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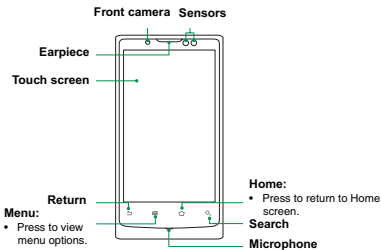
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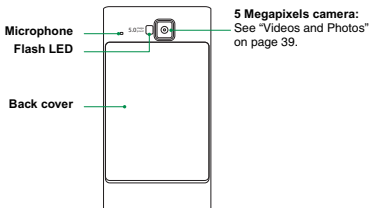
Chapter 1: Getting Started

1.1 Your Device

Headset jack:

Use a headset for hands-free conversation or listening to music.

Down



HDMI D-type connector

Micro USB connector:

- Connect USB cable to PC as a modem / USB mass storage.
- Connect USB cable and the AC adapter to charge the battery.

NOTE: The battery can also be charged while connecting to a computer.

Side

Power:

- Press and hold for 5 seconds to turn the device on or off.
- To save battery, press to temporarily turn the screen on or off.



Speakers

Volume: Press to adjust the volume.

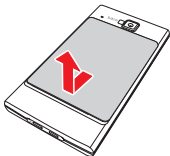

1.3 Installing SIM Card, Battery and Memory Card

To remove the back cover

1. Turn the device off.
2. Push and slide downwards to open the back cover.



SIM card

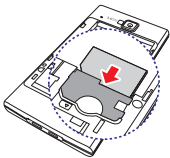
SIM card contains your phone number, memory storage, and network service details.

To install SIM card

Insert SIM card as shown. Make sure the gold contacts are facing down and the cut-off corner facing towards the battery slot.

To remove SIM card

1. Remove battery.
2. Use your finger to slide SIM card from the card slot.

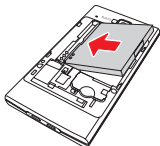


Battery

This device comes with a rechargeable Li-Ion battery. Battery life varies depending on the network and applications used and the type of connections attached to this device.

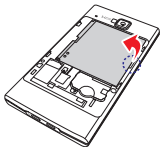
To install battery

Insert battery. Make sure the contacts of the battery are aligned with the connectors on the battery slot.



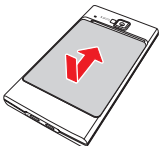
To remove battery

Use your fingertip to lift the battery tab and remove battery.



To replace the back cover

Secure the hooks on the back cover with designated holes on the device and close the back cover.



NOTE: To ensure battery performance and avoid the risk of fire:

- Use only original batteries designated for the device.
- Do not store the battery in temperatures below -10°C or higher than 45°C .

Memory card

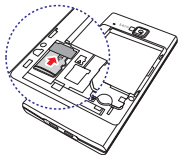
You will need a microSD® card to store photos, music, videos and other data.

To install memory card

1. Insert memory card with the gold contacts facing down.
2. Push memory card until it clicks into place.

To remove memory card

1. For safety removal, tap **Application Drawer > Settings > SD card & phone storage > Unmount SD card**.
2. Push memory card down to eject it from the slot.





1.4 Charging Battery

The battery that came with your device is only partially charged. To fully charge the battery, charge it for 2 hours.

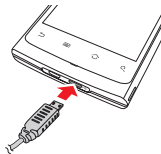
Charge the battery

1. Connect one end of the AC adaptor to the mini USB connector of the device as shown.
2. Plug the other end of the AC adaptor to the wall outlet to start charging.

When the battery is charging, the red LED is activated; the  icon is also displayed on the status bar. When the battery is fully charged, the red LED disappears and the green LED is activated; if the device is turned on, the  icon is also displayed on the status bar.

NOTE:

- Battery can also be charged when the device connects to computer through a USB cable.
- Battery life may vary depending on user usage.



1.5 Using Headset

For hands-free conversation or listening to music, plug a headset to the headset jack.

NOTE:

- When using a headset, your ability to hear outside sounds may be limited. Do not use headset if it will endanger you.
- Do not set the volume to its maximum with a headset as it may damage your hearing.

1.6 Turning the Device On or Off

After installing the SIM card and charging the battery, the device is ready to turn on.

Turn on your device

Press and hold the **Power** button until the device vibrates.

Turn off your device

1. Press and hold the **Power** button for 5 seconds.
2. A pop-up window appears, tap **Power off**.
3. Select **OK** to confirm.




Set your device to Sleep mode

To set the device to sleep mode, press the **Power** button. This turns the display off.

To turn the display on, press the **Power** button again.

1.7 Unlocking the Screen

Unlock the screen

1. Press the **Power** button to turn on the display from Sleep mode.
2. Drag  to the center of the screen to unlock the screen.

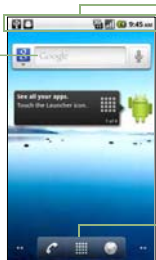


Chapter 2: The Basics

2.1 Home Screen

From Home screen, you can quickly access common features and view notifications of missed calls, received messages, check battery and connection status.

Google Search
Enter the text you want to search in the box.



Status bar

- Displays status and notification icons and clock.
- Message, appointment, task, and connection notifications are also displayed here.

Application Drawer

Tap to view the applications and device settings.

Shortcut Menu

Tap an icon to access the application.

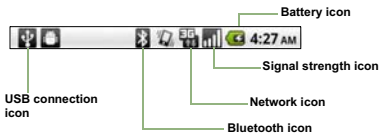
Status Bar Icons

The Status bar icons indicate different types of information. Tap the status bar and scroll down to view ongoing phone activities or notifications easily.

