




A Your phone supports only micro-SIM cards. Other sizes may not work properly. Contact your service provider to replace or purchase a new card. Power off your phone before installing or removing the micro-SIM card.



The dimensions (L x W) of a standard micro-SIM card is 15 mm x 12 mm (0.59 in. x 0.47 in.).

Charging the battery

Your phone is shipped with the battery partially charged. It is recommended that you fully charge the battery before using it for the first time.



Key Functions at Your Fingertips

① Power Key	 Press and hold to power on your mobile phone. When your mobile phone is powered on, press and hold this button to display the options menu. You can then choose to power off the phone or perform shortcut operations.
	• Press to lock the screen when your mobile phone is active.
■ Menu	•Touch to open the menu on an active screen. •Touch and hold to display recently used applications.
△ Home	 Touch to return to the Home screen. Touch and hold to search for content on your mobile phone, or on the web using Google.
Back	Touch to return to the previous screen or exit the application you are running.Touch to hide the keyboard.

Important Information About the Battery

- If the battery has not been used for a long time, you may not be able to power on your mobile phone immediately after you begin charging the battery. Allow the battery to charge for a few minutes with the phone powered off before attempting to power the phone on.
- As it ages, the battery's performance will degrade, in particular it will not hold
 charge as it did when it was new. When the battery life becomes noticeably
 shorter than usual after being charged properly, replace the battery with a new
 one of the same type.
- Using data services increases the power consumption of the phone and will therefore reduce the length of time that the phone can be used between battery charges.
- The time required to fully charge the battery depends on the ambient temperature and the age of the battery.

When the battery power is low, the phone will alert you and display a message.
 When the battery power is almost exhausted, your phone will power off automatically.

Power Saving Tips

The longevity of battery power depends on the network to which you connect, and how you use your mobile phone.

Try the following to conserve battery power:

- When you do not need 3G services, set your phone to connect to a 2G network.
- When your mobile phone is not in use, turn off the screen backlight.
- Reduce the time it takes for your screen backlight to turn off when your phone is idle.
- Lower the screen brightness.
- Turn off Bluetooth when you are not using it. Only make your phone visible to other Bluetooth devices when you need to establish a Bluetooth connection.
- Turn off Wi-Fi when you are not using it.
- Turn off your phone's GPS receiver when you are not using it.
- · Lower the volume.
- Close power-draining programs, when you do not need them.
- Turn off the data service when you are not using it.

Power On or Off Your Mobile Phone

Powering On Your Mobile Phone

Press and hold ① . If you have protected your mobile phone with a personal identification number (PIN), enter it before using the mobile phone.

Setting Up Your Mobile Phone

The first time you power on your mobile phone, the phone displays a setup wizard to help you set up the phone.

The setup wizard helps you:

- · Create or sign in to your account
- Make some initial decisions about how you want to use your mobile phone

Powering Off Your Mobile Phone

- 1. Press and hold ① to display the options menu.
- 2. Touch Power off.

If **Fast boot** is enabled, the mobile phone will enter deep sleep mode. If **Fast boot** is disabled, touch **OK** to power off the phone.

Turning On Fast Boot

- 1. Touch (iii) > Settings > All.
- 2. Touch the button next to Fast boot.
- Do not turn on **Fast boot** while on an airplane.

Restarting Your Mobile Phone

- 1. Press and hold to display the options menu.
- 2. Touch Restart.
- 3. Touch **OK**.

Using Airplane Mode

Some locations may require you to turn off your phone's wireless connections. Rather than powering off your phone, you can place it in **Airplane mode**.

- 1. Press and hold ① .
- 2. Touch Airplane mode in the options menu.

Using the Touchscreen

Touchscreen Actions



Touch: Tap the screen with your finger to select an item, confirm a selection, or start an application.



Touch and hold: Touch an item with your finger and do not release it until the mobile phone responds. For example, to open the options menu for the active screen, touch and hold the screen until the menu appears.



Flick: Move your finger either vertically or horizontally across the screen.



Drag: Touch and hold the desired item with your finger. To move an item, drag the item to any part of the screen. You can drag an icon to move or delete it.

Rotating Your Mobile Phone Screen

The orientation of most screens will change to landscape or portrait view when you rotate your phone sideways.


Locking and Unlocking the Screen

Locking the Screen

- When your phone is on, press ① to lock the screen. When the screen is locked, you can still receive messages and calls.
- If your phone is idle for a while, the screen will lock automatically.


Unlocking the Screen

- 1. Press to wake up the screen.
- 2. Drag the unlocking icon to the small lock, the screen is unlocked.



If you have set up a screen unlock pattern, you will be prompted to draw the pattern on the screen to unlock it.

Home Screen



Touch and hold a shortcut until the mobile phone vibrates, you can then drag it to your desired location or move it to the trash. You can also drag an icon from another area of the screen to the shortcut position.

Notification Panel

Your mobile phone will notify you when you receive a new message or there is an upcoming event. The notification panel also informs you of alarms and settings. Open the notification panel to see your network operator or to view a message, reminder, or event notification.

Opening the Notification Panel


- 1. When a new notification icon appears on the notification bar, place your finger on the notification bar and flick down to open the notification panel.
- 2. On the panel, you can:
 - Touch a notification to open the corresponding application.
 - Flick left or right on a notification to delete it.
 - Touch = to clear all notifications.

• Touch = to display the settings screen.

Closing the Notification Panel

Touch and hold the bottom of the panel. Then flick up to close it.

Viewing Other Parts of the Home Screen



Flick your finger left or right across the Home screen.

Customizing the Home Screen

Adding a New Home Screen Item

- 1. On the Home screen, touch to display the application list.
- 2. Press and hold an application icon, and then drag the icon to a blank area on the Home screen.

Moving a Home Screen Item

- 1. Touch and hold the item on the Home screen that you want to move until your mobile phone vibrates.
- 2. Without lifting your finger, drag the item to the desired position on the screen, and then release it.

Removing an Icon from the Home Screen

- 1. Touch and hold an item on the Home screen that you want to remove until your mobile phone vibrates.
- 2. Without lifting your finger, drag the item to the trash can. Wait until the item and the trash can turn red.
- 3. Release the item.

Managing Folders on the Home Screen

- To create a folder: Drag an application icon onto another application icon to create a new folder that contains both icons.
- To rename a folder: On the Home screen, touch a folder, and then touch the folder name field beneath it.
- To delete a folder: On the Home screen, touch and hold a folder, and then drag it to the trash can.
- To move a folder to the shortcut bar: On the Home screen, touch and hold a folder, and then drag it to the shortcut bar.

Service Shortcuts

- 1. Open the notification bar.
- 2. Touch 🗊 , 🔻 or 🜒 to turn the corresponding services on or off.
- You can touch 🔳 to display the switch shortcut list.

Changing the Wallpaper

- 1. On the Home screen, touch \equiv > Wallpaper.
- 2. Touch the following menu items to select a picture and set it as the wallpaper:
 - Gallery
 - Live Wallpapers
 - Themes
 - Wallpapers

Changing the Theme

- 1. On the home screen, touch (ii) > Themes.
- 2. Select a theme and touch **Apply** to apply it.

Applications and Widgets

The Application screen holds icons for all of the applications on your phone. You can touch ••• on the Home screen to open the application screen.

Accessing Widgets

On the application screen, touch the **WIDGETS** tab to switch to the widget screen. From the widget screen, you can touch and hold a widget, and then drag it to the Home screen.

