile phone comes with an Internet browser pre-installed.

7.4.1 Opening the Browser





• When known or open Wi-Fi networks and mobile data networks are available at the same time, your phone will preferably select a Wi-Fi network for Internet access.

Touch \equiv to open the browser options menu and perform one of the following operations:

- **New window**: Touch to open a new window.
- Bookmarks: Touch to display bookmarks.
- Windows: Touch to view thumbnails of open browser windows. You can switch to another browser window or open a new one on this screen.
- **Refresh**: Touch to refresh the current webpage.
- **Forward**: Touch to browse the next web page.
- More: Touch to open other menus and perform operations such as searching, selecting text, downloading, or setting options.

7.4.2 Opening a Webpage

- 1. In a browser window, touch the URL field at the top of the screen.
- 2. Use the keyboard to enter a webpage address. You can touch \P to enter the web page address by voice.
- 3. As you enter the address, matching webpage addresses will appear on the screen. If you see the address you want, touch it and go directly to that webpage or complete entering your desired webpage.

7.4.3 Managing Bookmarks

You can store as many bookmarks as you want on your mobile phone.

Adding a Bookmark

- 1. In a browser window, go to the webpage you want to save as a bookmark.
- 2. Touch \equiv , and then touch **Bookmarks** > **Add**.
- 3. Edit the bookmark name and then touch **OK**.

Opening a Bookmark

1. In a browser window, touch \equiv , and then touch **Bookmarks**.

On the **Bookmarks** screen, touch the **History** tab to view the pages you have visited, or touch the **Most visited** tab to view the pages you have visited most frequently.

2. Touch the bookmark of the website you want to open.

7.4.4 Customizing Browser Settings

Customize the browser to suit your browsing style. Use **Browser** to set page content, privacy, and security preferences. In a browser window, touch Ξ , and then touch **More > Settings**.

7.5 Bluetooth

Your mobile phone has Bluetooth, which allows you to create a wireless connection with other Bluetooth devices so you can share files with your friends, talk hands-free with a Bluetooth headset, or even transfer photos from your phone to your PC. If you are using Bluetooth, remember to stay within 10 meters (33 feet) of the other Bluetooth devices to which you want to connect. Be aware that obstacles like walls or other electronic equipment may interfere with your Bluetooth connection.

7.5.1 Turning On Bluetooth

- 1. Touch **Settings**.
- 2. Touch **Wireless & networks**, and then select the **Bluetooth** check box to turn on Bluetooth. When Bluetooth is turned on, the Bluetooth icon appears in the notification bar.
- 3. Touch **Bluetooth settings**, and then select the **Discoverable** to make your mobile phone visible to other Bluetooth devices.

7.5.2 Pairing with and Connecting to a Bluetooth Device

Your mobile Bluetooth lets you do the following:

- Hands Free Profile (HFP): allows you to use a hands-free Bluetooth device.
- Headset Profile (HSP): allows you to use a mono Bluetooth headset.
- Object Push Profile (OPP): allows you to transfer files over a Bluetooth connection.
- Advanced Audio Distribution Profile (A2DP): allows you to use a stereo Bluetooth headset.
- A/V Remote Control Profile (AVRCP): allows you to control audio playing using a Bluetooth headset remotely.

Before you use Bluetooth, pair your mobile phone with another Bluetooth device as follows:

- 1. Ensure that the Bluetooth function on your mobile phone is enabled.
- 2. On the Home screen, touch **Settings** > **Wireless & networks** > **Bluetooth settings**. Your mobile phone will then scan for Bluetooth devices in range.
- 3. Touch the device you want to pair your mobile phone with.
- 4. If required, enter the pairing password to complete the connection.

7.5.3 Sending Files via Bluetooth

With Bluetooth, you can share pictures, videos, or music files with your family and friends. To send files via Bluetooth:

- 1. Touch and hold the file to be sent in your mobile phone or SD card. The active options menu is displayed.
- 2. Touch Share, then Bluetooth to select a paired device.
- 7.5.4 Disconnecting from or Unpairing with a Bluetooth Device
- 1. Touch **Settings > Wireless & networks > Bluetooth settings**.
- 2. Navigate to the **Bluetooth devices** section, and then touch and hold the device to which you are connected.
- 3. Touch **Unpair** to disconnect from the device.

8 Entertainment

In addition to being a communication device and personal assistant, your mobile phone also provides you with a multitude of entertainment possibilities. You can take photos, create videos and audio clips, and download and listen to music.

8.1 Taking Photos and Recording Videos


The camera is a combination of camera and camcorder that you can use to shoot and share pictures and videos.

8.1.1 Opening Your Camera

• Touch **Camera** to open the camera. The camera opens in landscape mode, ready to take a picture or record a video.

• Touch \bigcirc to close the camera.

Capture Screen



Touch to customize the camera settings.

On the capture screen, touch \equiv to show the capture panel.

8.1.2 Taking a Photo

- 1. Open your camera application and switch it to camera mode.
- 2. If necessary, change the camera settings. The preview changes as you change the settings.
- 3. Frame your photo within the photo capture screen.

4. Touch (6) to take your photo.

Photos taken are displayed for a moment. You can take another photo or review your photos.

