In August 1996 the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the United States with its action in Report and Order FCC 96-326 adopted an updated safety standard for human exposure to radio frequency electromagnetic energy emitted by FCC regulated transmitters. Those guidelines are consistent with the safety standard previously set by both U.S. and international standards bodies. The design of this phone complies with the FCC guidelines and these international standards.



Use only the supplied or an approved antenna. Unauthorized antennas, modifications, or attachments could impair call quality, damage the phone, or result in violation of FCC regulations.

Do not use the phone with a damaged antenna. If a damaged antenna comes into contact with the skin, a minor burn may result. Please contact your local dealer for replacement antenna.

Body-worn Operation

This device was tested for typical body-worn operations with the back of the phone kept 0.4 inches (1 cm) from the body. To comply with FCC RF exposure requirements, a minimum separation distance of 0.4 inches (1 cm) must be maintained between the user's body and the back of the phone, including the antenna, whether extended or retracted. Third-party belt-clips, holsters and similar accessories containing metallic components should not be used. Body-worn accessories that cannot maintain 0.4 inch (1 cm) separation distance between the user's body and the back of the phone, and have not been tested for typical body-worn operations may not comply with FCC RF exposure limits and should be avoided.

Characteristics of Product

The product is a digital type mobile phone based on the CDMA communication technology to meet the demand of customers.

Please read the manual carefully before starting using the phone.

First, light and thin folder type. It is a new style, high-tech phone that is so small that it can be held in a hand. It is only 19 mm thick (based on the small size battery).

Second , beautiful LCD graphic. Users can use menu using a cute icon.

Third, electronic diary function. Telephone book, calendar function, schedule management, calculator, etc are the functions that the phone has. You won't need another electronic diary.

Fourth, longer operating time. You can use the phone for a week (when the large capacity battery is used) with one charge since it uses high-tech 3000 chip and power saving circuit design.

Precautions

Before you start, please make sure that the battery is fully charged.

Do not take apart or modify the phone.

Avoid damages from vibration or impact and keep the phone in safe place when not in use.

Do not touch the antenna during a call.

Do not use the phone in high-temperature or high-humidity environments. If soaked with liquids, the phone may be unrepairable.

Do not use or place your phone near explosive materials, inflammable liquids or gases.

Do not clean your phone with chemical solutions such as solvent or thinner.

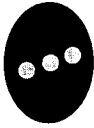

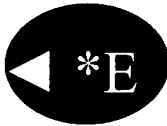

 (Signal Strength)

When without service area,  is displayed.  indicates the phone is being used or a call is being made, while  indicates the phone is in standby mode.

 (Short message service)
Appears when text or voice messages are waiting.

 (Alert)
Appears when the user has set the scheduler or call reservation.

 (Battery Level Indicator)
Shows balance of available battery power with the number of bars (from 0 to 3).

 (Etiquette Function)
Appears when the etiquette function is set.

Inserting and Removing the Battery

Inserting the battery

Insert the battery into the groove at the bottom of the phone and then press the battery until it snaps.

Removing the battery

Pull out the battery while pushing the separation tab .

Charging the Battery

- Battery is not charged when you purchase the product. So fully charge the battery before use
- Charge the battery when the alarm sound of the low battery rings from the phone.

Power connection

Connect the charger to a standard outlet.

- The charger can be connected to either 110V or 220V AC outlet without manipulating anything. When the charger is connected to power, orange lamp will blink once.

Charging the battery only

To charge the battery only, insert the battery pack into the charger.

Charging the battery with the handset

To charge the battery with the handset, insert the handset into the charger.

Charging the Battery**Power operating time table (when using a new battery)**

Battery type/Mode		Standard battery
Talk		About 130 – 150 min.
Stand-by	Slot mode 1	About 70 – 110 hrs.
	Slot mode 2	About 70 – 150 hrs.

- More power is required for the talk mode than for the stand-by, so the longer the talk time, the shorter the stand-by time per charge.
- The battery operating time can vary depending on the charging condition, surrounding environment such as temperature, habit of using the phone, electric wave condition in the location where the phone is used, key pad lighting time selection, etc.
- Stand-by time can vary depending on the slot mode related service type of the mobile communication system of the service company.
- Slot mode refers to the exchange frequency between the mobile communication system and the mobile phone in stand-by mode. The fewer the slot mode, the more frequent the exchange, shortening the stand-by time.

Battery charging time

Battery type	Standard battery
Charging time	Less than 300 min.

- When the lamp is not lighted at all, or blinks red, please check the connection part of the battery. If the battery does not work properly after four to five time trial, contact the nearest service center.

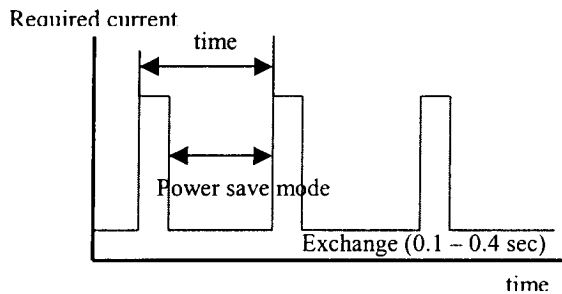
Since the battery is consumable supplies, the free guarantee period is 6 months.