Viewing Recently Used Applications

To display the list of recently used applications, press and hold \equiv . To open an application, touch the corresponding thumbnail. To close the application, flick left or right across the screen. To clear the list, touch $\stackrel{\bullet}{=}$.

Using a microSD Card

Using the microSD Card as a USB Mass Storage

To transfer all your favorite music and pictures from your PC to your mobile phone's microSD card, set the microSD card as a USB mass storage.

- 1. Connect your mobile phone to your PC with the USB cable provided. Your PC will detect the microSD card as a removable storage device.
- 2. Open the notification bar, and then touch **Connected as USB Storage**.
- 3. Touch **USB storage device** in the dialog box that opens to confirm that you want to transfer files.

You can now transfer files from your PC to your mobile phone's microSD card.



Removing the microSD Card

- 1. On the Home screen, touch :> Settings > All.
- 2. Scroll down the screen, and then touch **Storage** > **Unmount SD card**.
- 3. Carefully remove the microSD card.



To make a phone call, you can dial a number using the keypad or touch a number saved in your contact list, on a webpage, or in other places. When you are in a call, you can answer other incoming calls or redirect them to your voicemail. You can also set up conference calls with several participants.

Making a Call

To make a call, you can use the **Phone** application, or select a number from **People**.

When you are in a call, you can touch \triangle to use other functions. To return to the call screen, flick the notification bar down and touch **Current call**.



Be careful not to block the microphone at the bottom of your phone if you want your voice heard by the other parties in a call.

Making a Call with the Phone Application

- 1. On the Home screen, touch > Phone.
- 2. Enter the phone number.
- 3. Touch to initiate the call.

During a call, touch to enter other numbers on the dialer.

Making a Call from People

- 1. On the Home screen, touch > Phone.
- 2. Touch to display the contacts saved on your mobile phone. Select a contact to place a call.

Using Voice Dialing

Calls can be placed using voice dialing. When you open the voice dialing application, your phone's speaker will be enabled.

Background noise will affect the accuracy of voice dialing.


- 1. On the Home screen, touch (**) > Voice Dialer.
- 2. Follow the onscreen instructions, then say your command close to the microphone. Your phone will identify the command and make a call.

Answering or Rejecting a Call

Answering an Incoming Call

When you receive a phone call, the incoming call screen opens. If you have previously saved the caller's number in **People**, the caller's name and number are displayed. If the caller's number is not saved in **People**, the caller's number is displayed.

Drag to the right to answer the call.




Ending a Call

During a call, touch ____ to hang up.

Rejecting an Incoming Call

Drag to the left to reject the call.



You can also drag to the message icon to reject the call and send a message to the caller.

Other Operations During a Call

Making a Conference Call

If you receive a new call while you are already in a call, you can add the second call to the call you are in. This feature is known as conference calling. You can also set up a conference call with multiple callers.



- 1. To initiate a conference call, dial the number of the first participant. After you have connected to the first participant, keep the connection open, touch
- 2. Enter the phone number of the next person you want to invite for the conversation and touch , or select someone from your call log or **People**. The first participant is automatically placed on hold while you do this.
- 3. Once you have connected to the second person, touch > to begin the conference call.
- 4. To end the conference call and disconnect from everyone, touch

Switching Between Calls

If you receive a new call while you are already in a call, you can switch between the two calls

- 1. While you are in the first call and the second call comes in, answer the incoming call, and then touch \mathcal{Z} .
- 2. The current call is placed on hold and you are connected to the first call.

TTY Operation

Using the TTY Device

The Teletypewriter (TTY) is a typewriting device. By connecting the phone to the TTY device, you can use the TTY functions to send/receive messages. When you use the TTY function, do as follows:

- 1. Connect the TTY device to the headset jack of the phone and set the phone to the TTY mode.
- 2. Make or answer calls as normal.
- 3. When the call is put through, use the TTY device to send or receive the letters.
- 4. Press the **End** to end the call.

Setting the TTY Mode

- 1. Touch (:::) > Settings > All > Call > TTY mode.
- 2. Select one TTY mode.
 - TTY Off: The standard voice speaking mode and the listening mode.
 - TTY Full: Transmit and receive the TTY characters.
 - TTY HCO: Transmit TTY characters but receive by listening to the earpiece.
 - TTY VCO: Receive TTY characters but transmit by speaking into the microphone.

Setting Hearing Aid Compatibility

Touch :::> > Settings > All > Call > Hearing aids to set your phone to be compatible with a hearing aid.



The **People** application enables you to save and manage information such as phone numbers and addresses of your contacts. After you save contact information on your mobile phone, you have easy access to the people with whom you want to communicate.

Opening the People Application

On the Home screen, touch > **People** to open the **People** application.

- If you have not yet added any contacts to your mobile phone, touch to create a contact.
- Any contacts that are already saved on your mobile phone are displayed alphabetically in a list that you can scroll through.

Importing Contacts from a SIM Card

- 1. In the contacts list, touch \equiv > Manage contacts.
- 2. Touch Copy from SIM card.
- 3. Wait for the SIM card contents to be loaded. Touch one contact to import that contact individually to your mobile phone, or touch **SELECT ALL** to import all contacts to your mobile phone.
- 4. Touch COPY.
- 5. If you have more than one account on your phone, touch the account into which you want to import the contacts.

Adding a Contact

- 1. In the contact list, touch \mathbf{Q}_{+} .
- From the screen displayed, create a contact in your mobile phone, SIM card or your account. Add a new account if you do not have one.
- Enter the contact's name, and then add detailed information such as phone numbers.

4. Touch **DONE** to save the contact information.



To save a contact from your call log, touch and hold the desired phone number to display the options menu, and then touch **Add to contacts**.

Adding a Contact to Your Favorites

Select a contact and touch the star on the right of the contact's name. If the

★ icon is highlighted, the contact is in your favorites list.

Searching for a Contact

- 1. In the contact list, touch the search box.
- 2. Enter the name of the contact you wish to search for. As you type, contacts with matching names appear below the search box.

Editing a Contact

You can make changes to the information you have stored for a contact at any time


- 1. In the contacts list, touch the contact whose details you want to edit, and then touch ...
- 2. Touch the category of contact information you wish to change: name, phone number, email address, or any other information you recorded earlier.

Communicating with Your Contacts

You can quickly call or send a text (SMS) or multimedia (MMS) message to a contact's default phone number. You can also open details to view a list of all the ways you can communicate with that contact. This section describes how to communicate with a contact when viewed in your contacts list.

Using Quick Contact for Android

- 1. Touch the contact's picture or picture frame (if you have not assigned a picture to the contact) to open Quick Contact for Android.
- 2. Touch the icon for the way you want to communicate with the contact.



Communicating with a Contact

- 1. In the contacts list, touch the contact that you want to communicate with.
- 2. On the contact's details screen, you can communicate with the contact in one of the following ways:
 - Touch the phone number to place a call.
 - Touch the email address to send an email.
 - Touch to send a text message.

Deleting a Contact

- In the contact list, touch the contact that you want to delete, and then touch
 > Delete.
- 2. Touch **OK** to confirm that you want to delete the contact.

Backing Up and Synchronizing Contacts

You can back up contacts from your phone to a microSD card, or synchronize phone contacts with a server using your Google account.

Using a microSD Card to Back Up Contacts

Backing Up Contacts

1. In the contact list, touch = > Manage contacts.

- 2. From the displayed menu, touch **Export to storage**.
- After touching **Export to storage**, a message is displayed to show the storage location of the .vcf file to which your contacts will be exported.
- 3. Touch OK.