8.1.3 Viewing Your Photos

- 1. After taking a photo, a thumbnail of the photo you have just taken is shown in the upper right corner of the capture screen. Touch the thumbnail to view it.
- 2. Touch the onscreen button to do any of the following:
 - Touch Share to send the photo in a message or post it online.
 - Touch **Delete** to delete the photo.
 - Touch **More > Set as** to set the photo as a contact icon or the wallpaper.

8.1.4 Recording a Video

- 1. Open the camera application, and then switch it to camcorder mode.
- 2. If necessary, change the camcorder settings.
- 3. Frame the scene with which you want to start your video.
- 4. Touch (•) to start recording a video.
- 5. Touch (to stop recording.

8.1.5 Viewing Your Videos

- 1. After recording a video, a thumbnail of the video you have just recorded is shown in the upper right corner of the capture screen. Touch the thumbnail to view it.
- 2. Touch the onscreen buttons to do any of the following:
 - Touch Share to send the video in a message or post it online.
 - Touch **Delete** to delete the video.

On the video playback screen, touch the controls to fast-forward or rewind or to play or pause the video.

3. If you want to view more videos, flick your finger left or right across the screen.

8.2 Using the Gallery

Your **Gallery** application can automatically search for pictures and videos on your mobile phone and microSD card. Use **Gallery** to sort photos and videos into folders, view and edit pictures, watch videos, and set a picture as wallpaper or as a photo for a contact.

8.2.1 Opening the Gallery

On the Home screen, touch **Gallery**.

The **Gallery** application categorizes your pictures and videos by storage location and displays these files in folders. Touch a folder to view the pictures or videos inside.

8.2.2 Viewing a Picture

- 1. In **Gallery**, touch the folder that contains the pictures you want to view.
- 2. Touch the picture to view it in full-screen mode.

3. Touch the screen. Then the zoom panel appears. You can zoom in or zoom out on the picture.



• The picture viewer supports the automatic rotation function. When you rotate your mobile phone, the picture adjusts itself to the rotation.

8.2.3 Rotating a Picture

- 1. When viewing a picture, touch \equiv to display the operations panel.
- 2. Touch More.
- Select either Rotate Left or Rotate Right. The picture is saved with the new orientation.

8.2.4 Cropping a Picture

- 1. When viewing a picture, touch \equiv to display the operation panel, and then touch More > Crop.
- 2. Use the cropping tool to select the portion of the picture to crop.
 - Drag from the inside of the cropping tool to move it.
 - Drag an edge of the cropping tool to resize the image.
 - Drag a corner of the cropping tool to resize the image.
- 3. Touch Save to save the cropped picture. Touch Discard to discard the changes.

8.3 Enjoying Music

You can download music files to your PC or insert a CD and copy the files to your microSD card so you can listen to music on your mobile phone.

8.3.1 Copying Music to the microSD Card

- 1. Connect the phone to your computer with a USB cable and mount the microSD card.
- 2. On the PC, navigate to the USB drive and open it.
- 3. Create a folder in the root directory of the microSD card (for example, **Music**).
- 4. Copy the music from your computer to the folder you have created.

- 5. After copying music, unmount or eject the drive as required by your PC's operating system to safely remove the mobile phone.
- 6. Disconnect the mobile phone from the PC.

8.3.2 Opening the Media Library

Touch **B** > **Music** to display the media library.

The **Music** application organizes your music files by storage location. It contains four tabs: **Artists**, **Albums**, **Songs** and **Playlists**.

8.3.3 Playing Music

- 1. Touch a category on the music library screen.
- 2. Touch the song you want to play.

When you are listening to music, touch \triangle , to use another application. Your music continues to play. To return to the music controls, open the notification panel and then touch the song.

8.3.4 Adding Music to a Playlist

- 1. Touch a category on the music library screen.
- 2. In the list that appears, select the song you want to add to the playlist.
- 3. Touch and hold the song, and then touch **Add to playlist** in the options menu.
 - Touch **Current playlist** to add the song to an existing playlist.
 - Touch **New** to create a playlist and add the song to it.

8.3.5 Playing a Playlist

- 1. Touch the **Playlists** tab on the music library screen.
- 2. Touch and hold the playlist you want to play.
- 3. Touch **Play** to play the playlist.

8.4 Listening to the FM Radio

The FM radio lets you listen to FM radio programs on your mobile phone. Since the FM radio uses the provided wired stereo headset as its antenna, before opening the application, connect the headset to your phone's the audio jack.

8.4.1 Opening the FM Radio

- 1. On the Home screen, touch **FM Radio** to open the application.
- 2. The first time you open FM radio, touch **Auto tuning**, which automatically scans for available FM channels, saves them as presets, and plays the first FM channel found.

8.4.2 Tuning the FM Radio

Open the FM Radio application, and then do the following:

- Touch \bowtie or \bowtie to tune the radio to the previous or next channel.
- Slide the knob left or right to perform precision tuning. When a channel is found,

touch Ξ , then **Save channel**. Enter the channel name, touch **OK**, and then select an empty channel to save the new channel to the channel list.

• Touch \equiv > Auto tuning to scan automatically for available FM channels.

9 Google Services

Availability of Google applications, services, and features may vary according to your country or carrier. Please follow local laws and regulations to use them.

When you turn on your mobile phone for the first time, touch a Google services such as **Talk**, **Gmail**, or **Play Store**, and you will be prompted to sign in to your Google account.