To close the window, press ↶.



The icons on the status bar indicates the following information:



Volume icon

The following icons may appear on the volume icon area.

Icon	Description
	Sound is off.
	Vibrate mode is activated.
	Speakerphone is on.
	Phone is muted.

To adjust the volume, see "Adjusting the Volume" on page 14.

Phone Network icon

The following icons may appear on the phone network icon area.

Icon	Description
	No network signal.
	Maximum signal strength. Fewer bars indicate lower signal strength.
	GPRS network is in use.

Battery icon

The following icons may appear on the battery icon area:







Icon	Description
	Battery is full.
	Battery is low.
	Battery is charging.

To charge the battery, see "Charging Battery" on page 5.

Icon	Description
	Call is in progress.
	Call is on hold.
	No SIM card inserted.








Connection icon

The following icons may appear on the connection icon area.

Icon	Description
	WiFi is connected.
	Bluetooth connection is active.
	GPRS data connection is active.
	HSDPA data connection is active.
	Device is connected to PC via USB connector.
	File has been downloaded.



Notification icon

The following icons may appear on the notification icon area.

Icon	Description
	New text message notification.
	New WAP Push notification.
	New email notification.
	New Google mail notification.
	Alarm.
	Task notification.
	Missed call notification.

Shortcut Menu

The Shortcut menu displays notification or other information of each menu item. To easily access the menu, tap the item on the Home screen.

Icon	Menu Item	Description
	Phone	Display device keypad. Tap to enter the phone number and make calls.
	Browser	Tap to browse the web pages.



Customizing Shortcut menu

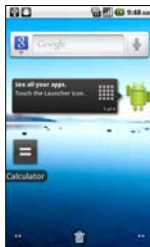
To add a shortcut:

1. Tap **Menu > Add > Shortcuts**.
2. Tap **Applications** to display the list of applications.
3. Tap to add the items that you want to appear on the Home screen.



To remove a shortcut:

1. Tap and hold the desired shortcut icon. The icon enlarges.
2.  appears on the bottom of the Home screen.
3. Drag the icon to  to delete. The shortcut icon is then removed.





Using Widgets

Save time with live updates right on the Home screen and get all your personalized updates in one place.

You may add and customize the Widgets on the Home screen as you like.


1. From the Home Screen, tap **Menu > Add > Widgets**.
A list of all available widgets is displayed.
2. Tap to select the widget you want to appear on the Home screen.

To remove widgets:

1. From the Home screen, tap and hold the desired widget. The widget enlarges and  appears at the bottom of the Home screen.
2. Drag the widget to  to delete. The widget is then removed.



Application Drawer

The Application Drawer contains all applications and settings. On the Home screen, tap  to display the menu.

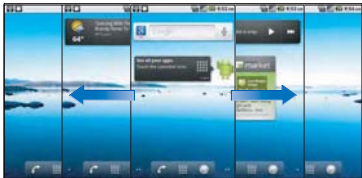
- Swipe your finger up or down to view more applications.
- Tap an icon to open the application.



Extended Home Screen

Swipe your finger to the left or right across the Home screen.

The two extensions to the left and to the right of the Home screen provide more space for icons, widgets, shortcuts, and other items.

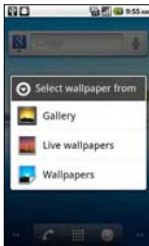


Setting Wallpaper

You can customize the wallpaper of your Home screen with a default wallpaper or with pictures taken with this device.

Set wallpaper from Pictures

1. From the Home Screen, tap **Menu > Wallpaper**.
Select wallpaper from is displayed on screen.
2. Tap **Gallery**.
3. Tap to select pictures taken by the phone camera or saved on your microSD card.
4. You will see thumbnail images of all pictures. Tap to select the picture you want to use as wallpaper.
5. Drag your finger to select the crop area and tap inside the box to crop the image.
6. Tap **Save** and the cropped image appears as wallpaper on the Home screen.



Set wallpaper from Wallpaper gallery

1. From the Home Screen, tap **Menu > Wallpaper**.
Select wallpaper from is displayed on screen.
2. Tap **Wallpapers**.
3. All system wallpapers are displayed. Swipe your finger left or right to view all available wallpapers.
4. Tap to preview the wallpaper.
5. Tap **Set wallpaper** to apply your selection.


2.2 Adjusting the Volume

This device features four types of volume which can be adjusted separately:

- **Ringer volume:** Set the volume for incoming calls and notifications.
- **In-call volume:** Set the volume during a call.
- **Media volume:** Set the volume for music and videos.
- **Alarm volume:** Set the volume for alarms.

To adjust ringer volume

1. Tap **Application Drawer > Settings > Sound**.
2. Tap **Volume**.
3. To adjust the ringtone volume, do either of the following:
 - a. Drag the volume slider to adjust the volume.
 - b. Press the volume button to adjust the volume.

NOTE: When the device is set to silent mode, all sounds are turned off except media and alarm.
4. Tap  to exit the menu.

To adjust in-call volume

During a phone call, press the volume button to adjust the volume.

To adjust media/alarm volume

1. Tap **Application Drawer > Settings > Sound**.
2. Tap **Volume**.
3. Drag the media/alarm volume slider to adjust the volume.



2.3 Contacts

Contacts is your phonebook that lets you store names, phone numbers, email addresses and other information. Contacts are stored in the phone memory. You can save information such as names, pictures, phone numbers, e-mail addresses, etc. You can also add the frequently used contacts to the favorites list. See "Favorite Contacts" on page 17.