Battery operating time depending on the service environment

Slot mode

When the phone is in stand-by mode, information is sent to the phone from the system on a regular basis. This is called, “The phone is working in slot mode”, and the frequency is called “slot cycle”.

As for the types of slot cycle, it varies from 0 to 7. While the phone does not exchange telegraphic message with the system, it works in power save mode, which reduces the consumption of battery.



Power save mode length

When the slot cycle type is 0: 1.28 sec
(In this case, battery is consumed the most)

When the slot cycle is 1: 2.56 sec

When the slot cycle is 7: 163.84 sec (In this case, battery is consumed the least)

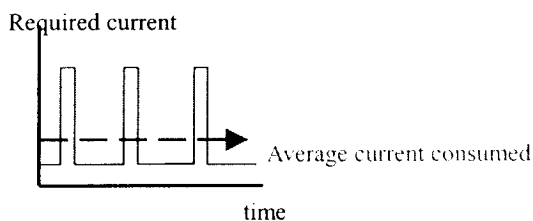
- The battery operating time varies depending on the type of the slot cycle. Different slot cycle type is used depending on the service firm and location in which the phone is used.

Service condition and the battery stand-by time

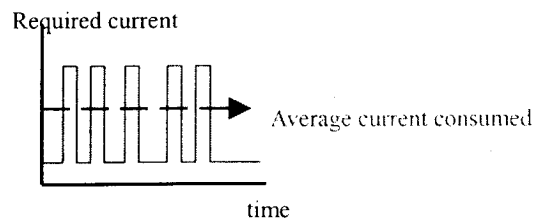
- In normal condition(1)

It differs depending on the slot cycle type.

- In the municipal area where there are a lot of bases or when the user is in a transportation vehicle. (2)

The more the user retrieves the surrounding bases, the shorter the battery operating time.

- When the user is out of service area for long, current consumed is as much as the case of the slot cycle type 0.

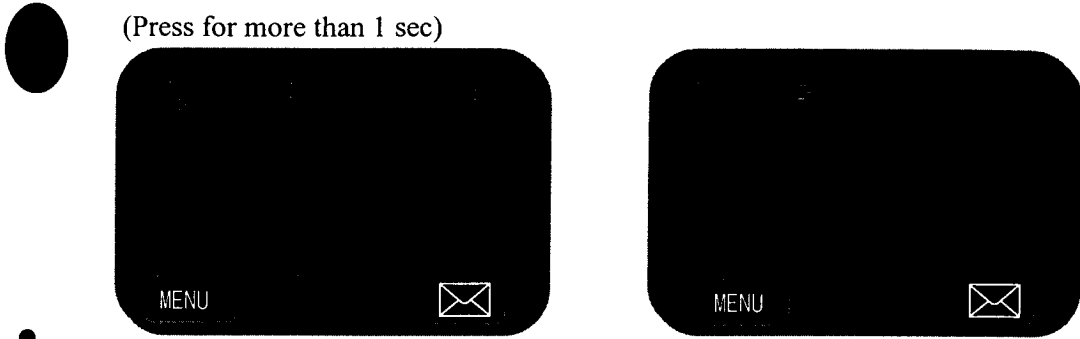

Basic Operations**Turning the phone ON**

(Press for more than 1 sec)



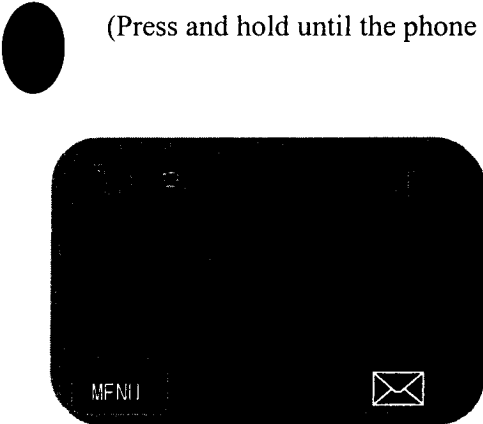
When the Lock code is displayed on LCD, enter your 4-digit lock code to unlock the phone.

When you purchase the phone, the default lock code is last four digit of your phone number.

- If an error message appears on LCD, contact the nearest service center.
- When something strange happens to the phone, or the phone is not turned on, remove the battery and then connect it again and turn the phone on.