(1) Ensure that your mobile phone has an active data connection (3G/GPRS) before you sign in to your Google account.

If you already have a Google account, touch **Sign in** and enter your username and password.

9.1 Creating a Google Account

If you do not have a Google account, you can create one:

- 1. After reading the setup information, touch Next.
- 2. Touch Create.

- 3. Enter the first name, last name, and user name for your Google account, and then touch **Next**. The mobile phone will connect to a Google server to check whether the username is available. If the username you entered is already in use, you will be prompted to choose another one or select one from a list.
- 4. Enter and confirm your Google account password.
- 5. Select a security question from the drop-down menu, and then enter the answer.
- 6. Touch Create.
- 7. When the Google Terms of Service screen appears, touch I agree, Next.
- 8. Enter the characters that appear on the screen, and then touch **Next**.
- To use another Google account, go to the **Accounts & sync settings** screen, and touch **Add account** to select which type of accounts you want to add.

9.2 Gmail

Gmail is Google's web-based email service. When you first set up your phone, you may have configured it to use an existing **Gmail** account or create a new account. The first time you open the **Gmail** application on your phone, your **Inbox** will contain the messages from your **Gmail** web account.

9.2.1 Opening Gmail

On the Home screen, touch **G > Gmail**. The **Inbox** mail list appears. Any emails you decide to keep on your mobile phone will go to your **Inbox** folder.

9.2.2 Switching Between Accounts

- 1. In the mail list, touch $\overline{\equiv}$, and then touch **Accounts**.
- 2. Touch the account that contains the email you want to read.

9.2.3 Creating and Sending an Email

1. In the mail list, touch $\overline{\equiv}$, and then touch **Compose**.

2. Enter the message recipient's email address in the **To** field. If you are sending the email to several recipients, separate the email addresses with commas. You can add as many message recipients as you want.

If you want to send a copy (Cc) or a blind copy (Bcc) of the email to other recipients, touch $\overline{\equiv}$, and then touch **Add Cc/Bcc**.

3. Enter the email subject and write your email.

If you want to add a picture attachment, touch \equiv , and then touch **Attach** to select the picture you want to attach.

4. After writing your email, touch 🖾 .

9.2.4 Replying to or Forwarding an Email

- 1. In the mail list, touch the email that you want to reply to or forward.
- 2. Touch \blacktriangleleft to reply. You can also touch \triangleleft , and then touch **Reply**, **Reply all**, or **Forward**.
- 3. Do one of the following:
 - If you selected **Reply** or **Reply all**, enter your message.
 - If you selected **Forward**, specify the message recipients and add any additional text you want to include in the forwarded message.
- 4. Touch B to send, or touch B to save as a draft.

9.2.5 Searching for an Email

- 1. In the mail list, touch $\overline{\equiv}$, and then touch **Search**.
- 2. Enter the search keywords in the box, and then touch $\,\,\mathbf{Q}\,\,$.

9.2.6 Customizing Your Gmail Settings

In the mail list, touch $\overline{\Xi}$, and then touch **More** > **Settings** to customizing your **Gmail**.

9.3 Talk

Talk is Google's instant messaging service. You can use it to communicate in real time with other people using **Talk** on a phone or on the web.

9.3.1 Opening Talk

On the Home screen, touch **Talk** to open the application.

Your **Talk** account is based on the Google account you set up with your mobile phone.

9.3.2 Adding a Friend

- 1. In the friends list, touch Ξ , and then touch **Add friend**.
- 2. Enter the **Talk** instant messaging ID or Gmail address of the friend you want to add.
- 3. Touch Send invitation.

9.3.3 Accepting an Invitation

- 1. If you have invited anyone to chat or if someone else has invited you to chat, this information will appear in the friends list.
- 2. Touch a pending invitation, and then touch Accept.

9.3.4 Starting a Chat

- 1. In the friends list, touch a friend's name in the friends list.
- 2. Use the onscreen keyboard to enter text and chat with your friend.
- 3. After entering your message, touch Send.

9.3.5 Setting Notifications for New Instant Messages

Whenever you receive an instant message, your mobile phone can play a sound, vibrate, or display an icon. To set up one of these handy notifications, start in the friends list, and then touch Ξ . Then touch **Settings**. Now choose from one of the following:

IM notifications	Select the check box to receive a notification on the notification bar when you receive an instant message.
Select ringtone	Touch to choose the ringtone used for a new instant message. You will hear a short sample of the ringtone when you select it. To turn the ringtone off, select Silent .

Vibrate

Select the check box to make your mobile phone vibrate when you receive a new instant message.

9.3.6 Signing out of Talk

On the friends list screen, touch $\overline{\equiv}$, and then touch **Sign out** to quit **Talk**.

9.4 Maps

Maps lets you find your current location, view real-time traffic conditions (depending on availability in your locale), and get detailed directions to various destinations. You can view satellite images, traffic maps, or other kinds of maps of your current or other locations.

9.4.1 Enabling the Location Service

Before you open **Maps** to find your location or search for places of interest, you must enable the location service.

- 1. On the Home screen, touch **Settings**.
- 2. Touch Location & security.
- 3. In the **My Location** section, select the **Use wireless networks** check box, the **Use GPS satellites** check box, or both.