Adding a Contact

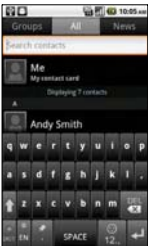
1. Tap **Application Drawer > Contacts**.
2. Tap **Menu > New contact**.
3. Enter contact information such as name, phone number, email address etc.
4. Tap **Done** to save the contact or tap **Revert** to exit without saving any changes.



Searching for Contacts

On the Contacts screen, do any of the following to easily search for contacts:

- In the search box, type the first few letters of the contact to search, or tap **Menu > Search**. The list is filtered as you type.
- Tap an alphabetical index to view contacts that start with the letter. For example, to view names that start with "k", tap "k" and the list of contacts will be displayed.



Importing Contacts

You can import contacts from the SIM card or the memory card to this device.

1. Tap **Application Drawer > Contacts**.
2. Tap **Menu > Import/Export**.
3. Select **Import from SIM card** or **Import from SD card**.
4. Select contacts to import, tap **Menu** to select **Import all** or select vCard files to import.



Backing Up Contacts

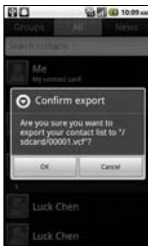
You can copy the contacts to the memory card to back up the contact information.

Export contacts to the memory card

1. Tap **Application Drawer > Contacts**.
2. Tap **Menu > Import/Export > Export to SD card**.

NOTE:

- Copying contacts to the memory card will overwrite the old backup file.
3. A warning message pops up, tap **OK** to proceed. All contacts are copied to the memory card.

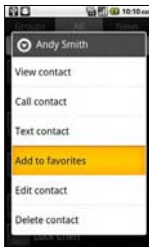


Favorite Contacts

You can add the most frequently called contacts to the favorite contact list which helps you to access the contacts quickly and easily.

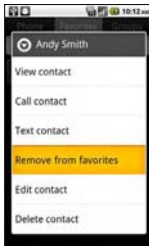
Add to Favorites

1. Tap **Application Drawer > Contacts**.
2. From the contact list, tap and hold the desired contact.
3. Tap **Add to favorites**.
The contact is now in the favorites list.



Remove from Favorites

1. Tap **Application Drawer > Contacts**.
2. Tap **Favorites** tab.
The favorites list is displayed.
3. Tap and hold the desired contact to display the submenu.
4. Tap **Remove from favorites**.
The contact will be removed from the favorites list.





Chapter 3: Using the Phone

To open Phone screen, do any of the following:



- On the home screen, tap **Phone**.
- Tap **Application Drawer** > **Phone**.

3.1 Making a Call

To make a call from the Phone screen

1. Tap **Application Drawer** > **Phone**.
2. Tap the phone number on the keypad.
3. Tap  to erase a wrong number. Tap and hold  to erase the entire number.

NOTE: To call a contact, tap the contact from the list.

4. After entering the phone number, tap .
5. To end the call, tap .



To make a call from Contacts

1. Tap **Application Drawer** > **Contacts**.
2. Tap the desired contact.
3. Tap **Call mobile**, **Call work**, or **Call home**.



To manage other voice call features

- Tap **Add call** to place a second call while putting the current caller on hold.
- Tap **Dialpad** to display the on-screen keypad.
- Tap **Bluetooth** to route the device's audio through a connected Bluetooth device.
- Tap **Mute** to mute or unmute the microphone.
- Tap **Speaker** to activate or deactivate the Speakerphone.



3.2 Answering a call

To accept or reject an incoming call

- To answer a call, drag  to the right side.
- To reject the call, drag  to the left side.

Your device notifies you of incoming calls in the following ways:

- The device rings or vibrates.
- The screen displays an incoming call message. If the caller is listed in your Contacts, the contact's name appears. You may also see the caller's phone number, if available.



Chapter 4: Entering Information

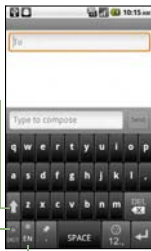
4.1 On-Screen Keyboard

On-screen keyboard appears in portrait mode when an application requires text input, such as messaging, and writing emails. The keyboard input method is activated by default.

CAPs Lock selector arrow

Tap to toggle between upper case or lower case text input method.

Dictionary:
Tap to enable dictionary.



Input method selector: Tap to choose your preferred input method.

Using the On-Screen Keyboard

Tap the screen to display the on-screen keyboard.






Lower case keyboard (default)



Upper case keyboard



Numbers and symbols

- Use the on-screen keyboard as you would a computer keyboard.
- Tap the keys to enter characters.
- To toggle between upper and lower case letter display, tap .
- To display the numeric and symbols keyboard, tap . Tap  to toggle back.

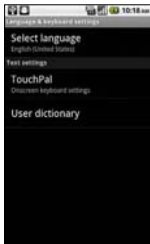
Setting the Input Method

This device supports several text input methods, select your preferred method.

1. Tap **Application Drawer > Settings > Language & keyboard**.
2. In Language & keyboard settings, a list of the input methods is displayed. Select and check the options you prefer.

Changing Input Method

1. Press and hold any text-field in an application. For example, in **Messaging**, tap and hold the field **"To:"**. The Input Method Screen pops up.
2. Select an available input methods to use.





4.2 Configuring Device Keyboard Settings

You can use keyboard aids to help you when you input text using the on-screen keyboard.