You can copy the .vcf files backed up on the microSD card to your computer.

Restoring Contacts

- 1. In the contact list, touch = > Manage contacts.
- 2. Touch **Import from storage** in the displayed menu.

If there is more than one .vcf files saved on the microSD card, you can choose to restore one, multiple, or all the of them.

Using a Google Account to Synchronize Contacts

You can synchronize contacts using your Google account. For details, see Changing an Account's Synchronization Settings.

Managing Groups

Creating a Group

- 1. On the Home screen, touch \Longrightarrow > **People**, and then touch \Longrightarrow .
- 2. Touch 🕮 in the group list.
- 3. Enter the name you want to assign to the group.
- 4. Touch **DONE** to save the group.
- You can add only contacts saved in the phone memory to a group.

Editing a Group

You can always make changes to the information you have saved for a group.

- 1. In the groups list, touch the group that you want to edit, and then touch **\Begin{array}{c} \ Edit**.
- 2. Make the desired changes to the group information, and then touch **DONE**.

 To cancel all changes you made to the group information, touch \hookrightarrow > **OK**.

Adding a Contact to Your Groups

Select a group, touch to select the desired contact, and then touch **ADD**



You can only add contacts saved in your phone memory to a group, you cannot add contacts saved in your SIM card.

Joining and Separating Contacts

You may have duplicate contacts if you import contacts by:

- · Adding an account, such as a Gmail account.
- Using the social networking services such as Twitter.
- Using other methods, such as exchanging emails.

To avoid duplication, join two or more contacts together to form a single contact.



Availability of Twitter may vary depending on your country or carrier. Please use them according to local laws and regulations.

Joining Contacts

- 1. On the Home screen, touch (**) > People.
- 2. Touch a duplicated contact.
- 3. Touch Manage joined contacts, and then touch Add contact.
- 4. Select the contact to be joined to combine two duplicate contacts.

Two contacts will be joined together and displayed as one contact. Touch the contact to view the joined information. You can see that the contact is joined together by two contacts. You can also combine more than two contacts.



Contacts stored in the SIM card cannot be joined.

Separating Contacts

If contact information from different sources was joined together in error, you can separate the contacts.

1. On the Home screen, touch > People.

- 2. Touch the joint contact to be separated.
- 3. Touch Manage joined contacts.
- 4. Select the contact to be separated from the joint contact.

The joint contact is then separated into two contacts displayed separately in **People**.

Sending Contacts

You can send contact information as a .vcf file via Bluetooth or Messaging.

- 1. Select a contact from the contacts list.
- 2. Touch \equiv > Share.
- 3. Select your preferred method to send the contacts you have selected, for example Bluetooth or Messaging.

Text Input

Displaying the Keyboard


To enter text, use the onscreen keyboard. The keyboard is displayed automatically when you run certain applications. If not, touch a text field to open the keyboard.

Choosing an Input Method

- When the keyboard is displayed, the keyboard icon is shown on the notification bar. Flick the notification bar downwards to open the notification panel.
- Touch Choose input method.
- 3. Select the desired input method.

You can also change the default input method. To do so, touch : > Settings > All > Language & input > Default on the Home screen, and then select an input method.


Using the Android Keyboard




Touch once to capitalize the next letter you type. Touch twice to capitalize all letters to be entered.

Using the Swype Keyboard

Editing Text

To edit text quickly, touch and hold the text you have entered, and choose the content you want to edit. You can then edit the text quickly using icons in the upper right corner as follows:

- **H** : Select all content.
- Cut the selected content. Touch and hold the text. Drag the grab points to select the text you want to cut. Then touch this button to cut the selected text. After the text is cut, touch a blank area in the text field to display .

 Move to select where you want to paste the text. Touch > PASTE to paste the previously cut text.
- Copy the selected text. Touch and hold the text. Drag the grab points to select text you want to copy. Touch this button to copy the text. After the text is copied, touch a blank area in the text field to display . Move to where you want to paste the text. Touch > PASTE to paste the previously copied text.
- Ill : Move the cursor to an input position. Touch this icon to replace the selected content with what you just cut or copied.

Using the Landscape Keyboard

If you find the keyboard inconvenient or difficult to use, turn your mobile phone sideways. The screen will display the keyboard in landscape orientation, providing you with a wider keyboard layout.

Customizing Your Keyboard Settings

- 1. On the Home screen, touch > Settings > All > Language & input.
- 2. In **Keyboard & input methods**, touch next to an input method to customize the input method.

Messaging

The **Messaging** application allows you to exchange text messages (SMS) and multimedia messages (MMS) with anyone using an SMS-or-MMS-capable phone.

Opening Messaging

On the Home screen, touch (***) > **Messaging** to open the message application.

Creating and Sending a Text Message

- 1. Touch > Messaging, then -.
- 2. Enter a phone number or a contact's name in the **To** field, or touch select a contact from **People**.

As you enter the phone number or the contact's name, the phone displays possible matches from your contacts. Select a contact from the list of possible matches or continue entering.

After you select a contact or finish entering a number, you can enter another recipient.

- 3. Touch the composition text box to start composing your message.
- 4. When you are ready to send the message, touch **Send**.

Sent and received messages will be displayed in a message thread and grouped together in a conversation.

Creating and Sending a Multimedia Message

You can use multimedia messages to make everyday communications very special. You can record a message and send it as an audio file, for example, sing "Happy Birthday" and send it to a friend, or send a slideshow of photographs of a special event. The possibilities are enormous.

- 2. Enter a phone number in the **To** field, or touch **\(\bigsigma_{+}\)** to select a contact from **People**.
- 3. Touch the composition text box to start composing your message.
- \blacksquare If you want to enter a smiley, touch \blacksquare , then **Insert smiley**.
- 4. Perform the following steps to convert a text message into a multimedia message:
 - Touch = > Add subject to add the message subject. Your mobile phone is now in multimedia message mode.
 - Touch to attach a picture, an audio file, or a video clip to the message.
- 5. When you are ready to send the message, touch **Send**.
- You can select a media file (music, video, or picture) and send it as an attachment in a multimedia message. In **File Manager**, touch and hold a media file, and then touch **Share** > **Messaging**.

Adding a Slideshow

If you want to attach more than one file to your message, use the **Slideshow** option.

- 1. On the message composing screen, touch 🔌 to display the options panel.
- 2. Touch **Slideshow**, and then select a slide to edit.
- 3. Touch **=** > **Add slide** to add more slides.
- 4. Touch **Done** to return to the multimedia message screen when you finish editing the message.
- 5. To modify your multimedia message, touch **Replace** on the multimedia message screen. When you are ready to send the message, touch **Send**.

Opening and Viewing a Multimedia Message

- 1. In the message list, touch the message thread you wish to view.
- 2. Touch the multimedia message to view the message.

Replying to a Message

- 1. In the message list, touch a text or multimedia message thread to open it.
- 2. Touch the text box to compose your message. Once finished, touch **Send**.

Searching for a Message

To find a message quickly: On the messages list screen, touch $\, \, {\bf Q} \,$ and enter the message content to search for.

Customizing Message Settings

In the message list, touch \equiv > **Settings** to customize the message settings.

Getting Connected

Mobile Networks

Your mobile phone will be automatically configured to use your network operator's 2G/3G service (if available) when you turn on the phone for the first time. Note that the SIM card must be inserted.