9.4.2 Opening Maps

On the Home screen, touch **B** > Maps to open the application.

9.4.3 Searching for Places of Interest

- 1. On the map, touch \equiv , and then touch **Search**.
- 2. Enter the place you want to search for in the search box, and then touch the Search icon.
- 3. Your search results will then be displayed. Touch a place you are interested in and the application will show where it is on the map.

9.4.4 Getting Directions

- 1. While viewing a map, touch Ξ , and then touch **Directions**.
- 2. Enter the starting point in the first text box, and then enter your destination in the second text box.
- 3. Touch the icon for car, public transit, or walking directions.
- 4. Touch **Get directions**. Your directions will appear in a list.
- 5. Touch a direction item on the list to show it on the map.
- 6. When you finish viewing or following the directions, touch Ξ , and then touch **Clear Map** to reset the map.

9.5 YouTube

YouTube is Google's free online video streaming service for watching, searching for, and uploading videos.

9.5.1 Opening YouTube

On the Home screen, touch **YouTube**. You will then see the YouTube screen.

9.5.2 Searching for a Video

- 1. On the **YouTube** screen, touch \equiv , and then touch **Search**.
- 2. Enter a search keyword, and then touch the Search icon.
- 3. You will see a number of search results displayed below the notification bar. Scroll through the results and touch a video to watch it.

9.5.3 Sharing a Video

From the video list on the **YouTube** screen, select a video clip and touch **W** to share the video.

9.6 Play Store

Android Play store provides direct access to applications and games which you can download and install on your phone.

9.6.1 Opening Play Store

- 1. On the Home screen, touch **Play Store**.
- 2. When you open **Play Store** for the first time, the **Google Play Terms of Service** window will appear. Touch **Accept** to continue.

9.6.2 Searching for Applications

There are a few different ways to find applications on the **Play Store** home screen, including:

- Featured applications
- List of games
- Search function
- My apps

9.6.3 Installing an Application

- 1. In the **Play Store**, select a category, and then touch the application you want to download. On the application details screen, you can view more information about this application, such as its cost, overall rating, user comments, and similar applications. When scrolling down, you can also view developer's information including other applications from the same developer and the link to the developer's website. In addition, you can send the developer an email.
- To install the application, touch **Download** > Accept & download (if it is free) or touch the button with a price (if it is not free), and confirm your download or purchase.
- 3. To check the progress of a download, open the notification panel. Most applications are installed within seconds. To stop an application from downloading, touch the cross (×).

After the application has been downloaded and installed on your mobile phone, the content download icon appears in the notification bar.

If you want to install a non-Play Store application, touch Settings > Applications, and then select the Unknown sources check box to allow installation of the non-Play Store application.

9.6.4 Uninstalling an Application

- 1. On the **Play Store** screen, touch \equiv > **My Apps**.
- 2. Touch the application you want to uninstall, and then touch Uninstall.
- 3. When prompted, touch **OK** to remove the application from your mobile phone.

10 Synchronizing Information

Some applications on your mobile phone give you access to the same personal information that you can add, view, and edit on your computer. If you add, change, or delete your information in any of these applications on the web, the updated information also appears on your mobile phone.

This is made possible through over-the-air data synchronization. The process occurs in the background and does not interfere with use of your mobile phone. When your phone is synchronizing, a data synchronization icon will be shown in the notification bar.

10.1 Managing Your Accounts

You can synchronize contacts, email, and other information on your mobile phone with multiple Google accounts or other kinds of accounts, depending on the applications installed on your mobile phone.

For example, you can start by adding your personal Google account, so your personal email, contacts, and calendar are always available. You could then add a work account, so your work-related emails and work contacts are handy. If you like, you may add multiple Google accounts or other accounts.

10.1.1 Adding an Account

When you add an account, the **Contacts** application compares contacts from the newly synchronized account with contacts from your existing mobile phone accounts and attempts to merge duplicates into a single entry in **Contacts**. While it is presented as a single contact entry, the contact data itself is not merged.

- 1. On the Home screen, touch **Settings** > **Accounts & sync**. The screen displays your current synchronization settings and a list of your current accounts.
- $\textcircled{\begin{tabular}{ll} \label{eq:linear} \label{eq:linear} \end{tabular}}$ In some cases, you may need to obtain account details from IT support. For

example, you may need to know the account's domain or server address.

- 2. Touch Add account.
- 3. Touch the kind of account to add.
- 4. Follow the onscreen steps to enter the required and optional information about the account. Most accounts require a username and password, but the details depend on the kind of account and the configuration of the service to which you are connecting.
- 5. Configure the account. Depending on the kind of account, you may be asked to configure what kind of data you want to synchronize to the mobile phone, to name the account, and for other details. When you are finished, the account is added to the list on the **Accounts & sync settings** screen.

10.1.2 Adding an Exchange Account

- 1. On the Home screen, touch **Settings > Accounts & sync**.
- 2. Touch Add account > Corporate.
- 3. Follow the instructions and enter the required information about the exchange account you want to add. For details, contact the server administrator.
- 4. Touch **Next** to display the **Account options** screen. Configure the synchronization settings for this account.
- 5. Touch **Next** to finish configuring the account settings. If emails are not synchronized properly, contact the server administrator.