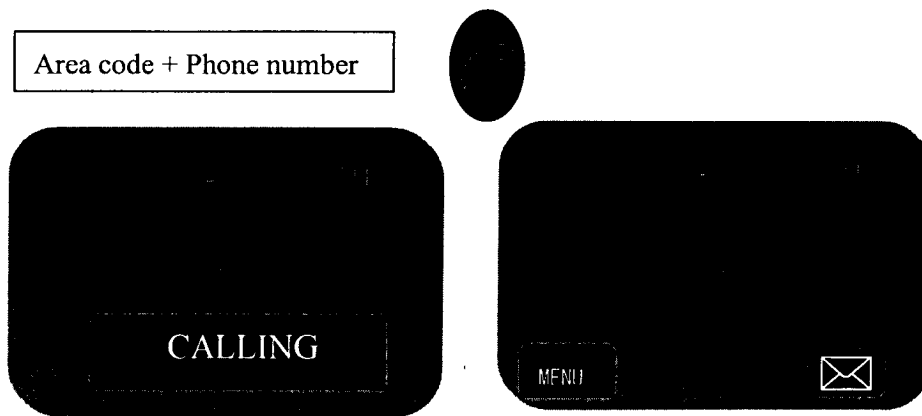

Making a Call



To correct a number,

- Press  button quickly to delete one character at a time.
- Press and hold  button for more than 0.5 second to clear the entire phone number.
- “Call Failed” indicates that your call is not connected.
- If the alert sound for the call connection is set, a signal will come out when the call is connected and the call time will be displayed.
- If  is displayed on LCD, the phone is out of service area. So get out of the area you are in and then make a call.
- If the automatic area code is set, you do not have to dial the area code.

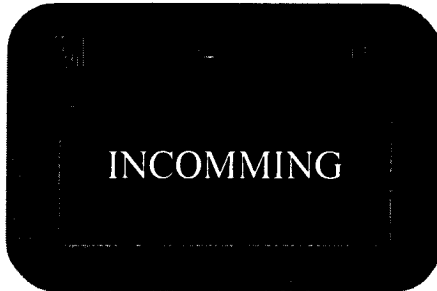
Press  button or shut the cover to terminate the call.



- Press  to redial the number that you just called.
- When using the ear microphone, press the [send/end] button of the ear microphone for more than 0.5 second . (possible even when the cover is shut).
- You can not make a collect call with the phone.

Basic Operations**Receiving a Call**

When the phone rings

Receive the call, opening the cover
(if the cover is open, press any button)



- Change the signal (bell/signal strength/vibration/no sound/bell after vibration).
- When you purchase the phone, it is set with the bell.
- Press  button once to stop the bell sound, and press the button once more to return to the stand-by mode.
- If the automatic receiving function is set, you can automatically receive the call after the bell rings for a certain number times.
- Press  button quickly or shut the cover to terminate the call.
- When using the ear microphone, press the [send/end] button of the ear microphone quickly.

How to enter characters

- To enter special characters

Press  button to switch to the “Special character (whole/half)” entering mode.



- Special characters (whole/half) indicate special characters in whole/half types.
- You can select the characters you want using the number buttons.
- It is composed of a total 6 groups and each group can be selected using the


 button.

- To enter English/numbers

- Up to 16 alphabetical characters letters can be entered in a line.

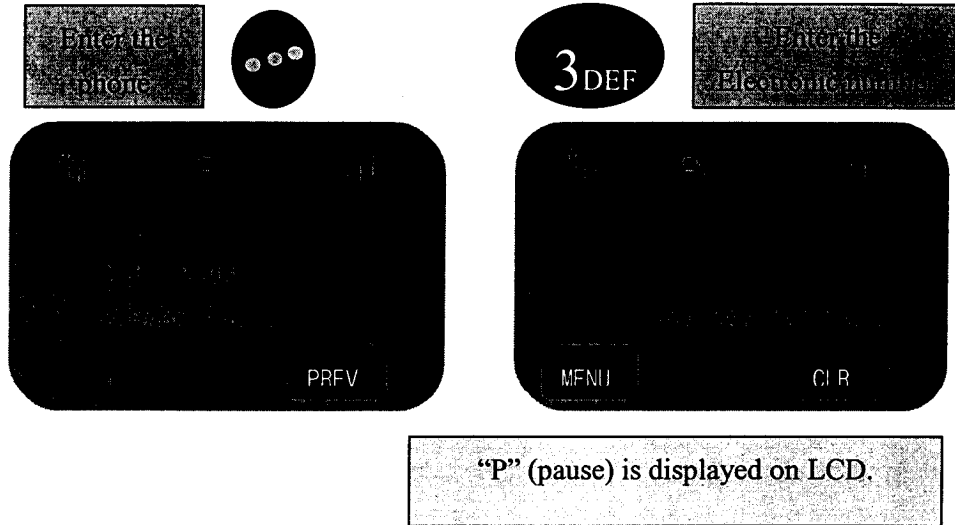

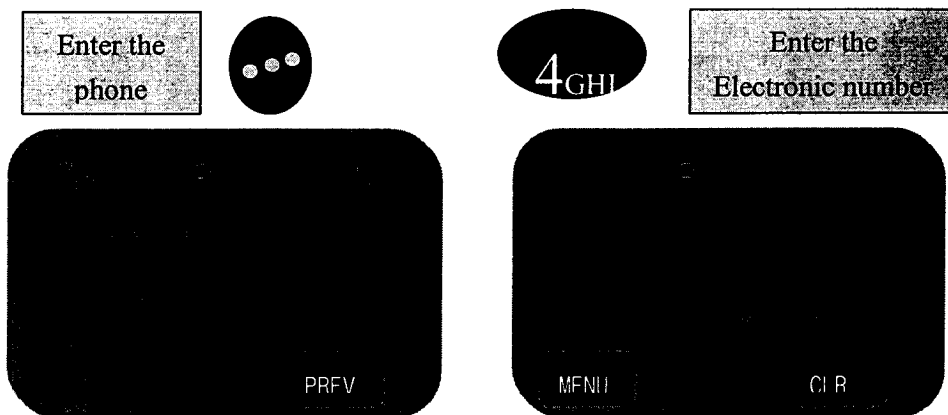
Electronic Dialing (Pause)