Checking the Network Connection

- 1. Touch Settings > All.
- 2. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch Mobile networks.
- Touch Access Point Names or Network operators to check the network connection.
- Your phone will automatically read the access point settings from the SIM card (if any). Therefore, do not change the access point parameters; otherwise, you might not be able to access network resources.

Turning On the Data Service

- 1. Touch > Settings > All.
- 2. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch Mobile networks.
- 3. Select the **Data enabled** check box to turn on the data connection.
- If you do not need to access a wireless data network, you can clear the **Data** enabled check box to save data traffic costs.

Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi gives you wireless access to broadband Internet. To use Wi-Fi on your mobile phone, you must have an access to wireless access points (hotspots). Obstacles that block the Wi-Fi signal will reduce its strength.

Turning On Wi-Fi

1. Touch > Settings > All.

2. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch the button next to Wi-Fi.

Connecting to a Wireless Network

- 1. After turning on Wi-Fi, touch > **Settings** > **All**.
- 2. Under **WIRELESS & NETWORKS**, touch **Wi-Fi** to display the **Wi-Fi** screen. You will see a list of detected Wi-Fi networks.
- 3. Touch a Wi-Fi network to connect to it.
 - If you select an open network, your mobile phone will automatically connect to it.
 - If you select a network that is secured with Wired Equivalent Privacy (WEP) and it is the first time that you have connected to it, enter the password as prompted, and then touch Connect. If you connect to a secured wireless network that you have already used, you will not be prompted to enter the password again unless you have reset your mobile phone to its default settings.
- On the **Wi-Fi** settings screen, touch + to add a new Wi-Fi network.

Sharing Your Phone's Data Connection

You can share your mobile phone's data connection with a single computer via a USB cable: USB tethering. You can share your mobile phone's data connection with a number of devices at the same time, by turning your phone into a portable Wi-Fi hotspot.

Sharing Your Phone's Data Connection via USB

To use USB tethering in different operating systems, you may need to prepare your computer to establish a network connection via USB.

- You cannot share your phone's data connection and access its microSD card via USB at the same time.
- 1. Touch (iii) > Settings > All.
- 2. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch More... > Tethering & Mobile Hotspot.
- 3. Select the **USB tethering** check box to share your data connection.

Sharing Your Phone's Data Connection as a Portable Wi-Fi Hotspot

- 1. Touch > Settings > All.
- Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch More... > Tethering & Mobile Hotspot.
- 3. Touch Configure Mobile Hotspot.
- 4. Name the Wi-Fi hotspot.
- 5. Select an encryption mode.
- It is recommended that you set the encryption mode to WPA2PSK to better secure the Wi-Fi network.
- 6. Set the key to the Wi-Fi hotspot.

When other devices want to access your phone's network, this key must be entered

- 7. Select the **Mobile Hotspot** check box.
- You can now search for and access your phone's Wi-Fi network from other devices.

Controlling Data Usage

With **Data usage**, you can set a data usage cycle and the mobile data limit for this period. You will be notified when data usage reaches the set limit. You can also query the data usage within a certain period or by a certain application.

- Touch Mobile data to turn on or off the mobile data function. The mobile data function must be turned on to configure data control and query data usage.
- Touch the scroll arrow beside Data usage cycle, then Change cycle.... After setting the data usage cycle, touch Set.
- Drag the red line to set a data usage limit or the orange line to set a warning limit. When data traffic reaches the yellow line, you will be notified; when data

traffic reaches the red line, your phone's mobile networks data connection will be disabled.


- Scroll the white time axis to view data usage within a certain period.
- Touch an application to check its data usage.

Browser

Your mobile phone comes with an Internet browser pre-installed.

Basic Operations

Touch : > **Browser** to open the home page.



Touch on the upper section of the screen, and all web pages currently open are displayed. You can:

- Touch one page to enlarge it.
- Touch the cross sign (x) to close that page.
- Touch (+) to open a new browser window.

Touch \equiv to open the browser options menu and perform one of the following operations:

- **Refresh**: Touch to refresh the current webpage.
- **Forward**: Touch to navigate to the web page from which you returned to the current web page.
- Bookmarks: Touch to display bookmarks.

Opening a Webpage

- 1. In a browser window, touch the URL field at the top of the screen.
- 2. Use the keyboard to enter a webpage address. You can touch \P to enter the web page address by voice.

3. As you enter the address, matching webpage addresses will appear on the screen. If you see the address you want, touch it and go directly to that webpage or complete entering your desired webpage.

Setting a Home Page

- 1. In a browser window, touch **=** > **Settings** > **General** > **Set homepage**.
- 2. Select one page from the list, or touch **Other** to enter desired homepage's URL, and then touch **OK**.

Managing Bookmarks

You can store as many bookmarks as you want on your mobile phone.

Adding a Bookmark

- 1. In a browser window, go to the webpage you want to save as a bookmark.
- 2. Touch **=** > **Save to bookmarks**.
- 3. Edit the bookmark name and then touch **OK**.

Opening a Bookmark

- In a browser window, touch > Bookmarks.
 On the bookmarks screen, touch the HISTORY tab to view the pages you have visited, or touch SAVED PAGES to view saved pages.
- 2. Touch the bookmark of the website you want to open.

Customizing Browser Settings

Customize the browser to suit your browsing style. Use **Browser** to set page content, privacy, and security preferences. In a browser window, touch **Settings**.

Bluetooth

Your mobile phone has Bluetooth, which allows you to create a wireless connection with other Bluetooth devices so you can share files with your friends, talk hands-free with a Bluetooth headset, or even transfer photos from your phone to your PC.

If you are using Bluetooth, remember to stay within 10 meters (33 feet) of the other Bluetooth devices to which you want to connect. Be aware that obstacles like walls or other electronic equipment may interfere with your Bluetooth connection.

Turning On Bluetooth

- 1. Touch : > Settings > All.
- Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch the button next to Bluetooth.
 When Bluetooth is turned on, the Bluetooth icon appears in the notification bar.
- 3. Touch **Bluetooth**, and your device's Bluetooth name is displayed on the screen.

Touch **=** > **Rename phone** to change your device's name, and then touch **Rename**.

Pairing with and Connecting to a Bluetooth Device

You can do the following by using the Bluetooth:

- Hands Free Profile (HFP): allows you to use a hands-free Bluetooth device.
- Headset Profile (HSP): allows you to use a mono Bluetooth headset.
- Object Push Profile (OPP): allows you to transfer files over a Bluetooth connection.
- Advanced Audio Distribution Profile (A2DP): allows you to use a stereo
 Bluetooth headset.
- A/V Remote Control Profile (AVRCP): allows you to remotely control audio playing using a Bluetooth headset.

Perform the following steps to pair your mobile phone with another Bluetooth device:

- 1. Ensure that the Bluetooth function on your mobile phone is enabled.
- 2. Under **WIRELESS & NETWORKS**, touch **Bluetooth**. Your mobile phone will then scan for Bluetooth devices in range.
- 3. From the list of found devices, touch the device you want to pair your mobile phone with.

4. If prompted, enter the pairing password to complete the connection.

Sending Files via Bluetooth

With Bluetooth, you can share pictures, videos, or music files with your family and friends. To send files via Bluetooth:

- 1. Touch and hold the file to be sent in your mobile phone or SD card. The active options menu is displayed.
- 2. Touch **Share**, then **Bluetooth** to select a paired device.