10.1.3 Removing an Account

You can remove an account, deleting it and all information associated with it from your mobile phone, including email, contacts, settings, and so on. You cannot, however, remove some accounts, such as the first account you signed into on the mobile phone. If you attempt to remove certain accounts, all personal information associated with it will be deleted.

- You can only remove the first Google Account by resetting the phone to factory defaults.
- 1. On the **Accounts & sync settings** screen, touch the account to be deleted.
- 2. Touch Sign Out.
- 3. Confirm that you want to remove the account.

10.2 Customizing Your Account Synchronization

You can configure background data use and synchronization options for all the applications on your phone. You can also configure what kind of data you synchronize for each account.

For some accounts, synchronization is bi-directional; changes that you make to the information on your mobile phone are made to the copy of that information on the web. Some accounts support only one-way synchronization; the information on your mobile phone is read-only.

10.2.1 Configuring General Synchronization Settings

On the Accounts & sync settings screen, do the following:

• Select or clear the **Background data** check box to control whether applications and services can transmit data when you are not working with them directly (that is, when they are running in the background).

If you clear this option, **Gmail** stops receiving new mails, **Calendar** stops synchronizing events, and so on, until you refresh them.

• Select or clear the **Auto-sync** check box to control whether changes you make to information on the phone or on the web are automatically synchronized with each other.

For example, when this option is selected, changes that you make in **Contacts** on the phone are automatically made in Google Contacts on the web.

10.2.2 Changing an Account's Synchronization Settings

- 1. On the Accounts & sync settings screen, select Background data and Autosync.
- 2. Touch the account for which you want to change the synchronization settings. The data and synchronization screen opens, displaying a list of the kinds of information the account can synchronize.
- 3. Select the items you want to synchronize from the list. Your phone will automatically synchronize the selected items.

11 Using Other Applications

11.1 AppInstaller

You can use this installer to install more than one applications at a time.

11.1.1 Install Applications

- 1. On the Home screen, touch **AppInstaller**. Then the installer will scan and display all the applications (.apk files) in the microSD card.
- 2. In the applications list, select applications you want to install.

 ${igstyle }_{igstyle }$ You can touch $\bigstyle \equiv$, and then touch **Deselect all** or **Select all** to select and deselect all applications.

3. Touch \equiv > Install.

The applications you select will be installed in your phone.

11.2 Calendar

Use **Calendar** to create and manage events, meetings, and appointments. Depending on your synchronization settings, the calendar on your phone can be synchronized with the internet-based calendar you use.

11.2.1 Opening Calendar

On the Home screen, touch **Calendar** to open the application.

• When you add a Google Account that includes a calendar service to your phone, you can access Google calendar: Touch Ξ , and then touch **More** > Calendars.

11.2.2 Creating an Event

- 1. In any calendar view, touch Ξ , and then touch **New event** to open the **Event** details screen.
- (1) If you have more than one calendar, select the calendar where you want to save

the event.

- 2. Enter the event name.
 - If there is a time frame for the event, touch **From** and **To** to set the beginning and end times of the event.
 - If the event is a special occasion such as a birthday or a day-long activity, set the date for **From** and **To**, and then select the **All day** check box.
- 3. Enter the location of the event and a description.
- 4. Specify in **Repetition** whether the event recurs and, if it does, how frequently, and then set the time for your event reminder in **Reminders**.
- 5. Touch Done.
- To quickly create an event in the day, week, or month view, touch and hold an empty time slot, and then touch New event. A new event details screen will appear with the selected time slot and date in the From and To fields.

11.2.3 Setting an Event Reminder

- 1. In any calendar view, touch an event to view its details or an event summary.
- 2. Touch the **Add reminder** button to add a reminder, or touch the reminder's "-" button to delete an existing reminder.
- 3. Touch the reminder time, and then, from the list displayed, touch the length of time before the event when you want to be reminded. When the time comes, you will receive a notification about the event.

11.2.4 Setting Synchronization and Display

The Calendars screen displays all the calendars you have added or subscribed to for each account that is configured to synchronize events to your phone, organized by account. (Calendars for accounts you have configured not to synchronize Calendar events are not included in the list.)

- 1. In any calendar view, touch \equiv . Then touch **More** > **Calendars**.
- 2. Touch the icon next to a calendar to change whether it is synchronized and whether it is displayed.

You remain subscribed to Calendars that you configure not to store on the phone and can still work with them with Google Calendar on the web, or using other calendar services.

3. Touch OK.

11.2.5 Customizing Calendar Settings

In any calendar view, touch Ξ . Then touch **More** > **Settings** and choose from the following:

- **Hide declined events**: Select to hide events for which you have declined invitations.
- Set alerts & notifications: Touch to set event reminders to alert you, to send you a notification, or to turn off event notifications on your mobile phone.
- **Select ringtone**: Touch to select the ringtone to sound when you receive an event reminder.
- Vibrate: Select to vibrate the mobile phone when you receive an event notification.
- **Default reminder time**: Touch to select the default time before an event for event reminders to occur.

11.3 File Manager

File Manager is like having a pocket-sized personal assistant (PA), letting you organize, edit, and delete files and folders.

11.3.1 Opening File Manager

On the Home screen, touch **File Manager** to open the application.