1. Tap **Application Drawer > Settings > Language & keyboard**.
2. Tap **TouchPal**.
3. Select the applicable options from the following Basic settings, Prediction & Gestures, Chinese, and Handwriting submenus.
 - **Basic settings:** available options are Word prediction, Key press sound, Key press vibration, Layout in portrait mode, Layout in landscape mode, Swipe to switch layout, Mixed language input, and Select languages.
 - **Prediction & Gestures:** available options are Predict next word, Correct mistyping, Slide-down symbols, and Relevant words.
 - **Chinese:** tap **Ambiguous PinYin** to see more options.
 - **Handwriting:** available options are Stroke width, Recognize interval, Stroke Color, and Help.



Chapter 5: Email & Messaging

Use **Messaging**  to access text and MMS messages. Use **Email**  to send and receive email messages via your internet e-mail accounts.

5.1 Text Message

A text message can only contain letters, numbers and symbols.

Creating and Sending a Text Message

This device offers several ways to create and send a new text message.

From Messaging screen

1. Tap **Application Drawer > Messaging**.
2. Tap **New message**.
3. In the **To** field, enter the recipient's phone number, then tap **Next**.
4. Type message in the **Type to compose** field, then tap **Done**.
5. Tap **Send** to send your message.

From Call log

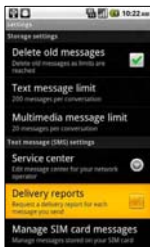
1. Tap **Application Drawer > Contacts**.
2. Tap the Call log tab to view all call history.
3. Tap and hold a call from the Call log.
4. Tap **Send text message**.
5. Compose your message.
6. Tap **Send**.

Note: If you exit Messaging before sending, the unsent message will be automatically saved as a draft.



Request message delivery notification

1. In **Messaging**, tap **Menu > Settings** to access SMS and MMS settings.
2. Tap to check **Delivery reports** check box.
3. Tap **⌵** to exit the menu.



Receiving and Managing Messages

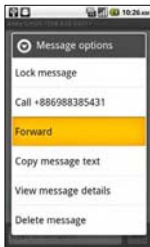
When you send and receive messages from a contact, these messages are grouped as a message thread. A message thread looks like an exchanged conversation.

Reply to a text message

1. Tap **Application Drawer > Messaging**.
2. Tap a message thread to open it.
3. Tap **Type to compose** to enter your message.
4. Tap **Send**.

Forward a text message

1. Tap **Application Drawer > Messaging**.
2. Tap to view a message thread.
3. Tap and hold a message to display the message options.
4. Tap **Forward**.
5. In the **To** field, enter the recipient's phone number.
6. Tap **Send**.



Delete all text messages

You can delete all text threads in Messaging.

1. Tap **Application Drawer > Messaging**.
2. Tap **Menu > Delete threads**.
3. Tap **Delete** to confirm.

Delete one message thread

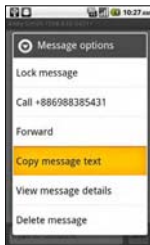
1. Tap **Application Drawer > Messaging**.
2. Tap and hold the message thread you want to delete.
3. Tap **Delete thread**.
4. Tap **Delete** to confirm.



Copy message text

You can use this function to copy the text from a message to a new message you are composing.

1. Tap **Application Drawer > Messaging**.
2. Tap a message thread to open it.
3. Tap and hold the message to display the options.
4. Tap **Copy message text**.
5. Tap and hold **Type to compose**.
6. Tap **Paste** to paste the copied texts to your new message.



5.2 Multimedia Message

A Multimedia message or MMS can contain letters, an image, an audio or video file.

Creating and Sending an MMS Message

This device offers several ways to create and send an MMS message.

1. Tap **Application Drawer > Messaging**.
2. Tap **New Message**.
3. Tap **Menu > Add subject**.
The message automatically converts to an MMS message.
4. In the **To** field, enter the recipient's phone number or email address.
TIP: To add recipients from **Contacts**, tap **To** and enter at least two numbers of a contact number or two characters of a contact name. Then the corresponding contact will be listed for you to select.
5. Enter a subject.
6. To insert a picture or video file, tap **Menu > Attach**.
7. To insert text, tap **Type to compose**, then enter your message.
8. To insert an audio file, tap **Menu > Attach > Audio**.
9. Tap **Send MMS**.

From the Call log




1. Tap **Application Drawer > Contacts > Call log**.
2. Tap and hold a call from the Call log.
3. Tap **Send text message**.
4. Tap **Menu > Add subject** to convert to an MMS message. To enter subject, tap **Subject**.
5. To insert a picture or video file, tap **Menu > Attach**.
6. To insert an audio file, tap **Menu > Attach > Audio**.
7. To insert text, tap **Type to Compose**, then enter your message using the on-screen keyboard.
8. Tap **Send MMS**.



5.3 Voice Message

This device supports sending of Voice message.

Create a voice message

1. Tap **Application Drawer > Messaging**.
 2. Tap **New Message**.
 3. Tap **Menu > Attach > Record audio**.
 4. Tap  to record your message.
 5. Tap  to stop recording.
 6. Tap  to listen to your recording.
 7. Tap **Use this recording** to proceed or **Discard** to return to the compose message screen.
8. Tap **Play** to listen to your recording again, or tap **Remove** to delete your recording from the MMS message.
 9. Enter the recipient's phone number in the **To** field.
 10. Tap **Type to compose** to enter your message, and tap **Send MMS**.

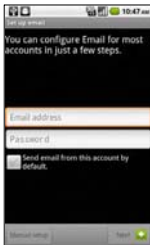


5.4 Email Accounts

This device can send and receive emails just as you do with a computer. This device supports Internet email: email account provided by an Internet Service Provider (ISP) or web-based email, such as Gmail, Hotmail, Yahoo! Mail, etc.