Disconnecting from or Unpairing with a Bluetooth Device

- 1. Touch Settings > All.
- 2. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch Bluetooth.
- 3. Navigate to the **Paired devices** section, and then touch **②**.
- 4. Touch **Unpair** to disconnect from the device.



Your mobile phone also puts email at your fingertips. With your phone's **Email** application, you can use your email account with Yahoo!, AOL, or other popular email services on your phone.

Adding an Email Account

When using the **Email** application for the first time, you must configure an email account. The Email setup wizard helps you to configure your account. A number of popular email providers are supported. You can work with the same email service that you use on your PC or you can select another email service.

- 1. On the Home screen, touch (***) > Email.
- 2. Touch the email service provider you want to use, or touch **Others** to enter an email address and password, then touch **Next**.
- 3. Follow the onscreen instructions to set parameters such as POP3, IMAP, and account. If you do not know how to set the parameters, contact your email service provider or search online.
- 4. Touch **Next**, and the **Inbox** of the newly configured email account will be displayed.

After creating your initial email account, touch **=** > **Settings** > **ADD ACCOUNT** on the **Inbox** screen to add more email accounts.

Switching Between Email Accounts

On the **Inbox** screen, touch the email address bar on the top, and choose an email account from the email account list displayed. The selected account's Inbox is then displayed by default.

Viewing an Email Message

On the **Inbox** screen, touch the email message you want to view.

You can also touch and select another folder to view.

Saving an Email Attachment

- 1. On the **Inbox** screen, touch the email message you want to view.
- 2. Touch the attachment tab to display the attachment.
- 3. Touch **SAVE** to download the attachment.

After being downloaded, the attachment is saved in the **Download** folder on the microSD card

Creating and Sending an Email Message

- 1. On the **Inbox** screen, touch
- 2. In the **To** field, enter the recipient's name or email address.
- 3. Enter the subject of your message and compose the message.

To send an attachment with the message, touch **\rightarrow**.



4. Touch

If you are not ready to send the message, touch \equiv > Save draft or \hookrightarrow to save the message as a draft.

Replying to an Email Message

- 1. On the **Inbox** screen, touch the email message to which you want to reply.
- 2. Touch or > Reply all to reply to the email message.

Deleting an Email Account

- 1. On the **Inbox** screen, touch \equiv > **Settings** to enter the account configuration screen.
- 2. Select an email account.
- 3. In the menu at the bottom, touch **Remove account** then touch **OK**.

Changing Email Account Settings

You can change a number of account settings, including the email checking frequency, new mail notification method, and details about the account's email sending and receiving servers.

- Your account's incoming and outgoing settings depend on the kind of email service you are using. You can enter the necessary details manually, although you may need to contact your email service provider to obtain the correct information.
- 1. On the **Inbox** screen, touch **≡** > **Settings** to enter the account configuration screen.
- 2. Select an email account.
- 3. Change the account settings, such as **DATA USAGE**, **NOTIFICATION SETTINGS**. and **SERVER SETTINGS**.

Entertainment

In addition to being a communication device and personal assistant, your mobile phone also provides you with a multitude of entertainment possibilities. You can take photos, create videos and audio clips, and download and listen to music.


Taking Photos and Recording Videos

The camera is a combination of camera and camcorder that you can use to shoot and share pictures and videos.

Opening Your Camera

- Touch (::) > Camera to open the camera.
- Touch

 to close the camera.



Touch to customize the camera settings.

Taking a Photo

- 1. Open your camera application and switch it to camera mode.
- 2. If necessary, change the camera settings. The preview changes as you change the settings.
- 3. Frame your photo within the photo capture screen.
- 4. Touch oto take your photo.

Photos taken are displayed for a moment. You can take another photo or review your photos.

Viewing Your Photos

- 1. After taking a photo, a thumbnail of the photo you have just taken is shown in the lower right corner of the capture screen. Touch the thumbnail to view the photo.
- 2. Touch the onscreen buttons for the following functions:
 - Touch 🔚 to enter the gallery.

 - Touch (a) to send the photo via a multimedia message.

Recording a Video

- 1. Open the camera application, and then switch it to camcorder mode.
- 2. If necessary, change the camcorder settings.
- 3. Frame the scene with which you want to start your video.
- 4. Touch to start recording a video.
- 5. Touch to stop recording.

Viewing Your Videos

- 1. After recording a video, a thumbnail of the video you have just recorded is shown in the lower right corner of the capture screen. Touch the thumbnail to view it.
- 2. Touch the onscreen button to do any of the following:
 - Touch **=** to enter the gallery.

 - Touch (22) to send the video via a multimedia message.
- 3. If you want to view more videos, flick your finger left or right across the screen.

Using the Gallery

Your **Gallery** application can automatically search for pictures and videos on your mobile phone and microSD card. Use **Gallery** to sort photos and videos into folders, view and edit pictures, watch videos, and set a picture as wallpaper or as a photo for a contact.

Opening the Gallery

On the Home screen, touch • > Gallery.

The **Gallery** application categorizes your pictures and videos by storage location and displays these files in folders. Touch a folder to view the pictures or videos inside.

Viewing a Picture

- 1. In **Gallery**, touch the folder that contains the pictures you want to view.
- 2. Touch the picture to view it in full-screen mode.
- The picture viewer supports the automatic rotation function. When you rotate your mobile phone, the picture adjusts itself to the rotation.

Rotating a Picture

- 1. When viewing a picture, touch \blacksquare to display the operations panel.
- 2. Select either **Rotate Left** or **Rotate Right**. The picture is saved with the new orientation.

Cropping a Picture

- 1. When viewing a picture, touch \blacksquare to display the operation panel, and then touch **Crop**.
- 2. Use the cropping tool to select the portion of the picture to crop.
 - Drag from the inside of the cropping tool to move it.
 - Drag an edge of the cropping tool to resize the image.
 - Drag a corner of the cropping tool to resize the image.

Touch SAVE to save the cropped picture. Touch CANCEL to discard the changes.

Enjoying Music

Before you using music player, you must copy music files from your computer to the microSD card.

Once you have done this, the player will search for music on the microSD card. After the search is complete, you will be able to view all available music files in the music library.

Copying Music to the microSD Card

- 1. Connect your mobile phone to your PC with a USB cable, and mount the miscroSD card.
- 2. On the PC, navigate to the USB drive and open it.
- 3. Create a folder in the root directory of the microSD card (for example, **Play Music**).
- 4. Copy music from your PC to the folder you have created.
- 5. After copying the music, unmount or eject the drive as required by your PC's operating system to safely disconnect your phone from the PC.
- 6. Disconnect your mobile phone from the PC.


Opening the Media Library

Touch Play Music to display the media library.

The **Play Music** application organizes your music files by storage location. It contains six tabs: **PLAYLISTS**, **RECENT**, **ARTISTS**, **ALBUMS**, **SONGS** and **GENRES**

Playing Music

- 1. Touch a category on the music library screen.
- 2. Touch the song you want to play.



When you are listening to music, touch \bigcirc to use another application. Your music continues to play. To return to the music controls, open the notification panel and then touch the song.

Adding Music to a Playlist

- 1. Touch a category on the music library screen.
- 2. In the list that appears, select the song you want to add to the playlist.
- 3. Touch and hold the song, and then touch **Add to playlist** in the options menu.
 - Touch an existing playlist to add the song to it.
 - Touch **New playlist** to create a playlist and add the song to it.

Listening to the FM Radio

The FM radio lets you listen to FM radio programs on your mobile phone. Since the FM radio uses the provided wired stereo headset as its antenna, before opening the application, connect the headset to your phone's the audio jack.