- 11.3.2 Creating a Folder
- 1. On the **File Manager** screen, access the directory in which you want to create a new folder.
- 2. Touch \equiv to open the options panel, and then touch **New folder**.
- 3. Enter the name of the new folder in the text box.
- 4. Touch Save.
- 11.3.3 Moving or Copying a File
- 1. On the **File Manager** screen, touch \equiv to show the options panel, and then touch **Multiselect**.

2. Touch the file or folder you want to move or copy. When a file or a folder is selected, a check mark will appear.

To select or unselect all files, touch **Select all** or **Unselect all**.

- 3. Touch **Cut** or **Copy**.
- 4. Select the path where you want the file to be copied or moved. Touch Ξ to open the options panel, and then touch **Paste** to move or copy the file to the selected path.

11.3.4 Searching for a File

- 1. On the File Manager screen, touch a folder to access the directory where the file you want is located.
- 2. Touch \equiv to open the options panel, and then touch **Search**.
- 3. Write a key word of the name of your file in the search box.
- 4. Touch **Q** next to the search box. Your mobile phone will start the search.
- 5. A list of search results will be displayed. Touch a file in the list to open it.
- 6. Touch **New search** for a new search or touch the back key to return to the file manager screen.

11.3.5 Compressing or Extracting Files

Your phone supports compressing and extracting files.

- You can only compress files and folders into .zip files, but can extract both .zip and .rar files.

Compressing Files

- 1. On the File Manager screen, touch \equiv , and then touch Multiselect.
- 2. Select the files or folders you want to compress. When a file is selected, a check mark will appear.

To select or unselect all files, touch Select all or Unselect all.

- 3. Touch Compress.
- 4. Edit the save path and the name of the target file, and then touch **OK** to start compressing the files and folders.

Extracting a File

- 1. Touch and hold a compressed file.
- 2. Touch Extract.
- 3. Edit the save path for the extracted files.
- 4. Touch **OK** to start extracting.

11.3.6 Viewing Your Memory Status

On the **File Manager** screen, touch \equiv to open the options panel, and then touch **Memory Status**. The memory management screen will be displayed. This screen allows you to view the memory status and available memory on your mobile phone and microSD card.

11.4 Clock

In addition to displaying the date and time, the **Clock** application displays information about the weather and your phone. You can also use **Clock** to turn your mobile phone into an alarm clock.

11.4.1 Opening the Clock

On the Home screen, touch **Clock** to open the application.

Clock opens with the date and time displayed on your Home screen wallpaper, along with your local weather and other useful information.

11.4.2 Opening the Alarms

On the **Clock** screen, touch 🖸 to open the **Alarms**.

Adding an Alarm

- 1. On the alarm list screen, touch Add alarm.
- 2. Set the alarm, and then touch Done.

Setting an Alarm

- 1. On the alarm list screen, touch one of the alarms on the screen.
- 2. Touch **Time** to set the time of the alarm.
- 3. Touch **Repeat** to set the days when you want the alarm to sound.

- 4. Touch **Ringtone** to select a ringtone for the alarm.
- 5. Select the **Vibrate** check box to enable the phone to vibrate, in addition to playing the ringtone.
- 6. Touch **Label** to enter a name for the alarm.
- 7. Touch Done.

• The alarm clock still works when the phone is powered off.

Customizing Alarm Settings

On the alarm list screen, touch $\overline{\equiv}$, and then touch **Settings**.

11.5 Calculator

Use **Calculator** to solve simple arithmetic problems or use its advanced operators to solve more complex equations.

11.5.1 Opening Calculator

On the Home screen, touch **Calculator** to open the application.

11.5.2 Switching Between Basic and Advanced panel

On the **Calculator** screen, flick the screen to the right or left to switch between **Advanced panel** and **Basic panel**.

11.6 Notepad

Notepad features a simple text processor. In the note list, you can add, edit, and delete notes.

- 1. On the Home screen, touch **Notepad** to open the application.
- 2. Touch \equiv , and then touch **Add note** to create a note.
- 3. Touch \bigcirc > **OK** to save the note.

12 Managing Your Mobile Phone

To configure your mobile phone, touch **Settings**.

12.1 Setting the Date and Time

- (1) When your mobile phone is using the date and time settings provided automatically by the network, you cannot manually set the date, time, and time zone.
- 1. On the **Settings** screen, touch **Date & time**.
- 2. Clear the Automatic check box.
- 3. Touch **Set date**. On the set date screen, touch + or to adjust the date, month, and year, and then touch **Set** when the configuration is complete.
- 4. Touch **Select time zone**, and then select the desired time zone from the list. Scroll the list to view more time zones.
- 5. Touch **Set time**. On the set time screen, touch + or to adjust the hour and minute. Touch **Set** when the configuration is complete.
- 6. Select or clear the **Use 24-hour format** check box to switch between 24-hour and 12-hour formats.
- 7. Touch **Select date format** to select how you want the date to display on your mobile phone.

12.2 Setting the Display

- 12.2.1 Adjusting the Screen Brightness
- 1. On the **Settings** screen, touch **Display > Brightness**.
- (1) If you want to adjust the screen brightness manually, first clear the **Automatic brightness** checkbox.
- 2. Drag the slider left to make the screen darker, or right to make it brighter.
- 3. Touch **OK** to save the adjustment.