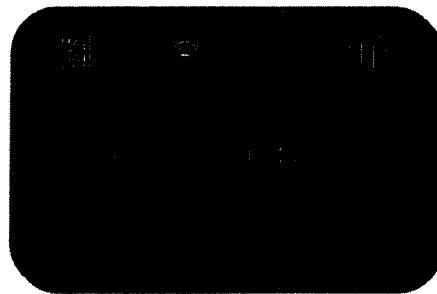
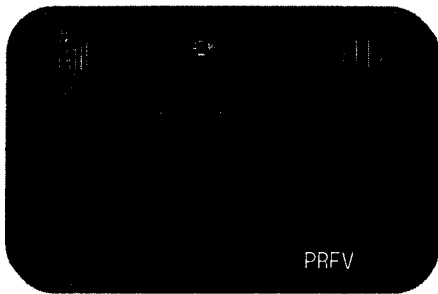
Storing a Phone Number

Recalling by the memory location number

This feature allows you to make a call by recalling a stored phone number.

- Memory location number from 0 to 9: press and hold the memory location number of the phone number
- Memory location number from 10 to 99: press the first digit of the memory location number quickly and press and hold its second digit of the phone number.
- Press the memory location number and  button.

When there are more than two phone numbers in a memory location number:



- Press the relevant dial button of the number you want.

Biorhythm

This feature allows you to check your biorhythm for today or a specific day using the birthday .



Enter the birthday in the following order of year/month/day.

Select TODAY to find out today's biorhythm.

Biorhythm is only possible when you set up the time information.

Biorhythm

- What is biorhythm?

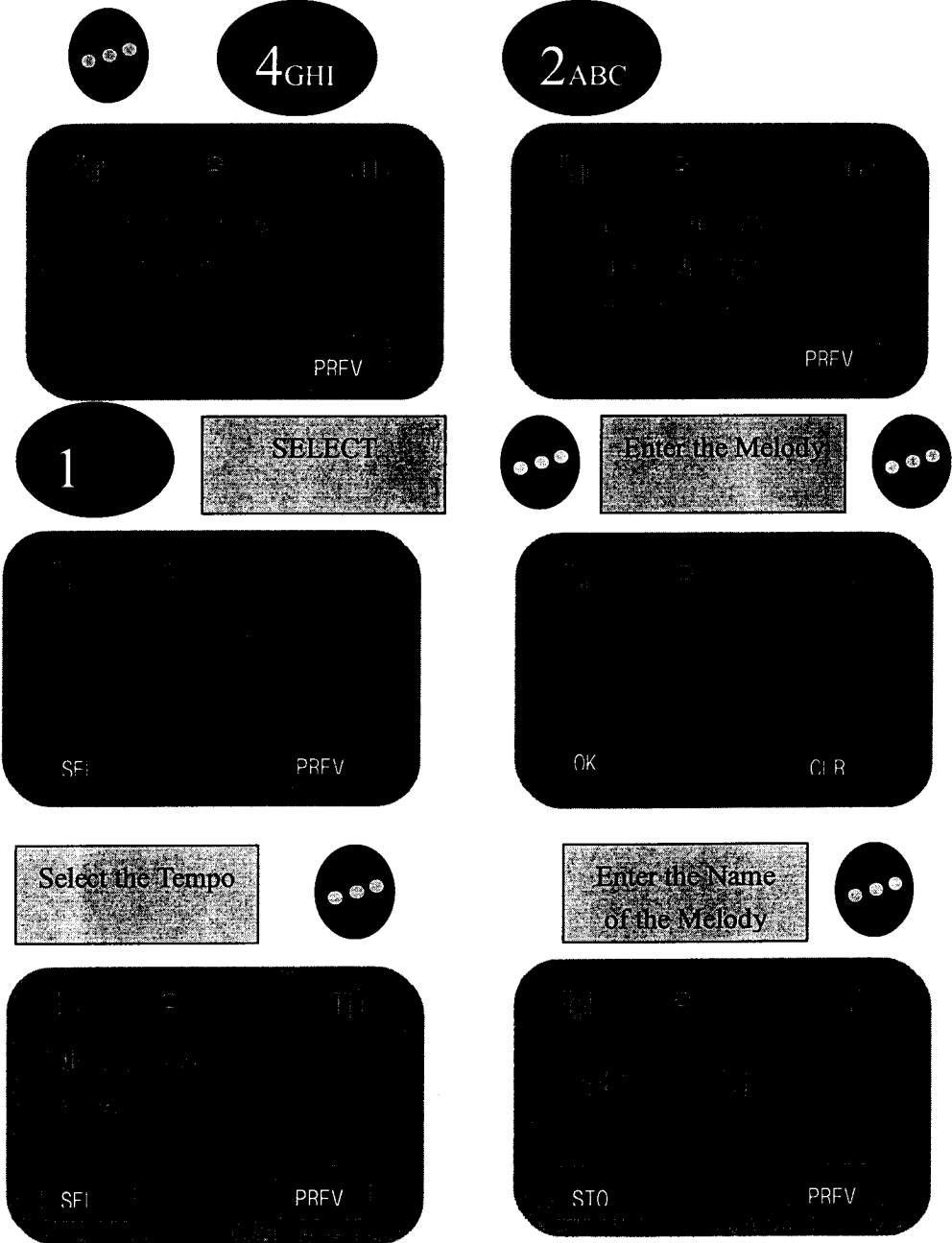
Biorhythm is a life rhythm that is governed by three rhythm curves called physical, emotional, and intelligent and starts from within our bodies from birth to death.