Opening the FM Radio

1. On the Home screen, touch \Longrightarrow > FM Radio to open the application.

2. The first time you open FM radio, touch **Auto tuning**, which automatically scans for available FM channels, saves them as presets, and plays the first FM channel found

Tuning the FM Radio

Open the **FM Radio** application, and then do the following:

- Touch or to tune the radio to the previous or next channel.
- Slide the knob left or right to perform precision tuning. When a channel is found, touch => Save station. Enter the channel name, touch OK, and then select an empty channel to save the new channel to the channel list.
- Touch = > Auto tuning to scan automatically for available FM channels.

Google Services

Availability of Google applications, services, and features may vary according to your country or carrier. Please follow local laws and regulations to use them.

When you turn on your mobile phone for the first time, touch a Google services such as **Talk**, **Gmail**, or **Play Store**, and you will be prompted to sign in to your Google account.

Ensure that your mobile phone has an active data connection before you sign in to your Google account.

If you already have a Google account, touch **Existing** and enter your username and password.

Creating a Google Account

If you do not have a Google account, you can create one:

- 1. After reading the setup information, touch **New**.
- 2. Enter the first name, last name, and then touch .
- 3. Enter the user name for your Google account, and then touch book in the mobile phone will connect to a Google server to check whether the username is available. If the username you entered is already in use, you will be prompted to choose another one or select one from a list.
- 4. Enter and confirm your Google account password, and then touch
- 5. Select a security question from the drop-down menu, and then enter the answer, and then touch .
- 6. Enter the characters that appear on the screen, and then touch ightharpoonup.
- To use another Google account, go to the **Settings** screen, and touch **Add account** to select which type of accounts you want to add.

Gmail

Gmail is Google's web-based email service. When you first set up your phone, you may have configured it to use an existing **Gmail** account or create a new account. The first time you open the **Gmail** application on your phone, your **Inbox** will contain the messages from your **Gmail** web account.

Opening Gmail

On the Home screen, touch :: > Gmail. The Inbox mail list appears. Any emails you decide to keep on your mobile phone will go to your Inbox folder.

Switching Between Accounts

On the **Inbox** screen, touch the email address bar on the top, and choose an email account from the email account list displayed. The selected account's Inbox is then displayed by default.

Creating and Sending an Email

- 1. In the mail list, touch
- 2. Enter the message recipient's email address in the **To** field. If you are sending the email to several recipients, separate the email addresses with commas. You can add as many message recipients as you want.
 - If you want to send a copy (Cc) or a blind copy (Bcc) of the email to other recipients, touch = , and then touch Add Cc/Bcc.
- 3. Enter the email subject and write your email.
 - If you want to add a picture attachment, touch \equiv , and then touch **Attach picture** to select the picture you want to attach.
- 4. After writing your email, touch .

Replying to or Forwarding an Email

- 1. In the mail list, touch the email that you want to reply to or forward.
- 2. Touch to reply. You can also touch , and then touch **Reply all** or **Forward**.

- 3. Do one of the following:
 - If you selected lacktriangle or **Reply all**, enter your message.
 - If you selected **Forward**, specify the message recipients and add any additional text you want to include in the forwarded message.
- 4. Touch ▶ to send, or touch ☐ to save as a draft.

Searching for an Email

- 1. In the mail list, touch $\, {f Q} \,$.
- 2. Enter the search keywords in the box, and then touch $\, {f Q} \,$.

Customizing Your Gmail Settings

In the mail list, touch = > **Settings** to customizing your **Gmail**.

Talk

Talk is Google's instant messaging service. You can use it to communicate in real time with other people using **Talk** on a phone or on the web.

Opening Talk

On the Home screen, touch > **Talk** to open the application.



Adding a Friend

- 1. In the friends list, touch 💂 .
- 2. Enter the Gmail address of the friend you want to add.
- 3. Touch 🗸 .

Accepting an Invitation

1. If someone else has invited you to chat, this information will appear in the friends list

2. Touch a pending invitation, and then touch **Accept**.

Starting a Chat

- 1. In the friends list, touch a friend's name in the friends list.
- 2. Use the onscreen keyboard to enter text and chat with your friend.
- 3. After entering your message, touch .

Setting Notifications for New Instant Messages

Whenever you receive an instant message, your mobile phone can play a sound, vibrate, or display an icon. To set up one of these handy notifications, start in the friends list, and then touch \equiv > **Settings**. Then touch the account that you want to set. Now choose from one of the following:

IM notifications	Select the check box to receive a notification on the notification bar when you receive an instant message.
Notification ringtone	Touch to choose the ringtone used for a new instant message. You will hear a short sample of the ringtone when you select it. To turn the ringtone off, select Silent .
Vibrate	Select the check box to make your mobile phone vibrate when you receive a new instant message.

Signing out of Talk

On the friends list screen, touch \equiv , and then touch **Sign out** to quit **Talk**.

Maps

Maps lets you find your current location, view real-time traffic conditions (depending on availability in your locale), and get detailed directions to various destinations. You can view satellite images, traffic maps, or other kinds of maps of your current or other locations.

Enabling the Location Service

Before you open **Maps** to find your location or search for places of interest, you must enable the location service.

- 1. On the Home screen, touch > Settings > All.
- 2. Touch Location services.
- 3. Select the **Google's location service** check box, the **GPS satellites** check box, or both.

Opening Maps

On the Home screen, touch > Maps to open the application.

Searching for Places of Interest

- 1. On the map, touch \mathbf{Q} .
- 2. Enter the place you want to search for in the search box, and then touch the Search icon.
- 3. Your search results will then be displayed. Touch a place you are interested in and the application will show where it is on the map.

Getting Directions

- 2. Enter the starting point in the first text box, and then enter your destination in the second text box.
- 3. Touch the icon for car, public transit, or walking directions.
- 4. Touch **GET DIRECTIONS**. Your directions will appear in a list.
- 5. Touch a direction item on the list to show it on the map.
- 6. When you finish viewing or following the directions, touch =, and then touch Clear Map to reset the map.

YouTube

YouTube is Google's free online video streaming service for watching, searching for, and uploading videos.

Opening YouTube

On the Home screen, touch > **YouTube**. You will then see the YouTube screen.

Searching for a Video

- 1. On the **YouTube** screen, touch \mathbf{Q} .
- 2. Enter a search keyword, and then touch the Search icon.
- 3. You will see a number of search results displayed below the notification bar. Scroll through the results and touch a video to watch it.

Sharing a Video

From the video list on the **YouTube** screen, select a video clip and touch share the video.

Play Store

Android **Play Store** provides direct access to applications and games which you can download and install on your phone.

Opening Play Store

On the Home screen, touch > Play Store.

Installing an Application

1. In the Play Store, select a category, and then touch the application you want to download. On the application details screen, you can view more information about the selected application, such as its cost, overall rating, user comments, and similar applications in which you might be interested. You can also scroll down to view information about the application developer,

- including other applications from the same developer and a link to the developer's website. In addition, you can send the developer an email.
- 2. To install the application, touch **INSTALL** (if it is free) or touch the button with its price (if it is not free), and confirm your download or purchase.
- 3. To check the progress of a download, open the notification panel. Most applications are installed within seconds. To stop an application from downloading, touch the cross (x).

After the application has been downloaded and installed on your mobile phone, the content download icon appears in the notification bar.