Setting Up an Internet Email Account

1. Tap **Application Drawer > Email**.
2. Enter your **Email address** and **Password**.
3. Tap **Next**. The device will automatically retrieve the email settings.
 - To add another email account, tap **Menu > Accounts > Menu > Add account**.
4. Enter **Name** and **Account display name**.
NOTE: The **Account display name** is the name shown on the Home screen and the Email screen.
5. Tap **Done**.



Opening Email

From the Application Drawer, tap **Email** to view your emails.

Select an account

1. Tap **Application Drawer > Email**.
The account picker screen lists the available email accounts.
2. Tap the account you want to access.

Configure email settings

Configure message settings using the **Account settings** submenus.

1. On Your accounts screen, tap to select an email account.
2. Tap **Menu > Account settings** to open the email setting submenus.



5.5 Using Email

Composing and Sending an Email

1. Tap **Application Drawer** > **Email**, then tap an email account.
2. Tap **Menu** > **Compose**.
3. In the **To** field, enter the recipient's email address.
4. To enter a subject, tap **Subject**.
5. Compose your email.
6. Tap **Send**.



Send an Email from Contacts

You can send an email to a contact with an email address stored in Contacts.

1. Tap **Application Drawer** > **Contacts**.
2. Tap a name to open contact.
3. Tap **Email home**.
4. Enter a subject and compose your email.
5. Tap **Send**.

Add attachments to an email message

1. Before sending your message, tap **Menu** > **Add attachment**.
2. Select a folder and select the file you want to attach.



Receiving Emails

Emails are automatically received in Inbox folder when the device connects to a network.

Manually receive e-mails

1. Tap **Application Drawer** > **Email**, then tap an email account.
2. Tap **Menu** > **Refresh**.

Reading and Replying to Emails

The Inbox displays the email headers. When you open the email, it shows only a part of the message, unless it is a very short message. Download the email to view the complete content.

Download attachments

- With POP3 email accounts, attachments are downloaded when you download the complete message.
- With IMAP4 email accounts, tap the attachment to mark it for download. The attachment is downloaded the next time you connect to your email server.

NOTE: Only supported file types can be opened on this device.

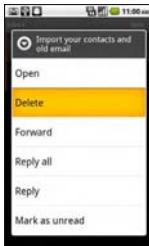
Reply or forward an e-mail

1. Open the message.
2. Do any of the following:
 - Tap **Reply** or **Reply all** to reply the email.
 - Tap **Menu** > **Forward**. Then enter the recipient in the **To** field.
3. Compose your message.
4. Tap **Send**.

Managing Email Folders

Delete an email

1. Tap **Application Drawer** > **Email**, then tap an email account.
2. Tap **Inbox** to view the inbox messages.
3. Tap and hold the message.
4. Tap **Delete**.



To move between messaging accounts

If you are viewing the messaging list screen of one account and you want to view the list of another account, tap **Menu** > **Accounts**, then tap the account you want to view.

Customizing Email Settings

You can configure the general settings of your email account such as account name, email checking frequency, default account, notifications, and server settings.

Set up your account name

1. Tap an email account.
2. Tap **Menu > Account settings** to view the email account settings.
3. Tap **Account name** to change the account name.
4. Tap **OK** to confirm.

Set up the email checking frequency

1. Tap an email account.
2. Tap **Menu > Account settings** to view the email account settings.
3. Tap **Email check frequency**.

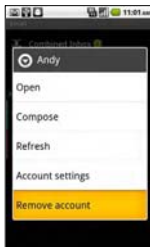
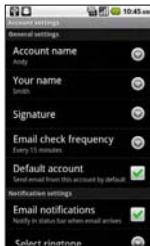
You can set the device to automatically check for new email every 5 mins, every 10 mins, every 15 mins, every 30 mins, every hour, or never.

Set up default account

1. Tap an email account.
2. Tap **Menu > Account settings** to view the email account settings.
3. Tap **Default account** to send email from this account by default.

Delete an email account

1. Tap **Application Drawer > Email**.
2. Tap and hold the account to delete.
3. Tap **Remove account**.
4. Tap **OK** to confirm.



Chapter 6: Using Internet

6.1 Connecting to Internet

This device connects to Internet via:

- Wi-Fi
- Cellular Data Networks

Wi-Fi

Turn Wi-Fi on or off

1. Tap **Application Drawer > Settings > Wireless & networks**.
2. Tap to check the **Wi-Fi** function and turn Wi-Fi on or off.




Connect to a Wi-Fi network

1. Turn Wi-Fi on.
2. Tap **Wi-Fi settings**. The device scans for Wi-Fi signals.
3. Detected networks are displayed below. Tap a network connection then tap **Connect**.
4. If you select an unsecured network, the connection is automatically established.
5. Otherwise, proceed to the next step.



- When connecting to a secured network, you will be prompted for the password. Enter the password, then tap **Connect**.

When Wi-Fi is connected, the  connection icon is displayed on the status bar.



Add Wi-Fi network

- Tap **Application Drawer > Settings > Wireless & networks**.
- Tap **Wi-Fi settings**.
- In Wi-Fi networks, tap **Add Wi-Fi network**. A new window is displayed.
- Follow the on-screen instructions and enter the necessary information, then tap **Save** to save the settings.