	Physical rhythm (23 days)	Emotional rhythm (28 days) (Stability rhythm such as work and love life)	Intelligent rhythm (33 days) (Learning and efficiency rhythm such as memory, ability to analyze, concentrate)
Vital period	Suitable for tasks requiring physical strength, travel, intensive sports training. But be careful about overconfidence in your body and overdrinking. Good period for rapid recovery from surgery.	Takes care of works full of vitality. Good time for joint work, love seeking, and dating.	Fast brain activity, lots of mental work. Planning, reviewing. Good time to make decisions about important matters.
Dangerous period	High probability of increased body temperature, occurrence of chronic disease, code, headache. Be careful about driving and other hazardous situations. Setting Lock Code

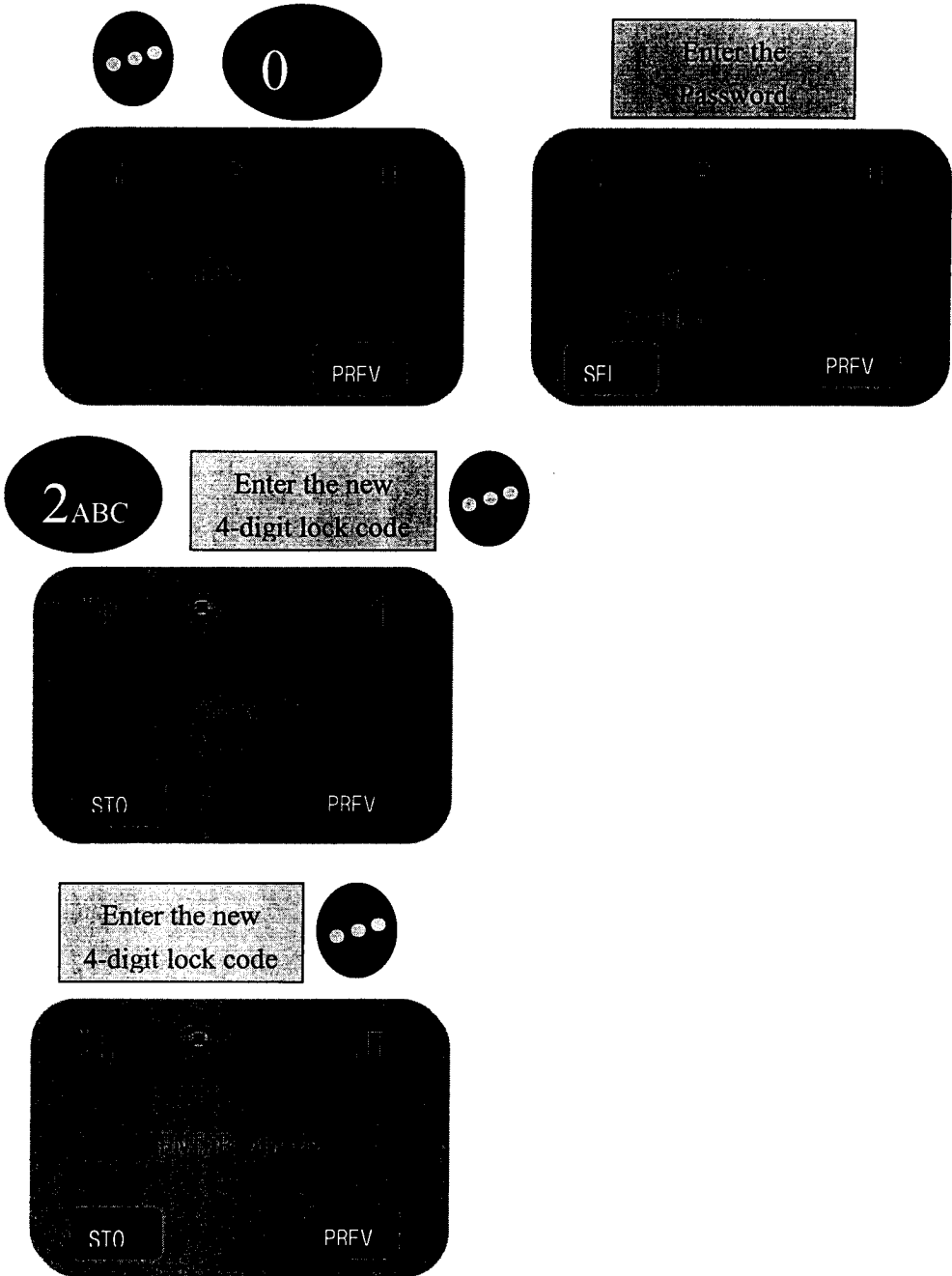
This feature protects the phone against unauthorized use, restricting all outgoing calls. Incoming calls can be answered and emergency calls can be made.