12.2.2 Adjusting the Time Before the Screen Turns Off

If your mobile phone is idle for several minutes, it will turn off the screen to save battery power. To set a longer or shorter idle time:

- 1. On the **Settings** screen, touch **Display > Screen timeout**.
- 2. Select the duration you want the screen to be illuminated.

12.3 Setting Ringers

12.3.1 Turning On Silent Mode

- 1. On the **Settings** screen, touch **Sound**.
- 2. Select the **Silent mode** check box to silence all sounds except alarms, and music and video media.

12.3.2 Adjusting the Volume

You can adjust the volume while on the Home screen or on most of the application screens (such as the screen displayed during a call or when playing music or videos). Press the Volume keys to adjust volume to the level you desire. You can also adjust the volume from the settings screen.

- 1. On the **Settings** screen, touch **Sound > Volume**.
- 2. Drag the slider left to make the volume lower, or right to make it higher.
- 3. Touch **OK** to save the adjustment.

12.3.3 Changing the Phone Ringtone

- 1. On the **Settings** screen, touch **Sound > Phone ringtone**.
- 2. In the displayed list, select an option:
 - **Ringtone**: Select a preinstalled ringtone. The ringtone plays when selected.
 - **Music**: Select the music stored in the phone or on the microSD card. The music plays when selected.

3. Touch **OK**.

12.3.4 Changing the Message Ringtone

1. On the Home screen, touch **B** > **Messaging**.

- 2. In the message list, touch \equiv > Settings > Select ringtone.
- 3. In the displayed list, select an option:
 - **Ringtone**: Select a preinstalled ringtone. The ringtone plays when selected.
 - **Music**: Select the music stored in the phone or on the microSD card. The music plays when selected.
- 4. Touch OK.

12.4 Setting Phone Services

12.4.1 Customizing Call Settings

Mobile phone service providers offer different services such as call forwarding, call waiting, fixed dialing numbers, and voicemail. You can customize many of these services if they are part of your calling plan.

On the **Settings** screen, touch **Call settings** to customize your call functions.

12.4.2 Turning on Data Roaming

- 1. On the Settings screen, touch Wireless & networks > Mobile networks.
- 2. Select the **Data roaming** check box.
- Accessing data services while roaming may incur additional charges. Ask your wireless service provider about data roaming fees.

12.4.3 Switching off the Data Service

- 1. On the **Settings** screen, touch **Wireless & networks > Mobile networks**.
- 2. Clear the Data enabled check box.

12.5 Configuring Text-to-Speech

Use the Text-to-Speech settings to configure the Android text-to-speech synthesizer, for applications that can take advantage of this feature.

12.5.1 Installing Voice Data

1. On the **Settings** screen, touch **Voice input & output > Text-to-speech settings** > **Install voice data**.

- 2. If your mobile phone does not have speech synthesizer data installed, connect to Android Play Store and let it guide you through the process of downloading and installing the data.
- 3. Follow the instructions to install the voice data.

12.5.2 Adjusting the Speech Rate

- 1. On the **Settings** screen, touch **Voice input & output > Text-to-speech settings > Speech rate**.
- 2. Select a speed at which the text is to be spoken.

12.6 Protecting Your Mobile Phone

12.6.1 Turning on Your SIM Card PIN

- 1. On the **Settings** screen, touch **Location & security > Set up SIM card lock**.
- 2. Select the Lock SIM card check box.
- 3. Use the keyboard to enter the PIN, and then touch **OK**.
- 4. To change the PIN at any time, touch **Change SIM PIN**.
- (1) You can dial emergency numbers any time from your mobile phone.

12.6.2 Protecting Your Mobile Phone with a Screen Lock

To keep your data more secure, lock the screen and/or require a screen unlock pattern every time your mobile phone is turned on or wakes up from sleep mode.

- 1. On the Settings screen, touch Location & security > Set up screen lock > Pattern.
- 2. Flick your finger vertically, horizontally or diagonally, connect at least four dots in any order you choose. Lift your finger from the screen when you are finished.

You must drag your finger between the dots on the screen to create the pattern, not simply touch individual dots.

3. Your mobile phone will record the pattern. Touch **Continue**.

4. When prompted, draw the screen unlock pattern again, and then touch **Confirm**. To change your unlock screen pattern, touch **Location & security > Change screen lock**.

12.6.3 Protecting Your Mobile Phone with a Numeric PIN

You can set up a numeric PIN to lock your phone.

- 1. On the **Settings** screen, touch **Location & security > Set up screen lock > PIN**.
- 2. Enter at least four characters.
- 3. Touch Continue.
- 4. Enter the same characters again and touch **OK**.

To change your PIN, touch Location & security > Change screen lock.

12.6.4 Unlocking Your Mobile Phone If You Forget the Screen Lock Pattern

If you have already created a Google account, you can unlock your mobile phone using the following methods.

- After you have entered the wrong sequence five times, a **Forgot pattern?** button will appear. Touch this button to enter the Google account interface. After you have entered your Google account password, you will be able to reset the unlock pattern.
- After you have entered the wrong pattern twenty times, you will be taken directly to the Google account interface. After you have entered your Google account password, you will be able to reset the unlock pattern.

12.7 Managing Applications

12.7.1 Viewing an Installed Application

- 1. On the **Settings** screen, touch **Applications** > **Manage applications**.
- 2. In the applications list, do either of the following:
 - Touch 📃 , and then touch **Sort by size**. Then touch an application to view its details.
 - Touch an application directly to view its details.