Configure Wi-Fi settings

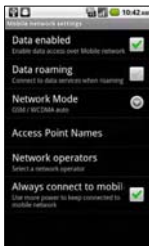
1. Tap **Application Drawer > Settings > Wireless & networks.**
2. Tap **Wi-Fi settings > Menu > Advanced.**
NOTE: If you use static IP, enter the IP settings as required.
3. Tap **Use static IP.**
4. In IP settings, enter the IP address, gateway, netmask, and DNS. Tap **OK** to save your settings.



Cellular Data Network

Check the availability of these connections with your network service provider and obtain the following information:

- Access Point Names
- Proxy
- Port
- User name
- Password



Set up wireless data connection

1. Tap **Application Drawer > Settings > Wireless & networks**.
2. Tap **Mobile networks > Access Point Names**.
3. Tap **Menu > New APN**.
4. Tap **Name** to enter a name for the connection, then tap **OK**.
5. Enter the **APN**, then tap **OK**.
6. Enter the **Proxy**, **Port**, **Username**, and **Password** (if available) etc., then tap **OK**.
7. Tap **Save** to store your settings or tap **Discard** to exit without saving the changes.




Starting a Data Connection

Data connection is automatically activated when the device is turned on. If you set up multiple data connections, select the connection you want to use manually.

Manually start a data connection

1. Tap **Application Drawer > Settings**.
2. Tap **Wireless & networks > Mobile networks > Access Point Names**.
3. A list of connections will be displayed. Tap the connection you want to use.

6.2 Browsing a Web Page

1. On the home screen, tap **Browser** or tap **Application Drawer > Browser**.
2. Tap the address bar.
3. Type the URL then tap  .



To scroll the page

To scroll up or down, swipe your finger down or up. To scroll left or right, tap and swipe your finger to the right or left.

Quick search on your phone and the web

From the Home Screen, you can search information on your phone and on the web with **Google Search**.

To search information by entering text


1. Tap **Application Drawer > Google Search** or tap **Google Search** widget.
2. Enter the text you are searching in Quick Search Box.
3. As you type, matching items on your phone and suggestions from Google web search are added to the list of previously chosen search results.

If what you are searching for is in the list of suggestions, phone search results, or previously chosen search results, tap it in the list. The item opens in the appropriate application, such as Contacts or the Browser.

4. If what you are searching is not in the list, tap  in the Quick Search Box. The Browser opens, displaying results of a Google search on the web.



To search information by speaking

1. Tap  in the Quick Search Box.
2. A dialog opens, prompting you to speak the words that you want to search for.
3. When you are finished speaking, **Voice Search** analyzes your speech and displays the results of your search.
If **Voice Search** misunderstood you, Quick Search Box presents a list of similar-sounding search terms.



Chapter 7: Using Bluetooth

Bluetooth modes

- **On:** Bluetooth is turned on. This device detects other Bluetooth devices, but this device is not visible to others.
- **Discoverable:** Bluetooth is turned on and this device is visible to other Bluetooth devices.
- **Off:** Bluetooth is turned off.

To turn Bluetooth on or off

1. Tap **Application Drawer > Settings > Wireless & networks**.
2. Tap to check **Bluetooth** and activate.
3. To make your phone visible to others, tap **Bluetooth settings** and check **Discoverable** to make this phone visible to other devices.

7.1 Connecting to Bluetooth Devices

A connection to a Bluetooth device is called a partnership. You need to pair and create a partnership with a Bluetooth device to exchange information.

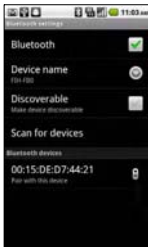
1. Tap **Application Drawer > Settings > Wireless & networks**.
2. Tap **Bluetooth settings** to view the menu options.
3. To search for a new device, tap **Scan for devices**.
4. Tap the device to connect.
5. Enter the **PIN** to start pairing, then tap **OK**.

NOTE: PIN of the device must be the same PIN on the other Bluetooth pairing device.

6. If you connect with an audio device which only supports HSP/HFP, "**Connected to phone audio**" will be displayed on the screen.
7. If you connect with audio device which supports HSP/HFP/A2DP, "**Connected to phone and media audio**" will be displayed on the screen.

NOTE: Tap and hold the selected device to enter device options menu.

NOTE: Once a partnership has been created, connecting to that device again will no longer require entering the passcode.

To focus on the image before taking the shot, tap and hold . The focus frame turns red to indicate that the focus is set.

Reviewing a Video

After recording a video, the video preview appears on of the screen.

- Tap **Gallery** to view all files saved in the gallery.
- Tap **Share** to share the video via Messaging, YouTube, Bluetooth, Email, or Gmail.
- Tap **Play** to playback the video clip.
- Tap **Delete** to delete the video.



Reviewing a Photo

After taking a photo, the photo preview appears on the screen.

- Tap **Gallery** to view the files saved in the gallery.
- Tap **Share** to share the picture via Messaging, Picasa, Bluetooth, Email, or Gmail.
- Tap **Set as** to set the current picture as Contact icon or Wallpaper.
- Tap **Delete** to delete the picture.



Configuring Camera Settings

Tap the icon (on the left/right side of the screen) to access the respective camera/ camcorder menu. Swipe your finger up and down to scroll the page for more options.



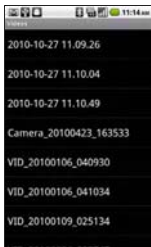

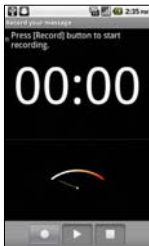
9.33 Voice Note

To record a voice note

1. Tap **Menu > Voice Note**.
2. Tap **Menu > Record**.
The recording screen is displayed.
3. Tap  to record your voice. To stop recording, tap .
4. Tap **Use this recording** to save the file.