- Power on: indicates that the phone is locked after it is turned on.
- After 20 secs: indicates that the phone is locked 20sec in standby mode.
- No Use: cancels Lock function.
- If the  button is pressed long, the phone is locked 20 seconds after it is in standby mode and it is not used.

Changing Lock Code

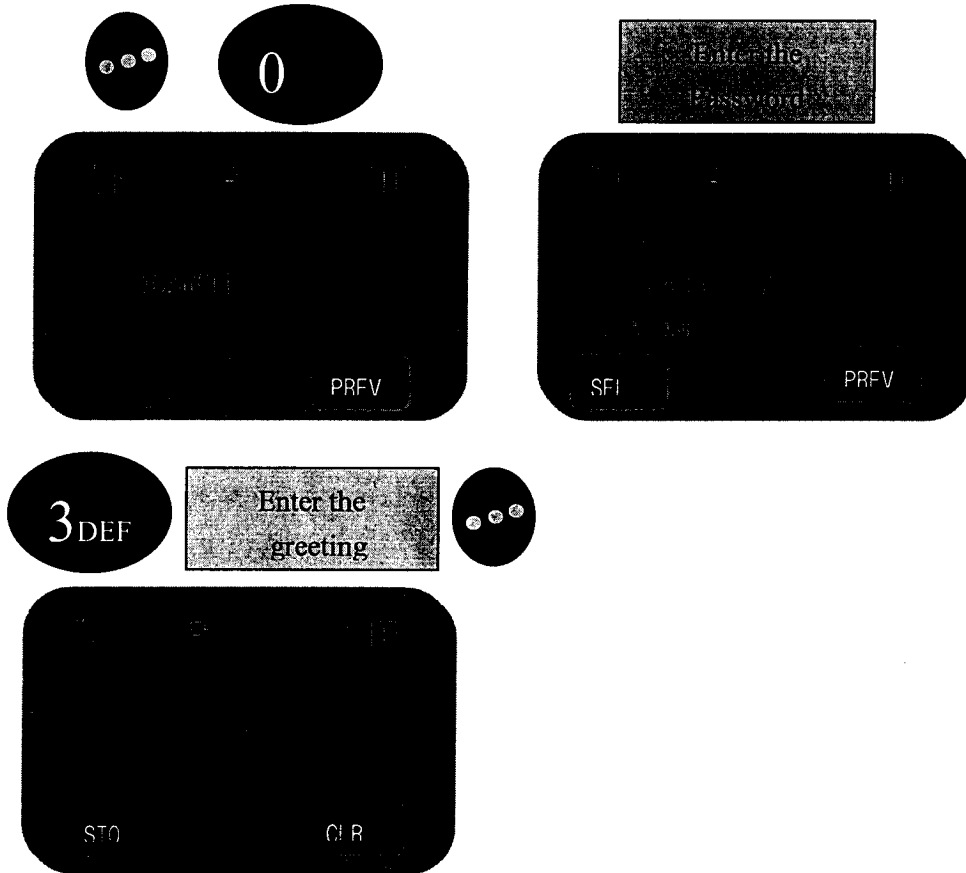
This feature allows you to change the four-digit lock code of the phone.



- When setting the lock code, keep the number somewhere in case you forget the number.