If you want to install a non-Play Store application, touch > Settings > Security, and then select the Unknown sources check box to allow installation of the non-Play Store application.

Uninstalling an Application

- 1. On the **Play Store** screen, touch \equiv > **My apps**.
- 2. Touch the application you want to uninstall, and then touch **UNINSTALL**.
- 3. When prompted, touch **OK** to remove the application from your mobile phone.


Accounts and synchronization

You can synchronize data on your phone, such as contacts, emails, and events, to and from the web.

Adding an Account

- 1. On the Home screen, touch (***) > **Settings** > **All**.
- 2. In the ACCOUNTS area, touch Add account.
- 3. Select an account type.
- 4. Follow the onscreen instructions to enter your account information.
- 5. Configure the account and set the type of data you wish to synchronize.

When an account is set up, it appears in the **ACCOUNTS** area.



Deleting an Account

- 1. On the Home screen, touch > Settings > All.
- 2. In the **ACCOUNTS** area, select an account type.
- 3. Select the account you wish to delete.
- 4. Touch **=** > **Remove account**.
- 5. In the displayed dialog box, touch **Remove account**.

Turning on data synchronization

- 1. On the Home screen, touch : > Settings > All.
- 2. In the ACCOUNTS area, touch Email.
- 3. Select the account you wish to synchronize.

4. Touch **Sync Email** to turn on data synchronization.



You can touch = > Sync now to have the account synchronize data from the web in the background.

Changing an Account's Synchronization Settings

- 1. On the Home screen, touch > Settings > All.
- 2. In the **ACCOUNTS** area, touch **Google**.
- 3. Select the account whose synchronization settings you wish to modify. The **Sync settings** area displays data you can synchronize.
- 4. Select the data you wish to synchronize.

Using Other Applications

Backup

Backup lets you back up your important data and restore them after a system upgrade or reset.

Backing up data to local storage

- 1. On the home screen, touch : > Backup.
- 2. Touch Back up to SD card.
- 3. Select the data you wish to back up.
- 4. Touch Backup.
- 5. Enter a password when prompted.
- 6. Touch **Backup**.

By default, backup files are saved to the **HuaweiBackup** folder in **File Manager**.

Restoring data from local storage

- 1. On the home screen, touch > Backup.
- 2. Touch Restore from SD card.
- 3. From the backup file list, choose the file you wish to restore.
- 4. Enter the backup password.
- 5. Touch OK.
- 6. Touch Restore.

Calendar

Calendar enables you to create and manage events, meetings, and appointments. Depending on your synchronization settings, the calendar on your phone can be synchronized with the internet-based calendar you use.

Opening Calendar

On the Home screen, touch (iii) > Calendar to open the application.

Creating an Event

- 1. In any calendar view, touch \blacksquare , and then touch **New event**.
- If you have more than one calendar, select the calendar where you want to save the event.
- 2. Enter the event name.
 - If there is a time frame for the event, touch **FROM** and **TO** to set the beginning and end times of the event.
 - If the event is a special occasion such as a birthday or a day-long activity, set the date for FROM and TO, and then select the ALL DAY check box.
- 3. Enter the location of the event and a description.
- 4. Specify in **REPETITION** whether the event recurs and, if it does, how frequently, and then set the time for your event reminder in **REMINDERS**.
- 5. Touch SAVE.
- To quickly create an event in the day or week view, touch and hold an empty time slot, and then touch **New event**. A new event details screen will appear with the selected time slot and date in the **FROM** and **TO** fields.

Setting an Event Reminder

- 1. In any calendar view, touch an event to view its details or an event summary.
- Touch the Add reminder button to add a reminder, or touch the reminder's
 button to delete an existing reminder.
- 3. Touch the reminder time, and then, from the list displayed, touch the length of time before the event when you want to be reminded. When the time comes, you will receive a notification about the event.

Setting Synchronization and Display

The Calendars screen displays all the calendars you have added or subscribed to for each account that is configured to synchronize events to your phone,

organized by account. (Calendars for accounts you have configured not to synchronize Calendar events are not included in the list.)

- 1. In any calendar view, touch = > Calendars to display.
- If you have an account to be synchronized to your phone, the account will be displayed in the **Calendars to display** list.
- 2. Touch = > Calendars to sync.
- 3. Select the accounts you want to synchronize to enable their calendar synchronization function.

Customizing Calendar Settings

In any calendar view, touch \equiv > **Settings**. Follow the onscreen instructions to configure the calendar settings.

File Manager

File Manager is like having a pocket-sized personal assistant (PA), letting you organize, edit, and delete files and folders.

Opening File Manager

On the Home screen, touch \bigcirc > **File Manager** to open the application.

Before performing operations on the **SD card** list, ensure that a microSD card is inserted.

Creating a Folder

- 1. On the **File Manager** screen, touch **Internal** or **SD card**.
- 2. Touch = > New folder.
- 3. Enter the name of the new folder in the text box.
- 4. Touch Save.

Moving or Copying a File

1. On the **File Manager** screen, touch **Internal** or **SD card**.

- 2. Touch and hold the file you wish to copy or cut.
- 3. From the displayed option menu, choose **Cut** or **Copy**.
- 4. Select where you wish to paste the file.
- 5. Touch Paste.

Searching for a File

- 1. On the **File Manager** screen, touch **Internal** or **SD card**, and then touch a folder to access the directory where the file you want is located.
- 2. Touch **=** > **Search** to enter part or all of the file name.
- 3. Touch \mathbf{Q} in the lower right corner of the keyboard.
- 4. A list of search results will be displayed. Touch a file in the list to open it.
- 5. Touch to return to the file manager screen.

Compressing or decompressing files

You can compress files into .zip files to save space or decompress .zip and .rar files.

- 1. On the **File Manager** screen, touch **Internal** or **SD card**.
- 2. Touch and hold the file or folder you wish to compress.
- 3. From the displayed option menu, choose **Compress**.
- 4. Select the save path of the compressed file and name the file.
- 5. Touch OK.

To decompress a file, touch and hold it and choose **Extract** from the displayed option menu.

Viewing Your Memory Status

On the **File Manager** screen, touch \equiv to open the options panel, and then touch **Storage**. The memory management screen will be displayed. This screen allows you to view the memory status and available memory on your mobile phone and microSD card.

Clock

Clock displays the date and time. You can also use **Clock** to turn your mobile phone into an alarm clock.

Opening the Clock

On the Home screen, touch \bigcirc > **Clock** to open the application.

Opening the Alarms

On the **Clock** screen, touch to open the **Alarms**.

Adding an Alarm

- 1. On the alarm list screen, touch +.
- 2. Set the alarm time, sound, how often it repeats, and more.
- 3. Touch DONE.

Setting an Alarm

- 1. On the alarm list screen, touch one of the alarms on the screen.
- 2. Touch **Time** to set the time of the alarm.
- 3. Touch **Repeat** to set the days when you want the alarm to sound.
- 4. Touch **Ringtone** to select a ringtone for the alarm.
- 5. Select the **Vibrate** check box to enable the phone to vibrate, in addition to playing the ringtone.
- 6. Touch **Label** to enter a name for the alarm.
- 7. Touch **DONE**.
- The alarm clock still works when the phone is powered off.

Customizing Alarm Settings

On the alarm list screen, touch \equiv > **Settings**.

Calculator

Use **Calculator** to solve simple arithmetic problems or use its advanced operators to solve more complex equations.

Opening Calculator

On the Home screen, touch **:::** > **Calculator** to open the application.