To play a voice note

1. Tap **Menu > Voice Note**.
A list of voice notes is displayed.
2. Tap the voice note you want to listen.
The voice note is played with the Music player.



9.34 Voice Search

Speak your query to search item on Google, or for applications or contacts on your device.

1. Tap **Application Drawer** > **Voice Search**.
2. A dialog opens, prompting you to speak the words that you want to search for.
3. When you are finished speaking, **Voice Search** analyzes your speech and displays the results of your search.
If **Voice Search** misunderstands you, Quick Search Box presents a list of similar-sounding search terms.



9.35 YouTube

YouTube is an online video streaming service that allows you to view, search, and upload videos.

1. Tap **Application Drawer** > **YouTube**.
2. Videos are grouped into categories, such as Featured, Most popular, Most viewed, Top rated, and more. Tap a category to see the available videos for that category.
3. Tap a video to play it.



Chapter 10: Managing Your Phone

10.1 Device Settings

Tap **Application Drawer > Settings** to view and adjust the settings of this device. The Settings menu is categorized into: **Wireless & networks**, **Call settings**, **Sound**, **Display**, **Location & security**, **Applications**, **Accounts & sync**, **Privacy**, **SD card & phone storage**, **Language & keyboard**, **Voice input & output**, **Accessibility**, **Date & time**, and **About phone**.

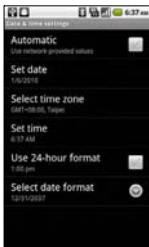

10.2 Changing Basic Settings

Date and Time

To set the date and time


1. Tap **Application Drawer** > **Settings** > **Date & time**.
2. Tap **Set date** to set the date.
 - To adjust the date, tap the month, day, or year field, and tap + or - to increase or decrease the value. Tap **Set** to apply the values.
 - To change the date format, tap **Select date format**, and select the date format from the list.
3. Tap **Set time zone** to select the time zone from the list.
4. Tap **Set time** to set the time.
 - To adjust the time, tap the hour, minute, second or AM/PM field, and tap + or - to increase or decrease the value. Tap **Set** to apply the values.
 - To use 24-hour format, tap **Use 24-hour format**.

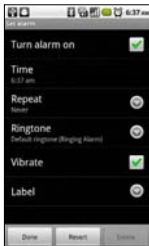


Setting Alarms

You can set up alarms on this device.

To set the alarm

1. Tap **Application Drawer** > **Clock**.
2. Tap .
3. To add an alarm, tap **Add alarm**.
4. Tap the + and - icons to set the alarm time, and tap **Set**.
5. To set repeat mode, tap **Repeat**. Tap one or more options, then tap **OK**.
6. To set the ringtone, tap **Ringtone**. Tap an option, then tap **OK**.
7. To vibrate when alarm sounds, check **Vibrate**.
8. To enter an alarm label, tap **Label**.
9. After all settings are completed, tap **Done**.



Display Settings

The display settings of this device affect the battery and external power level.

To turn off backlight when the phone is idle

1. Tap **Application Drawer > Settings > Display** to enter the submenu.
2. Tap **Screen timeout**.
3. Select from the screen timeout list. Your setting is automatically saved.

To adjust brightness

1. Tap **Application Drawer > Settings > Display** to enter the submenu.
2. Tap **Brightness**.
3. Drag the **Brightness** slider to adjust brightness settings, and tap **OK**.

To change the screen orientation

1. Tap **Application Drawer > Settings > Display** to enter the submenu.
2. Tap **Auto-rotate screen** to check the box to automatically switch the screen orientation when rotating the device.

Ring Settings

You can assign a ringtone and a ringtone type for various events such as an incoming call, new message received, among others.

To change the ring tone and ring type of an incoming call

1. Tap **Application Drawer > Settings > Sound**.
2. Tap **Phone ringtone**.
3. Select the desired ringtone from the lists.
4. Tap **OK** when finished.

To change the ring tone of other events

1. Tap **Application Drawer > Settings > Sound**.
2. Tap **Notification ringtone**.
3. Select the desired ringtone from the lists.
4. Tap **OK** when finished.

10.3 Using Wireless & networks

Wireless & networks allows you to manage Wi-Fi, Bluetooth, airplane mode, and mobile networks.

1. Tap **Application Drawer > Settings > Wireless & networks**.
2. To turn on or off **Wi-Fi**, **Bluetooth** or **Airplane mode**, simply tap their corresponding bars.
3. To change connection settings, tap the corresponding function settings, then select the setting to change.

10.4 Protecting Your Phone

You can protect this device from unauthorized users by requiring the PIN code or entering a password.

Enable or Disable SIM card PIN

When PIN code is enabled, you are required to enter the PIN code before making a call.

1. Tap **Application Drawer > Settings > Location & security**.
2. Tap **Set up SIM card lock**.
3. Tap **Lock SIM card** to use PIN to use the device. Check to enable, uncheck to disable.
4. Enter the current PIN code.
5. To change the PIN code, tap **Change SIM PIN**.
6. Enter the old PIN code.
7. Enter the new PIN code and confirm.

Enabling Screen Lock Protection

You can increase your device's security by creating a screen unlock pattern (disabled by default). When enabled, you must draw the correct unlock pattern on the screen to unlock and regain access to the device.

1. Tap **Application Drawer > Settings > Location & security**.
2. Tap **Set up screen lock**.
3. Tap **Pattern** to draw pattern to unlock screen.
4. Follow on-screen instructions to draw your own personal unlock pattern and tap **Continue**.
5. Redraw your unlock pattern again and tap **Confirm**.