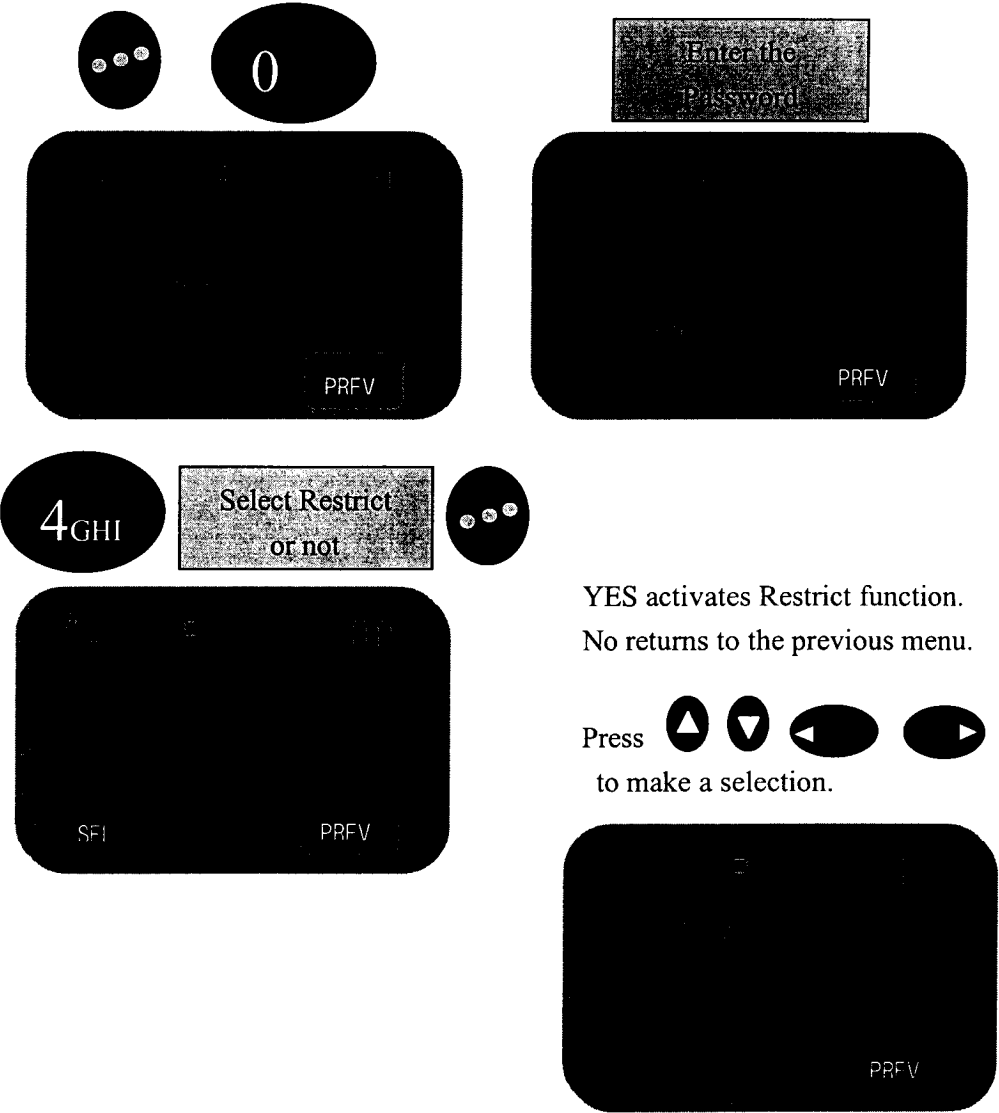
Greeting Message

This feature allows you to display a greeting message on the LCD when you power on the phone. A greeting message can contain a maximum 16 English characters.



Call Restrict

This feature allows 3 levels of call restrictions.