Switching Between Basic and Advanced panel

On the **Calculator** screen, flick the screen to the right or left to switch between **Advanced panel** and **Basic panel**.

Notes

Notes features a simple text processor. In the note list, you can add, edit, and delete notes.

- 1. On the Home screen, touch (iii) > **Notes** to open the application.
- 2. Touch to create a note.
- 3. Touch

 to save the note.

Managing Your Mobile Phone

To configure your mobile phone, touch :> Settings > All.

Setting the Date and Time

- When your phone is using the date and time settings provided automatically by the network, you cannot change the settings.
- 1. On the **Settings** screen, touch **Date & time**.
- 2. On the settings screen, perform any of the following operations:
 - Clear the Automatic date & time check box to stop your phone from automatically obtaining the network date and time.
 - Clear the Automatic time zone check box to stop your phone from automatically obtaining the time zone from the network.
 - Touch **Set date** and flick up and down to set your phone's date.
 - Touch **Set time** and flick up and down to set your phone's time.
 - Touch Select time zone and select the time zone you want from the list.
 Scroll up or down to view more time zones.
 - Select or clear the Use 24-hour format check box to switch between 12-hour and 24-hour formats.
 - Touch **Select date format** to select how you want the date to be displayed.

Setting the Display

- 1. On the **Settings** screen, touch **Display**.
- 2. Perform any of the following operations:
 - Touch Brightness to set the screen brightness. To manually adjust the screen brightness, clear the Automatic brightness check box.
 - Touch **Auto-rotate screen** to turn the auto-rotate screen function on and off. With this function enabled, if your rotate your phone when browsing a

web page, viewing an image, or writing a message, your screen orientation will automatically change to landscape or portrait view.

- Touch **Sleep** to set a screen timeout period. If idle for the specified period of time, your phone automatically locks its screen to save battery power.
- Touch **Font size** to change the display font size.

Setting Ringers

- 1. On the **Settings** screen, touch **Sound**.
- 2. On the settings screen, you can:
 - Touch **Volume** and drag the sliders to set the volumes of music, ringtone, message notification tone, and more.
 - Touch **Vibration** to set whether your phone vibrates when you have an incoming call, new message, new email, upcoming event, and more.
 - Touch **Silent mode** to turn silent mode on or off.
 - Touch **Phone ringtone** to select a ringtone.
 - Touch Notification tone to select a tone for a new message, new email, upcoming event, and more.
- To adjust the volume, you can press the volume buttons from the home screen or most application screens (for example, the call, music, and video playback screens).

Setting Phone Services

Customizing Call Settings

Mobile phone service providers offer services including call forwarding, call waiting, fixed dialing numbers, and voicemail. You can customize the services included in your call fee package.

On the Home screen, touch > **Phone**, and then touch > **Settings** to customize call functions.

Turning on Data Roaming

- 1. On the **Settings** screen, touch **Mobile networks**.
- 2. Select the **Data roaming** check box.
- Accessing data services while roaming may incur additional charges. Ask your wireless service provider about data roaming fees.

Disabling the Data Service

- 1. On the **Settings** screen, touch **Mobile networks**.
- 2. Clear the **Data enabled** check box.

Configuring Text-to-Speech

Use the Text-to-Speech settings to configure the Android text-to-speech synthesizer, for applications that can take advantage of this feature.

Adjusting the Speech Rate

- 1. On the **Settings** screen, touch **Language & input > Text-to-speech output** > **Speech rate**.
- 2. Select a speed at which the text is to be spoken.

Protecting Your Mobile Phone

Turning on Your SIM Card PIN

- 1. On the **Settings** screen, touch **Security** > **Set up SIM card lock**.
- 2. Select the Lock SIM card check box.
- 3. Use the keyboard to enter the PIN, and then touch **OK**.
- 4. To change the PIN at any time, touch Change SIM PIN.
- You can dial emergency numbers any time from your mobile phone.

Protecting Your Mobile Phone with a Screen Lock

To keep your data more secure, lock the screen and/or require a screen unlock pattern every time your mobile phone is turned on or wakes up from sleep mode.

- 1. On the **Settings** screen, touch **Security > Screen lock > Pattern**.
- Flick your finger vertically, horizontally or diagonally, connect at least four dots in any order you choose. Lift your finger from the screen when you are finished.

You must drag your finger between the dots on the screen to create the pattern, not simply touch individual dots.

- 3. Your mobile phone will record the pattern. Touch **Continue**.
- 4. When prompted, draw the screen unlock pattern again, and then touch **Confirm**.

To change your unlock screen pattern, touch **Security** > **Screen lock** > **Pattern**.

Protecting Your Mobile Phone with a Numeric PIN

You can set up a numeric PIN to lock your phone.

- 1. On the **Settings** screen, touch **Security** > **Screen lock** > **PIN**.
- 2. Enter at least four characters.
- 3. Touch Continue.
- 4. Enter the same characters again and touch **OK**.

To change your PIN, touch **Security** > **Screen lock** > **PIN**.

Unlocking Your Mobile Phone If You Forget the Screen Lock Pattern

If you have already created a Google account, you can unlock your mobile phone using the following methods.

After you have entered the wrong sequence five times, a Forgot pattern?
 button will appear. Touch this button to enter the Google account interface.
 After you have entered your Google account password, you will be able to reset the unlock pattern.

 After you have entered the wrong pattern twenty times, you will be taken directly to the Google account interface. After you have entered your Google account password, you will be able to reset the unlock pattern.

Managing Applications

Viewing an Installed Application

- 1. On the **Settings** screen, touch **Manage apps**.
- 2. In the applications list, do either of the following:
 - Touch = , and then touch Sort by size. Then touch an application to view its details.
 - Touch an application directly to view its details.

Uninstalling an Application

- You cannot uninstall the applications that are pre-installed on the system.
- 1. On the **Settings** screen, touch **Manage apps**.
- 2. Touch an application, and then touch **Uninstall**.

Ways to Free Up Your Mobile Phone Memory

- Move files and email attachments to the microSD card.
- In **Browser**, clear all temporary Internet files and Browser history information.
- Uninstall any downloaded programs that you no longer use.
- Reset your mobile phone.

Resetting Your Mobile Phone

Backing Up My Data

You can use your Google account to back up your mobile phone's settings to Google servers. If you replace your mobile phone, the settings you have backed up will be transferred to the new mobile phone the first time you sign in to your Google account.

- 1. On the **Settings** screen, touch **Backup & reset**.
- 2. Select the **Back up my data** check box.

Restoring Factory Data

If you reset your phone to its factory settings, all of your personal data stored on the phone, including information about your Google account, any other accounts that you have configured, your system and application settings, and any applications you have installed will be erased. Resetting the phone does not erase any system updates you have downloaded. Using the check box provided, you can also select to erase all the data stored on your SD card or on the phone's internal SD card, which includes files that you have downloaded or copied there, such as music or photos.

- 1. On the **Settings** screen, touch **Backup & reset** > **Factory data reset**.
- When prompted, touch **Reset phone**, and then touch **Reset phone**. The mobile phone resets the settings to the original factory settings, and then restarts.

Online Update

Your mobile phone has pre-installed the online update function. When there is new software available, the version information appears and prompts you to update. You can also touch **Settings** > **All** > **About phone** > **System updates** to check whether the new software is available.

When updating:

- 1. Back up your personal information. All personal information will be removed after the update.
- Make sure that your microSD card has sufficient space to store the new software version.
- 3. Perform the online update following the onscreen instructions.