12.7.2 Uninstalling an Application

- (1) You cannot uninstall the applications that are pre-installed on the system.
- 1. On the **Settings** screen, touch **Applications** > **Manage applications**.

2. Touch an application, and then touch Uninstall.

12.7.3 Moving an Application to the microSD Card

Some applications are designed to be stored on your phone's USB storage or microSD card (depending on the model of your phone), rather than in its internal storage. Others are designed so you can change where they are stored. You may find it helpful to move large applications off your internal storage, to make more room for other applications that do not offer the option.

- 1. On the **Settings** screen, touch **Applications** > **Manage applications**.
- 2. Touch an application in the list. Then touch **Move to SD card** to move the bulk of the application from the phone's internal storage.

The **Storage** section of the application's details screen shows details about the memory used by the application. If the application can be moved, the **Move to SD card** button is active.

Touch **Move to phone** to move the application back to the phone's internal storage.

12.7.4 Ways to Free Up Your Mobile Phone Memory

- Move files and email attachments to the microSD card.
- In **Browser**, clear all temporary Internet files and Browser history information.
- Move applications to the microSD card.
- Uninstall any downloaded programs that you no longer use.
- Reset your mobile phone.

12.8 Resetting Your Mobile Phone

12.8.1 Backing Up My Data

You can use your Google account to back up your mobile phone's settings to Google servers. If you replace your mobile phone, the settings you have backed up will be transferred to the new mobile phone the first time you sign in to your Google account.

- 1. On the **Settings** screen, touch **Privacy**.
- 2. Select the **Back up my data** check box.

12.8.2 Restoring Factory Data

If you reset your phone to its factory settings, all of your personal data stored on the phone, including information about your Google account, any other accounts that you have configured, your system and application settings, and any applications you have installed will be erased. Resetting the phone does not erase any system updates you have downloaded. Using the check box provided, you can also select to erase all the data stored on the phone's internal SD card, which includes files that you have downloaded or copied there, such as music or photos.

- 1. On the **Settings** screen, touch **Privacy** > **Factory data reset**.
- 2. When prompted, touch **Reset phone**, and then touch **Erase everything**. The mobile phone resets the settings to the original factory settings, and then restarts.

13 Appendix

13.1 Warnings and Precautions

This section contains important information pertaining to the operating instructions of your device. It also contains information about how to use the device safely. Read this information carefully before using your device.

Electronic Device

Power off your device if using the device is prohibited. Do not use the device when using the device causes danger or interference with electronic devices.

Medical Device

- Follow rules and regulations set forth by hospitals and health care facilities. Do not use your device when using the device is prohibited.
- Pacemaker manufacturers recommend that a minimum distance of 15 cm be maintained between a device and a pacemaker to prevent potential interference with the pacemaker. If you are using a pacemaker, use the device on the opposite side of the pacemaker and do not carry the device in your front pocket.

Potentially Explosive Atmosphere

Power off your device in any area with a potentially explosive atmosphere, and comply with all signs and instructions. Areas that may have potentially explosive

atmospheres include the areas where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle engine. Triggering of sparks in such areas could cause an explosion or a fire, resulting in bodily injuries or even deaths. Do not power on your device at refueling points such as service stations. Comply with restrictions on the use of radio equipment in fuel depots, storage, and distribution areas, and chemical plants. In addition, adhere to restrictions in areas where blasting operations are in progress. Battery and Charger

- 2. Insert the microSD card into your mobile phone and find the **.vcf** file using **File Manager**.
- 3. Touch the **.vcf** file. The phone displays a message asking whether you want to import the contacts.
- 4. Touch **OK** to import the contacts.
- () Compatibility problems may occur with **.vcf** files created by different mobile phones and certain contact information may be lost after contacts are imported.

How Can I Use HiSuite to Import Contacts to My Phone from a Different Mobile Phone?

Your mobile phone only supports contact files in the .vcf format.

- 1. Save the **.vcf** file containing the contact information you want to import to a PC.
- 2. On the Home screen, touch Solutions > Settings > Applications > Development > USB debugging.
- 3. Use a USB cable to connect your phone to the PC.
- 4. Visit http://www.huaweidevice.com/worldwide to download and install HiSuite.
- 5. Open HiSuite and follow the instructions to complete the installation.
- Open HiSuite after the installation is complete. Click Contacts > .
 Follow the instructions and select the .vcf file you want to import.
- 7. Disconnect your mobile phone from the PC after the contacts have been imported.

How Do I Set a Song As a Phone Ringtone?

In **Music**, touch and hold the song to be set as ringtone, and then touch **Use as phone ringtone**.

On the Home screen, touch **Settings > Display > Auto-rotate screen** to disable the function.

How Do I Set an Unlock Pattern?

On the Home screen, touch **Set up screen lock > Pattern**.

Touch and hold the area where you write text and then select the input method you prefer.

How Do I Stop the Song Playing in the Background?

Touch the notification bar, flick downwards to open the notifications panel, touch the music playing notification to go to the music playing screen, and then stop playing the song.

While in a call, if you're on another screen, you can touch the notification bar, and flick downwards to open the notifications panel. Then touch the current call notification to return to the call screen.