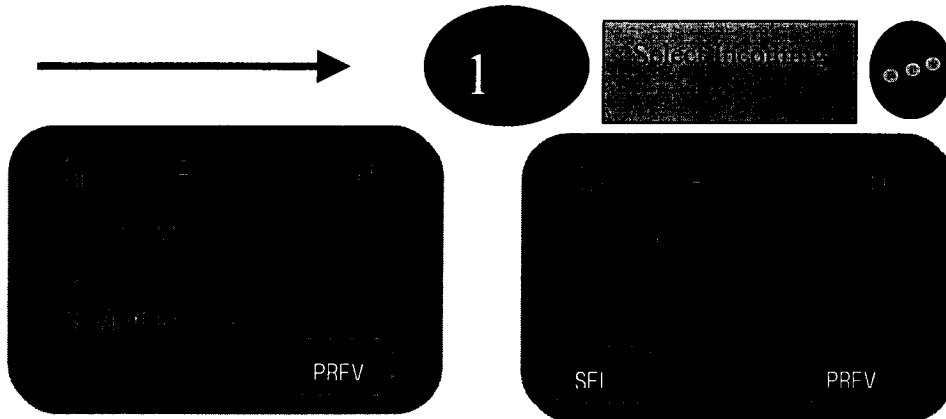

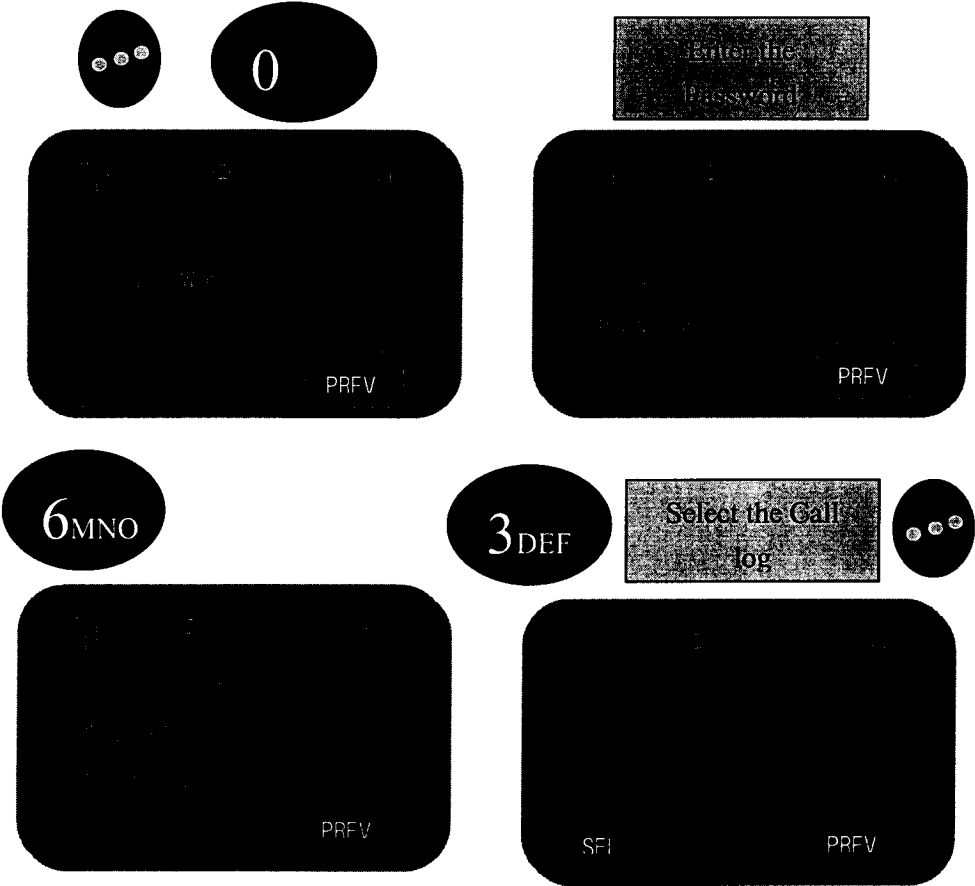

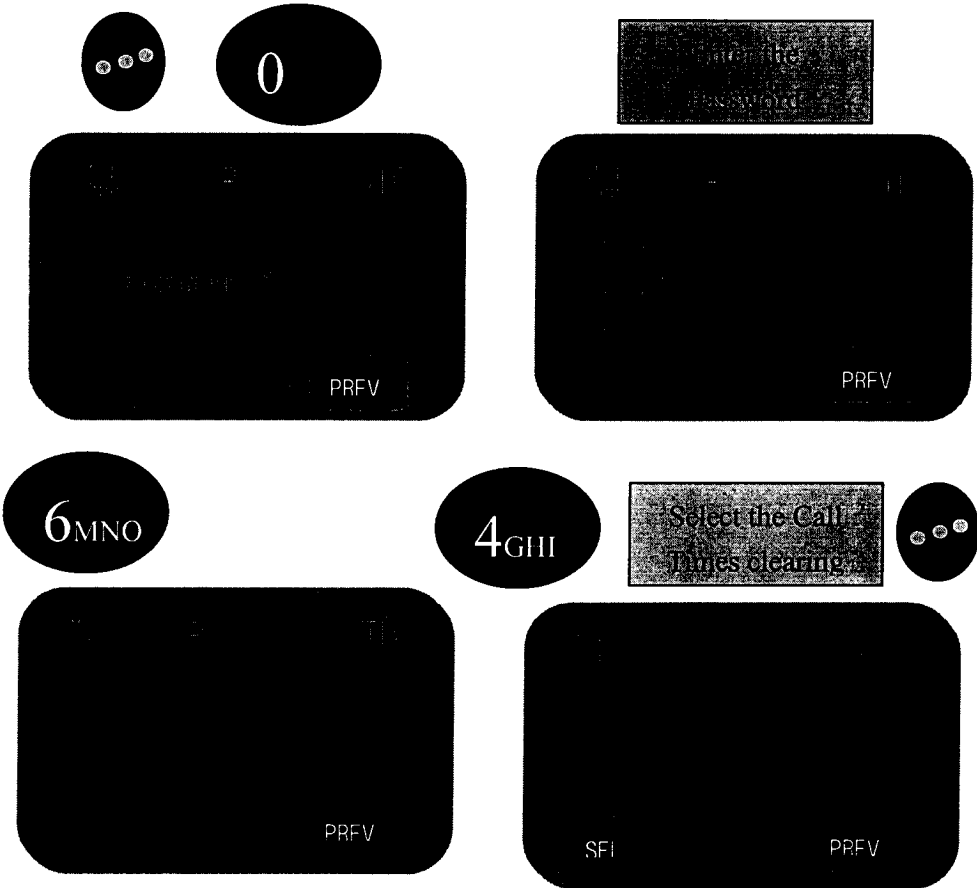

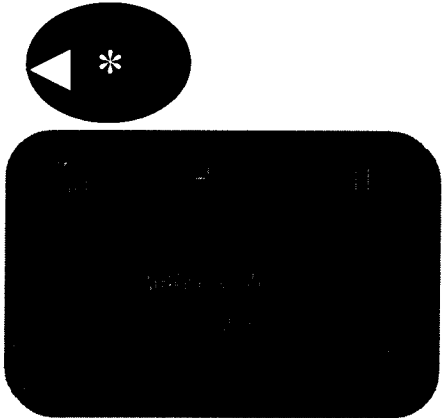

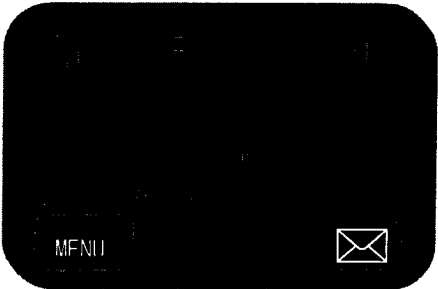