10.5 Resetting the Device

You can reset your phone to its factory defaults.

1. Tap **Application Drawer > Settings > Privacy**.
2. Tap **Factory data reset**.
3. Tap **Reset phone** to erase all data on your device.

Chapter 11: Using PC Tools Application

PC Tools application is a software that enables you to change USB modes when your device is connected to a computer. Available modes are as follows:

- **USB Mass Storage:** Allows the computer to recognize your device as a USB mass storage device.
- **Phone as modem:** Allows you to use your device as a modem.
- **Synchronization Tool:** Allows you to sync your device with a computer.

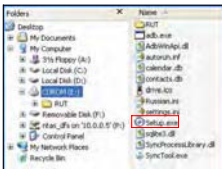

11.1 Using PC Tools Application

Installing the Driver

1. Turn on your device, and connect it to your computer using the USB cable.
2. From the Windows desktop, double click on **My Computer** and locate the **CD drive**.
3. Browse and double click **Setup.exe**.



4. Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the driver installation.

Using Your Phone as a Storage Device

To browse and transfer video and still images to a computer, do the following:

1. In PC Tools application, select **USB Mass Storage**.
2. The **Removable Disk** window appears on the screen.



3. Locate the **DCIM** folder and double click on **DCIM** folder to open it to find more folders.
Your recorded images and video clips will be inside these folders.
4. Copy and paste the image and video files to a folder on your computer.

Using Your Phone as a Modem

This feature allows you to use your device as a modem to access internet.

1. Be sure that the Wi-Fi function on your device is set to **disable** mode.
 - Tap **Application Drawer > Settings > Wireless controls**. Turn off **Wi-Fi** mode (uncheck **Wi-Fi**).
2. In PC Tools application, select **Phone as modem**.
3. Select **APN**.

You can edit the correct APN of your operator. Contact your network provider for more information.



4. Wait until **Connecting to 3G_Modem** process is completed.
A "3G_Modem is now connected" message appears on the screen.

- From the Windows desktop, double click on **Internet Explorer** or launch a web browser.

Using Your Phone to Sync with a Computer

This feature allows you to sync your device with a computer.

In PC Tools application, select **Synchronization Tool**.



- **Start Synchronization:** allows you to initiate synchronization.
- **Synchronization Setting:** allows you to set the synchronization settings. Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the settings.
- **Synchronization Summary:** displays the summary of the synchronization process.

Warnings and Precautions

This section contains important information pertaining to the operating instructions of your device. It also contains information about how to use the device safely. Read this information carefully before using your device.

Electronic Device

Power off your device if using the device is prohibited. Do not use the device when using the device causes danger or interference with electronic devices.

Medical Device

- Follow rules and regulations set forth by hospitals and health care facilities. Do not use your device when using the device is prohibited.
- Pacemaker manufacturers recommend that a minimum distance of 15 cm be maintained between a device and a pacemaker to prevent potential interference with the pacemaker. If you are using a pacemaker, use the device on the opposite side of the pacemaker and do not carry the device in your front pocket.

Potentially Explosive Atmosphere

Power off your device in any area with a potentially explosive atmosphere, and comply with all signs and instructions. Areas that may have potentially explosive atmospheres include the areas where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle engine. Triggering of sparks in such areas could cause an explosion or a fire, resulting in bodily injuries or even deaths. Do not power on your device at refueling points such as service stations. - In a motor vehicle, do not place the device over the air bag or in the air bag deployment area. Otherwise, the device may hurt you owing to the strong force when the air bag inflates.

Operating Environment

- Do not use or charge the device in dusty, damp, and dirty places or places with magnetic fields. Otherwise, it may result in a malfunction of the circuit.
- The device complies with the RF specifications when the device is used near your ear or at a distance of 1.5 cm from your body. Ensure that the device accessories such as a device case and a device holster are not composed of metal components. Keep your device 1.5 cm away from your body to meet the requirement earlier mentioned.
- On a stormy day with thunder, do not use your device when it is being charged, to prevent any danger caused by lightning.
- When you are on a call, do not touch the antenna. Touching the antenna affects the call quality and results in increase in power consumption. As a result, the talk time and the standby time are reduced.
- While using the device, observe the local laws and regulations, and respect others' privacy and legal rights.
- Keep the ambient temperature between 0°C and 40°C while the device is being charged. Keep the ambient temperature between 0°C to 40°C for using the device powered by a battery.

Prevention of Hearing Damage

Using a headset at high volume can damage your hearing. To reduce the risk of damage to hearing, lower the headset volume to a safe and comfortable level.

Safety of Children

Comply with all precautions with regard to children's safety. Letting the child play with your device or its accessories, which may include parts that can be detached from the device, may be dangerous, as it may present a choking hazard. Ensure that small children are kept away from the device and accessories.

Accessories

Use the accessories delivered only by the manufacturer. Using accessories of other manufacturers or vendors with this device model may invalidate any approval or warranty applicable to the device, result in the non-operation of the device, and cause danger.

Battery and Charger

- Unplug the charger from the electrical plug and the device when not in use.
- The battery can be charged and discharged hundreds of times before it eventually wears out. When the standby time and the talk time are shorter than the normal time, replace the battery.
- Use the AC power supply defined in the specifications of the charger. An improper power voltage may cause a fire or a malfunction of the charger.
- Do not connect two poles of the battery with conductors, such as metal materials, keys, or jewelries. Otherwise, the battery may be short-circuited and may cause injuries and burns on your body.
